

THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its eighteenth anniversary in the fall of 1989. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only 17 years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advanced work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Sparger was inducted into the UW-Stout "Hall of Fame" in 1980, and into the NAIA District 14 "Hall of Fame" in 1985.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He retired from the State Journal in 1987.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

Pretasky WSUC Scoring King

Running back Ted Pretasky closed out his La Crosse football career as the Wisconsin State University Conference's all-time leader in touchdowns and scoring. The 6-2, 220-pounder from Holmen scored 39 touchdowns and 234 points in WSUC competition from 1985 to '88. The old records were held by two Whitewater athletes, 31 touchdowns by Jim Knoblauch (1963-66) and 189 points by Harry Nordentoft (1957-60).

PREVIEW OF 1989 WSUC FOOTBALL SEASON

"Highly competitive" became a cliche in the Wisconsin State University Conference football long ago. No team has gone undefeated in the conference since 1981 and only three experienced perfect records in the past 22 years.

Nobody is ready to predict Whitewater will repeat as champion, certainly not Warhawk coach Bob Berezowitz, who learned through experience the vagaries of coaching in the WSUC. Whitewater must develop a quarterback and find replacements for some key defensive people, although Berezowitz holds a trump card in breakaway runner Travis Taiton.

"Again in 1989 the WSUC will be a balanced conference," Berezowitz said when asked to assess the coming season. "The team to beat will be Platteville, with many returning starters both offensively and defensively, and Stevens Point, with the great quarterback, Kirk Baumgartner. The rest of the league and the rankings will be determined on how fast teams start and how well young players develop."

Platteville received strong support from numerous coaches which raised some eyebrows, particularly after the Pioneers finished a modest 4-4 in the conference and 6-4 overall a year ago. Platteville coach George Chryst expressed cautious optimism but would rather have the onus of "favorite" fall on someone else's shoulders.

"We have a lot of experienced players coming back," Chryst conceded. "It's probably the best since I've been there, but so has everybody else in the league. People always talk about how they're one or two games away from being 8-0 or whatever. Heck, we were three plays away from being 0-8. In other words, we won some close games."

Just about every one of the nine schools features an outstanding quarterback and any of them might reach his peak, triggering a championship run. Stevens Point's Baumgartner, of course, leads the way. He has been the most productive passer in the WSUC the past two years and similar statistics in his senior season could vault the Pointers to a title.

Oshkosh features Dennis Bogacz, who rewrote Titan passing records as a freshman last season. His presence creates an aura of optimism among Titan partisans. Eau Claire's John Clark, Platteville's Brad Taylor, Stout's Tim Peterson and Superior's David Detrick evoke similar excitement on their respective campuses.

River Falls' Jeff Saueressig is another outstanding quarterback but his forte is running the football out of the "wishbone" and operating as a heady field general. He averaged 112 yards a game rushing last fall and 4.6 yards per carry.

La Crosse and Whitewater must find new quarterbacks but once they do, both possess supporting casts to compete with the frontrunners. The Eagles (nee Indians) start with a strong defense that coach Roger Harring hopes can keep his team in contention until the offense jells. La Crosse, runnerup to the Warhawks last year, advanced to the finals of the NAIA Division II playoffs before losing to Westminster (Pa.), 21-14, in the championship finals. Whitewater lost in the finals of the NCAA Division III West Regional.

The season opens with one new coach, John O'Grady, who replaced Mike Farley at River Falls when the veteran mentor decided to retire after 19 years at the helm of the Falcons. O'Grady, a former River Falls player and assistant coach, plans few changes on offense or defense but faces a tough task in duplicating Farley's eight championships.

Eau Claire coach Jim Lind, an astute football observer, makes a valid observation on how to approach the WSUC campaign.

"Whitewater and La Crosse are always strong," he said. "River Falls had a changeover but I think it was a fairly smooth transition. Stevens Point is strong. They (Pointers) have an all-American quarterback returning and had a strong recruiting year. It's going to be a dogfight. You don't talk about a conference championship. You talk about positioning yourself for a chance at the end of the season."

