# THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN

The University of Wisconsin, one of the world's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students assembled February 5, 1849. Junior year abroad programs are offered for students going to Brazil, China, England, France, West Germany, Hungary, Israel, India, Italy, Spain, Sweden, Norway, Nepal, Thailand and Mexico and Quebec for summer study.

The UW's Center for Health Sciences is one of the Midwest's leading centers for patient care, education of physicians and other health professionals, research and public service. It includes the Medical, Nursing, Pharmacy, and Allied Health Professions schools: UW Hospital and Clinics; State Laboratory of Hygiene; UW Health Service; and Wisconsin Clinical Cancer Center - one of 21 designated cancer centers in the country.

More than 400 campus organizations offer a wide variety of activities for Wisconsin students - including social, political, philosophic or religious, sports, honorary, ecological, philanthropic, drama and music groups plus fraternities and sororities. Film societies show 400 titles a year, and the intramural recreation program services some 35,000 students and staff at five indoor recreational facilities every month.

# **COVERING THE BADGERS**

## **WORKING PRESS**

Wisconsin's working press-radio-television facilities are limited at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum. Visiting media should enter the Coliseum through the Press/Player's Entrance at the North end of the building.

#### **WORKING TICKETS**

All Requests for working press credentials for covering University of Wisconsin Hockey must be made through the UW Sports News Service office. Requests should be made on letterhead and at least one week in advance of the game(s) you wish to cover. Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pick-up at the Press/Player's Entrance to the Coliseum. Working press tickets contain assigned seat locations.

#### **RADIO**

Visiting radio stations will be admitted upon the recommendations of the visiting school and its sports information director. Broadcast locations are assigned based on involvment with the co-op line arrange-

ment. Tickets will be held at the UW Sports News Service office thru noon on game day or at the Press/Player's Entrance to the Coliseum the day of the game.

# **PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Photo passes are also limited because of space restrictions at the Coliseum. Requests should be submitted on letterhead to the UW Sports News Service office and will be granted on a priority first-come, first-serve basis. Photographers are asked to consider the paying customers when working in the Coliseum.

#### **PARKING**

There is no reserved parking for visiting press at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum. Visiting media should plan to arrive at the Coliseum at least one hour prior to game time to avoid running into parking problems.

# **PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

On non-game days, players will be available to the media for interviews on Monday's and Wednesdays between 3:00-3:30 p.m.

Post-game UW coach and player interviews may be conducted in the media interview room outside the University of Wisconsin dressing room. No press will be permitted inside the University of Wisconsin locker room.

Media representatives will be able to interview Wisconsin players after each game following a short post-game team meeting. Player interviews may also be conducted during the week following practice at the Coliseum or the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center, usually 5:30-6:30 pm.

# INTERVIEWING THE COACH

Head coach Jeff Sauer will meet with media representatives following each game after a short post-game session with team and coaches. The post-game interview of Coach Sauer will be conducted in the media interview room adjacent to the Wisconsin dressing room.

Coach Sauer may be interviewed by the media on Mondays and Wednesdays between 3:00-3:30 p.m.

JIM MOTT, in his 22nd year as Sports Information Director at Wisconsin and a member of the CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Hall of Fame (1979), is a Madison native.

In 1986, Jim was presented with the distinguished Arch Ward award, and he is a past president of both CoSIDA and the Madison Pen and Mike Club. He served as Wisconsin's basketball team manager for four years while an undergraduate, earning a major "W" award for his work. 
and serves as the publicity coordinator for the WCHA.

# 1987-88 BADGER HOCKEY


The University of Wisconsin returns 19 lettermen, including six of last season's seven leading scorers, for 1987-88 and Head Coach Jeff Sauer is understandably optimistic about the Badgers' prospects this winter.

"No doubt about it," said the fifth-year mentor, "we should be an exciting hockey team. We have a solid group of experienced veterans, players who have been through the WCHA and know what it's about, led by our co-captains Steve Tuttle and Paul Ranheim. On defense, we'll be led by the likes of Shaun Sabol, Paul Stanton, Rob Mendel and Kurt Semandel, while in goal we feature strength in returning senior and three-time letterwinner Dean Anderson.


"We feel we have more depth this year than we've had in a long time. And because of our experience at the various positions, we should be very competitive."

Sauer's 1986-87 Badgers finished at a respectable 23-18-1 overall and tied for third place in the WCHA standings with Denver at 17-17-1.

"A Key for us will be getting off to a good start," added Sauer. "We need to make some strides early. The last couple of seasons we haven't started as well as we would have liked, and we've had to claw our way back. We've been very strong over the second half though, and hope that trend will continue."

