

MADISON,

The Capital of the State, is conceded to be one of the most beautiful cities in the west. It is situated on an isthmus, about a mile in width, lying between Lakes Monona and Mendota, near the geographical centre of Dane County and on the line of the Milwaukee & Mississippi Rail Road, about midway between Lake Michigan and the Mississippi River, distance about 95 miles from each. It is noted for the health and beauty of its location; commanding as it does, a view of nearly every characteristic of country peculiar to the west; the prairie, oak openings, mound, lake and woodland. The surface of the ground is somewhat uneven, but in no instance too abrupt for building purposes. From either lake it rises to an altitude of about 70 feet, and is then depressed and elevated, making the site of the city a series of gentle undulating swells.

The State House, a substantial edifice of stone, is built in the centre of a square park of 14 acres; the corners of the building are to the cardinal points of the compass, and from each of them, a street 60 feet wide extends, terminating at one or the other of the lakes. The Park is covered with a luxuriant growth of native oaks, and is located upon the highest point between the lakes, overlooking each and the surrounding city. It contains all of the State Offices, State Library, the Legisla-

tive Chambers, and Committee Rooms.

The streets are all straight and wide, and, with the exception of those above described as running east and west, are parallel to the sides of the Capitol, and consequently diagonal to the meridian.

The buildings of the State University stand at the termination of the street leading from the south western corner of the Park, which is State street, and distant about one mile from the Capitol, on College Hill, near the shore of Lake Mendota, and is in the centre of a park of about 50 acres commanding an extensive view of the city, lakes, and surrounding country.

The City Hall, at the west of the Capitol, is a massive structure of stone, and erected after the Roman style of architecture, with commodious accommodations for all of the City Offices. At the south eastern corner of the Capitol, the Court House and County Jail are built—the former a suitable structure of stone, the latter of beautiful cream colored stone, well

and conveniently adapted for its purpose.

Near the north eastern corner of the Park is the Post Office, Banks, Hotels, and the stores and business stands generally.— From its central location, and being the Capital of the State, Madison has special advantages and business facilities that can-

not fail to make it a large and flourishing city.

There is now in process of erection an extension to the State House; which, when completed, will surpass any structure of the kind in the west. For a view of the same, as it will appear when completed, we refer you to an engraving elsewhere in our book. Also of the State University buildings.



PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Until within three or four years, the Public Schools were almost entirely neglected. State Capitals are generally subject to influences unfavorable to that degree of interest which the population of any town must feel in schools, in order to secure the highest development of its resources for the education of youth. In this respect Madison has not been an exception.

In April, 1854, Mr. Kilgore commenced his labors in the small Brick School House on Washington Avenue, now used for primary schools. The first day there were twenty-three pupils present of different grades, speaking different languages, and presenting a variegated appearance. For various reasons, several of the pupils were sent home the first day to be prepared for school in a proper manner, most of whom returned in the afternoon very much improved in appearance.

The number gradually increased until the house would not accommodate the pupils, and the school was removed to the basement of the Methodist Church. Here the school was no

less crowded than before. In the winter term there were two hundred and sixty-seven pupils in one room. This term he was assisted by his sister, Miss Abby L. Kilgore. At the end of eight weeks, his health failed to such an extent that it was necessary to employ another assistant teacher for the remainder of the term.

The Legislature of 1854-5 enacted a special law, authorizing the election of six Directors, into whose hands the school

interests were committed.

With these few remarks, in order to present the subject matter of public schools in its proper light to our citizens, we herewith append the report of D. Y. Kilgore, Superintendent:

To the Board of Education—

Gentlemen:—According to the school census there are 1865 children between the ages of four and twenty, residing within

the limits of this city.

Of this number only 934 have attended the public schools the past year. The loss by absence during the winter term was 26 per cent., spring term, 25 per cent., and the fall term, 19 per cent., making an average loss during the year of about 23 per cent. of those whose names have been enrolled on the school registers. The following table will show the number, and average attendance of pupils in the different schools during each of the terms into which our school year is divided.