More often than not the WSUC title is decided in the last week of each season. There's little indication to expect anything different this year.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

Defense was Eau Claire's downfall in 1988 when the Blugolds finished 3-5 in the conference and 5-5 overall. The 43-39 loss at River Falls exemplified the problem, where coach Jim Lind must concentrate his effort at the outset this fall. He's confident, though, that his young team gained experience and is ready to emerge as a contender.

"We're primarily a junior team," he explained. "But, these juniors have a couple years of experience. So, we look at ourselves as an experienced football team."

Jeff Hebert and Chris Bowman lead returnees in the secondary. Hebert led the team in interceptions (five) and fumble recoveries (four) in '88 and he broke up seven passes. Linebacker and defensive end are two of the stronger areas with Corey Willert and Craig Barrett anchoring the linebacking. Mike Lukas, Todd Glaser and redshirt Brad Jones are leading end candidates. Key down linemen are Tim Golden, Chad Christianson, Jim Kelley and Kevin Prodzinski plus Jeff Kielb, a transfer who sat out last season.

Offensively, the Blugolds proved they could score points a year ago. John Clark, the WSUC's number four ranked passer in efficiency, heads this group. Dave Huffcutt, a former starter who sat out last fall with a knee injury, suffered another setback in the spring when he broke an ankle. Steve Rohrscheib, Clark's backup last season, is expected to press for the starting job this fall.

The offensive line returns almost intact and skilled players such as wide receivers Pete Balistrieri and Bill Johnson, along with running backs Cary Osborn and Cris Herzog give the attack an explosive potential. Clark passed for 2,242 yards and 17 touchdowns last year, Osborn rushed for 700 yards and Herzog led the team with 51 pass receptions.

Still Lind insists the offense shares the blame for some of the woes last season. "If we can hang onto the ball a little more, that's going to improve the defense also," he said. "That was a factor. We didn't sustain any drives last year against Whitewater and Stevens Point. It's a team thing. If you can get another first down here or there you're going to take some time off the clock and give some people a rest."

Junior college transfer Robbie Buck joins an offensive line that already has some depth and Lind emphasized, "I think we're going to be much stronger in the offensive line. You're going to see a big improvement."

The Blugolds yielded 20 or more points in nine of their 10 games last season. That has to change for them to compete with the contenders this fall.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

Roger Harring jokes about being the only football coach with a 25-4 record last year (14-1 in Italy during the summer and 11-3 with his Eagles). It's not all that funny because of the strain, especially after losing the NAIA Division II championship game to unbeaten Westminster College, 21-14. There are some benefits to playing such a long season, according to the veteran coach, but also many drawbacks.

The Eagles (nee Indians), who shared second (6-2) with River Falls last year, expect to challenge again this season but it could be a struggle. They start without the WSUC's all-time touchdown king, Ted Pretasky, for the first time in four years. What does that mean to Harring? "You lose your instant offense," the coach replied. "Your offense is effective because of what he does."

Pretasky, who scored 39 touchdowns and 234 points (both WSUC records) in his career, helped the Eagles to post season tournaments in three of his four years. He used his speed to hit the holes quickly and strength to break tackles. Harring also lost the bulk of his offensive line as well as quarterbacks Joe Rihn and Steve Althaus. Rihn's teammates voted him most valuable player in '88.

Harold Owens, a 6-foot, 210-pound senior, inherits Pretasky's running back position. He led the nation in kickoff returns last season and averaged 32.9 yards at his specialty in the conference. He doesn't possess Pretasky's speed (4.7 seconds in the 40 to Ted's 4.55) but is a good inside, short-yardage runner. Owens' breakaway credentials included a 95-yard kickoff return against Platteville.

Dennis Goettl, who saw limited action as a freshman last fall, gets the early nod at quarterback. "He will have to be thrown into the breach," Harring said. "He threw three or four touchdown passes so he's had some varsity experience. Of course, the extra practice of the playoffs really helped a kid like that. He got four more game preparations than the average freshman."

The defense, including all-conference cornerback Casey Campbell, along with end Andy Pretasky and linebacker Fritz Leinfelder, are a plus for the Eagles. "Our defense should be very solid," Harring agreed.

