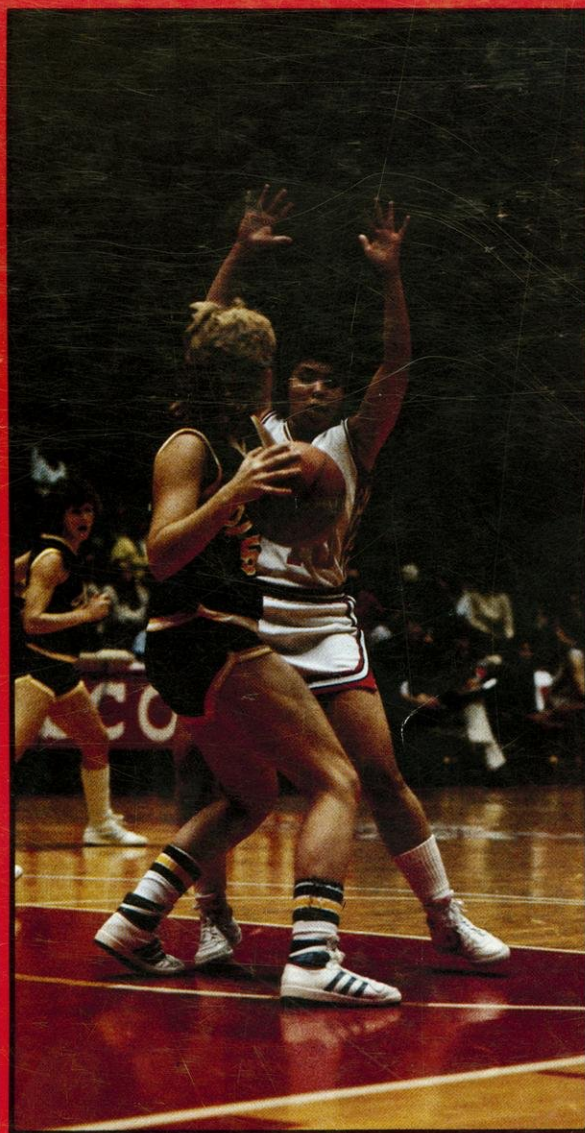
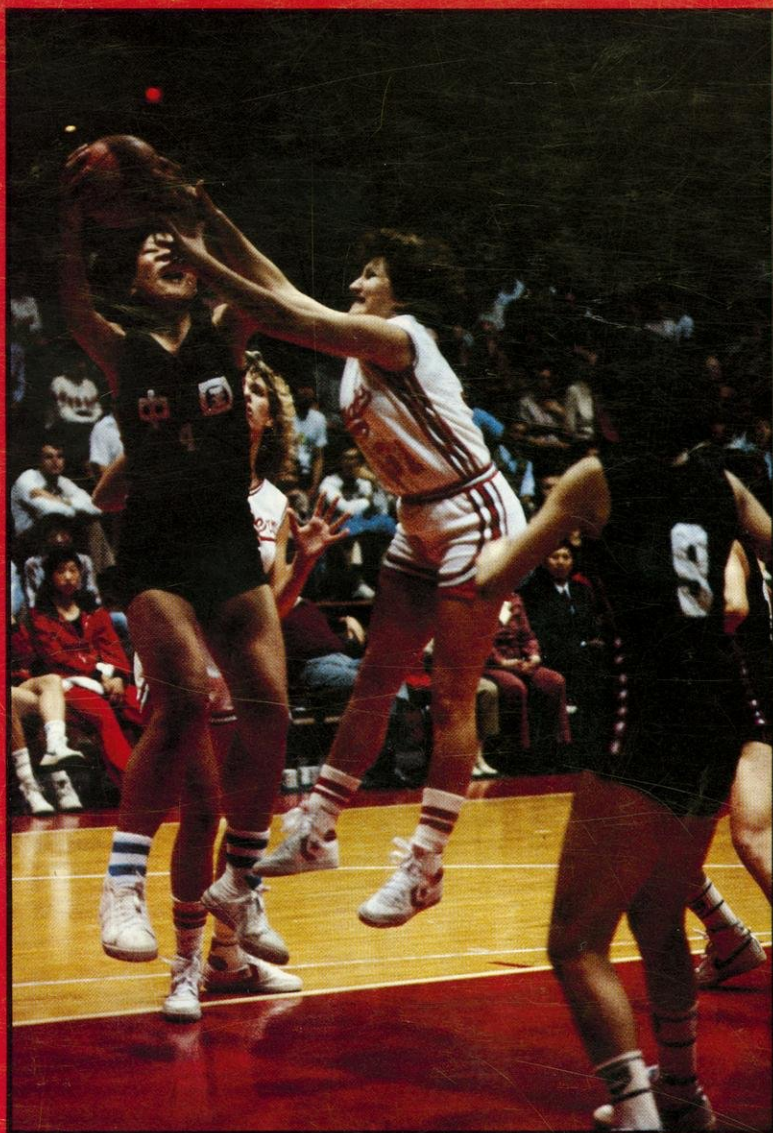

1983-84 Badger Preview

1

The University of Wisconsin women's basketball team will enter the 1983-84 season with sights on a third consecutive winning season. The Badgers are coming off their best season in the nine-year program history, having posted a 19-8 record and an 11-7 conference record to finish fifth in the Big Ten. Nine single game and single season records were set, and two others tied. The 1982-83 Badgers averaged the most points (74.3) and rebounds (45.6) of any previous squad, and set a consecutive win mark of seven.