Co-Captain Paul Ranheim may be college hockey's most explosive winger. He is a top candidate for All-America and All-WCHA acclaim.




Senior right wing and co-captain Steve Tuttle is the WCHA's top returning goal scorer; he had 31 a year ago. He, too, is a top candidate for All-America and All-WCHA honors.

The two questions facing him throughout the summer months - will Paul Ranheim and Mike Richter make the Olympic team, will either of them be back? - were partially answered in September when it became known that Ranheim would be returning for his senior season at Wisconsin. Richter, however, still appeared headed for Calgary in February.

What Sauer gained in the return of Ranheim was a bonafide All-America and All-WCHA candidate at forward. One of college hockey's most explosive players, Paul was a second team All-WCHA selection in 1986-87, and is the Badgers' leading returning scorer after marking 24 goals and 35 assists for 59 points in 42 games last winter. At 6-1 and 205 pounds, the speedy and aggressive left winger is an "impact" player. He has been selected as a co-captain for '87-88.

What he loses in Mike Richter - also a bonafide All-America and All-WCHA candidate - he hopes will be compensated for in the return of Dean Anderson.

Top returning offensive performers also include senior winger and co-captain designate Steve Tuttle, whose 31 goals and 21 assists for 52 points earned him honorable mention All-WCHA accolades last winter, sophomore center Chris Tancill (9-23-32), and sophomore winger Gary Shuchuk (19-11-30). All three of these players are considered contenders for post-season accolades as well.



Senior forward Glenn Revak has played in 87 games and earned three varsity letters heading into 1987-88.

The biggest loss up front is 1987 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist Tony Granato, who amassed 220 points during a brilliant four-year Wisconsin career. Granato figures to be in Calgary next February as a member of the 1988 US Olympic Hockey Team.

Other key returning lettermen at forward are Pat Ford (32 GP/5-9-14), Glenn Revak (39 GP/7-7-14), Tony Scheid (23 GP/4-3-7), Andy Akervik (18 GP/3-3-6), John Byce (40 GP/1-4-5), Tom Sagissor (41 GP/1-4-5), Steve Rohlik (31 GP/3-0-3) and Kurt Svendsen (1 GP/0-0-0).



Sophomore defenseman Shaun Sabol was an honorable mention All-WCHA choice as a freshman last winter.

On defense, Coach Sauer will rally his promising blueline unit around All-America and All-WCHA candidate Shaun Sabol, a rugged 6-3, 215-pound sophomore who topped off an outstanding freshman campaign of 1986-87 with honorable mention all-league honors. Shaun spent much of the past season on the powerplay, and contributed seven goals and 16 assists for 23 points in 40 games. A dominating presence, Shaun participated in the Olympic Festival last summer in North Carolina.

Also returning on defense for 1987-88 are steady junior and two-time varsity letterman Paul Stanton (41 GP/ 5-17-22), along with an up and coming trio in junior Kurt Semandel (37 GP/1-3-4), junior Greg Poss (20 GP/0-2-2), and sophomore Rob Mendel (42 GP/1-7-8). Stanton's steady overall play will be vital to the defensive success of the Badgers, while Semandel and Mendel add an extra dimension offensively to the UW attack. All three have made great strides the past year.

# **OUTLOOK** CONTINUED



Senior center Pat Ford looks to rebound offensively in 1987-88 and will be a key player to watch.

In goal, Dean Anderson is a three-time varsity letterwinner who's name is found in several places in the Wisconsin Hockey record book for goaltenders. He has fashioned a 38-21-0 career won-loss record with over 3,600 minutes of playing time, but he played in just nine games a year ago behind Mike Richter with a 4-2 record and a 3.96 GAA. Dean, who played in a record-setting 36 games as a freshman in 1984-85, has proven he can hold up to the day-to-day grind of playing every day something he may just have to do this winter. There is one other thing to note about Dean this winter, something called 'incentive'.


Additional varsity candidates are goaltender John Lambie and forwards John Parker, Brian Sergenian and Kurt Stahura.

Incoming freshman prospects for 1987-88 are defensemen Rob Andringa (Madison), Chris Jensen (Wilmette, IL) and Rodger Sykes (Waukegan, IL), and forwards Joe Decker (Bloomington, MN), Jon Helgeson (Roseau, MN), Don Granato (Downers Grove, IL) and Dennis Snedden (Eagle River).