1988 Results (5-4-1)PROSPECTS FOR 1989

Look for the Titans to come out throwing again with record-setting sophomore quarterback Dennis Bogacz ready to pick up where he left off in 1988. Not only did Bogacz rewrite Oshkosh's passing records, but he set several NCAA Division III marks for a freshman, including most total offense per game (260 yards), most yards passing per game (268.8), most passes attempted in a season (309) and most yards passing in a game (405).

Coach Ron Cardo's new wide-open attack enabled the Titans to split eight conference games and compile a 5-4-1 season record. The primary goal this year is a third straight winning season but Cardo is always hoping something even more exciting develops.

Complementing Bogacz are talented receivers Brian Rill, Rob Neta and Pete Greeninger. Rill, who also does the punting and started last season as Oshkosh's backup quarterback, led the Titans in receiving with 34 catches for 466 yards and three touchdowns. Neta caught 32 passes for 707 yards and Greeninger 31 for 502 yards.

Mark Matezk, who received another year of eligibility after injuring his foot in the first game last fall, gives the Titans some running punch. He needs 712 yards to become Oshkosh's all-time leading rusher. Other running backs vying for starting assignments are Alan Christian, Chris Kujawa and Arin Postel. They will be operating behind such veteran offensive linemen as Lawrence Wayne, Brian Vander Velde, Chad Jansen, Adam Benzaquen, Joe Hennes, Todd Kultgen, Paul Rheinschmidt and Gary Villnow.

Linebacker John Moe and tackle Mike House anchor a formidable defense that should keep the Titans in every game. Other key veterans are linebackers Lonnie Heller and Darryl Johnson and nose guard Brian Prochniak. The secondary, though, poses problems with four-year starters Todd Schoelzel and David Quenn gone. Expected to battle for starting positions are Paul Donart, Kevin Loken, Anthony Pope, Nelson Thurman and Joe Wagner.

Cardo expects his team to be more comfortable with the offense this year, explaining, "Last year was a real transition for the offensive line. Instead of coming out and attacking people, we're doing more retreat blocking. It was a real adjustment. I'm hoping we'll be much better. We're going to throw the football. I think we have some good receivers and we have a little bit of speed. And, with Bogacz at quarterback I think we can be very competitive."

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

More than one WSUC coach is pointing to Platteville as a solid contender and possibly the team to beat in 1989. Even Pioneers coach George Chryst contemplates the season with more optimism than usual. The veteran coach pondered the list of returnees and said, "I think we can be competitive out of the blocks. We have a lot of experienced players coming back. It's probably the best since I've been here."

Among the reasons for optimism are quarterback Brad Taylor, running back Dave Shumway, fullback Randy Hughes, linebackers Dave Runde, Dave Rindfleisch and Rick Verhaalen and defensive backs Dave Lombardo and Nick Feira. Nine of last year's offensive starters return, including 280-pound tackle Chad Hempel and split end Chris Miller.

"For once we have some relatively good speed," Chryst said. "Shumway is an excellent running back and I think Hughes had 100 yards in three of our last four games. Todd Peters returns and he has excellent speed, so we have somebody to complement Shumway and for the first time we're a little faster than we've been in the past."

Taylor gives the Pioneers some moxy at quarterback and the coach said, "He's a frail kid but he's an excellent competitor and finds a way to get things done."

The backs complement each other. Shumway ranks with the most versatile offensive players in the WSUC, finishing third in scoring, fifth in rushing and eighth in pass receiving. All the backs are capable of coming through in big games.

"And, I'm really happy on the defensive side of the ball. Jim Kinder (defensive coordinator) has done an excellent job of developing them. Our linebacking corps with Runde, Rindfleisch and Verhaalen give us the nucleus we haven't had there. Those are three solid players who give us more depth than we ever had before."

"We feel real confident that we have some experience with talent and physical skills. We're still not very big. We still don't have the dominating defensive linemen, but we have good solid players. For example, in the secondary Lombardo and Feira aren't very big but they are good, solid, dependable players. They have good enough speed and are sure tacklers and tough. So, we have the right mix."

The Pioneers won their last game a year ago at Stevens Point, 26-23. That bodes well for '89. A team that can win on the road usually contends for the title.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

John O'Grady replaces veteran Mike Farley as coach of the Falcons and has a tough act to follow. But, the Chicago native brings a rich football background to the job. He played linebacker on Farley's first WSUC championship team in 1975 and later also coached under Mike, Dave McClain and Jim Hilles at UW-Madison, Dick Scesniak at Kent State and Tim Rose at Miami of Ohio.

