WISCONSIN LED THE NATION IN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ATTENDANCE FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR IN 1972-73. AN ALL TIME COLLEGIATE RECORD OF 167,902 FANS WATCHED TWENTY HOME GAMES IN THE DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM. THIS BROKE THE PREVIOUS ALL TIME COLLEGIATE RECORD OF 157,142 FANS WHICH WISCONSIN ATTRACTED THE PREVIOUS SEASON. THE 1972-73 AVERAGE ATTENDANCE OF 8,395 FOR EACH HOME GAME WAS A NEW WISCONSIN RECORD AND 18 OF WISCONSIN'S HOME GAMES WERE PLAYED IN FRONT OF STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWDS. INCREASED SEATING AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOME GAMES ALLOWED 15 CONSECUTIVE CAPACITY, STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWDS OF 8,431 WHICH IS THE SCHOOL RECORD. FOR THE ENTIRE 40 GAME SEASON THE NATIONAL CHAMPION BADGERS PLAYED IN FRONT OF 268,917 FANS WHICH IS ANOTHER ALL TIME COLLEGIATE RECORD.

IN 1972-73 WISCONSIN REACHED THE PINNACLE OF COLLEGIATE HOCKEY SUCCESS BY CAPTURING THEIR FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP AT THE BOSTON GARDEN. IN THEIR SEVENTH YEAR UNDER HEAD COACH BOB JOHNSON, THE BADGERS SET SCHOOL RECORDS FOR MOST VICTORIES IN A SINGLE SEASON (29), THE LONGEST WINNING STREAK OVERALL (11) AND IN WCHA PLAY (9), BROKE ALL EXISTING ATTENDANCE RECORDS, AND FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR THE BADGERS WERE THE BIG TEN CHAMPIONS.

THE 1972-73 TEAM SET A TOTAL OF SIX TEAM RECORDS AND TIED ANOTHER. WISCONSIN SKATERS SET TWELVE NEW INDIVIDUAL RECORDS IN WCHA PLAY, TIED FIVE OTHER LEAGUE MARKS, AND SET FIVE NEW OVERALL RECORDS.

FROM NOVEMBER 4, 1972 THRU DECEMBER 22, 1972 THE BADGERS WENT UNDEFEATED (12 GAMES) WINNING 11 AND TYING ONE, TO SET A NEW MARK FOR CONSECUTIVE WINS OFFALL, 11 AND CONFERENCE NON-LOSSES AT 10. FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR VISCONSIN WON THE ST; LOUIS TOURNAMENT, DEFEATING MINNESOTA 5-1 FOR THE TITLE. IN COMPETITION AGAINST BIG TEN SCHOOLS THE BADGERS WERE 8-3-1, TO AGAIN WIN THAT CONFERENCE CROWN.

WISCONSIN FINISHED THIRD IN THE WCHA WITH AN 18-9-1 MARK AND 47 POINTS, AND FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR ADVANCED TO THE WCHA PLAYOFFS.

THE BADGERS FIRST MET MINNESOTA AND DEFEATED THE GOPHERS 14-10 IN A WILD TWO GAME TOTAL GOAL SERIES. IN THE WCHA FINAL PLAY-OFFS WISCONSIN TRAVELED TO SOUTH BEND, IND. TO FACE NOTRE DAME. THE IRISH AND THE BADGERS BATTLED DOWN TO THE FINAL MINUTES OF THE SECOND GAME OF THE SERIES AND ON A GOAL BY DAVE PAY WISCONSIN WON THE SECOND GAME 4-3 AND THE SERIES IN TOTAL GOALS 8-7. IN BEATING NOTRE DAME WISCONSIN EARNED THE RIGHT TO ADVANCE TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT FOR THE THIRD TIME IN FOUR YEARS.

