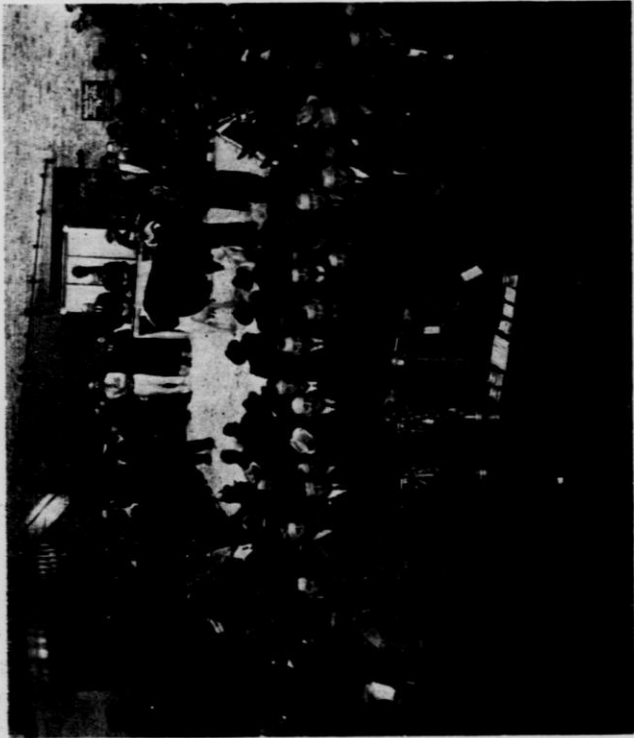

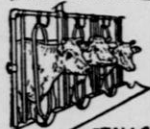

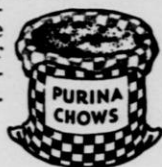

SECRETARY'S REPORT

JULY 1, 1940, TO NOVEMBER 1, 1941

The policy of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association to aid and assist in an educational way among dairy farmers of Wisconsin, and in Junior activities has been continued during the past year as always before. The activities of the Association have been directed toward the interest of both better dairying and greater dairy income for the state of Wisconsin. The Board of Directors of the Association, at the time of the last annual meeting, approved and adopted in its entirety the program of work which had been set up during the previous year. The program was outlined with the thought of extending cooperation to other existing agencies, including the College of Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, Vocational Agriculture Departments, County Agricultural Agents, Breed Associations and The Wisconsin State Fair. To promote and encourage Bull Associations, Production Record Keeping, Production Shows and Breeding Schools, and to work in every way possible with the Junior Dairymen. The Association has endeavored to cooperate fully with the above named groups. A brief summary of activities is included in this report.

1941 SPRING MEETING

The 69th Annual Convention of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association was held at Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, March 25 and 26. The two-day convention, an annual event, is held for the purpose of offering to adult groups, both men and women, and to Juniors, timely information on dairy subjects, by outstanding speakers.

In outlining the program for this convention, dairy herd improvement, marketing problems, and production testing were emphasized in every way possible. In emphasizing these problems, it perhaps would have been difficult to obtain a group of speakers capable of bringing more timely and valuable information to Wisconsin dairymen than those appearing on this program.

The cooperation of many groups was necessary in carrying out and making possible a program of this nature. To all those connected in any capacity whatever with the 69th Annual Convention, we express our appreciation and thanks for their services and assistance. The planning and conducting of the program was aided particularly by the cooperation of the city of Fond du Lac, its Association of Commerce, its Civic Clubs, and other organizations working hand in hand with committees of the various Dairy Breed Associations, the State Department of Agriculture, and the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association.

Outstanding on the two-days' program were the following speakers: L. G. Kuenning, Chief, Dairy Division of Wisconsin State Department of Agriculture; Dean E. L. Anthony, Michigan State College; Dr. J. F. Kendrick, Bureau of Dairy Industry; Ralph Ammon, Director, Wisconsin State Department of Agriculture; C. T. Conklin, Ayrshire Breeders' Association; Dr. B. A. Beach, University of Wisconsin; Dr. E. E. Heizer, University of Wisconsin; and Floyd Johnston, Iowa State College.

