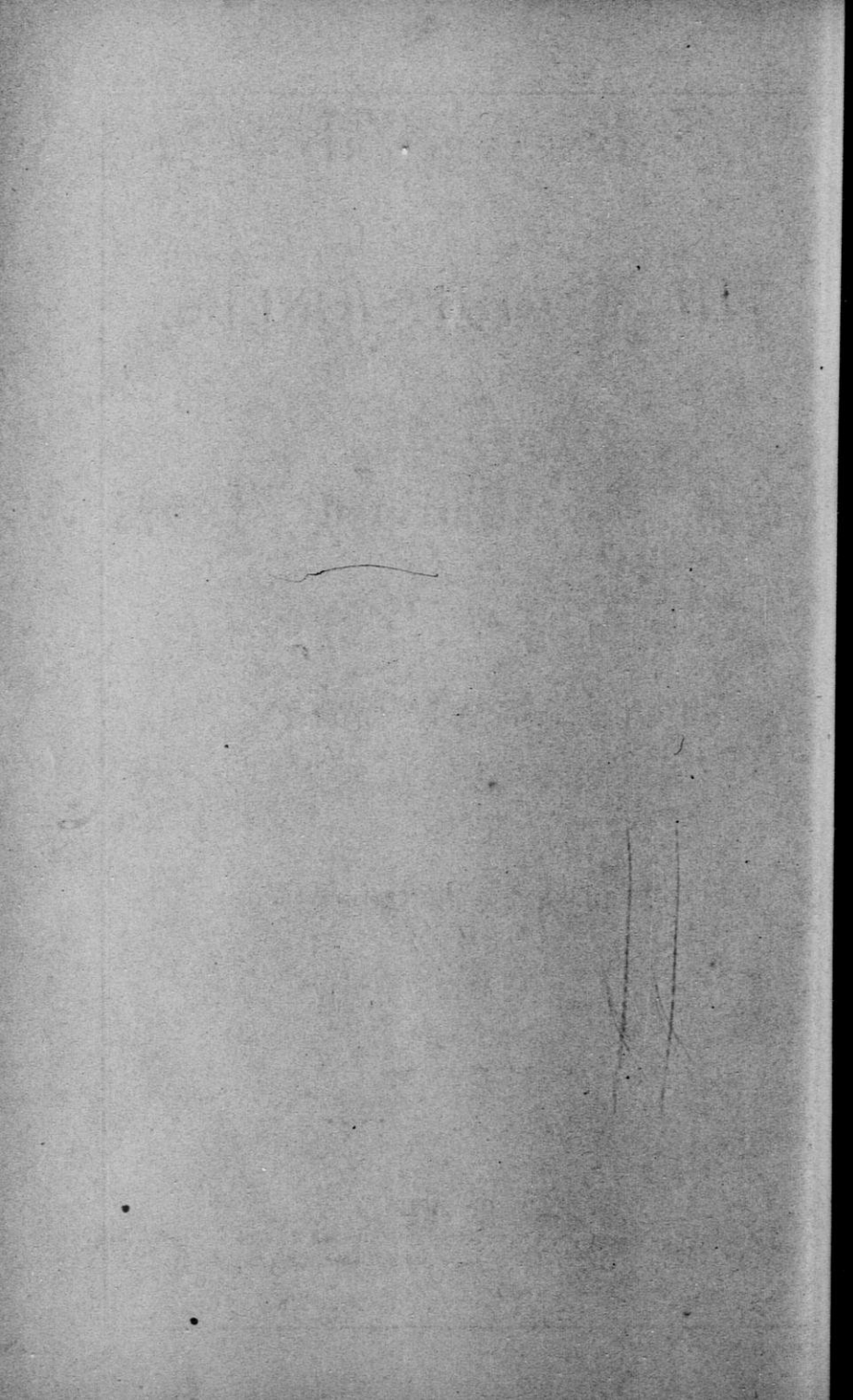

Governor of Wisconsin:

SIR:—As required by law we report herewith to you an account of our official proceedings for the year ending September 30, 1866.

The whole amount of lands sold during the year is as follows:

For a detailed statement of these sales we respectfully refer to accompanying tables, marked "Exhibits A," "B," "C," "D," and "E."