The Badger personnel losses include Wisconsin's premier woman basketball player, Theresa Huff of Milwaukee, WI, who closed out her career with 30 UW basketball records, six of which were all-time men's and women's program records. Also gone are Michelle Lowman, UW's all-time leading shot-blocker and a key rebounder, and starting forward Kris Hallisy. Starting point guard Faith Johnson will not be returning to school this semester. The junior averaged 10.6 points per game, 3.2 assists and 2.4 steals.

Three freshmen and red-shirt Sheila

Driver will join eight returnees in attempting to carry Wisconsin to new basketball heights. Head coach Edwina Qualls enters her eighth season at Wisconsin with a 98-90 career coaching record. Assisting Qualls will be new assistant Terry Ellis, former coach at Grove City College (Pa), and former Badger Linda Gough.

Newcomers include **Inga Young**, 6-2 freshman from Alexandria, VA. Young averaged only 8.1 points per game in high school, but her strength lies in her defensive abilities. She averaged 3.7 blocks per game and had a rebounding average of 8.1 per game. According to Qualls, "Inga can get up and down the floor well and will fit into the running game very well."

Freshman **Michelle Fischer**, a 6-0 small forward from Flint, MI, brings high school credentials of 19.5 points and 17 rebounds per game. Wisconsin native **Jane Skarr**, a 5-9 guard-forward from Hales Corners, is one of the most complete players to join the Wisconsin system, according to Qualls. She should see considerable playing time at guard. Also back in action will be 5-8 sophomore guard, **Sheila Driver** of Racine,

WI. She potentially could replace Johnson in the starting line-up.

Returning forwards and centers include **Theresa Theder**, 6-4 junior from Watertown, WI, who will start at center. Her competition, **Camilla Hudson**, a 6-4 sophomore from Aurora, IL is out of the line-up while rehabilitating a knee injury. After playing behind Theresa Huff for two years, **Andrea Adams**, junior forward from Milwaukee, WI, could crack the starting line-up. **Chris Pruitt**, 5-9 junior from Chicago, IL, will start at the small forward spot. Chris was third on the team in scoring with an 11.2 average, third in rebounding with six caroms a game and third in assists.

Cindy Slovak, a 5-11 forward from Chicago, IL and **Linda Stuessy**, a sophomore from Belleville, WI, along with freshmen Fischer and Young will provide the front-line depth. The front line will need to pick up the 17 points and 11 rebounds Theresa Huff contributed per game. Chris Pruitt seems ready to come out from under the shadow of Huff and have a big year. Qualls feels, "The team as a whole might respond in positive fashion to the challenge of Terri's loss."

Joining Skarr and Driver at the guard position are returning 5-8 seniors **Janet Huff** and **Mary Chernelich**, both of Milwaukee. Janet starts at off-guard and has been a major contributor for the Badgers. She was the team's second leading scorer with a 12.3 average, was the assists and steals leader, and best free throw shooter on the team with a 75 percent accuracy. Chernelich enters her second year at Wisconsin and is expected to contribute at both the point and off-guard position.

The season opens November 26-27 at the University of Kentucky Invitational. Eight non-conference games will follow before the beginning of the second year of Big Ten round robin action. The Big Ten schools recruited seven Parade All-Americans and the Conference race looks to be more competitive than ever before.

Qualls picks Illinois as the favorite to win the conference after a big recruiting year. Ohio State will rival Big Ten defending champ, Indiana, for the next spot. Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and Northwestern will logjam in the middle followed by Michigan State, Michigan and Purdue.

Qualls sees this as a rebuilding year for the Badgers. Her team objectives are to have a winning season, remain in the upper division of the Big Ten, and beat Ohio State and Minnesota for the first time.

Of Wisconsin Qualls concluded, "To win, the front line will have to gel, we have to get some good solid rebounding from our front line, and the defense must set up the offense so we can play our running game."



Big Ten Preview

It seems the most unlikely of places for a revolution in women's basketball to be occurring. After all, what have they ever REALLY done out there in the upper reaches of the NCAA'S Mideast region?

This year, however, the women's teams in the Big Ten are not interested in what has or hasn't gone down before. Talk to them and they'll tell you that their shouts

are not going to fall on deaf ears. This season, they want the nation to notice the "Big" in Big Ten.

The conference women are already among the nation's leaders when it comes to organization. The central office emits a constant flow of statistics, standings and other pertinent information to the news media. On November 20, the basketball coaches will gather in Chicago for a pre-season press conference—an event that has been held by only a few other leagues.

