# COVERING THE BADGERS

## ARRIVING AT THE DANE COUNTY COLISEUM

The University of Wisconsin's working facilities for newspaper, radio and television are located in the upper level on the east side of the Coliseum. Media covering the Badgers should enter the coliseum at the Press/Player's Entrance located at ground level on the north side of the building.

## MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All requests for working press credentials for University of Wisconsin hockey home games must be made in advance through the UW Sports Information Office, 1440 Monroe Street, Madison, WI 53711. **PHONE: (608) 262-1811. Requests should be made on your company's official letterhead and at least one week in advance of the game(s) you wish to cover.** Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pickup at the Press/Player's Entrance to the Coliseum. Working press tickets contain assigned seat locations.

## RADIO AND TELEVISION

Visiting radio and television stations will be admitted for broadcast upon the recommendation of the visiting school and its sports information director. Requests must be received at least one week prior to the game(s) you wish to broadcast. Broadcast locations are assigned by the UW Sports Information Department based on involvement with the co-op line arrangement.

Tickets will be held at the UW Sports Information office through noon on Friday and then will be placed at the Press/Player's Entrance to the Coliseum for later pickup.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photo passes are limited because of space restrictions at the Coliseum. Requests should be submitted on your company's letterhead to the UW Sports Information Office and will be granted on a priority first-come, first-served basis. Photographers are asked to consider the paying customers when shooting in the Coliseum.

## PRESS PARKING

There is no reserved parking for visiting press at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum. Visiting media should plan to arrive at the Coliseum at least one hour prior to game time to avoid parking problems.

## INTERVIEWING WISCONSIN PLAYERS

### During the week -

Media wishing to interview players during the week, must set all interviews up with the Sports Information Office. Practices are generally held at the Coliseum, from 2:30-5:30, but on certain days practice will be at the Shell on campus. For exact practice times and locations, contact the SID Office. Players will be available prior to and after practice. **BUT ONLY IF CLEARED WITH THE SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICE.**

### Post-Game -

UW player interviews may be conducted in the media interview room outside the Wisconsin dressing room following each game. **No media will be permitted inside the Wisconsin lockerroom.**

## INTERVIEWING COACH SAUER

Wisconsin Head Coach Jeff Sauer will meet with media representatives following each game after a short post-game session with team and coaches. The post-game interview of Coach Sauer will be conducted in the media interview room adjacent to the Wisconsin dressing room. The best time to interview Coach Sauer during the week is between 10:00 am and 12:00 noon at the UW Hockey Office or following practice at approximately 5:00 -5:30 pm.

## SPORTS INFORMATION STAFF

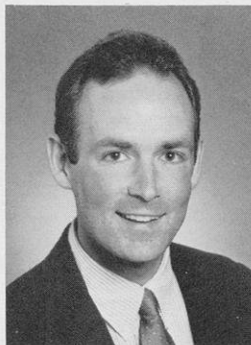

Malchow worked from 1979-89 at Iowa as a student, graduate and full-time assistant in the Hawkeye Sports Information Office.

**Julie Kluge** begins her second campaign as a full-time member of the UW Sports Information staff. She has worked for the Athletic Department since 1984.

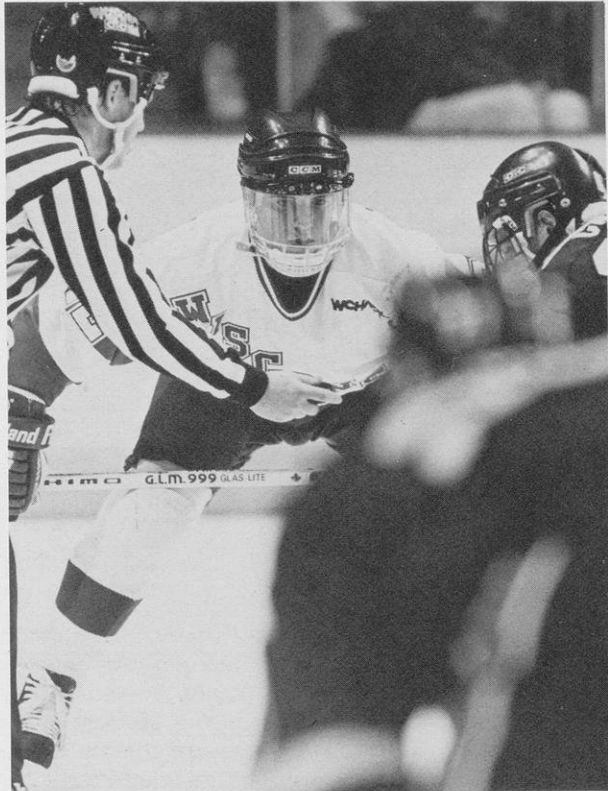

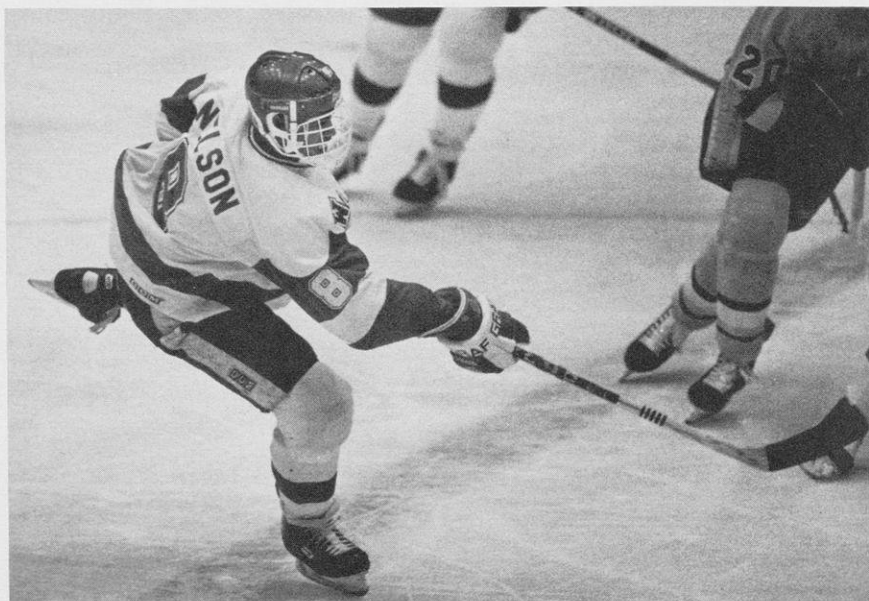

Entering the 1991-92 season, Wisconsin again looks to challenge for a top spot in the WCHA. Coming off a 26-15-3 campaign, a third-place WCHA finish and a fourth straight NCAA appearance, the young Badgers hope to continue that winning tradition.

Wisconsin returns 15 lettermen and welcomes 10 newcomers (seven freshmen, two transfers and one redshirt). Hobey Baker/All-America candidates Duane Derksen and Doug Macdonald return from tryouts with the Canadian National Team to lead the Badgers. Other post-season honors candidates include seniors Brett Kurtz and Chris Nelson, junior Barry Richter, and sophomore Jason Zent, who was a member of the 1991 WCHA All-Rookie team.

### THE SCHEDULE

Once again a successful season could hinge on getting off to a quick start. *"The schedule is very important. We play some of the teams that are building or rebuilding early in the season and that will be a positive,"* said Sauer. *"The key to our success is that we have a schedule that gives us a chance to get on track early if we play well."*

Wisconsin entertains a 34-game schedule, opening the season on the road at Michigan Tech. The home opener is Nov. 1-2 against Minnesota-Duluth.

The 1991 Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown will be held December 27-28 at the Bradley Center. The tournament field features Maine, Yale and the University of Toronto.

An exhibition contest with the Czechoslovakian National team will be played on Dec. 31 at the Dane County Coliseum.

One highlight of the 1991-92 schedule is the weekend at Minnesota, Nov. 15-16. Friday's game will be played at Mariucci Arena, with the Saturday night game contested at the Met Center. Dubbed the "Border Battle", the game will follow the afternoon gridiron game between Wisconsin and Minnesota.

### GOALTENDING

Wisconsin's strength will be in the nets, as senior Hobey Baker candidate Duane Derksen returns for his final season. Having established himself as one of Wisconsin's best ever, he is currently among the leaders in 10 records categories. Among those, he is second all-time with 59 career victories. Dean Anderson (1984-88) is the record holder with 68.

He finished the 1990-91 season among the leaders in several categories. He ranked first in games played (42) and minutes (2474), second in wins (24), saves (971), shutouts (3) and shutout periods (47), and third in goals against (3.22).

### DEFENSE

**"We'll build our team from defense out."**

With the early departure of All-American Sean Hill to the pros and the graduation of Rob Andringa and Rodger Sykes, the Badgers lost three of their top four defensemen off last year's squad. In addition, sophomores Jacques Auger and Matt Smith will not return.

Hill led the Badgers in scoring last season with 19-32=51, and along with Andringa (4-28=32) and Sykes (5-11=16) combined for nearly 450 career games played. That experience will be replaced by youth as four of the seven Badger freshmen are blueliners.

