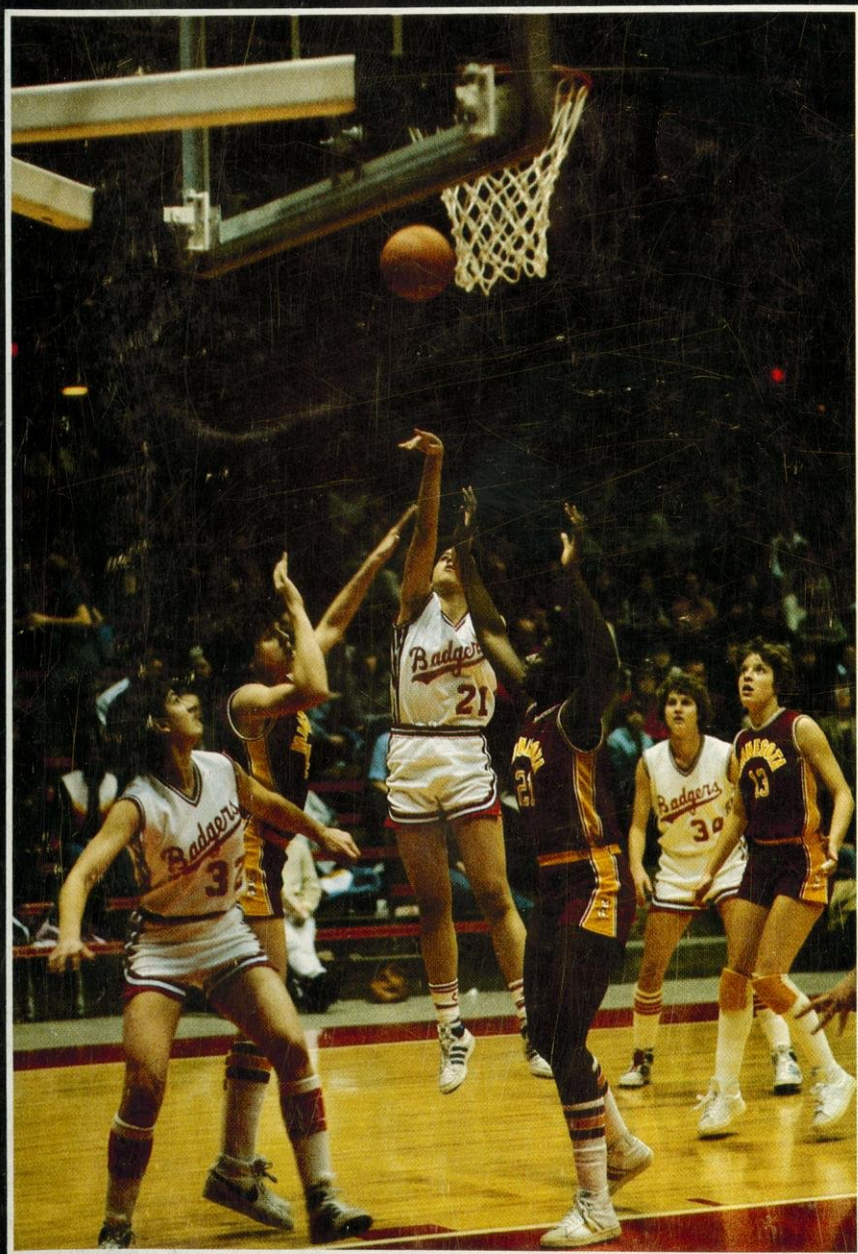

Press Row: Wisconsin working facilities for press-radio-television are located on the west side of the Wisconsin Fieldhouse.

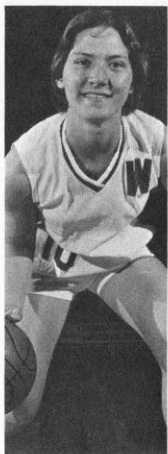

Madison and the Wisconsin Campus

Nestled between a chain of four sparkling lakes, the most dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.

Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief business is education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-America City given by the National Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota, and many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres. Also near the campus is a 129-acre park-like peninsula called Picnic Point which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.

Wisconsin has a well-earned reputation for academic excellence as cited in several national surveys of American campuses. The American Council of Education called UW-Madison “strong or distinguished” in thirty university departments. Students from all 50 states and over 100 foreign countries are enrolled in nine major colleges, and studying in 150 different subject disciplines.

