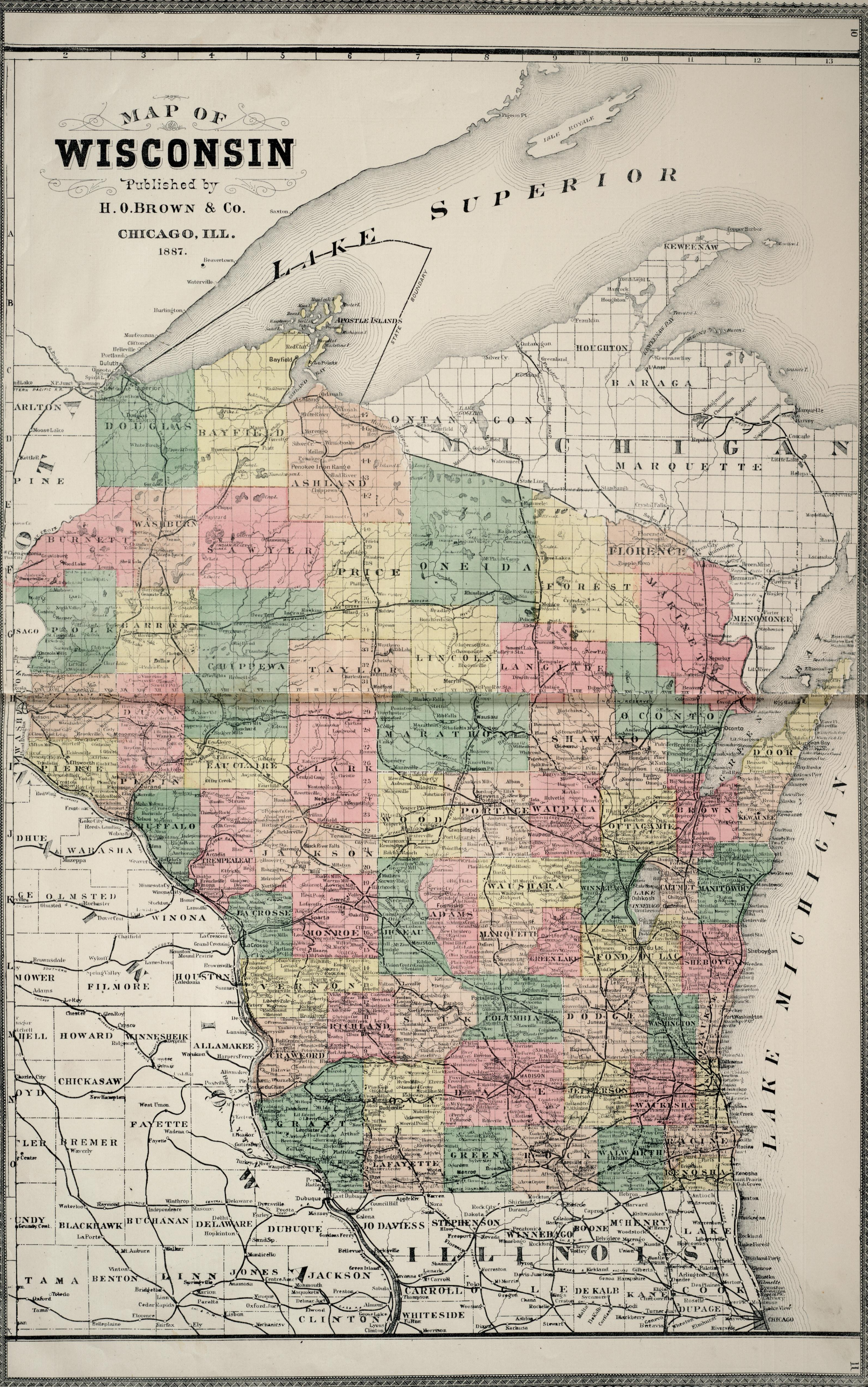

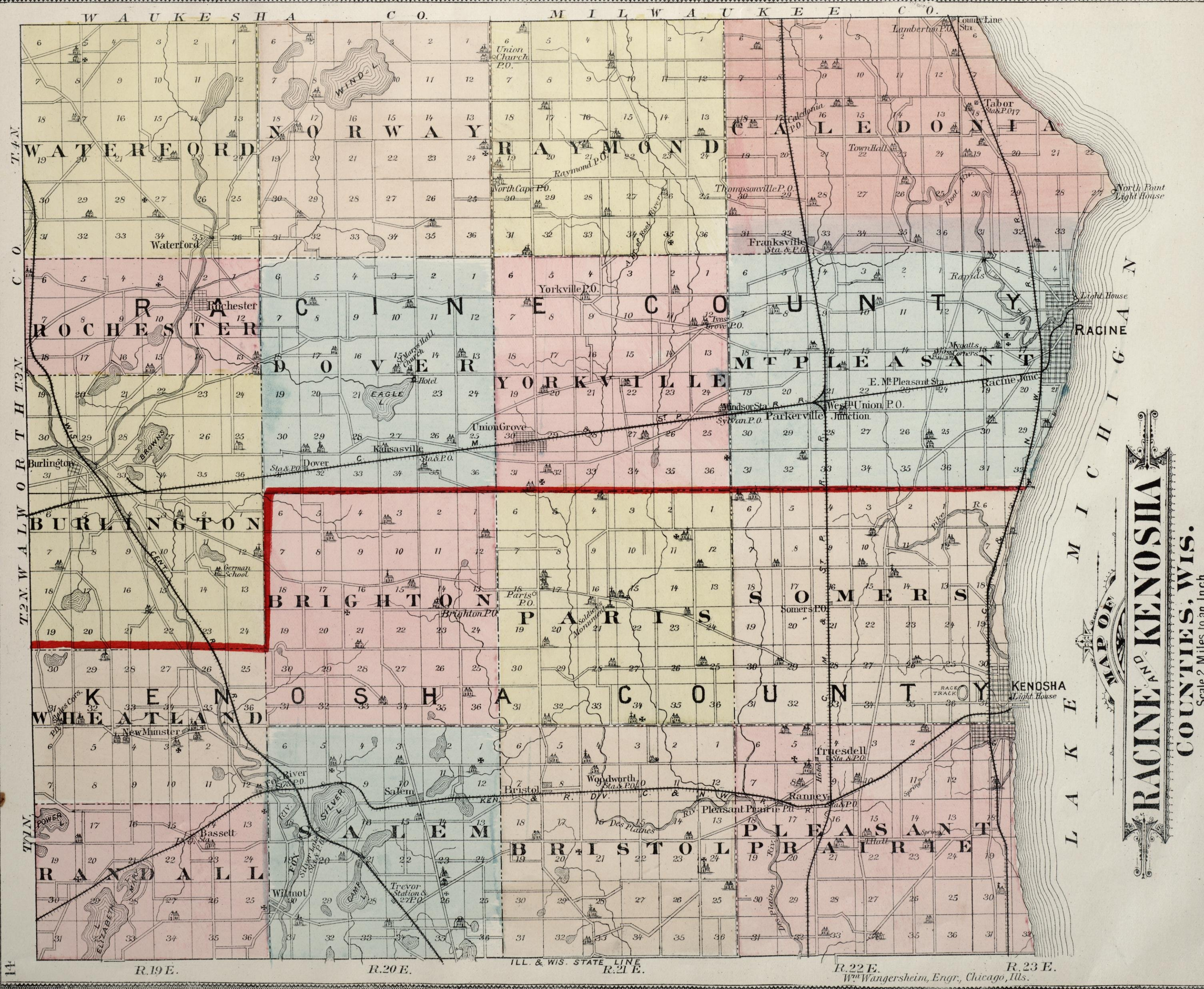



