

Sir: In compliance with law, we have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of this department for the two years ending June 30, 1952.

SALE OF LAND .

The withholding of state school lands from public sale as a general policy has been continued. A few pieces of escheated urban real estate located in the cities of South Milwaukee and West Allis and willed property in the city of Cudahy were sold. The proceeds on the sale of such property inures to the State Common School Fund under Article X, Section 2 of the Wisconsin Constitution. Escheated and willed property accrue to the State where a person dies intestate leaving no heirs or will distributing said property.

SALE OF THE FLAMBEAU TRACT

By Chapter 359, Laws of Wisconsin for 1951 and Section
24.09 Wisconsin Statutes, the Flambeau Tract of 1775.56 acres of
school lands in Township numbers 37 and 38 North, Range 3 West,
Sawyer County was sold direct to the State Conservation Department
at the appraised price as provided by Section 24.08 Wisconsin Statutes for \$457,115.63. Conservation Fund contributed \$275,000 and
the State General Fund \$182,115.63 toward this purchase. Indemnity

State Land Patent #837 was issued to the Conservation Commission on October 9, 1951.

The following acreage of state school lands remained unsold as of June 30, 1952.

SALE OF TIMBER

During this biennium 5.570.365' of marked (saw-log) timber and 14.609 cords of pulpwood and other cord timber on state school lands were offered at public sale and sold at a total price of \$375,940.00. During this same period 1,267,133' of blown down and damaged marked standing (saw-log) timber and 11,362 cords of cord timber and 20,464 pieces of Cedar posts and poles were sold direct at a total value of \$58,296.07. These direct sales of blown down timber were only made whenever the timber sold could be removed without injuring standing green timber. Most of these sales of blow down became necessary because of the recent severe wind storms which have occurred in the North since the severe storm of October 1949. We are herewith listing below the average prices received (by weight or per sale) on the public sale of school timber since 1948. This is an extension of similar prices from 1944 to 1947 which will be found in our biennial report ending June 30, 1948.

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

There has been an increase in total loans granted from the State Trust Funds the last two years and especially to school districts. A good share of these loans have been large as the result of larger school buildings, extensive alterations to present school buildings, additional class rooms, gymnasiums, bus garages etc. because of consolidation with other school districts. For comparison a total of \$11,958,160.84 was invested in loans to all municipalities from the State Trust Funds this biennium while \$9,685,06211 was so invested in the prior biennium. To meet this demand to secure cash for loaning, we reduced on sales, our bond investment account from \$7,183,733.72 to approximately \$1,587,798.75. It was also necessary for this Commission to curtail loans to municipalities other than school districts which districts we are to give preference under the Statutes. Because of a back-log on applications being filed here on loans from the State Trust Funds it was necessary as far back as June 1951 to promise no further loans in 1951 because of the lack of funds. This has continued now to a point where all available cash for loaning through 1953 and halfway through 1954 have been allocated to the school districts as applications are filed. This is continuing at such a rapid pace that within a few months all our

available cash in 1954 will be spoken for.

REFUND OF DEDUCTIONS FROM THE SCHOOL FUNDS (UNDER PUBLIC DEPOSIT LAW (CHAP. 34 STAT.)

In compliance with an official opinion of the Attorney General dated April 11, 1945 in which it was held that deductions under Sec. 20.055 Statutes (1933) unconstitutional as it provides for use of the School Trust Funds under Article X of the Constitution for deposit insurance, the Wisconsin Investment Board (Capitol) refunded the following amounts to the respective trust funds on June 18, 1952 for such deductions made from said funds during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934.

SWAMP LANDS IN THE BAD RIVER, LAC DU FLAMBEAU AND LAC COURT OREILLES INDIAN RESERVATIONS

This case is still pending in the United States Court of Claims, Washington D. C. (Case #45162 (1)). This is a case in which the Indians of the above reservations are attempting to recover from the United States Government the value of the swamp lands situated in said reservations to which the State of Wisconsin feels it has a prior claim under the Swamp Land Act of 1850. There have been hearings on this case in Washington and Madison but no decision has been reached to-date by the United States Court of Claims.

ISLANDS IN THE MISSISSIPPI AND WISCONSIN RIVERS

There appears to have been no activity by the U. S. Government the last two years in surveying or patenting to the State any additional islands in the Mississippi River under the Swamp Act. Since the last biennium, the U. S. Government has completed the field work on the survey of approximately 40 islands and some uncovered mainland in and along the Wisconsin River in Township 8 North, Range 1, 2 and 3 East and Township 9 North, Ranges 1 and 2 East containing a total of 785.09 acres. Plats of these surveys were officially approved by the U. S. Department of Interior, Bureau of Land Management, Washington D. C. on October 12, 1951 and copies are now on file in this office. Disposition of this 785.09 acres to the State of Wisconsin under the Swamp Act upon our application dated December 19, 1951 is now pending. "One Mile" island in Sections 4 and 5, Township 8 North, Range 1 East is included in the above survey.