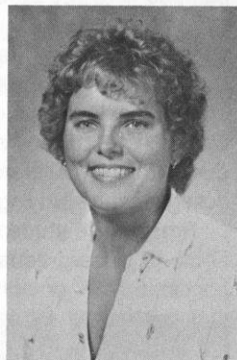
Administration

Dr. Kit Saunders begins her seventh year as Wisconsin's Director of Women's Athletics. She has had a long association with women's athletics at Wisconsin, however, having served as the sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education, and women's tennis coach for eight years prior to her present appointment in 1974.

Under Kit's leadership the athletic program has experienced great increases each year in funding and participation. Wisconsin teams have enjoyed the benefits of excellent coaching, fine facilities and adequate budgets while the Wisconsin women's sports program has emerged as a model for other Division I athletic programs.

Kit's demonstrated leadership at home has also had an impact within the state, region and even nationally. She has served in numerous state offices including that of President. She has been a Commissioner for the six-state Midwest Region V, and is presently national Vice President of the AIAW for Division I schools.

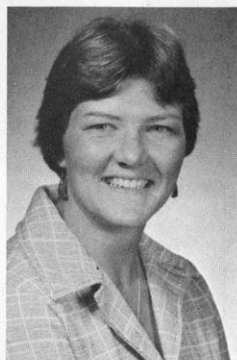
Assisting Kit Saunders in directing the Wisconsin women's athletics program is **Paula Bonner**. Beginning her third year as Assistant Athletic Director, the South Carolina native brings the enthusiasm and knowledge to her position which makes her so indispensable to the staff and student-athletes alike. Her varied responsibilities include working closely with the coaches and athletes in matters concerning recruitment, financial aid, eligibility and special events arrangements. Paula and Kit also work closely in areas of budget preparation, policy definition and fund raising.



Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 12-sport women's athletic program lies with **Tamara J. Flarup**, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Now in her fourth year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (W.I.S.) in their promotions and publications.



Sports Medicine



Janet Tappan begins her third year as the Head Women's Athletic Trainer at Wisconsin. Utilizing the modern training facilities in Camp Randall Stadium, Jan provides for the care, prevention and treatment of injuries for all Wisconsin women athletes.

Together with her staff of student trainers, Jan is responsible for covering all practices and competitions of the 12 women's sports. Besides the Camp Randall training center, Jan also has access to training facilities in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse and Natatorium. All are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus.

Jan is a N.A.T.A. certified athletic trainer whose experience and knowledge helped her in being selected to be one of 60 athletic trainers who worked with the athletes at the 1980 Winter Olympic Games in Lake Placid, NY.

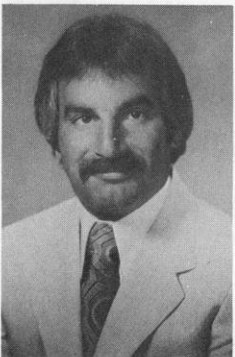
Academic Counseling



Academic excellence is a phrase which is stressed at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the student-athlete.

Assistant to the Director of Athletics **Diane Johnson** and Counselor **Alan Zussman** are responsible for the Wisconsin athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Al have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane and Allan offer counseling sessions on a one-on-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. Johnson and Zussman take a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.



Head Basketball Coach

EDWINA QUALLS

Head basketball Coach Edwina Qualls begins her fifth year of coaching women's basketball at Wisconsin. A native of Connecticut, Edwina coached basketball and taught physical education at R. C. Lee High School in New Haven where she compiled an 82-15 high school coaching record over a seven year period. Her teams consistently appeared in the Connecticut State basketball tournament claiming the Class L state title in 1975, and runners-up titles two other years.

Edwina's university coaching experience began at Southern Connecticut State College where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physical education. She later teamed with basketball great Louise O'Neal as her assistant basketball coach at Yale University prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Coach Qualls was honored by being named "Coach of the Year" in 1975 by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. She served as the Midwest basketball coach at the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs in 1979, and was a member of the AIAW Division I Basketball Committee this year.

Her career coaching record is 127-66, while her record at Wisconsin is 45-51.



Assistant Coach



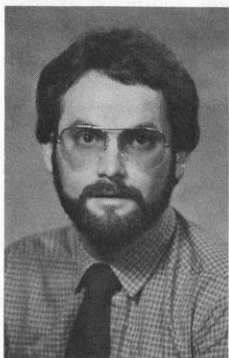
KATHY RICHEY

Assistant coach Kathy Richey came to the Badger basketball program with a broad background both as a player and coach.