Things won't look much different this season, though, because O'Grady will keep the "wishbone" offense. He assigned veteran Ted Thompson as his offensive coordinator and put Mick Miyamoto in charge of the defense. Farley eschewed the forward pass and O'Grady quipped, "We'll probably throw more than seven (passes) a season but I can't promise we'll throw more than seven a game."

The Falcons return 45 lettermen, including five offensive starters and eight defensive regulars. Among key returnees are quarterback Jeff Saueressig, fullback Chris Krueger and guard Jim Schulenburg from the offense, tackle Arlin Frank and cornerback Roy Gruel from the defense along with placekicker Andy Feil.

"One of the advantages of me going into this situation right now is that I believe in the wishbone," O'Grady said. "I believe in running the football and really like the defense they installed a year ago, which they had gotten from Michigan State. Things aren't going to change all that much, which I think is good for the kids."

"Saueressig is the quarterback. It's going to be tough for any kid to come in and beat him out. He has a 3.6 (grade point average) in physics and is a good football player, especially in our offense."

"The defense is in very good shape with 10 starters returning," he continued. "Behind them are nine who lettered. They were young guys a year ago and will be much improved."

"Offensively we're in a little different situation. The entire starting backfield is returning. Up front is where we're the weakest. Schulenburg returns at one guard position but other than that we're very weak. We've got a job to do up front with a lot of young guys."

O'Grady conceded the change of coaches also could be a problem. "This could be a tough situation, especially for the upperclassmen who are used to coach Farley," he said. Farley produced eight WSUC championships in the past 14 years, including four straight prior to last season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

John Miech's first year as head coach produced a 7-4 record and a fourth-place finish (5-3) in the WSUC. "My prediction came true that we'd go as far as our offensive line would take us; how early they were going to mature," Miech reflected. "We had those early losses because of five inexperienced kids in there and after they gained experience we were very competitive."

Among key losses from 1988 were split end Theo Blanco, defensive tackle Kevin Deates and free safety Dan Hilliker. But, seven offensive and eight defensive starters return, including all-everything quarterback Kirk Baumgartner. Complementing the senior passing whiz are running back Jim Mares, tight end Dan Moehling and the improved offensive line.

"When you have a quarterback like Baumgartner, he covers up for a lot of inexperience in the rest of the team," Miech said. "He's one of a kind. Everybody talks about his athletic ability but one of his strong points is he's a great leader. We have a group of young men in our football program who will go where he wants to go. They believe so much in him and that's one of the attributes you look for."

The defense needs to be strengthened. Linebacker Bob Bostad, the Pointers most valuable player on that side of the ball last fall, anchors this group. Hopes for the defense center around the improvement of such youngsters as linebackers Sha... Becker and Brian Filtz along with Rob Adler, John Gajewski and Mike Leinstock in the interior line.

Kevin Bostad, who broke an ankle in two-a-days a year ago, figures to do the punting. He's also a tight end playing behind Moehling but might move rather than languish on the sidelines. Miech wants his best athletes on the field.

Baumgartner, of course, remains the key offensively. Miech conceded, "Any time you have a quarterback like Baumgartner people are going to say you should be a contender and we hope we are. It's great to have an all-American quarterback but if you don't have anybody to protect him...." He didn't have to finish.

"We saw that in the Whitewater game (which Point lost, 20-14). We started two freshmen tackles and couldn't protect him."

Miech goes into this season with more confidence because he explained, "They say games are won in the trenches and now we have some people with experience there."

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

The Blue Devils are coming off a disappointing 1988 season when injuries ruined hopes for any kind of success. All-conference linebacker Mike Tweet, quarterback Tim Peterson and wide receiver Mark Rothwell were just some of the key performers sidelined with injuries at one time or another. As coach Rich Lawrence explained, "A 24-point differential gave us a 2-8 record rather than 7-3 and much of that was due to injuries."

Optimism prevails heading into the '89 season, however. Peterson, Stout's all-time passing and total offense leader, returns with six other offensive starters, including the school's career pass receiving leader Scott Fredrickson. Lawrence must find replacements for key offensive linemen Chris Berg and Steve Horne, who graduated.