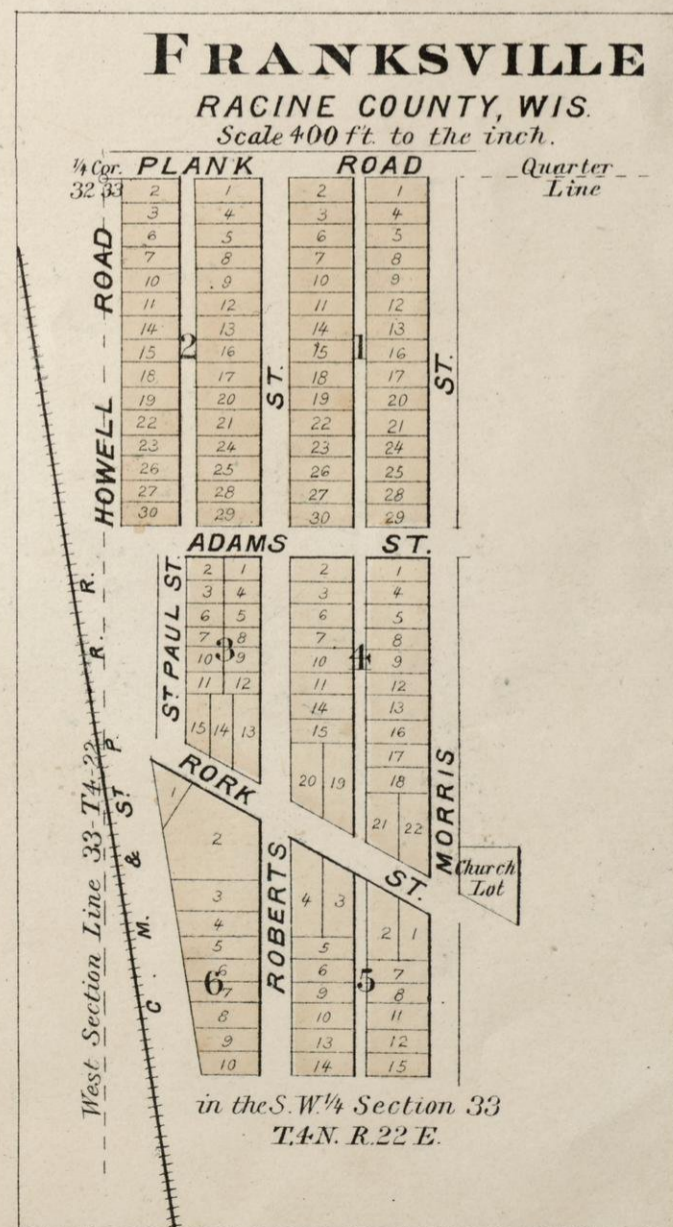
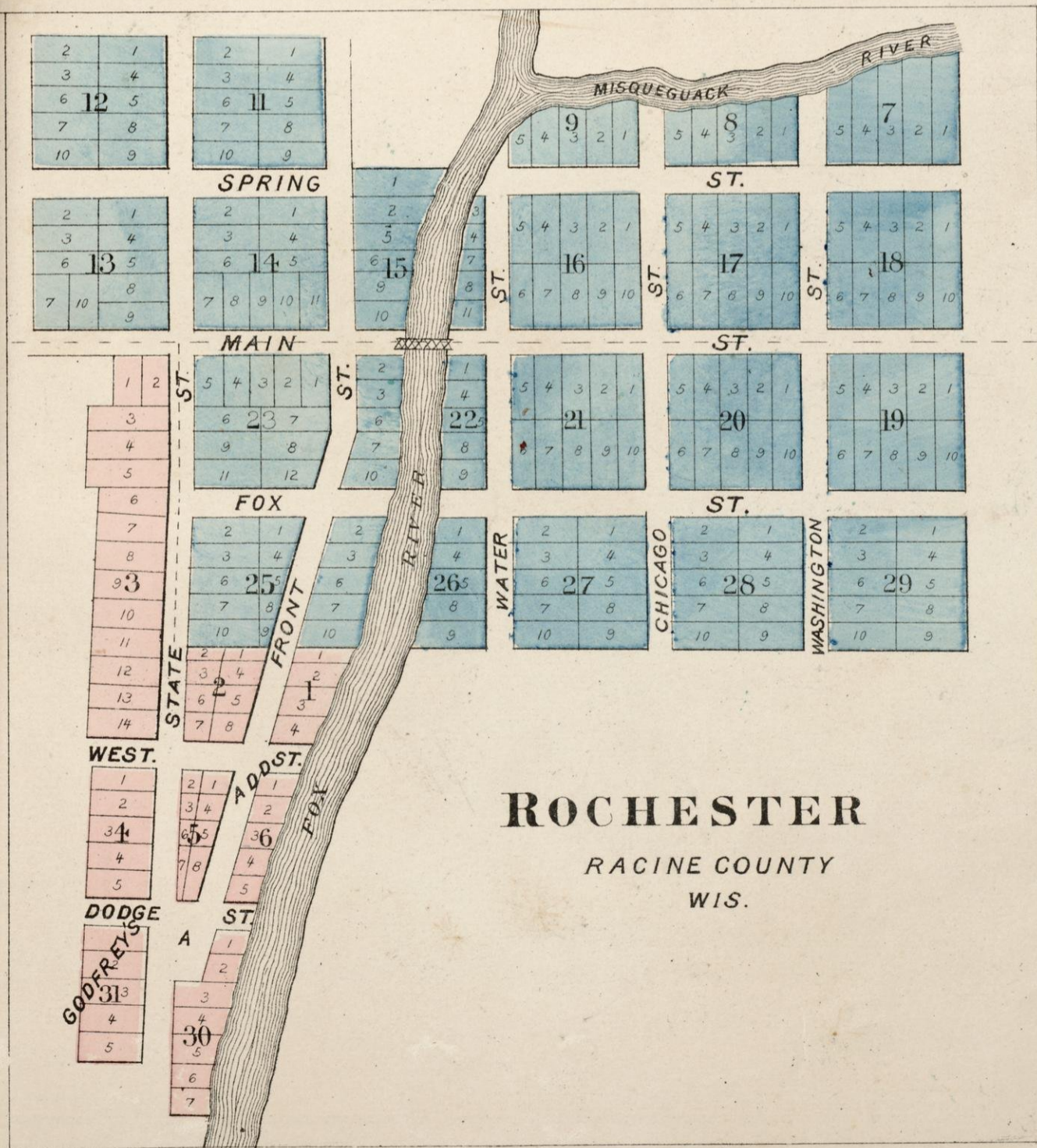
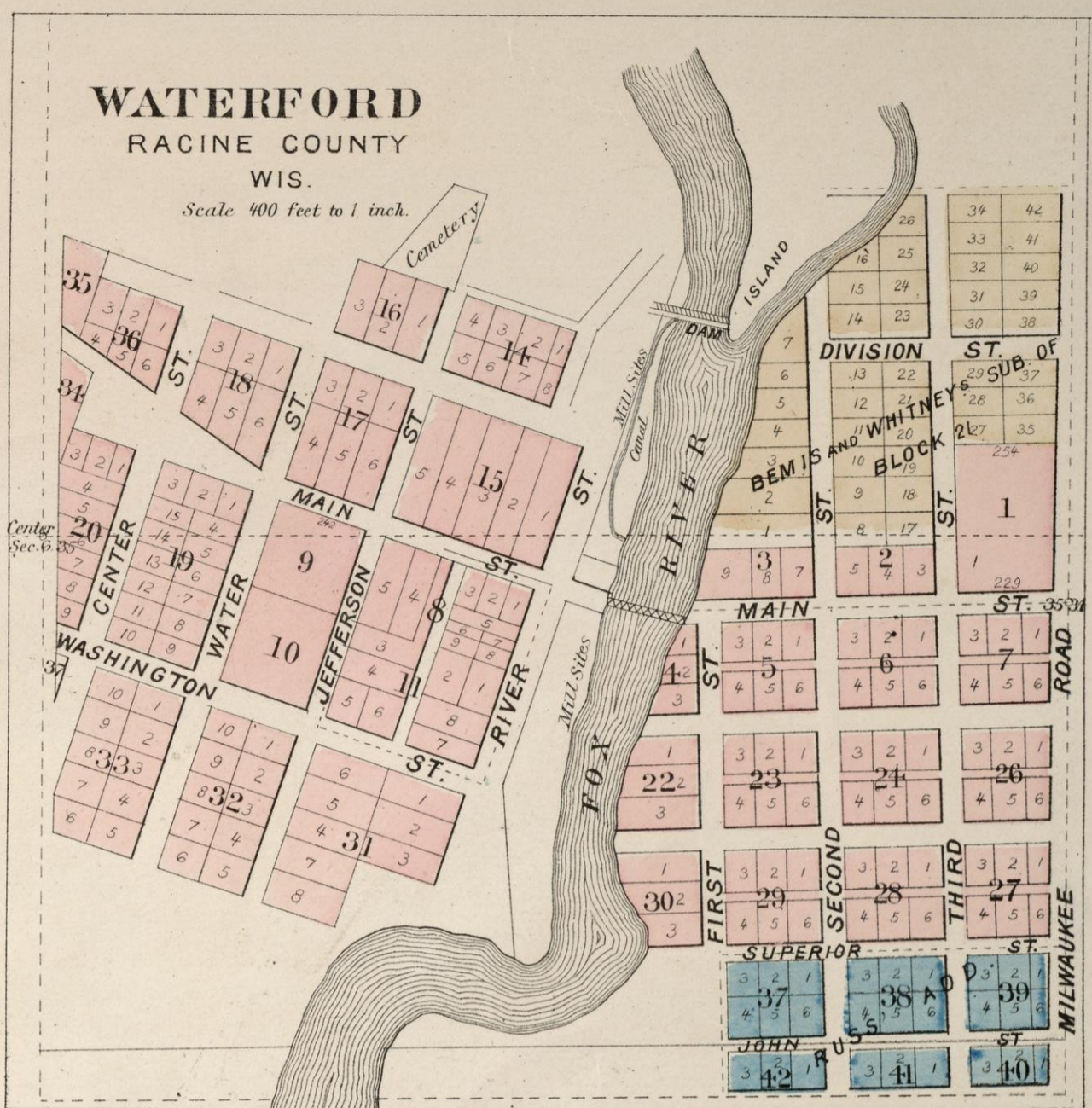