At the present time there are eleven separate schools, in which are employed fifteen teachers. The whole amount expended for the support of schools during the year, including rent of school houses, repairs, fuel, incidental expenses and teachers wages, according to the report of the treasurer of the Board of Education, is less than \$6000. This is less than six dollars and fifty cents per scholar for the whole number who have attended school. Judging from those now in the public schools, who have been instructed in private schools, we believe that pupils can be better educated in the former, at an expense of less than two dollars and fifty cents per term, than in any private schools in the city where the tuition for a single pupil ranges from fifteen to forty dollars per annum.

The new school houses, which were ready for occupancy in October, have enabled me for the first time to inaugurate a system of graded schools. Hitherto it has been impossible to grade the schools in such a manner as to enable teachers to do justice,

either to themselves or their pupils.

Although we have not been able to classify the scholars as thoroughly as would be desirable, sufficient has been done in that direction to convince the most skeptical of the practicability, utility and economy of a graded system of schools. Classes have been formed in accordance with the course of study adopted.

In consequence of the crowded condition of the school house in the first ward, it has been found necessary to exclude scholars under six years of age, to give place to those who are older, and whose attendance at school is much more important. Parents have sometimes complained of this, but when it is necessary to exclude any class of pupils, on account of a lack of room, it is better to exclude those who would be least benefited by school privileges. Most experienced educators entertain the opinion that no child under six years of age should be allowed to attend school at all.

School Regsiters.—The registers heretofore in use in our schools were both faulty in plan and deficient in matter. To secure a uniform system of school statistics, I have prepared a new one for each of the departments in which will be preserved the following facts, viz: Name of school; name of teacher; length of term, with the date of its commencement and close; number, age, name and attendance of each pupil; number of times dismissed; number of times tardy; number of times each pupil has communicated; number of times punished; number

of males; number of females; whole number of pupils; average number; number of visitors; also, the standing and conduct of the pupils, and the names of parent, or guardian.

These registers will furnish that kind of information which is so indispensable to the Superintendent, as well as to all those who are responsible for the character of our public schools.

Blank forms of reports of the weekly standing of each pupil, to be filled out by the teachers and sent home to parents or

guardians, will soon be in readiness.

TARDINESS .- The evil of tardiness has been diminished in all the schools, although it has not been entirely overcome. For the few cases which now remain, parents are, for the most part, responsible. Every case of tardiness is faithfully preserved in the permanent records of the school, and to a certain extent determines the standing of the pupil, whether he is or is not responsible. No reasons for tardiness are given, as the fact that a pupil retains connection with the school after repeatedly coming late to school, is of itself sufficient evidence that he has given satisfactory reasons to his teacher. A written excuse, while it transfers responsibility from the pupil to the parent, cannot remedy the evil, or render it less injurious or odious. Were all parents fully aware of its effects, they would submit to considerable inconvenience before they would lower the standing of their children, or cause them to interrupt the progress of the school, by coming in after the exercises commence.

IRREGULAR ATTENDANCE.—Another evil which interferes with the progress of our city schools, is irregular attendance. No pupil should be allowed to absent himself from school, even for one half day, except in case of sickness or some urgent necessity. If scholars cannot attend school more than three-fourths of the time, it is much better for them, and for the school, for them to attend every day for one-fourth part of the term, than to be absent one day in four during the whole length of school. About fifty per cent of the absences, during the last term, was occasioned by the delay in building sidewalks to

the school houses.

A large number of children in the second ward remained at home part of last term, because they were unable to cross the marsh between their homes and the school house in the third ward. Many children have been kept out of school in the first ward in consequence of the bad condition of the roads leading to the school house. We hope immediate steps will be taken to remedy these defects.

The practice of excusing pupils from school, for minor rea-

sons, is a pernicious one, and ought to be discontinued. At times as many as twenty pupils, in one department, have brought requests from parents, that their children might be dismissed from school, in a single afternoon. In several instances they were dismissed from school for the purpose of taking lessons of some itinerant singer, who taught them just enough to qualify them to take part in a public concert for his benefit. For a few songs, which have been learned, and which have been almost as soon forgotten, more than a hundred pupils have been allowed to leave their school, get behind their classes, and lose interest in their studies for almost an entire term. Instead of requesting a repetition of concerts, which are prepared at such a sacrifice, it would be more just to prosecute such individuals for "obtaining money under false pretences." In other places they have rules for the prevention of such evils as the above, and the good of our schools demands some such regulation here. Parents can have the privilege of hearing several hundred children sing together, almost any day, by coming within hearing distance of the school houses, to which they would be kindly welcomed, without any admission fee.