Returning to lead the young squad will be seniors Chris Nelson (5-12=17) and Joe Harwell (3-5=8). "Swingman" Barry Richter (15-20=35), who played right wing last season, will be moved to defense. He played defenseman his freshman year. Junior Jeff Sanderson will add depth.

Freshmen Maco Balkovec, Brian Rafalski, Mark Strobel and Chris Tok could see a lot of icetime in their rookie seasons. "The defensive corps could see up to four defensemen from the freshman class. They will be called upon to step in and play right away," said Sauer.

### FORWARDS

Captain Doug Macdonald, the top goal scorer from a year ago with 20, leads the Badgers up front. He was second in scoring last season with 20-26=46 in 31 games, averaging nearly 1.50 points per game. That despite missing 13 games with a knee injury. He turned in 15 multiple point games in 1990-91 and scored in 26 of 31 games.

Boasting one of the hardest slapshots in college hockey, 1991 WCHA All-Rookie Team member Jason Zent will be looked to as an offensive leader. Ranking fourth in team scoring with 19-18=37

last season, Zent was one of the most productive first-year players in the WCHA in '90-91 and will be a strong post-season honors candidate.

Junior Barry Richter (15-20=35), was fifth in team scoring a year ago, and will be a definite asset with his ability to play either at forward or defense.

Other experienced veterans who will add to the depth up front are assistant captains senior Brett Kurtz (7-21=28) and junior Jason Francisco (6-5=11) and senior Jon Helgeson (3-1=4)

The Badgers also received solid campaigns from freshmen forwards Blaine Moore, Dan Plante, Andrew Shier and Chris Tucker, in addition to Jason Zent. These players should take charge in their sophomore seasons. With the experience they gained last year, this class will be looked to for strong offensive production. "Our sophomores gained a lot of experience last year with the amount of playing time they got. Hopefully that experience will pay off," said Sauer.

## THE FRESHMEN

The Class of 1995 is made up of four defensemen -- Maco Balkovec, Brian Rafalski, Mark Strobel, Chris Tok -- and three forwards -- Kelly Fairchild, Jamie Spencer, Mike Strobel. The freshmen will be looked to early, especially on defense, to adjust and contribute right from the start.

Also new to the lineup this season are two transfers. Mike Doers, a winger, transferred from the University of Vermont and sat out last season. He originally hails from Chippewa Falls, WI. Rob Granato, the younger brother of former Badgers Tony and Don, will be eligible to play second semester, after transferring from Colorado College.

Todd Hedlund, a freshman redshirt a year ago, is expected to add depth at forward.

# THE COACHES







## JEFF SAUER

The 1991-92 season marks the close of a decade for Jeff Sauer as the guiding force of the University of Wisconsin ice hockey program. One of the most respected and influential coaches in the collegiate game today, Sauer's list of accomplishments and milestones is extensive.

In nine seasons at the helm of the Badgers, Sauer's teams have averaged nearly 27 victories per year and have compiled an impressive 246-130-17 record (.648). His teams have earned NCAA tournament bids four consecutive years. No other coach has had that success.

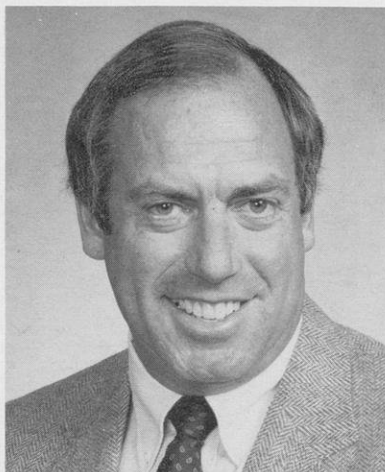
Last season Sauer became just the 10th coach in college hockey history to win 400 games. He recorded that milestone victory on Dec. 28, 1990 with a 3-0 victory over St. Lawrence in Milwaukee. He currently ranks ninth, among college coaches, with 413 victories.

The 1990-91 team posted a 26-15-3 mark, made a fourth straight NCAA appearance and successfully defended their Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown crown.

Sauer's 1989-90 team posted a 36-9-1 record en route to capturing the school's fifth NCAA Championship and the second under his tenure. The Badgers won both the regular season and playoff championships in the WCHA, and the inaugural "Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown." Fittingly, the 6-3 win over Boston College in the championship game of the "Showdown" was Sauer's 200th victory at Wisconsin.

The Badgers' 36 victories in '89-90 marked the third time under Sauer's leadership that a Wisconsin team won at least 30 games. No other Wisconsin hockey coach can boast of such a distinction. It was the 11th straight year a Badger squad posted 20 or more wins in a season.

In addition to being one of college hockey's top coaches, Sauer has a wealth of international experience. In 1990, he was head coach of Team USA



in the Goodwill games in Seattle. Prior to the games, Team USA beat the Soviet Union's National Team in an exhibition contest at the Oakland Coliseum. It was the first time since 1980 that a U.S. squad had beaten a team from Russia. Under Sauer's guidance, Team USA lost the gold medal game to the Soviet Union, falling short in a 4-3 decision decided by a shootout at the end of sudden death. In April of 1989, he coached the USA Select Hockey Team at the Pravda Cup in Leningrad, USSR. He is a regular consultant to USA Hockey Teams and served as one of four coaches at the 1988 Olympic Festival.

The 47-year old Sauer will mark his 20th season as a Western Collegiate Hockey Association head coach this winter, qualifying him as the "Dean" of league coaches.

In his first year at Wisconsin (1982-83), Sauer accomplished what no other first-year college coach had done before. His Badgers captured the 1983 NCAA Championship, earned the No. 1 ranking in the final poll, and posted one of the best marks in school history (33-10-4).

At Colorado College, where he served as the Tigers' Head Coach from 1972-82, Jeff won more than 180 games and was twice named WCHA "Coach of the Year". His first award came following his rookie season and the second

following the 1975-76 campaign when Colorado College posted a 23-14-0 record and finished third in the WCHA. Sauer also guided his '80-81 Tigers to third place in the WCHA.

A 1965 graduate of Colorado College, Jeff earned a Bachelor's degree in Sociology. During his undergraduate years in Colorado Springs, he competed in both hockey and baseball.

In 1966, Sauer began his coaching career as an assistant to Bob Johnson at Colorado College. When Johnson took over the head coaching duties at Wisconsin, Sauer again served as his assistant.

Jeff and his wife, Jamie, are the parents of two children—Chip (16), and Beth (11).

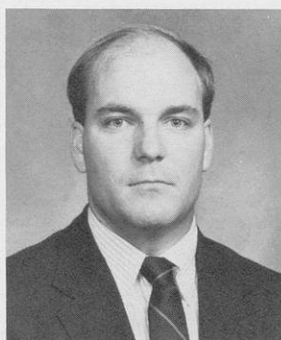

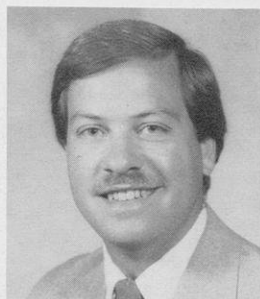
**Administrative Assistant

MIKE JOHNSON**

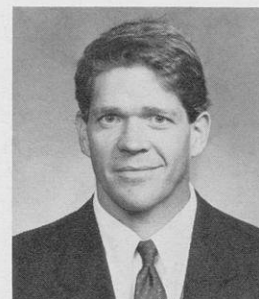
Mike begins his third year as trainer for the hockey team, and fourth year overall at Wisconsin. He also works with football, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's tennis.

Steve Myrland returns for his fourth year at the UW, and his third as the strength and conditioning coach for the Wisconsin hockey team.

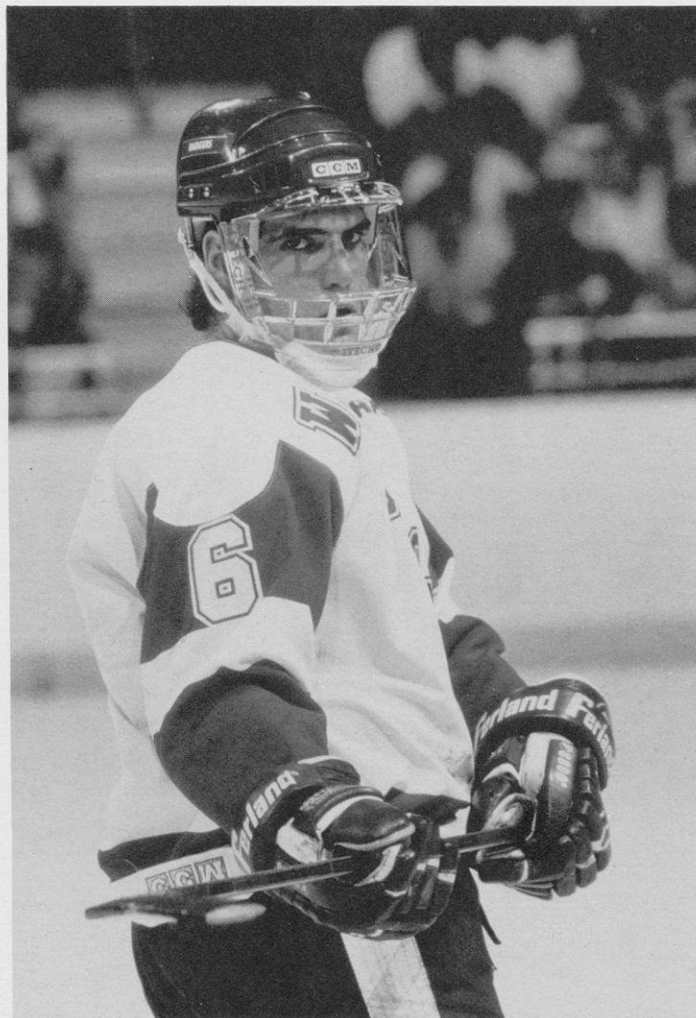

# SEASON IN REVIEW





## 1990-91 SEASON IN REVIEW

The 1990-91 Badger hockey team, despite the loss of seven seniors from the 1990 NCAA Championship team, once again turned in a very successful campaign. Wisconsin won at least 20 games for the 11th season in a row, qualified for its fourth straight NCAA tourney and spent most of the year in the nation's top ten.