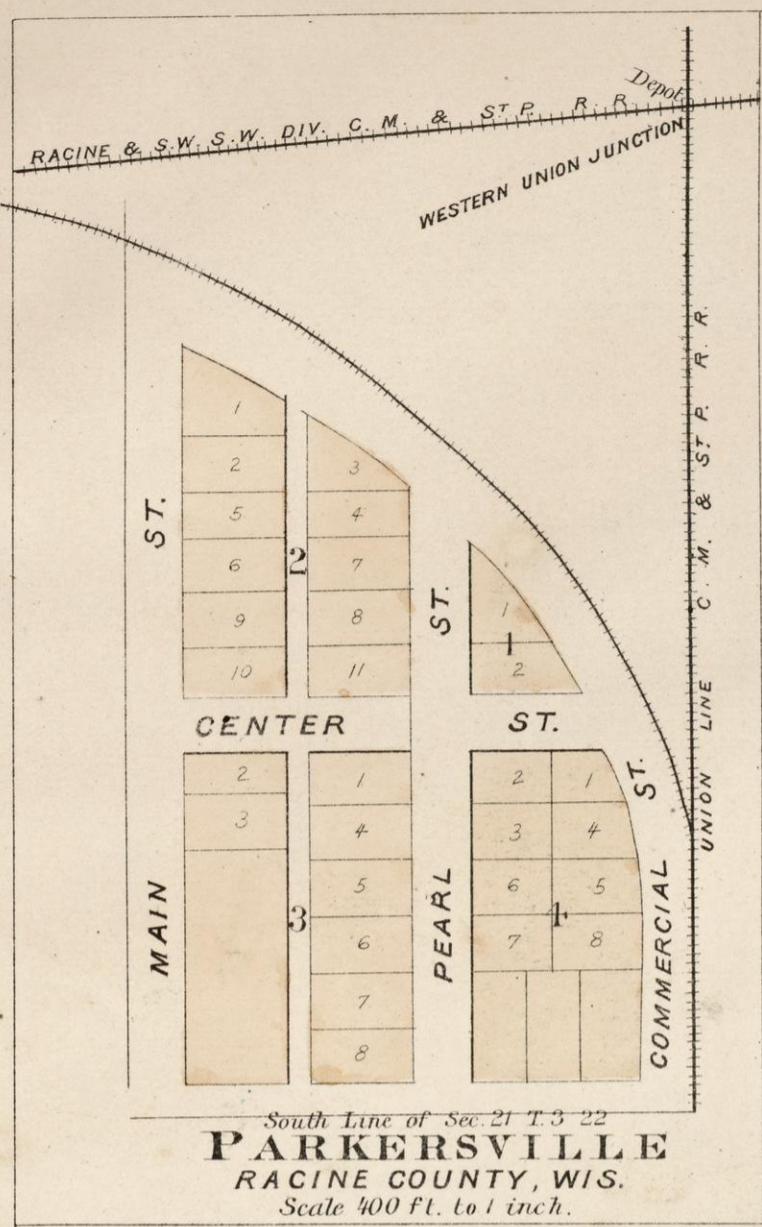
MAP OF ROCHESTER

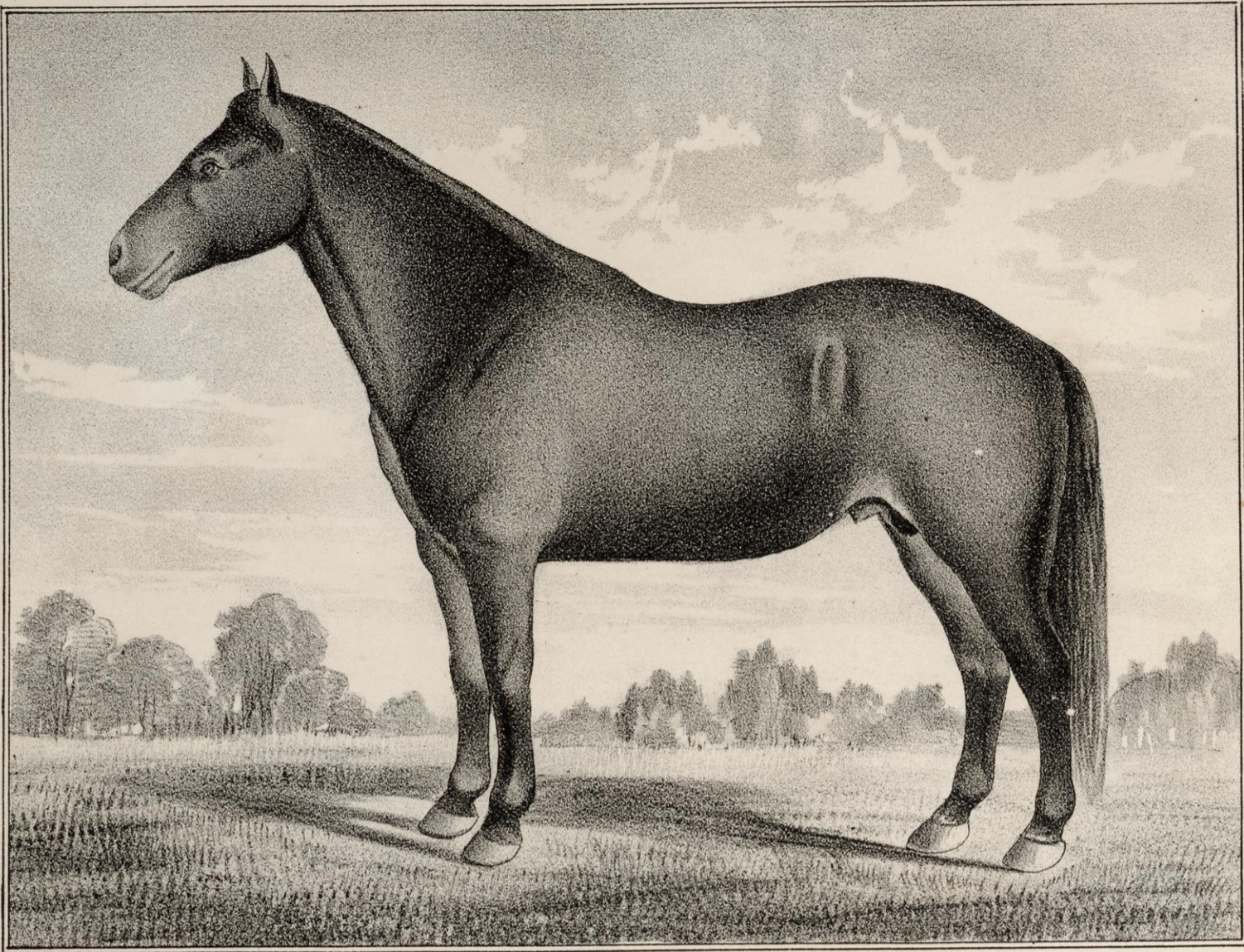