The Badgers will play a 39-game regular-season schedule in 1987-88. This includes a strenuous 28-game Western Collegiate Hockey Association slate - with 14 straight league games to open the campaign - and seven games with Hockey East opponents. (The Badgers will both open and close the regular season with WCHArival Northern Michigan.

Additional highlites of the 1987-88 Wisconsin hockey schedule include a Monday, December 7th Dane County Memorial Coliseum date with the 1988 USA Hockey Team (featuring the return of former Badgers Tony Granato and Mike Richter), a Tuesday evening, December 8th home-ice contest against a touring Soviet Select team, and a December 29-30 appearance at the prestigious Great Lakes Invitational Tournament at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, where the Badgers will join up with Michigan Tech, Michigan and Michigan State.

All Wisconsin home games in 1987-88 will face-off at 7:35 pm central time, with one exception.



# JEFF SAUER



One of the most respected and influential coaches in the collegiate game today, 1987-88 marks the sixth year for Jeff Sauer as the guiding force of the University of Wisconsin ice hockey program.

In five seasons at the helm of the Badgers, Sauer's teams have averaged nearly 26 victories per year and have compiled an impressive 129-77-6 record and a .623 winning percentage. His 1986-87 squad put together a 23-18-1 overall mark and a 17-17-1 third place (tie) WCHA finish.

The Badgers' 23 victories in '86-87 marked the tenth time since 1971 that Wisconsin teams have won at least 23 games, and was the 17th time in the past 20 seasons that the UW has won 20 or more games. Under Sauer's leadership, the Badgers have won at least 21 games all five seasons.

In addition to being one of college hockey's top coaches, Sauer has a wealth of international hockey experience as well. He is a regular consultant to USA Hockey Teams and served as one of four head coaches at the Olympic Festival in North Carolina this past summer. In the spring of 1985, he served as an assistant coach to Dave Peterson for the 1985 USA Hockey Team that participated in the annual IIHF (International Ice Hockey Federation) World Championships in Prague, Czechslovakia. That team put together a fine fourth place finish - just out of the medal picture and behind World Champion Czechoslovakia, runner-up Canada, and third place Russia.



Sauer guided his first Wisconsin Hockey team to the 1983 NCAA Championship.

Sauer enters the 1987-88 campaign just four wins shy of 300 career victories, a plateau which will put him in select company in college hockey circles. Only 44 years old, Jeff will also mark his 17th season as a Western Collegiate Hockey Association Head Coach in '87-88, qualifying him as the ''Dean'' of league coaches.

In his first year at Wisconsin in 1982-83, Sauer accomplished what no other first-year college hockey coach had ever done before. His Badgers captured the 1983 NCAA Championship, earned the No. 1 ranking in the final poll, and posted one of the best marks in school history at 33-10-4. It marked the fourth national championship for Wisconsin since 1973. Four members of that team - Pat Flatley, Chris Chelios, Bruce Driver and Marc Behrend played in the 1984 Winter Olympic Games in Sarajevo and have since become standout players in the National Hockey League.

Known for their second-half peaks, Sauer's Wisconsin hockey teams have put together some impressive numbers during

the January-March stretch runs. His 1982-83 team compiled a 23-4-2 record and an .828 winning percentage after Christmas; his youthful '84-85 club ran up a 19-9 mark and a .679 winning percentage after November 30th; while his '85-86 club went 14-5-0 (.737) from December 30th to March 2nd. Last year, Wisconsin fashioned an 8-1-0 tear from late December to late January.

Among his other list of "notables" in the coaching profession are: head coach of the South team at the 1983 National Sports Festival; member of the 1984 US Olympic Hockey Committee; 1983 Chairman of the WCHA Coach's Committee; and a stint on the NCAA Ice Hockey Rules Committee. Jeff also directs his own hockey school in Madison and has worked with the Stan Mikita Hockey School for the Hearing-Impaired in Chicago.

Sauer had big shoes to fill when he left a comfortable position as head hockey coach and athletic director at Colorado College to replace the highly successful Bob Johnson in 1982. But his character, determination to succeed and his positive rapport with student-athletes, fans, and media have proved he was the ideal choice.

At Colorado College, where he had served as the Tigers' Head Coach since 1971, Jeff won more than 180 games and was twice named WCHA "Coach of the Year". His first award came following his rookie season of 1971 and the second following the 1975-76 campaign when Colorado College posted a fine 23-14-0 record and finished third in the final WCHA standings. Sauer also guided his '80-81 Tigers to third place in the WCHA.