The Big Ten has shown itself to be a conference of balance. At midseason last year, four teams (Ohio State, Northwestern, Wisconsin, Minnesota) were in contention for the league title. But it was Indiana that went charging to the finish and walked off with the glory.

And there is a tradition of excellence. The Big Ten and the Southeastern Conference are the only two groups to have placed as many as seven different teams in national tournament play over the last decade, which includes the AIAW years as well as the new era under the NCAA.

The Big Ten women proudly state that the league has gained in stature over the summer. The reason, they say, is the new coach over at Iowa—Vivian Stringer. At Cheyney State, she led her team to the first NCAA national title game in 1982 and had her team finish in the top five again last year. For her part, Stringer will point out the lure of the league as one of the most competitive in the nation.

The wars within a war—the conference schedule—do not begin until January. In the interim, look for the contending teams in the league to launch a major assault on national opponents.

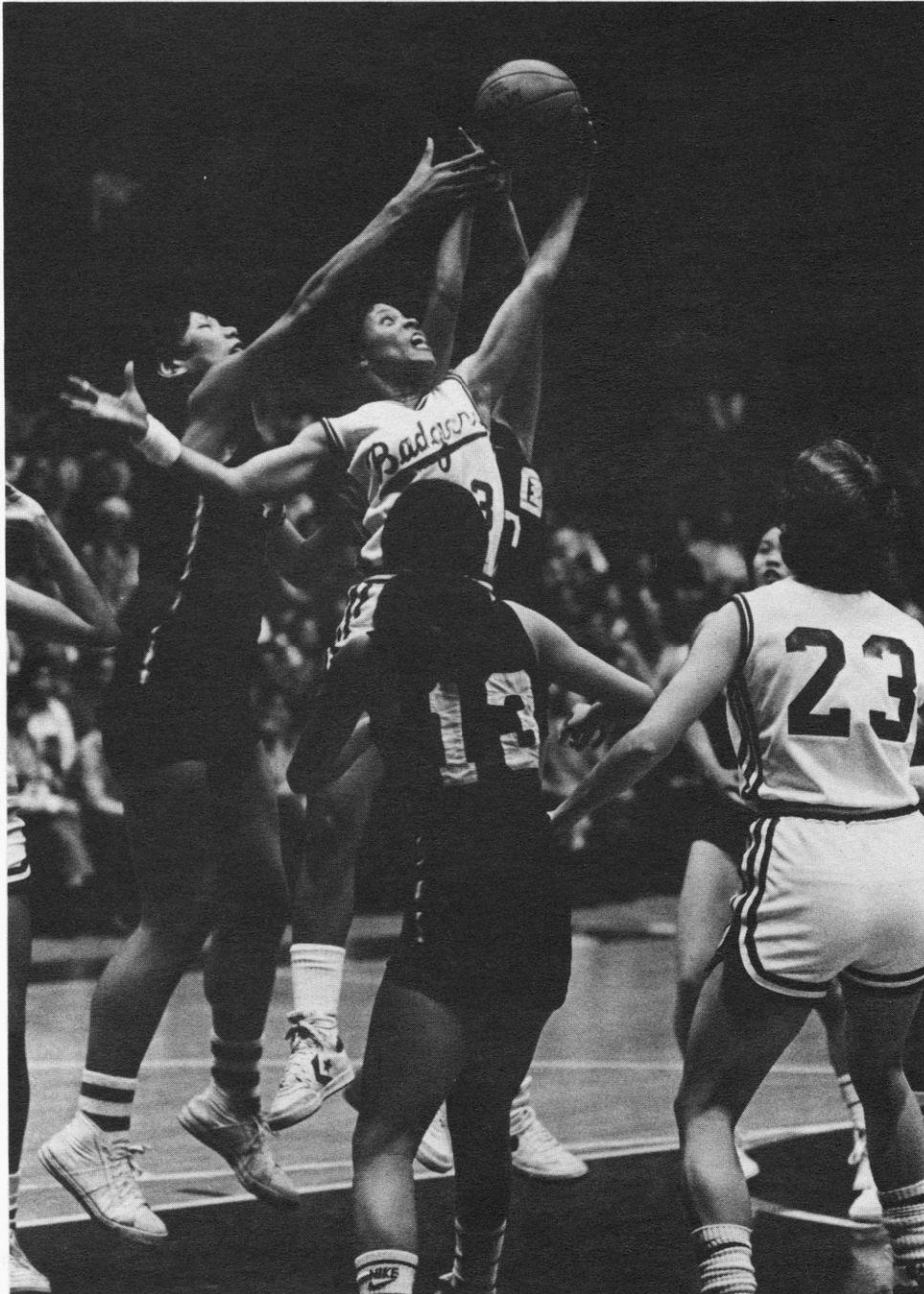
The Big Ten women learned to stop taking prisoners after Indiana—unranked Indiana—cut short No. 11 Kentucky's drive to the final four in the first round of the NCAA tournament, 87-76, in Lexington.

Now they're ready for more.

Indiana's national foes include Kentucky, Arizona State, Louisiana Tech, and South Carolina. Minnesota has Kansas, Tennessee, Western Kentucky, and potentially Rutgers, Cheyney and or Mississippi in the La Salle tournament in its battle plans.