The Badgers completed a 26-15-3 season and received an NCAA bid for the fourth consecutive year. In the WCHA, the Badgers finished 19-11-2 for third place. It was the seventh year in a row that Wisconsin finished in the top three.

### **Team Accomplishments**

Head Coach Jeff Sauer reached a milestone, winning his 400th game. That game came at the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown in a 3-0 victory over St. Lawrence. Sauer has 413 wins, and is ninth all-time on the college coaches' career victory list.

The Badgers were led by the defensive tandem of junior Sean Hill and senior co-captain Rob Andringa. Both carved their names in the Badger record book. Andringa for games played (179) and Hill for most goals scored by a defenseman in a season (19). Hill also became the

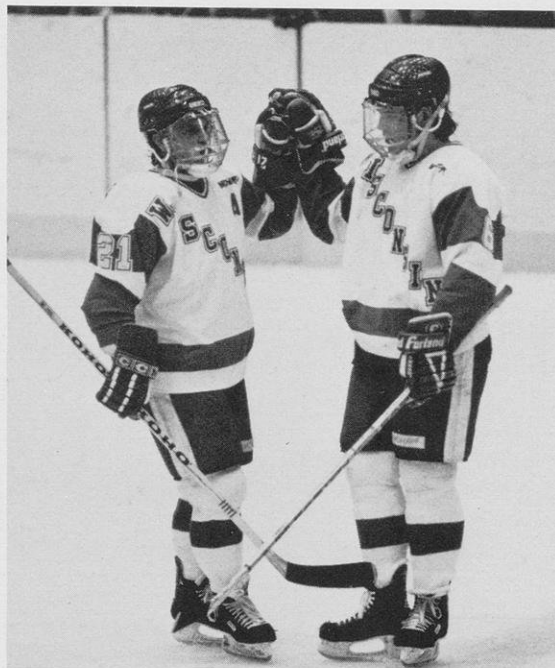
UW's 20th All-American, receiving second team honors.

In goal, Duane Derksen moved into second place on the Badger all-time victory list with 59. He registered three shut-outs, to up his career total to six. He is currently tied for second with Bob Vroman in the record books.

The 1990-91 senior class of Andringa, Joe Decker, Don Granato, John Parker, Dennis Snedden, Rodger Sykes and Tray Tuomie, became the winningest class in school history. In their four year careers, they went 116-53-11 for a winning percentage of .675. Those 116 victories included a NCAA championship, two WCHA playoff championships, a WCHA title, two Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown crowns, a 1987 Great Lakes Invitational Tournament championship and four consecutive NCAA bids.

## THE WCHA

The University of Wisconsin is proud to be a member of America's premier collegiate hockey league -- the **Western Collegiate Hockey Association**.

No conference can match the WCHA's outstanding reputation for producing national championship teams, All-Americans, Olympians, and subsequent stars in the National Hockey League. The quality of institutions, student athletes, coaching, on-ice play, and level of administrative and fan support throughout the nine-team WCHA is second to none. The 1991-92 season marks the 33rd year of top-flight competition for the WCHA.

WCHA-member teams have claimed an unprecedented 30 NCAA Ice Hockey Championships. Thirteen of the last 19 titles have gone to WCHA members, with Northern Michigan skating away with the 1991 crown. Along with its 30 NCAA titles, the WCHA can boast of 23 second place finishes and since the NCAA tournament began in 1948, the WCHA has had at least two teams in college hockey's "final four" 34 times. Three member institutions, Minnesota, North Dakota, and Wisconsin, have accounted for 11 national championships since 1973.

The Badgers earned the NCAA Championship in 1973, 1977, 1981, 1983 and 1990. North Dakota took the crown in 1980, 1982 and 1987, and Minnesota captured the national title in 1974, 1976 and 1979.

Perhaps the most recent example of the WCHA's ability to draw on its great tradition was the institutional on an annual WCHA Playoff Championship (i.e. 'final four') in the spring of 1988. Contested at the St. Paul (MN) Civic Center in March with the four first-round winners, the WCHA Playoff Championship had quickly established itself as one of college hockey's premier showcase events. Since the inaugural event



in 1988, the playoff championships have drawn more than 200,000 fans in just four years.

The names and faces of ex-WCHA players are legendary, and although the list is too numerous to mention them all, you can start with John Mayasich, Bill Hay, Bill Masterton, Gordon "Red" Berenson, Lou Nanne, Tony Esposito, Keith Magnuson, Wayne Thomas, Dennis Hextall, Ron Grahame, Chico Resch and Ed Mio. And more recently, the WCHA boasts of such alumni as NHL stand-outs Glenn Anderson (Denver), Ed Belfour (North Dakota), Perry Berezan

(North Dakota), Mike Blaisdell (Wisconsin), Aaron and Neal Broten (Minnesota), Chris Chelios (Wisconsin), Dave Christian (North Dakota), Kevin Dineen (Denver), Bruce Driver (Wisconsin), Patrick Flatley (Wisconsin), Curt Giles (Minnesota-Duluth), Tony Granato (Wisconsin), Tony Hrkac (North Dakota), Brett Hull (Minnesota-Duluth), Jim Johnson (Minnesota-Duluth), Mark Johnson (Wisconsin), Bob Joyce (North

## GREAT MOMENTS

### MARCH, 1962

Wisconsin Athletic Director Ivan Williamson announced the return of ice hockey as an intercollegiate sport after a 28-year absence.

### DECEMBER 6, 1963

A rebound goal by Chan Young 5:10 into the sudden death period gives Wisconsin its first modern collegiate victory, a 3-2 decision over Macalaster.

### FEBRUARY 22, 1964

Wisconsin concluded its first season of hockey in the modern era with an 8-5-3 record.

### DECEMBER 11, 1964

In an effort to upgrade the program, the Badgers schedule eight games against WCHA teams, but unfortunately, the Badgers go on to lose all eight of those games.

### FEBRUARY 22, 1966

After 13 straight losses to WCHA teams, the Badgers finally post a victory, a 5-4 overtime win over Minnesota. Jim Petruzates scored on a break-away just two minutes into the overtime period.

### APRIL 1, 1966

Following the retirement of John Riley, Bob Johnson was named head coach of the Wisconsin hockey program.

### MARCH, 1968

Wisconsin hockey hit the national spotlight as Bert DeHate, a sophomore center, wins the national scoring title with 77 points on 47 goals and 30 assists. DeHate hits for seven hat tricks, a Badger record, as the team goes 21-10-0.

### MARCH 30, 1969

After another successful season, including an 11-9-2 mark against WCHA teams, the Badgers are admitted to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association.

### MARCH, 1970

Wisconsin places fourth in the WCHA and qualifies for the NCAA Championships, where they post a third place finish. Defensemen John Jagger of Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario becomes the first Badger player to earn All-American honors.

### MARCH, 1972

The Badgers make their second appearance at the NCAA Championships in three seasons, again coming away with a third place finish.

### MARCH 16, 1973

Wisconsin stuns Cornell, 6-5, in overtime to advance to the finals of the NCAA Championships. A goal with five seconds left in regulation time by sophomore Dean Talafofus ties the game. Talafofus then tallies the game-winner with 33 seconds left in overtime.

### MARCH 17, 1973

With a 4-2 victory over WCHA rival Denver, Wisconsin wins the NCAA Ice Hockey Championship for the first time in the school's history.

### FEBRUARY 19, 1977

The Badgers defeated Minnesota-Duluth, 6-4, to capture the MacNaughton Cup and the WCHA regular season championship for the first time in Badger hockey history.

### MARCH 25, 1977

After missing the NCAA playoffs for three years, the Badgers make it to the final four again. Les Grauer scored the tying goal against New Hampshire and Mike Eaves won it in overtime, 4-3, to move the Badgers into the finals.

