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ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOAPD OF REGENTS

Madison, Wisconsin

Saturday, June 16, 1928, 10 A. M.

Budget adopted -See fsp. 16-17 Exhibits

President Grady presiding

PRESENT: President Frank; Regents Bachman, Berger, Callahan, Cashman, Faast, Grady; Mead, Nelson, Olbrich, Richardson, Schmidtmann, Waters, Wild.

ABSENT: Regents Gale, Gundersen, Runge.

Upon motion of Regent Schmidtmann, seconded by Regent Richardson, the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on April 25, 1928, were approved as sent out to the regents.

The matter of the salary for Dean Snell for the year 1928-29 was discussed, and it was moved by Regent Callahan that the salary be made \$10,000. Called vote was taken. Regents voting "Aye", Bachman, Berger, Callahan, Mead, Richardson, Schmidtmann - 6; Regents voting "No", Cashman, Faast, Grady, Nelson, Olbrich, Waters, Wild, - 7. Motion lost.

Regent Olbrich moved, seconded by Regent Wild, that the salary of Dean Snell for the year 1928-29 be made \$9,000. Called vote was taken. Regents voting "Aye", Berger, Callahan, Faast, Grady, Mead, Nelson, Olbrich, Richardson, Schmidtmann, Waters, Wild, - 11; Regents voting "No", Bachman, Cashman, - 2. Motion carried.

Regent Olbrich again presented a communication from the International Association of Machinists at Madison and endorsed by the Milwaukee Teachers' Association.

The matter was deferred until the next legislative budget is

Regent Olbrich made a detailed report relative to the transfer of the Ward Farm as a portion of the consideration involved in the acquisition of the so-called Nelson Farm by Madison Parks Foundation; stated that three separate appraisals had been made of the property; that the Parks Foundation included the same in its dealings with Mr. Hudson who held the second mortgage on the Nelson Farm in the belief that they were rendering a service to the University in procuring a disposition of the farm on the basis of a ten thousand dollar consideration.

He stated that by reason of the fact that he occupied a dual relationship to the situation, being a member of the Trust Funds

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Committee and also a director and an active force in the affairs of the Madison Parks Foundation, that this should be made clear. He also stated that if any member of the Board felt that under all the circumstances the University would be in a better situation to own the Ward Farm than to have a well secured first mortgage for \$10,000.00, that it was still perfectly feasible to turn the Ward Farm back to the University and that its use in the transaction was in no sense a matter of any favor to Madison Parks Foundation in its operations. An informal ballot was taken for the office of Vice President. Thirteen votes were east, of which Regent Faast received twelve, Regent Callahan one. It was

VOTED, That the By-Laws be suspended and that a unanimous ballot be cast for Regent Faast as Vice President. The ballot was cast and Regent Faast declared elected.

Upon motion of Regent Bachman, seconded by Regent Schmidtmann, it was

VOTED, That the rules be suspended and M. E. McCaffrey be elected Secretary for the year 1928-29. Motion carried.

This was formally ruled upon by the Attorney General at the time these courses were made optional,

The report was approved and the committee discharged.