Ohio State lists NCAA performers Kentucky, Louisiana Tech, Stephen F Austin, champion Southern California, and Georgia as prime targets. The Buckeyes, remember, were tied with Indiana in the final Big Ten standings. The Hoosiers advanced on the tie-breaker procedures, though many feel State should have also received a bid.

"I'm still so mad about what happened at the end of last year, I know I'll be a better coach this year because of it," says Ohio State's Tara Van Derveer.



Her Big Ten colleagues expect the Buckeyes to be a better team. They've made Ohio State the conference favorite with 6 first-place votes and 95 out of 100 points in the preseason vote. Indiana, which was 5th in last season's similar vote, has been chosen second with a first-place ballot and 88 points. Minnesota placed third with a first-place vote and 76 points. Illinois gained 2 first-place votes and 69 points for fourth. Northwestern placed fifth with 58 points, followed by Michigan State and Wisconsin, tied for sixth with 46 points. Iowa was eighth with 41 points and many expect the Hawkeyes to be the most improved team in the league. The school was tied for ninth in last season's forecast. This time, Michigan and Purdue tied for the position with 22 points.

No one will be able to accuse Ohio State of having a weak schedule this season. By the end of December, it's conceivable that the Buckeyes could end up facing all but Old Dominion of last March's NCAA final four contingent. The chemistry seems to be working in Columbus, where youth and experience could produce a winning blend. Three starters and nine letterwinners return from last season's 23-5 contingent. All-Big Ten pick Yvette Angel, a junior, returns with her team-leading 15.3 scoring average. Junior Carla Chapman returns at center, while center-forward Kelly Robinson is also back in the lineup. Recruiting continues to be impressive with the addition of Kim Walton, the state's Class AAA player of the year and Diane Davis, the state's Class AA player of the year.

"I think people are forgetting we won it last year, but that's ok, because we're the ones wearing the rings," says Indiana coach Maryalyce Jeremiah, who added to her reputation by bringing the Hoosiers through with a late season charge. Her squad's equipped to make a run at the glory again. Rachelle Bostic (16.3 points) and All-Big Ten player Denise Jackson (19.8 points, 12.2 league-leading rebounds) return from a 19-11 group that at one time was suffering with a 3-7 mark. Linda Cunningham, the conference freshman-of-the-year, returns at guard. Key recruits include 6-2 Karna Abram, a Parade magazine All-American, and Lisa Bradley, a 5-9 guard.

Minnesota will miss Debbie Hunter and Cindy Kuhlman from its 20-7 squad but the outlook remains extremely bright for Ellen Mosher's Gophers with the return of junior Laura Coenen. The 6-1 forward-center led the conference and was fifth in the nation in scoring with a 24.2 average. She holds seven school records. Also back are Mary Dressen at guard and Carol Peterka at forward. The key recruit is 6-2 forward-center Molly Tadich.

Illinois has a nucleus of eight letterwinners for Jane Schroeder that will be more experienced after going through a 14-14 season. Five of the eight veterans are sophomores, which gives the Illini a youthful look with the experience. The key returnee is 6-3 junior Kendra Gantt, who had a 21.0 scoring average and 8.8 rebounding mark. Senior Diane Eickholt is expected to be stronger after recovering from injuries last season. Coach Schroeder landed two 6-3 centers—Jonelle Polk and Leslie Hudgins, who both had high school All-American honors. Stacey Pfeiffer, a freshman guard from Wisconsin, led her high school team to two state Class A titles.

Northwestern can't be discounted from anything with 6-1 junior Anucha Browne in the lineup. The Wildcat veteran averaged 20.4 points and 9.2 rebounds for last season's 17-10 contingent. Other veterans include Connie Erickson, who was red-shirted last year, starter Laura Wiesen, Stacey Neal and Mary Russo. Coach Annette Lynch promises a running game from her players. Among the four new players, Stephanie Chambers, of Michigan, and Joanne Palumbo, of Maine, were high school All-Americans last year.

Karen Langeland has a decidedly young lineup at Michigan State, but one still ready to make trouble for conference contenders. "The Big Ten is going to be stronger this year," she says in attributing the reason as being the ability of conference teams to keep high school talent in the area. Six new players led by Sue Tucker and Kim Archer enter the Spartans' roster. The key veteran is senior point guard Brenda Jezowski, who averaged 10.5 points and led the team in assists.

Wisconsin and Coach Edwina Qualls will be rebuilding after the loss of the Badgers' premier player, Theresa Huff, who holds 30 school records. The squad finished 19-8 and was in contention for the Big Ten title before being overrun in the stretch drive. Only two seniors are listed on the roster: 5-8 guards Mary Chrnelech and Janet Huff. Newcomers include Inga Young from Alexandria VA, Jane Skarr, from Hales Corners, WI, and Michelle Fischer from Flint, MI.