These tables show the number of acres sold in each county, the fund to which they belong, the amount sold for, and the amount received on such sales.

The number of acres sold as compared with the three previous years is as follows :

No money has been loaned to individuals during the year, but the principal of each fund as it has accumulated has been invested in bonds of this state as required by law—a system so much preferable to the old loan system that we sincerely hope that at an early day every dollar due any of the trust funds will be invested in like manner or in bonds of the United States.

The tables marked "Exhibit F and G," show the number of acres of land belonging to the state at the close of the fiscal year, the class to which they belong, and the counties in which they are situated.

The number of acres owned by the state is as follows :

In addition to the swamp lands above mentioned we have, during the fiscal year, under authority from the commissioner of the general land office, selected 751,431 30-100 acres of land enuring to the state under the swamp land grant approved Sept. 28, 1850. A list of these selections has been forwarded to the commissioner for approval.

Table marked "Exhibit H," shows the amounts apportioned to the several counties, June 1, 1866, under the provisions of chapter 537, laws of 1865.

From this table it will be seen that the sum of \$45,774.58 has been apportioned and under the law is to be applied to reclaiming swamp lands. This amount of money if properly expended will go far toward rendering these lands among the most valuable in the state, but in order to ensure a proper application of the money hereafter to be apportioned, we would recommend that said chapter 537, laws of 1865, be so amended as to provide for a penalty for any diversion of this money from the purposes specified in the law.

That some legislation is needed on this subject is evident from the fact that we have received numerous letters from different parts of the state complaining that the drainage fund is being used for other purposes than those expressed in the law.

We would further recommend that this law when so amended be al-

lowed to remain intact, and that no further appropriation of lands be made for any purpose except those specified in the law, as under said law the original intention of the grant of congress can be fulfilled and the swamp lands reclaimed and made valuable.

The sum of \$5,860.00 has been expended during the last year in protecting the state lands from trespass.

Under the operation of the laws now in force for the protection of state lands, a larger proportion of these lands are paid for in full at the time of entry than formerly, and the present laws are believed to be effective, but we would recommend that inasmuch as the expense of protecting these lands is now paid from the general fund, that the present law be so amended as to provide that all moneys paid as trespass penalties be paid into the general fund.

We desire to call attention to chapter 261, laws of 1864. Under the provisions of this law, a large amount of forfeited mortgaged lands have been appraised and are now subject to sale.

This law provides that these lands shall be sold at their appraised value, but at the time of their forfeiture there were taxes due thereon, which had been returned to the state treasurer for collection, and still remain unpaid.

Under the law we have no authority to collect these unpaid taxes, as it was clearly the intention of the law to sell these lands at their actual appraised value. The question arises, how are the counties to collect these unpaid taxes?

Have they a claim upon the money actually realized upon the sale of these lands, or are the taxes wiped out by the operations of said chapter 261, laws of 1864?

We would recommend that some action be taken by the legislature defining the intent of said law.

The question of title to the islands in the Wisconsin and Mississippi rivers remains unsettled.

We have no doubt that these islands belong to the state under the provisions of the swamp grant of Sept. 28, 1850, but an application made by us to the commissioner of the general land office, for the approval of these islands to the state has been met by a decided refusal to examine the question on its merits: the commissioner basing his refusal upon an act of congress, approved March 12, 1860, which provides "that the selection of lands under the grant of Sept. 28, 1850, shall be made within two years from the adjournment of the legislature of each state at its next session after the passage of this act."

The commissioner decided "that as this period has elapsed, these islands were no longer subject to such selection or any other action under the swamp grant."

From this decision an appeal has been taken to the secretary of the interior, which has not yet been decided. We hold that inasmuch as the act of congress, approved Sept. 28, 1850, made it the duty of the secretary of the interior to furnish this state with a list of the lands to which she was entitled under said act, and as repeated requests were made by the state for said lists prior to the act of March 12, 1860, that the rights of the state cannot be prejudiced by the neglect of the secretary of the interior to perform the duties prescribed by the act.

It may be that it will be necessary to obtain some action by congress to secure our rights in the matter.