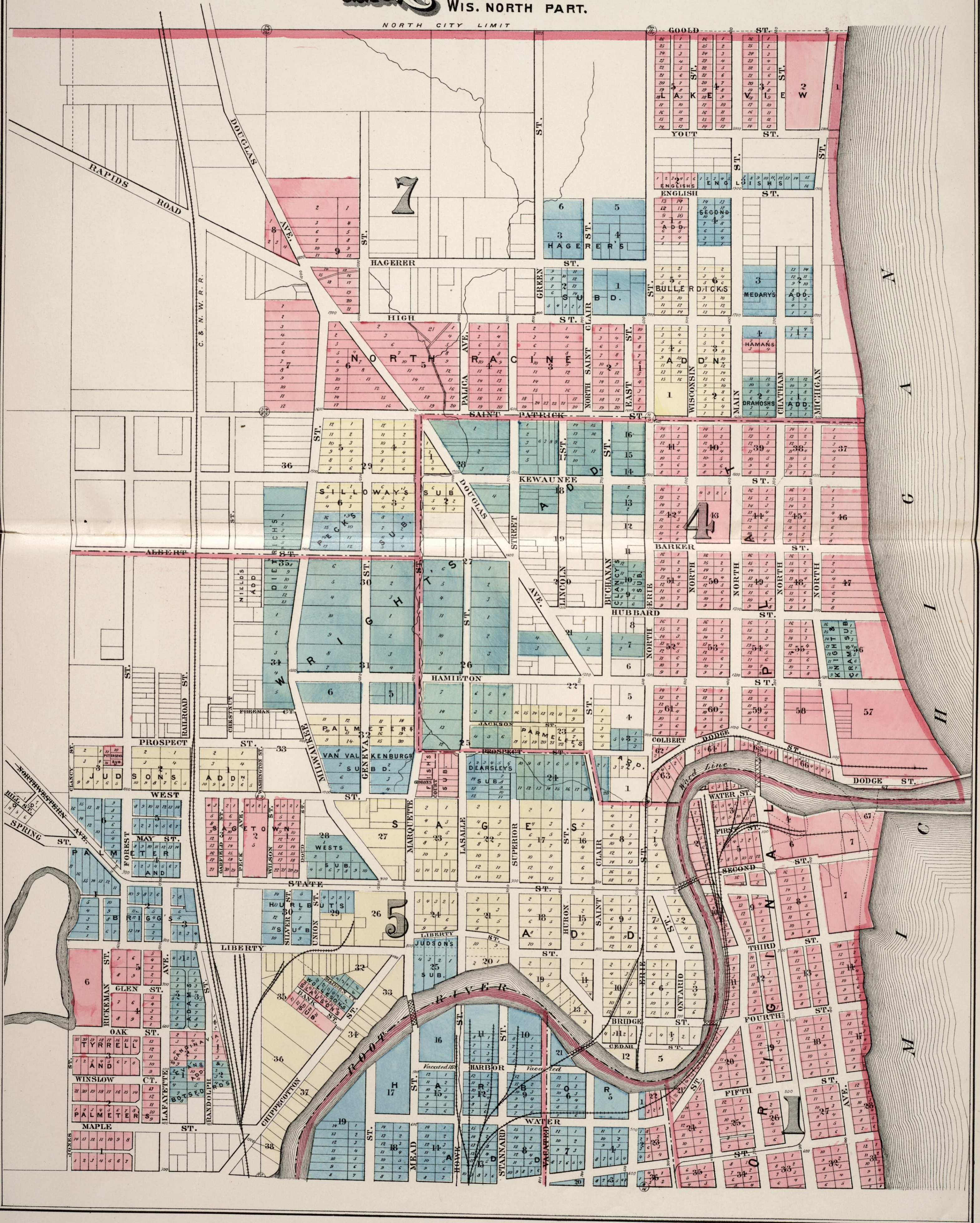

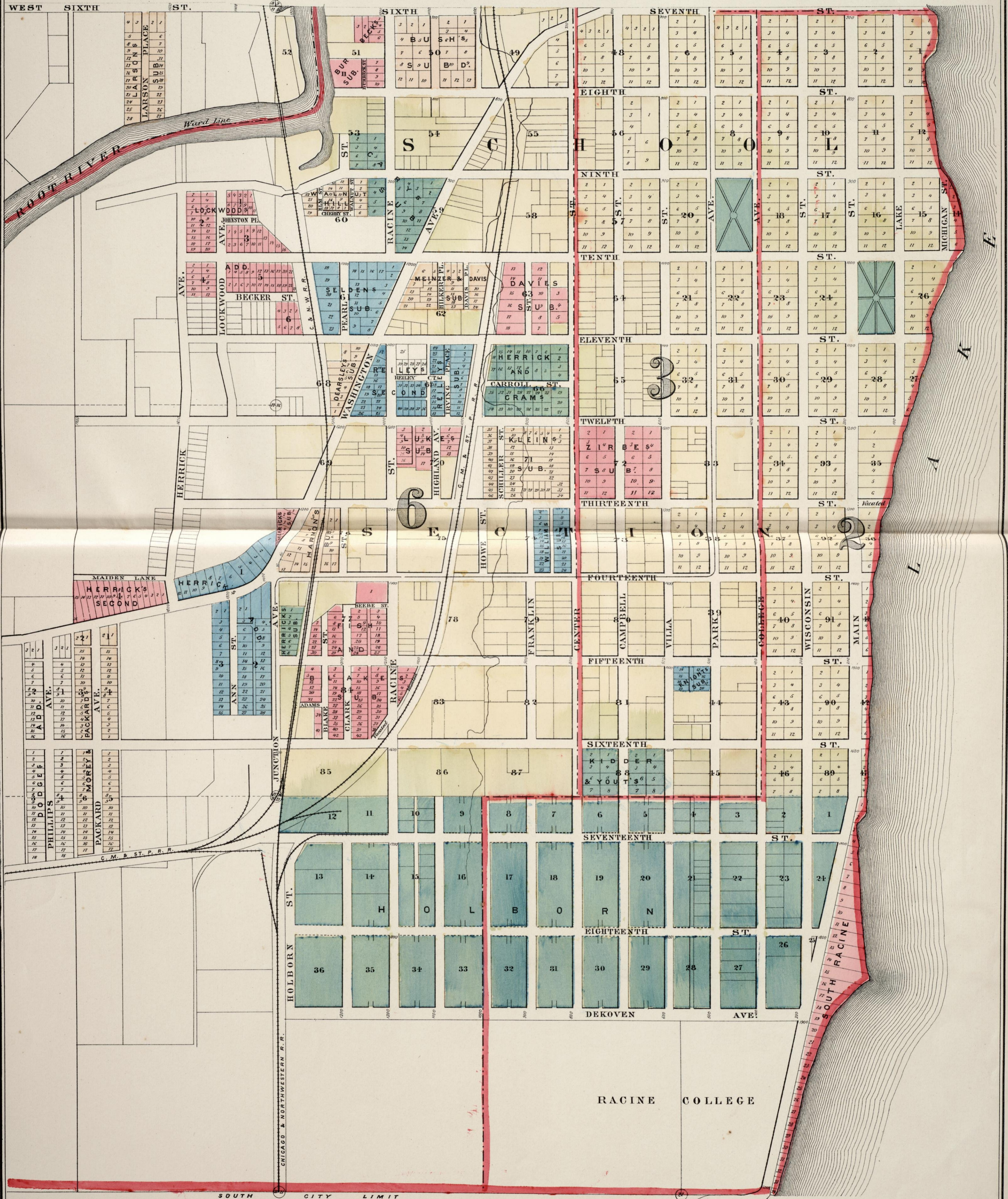
RES. OF JAMES