THE SEMI-FINAL GAME AGAINST THE TOP SEEDED TEAM FROM THE EAST, CORNELL, WAS ONE OF THE MOST EXCITING IN BADGER HOCKEY HISTORY. WISCONSIN TRACED IN THE GAME 4-0 AND 5-2, BUT BATTLED BACK TO TIE THE CONTEST WITH ONLY FIVE SECONDS REMAINING IN REGULATION TIME ON A GOAL BY DEAN TALAFOUS. IN THE SUDDEN DEATH OVERTIME PERIOD IT WAS TALAFOUS AGAIN WHO SCOERD FOR THE BADGERS, WINNING THE GAME WITH 37 SECONDS LEFT IN THE PERIOD.

IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAMETWISCONSIN OVERCAME A 2-1 DENVER UNIVERSITY LEAD AND SCORED THREE CONSECUTIVE GOALS TO WIN 4-2 AND BRING THEIR FIRST NCAA CROWN BACK TO MADISON.

ATTENDANCE RECORDS CONTINUED TO FALL AS WOSCONSIN ENJOYED THE GREATEST SUPPORT ANY COLLEGIATE HOCKEY TEAM HAS EVER RECEIVED. IN 20 HOME GAMES THE BADGERS DREW 167,902 FANS, AN ALL-TIME COLLEGIATE ATTENDANCE RECORD BOTH AT WISCONSIN AND IN THE NATION. THE BADGERS AVERAGED 8,395 IN THE 8,431 SEAT DANE COUNTY COLISEUM AND 16 SELL-OUT STANDING-ROOM-ONLY CROWDS ENABLED WISCONSIN TO LEAD THE NATION IN COLLEGIATE ATTENDANCE FOR THE FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR.

WISCONSIN'S FINAL RECORD OF 29-9-2 MARKED THE SIXTH STRAIGHT YEAR THAT THE BADGERS HAVE WON 20 OR MORE GAMES TO GIVE COACH BOB JOHNSON A RECORD OF 158-73-6 FOR HIS SEVEN SEASONS AT WISCONSIN.

# ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

THE SEVENTH YEAR OF BOB JOHNSON'S STINT AS HEAD HOCKEY COACH OF THE WISCONSIN BADGERS WILL BE THE ONE HE WILL ALWAYS REMEMBER. FOR IT WAS IN HIS SEVENTH YEAR AT THE BADGER HELM THAT HE REALIZED THE DREAM OF EVERYONE WHO HAS EVER BEEN IN THE COACHING PROFESSION, A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

DURING COACH JOHNSON'S TENURE AT WISCONSIN HE HAS BROUGHT THE SPORT OF HOCKEY FROM A NON-REVENUE SPORT TO THE NUMBER TWO MONEY MAKING SPORT IN THE WISCONSIN ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT. HE HAS LED THE BADGERS TO TWO CONSECUTIVE BIG TEN TITLES 1971-72 AND 1972-73, WON THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1973 AND HIS TEAMS HAVE LED THE NATION IN ATTENDANCE FOR THE PAST FOUR SEASONS.

Johnson took over the coaching reigns at Wisconsin in Time for the 1966-67 season. After three years as an "Independent" in college hockey Johnson's Badgers Joined the tough Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA). Their first year in the league 1969-70 Wisconsin surprised the college hockey world by finishing fourth (all other first year teams had finished last) and then took third place in the NCAA tournament at Lake Placid, N.Y. In 1970-71 Wisconsin finished third in the WCHA and second in 1971-72 with the best won-lost percentage in the League.

THREE OUT OF THE PAST FOUR YEARS JOHNSON HAS LED WISCONSIN TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT. AFTER FINISHING THIRD IN THE TOURNAMENT IN 1970 WISCONSIN FINISHED THIRD AGAIN IN 1972 AND THIS LAST SEASON 1973 WON THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

WISCONSIN FANS HAVE RESPONDED TO THIS WINNING HOCKEY IN RECORD NUMBERS. THE BADGERS HAVE LED THE NATION IN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ATTENDANCE FOR THE PAST FOUR SEASON AND THIS PAST SEASON DREW AN ALL-TIME COLLEGIATE RECORD OF 167,902 FOR TWENTY HOME GAMES. THIS BROKE THE PREVIOUS ALL TIME COLLEGIATE RECORD OF 157,142 IN TWENTY GAMES SET BY WISCONSIN THE PREVIOUS SEASON.