"If four from a class of sixteen, which is about the ratio of absenteeism among those who are enrolled on the school registers, are absent every day, there is, besides the loss of just onefourth of the teacher's time and the school expenses, a fearful drawback on the industry and progress of the scholars who are present. Of the twelve present to-day, four, that is, one-third were absent yesterday, and having not heard that lesson recited and explained, they are not fitted to understand the present lesson. The teacher must therefore go over it rapidly to them and this will cause a loss of time to the other eight, and being done rapidly will not be understood by the four absentees. Here then are three losses, no one of which is inconsiderable—the time and strength of the teacher, the time and patience of the scholars who were punctual, and the loss to the absentees themselves, resulting from the imperfect understanding of the previous lesson, and all these are additional to those enumerated above. As this twenty-five per cent. is the constant ratio of absenteeism, these losses are every day losses, and their amount in a year is fearful. The effect of these is to introduce discouragement into the breast of the faithful and courageous teacher, and confusion and loss of interest into all the classes

and exercises of the school."*

PARENTS AND TEACHERS.—The relation existing between teachers and pupils, is, in many respects, very similar to that which exists between parents and children, and whatever would tend to diminish the authority of the teacher, would tend to

diminish also the authority of the parent.

For this reason the teacher and parent should be friendly colaborers in the work of education. If the teacher establishes a system of instruction and discipline which clashes with that already existing in the family, the influence of one system must become weakened in proportion as the other grows strong. It becomes the duty of both teacher and parent, under such circumstances, to consult respecting the highest good of the child, and each should be willing to pursue that course which would be productive of the best results. Teachers are not always perfect, and while they should not be regarded as the servants of any one citizen, they should justly be regarded as the servants of And while they are not at liberty to adopt a principle, which, although it might please some influential parent, would infringe upon the rights of the humblest member of the school, they should listen respectfully to all the suggestions of parents, and adopt such of them as are wise and good; and a parent should never entertain an opinion prejudicial to the teacher, before he has received an explanation of the supposed grievance from the teacher's lips. Children do not always represent the circumstances of school transactions correctly, even when they desire to do so, and are rarely capable of appreciating the considerations which often influence the teacher's conduct. A wise parent will be cautious how he expresses his hostility to the management of the teacher, in the presence of his child, even when he has satisfied himself by a conversation with the teacher, that his action was wrong. Any teacher worthy of his calling, would appreciate the kindness of a parent, who, instead of threatening vengeance against him, would calmly investigate the facts of the alleged grievance, and in a friendly manner point out his fault. Parents sometimes fail to secure obedience on the part of their children, and oftentimes make mistakes in the management of even a small number, although they have an intimate knowledge of their children's dispositions and habits, and are invested with all the authority of the parental relation.

Teachers are obliged to study the character of a large number, under circumstances which often render it difficult to learn the truth respecting each individual, and it would be a miracle, if they should make no mistakes in the management of such a

variety of children as are often brought together in the same school.

In a majority of cases, those parents who censure most strongly the discipline their children receive at school, who declaim loudest against the tyranny and arbitrary rule of the teacher, are the very persons whose children are most disobedient and badly governed at home. If, instead of complaining of the teacher, and that, too often in the presence of their children, they would visit the school, invite the teachers to their homes, and take some pains to become acquainted with them, they might impart much valuable information concerning the dispositions, habits and tendencies of their children, which could hardly fail of being advantageous to both.

Teachers thus situated would forget the weary toil and care of the school room, in the satisfaction of knowing that their efforts were duly appreciated, and would embrace every opportunity to make their labors worthy of still greater attention. How much trouble might be saved and how much positive good might be accomplished by the combined wisdom of both teacher and parent. It is a gratifying fact that not a single complaint against any of the teachers now employed in the public schools, has, to my knowledge, ever been made by any parent or guardian who

has visited the school during the past year.

