Product Information: 'Milpath' (meprobamate + tridihexethyl chloride) is indicated in both organic and functional gastrointestinal disorders, especially when accompanied by anxiety and tension.

Side effects from tridihexethyl chloride are rare at recommended dosage; after high dosage, dry mouth and blurred vision, and occasional constipation or "bloating" may occur. Slight drowsiness and, rarely, allergic reactions may occur with meprobamate. Meprobamate may increase effects of excessive alcohol. Consider possibility of dependence, particularly in patients with history of drug or alcohol addiction. Withdraw gradually after pro-

longed use at high dosage. Tridihexethyl chloride is contraindicated in urinary bladder neck or pyloric obstruction, and glaucoma; may also be contraindicated in peptic ulcers with significant gastric retention due to stenosis.

Usual Dosage: One 'Milpath'-400 or 1-2 'Milpath'-200 tablets q.i.d. at meals and bedtime.

meprobamate 400 mg.
tridihexethyl chloride 25 mg.

meprobamate 200 mg.
tridihexethyl chloride 25 mg.