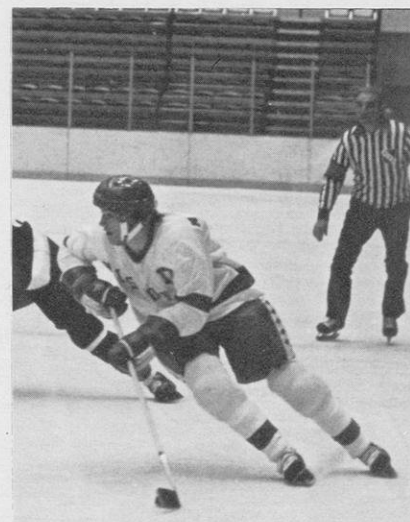

Badgers' finest season with a goal 23 seconds into overtime to give Wisconsin a 6-5 win over Michigan for the school's second NCAA Championship. Wisconsin finished the season at 37-7-1, and was the first team to capture the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in one season.

Three players were named to the All-American squad - defenseman Craig Norwich, goaltender Julian Baretta and center Mike Eaves. Coach Bob Johnson was named national coach of the year, while his son, Mark, was named freshman of the year.

### MARCH 25, 1978

Wisconsin fans took Providence, Rhode Island by storm for the 1978 NCAA Championships, and were resultingly proclaimed the "World's Greatest Hockey Fans" by the city of Providence. Mike Eaves concluded his UW career as the school's all-time scoring leader, while he and Mark Johnson earned All-American acclaim. The Badgers finished fourth in the tournament.

### MARCH, 1979

Record crowds saw the Badgers (25-13-3) play as 21 of the 23 home games were sellouts and the average crowd of 8,654 at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum was just eight short of a sellout. Mark Johnson closed out his Badger career as the top goal scorer (125) in Wisconsin history. He was named to the All-American team for the second time and was collegiate player of the year.

## GREAT MOMENTS

### MARCH 27, 1981

Wisconsin returned to the NCAA Championships for the sixth time since 1970 after defeating the best team in the East, Clarkson, 9-8, in a total goal series at Potsdam, NY. After a 5-1 win over Northern Michigan in the semi-finals, the Badgers advanced to the finals for the third time.

### MARCH 28, 1981

The Badgers gained the NCAA crown for the third time with a 6-3 win over Minnesota. The "back door" Badgers proved they were the champions after defeating the No. 1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), the CCHA (Northern Michigan) and the WCHA (Minnesota); goaltender Marc Behrend was named NCAA tourney "MVP". The season also marked the end of the ten-team WCHA, as the three Michigan schools and Notre Dame dropped out and joined the CCHA, to cut expenses.

### MARCH 27, 1982

Wisconsin makes its seventh NCAA Championship appearance but finishes second to North Dakota. The Badgers compiled the second best record in school history at 35-11-1. Center John Newberry and defenseman Bruce Driver receive All-American honors.

### JUNE 1, 1982

Coach Bob Johnson resigns after 15 great years at Wisconsin. He had guided the Badgers to three NCAA Championships, seven national tournament appearances, a record of 367-175-23, and the best attendance of any college hockey program in the country.

### JULY 8, 1982

Jeff Sauer, previously head coach at Colorado College and former assistant to Bob Johnson at Wisconsin, is named the school's fourth coach.

### MARCH 5, 1983

Sophomore defenseman Chris Chelios and sophomore winger Paul Houck score the tying and winning goals as the Badgers beat North Dakota, 6-5, in triple overtime to advance to the WCHA Playoff Championships in Minneapolis. It is the longest game in school history.

### MARCH 24-26, 1983

After sweeping past Minnesota in Williams Arena to gain the WCHA Playoff Championship and the No. 1 seed in the West, first-year coach Jeff Sauer's Badgers swept St. Lawrence, 6-2 and 7-1, in the NCAA Quarterfinals in Madison to move to the NCAA Championships for the third straight year and eighth time overall since 1970. In Grand Forks, North Dakota, the Badgers claimed their

fourth national championship since 1973 with a 2-0 win over Providence in the semi-finals and a 6-2 victory over Harvard in the finals. Senior goaltender Marc Behrend was named the NCAA tournament most valuable player for the second time in his career.

### NOVEMBER 23, 1985

The University of Wisconsin records its 500th victory since reviving hockey in 1963 with a 6-2 victory over WCHA-rival North Dakota in the Coliseum.

### DECEMBER 30, 1987

Wisconsin beats CCHA-members Michigan, 6-0, and Michigan State, 4-3, to win the 23rd Annual Great Lakes Invitational Tournament before 19,482 at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, MI. Goaltender Dean Anderson, defenseman Paul Stanton and forwards Paul Ranheim and Steve Tuttle are named to the all-tournament team, and Anderson also receives the tourney "MVP" award.

### MARCH 6-7, 1988

Wisconsin defeats North Dakota, 2-1, and Minnesota, 3-2, to claim the first WCHA Final Four Playoff Championship before nearly 14,000 at the St. Paul Civic Center. Anderson, Stanton, Ranheim and Tuttle are voted to the all-tournament team while Anderson is tourney "MVP". Later that month, Ranheim and Stanton are named first team All-Americans, while Anderson and Tuttle are second team All-Americans. The Badgers finish at 30-13-2, the school's fourth 30-victory campaign.

### DECEMBER 28-29, 1989

Wisconsin hosts the first Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown at Milwaukee's spectacular Bradley Center. The Badgers defeat Notre Dame, 9-3, and Boston College, 6-5, to capture the Pettit Cup. More than 30,000 fans attend the highly successful first 'Showdown'.

### FEBRUARY 16, 1990

The University of Wisconsin marks its 1,000th game since 1963 with a 6-3 victory over Minnesota at Minneapolis.



### JANUARY 1, 1984

Wisconsin becomes the first and only American college team to defeat the 1984 US Olympic Hockey Team when the Badgers stun Team USA, 4-2, before 8,732 at the Dane County Coliseum.





## GREAT MOMENTS

### FEBRUARY 24, 1990

Wisconsin defeats North Dakota, 5-4, in overtime on Chris Tancill's goal to clinch the 1990 WCHA Playoff Championship and MacNaughton Cup before a sellout crowd of 8,644 at the Dane County Memorial Coliseum. The Badgers' league title is the school's second since 1977.

### MARCH 12, 1990

Wisconsin defeats Minnesota, 7-1, at the St. Paul Civic Center to claim the 1990 WCHA Playoff Championship. It is the UW's ninth WCHA Playoff title and second in the past three years under Jeff Sauer.

### MARCH 24, 1990

Wisconsin completes an NCAA Quarterfinal sweep of Maine with a 4-3 overtime win on Tom Sagissor's goal. The win sends the Badgers onto Detroit and a berth in the 1990 NCAA Championships at Joe Louis Arena. Wisconsin's 'Drive for Five' is just two wins away.

### MARCH 30, 1990

The Badgers down Boston College, 2-1, in an NCAA sem-final game in Detroit as right wing Chris Tancill scores both goals on assists from freshman Barry Richter. In goal, Duane Derksen stops 27 of 28 shots as Wisconsin advances to the championship game. More than 8,000 Badger faithful have made their presence felt in the Motor City.

### APRIL 1, 1990

No fooling. Coach Jeff Sauer's Wisconsin Badgers whip Colgate, 7-3, to claim the school's fifth NCAA Division I Ice Hockey Championship before 15,034 at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. Senior center John Byce records the hat trick, including one short-hander while junior defenseman Rob Andringa nets the gamewinner. More than 8,000 Wisconsin fans storm Detroit for the title game. The Badgers finish with a 36-9-1 record, the second most wins in school history. Center Gary Shuchuk, who scored 41 goals and 80 points on the season, is named first-team All-American. Chris Tancill is the NCAA Tournament "MVP".

### APRIL 2, 1990

More than 5,000 enthusiastic Wisconsin hockey fans turn out at the UW Fieldhouse for a pep rally to honor the 1989-90 NCAA Champions.

### DECEMBER 28, 1990

Head coach Jeff Sauer records career victory #400 as Wisconsin defeats St. Lawrence 3-0 in the semi-final game of the 1990 Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown. He ranks ninth on the all-time list for victories.

### DECEMBER 28-29, 1990

The Badgers claim their second Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown title, defeating St. Lawrence, 3-0 in the semis and North Dakota, 3-2 in the championship game. The championship game drew 17,671 fans, setting a WCHA record for most people ever to witness a WCHA contest. In all, over 32,000 fans attended the 1990 'Showdown'. Goaltender Duane Derksen is named tournament "MVP".

### MARCH, 1991

Wisconsin records its 13th 25-win season and seventh under Jeff Sauer. Wisconsin junior defenseman Sean Hill is named second-team All-American.

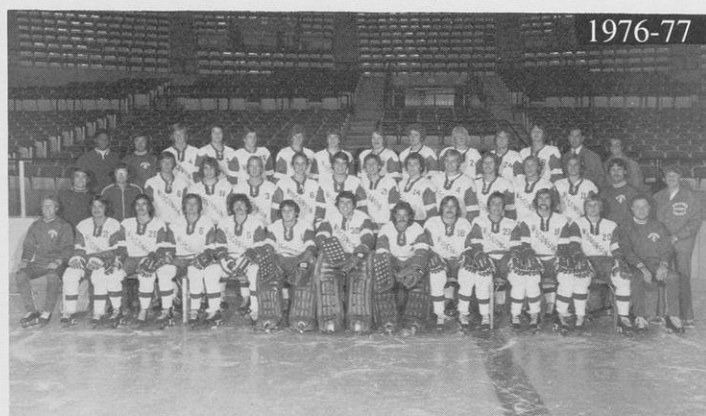

The Wisconsin Badgers are the National Champions of collegiate hockey. Wisconsin won the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Championship last weekend by beating Cornell 6-5, in overtime and then disposing of Denver 4-2 in the title game to become the first Wisconsin team to win an NCAA title since the Badger boxing team did in 1956.