Wisconsin hockey fans will probably never forget the almost legendary "Black Sunday" in March of 1981 when Sauer's CC Tigers came back with a miraculous 11-4 upset over the Badgers in the Dane County Coliseum to claim the two-game, total-goals playoff victory. (Wisconsin had won the opening game 8-2.)

A 1965 graduate of Colorado College, Jeff earned a Bachelor's degree in Sociology. During his undergraduate years in Colorado Springs, he competed in both varsity hockey and baseball for the Tigers.


In 1966, Sauer began his coaching career as an assistant to Bob Johnson at Colorado College. Then when Johnson took over the head coaching duties at Wisconsin, Sauer again served as his assistant coach.

Jeff and wife, Jamie, are the parents of two children - Chip, 12, and Beth, seven.

Marking his sixth year overall as an assistant coach with the Wisconsin Hockey program in 1987-88 is Mike Kemp.





A key to the Badgers' continued success at the goaltending position in recent years has been Bill Howard, who marks his sixth year with the Wisconsin Hockey program.


Howard is credited with helping develop such recent Badger goaltending standouts as Marc Behrend, Terry Kleisinger and Mike Birhter





WCHA-member teams have claimed an unprecedented 20 NCAA Division I Championships in the past 28 years, including 11 of the last 15 with the University of North Dakota skating to the national title in 1987. And since the NCAA Tournament began in 1948, the WCHA has claimed 30 national collegiate ice hockey titles! Three member institutions - Wisconsin, North Dakota and Minnesota - have accounted for ten national championships since 1973. The Badgers earned the NCAA Championship in 1973, 1977, 1981 and 1983; North Dakota took the crown in 1980, 1982 and 1987; and Minnesota captured the national title in 1974, 1976 and 1979. In NCAA final four competition, the WCHA has had two teams in the final four an impressive 34 of 39 times since 1949!



# GREAT MOMENTS IN WISCONSIN HOCKEY



DEAN TALAFOUS STUNS CORNELL WITH OVERTIME GOAL IN 1973 NCAA SEMIFINALS.

March, 1962—Wisconsin Athletic Director Ivan Williamson announced the return of hockey as an intercollegiate sport after a 28-year absence.

December 6, 1963—A rebound goal by Chan Young 5:10 into the sudden death period gives Wisconsin its first modern collegiate win, a 3-2 victory over Macalester.

**February 22, 1964**—Wisconsin concluded its first season of hockey in the modern era with an 8-5-3 record.

December 11, 1964—In an effort to upgrade their program, the Badgers scheduled eight games against WCHA teams, but unfortunately, the Badgers lost all eight of those games.

February 22, 1966—After 13 straight losses to WCHA teams, the Badgers finally post a victory, a 5-4 overtime win over Minnesota. Jim Petruzates scored on a break-away just two minutes into the overtime period.

**April 1, 1966**—Following the retirement of John Riley, Bob Johnson was named head coach of the Badger hockey program.

March, 1968—Wisconsin hockey hit the national spotlight as Bert DeHate, a sophomore center from St. Paul, MN, wins the national scoring title with 77 points on 47 goals and 30 assists. DeHate hits for seven hat-tricks, a Badger record, as the team goes 21-10.

March 30, 1969—After another successful season, including an 11-9-2 mark against WCHA teams, the Badgers were admitted to the WCHA.

March, 1970—Wisconsin places fourth in the WCHA and qualifies for the national tournament, where they post a third place finish. Defenseman John Jagger of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario becomes the first Badger player to win All-American honors.

March, 1972—The Badgers make their second NCAA appearance in three years, but again come away with a third place finish.

March, 16, 1973—Wisconsin stuns Cornell 6-5 in overtime to advance to the NCAA finals. A goal with five seconds left in regulation time by sophomore Dean Talafous ties the game. Talafous then tallies the game-winner with 33 seconds left in overtime.

March, 17, 1973—With a 4-2 win over WCHA rival Denver, Wisconsin wins the NCAA championship for the first time in the school's history.

March, 25, 1977—After missing the NCAA playoffs for three years, the Badgers make it to the final four again. Les Grauer scored the tying goal against New Hampshire and Mike Eaves won it in overtime 4-3, as the Badgers advanced to the finals.

March 26, 1977—Senior Steve Alley culminated the Badgers' finest season ever with a goal 23 seconds into overtime to give Wisconsin a 6-5 win over Michigan for their second NCAA title. Wisconsin finished the season at 37-7-1 and was the first team to capture the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in the same season. Three players were named to the All-American squad. Johnson was named Coach of the Year, and his son Mark was named Freshman of the Year.

