Analgesia equivalent to 30% to 60% nitrous oxide for vaginal delivery can be provided by 0.25% to 1.0% Alyrane. For caesarean section, Alyrane should be administered at concentrations of 0.5% to elevated white blood 1.0% as a supplement to other general

anaesthetics.

Contraindications:

Seizure disorders; known sensitivity to Alyrane or anaesthetics; known or suspected genetic susceptibility to malignant hyperthermia; use of product in conjunction with isoniazid or other hydrazine-containing compounds.
