ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS

Madison, Wisconsin

Monday, August 17, 1936

The meeting was called to order at 10:55 A.M., President Wilkie presiding

· PRESENT:

President Frank; Regents Baker, Brown, Callahan, Christopherson, Combs, Gates, Grady, Gundersen, Hones, Miller, Richards, Runge, Wilkie.

ABSENT:

Regents Backus, Mead.

The Regents immediately went into executive session.

President Frank read the following action of the Executive Committee taken at the meeting held on August 14, 1936: 1.2-

The Executive Committee approves and recommends for adoption by the Regents the budget for 1936-37 submitted by President Frank in conformity with regent action of July 23, except with respect to the appointment of an Associate Director of Agricultural Extension. Professor Warren W. Clark, Supervisor of County Agents, shall in the meantime take active charge of the work of such Associate Director, at a base salary of \$5500, less waiver \$965, net salary \$4535, on the ten months' basis.

The recommendation as to the employment of Professor Clark as Associate Director of Agricultural Extension was discussed at length Dean Christensen was present to support the recommendation. He st that he had letters from a large number of farm organizations as the appointment of Professor Clark to this position. Regent Ho stated that he was opposed to the appointment and that it would satisfactory to the Farmers Union or the Wisconsin Milk Pool.

Upon motion of Regent Christopherson, seconded by Regen

Brown, the recommendation of the Executive Committee relating to the appointment of Professor Warren W. Clark was by called vote adopted. Regents voting "Aye", Baker, Brown, Callahan, Christopherson, Combs, Gates, Hones, Miller, Richards, Runge, Wilkie (11). Regents voting "No", Grady, Gundersen (2). Regent Grady explained his vote by stating that he believed the recommendation of Dean Christensen should be recognized and adopted and Regent Gundersen stated that that was his feeling also.

The case of William C. Woerner was discussed. Upon motion of

Regent Brown, seconded by Regent Baker, it was

VOTED, That Mr. Woerner be employed in the field of engineering. (Details as to rank and salary to be determined later.) Regent Grady voted "No".

President Wilkie presented an amendment to the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on June 15, 1936, and stated that action would be postponed to the next meeting.

At 12:30 P.M. Regent Gates moved that the Regents now arise from executive session.

The report of the Executive Committee recommending the passage of the 1936-37 budget was again read.

Regent Grady made the following statement: "I object to the adoption of this budget, first, for the reason that the original budget was legally passed at the June meeting of the Board, as ruled by the Attorney General; second, that there has been no reconsideration of that action in June by any subsequent action of the Board; third, the proposed budget involves items carrying less than the minimum wage prescribed by the Bureau of Personnel for approximately 400 of the civil service employees of this University."

Regent Brown: "I would like to make a few remarks here. the first place, I am going to represent labor to the best of my ability, consistent with the other people that are in this institution. I am not going to come here as a representative of labor and insist that the people that I think and know are getting a salary that is not consistent with good living should be raised when I know that there are other people in this institution who are not receiving a wage that I consider a living wage. With this in mind I am voting for this budget because I think it is equitable in so far as the funds are available to this Board. I was never in accord with the original waiver that was put in effect here and have so expressed myself."

Regent Richards: "As a representative of labor I would like to say a few words to be recorded. As far as fighting for those that toil at such a low rate is concerned, I have had considerable experience along these lines and I am heartily in sympathy with those that are working in these lower brackets and I have stood opposed to these waivers. You will recall that I mentioned the fact that there was something wrong with an institution that had to take such measures. but I believe that the fault lies with the legislature. I think it would be unfair and unjust to restore these wages by taking it out of the students. It is up to the citizens of the state of Wisconsin to get a legislature that can see the wants and the needs of this institution and will appropriate enough to take care of it. I do not believe that we should restore these lower wages by an increase in student tuition and I believe that we can shame the legislature to the extent that they will give this institution the support that it is entitled to."

Upon motion of Regent Brown, seconded by Regent Richards, the passage of the 1936-37 budget was by called vote adopted. Regents voting "Aye", Baker, Brown, Callahan, Christopherson, Gates, Hones, Miller, Richards, Runge, Wilkie (10). Regents voting "No", Combs, Grady (2). Regent Gundersen had left the meeting.

Regent Callahan stated that his reason for voting for the adoption of the budget was to permit the work of the University to get underway.

Upon recommendation of President Frank and upon motion of Regent Gates, seconded by Regent Richards, it was
VOTED, That the schedule of reclassifications of civil service positions be approved, EXHIBIT A, as follows:

VOTED, That the promotions, appointments, reappointments, leaves of absence and resignations presented in EXHIBIT B, attached, be approved.