Defensively eight starters return and Lawrence will reinstitute the "50" defense with which his Panhandle (Okla.) State team led the nation several years ago. He didn't think there was talent enough at Stout before but the head coach plans to take charge of the secondary himself now and implement a four-deep scheme he employed with success in the past. Mike Wilson, a transfer from Concordia (Ill.), figures to help in the secondary.

Stout's current seniors formed the nucleus of Lawrence's first recruiting class at Menomonie and he will have almost 50 upperclassmen (juniors and seniors) this fall. "We think we made some progress," the coach said. "People will see our kids have grown up. We're finally going to look like a defensive football team. We have a couple transfers who will help make us a little better and also our younger kids are stronger and more physical."

Assistant coach Mike Wyatt, who coached quarterbacks the past couple years, will coordinate the offense and tutor linemen this season with Bob Thomas handling quarterbacks and receivers. The Blue Devils will continue to operate out of a multiple/pro style attack that features plenty of passing. The basic formation is the pro-I.

Lawrence said when Wyatt was line coach and offensive coordinator, the tendency was to run more than when he was in charge of skilled positions. They aim now for more diversity. "I really believe we'll throw but I think we have some running backs we need to utilize a little more," he concluded.

Superior has not fielded a winning football team since 1971 but second-year coach Bill Connor is working tirelessly to end that drought. He understands the odds. The winters are harsh and the city somewhat isolated.

Connor concedes, "Superior has a reputation of being 'way up there.' Sometimes we have better success recruiting a kid from far away. The population thing is a battle and I also think the history is against us.

"But, I'm not saying it can't be done but it isn't as easy as some situations. Returning fellows we brought in a year ago are awful young. We're trying to build on that. We think we've made some progress. We have a pretty good nucleus of talent returning."

Connor will try to make the pendulum swing the other way this fall. He starts with seasoned quarterback David Detrick and Dan Keiner, the WSUC dash champion who ranks with the best wide receivers in the conference. Jim Will, also an excellent punter, and Larry Thomas augment the receiving corps. Bob DeMeyer, who shared time at quarterback last year, and new recruit Michael Carr, are pressing Detrick.

"We're in good shape at quarterback," Connor emphasized. "That's going to be interesting. We'll have to make a decision early and move one to a different spot because they're all good athletes. All are among the top 22 football players at Superior."

The running back position is well fortified with Keith Turner, Dan Walsh, Earl Justice and Andre Gatewood. "They all have goal-line-to-goal-line ability," Connor said. "They need to get a little more mature. They're not (Travis) Talton or (Ted) Prestasky yet but they have the potential to be."

"Our biggest problem is always in the line. We return a fair nucleus in the line but we're still going to be short there. We were awful thin a year ago."

Defense should be better than last fall when the Yellowjackets lost all 10 games. Larry Pursel, a 27-year-old sophomore, heads the linebacking corps. "He's a great kid," Connor praised. "He has the potential to go as far as he wants to." The coach also expressed high hopes for Mark Sickler, a Superior all-stater who will play defensive end. Vic Oates, Jemal Broussard and Darwin Myles provide stability in the secondary.

"A year ago when I came in, we couldn't put a full football team on the field," Connor reflected. "Right now we could. I don't know how we'd be, but we'd have a competitive football team."

PROSPECTS FOR 1989

Bob Berezowitz starts his fifth year as Warhawk head coach with two straight WSUC championships under his belt. Spearheading defense of the '88 title will be running back Travis Talton, offensive guard Rory Redemann and defensive lineman Jim Sherman, each an all-conference performer. Eight offensive starters return, so most of the early work must center around the defense, where only five regulars are back.

Talton led the WSUC in rushing last fall, averaging 157 yards a game and 7.4 yards per carry. Quarterback Jeff Olsen graduated, so Joe Parish and letterman Scott Whitmore will vie for the starting job. Parish, an all-stater while in high school at Watertown, transferred from Stevens Point. "He's a good athlete, throws real well and has a good mind," Berezowitz said of Parish. "The offense won't change much with either one at quarterback."