The Badgers came within five seconds of never having a shot at the title of all. That's how much time was left on the Boston Garden clock when Wisconsin tied Cornell 5-5 to send the game into sudden-death overtime. Wisconsin, after making an incredible comeback, scored the gamewinner with 33 seconds left in the overtime period. Dave Olmstead centered the puck to freshman Steve Alley. Alley's shot was blocked, but the rebound came to Dean Talafous who scored the winner.

Wisconsin then moved into the championship game with Denver, who had ousted Boston College 10-4 in the tournament's first game on Thursday night. Wisconsin freshman Dave Pay opened the scoring in the first period but Denver tied it at 1-1. The Pioneers took a 2-1 lead early in the second period but from that point on it was all Wisconsin. The Badgers showed no after-effects of the exhausting game against Cornell the night before, and completely outplayed Denver. Denver was the Western Collegiate Hockey Association Champion and had been ranked the number one team in the nation coming into the NCAA tourney.

Captain Tim Dool tied the game at 2-2 and then man Talafous again scored the goal that proved to be the winner putting Wisconsin ahead 3-2. Senior Jim Johnston added an insurance goal in the third period and Junior Jim Makey was superb in the nets kicking out 32 Denver shots. But somehow, even the national championship game paled in comparison with the Badger team heroics against Cornell.

No NCAA tournament team was named, but Talafous was named Most Valuable Player in the tournament. Wisconsin became the first team since 1965 to win both Friday and Saturday night games in the national tournament.

The Badgers thus finished the season with a school record for wins in a single season, 29-9-2. Coach Bob Johnson finished his seventh year at Wisconsin with a record of 158-73-6 and the Wisconsin seniors, Bentley, Dool, Cherrey, Johnston and Doug Kelso, who participated in three NCAA tournaments in their four years, finished with 99 wins, 43 losses and 4 ties in their careers.

Steve Alley slammed in a rebound off Tom Ulseth's shot 23 seconds into the overtime Saturday night to give the weary Badgers a 6-5 victory over Michigan and the 1977 NCAA Hockey Championship.

If Wisconsin was off balance in Friday's overtime victory over New Hampshire, the Badgers came out clicking against the Wolverines on Saturday night. They passed crisply and confidently and played strong defense, with the forwards coming back to back check consistently. Baretta played confidently and positively in the net.

Alley scored on a power play 2 minutes, 29 seconds into the game when he fought off a man in the slot and deflected a Craig Norwich slapshot from the center blueline past goalie Palmer. Herbst scored on a breakout off a beautiful pass from Norwich at 9:27. The two Badgers steamed down the slot, Norwich on the left side and Herbst slightly ahead of him on the right. Norwich slid a pass through traffic to Herbst at the goal mouth and Herbst flicked the pass in.

Mark Johnson scored on a rebound off an Alley shot on a power play at 15:12. Norwich, at the blueline, passed to Eaves in the left circle and Eaves got it to Alley, who got off a shot in the slot. The rebound hopped out to Palmer's left and lay there until Johnson could roar in from the right circle and flip it over Palmer.

In the second period, Meeker carried the puck down the right wing boards, stopped and deked around a defender at about the top of the circle then skated a stride and floated a backhand which hit the bottom of Palmer's glove and skittered down into the net.

"Mike (Eaves) won the faceoff and Al forechecked it away from a guy," Ulseth said. "I took it behind the cage and came around and tried to stuff it." Alley said he got the rebound after Eaves had had a second shot "and I just shoveled it into the open net."

Sophomore goaltender, Julian Baretta, was named the Most Valuable Player in the 1977 NCAA Hockey Tournament. Baretta, along with Badger defenseman Craig Norwich and John Taft were members of the NCAA All-Tournament Team. Wisconsin became the first team ever to win the Big Ten, WCHA and NCAA titles in the same season.

The Wisconsin Hockey team took full advantage of its at-large berth in the NCAA Hockey Championships and captured the NCAA title for the 3rd time under Head Coach Bob Johnson. The Badgers downed the CCHA Champion Northern Michigan in the semi-final game, 5-1 and then took on the top ranked team in the country and WCHA title winner Minnesota. Wisconsin beat Minnesota by a 6-3 count behind the steady goaltending of sophomore Marc Behrend and a total team effort that the Gophers could not match. Behrend, who was also in the nets against Northern Michigan, was selected as the tournament's Most Valuable Player and along with freshman center John Newberry was placed on the All-Tournament team. Behrend had a total of 55 saves in the meet, 25 against Northern and 30 against the Gophers. Newberry led the Badgers in scoring with two goals and four assists and tied with Aaron Broten of Minnesota for the scoring leadership in the Duluth final four meet.

Wisconsin playing on an emotional high, never let the Gophers get into their style of play and 1st period goals by senior Dan Gorowsky, Newberry and Lebler gave the Badgers the confidence they needed. Wisconsin jumped out to a 4-0 margin midway through the 2nd period on a goal by freshman Ted Pearson. Minnesota cut the advantage to a 4-1, but Newberry gave the Badgers its four point lead back with a power-play goal at the 16:09 mark. Minnesota pulled its goaltender with 1:25 remaining in the game and Lebler hit the open net from just outside his own blueline to ice the victory for the Badgers.

On its way to the 1981 NCAA crown, the Badgers defeated the conference champs of all three Division I leagues. In the NCAA quarterfinals, Wisconsin beat Clarkson 9-8, in a total goals series. Clarkson was the ECAC title holder. Northern Michigan had captured the CCHA title and Minnesota finished first in the WCHA.

The Badgers finished their season with an overall record of 27-14-1, 2nd in the WCHA, tied with Michigan Tech and winners of the 34th NCAA Hockey Championship.

Scott Lecy led the team in scoring with 75 points (26G, 49A), while Peter Johnson and John Newberry were the top goal scorers with 30 apiece.

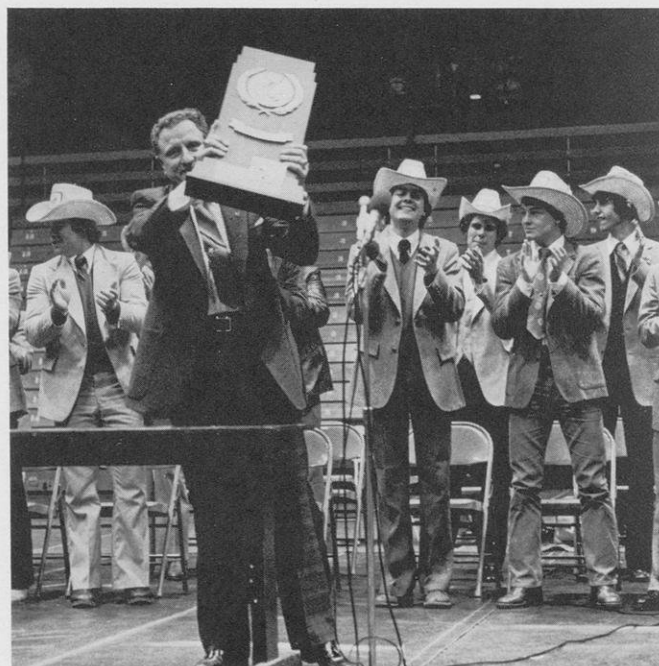

Attendance: 6,000

In what was to be a transition year, first year Head Coach Jeff Sauer guided the Badger hockey team to its 4th NCAA Championship, their second in the last three years. Sauer molded the Badger squad slowly but surely and over the final two months of the season it became the best college hockey team in the country, suffering only one loss in the last 15 games. By downing the powers of the East, Wisconsin proved to the hockey world that without a doubt they are number one.

Wisconsin met Providence in the semi-finals of the NCAA meet and with Marc Behrend in the nets shut-out the Friars 2-0. There was no scoring in the opening period, but a carry over power-play helped Wisconsin get the winning goal :37 seconds into the second period. Bruce Driver and John Johannson combined passes to set-up Paul Houck for his seventh power-play goal of the year and his 14th winning goal. Behrend was tested only 17 times while recording his first shut-out of the season, and Wisconsin's second in NCAA tournament action. (Terry Kleisinger had one against New Hampshire in 1982.) Jim Johannson tallied an open net goal with :47 seconds remaining for the final 2-0 tally. The Providence goalie was called upon to make 29 saves.