All eyes are on the Hawkeyes where the sleeping Iowa program is about to have a new awakening from its ninth-place conference finish. First-year coach Vivian Stringer is ready to turn the school's fortunes around after arriving at Iowa City with one of the nation's outstanding career records—a 251-51 won-loss mark for a .831 winning percentage at Cheyney State. And she's already begun in a whirl. Seven freshmen have arrived on campus including 6-4 Parade All-American Lisa Becker, of Iowa, and 5-11 forward Lisa Long from Newark, N.J. Both were state prep players-of-the-year. "It's definitely a little different out here," said Stringer of her move from the Philadelphia area to the Midwest. It will definitely be different for Iowa, also.

Michigan has lost only one player—Peg Harte—but she led the Wolverines in scoring with a 20.7 average and held several school records. Still, the outlook has to be brighter for Coach Gloria Soluk with last year's freshmen now experienced sophomores. Orethia Lilly (13.3 points) returns at guard, 6-0 Wendy Bradetich (10.6 points) is at center, and 5-6 Lori Gnatkowski also is back. Height is added with 6-7 Lynn Morozko at center. Melanie Smith, a 5-7 guard, is the other recruit.

Three starters return to Purdue, but Coach Ruth Jones has only two seniors on the 1983-84 roster. Six recruits will be competing for spots vacated by the graduated Carol Emanuel and center Leslie Schultz. Jennifer Isom will be seeking more action at forward, while newcomers Cathey Tyree and Kay Sharp will also be competing for the spots. Mona Clor and Janet Freund, two 6-0 rookies, will vie for the center position. Ball control and outside shooting are expected to dominate the offense.

Administration and Supporting Services

Administration

Dr. Kit Saunders, the Director of Women's Athletics for the past nine years, has assumed a new role in the Wisconsin Athletic Administration. As the Associate Director of Non-revenue Sports, Kit oversees the policies and direction of the 22 men's and women's non-revenue sports at Wisconsin. Kit's long association with UW athletics also includes serving as the women's sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education, and the women's tennis coach prior to her appointment as Director of Women's Athletics in 1974.

She has held positions of leadership on the state, regional and national level. As one of the founders of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Kit served in numerous state offices including that of president. She has been a commissioner for the six-state Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for

Women (MAIAW), and was elected vice president for division I schools of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

Paula Bonner has assumed the role of Assistant Director in charge of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Program. Now in her sixth year of administrative association with the UW program, Paula oversees the complete operation of the 11-sport Badger women's program including budget preparation and expenditures, financial aid, specials events arrangements and recruiting.

She has served as the chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees, and heads the UW Athletic Board Women's Sports Committee.

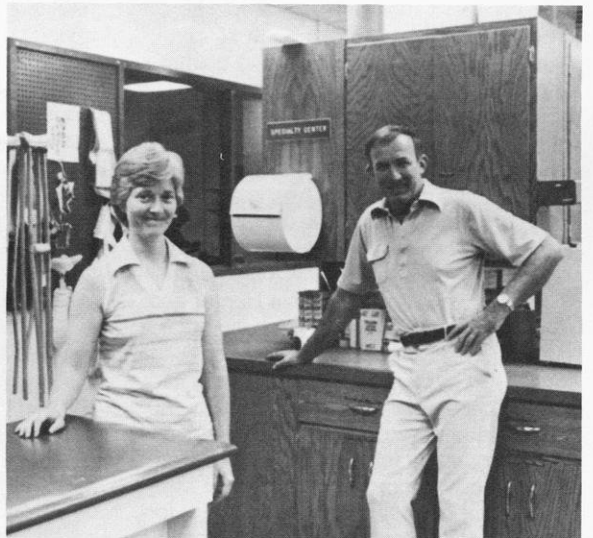

Sports Medicine

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a four-person staff of NATA certified athletic trainers. **Gordon Stoddard, Jan Tappan, Dennis Helwig** and **Jim Bosanny** are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and one certified graduate assistant as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Natatorium and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. An orthopedic surgeon assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assists in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 11-sport women's athletic program lies with **Tamara J. Flarup**, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Now in her seventh year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction, the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (WIS Club) in its promotions and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, served as a coordinator for the CoSIDA Publications Contest Committee and was a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee.

During the past summer, Tam was selected as one of 34 sports information directors to serve as a media liaison director for the 1983 National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs.

Academic Counseling

Academic excellence is a phrase which is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the men and women student athletes.

Assistant to the Director of Athletics **Diane Johnson** and Counselor **Alan Zussman** are responsible for the Wisconsin athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. 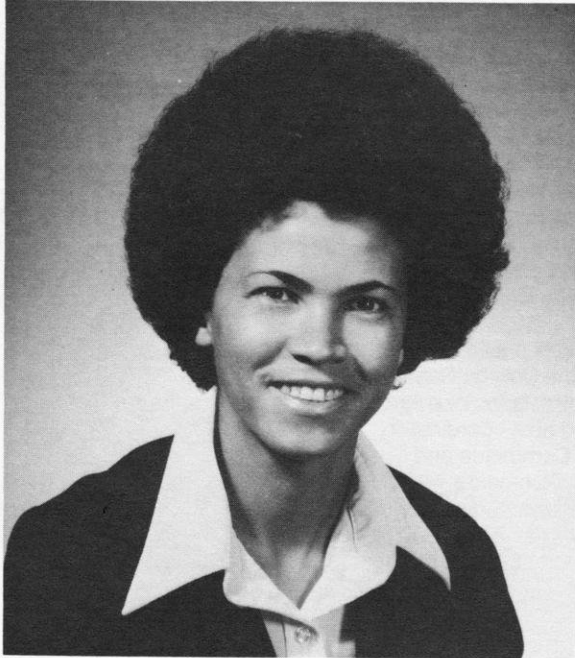