The school house grounds should be properly enclosed as soon as practicable in order that requisite apparatus for physical exercise may be prepared and the pupils have an opportunity of suitably ornamenting the grounds with trees and shrubbery. Although the financial embarrassment which has fallen so heavily upon the country begets a desire for retrenchment in all public expenditure of money, I am confident that our citizens will be slow to commence with the most important and indispensable of all, and the only one which is always sure to make ample returns for the most liberal investments. Our schools are worthy of all that has been expended for their support.

RELIGIOUS WORSHIP, CHURCHES, &c.

BAPTIST CHURCH, Carroll Street, near Main.

The First Baptist Church in Madison was organized, December 23d 1847, composed of twenty constituent members. Rev. H. W. Read became the first pastor; he resigned in March, 1849, when he went out as a pioneer missionary to New Mexico. In October, 1849, Rev. John Williams was chosen pastor, but resigned February ensuing; and in the summer of 1851, Rev. S. S. Whitman, formerly professor in Hamilton Institute, New York, came from Belvidere, Illinois, and became pastor of the church, but his labors were of brief duration. He died, after a short illness, on the 2d of January, 1852.

In January, 1853, Rev. M. D. Miller arrived, by invitation, and entered upon the pastoral labors, and at once planned, and soon had under process of construction, the fine and commodious edifice now occupied by the church and congregation. By Mr. Miller's unceasing energies, the church was ready for occupancy in September, 1854, and he continued as pastor, till he resigned in 1855, when Rev. James Cooper was chosen his successor. After a year's labor, Mr. Cooper resigned, and was succeeded, in December 1856, by the present pastor, Rev. W. R. Brooks.

The church edifice is a fine and solid structure, of brick, 48 by 78 feet in size, with a basement, having seventy pews neatly finished.

The present membership of the church numbers seventy-five; sabbath school about seventy five.

The Roman Catholic Congregation of the German language, in the city of Madison, constitute a congregation independent of those in the English language. The congregation erected a church building on Johnson street; the building being sixty by twenty feet, capable of being used for day and Sabbath schools.

The number of members with families are about one hundred, belonging to the Congregation of the Redeemer's Church, as the

church is called.

The external church matters are under the direction of a Church Committee of five, elected by the congregation for the term of one year, under the superintendence of Rev. John M.

Henry, Bishop of Wisconsin.

The Catholic congregation has a day school for both languages, German and English. School time from nine till one o'clock, visited by seventy-six scholars, and a Sabbath school visited by forty scholars.

The present minister of the congregation is Mr. Michael

Haider.

CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH, Wisconsin Av., cor. Fairchild st.

The Congregational Church, was formed in October, A. D., 1840. It was the first Christian Church organized in Madison, and the first in a wide region adjacent. In a letter, from one of its first members, written only two days after its organization, he says: "Within fifty miles, in any direction, you cannot find another, and in a due north direction perhaps not one on this side of the pole." One can hardly realize that this could be true only so few years ago. The Church originally consisted of nine members, and was organized in the present Supreme Court rooms at the Capitol. After wandering about from place to place for several years, the church succeeded in erecting what was then deemed a very commodious and attractive edifice, now occupied by the City High School. A year and one-half ago the church and congregation had become so large as to compel a removal from this. They took possession of a new hall which was prepared for them, expecting to set about the erection of another and more ample house of worship. Various difficulties, however, were encountered, and it was subsequently determined to build a chapel, and postpone still further the erection of the church proper. The chapel was occupied for the first time in February, of this year. It is a handsome brick building, situated on Washington Avenue, about forty feet by seventy in

measurement, and will furnish sittings for five hundred people. The church numbers ninety members. The present officers of Church and Society are as follows:

This society was organized October 4, 1851. Rev. H. B. Gardiner, then of Galena, was engaged as minister. He occu-

pied the pulpit until October 21, 1855.

The church edifice was erected in the year 1852, and was opened for public worship on the first Sunday of January, 1853. The size of the building is 40 by 60 feet; the spire is 110 feet high; a bell, of 1000 pounds weight, was purchased and is now in use. The cost of the building was \$45.000, including site. September 21, 1856, the society extended an invitation to Rev. Wm. L. Green, of Kentucky, to be its pastor, which was accepted, and he has entered upon the duties of the office.

CEMETERY.

City Cemetery is situated about two miles from the City, and contains about eighty acres of unimproved land. It is rapidly being improved and beautified, and soon will be as fine a Cemetery as any in the Union.