The Junior program, as in past conventions, was conducted separately on the first day of the two-day convention and attracted more than 1,000 out-of-town Juniors. In addition many youngsters from the city of Fond du Lac attended the Junior activities. Recognition of achievements for the year were awarded to the Departments of Vocational Agriculture and 4-H Clubs. Outstanding on the Junior program, as features of the day, were the Dairy Quiz program conducted in the morning session, inspirational talks by Dr. Heizer and C. T. Conklin, a noon luncheon at which Dean Christensen spoke. The afternoon program, sponsored by the Department of Agriculture, emphasized greater utilization of dairy products through a specially conducted interview of outstanding sports' leaders, a presentation of the Dairy Queen, and free motion pictures offering entertainment and educational views on Wisconsin farm life.

The Women's program, outlined and conducted under the supervision of a special women's committee, featured many outstanding speakers and demonstrations. Outstanding on the women's program were the numbers offered by Mrs. Blanche Hedrick, University of Wisconsin; Miss Thelma Bly, Wisconsin Power & Light Company; L. G. Kuenning, Wisconsin State Department of Agriculture; Ralph Ammon, Wisconsin State Department of Agriculture; Ted S. Hitzler, Fond du Lac attorney; and a Panel Discussion on "Nutrition and Health."

Again, we express our thanks to all those who so willingly assisted in making this 69th Annual Convention a real success, and of great value to those in attendance.

RECOGNITION OF ACHIEVEMENTS

This year, for the first time, honors were paid dairy-men who had consistently tested their herds over long periods of time. In launching this program of recognition, it was decided to pay special recognition to all those individuals who had tested in D.H.I.A. work for a period of twenty-five years or longer.

In checking with the Department of Dairy Husbandry, Wisconsin State College, it was found that seven individuals were now testing who had tested their herds for a total of twenty-five years or longer. To each of these individuals, the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association paid special honor and awarded a silverware set. The following individuals were recognized: William Beckwith, Barron; William Meisegeier, Barron; John Holloway, Union Grove; Charles Holloway, Union Grove; Geo. Weiner & Son, Sparta; C. A. Schroeder, West Bend; and Martin Rockman, Barron.

This program of recognizing consistent and long time testing of dairy herds will be continued as an annual event by the association.

Cooperation between various state agencies has been sought in every possible means. Bull Associations have continued to be a major project of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association and much time was spent in organizing and supervising cooperative associations so that more good bulls would be alive when proved, and greater use would be made of the great sires when found.

In connection with the program of work this year, and the better sire campaigns which were begun a year ago, approximately 75 demonstrations with an attendance of approximately 3,750 have been conducted in the care and attention of the feet of the dairy bulls. These demonstrations were first begun as an added attraction on the programs of spring and summer dairy shows. As an outgrowth of these original demonstrations, however, many counties have asked that special dates be scheduled at which similar demonstrations could be put on as a countywide activity.

BETTER SIRE CAMPAIGNS

During the fall months of 1940 several counties were organized through the cooperation of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association and Extension Workers for the purpose of carrying out an intensified week's educational program on the need and use of better herd sires.

It was the intention and purpose of these meetings to lead to the organization of cooperative bull associations, cooperative placement of young sires out of tested herds, increased production testing, and improved management methods of dairy herds. The meetings which were conducted last year were very satisfactory from the standpoint of developing this local interest, and their reactions. Similar meetings will be organized and conducted following the annual meeting this year.

EXHIBITS

This year again the Stars of the Milky Way exhibit was sponsored by the Association. One cow of each breed from four separate regions within the state was taken to the State Fair for an educational display which lasted the duration of the Fair.

These cows were selected on a basis of type, production, and reproduction.

Completing the exhibit was a proved sire and ten of his daughters, all show-ring winners, all proving their ability as milk producers.

The twenty cows belonged to: District No. 1, Harry C. Dix, Menomonie; Emil J. Jensen, Menomonie; Walter Matthys, Barron; J. H. 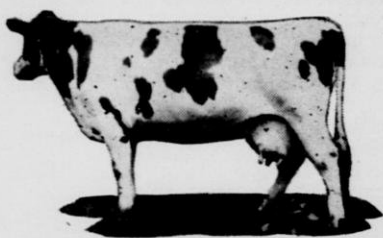