Coaching

Head Coach
Edwina Qualls



Head basketball Coach **Edwina Qualls** begins her eighth year of coaching women's basketball at Wisconsin. A native of Connecticut, Edwina coached basketball and taught physical education at R.C. Lee High School in New Haven, where she compiled an 82-15 high school coaching record over a seven-year period. Her teams consistently appeared in the Connecticut State basketball tournament claiming the Class L state title in 1975 and runners-up titles two other years.

Edwina's university coaching experience began at Southern Connecticut State College, where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physical education. She later teamed with basketball great Louise O'Neal, serving as her assistant basketball coach at Yale University prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Coach Qualls was honored by being named "Coach of the Year" in 1975 by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. She served as the Midwest basketball coach at the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs in 1979, and was a member of the AIAW Division I Basketball Committee 1979-80.

While at Wisconsin, Edwina's teams have an overall record of 98 wins, 90 losses and four winning seasons. She guided the 1981-82 squad to a quarter-final finish in the AIAW National Basketball Championship.



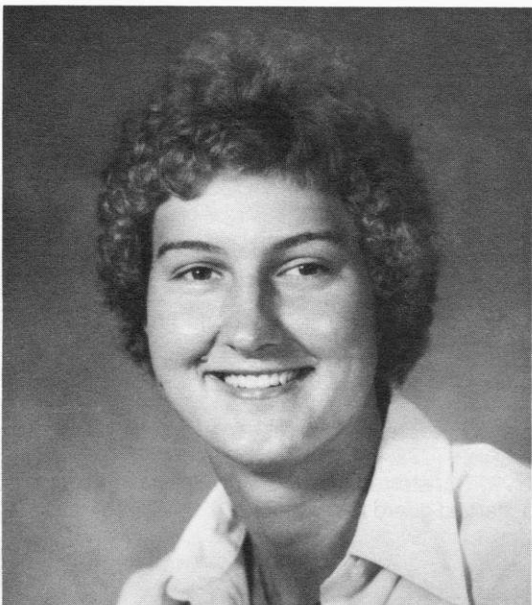
Assistant Coaches



Terry Ellis begins her first year as assistant coach for the Badgers. She comes to the UW from Grove City College (Pa) where her teams built impressive records as she doubled as head basketball coach for seven seasons and head volleyball coach for ten years. Named the conference basketball coach of the year four times, her basketball teams won five Women's Keystone Conference Championships and had an overall record of 102 wins and 25 losses. Grove City College finished among the top eight of the nation's 1983 NCAA Division III teams.

"I'm pleased that Terry Ellis will be a part of our basketball program," said head coach Edwina Qualls. "She was highly successful as a coach on the collegiate level and she has a broad base of contact which should assist us in our recruiting efforts."

The Independence, MO native will coordinate about 80 percent of Wisconsin's basketball recruiting, as well as assisting with practices and games. Ellis received a B.S. in physical education from Southwest Missouri State in 1972 and her masters from Slippery Rock State College in 1974. She was Slippery Rock's assistant coach from 1972 until 1974.



Linda "Bird" Gough, a former Wisconsin standout player, begins her third year assisting with the Wisconsin women's basketball program. The first 1000 point scorer for the Badgers, Linda played the forward spot for Wisconsin four years, graduating from the squad in 1981. She was a member of the Midwest Team attending the National Sports Festival in 1978.

Among her many career records is the enviable statistic of having played 103 consecutive games for Wisconsin in a 105 career total. Although she saw many of her records broken by scoring and rebounding ace Terri Huff last year, Linda still ranks second in scoring and third in rebounding and blocked shots. She also ranked among the top 10 in eight other career categories.

Linda will assist in scouting and recruiting again this year in addition to her practice coaching duties. She received a B.S. in recreation and resource management in 1982.

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from some of the finest sports facilities found anywhere in the country. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its women athletes.

The basketball and volleyball teams practice and compete in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse (seating capacity 12,204). The facility contains four remodeled locker rooms and a modern and convenient athletic training area.

Our tennis players have a marked advantage in their ability to play tennis year-round at Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The two-million dollar facility seats 1500 spectators and features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, and one squash doubles court. The Stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system, who captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916-1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

Wisconsin's track program is enhanced by practicing and competing during the indoor season in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center. Located next to the Stadium, the "shell" contains a 220-yard, newly resurfaced, mondo rubber track, throwing and jumping areas in the infield, and a seating capacity of 2500. Also located in the Sports Center is an ice rink used by the Wisconsin hockey team and the community.