Wisconsin faced Harvard in the Championship game. The Badgers jumped out to a 3-0 lead with a goal in each of the first two periods and another goal early in the final stanza. Pat Flatley, who along with Paul Houck were named to the All-Tournament team, scored Wisconsin's first goal on a power-play midway into the first period. Flatley picked up his second goal of the game late in the second period. Paul Houston made it 3-0 early in the third, Harvard then scored two goals with Driver getting one sandwiched in between. The Badgers pulled away late in the game with Houston scoring his second at the 18:39 mark and John Johannson tallying a short-handed, empty net goal at the 19:21 mark to make it 6-2. Behrend was honored as the tournament's Most Valuable Player. It was the second time he received the award having captured it in the 1981 tourney. Badger defenseman Chris Chelios was the fourth Badger named to the All-Tournament team.

This marked the fourth title in eight appearances in the Final Four and their third appearance in the championship game in three years.

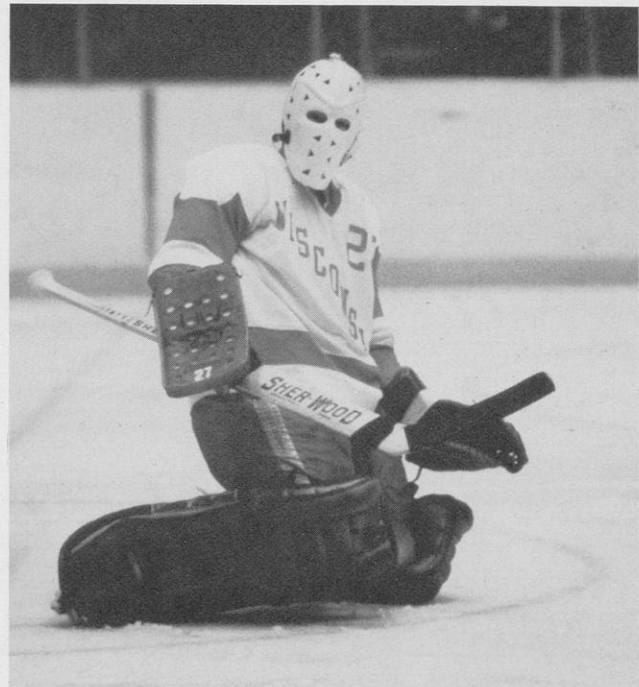

(Editor's note: This story appeared in the April 2, 1990 edition of the Badger Herald and was written by Brian Fishman)

Colgate's game plan was wrecked in the first 3:23 by Wisconsin star John Byce. His two early goals put the Red Raiders behind the eight ball, and left them in a precarious position which they were not able to escape. The Badgers held off Gate 7-3, and claimed the NCAA title.

Wisconsin capitalized on their first opportunity as Red Raider Steve Poapst was whistled for high sticking just :37 seconds into the game. When Byce tipped in Sean Hill's blast from the left point, it put the Badgers ahead to stay. But the telling play occurred less than two minutes later. With Colgate on the power play, Rob Mendel stole the puck and banked it off the boards and up to Byce who was breaking ahead of the pack. He deked Gagnon and neatly deposited the puck through the netminder's pads.

Byce described the shorthanded maker as the play developed.

"On the second goal, we were shorthanded and (Mendel) made a really nice play along the boards and tipped it past their defenseman. The other one took a spill so I was all alone. When you get Gagnon moving, I think he opens up some space, especially between his legs. When I cut across, I had a lot of room in the five hole and that's where I put it."

Two goals by Byce and singles by Tournament MVP Chris Tancill and Rob Andringa gave Wisconsin a big 4-1 first period lead. However, with 40 minutes to play there was still plenty of time for Colgate to put together a comeback. But Dennis Snedden took a pass from Brett Kurtz, skated right around a Colgate defender and blasted the puck past netminder Dave Gagnon, to make it 5-1.

Though Colgate pulled to within 6-3 midway through the third, Sauer knew that victory was there. All facets of their game were clicking, as the Badgers scored on tip-ins, perfect passing, and booming slapshots while receiving Stanley Cup style goaltending from Duane Derksen at the other end. All this meant that the UW now stood at the top of the college hockey world.

Along with MVP honoree Chris Tancill, center John Byce, goaltender Duane Derksen, and defensemen Mark Osiecki and Rob Andringa were all selected to the 1990 NCAA All-Tournament Team.

Home ice for the Wisconsin hockey team is the Dane County Memorial Coliseum, one of college hockey's finest all-around facilities and home to the NCAA Division I attendance leaders for 22 consecutive seasons.

With theatre-style seating for 8,644, the Coliseum is the second largest collegiate ice facility in the nation. The ice surface is an impressive 200' by 85', making for fast-paced, free-wheeling action.

Inside the coliseum, the hockey Badgers make use of dressing room facilities as fine as any in the country. Each player is assigned a comfortable, spacious dressing stall (3 1/2 x 6) for practice and game equipment. Located adjacent to the Wisconsin dressing room is a modern training room which includes a whirlpool and all the various modalities and exercise equipment for treatment of injuries.

The Badgers also have a newly-renovated and fully-equipped weight room located inside the Coliseum.

Recognized as the home of some of the nation's best collegiate hockey fans, the Dane County Coliseum and the Wisconsin hockey team have attracted the nation's largest crowds every year since the Badgers joined the Western Collegiate Hockey Association for the 1969-70 season.

Wisconsin has led the nation in college hockey attendance for 22 consecutive seasons dating back to 1970! Some 4,231,051 Badger fans have watched UW hockey teams in the Coliseum since 1967. And since 1969, the UW has drawn 3,849,056 for 462 home dates (not including exhibitions), an average of 8,331 per game!

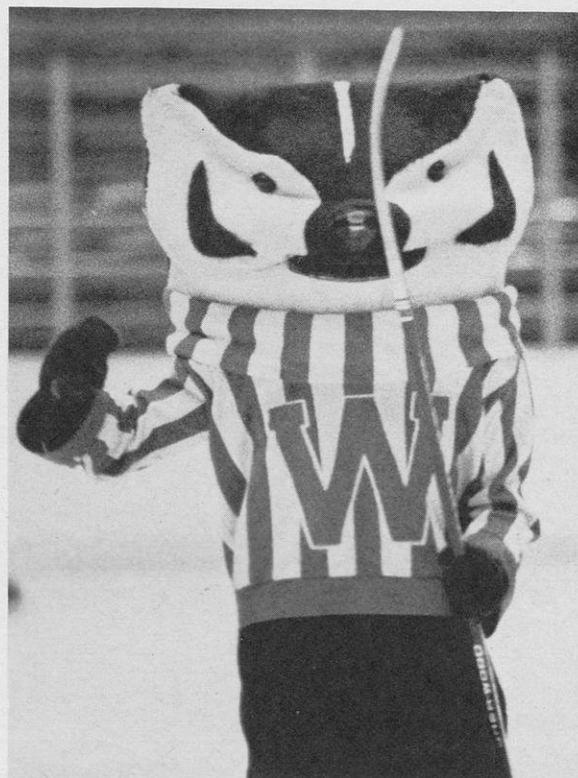
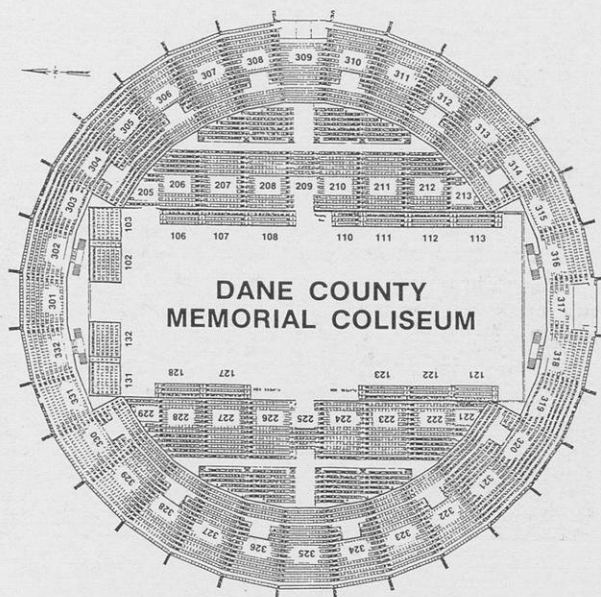

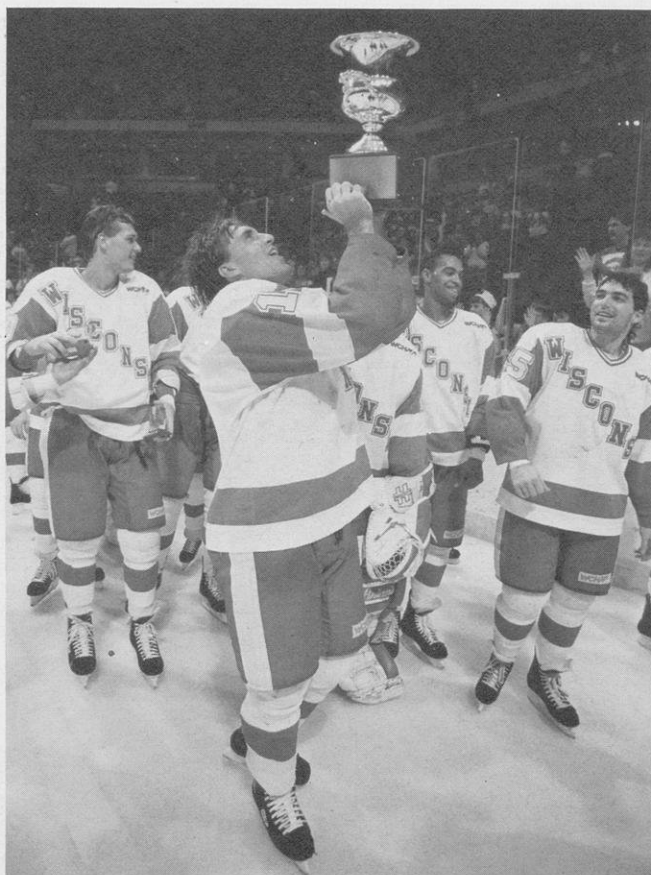
### 1991 BANK ONE BADGER HOCKEY SHOWDOWN

