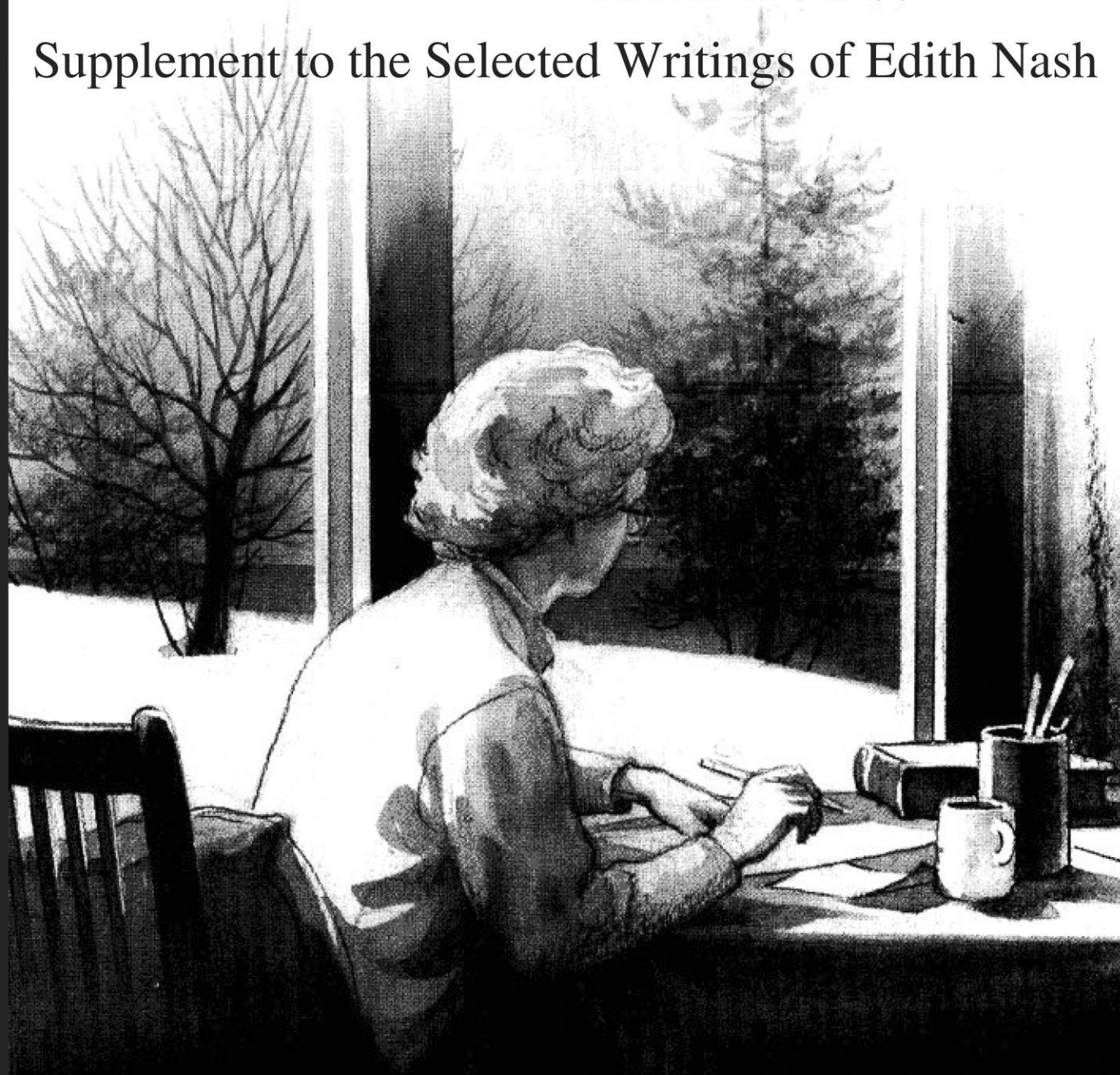

Nash was a retired educator who cofounded and worked at the Georgetown Day School, a private school in Washington, D.C. Nash also worked with Native American issues during her life. She passed away November 9, 2003, in Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin, at the age of 90.