BOLTON, RACINE, WIS.

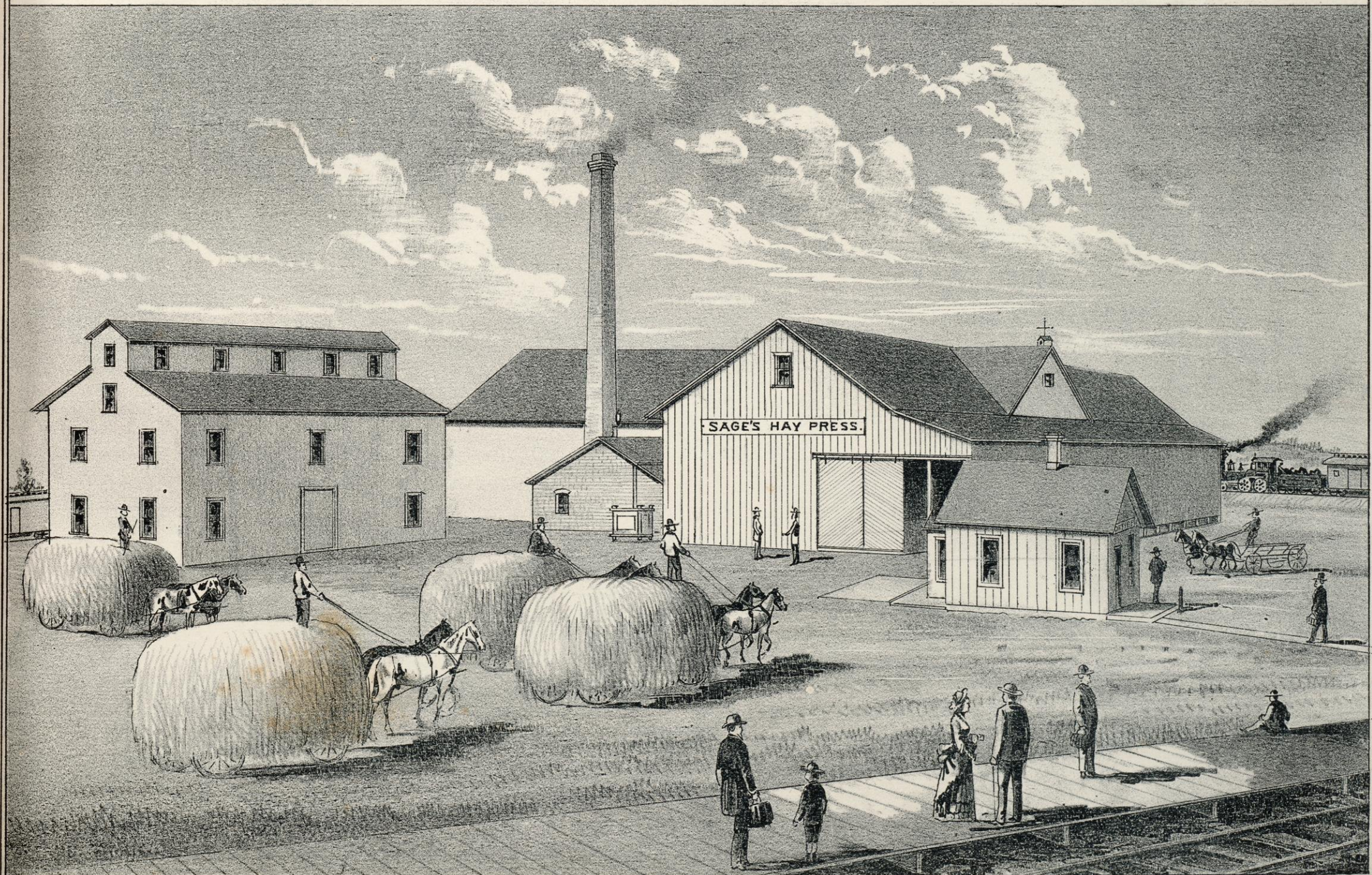


MAP OF THE CITY OF RACINE Wis. SOUTH PART.

