Commissioner of Indian Affairs -

Sir:

I have the honor to inform you that a Treaty of Peace and Friendship was this day concluded with the Western Bands of the Shoshone nation by Governor Nye and myself, upon terms quite as favorable as those of the Treaty at Fort Bridger -

Governor Nye will transmit the Treaty to the Department.

I expect to meet the Goship Tribe at a place about 250 miles east of this on the 6<sup>th</sup> instant for the purpose of treating with them. It is in their country that the most of the depredations and fighting have occurred during the past season; but from information obtained ~~defining~~ their camps and from other sources during the past month, they are now anxious to treat for peace -
