JOINT SESSION OF THE EXECUTIVE AND SUMMER SESSION COMMITTEES Madison, Wisconsin

Saturday, December 15, 1934, 10 A.M.

PRESENT: Regents Callahan, Mead, Ullsperger, Combs, Berger; President

Frank, Comptroller Peterson, Secretary McCaffrey.

ABSENT: Regent Runge.

Dean S. H. Goodnight, Director of the Summer Session, was present while summer session matters were under consideration. Upon motion of Regent Berger, seconded by Regent Mead, it was

VOTED to recommend to the Board of Regents the adoption of the 1935 summer session budget in the amount of \$108,455.85, which is computed on 15% of the waivered salary, but without guarantee that the compensation will reach the amount stated; that the leave of absence privilege be restored, with the understanding that the amount paid for substitute teaching will not exceed the amount that the absentee receives from the trust fund. (This means that the total cost to the University will not in any case exceed the amount required if no leave was granted.) Note: See Julia in the Secretary of the secretary.

Regent Ullsperger voted "No" on the change from 12% to 15%.

The committees having arrived at a recommendation to the Board, the Director of the Summer Session was authorized to proceed with his advertising.

The matter of the payment of a 10% bonus to teachers in the 1934 summer session was referred back to the Board without recommendation.

- Physical Education - Men -

l. That Marvin Steen be appointed assistant in physical education - men (basketball) for five months, beginning October 1, 1934; salary \$200 net for the period; charge to amount transferred from uncommitted cash balance for basketball coaches, fund 5-C.

l. That Loyal Durand, Jr., be appointed technical assistant in geography for three months during the summer of 1934; salary \$200 net for the period; to be charged to special grant of the National Research Council.

- 3. That the grant of \$600 from the National Research Council for field expenses, assistance and supplies, in connection with the study of the regional geography of southern Ontario, under the direction of J. Russell Whitaker, be accepted.

- l. That Robert C. Pooley, assistant professor in the teaching of English in the Wisconsin High School and assistant professor of educational methods, be granted leave of absence, without salary, for the second semester of 1934-35, pp. 64 and 67.

- 2. That Esther Vinson be appointed teacher of English (part-time) at the Wisconsin High School for the second semester of 1934-35; salary \$500 net for the semester; charge to salary of Robert C. Pooley, on leave.

l. That the appointment of Robert O. Magie, assistant in plant pathology (½ time), be continued from December 1, 1934 to January 31, 1935; salary at the rate of \$52.40 net a month (total \$104.80 net for the period); charge to saving on salary of Don Anderson, p. 81, fund 1A. Adopted.

2. That Gaylord M. Volk be reappointed assistant in soils from December 15, 1934 to January 15, 1935; salary \$114, less waiver \$14, net \$100 for the period; charge to saving on salary of R. K. Froker, p. 81, fund 1A.

- 3. That Howard R. Lathrope be reappointed county agricultural agent for Wood County, beginning January 1, 1935; salary at the rate of \$3500 per annum, 12 months basis, to be distributed as follows: University \$1700, County \$1800; charge to item for Wood County, p. 100a, funds 3A and 15A.

That the "Pay As You Learn Plan" for needy extension students, approved on August 3, 1933, be amended to provide payment of approximately one-third the total fee, plus the late registration fee, upon registration, and the other two-thirds in installments within 90 days, but in no case shall instruction be given in advance of actual fees paid.

- 2. That upon the recommendation of Dean Snell, the 2A University Extension budget be increased \$2600, credited to Milwaukee Center Additional Instruction, due to additional receipts.

- 3. That approval be granted for the rental of the Zwicker flat building on Lorch Street by the Wisconsin General Hospital from the Wisconsin University Building Corporation at a rental of \$100 a month effective January 1, 1935.

- 4. That upon the recommendation of Captain Orsinger, \$33.60 be transferred from Regents' Unassigned lA to Military Science, General Supplies lA. (To cover loss of one pair of stolen field glasses.)

- 5. That the request of Dean Goodnight for \$100 from Regents' Unassigned for extra clerical help, Summer Session, be approved.