Running back Tim LeMonds will alternate with Talton. "We rotate backs quite a bit; every couple series," the coach explained. Although running backs are the strength of the offense, Berezowitz believes he has a budding star in junior wide receiver Tim Gounaud, who could develop into a key offensive weapon.

Developing a quarterback and replacing key defensive people are priority items early. "I'm a firm believer you win with defense and we have to get that right away," the coach continued. "We think we have some people who will fight for positions. We're on a roll right now (with two straight crowns). It's just a matter of us replacing our seniors and trying to be competitive."

The Warhawks won the conference with a 7-1 record last season and wound up 9-3 overall. They won their opening NCAA Division III West Region playoff game over Simpson (Ia.) but lost in the Region final to Central of Iowa, 16-13.

"It was a great experience," Berezowitz said of the playoffs., "but it's tough on young men because sometimes they lose perspective of what they're after. Our philosophy is to go out and try to win the WSUC. That's the most important thing for us. Everything else is frosting on the cake. Sometimes after you win the conference kids lose perspective of what they've accomplished. You can end up on a negative note. It was a great year for Whitewater. That's why we want to keep that going."

PREVIEW OF THE 1988-90 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

It's difficult to imagine Wisconsin State University Conference basketball approaching the level of 1988-89 but history has taught skeptics not to underestimate what many consider the toughest non-scholarship league in the nation.

Last season co-champions Whitewater and Eau Claire added to the stature of the conference. The Warhawks won the NCAA Division III national championship, while the Blugolds reached the semifinals of the NAIA tournament in Kansas city before losing by two points.

Coach Dave Vander Meulen, who built Whitewater into a national power during his 11 years at the helm of the Warhawks, starts the season with an impressive list of veterans, including all-conference forward Elbert Gordon and play-making guard Ricky Spicer. He must replace the likes of Jeff Seifriz and Pat Miller, but his program contains quality players waiting in the wings.

Eau Claire's Ken Anderson is another coach with impressive credentials, having guided his Blugolds to the prestigious Kansas City tournament 12 times in his 21 years as their mentor. The Blugolds compiled a 29-4 record last season, the second best mark in Eau Claire history, and added to Anderson's impressive list of championships.

Although all-conference performers Mark Miller and Eric Davis are gone, Anderson greets a veteran team and the Blugolds figure to contend for the title again. Leading the way is senior point guard Tim Blair, who was elected most valuable player by his teammates at the end of last season.

Platteville wasn't expected to approach the quality of play that produced a championship in 1988, but coach Bo Ryan's Pioneers fooled the so-called experts. They contended almost to the end, finishing only a game behind the co-champions and compiling a 24-5 season record. Most of that talented crew returns, including Robby Jeter and Sean Poole, plus five others with a wealth of game experience.

Mentioned prominently with the top contenders in preseason speculation is Oshkosh with veteran forwards Ric Kunnert and Mark Ziebell providing coach Jim McGrath with what many consider the most potent one-two punch in the conference. Ziebell won the WSUC scoring championship last season with a 23.1 average and Kunnert ranked third at an even 21. The latter also led the conference in rebounds with 9.3 a game.

La Crosse, River Falls, Stevens Point, Stout and Superior will be vying for a first division finish. Whether any of them can compete consistently with Whitewater, Eau Claire, Platteville and Oshkosh will be determined by recruiting success and how much returning veterans have improved since last season.

The Eagles (nee Indians) of Burt McDonald must replace Corey Block and Willie Arnold. McDonald will build around veterans John Fullerton and Jim Rosemeyer, but he must find a competent point guard and another forward who can score with consistency.

Coach Rick Bowen faces similar problems at River Falls, where lack of strong rebounding has hampered the Falcons in recent years. They averaged only 27.3 rebounds a game last season, last in the conference, and that deficiency must be addressed at the outset. It will help to have 6-7 John Kinney back after sitting out last season with an injury. The Falcons should be strong in the backcourt with Rick Montreal and all-conference guard Dean Cook.

Stevens Point could be a sleeper. Coach Bob Parker has quietly rebuilt the Pointers almost from scratch. They managed a sixth-place finish (6-10) last season and were 13-14 overall. Nine lettermen return, including guards Scott Anderson and Chas Pronschinske and forward Jon Julius. Others gained valuable game experience that should prove profitable this season.