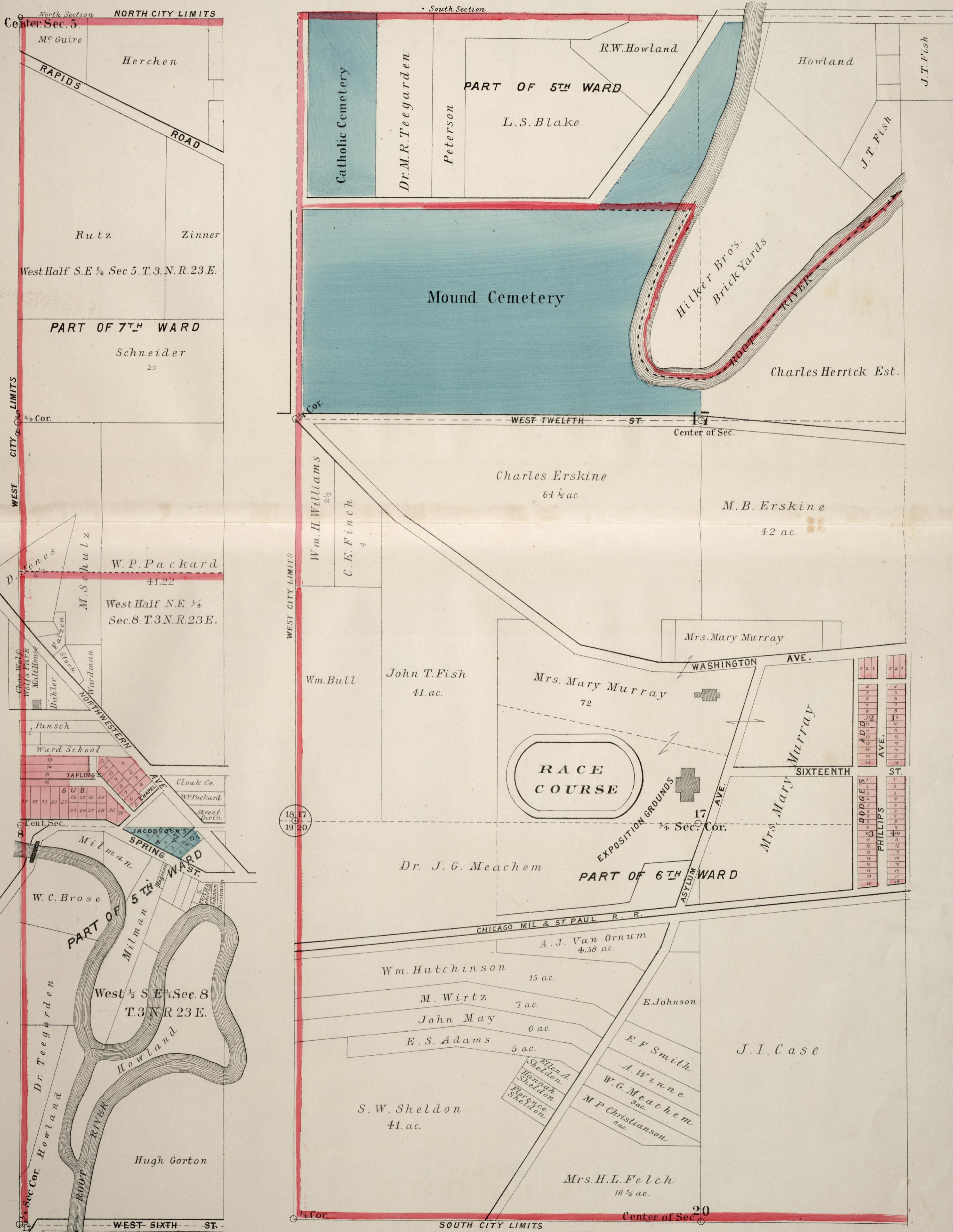

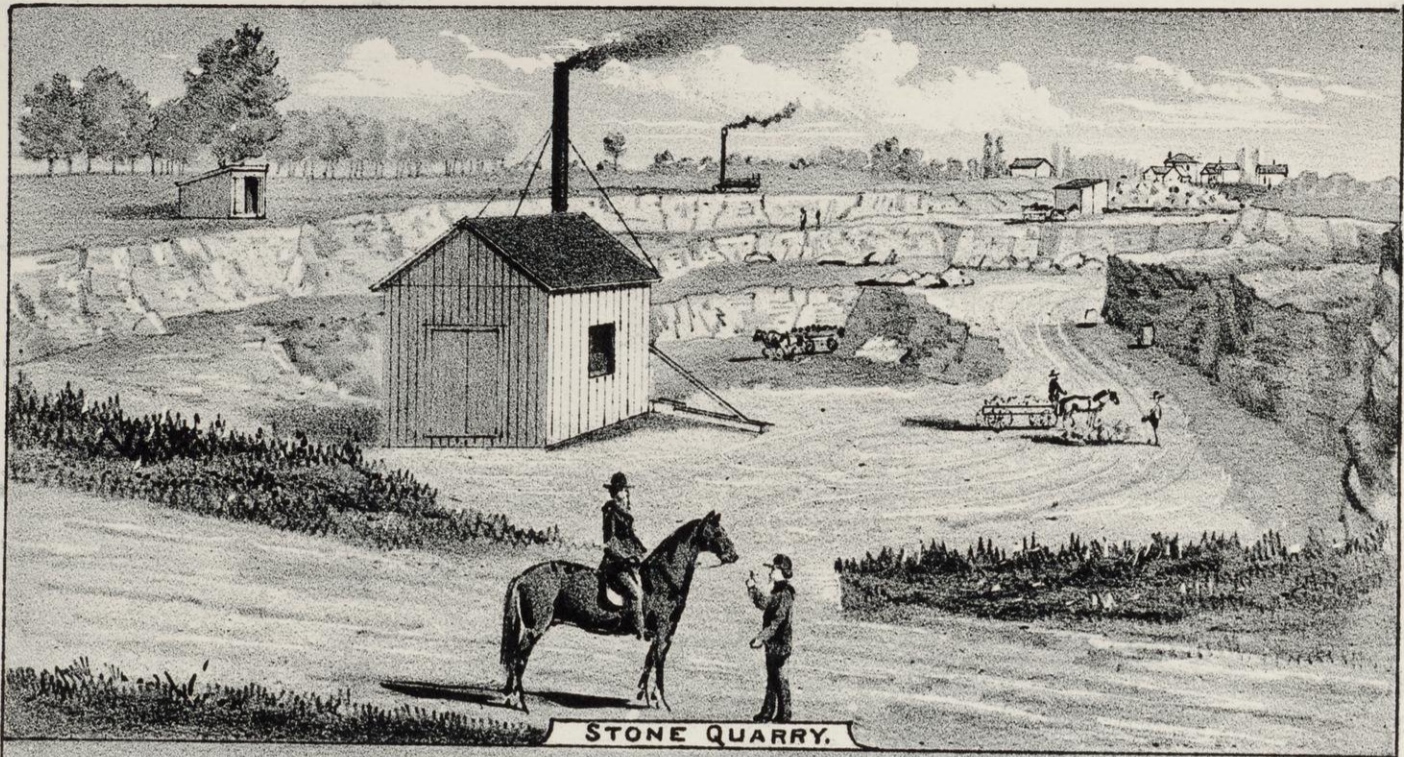

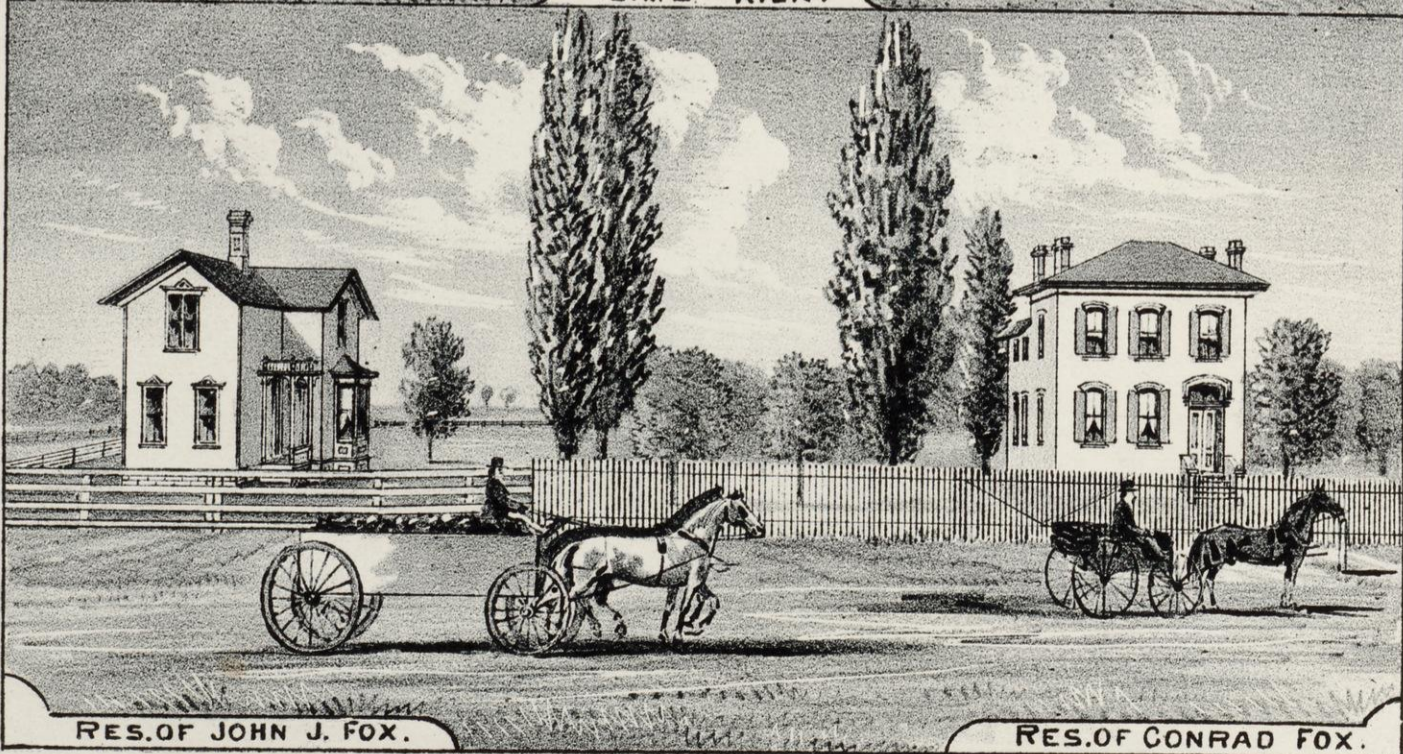

The association furnished in an elegant manner, a suite of five rooms in the Gorton Block, meetings held weekly have been largely attended, and marked by a spirit of devotion to the interests of the city, which could not fail to produce the most favorable results, among which may be mentioned the organization of the E. W. Rider Manufacturing Co., the Chicago Rubber Clothing Co., (of