Our teams also have access to Unit II and the Natorium, the center of activity for the Department of Physical Education and Dance. This complex includes seven gyms which are utilized by the volleyball and fencing teams. An athletic training facility is attached to the intercollegiate locker-rooms for convenience.

The swimming and diving team will have the luxury of having two pools in which to practice and compete—the Natorium adjacent to Unit II and the new Unit III facility. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with a fully automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The recently completed Unit III, featuring an indoor long course pool and movable bulkheads, more than doubles the program's training space.

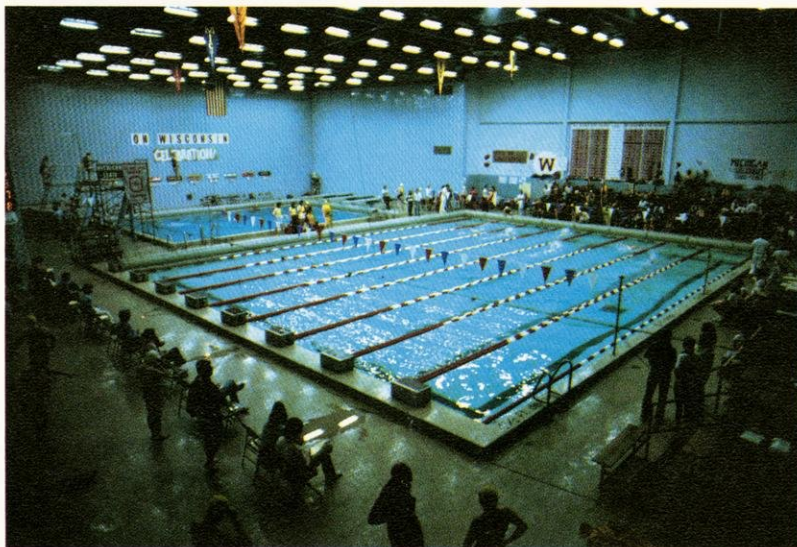
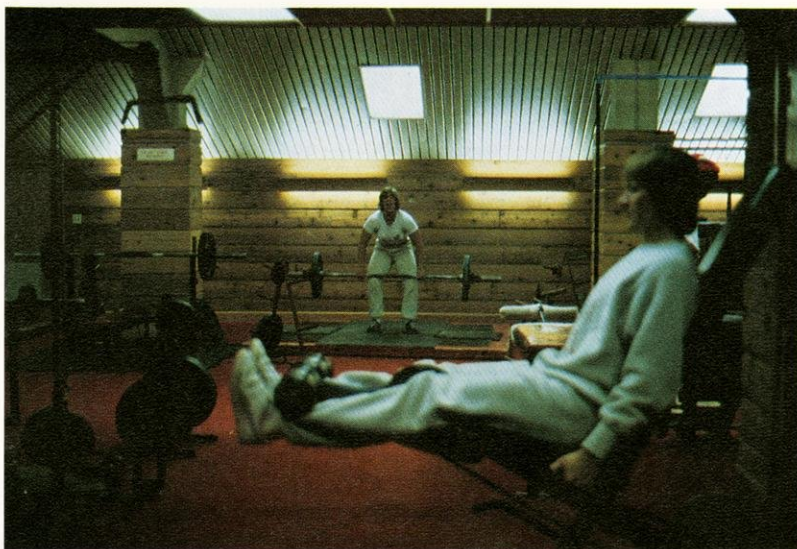
The latest addition to the list of fine facilities at UW-Madison is the newly renovated Armory where the gymnastics team will practice and compete. Better known on campus as the Red Gym, the facility provides increased training areas and spectator seating.

Outdoor facilities at Wisconsin include soccer fields adjacent to Camp Randall Stadium, and an outdoor track near Unit II on the West side of campus. The crew house, situated on Lake Mendota, provides the Badger crews with a modern facility including an indoor rowing tank for year-round practice.

Other facilities which are an integral part of the athletic program are the coeducational weight training and sports medicine rooms in the Camp Randall Stadium.

The large medical facility offers a well-equipped preventive medicine and rehabilitative area for all Wisconsin athletes. A certified staff of athletic trainers provides for the care and prevention of injuries for both the men and women athletes.

The modern weight training area features Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in a spacious, fully carpeted room in Camp Randall. A full-time weight training instructor monitors and advises all Wisconsin student-athletes.