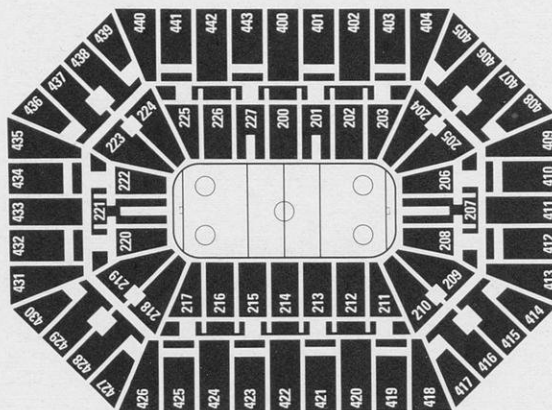
## THE BRADLEY CENTER

**THE BRADLEY CENTER**, located on the corner of Fourth and State Streets, covers more than a city block and is within walking distance of such luxury hotels as the Marc Plaza, the Wyndam and the Hyatt Regency, tournament headquarters.

With state-of-the-art engineering and technology, the Bradley Center features the integration of classical architectural elements. There are four dramatic entryways leading into the facility, one on each corner of the building. Each entryway is reached through a progression of visually exciting spaces: a tree-lined plaza, leading through an exterior portico into a 28-foot high, glass-enclosed vestibule, which opens onto a stunning 60-foot high, 17,500 square-foot lobby, also totally glass enclosed. Inside each lobby, double rows of concrete columns with granite bases rise almost 70 feet to support a spectacular skylight system. Each atrium is further enhanced by special lighting.

Two elevators, 16 escalators and various stairways take spectators to the seating area. Seating is comfortably arranged in an oblong octagon that provides spectators with an unrestricted view of the playing surface and the centrally located, four-sided video scoreboard.

The first level accommodates approximately 8,000 spectators. The second level features private suites that encircle the arena and provide seating for nine to 12 people per suite. The third level seats approximately 10,000 spectators in 21 rows of seats.

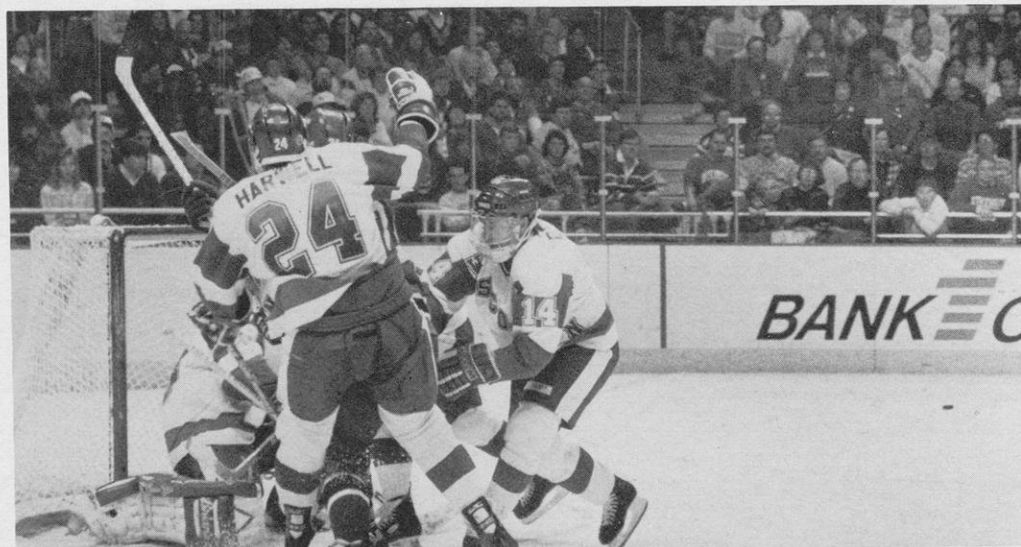


The Bradley Center has a total of 12 concession stands; eight of which sell traditional concession food and refreshments. The other four sell special deli-style sandwiches, pizza, pasta, chili, soups and other foods. Each stand is equipped with two to six closed circuit TV monitors. Special event merchandise is available throughout the Bradley Center at designated merchandise stands.

### ACCOMMODATIONS FOR THE DISABLED

The Bradley Center is an accessible facility with a variety of accommodations for patrons with limited mobility or special requirements.

# CHANCELLOR DONNA E. SHALALA



**Dr. Donna E. Shalala**, the first woman to lead a Big Ten University, has been the chancellor at UW-Madison since 1988.

As the leader of the nation's fifth largest university and the largest public research institution, Dr. Shalala has demonstrated a dynamic and energetic approach to dealing with issues in education.

During her tenure at Wisconsin, Dr. Shalala has launched efforts to strengthen undergraduate education; to be more competitive in recruiting and retaining top faculty, staff and students; to upgrade research facilities; to increase opportunities for women and members of minority groups on campus; and to strengthen the university's research program.

Dr. Shalala has garnered high national visibility during the past year. She was named one of the top five managers in higher education by *Business Week* and was tagged one of the fifty most powerful women in the United States by *Ladies Home Journal*.

In the athletic environment, Dr. Shalala has been a leader in restructuring the UW Athletic Department. She also serves on the Knight Commission, a national panel that is charting reform in intercollegiate athletics.

Prior to her arrival at Wisconsin, Dr. Shalala served for seven years as president of Hunter College. She served on the faculty at Columbia University and as Assistant Secretary for Policy Development and Research of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development during the Carter Administration.

She is a member of the National Academy of Public Administration and the National Academy of Education, and has received more than a dozen honorary degrees.

Public service has been a hallmark of her career. She spent two years in the Peace Corps. She is vice chair of the Children's Defense Fund, a trustee of the Committee for Economic Development, a member of the board of directors of Spelman College, the Brookings Institution, the American Ditchley Foundation, the Institute for International Economics and the Spencer Foundation.

Chancellor Shalala earned her bachelor's degree from Western College for Women (Oxford, Ohio) in 1962 and her doctoral degree from Syracuse University in 1970.

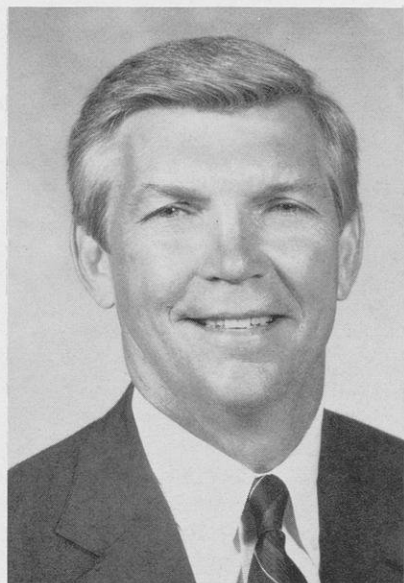

## ATHLETIC DIRECTOR PAT RICHTER



**Pat Richter**, a name synonymous with success in Madison and at the University of Wisconsin, is in his second season as Athletic Director of his alma mater.

Named to his position on Dec. 15, 1989, Richter is in charge of one of the nation's most successful collegiate athletic programs. He directs a program which has 20 sports, nearly 1,000 athletes, more than 160 employees and a large physical plant.

Since Richter's takeover the Wisconsin Athletic Department has made giant strides. Richter first lured Barry Alvarez from Notre Dame to head the football program. Richter oversaw an improvement in facilities boosting UW's ranking to among the nation's best. He also helped regain program support from every corner of the state.

In his opening year on the job, Richter saw both the hockey team and crew win national championships and track star Suzy Favor

capture the Broderick Cup, an award given to the nation's top female athlete. Clearly, UW athletics are on the upswing and Richter is the driving force.

The 49-year-old Madison native was a three-sport letterman at UW. He is the last nine-time letterwinner in Badger history, gaining three monograms in football, basketball and baseball.

On the Badger gridiron, Pat earned all-American and all-Big Ten mention twice as an end. He led Wisconsin to its last Rose Bowl appearance (1963) and set a game record with 11 receptions for 163 yards. The Badger's 42-37 loss to USC is recognized as the top Rose Bowl game ever.

Richter was an academic all-American in 1962 and was the recipient of the Big Ten Medal of Honor his senior season. Richter led Wisconsin in receiving twice, and his name remains in the school's record books.

