



Not more than a couple of generations ago, settlers were intensely occupied in the task of adjusting themselves to a friendly but demanding environment. Yet, even in those periods of intense preoccupation with the physical necessities of life, there was room for the gay and colorful calico and the carved and decorated utensils of everyday living.

To create is a basic urge of all mankind. It is felt in all periods of history and among all types of people. Here in Wisconsin there has been developing a native cultural movement whose roots are deeply embedded in Wisconsin's rich soil. We intend to encourage and promote this growth towards a strong Wisconsin rural culture, knowing it will emerge as a powerful regional unifying force. The importance and need of this force in knitting together peoples and groups in the rural community cannot be minimized.

This year's show is divided in two sections--those artists over 18 exhibiting in the first section, and those 18 and under exhibiting in the second section from June 23 to July 15. With this second section, it is a group of drawings selected from the results of the creative art program of the Wisconsin School of the Air. This is currently broadcast to 84,000 youngsters in Wisconsin's schools.

TO BE ELIGIBLE, exhibitors in the Rural Art Show must be living on farms, in rural communities or have farm backgrounds. All entries must be original works of art which have never been exhibited before in a State Show.