✓ Upon recommendation of President Frank and upon motion of Regent Baker, seconded by Regent Richards, it was VOTED, That the Bureau of Personnel be requested to increase the maximum salary of operating engineers to \$2400 per year and for firemen to \$2000 per year.

[✓] Discussion was had with reference to high school honor scholarships. In view of a letter from the Attorney General to the Board of Normal School Regents advising that the law does not permit an

indefinite number of alternates, it was understood that in high schools of 250 students or less, one alternate would be approved; in high schools of 250 to 750, two alternates would be approved; in high schools from 750 up, three alternates would be approved.

Upon motion of Regent Gates, seconded by Regent Callahan, it

VOTED. That the action taken by the Regents at the meeting held on July 23 be amended by instructing the Registrar's office to consider the best policy in the light of the Attorney General's opinion, which provides one alternate for each scholarship. Regent Grady voted "No" for the reason that he does not believe the statute contemplated such an action.

Vote was then taken on the original action as amended, which reads as follows:

That there be established Wisconsin high school scholarships in accordance with Section 36.161, Chapter 535 of the Statutes of the State of Wisconsin, Paragraph One. Each scholarship will be equivalent in value to freshman incidental fees.

These scholarships shall be distributed annually to graduates of Wisconsin public high schools and accredited private secondary schools under the following conditions:

- a. The parents or guardians of such graduates must be residents of Wisconsin.
- b. The number of scholarships from each school will be determined by the number enrolled in the following manner:
 - (1) Schools enrolling under 250. The student ranking first in scholar-ship. One alternate with an average rating of 90 or higher.
 - (2) Schools enrolling from 250 to 750. The two students ranking first and second in scholarship. Two alternates with an average rating of 90 or over.
 - (3) Schools enrolling 750 or more. The three students ranking first, second and third in scholarship. Three alternates with an average rating of 90 or over.

This is construed to mean waiver of the full \$27.50 per semester.

Regent Grady voted "No", for the same reason as previously stated.

- 4. That Lewis Smith be appointed assistant in dairy industry for the fiscal year 1936-37; salary at the rate of \$1380 a year, less waiver \$103, net \$1277; charge to item for Lewis Smith, fund 3K.

- 5. That Curtis E. Dieter be appointed assistant in economic entomology from July 1 to August 31, 1936; salary \$100 net for the period; charge to labor, fund 15A.

- 6. That J. Welton Brooks be appointed assistant in economic entomology from August 1 to September 15, 1936; salary \$154 net for the period; charge to vice Atwood, fund 15A.

- 9. That the resignation of Mrs. Helen K. Harrison, assistant in agricultural economics, be accepted; to take effect August 22, 1936.
 Adopted.
- 10. That Burton A. Baker be appointed assistant in agricultural economics from August 8 to September 14, 1936; salary \$150 net for the period; charge to labor, fund 15A.

 Adopted.
- ll. That the resignation of Sanford S. Atwood, assistant in agronomy, be accepted; to take effect July 1, 1936.
 Adopted.
- 12. That Ward Stanger be appointed assistant in economic entomology from August 1 to September 30, 1936; salary \$154 net for the period; charge to item for assistant (summer service), fund 1A.

 Adopted.
- 13. That the salary of Everett L. Byers, assistant in dairy industry, be increased from the rate of \$1200 to the rate of \$1800 a year from August 4, 1936 to June 30, 1937 (salary for the period \$1466.42 net); charge \$697 to fund 1A, and \$768.68 to fund 3K, in place of Frank H. Hanson, resigned. (In effect a promotion because of increased duties.)

 Adopted.

Upon motion of Regent Gates, seconded by Regent Richards, it was

VOTED, That the President and Business Manager be authorized to proceed with the appointment of an artist in residence and the construction of a studio when funds are available.

A communication was presented from Professor Einar Haugen of the Department of Scandinavian Languages, asking for approval to place on the campus, in memory of the late Professor Rasmus B. Anderson, a large rock from the curb in front of Professor Anderson's home, to which he had taken a fancy many years ago because of its resemblance to a viking ship. An appropriate inscription will be placed on the stone and funds for this purpose have been donated from private sources. The matter was referred to the Business Committee with power to act.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Gates, it

was

VOTED, That the minutes of the meeting of the Board held on July 23, 1936, and the minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee held on July 24, 1936, be approved.