March 25, 1978—Wisconsin fans took Providence by storm for the NCAA tournament, and were proclaimed the "World's Greatest Hockey Fans". Mike Eaves finished his career as the school's

all-time scoring leader, while he and Mark Johnson were All-Americans. Wisconsin was fourth in the NCAA's.

March, 1979—Record crowds saw the Badgers (25-13-3) play as 21 of the 23 home games were sell-outs and the average crowd of 8,654 was just eight short of a sell-out. Mark Johnson closed out his Badger career as the top goal scorer in Wisconsin history. He was named to the All-American squad again and was the college "Player of the Year".

March 27, 1981—Wisconsin returned to the NCAA final four after defeating the best team in the East, Clarkson, 9-8 in a total goal series at Potsdam, NY. After a 5-1 win over Northern Michigan, the Badgers advanced to the finals again.

March 28, 1981—The Badgers regained the NCAA crown for the third time with a 6-3 win over Minnesota. The "back door" Badgers proved they were the champions after defeating the #1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), CCHA (Northern Michigan) and WCHA (Minnesota). The season also marked the end of the ten-team WCHA, as the three Michigan schools and Notre Dame dropped out to join the CCHA.

March 27, 1982—Badgers finish 2nd in NCAA tournament, and compile the second best record in Wisconsin Hockey history at 35-11-1. Center John Newberry and Defenseman Bruce Driver receive All-American status.

June 1, 1982—Bob Johnson resigns after fifteen years at Wisconsin. Johnson had guided the Badgers to three NCAA Championships and the best attendance of any college hockey program in the country.

July 8, 1982—Jeff Sauer, Head Coach at Colorado College and former assistant to Bob Johnson at Wisconsin, is named as the second full-time coach of the Badgers.


March 5, 1983—Sophomores Chris Chelios and Paul Houck score the tieing and winning goals as the Badgers beat North Dakota 6-5 in triple overtime to advance to the WCHA Playoff championships in Minneapolis.

March 24-26, 1983—After sweeping Minnesota in Williams Arena to gain the WCHA Playoff Championship and the No. 1 seed in the West, first-year Coach Jeff Sauer's team swept St. Lawrence 6-2, 7-1

in the NCAA Quarterfinals in Madison to move to the final four for the third straight year. In Grand Forks, ND, the Badgers claimed their fourth NCAA Championship since 1973 with a 2-0 win over Providence in the semi-finals and a 6-2 victory over Harvard in the finals. Senior goaltender Marc Behrend was named the Tournament MVP for the second time in his career.

January 7, 1984—Wisconsin becomes the first and only American college team to defeat the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team when the Badgers stun USA 4-2 before 8,732 at the Coliseum.

November 23, 1985—The University of Wisconsin records its 500th victory since starting hockey in 1963 with a 6-2 victory over WCHA rival North Dakota in the Dane County Coliseum.









# THE DANE COUNTY COLISEUM HOME OF THE BADGERS



Home ice for the University of Wisconsin Hockey Team is the modern Dane County Memorial Coliseum, one of college hockey's finest facilities and the site of NCAA attendance records for 18 consecutive seasons.

With theater-style seating for 8,644, the Coliseum is the second largest collegiate ice facility in the nation. The ice surface is 200' by 85'.

Inside, the Badgers make use of dressing room facilities that rank second to none. Each player is assigned an individual stall (3½  $\times$  6) for his equipment and personal belongings. Also located adjacent to the Wisconsin dressing room is a


modern training room which includes a whirlpool and all the various modalities and exercise equipment for treatment of rehabilitation of injuries. The Badgers also make use of a fully-equipped weight room inside the Coliseum.

Recognized as the home of some of the nation's best collegiate hockey fans, the Coliseum and the University of Wisconsin hockey team have attracted record crowds every year since the Badgers joined the Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the 1969-70 season.

The University of Wisconsin has set American college hockey attendance records for 18 consecutive seasons dating back to 1970. Nearly 3½ million fans have watched Badger Hockey in the Coliseum since 1967, and since 1969, the UW has drawn 3,244,342 for 393 home dates (not counting exhibitions) - an average of 8,255 per game.

In 1981-82, the Badgers drew 240,095 fans for 28 home games to set an all-time NCAA single season record, while the 1978-79 average attendance of 8,654 is both an NCAA and University of Wisconsin record.

Witnessing a Badger hockey game in the jam-packed Dane County Coliseum is like nothing else in college hockey.

University Theater, School of Music, and the Dance Division offer a wide range of performances throughout the year. Facilities include the Ronald E.