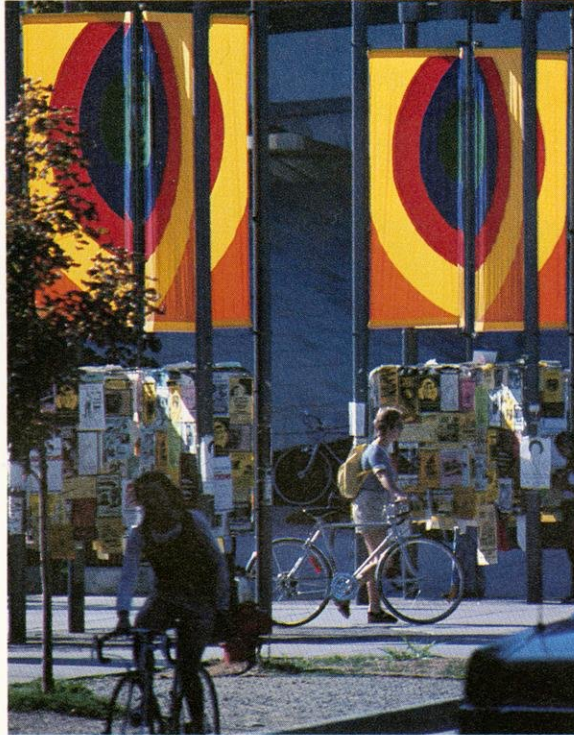
Madison: All American City

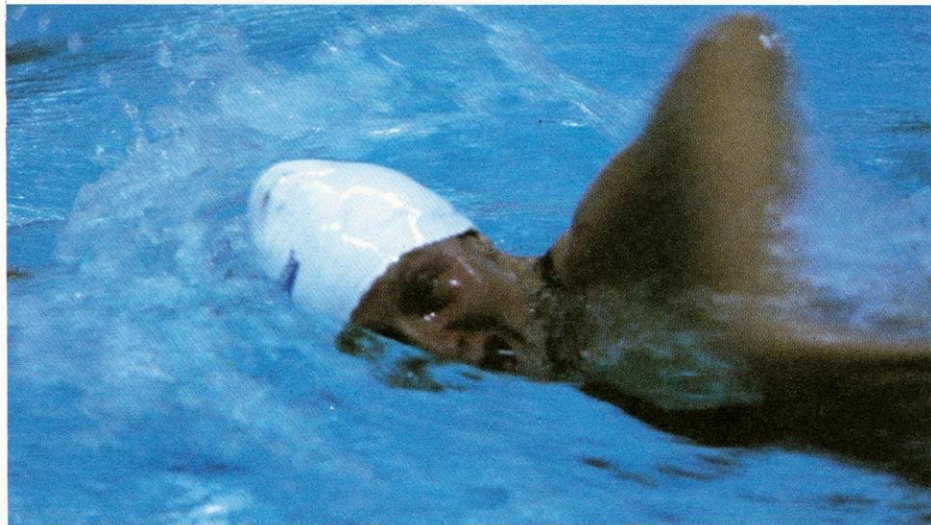
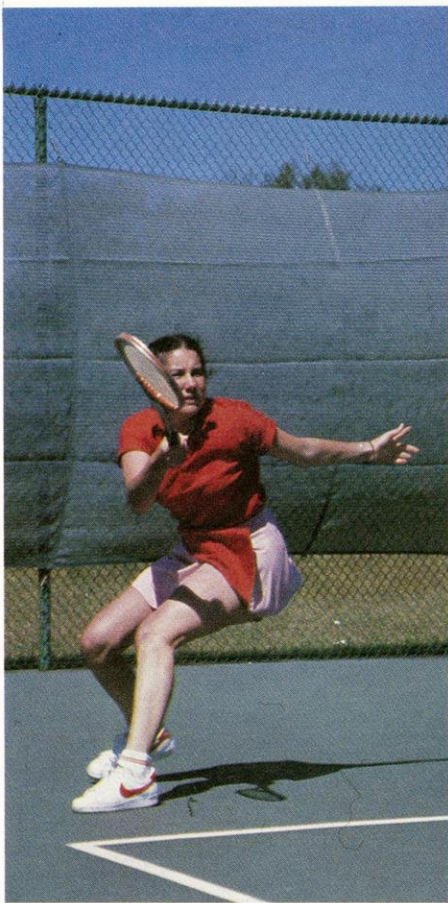
Madison is a clean, vibrant city whose chief businesses are education and government. Located just three driving hours from Chicago, one-and-one-half hours from Milwaukee, and five hours from Minneapolis, Madison is consistently rated as one of the most attractive places to live in the country. In 1978, Madison proudly accepted the designation of All-American City given by the national Municipal League.

The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.

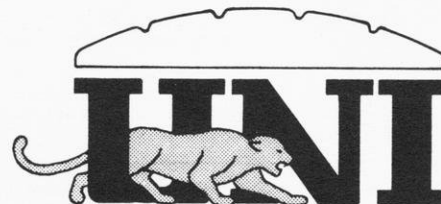

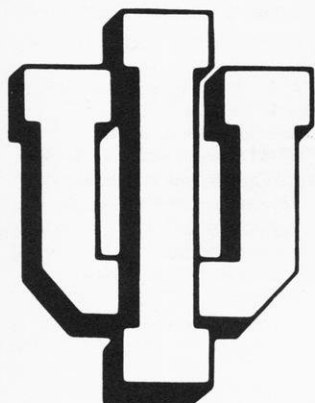

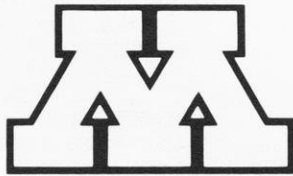