As a slugging first baseman, Richter earned all-conference honors and led the Badgers in hits, home runs and runs batted in for three straight years. Pat actually earned his scholarship to Wisconsin for basketball, where the 6-6 center played three seasons.

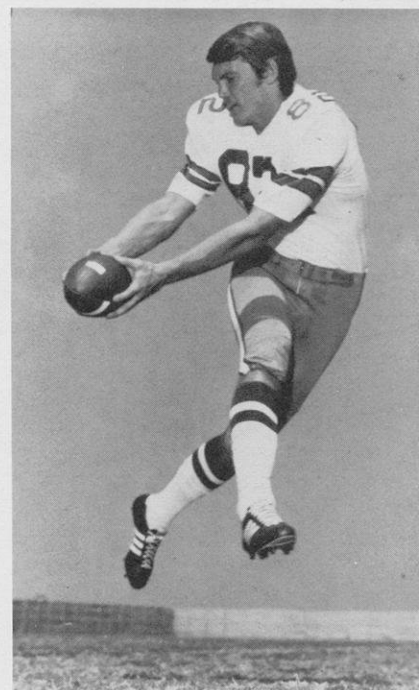
After earning his Bachelor of Science degree from UW in Landscape Architecture in 1964, Pat was a first-round draft pick of the Washington Redskins. He played nine seasons (1963-71) as an end and punter.

Upon retirement from the NFL, he returned to the UW-Madison to earn his law degree (1971). After six months with a Madison law firm, he worked his way up to Vice President of Personnel at the Oscar Mayer Corporation.

Among his achievements, Richter was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for post-college achievements in 1988. He is a member of the Wisconsin State Athletic and Madison Sports Halls of Fame, the NFL Player and Alumni Associations and the American Bar Association.

Pat is a regular contributor to many charitable organizations, including the UW Children's Hospital and the Four Lakes Boy Scouts.

Richter and his wife, Renee, have four children: Scott, Brad, Barry and Tim. Barry is a member of the Badger hockey team.







# A WORLD CLASS UNIVERSITY

**History:** Founded in 1849, the University of Wisconsin-Madison has the nation's fifth largest enrollment. Dedicated to the support of academic freedom, the UW-Madison has ranked among the top universities in the United States in every scholarly pursuit since 1910.

**Accomplishments:**

The UW-Madison has been a leader in many areas. Among the breakthroughs at UW: establishing the first academic programs in the U.S. for Scandinavian Studies (1875), Psychology (1888), Agricultural Economics (1909), Genetics (1910) and Wildlife Management (1939); launching the world's first space observatory; conducting the first bone marrow transplant in the United States; operating the nation's first radio station (WHA) in 1917; discovering Vitamins A and B; and finding evidence to link cancer with saccharine and cyclamates.

**Programs:** The UW has 11 schools and colleges, 133 academic departments, over 16,000 faculty and staff and a budget over \$1 billion. In one of the most thorough studies of its kind, the *Assessment of Research-Doctorate Programs in the U.S.*, ranked the UW tied for eighth in reputation for academic quality. Majors are offered in 151 bachelors, 191 masters and 123 doctoral programs.

**Students:** Over 43,000 students attend the University, coming from every county in Wisconsin, all 50



states and more than 125 countries. The UW ranks fourth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment, making it one of the nation's most diverse populations.

**Faculty:** The UW-Madison faculty routinely win national citations for teaching excellence, research and service. Much of the university's international reputation comes from the quality of its faculty. In fact, UW faculty and alumni have accounted for 11 Nobel and 16 Pulitzer Prizes.

**Athletics:** A member of the prestigious Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin offers its student-athletes the finest opportunities in both academic

and athletic pursuits. The Badger men's athletic department sponsors competition in basketball, crew, cross country, football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, and wrestling.

**Landmarks:** Tree-lined Bascom Hill is one of the university's most famous sites. Its centerpiece is Bascom Hall, which houses the UW's main administrative offices. Campus highlights also include North Hall (the oldest campus building), Van Hise Hall (the tallest building), Library Mall (featuring its clock tower) and Picnic Point (a 129-acre peninsula). The Memorial Union, complete with its lakeside terrace, is a favorite meeting place for students.

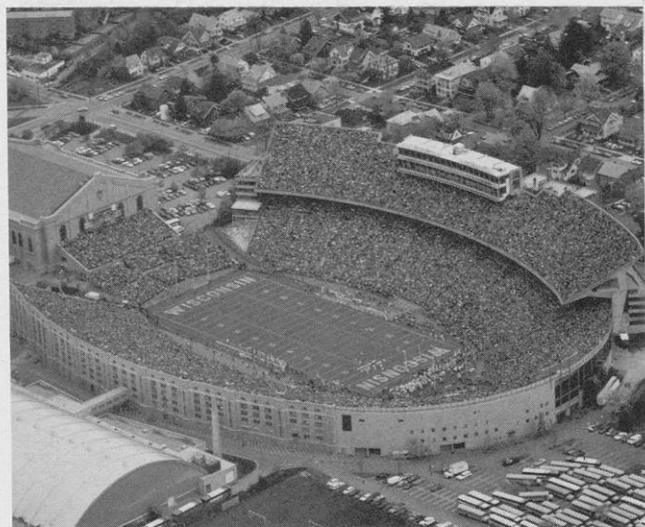
# THE WISCONSIN CAMPUS

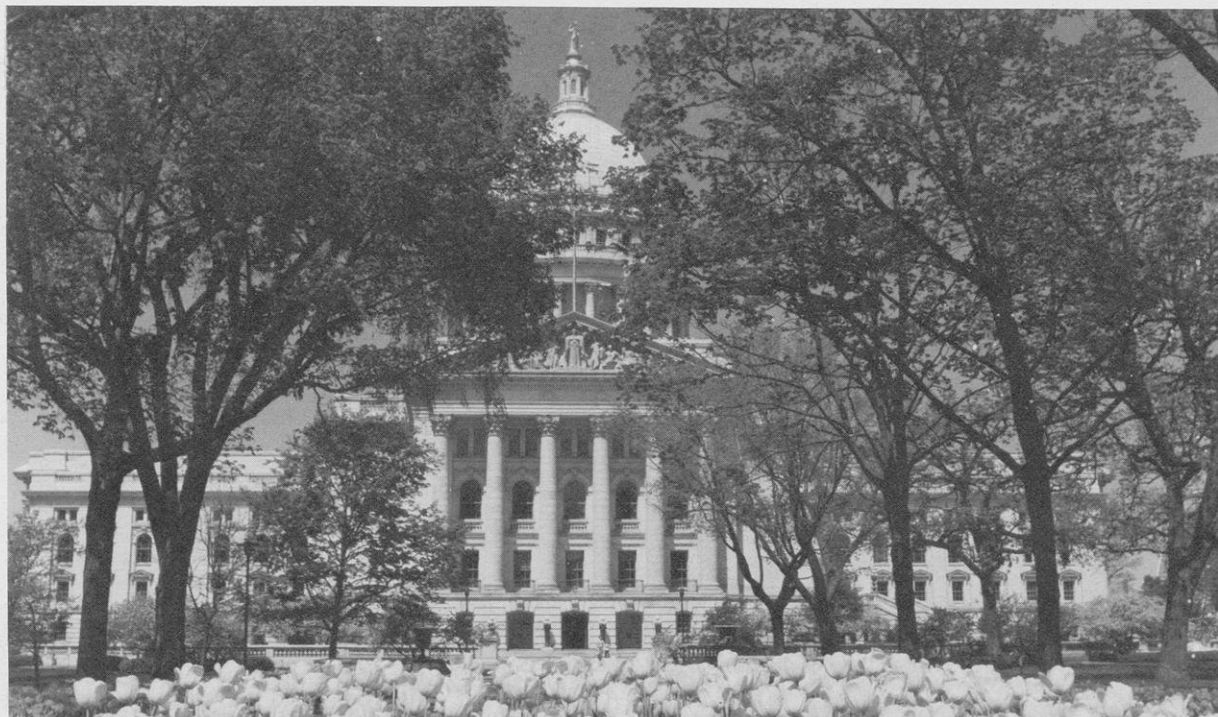
**Memorial Union** — the “living room of the campus,” which includes the lakeside terrace.

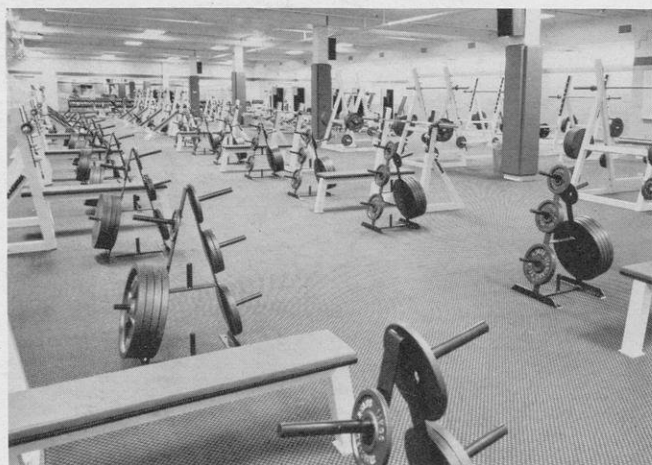
