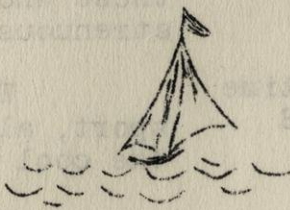

HISTORY OF WILLIAMS BAY
(Sixth Instalment)

The map which appeared on the cov-
er of Bay Leaves last week attrac-
ed considerable comment and brough
to light a few sidelights on some
of the land owners in 1857.

A large part of the present Vill-
age was given as a part of the land
shown as owned by D. Carvey. The
abstracts of most of the Village
north of Geneva St. contain his
name as having purchased the land
from Royal J. Williams in 1856
for \$3400 making a payment of \$800;
in 1858 he resold the land to the
Williams family for \$3000. In the
abstract is found a signed state-
ment by a Mrs. Hall to the effect
that she knew said D. Carvey and
that he was a single man and a
bachelor. He apparently did not
live on the place.

Politically Walworth Town was at
first a part of Delavan Township.
In 1839, it was set off together
with what is now Sharon as Walworth
and in 1843 assumed its present lim-
its, when Sharon was set off as a
separate town.

The first town meeting was held
at the schoolhouse near John Bowman'
on Big Foot Prairie on Tuesday,
April 4, 1843

The first officers were:

Supervisors: George H. Loun, Chm.
Darius B. Mason, Amos Bailey. Clerk;
James M. Clark; Treasurer, Joseph
Bailey; School Commissioners:
Christopher Douglass, Amos D. Johns,
Henry Clark.

Highway Commissioners: John Read-
er, Jabez H. Smith, Curtis H. Eaton.
Assessor, Wm. Bell; Collector,
Cyrus Church.

Constables: Lucius W. Smith,
Cyrus Church, Levi Lake

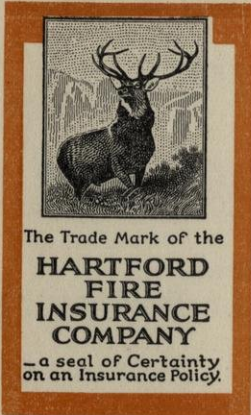

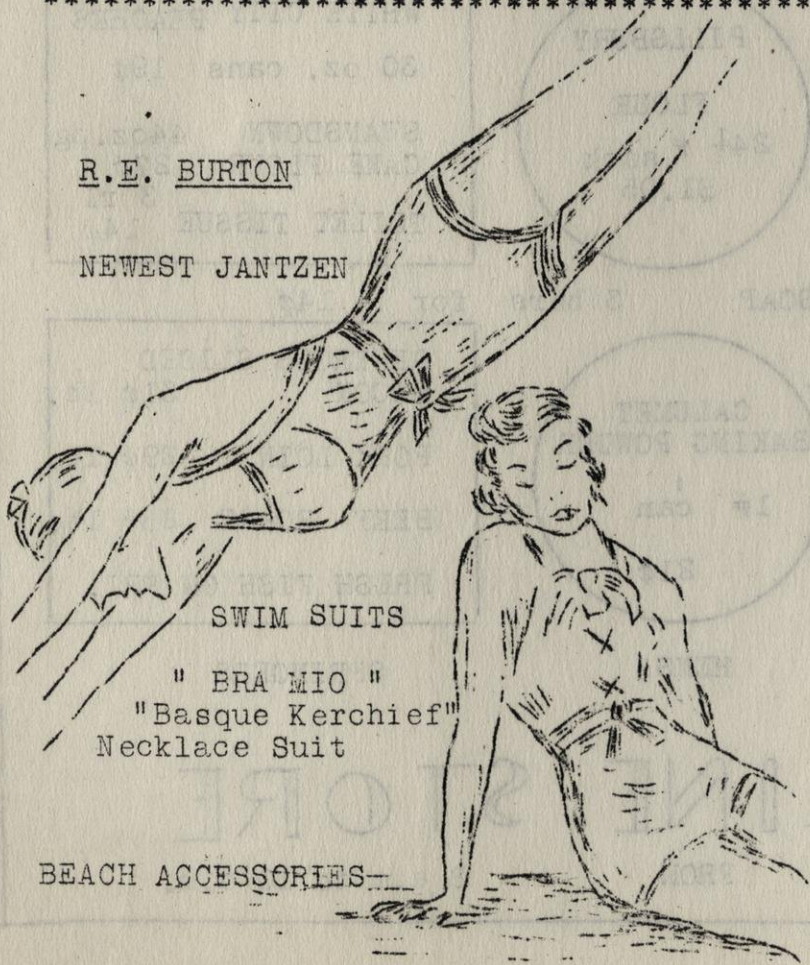