Racine,) the removal to Racine of the extensive Cloak Factory of A. Ellinger & Co., of Chicago, the organization of the Racine Tack Factory, (removed from Milwaukee,) and a number of other enterprises now in course of development which give promise of great additions to the wealth and population of the city. Indirectly the association assisted materially in the reorganization of the Fish Brothers Wagon Co. The vast amount previously paid for labor in Racine has thus been increased nearly \$50,000 per month. Friendly, social and business relations have been established among the business men of the city, and their efforts can now be concentrated upon any project for the public benefit within a few hours. At the annual meeting in May 1887, but few changes were made in the list of officers, and the prospects for future success of the association are very bright.

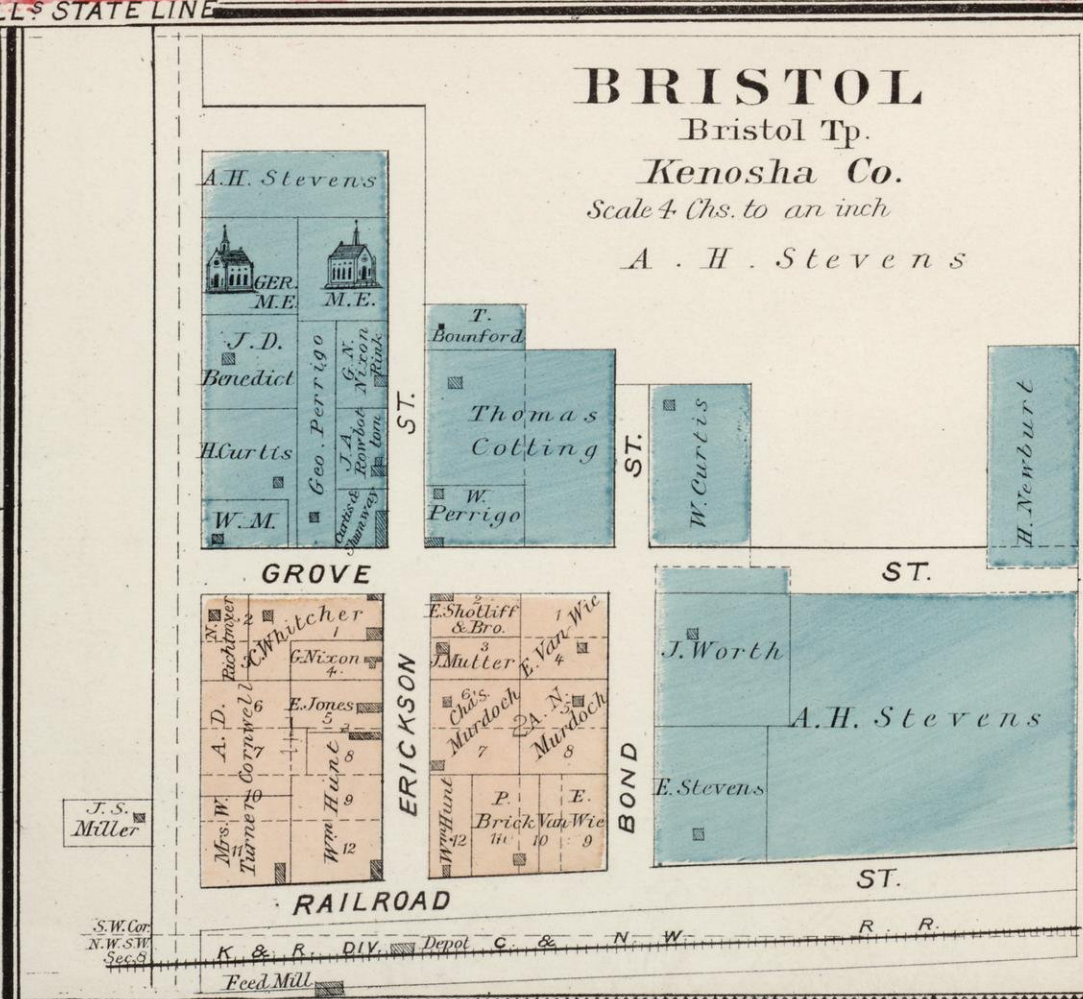
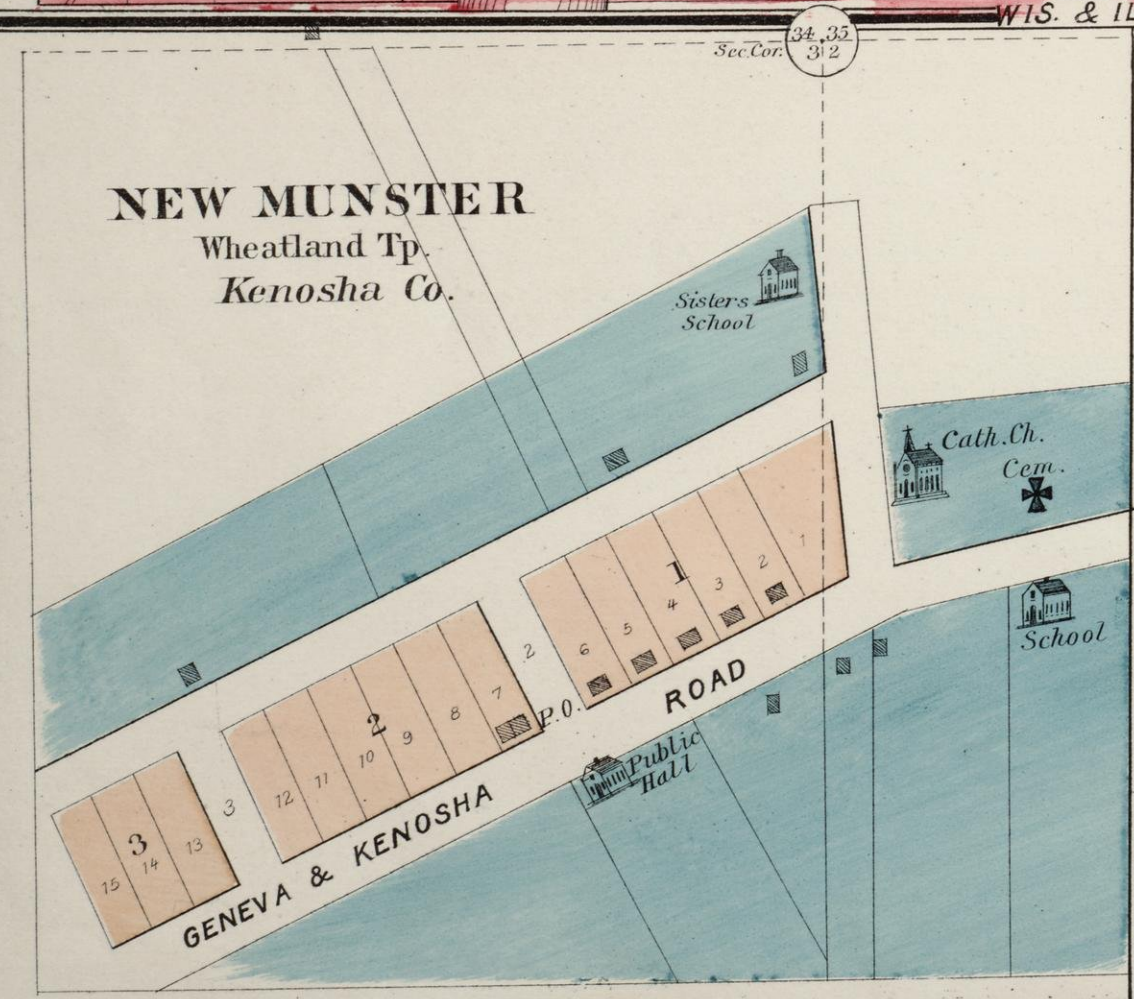
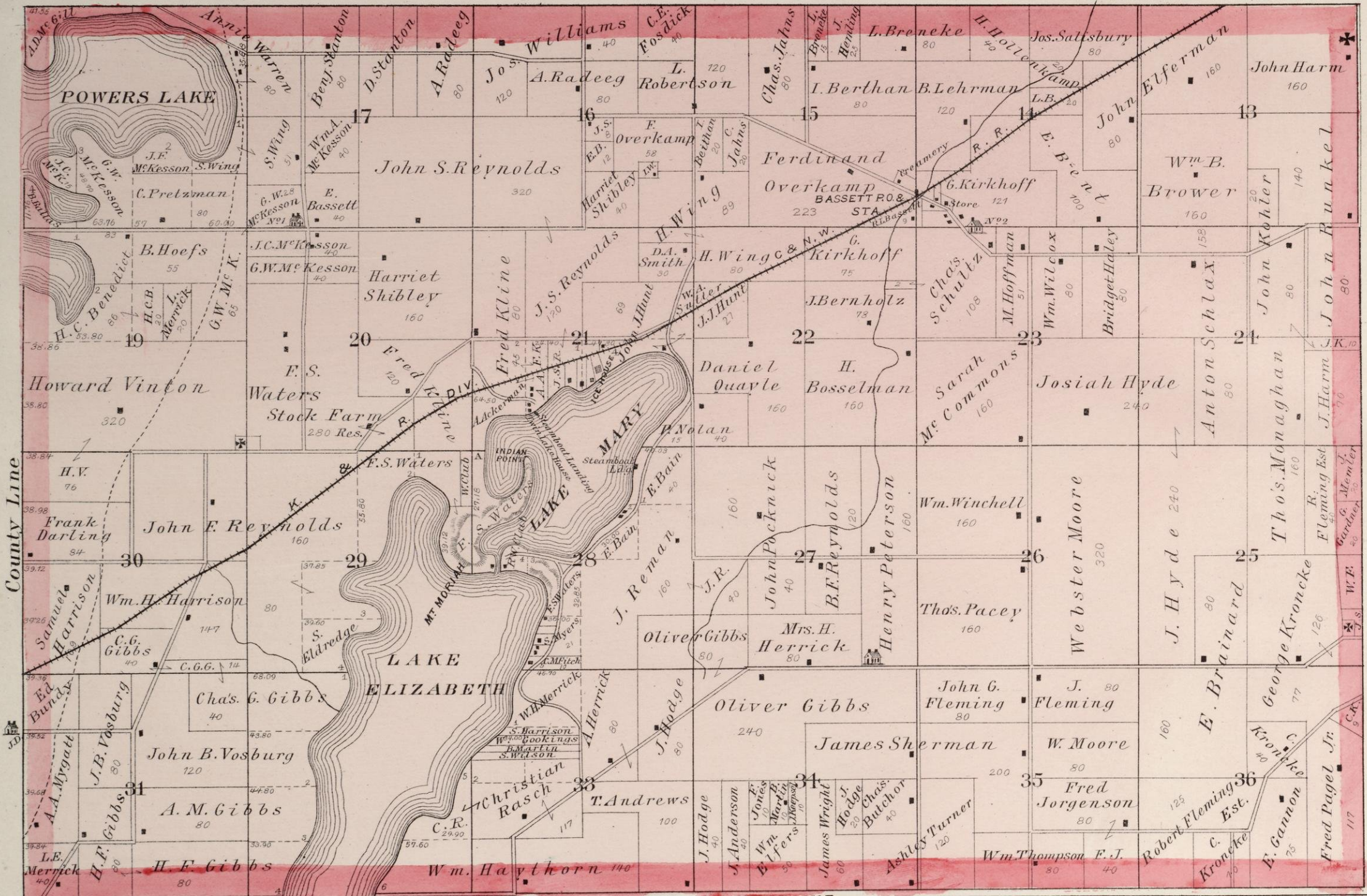
Map of SILVER LAKE
