

This fall, the Theater marks its 39th season with an especially diverse program of music, drama and dance. As a Union member, you have recently received a brochure detailing the entire season; we'd like to call your attention to some of the highlights of the first semester and also invite you to take advantage of the special dinners planned by our food staff to complement your evening at the Theater.

- Tickets are still available, in all price ranges, for the White Concert Series, five evenings of stellar artistry with Violinist Pinchas Zukerman, the Bach Aria Group, Music from Marlboro, Guitarist Carlos Bonell and Pianist Garrick Ohlsson. Red Concert Series tickets also are available in the lower two price ranges. Remember, the purchase of a ticket for either series entitles you to purchase tickets in advance for the October 14 concert by renowned Metropolitan Opera soprano Shirley Verrett and the October 15 performance of the beloved Vienna Choir Boys.
- The Piano Series, the first time the Theater has presented a series devoted exclusively to piano music, will bring three of the world's most outstanding pianists Horacio Gutierrez, Lazar Berman and Murray Perahia in a series not to be missed.
- Travel with us to Bavaria, Australia, and other spots around the globe. Tickets are still available in the lower price range for both the Monday and Tuesday night series of Travel-Adventure films.

## REMODELING PROJECTS OF PHASE II COMPLETED

Although a few pieces of construction equipment can still be identified around the Memorial Union, the Phase II remodeling and refurbishing of the nearly 50-year-old building is complete.

The Class of '24 Reception Room off Great Hall has had its shake-down this summer with many events scheduled there. The room, which is a separate entity and can be closed off from Great Hall with a folding wall, seats 150 and up for catered events such as luncheons, dinners and receptions.

The room can be used as an adjunct to Great Hall, either as a reception room before or after an event, or as additional seating for a large program.

On the third floor the Beefeater's Room has been expanded so that it can now seat a minimum of 100 for catered events. A mural, financed by former Union committee chairmen, is still to be installed on the West wall. The Beefeater's Room remodeling was part of a general redo of the rooms on the third floor Commons wing, including the Old Madison Room, the Board Room and Round Table.

The Class of 1925 Gallery on the second floor was opened with a reception during the summer. However, an official dedication is planned for this fall.

Carl Caruso in the Travel Center at Memorial Union tells us that after one of the busiest summers ever in the travel business, plans are now being made for a full year of special trips. Once again your expressions of interest are solicited. By returning the coupon indicating the trips in which you might be interested, you can help Carl plan an exciting year for traveling Union members.

Among the trips now planned are:

- Jamaica, Dec. 30 Jan. 6, \$298 -- and up, depending on the number of persons in a room.

In addition to these trips, the extremely popular Europe charters will be available again next spring and summer beginning in March, as will group flights to New York City for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Spring break. - For drama enthusiasts, the 1977-78 season includes three superb opportunities. The Acting Company (artistic director, John Housman) will present Bertolt Brecht's "Mother Courage" and Tennessee Williams" "Camino Real" on October 7 and 8, respectively while the Oxford and Cambridge Shakespeare Company will bring us the Bard's "Midsummer Night's Dream" on November 5.
- Witty, inventive, dynamic are among the plaudits currently greeting performances by the Twyla Tharp-Dance Company, which will present a lecturedemonstration and two performances October 27, 28 and 29 in the Union Theater.
- For jazz buffs, The Chuck Mangione Quintet, which played to a sold-out house last season, returns for a November 18 concert in the Theater. Mangione will also conduct the Madison High School Festival Orchestra for a special November 17 concert in the University Pavilion.
- The Theater's Debut Concerts, providing an opportunity to enjoy the talents of young artists just beginning to achieve prominence, will include performances by Dancer Matthew Diamond, Pianist Daniel Adni and Mime Graciela the first semester.

## DINNER-THEATER RETURNS THIS FALL AT THE UNION

To add to the enjoyment of an evening at the Union Theater, the Union will again offer several gala dinnertheater programs this semester.

Scheduled from 5:45 to 7 p.m., the dinners will feature waiter service in the elegant Tudor setting of the Union's Tripp Commons. Cocktails and wine service will be available.

Dinner-theater at the Union will begin October 7 and 8 for the Acting Company presentations of "Mother Courage" and "Camino Real". Roast round of beef with mushroom glaze will be the entree, with au gratin potatoes, tossed vegetable salad, hot rolls and muffins, green beans almondine, lemon meringue pie, and beverage.

The price for the special dinner programs is \$5.25 for adults, with cocktails and wine additional. For children up to 12 years of age, the dinner will be 35¢ times the years of their age. Reservations for the dinners may be made with the theater ticket orders (see the mail order blank, page 5) through the Union Theater Box Office. Because of limited seating for the dinners, early reservations are recommended.

In addition to the special dinner-theater packages, the Union will continue to present traditional pre-theater dinners in either the Inn Wisconsin or Tripp Commons for the majority of the other theater events (see calendar for specific dates). The dinners will be buffet style. Reservations for these dinners may be made through the Union Reservations Office, 262-2511.