A native of Bellefontaine, Ohio, Kathy played in three AIAW National Basketball Championships while an undergraduate student at Ashland College in Ohio. Her teams placed third, fourth and eighth in those three years.

In addition to her extensive playing experience, Kathy gained a solid coaching background at the high school and college levels in Ohio and Iowa. This included a one year stint as assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa, where she concurrently works on her M.A. Degree in Athletic Administration.

Assistant Coach



DENNIS SIMPSON

The 1980-81 season marks the third year for Dennis as head coach of the UW women's Varsity reserve basketball team. Before his move to the junior varsity, Dennis was assistant coach to the varsity, where he played an integral part in developing many of the program's prominent players.

A 1972 graduate of Western Kentucky University, Dennis earned his B.A. degree in sociology with a minor in recreation. Before coming to the UW, Dennis taught at two high schools in Louisville, Kentucky, where he also served as assistant men's basketball coach. Since his arrival in Madison, Dennis has participated in several youth oriented programs, in addition to his responsibilities with the UW women's basketball program.

1980-81 Badger Women's Basketball

Experience and depth form the foundation of what fifth-year Wisconsin Women's Basketball head coach Edwina Qualls feels will be her finest team to date. With only two letterwinners gone from last year's 11-16 team, prospects for success appear to be excellent in the eighties.

The 1980-81 Wisconsin Women's Basketball team possesses one of the finest front-lines in program history. Cornerstone of that line is 5-11 sophomore forward Theresa Huff of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. As a freshman, Huff led the team with a program record 382 points (14.1 ppg), which included a 30-point performance in a single game against Drake University. Her 7.8 rebound average also ranked third on the team.

Complementing Huff's skill at the other forward spot is 6-0 senior Linda Gough of Elgin, IL, currently riding a streak of 72 consecutive games played at Wisconsin. Gough is the pre-eminent figure in the Badger record book. She tops the all-time scoring list with 790 points, while standing in second place in rebounding with 513 in a three-year career. Linda posted a 13.6 scoring average last season, and an 8.0 rebounding average including the school record 23 she collected in a single game last season against Lincoln College.

Filling out the imposing front line is a 6-2 junior returnee to the Badger line up. Michelle Lowman of New Haven, CT, returns to Wisconsin after a one year hiatus. As a freshman, Lowman averaged 8.5 points and 8.8 rebounds per game while solidifying the team's defense with 73 blocked shots.

Veterans Ann Hall and Nancy Fahey will return to the back court this season for Wisconsin. Hall, a 5-11 junior from Brownsville, WI, averaged 9.4 points

and 8.9 rebounds as a forward last year, but will bring her skills and leadership to the point position this season. Senior guard Nancy Fahey of Belleville, WI, will be one of several guards looking for playing time opposite Hall. Fahey dished out 117 assists to complement her 1979-80 scoring average of 6.7 last year.

Other returnees and newcomers to the Badgers should provide pleasant problems for Coach Qualls this season. Sophomore Carol Jones, a cat-quick guard from Chicago, IL, should give excellent relief to the backcourt where she scored 7.9 points and accumulated 54 assists as a freshman last year. A sister team could also prove effective for the Badgers as Theresa Huff's sister Janet joins the guard line-up this year. "Little Huff" averaged 22 points and 10 rebounds as a forward for Milwaukee Riverside her senior year.

Two freshman guards, Faith Johnson of Minneapolis and Lori Kroening of



Wausau, WI, will also be looked to for playing time. Johnson at 5-5 lends great speed to the point position while Kroening adds scoring abilities from the perimeter with her 17-foot jumper.

Newcomer 5-10 Vivian Rorer of Peoria, IL, will be looked to for leadership as well as speed and scoring. The Grand View College transfer is the fastest forward on the Wisconsin team and averaged 16 points and 13 rebounds per game in her two years at Grand View.

Two other returnees to the Wisconsin squad are sophomore guard Debbie Ambruso and forward/center Kris Hallis of Antigo, WI. Although both sophomores saw limited playing time last season, they will be expected to lend their year of experience to the squad this season.

An impressive schedule awaits the 1980-81 cagers including dates with eight Big Ten schools, six of which are played at home in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse. The Badgers also host their own Badger Invitational December 12-13, with Big Ten champion Northwestern, Western Kentucky and Western Michigan participating. Wisconsin will also take a swing through the South with games scheduled against the University of Mississippi, Memphis State University and Tennessee's Union University. The Big Ten Basketball Championship will be played at Northwestern in February, and Illinois State will host the Region V Division I Championship in March.
