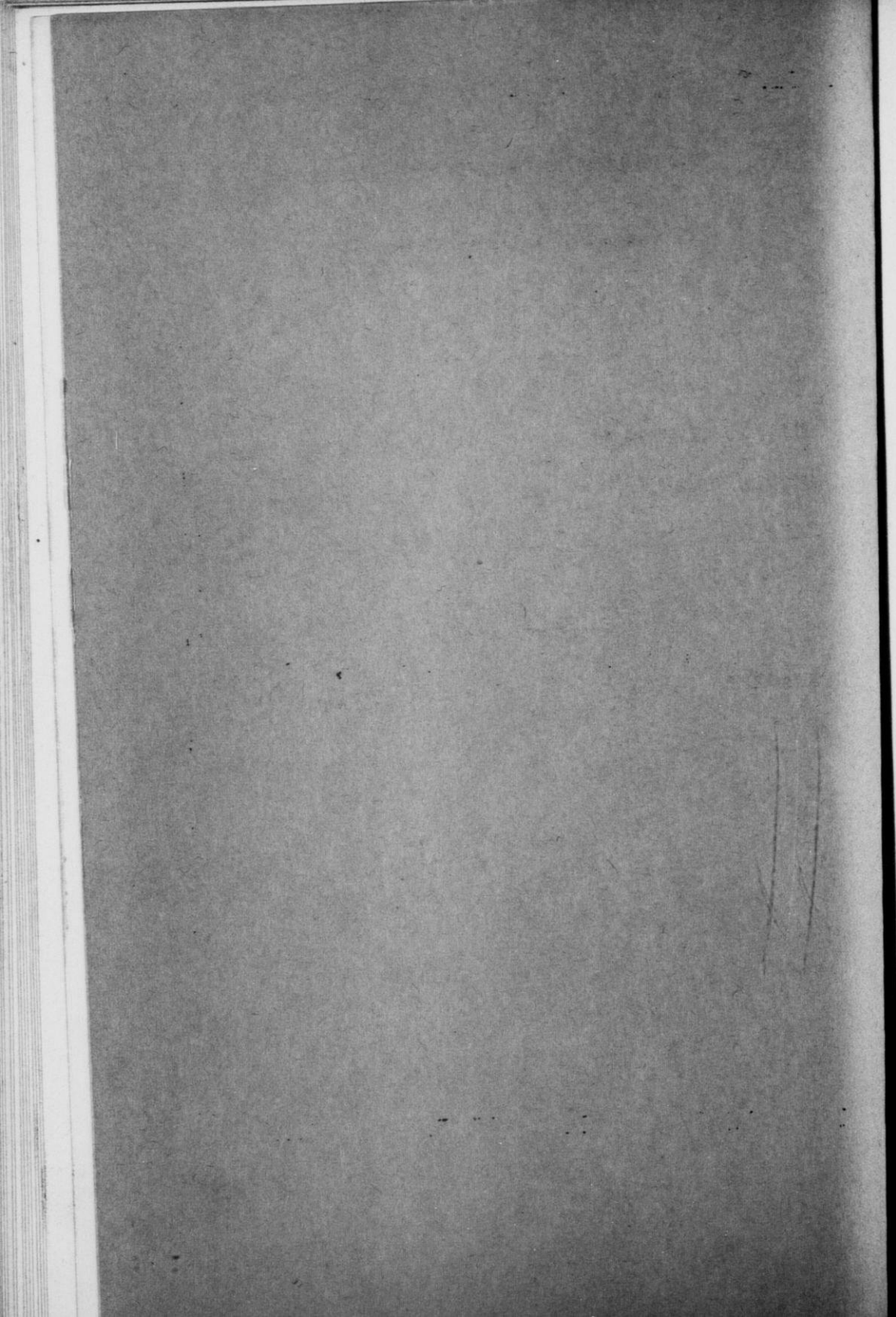

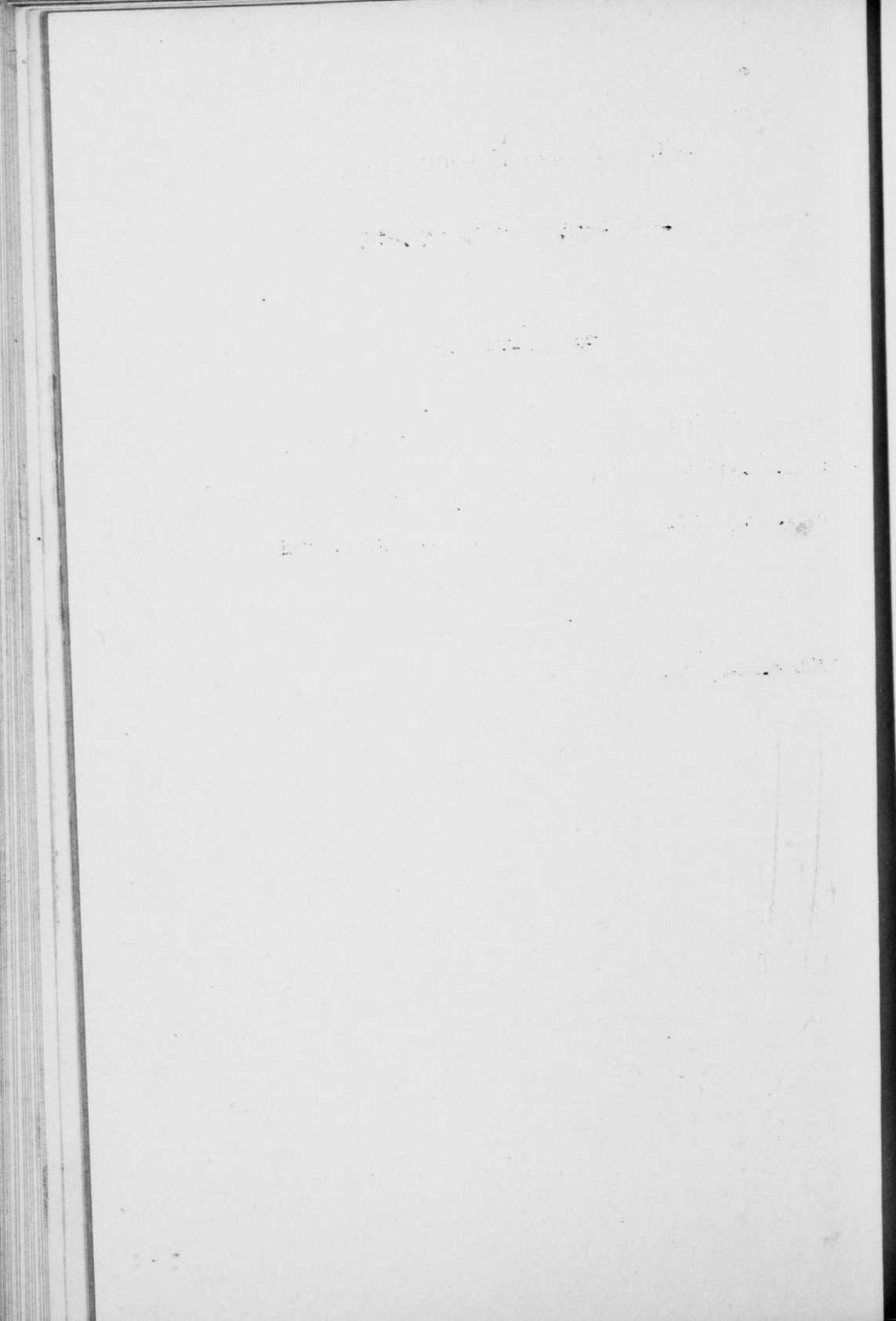

Sir: In compliance with law we have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of this department for the two years ending June 30, 1942.

The policy of withholding state lands from public sale, in general, which has prevailed since 1913, has been continued. The market did not dictate otherwise and it appears more beneficial to the State Trust Funds to hold such lands for better prices or hold for a future crop of timber than sell such lands at \$1.00 to \$2.00 an acre after the timber has been removed. A few isolated descriptions were sold when the greater portion of the timber stand was mature and damaged or had no timber or will not grow timber, and when the adjoining land owner needed such land as an extension to his farm, and further, expensive for this office to administer. One sale of 4,592.14 acres of Normal School lands in Forest County was made to the United States government under Section 1.055, Wisconsin Statutes, as part of the National Forest, and to assist said government in a cooperative employment program for that region.

Some isolated stands of damaged and ripe timber have been sold to salvage any future losses because of the timber adjoining being cut, leaving such stands subject to all weather hazards and the withdrawing of timber cutting operations by certain Lumber Companies who own all the adjoining lands, leaving no prospects of the sale of such timber after such withdrawal.

A great deal of thought and consideration was given the last two years to the mature stand of timber on the state school lands and at the last session of the Legislature, a bill was submitted to appropriate \$25,000 to this Commission to have such school lands appraised. This was Bill No. 360A and passed both houses with but one dissenting vote, however, vetoed by the Governor. It is the wish of this Commission to introduce a similar bill at the coming session. Approximately 60% of the state school lands and timber were appraised in 1929 and 1930, leaving the remaining 40% not appraised since 1904 and 1913.

There was an increase in loans from the State Trust Funds in 1941 under the provisions of Chapter 25 of the Statutes. However, there has been a decline in 1942 because of Government restrictions on new constructions because of the present war. Interest rate on loans under the above section of the statutes has continued at $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum.