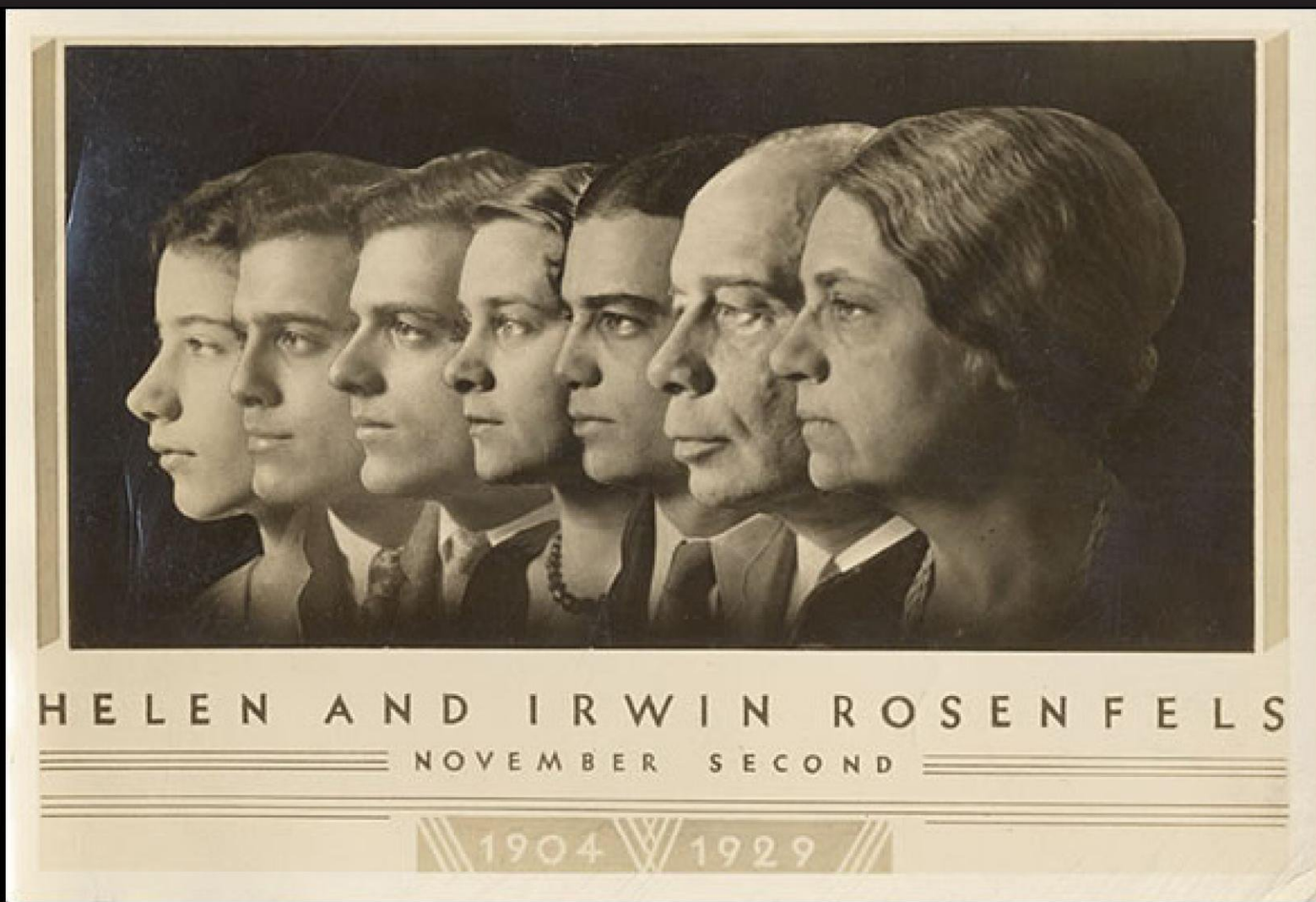