Superior and Stout finished eighth and ninth last season and naturally face a long haul. Recruiting success, or lack of same, over the spring and summer will play a major role in the aspirations of the Yellowjackets and Blue Devils this winter.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

The Blugolds enjoyed another banner season in 1988-89 under coach Ken Anderson, sharing the WSUC championship with Whitewater and reaching the NAIA final four in Kansas City before bowing to East Central Oklahoma, 58-56. They begin this season with a 22-game home court winning streak and their first victory will give Anderson his 500th career win at Eau Claire.

Anderson rotated 10 players most of last season and often would replace all five starters with one move. Gone from that group are all-conference performers Mark Miller and Eric Davis, along with Craig Campbell and Chris Paulson. Miller led the Blugolds in scoring with a 17.4 average in the conference, while Davis contributed 10.6 points and 7.8 rebounds a game.

Senior point guard Tim Blair, last season's most valuable Blugold player, leads returnees. "Tim is an excellent general," Anderson praised. "He makes good decisions and gets the ball to the proper people. He is the most complete player on the team and in the conference."

Also returning are 6-4 Mike Prasher, 6-3 Matt Benedict, 6-7 Mike Johnson, 6-7 Duane Bushman, 6-6 Todd Oehrlein, 6-7 Eric Gardow and 6-5 Thane Anderson.

The Blugolds compiled a 29-4 record last season, the second best mark in Eau Claire's history, and added to Anderson's impressive list of championships. They are considered a leading contender again.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

Following a fourth-place finish last season, the Eagles (nee Indians) would hope to climb in the WSUC standings, but the improvement won't come easy. Gone are guard Corey Block and forward Willie Arnold, two mainstays from the 1988-89 team. Arnold averaged 13.9 points and 6.9 rebounds a game, while Block contributed more than 12 points a game and sank 45 three-point shots in conference competition.

Two experienced players in the front line, 6-8 center John Fullerton and 6-5 forward Jim Rosemeyer, provide the nucleus around whom coach Burt McDonald hopes to build a contender. Rosemeyer led the Eagles last season, averaging 14.3 points a game, while also bagging 6.4 rebounds. Fullerton averaged 12.3 point and 4.9 caroms.

Experience in the backcourt and more overall offensive firepower are items of concern for McDonald. He will have son Tyler McDonald for the full season at guard, while Mitch Hauser and Damon Lee, both junior lettermen, figure to fight for one of the starting guard spots at the outset. Steve Givens, a 6-4 senior, 6-6 Dan Messman and 6-6 Bruce Ritter are vying for the staring spot opposite Rosemeyer. Greg Fohey, a 6-6 senior, backs up Fullerton.

La Crosse has enjoyed exceptional athletic success over the years but hasn't figured in a WSUC basketball championship in a quarter of a century. McDonald and his troops hope the new nickname will help them fly to heights they haven't attained in many a season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

Forwards Ric Kunnert and Mark Ziebell give the Titans the most potent one-two punch in the WSUC and have Oshkosh partisans thinking this club can make the most serious title run since the 1978 championship season. Ziebell led the conference in scoring last season with 23.1 points a game. Kunnert finished third at 21.0, while also pacing all rebounders with a 9.3 average. Both earned all-conference recognition.

Nine returning lettermen hope to reverse last season's 11-17 record. Coach Jim McGrath's charges upset co-champion Whitewater, 102-91, in the regular season finale last February and finished fourth in the WSUC with a 7-9 mark. They also upset Parkside in the NAIA District 14 playoffs before bowing to Eau Claire. The success against Whitewater triggered current optimism.

McGrath is set in the backcourt with sophomores Kurt Woelffer and Steve Derouin returning with solid game experience. Woelffer started 24 games last season and averaged 9.9 points, sinking 51 of 107 three-point attempts. Derouin averaged only 4.9 points but his strong defense earned him a starting job by the end of the season.

Returning to the center position after missing most of last season due to injuries are juniors Brad Skogman and Tom Vogt. Quality play from these two would complement Ziebell and Kunnert, who already have scored 1,365 and 1,302 points, respectively, at Oshkosh. Ziebell scored 30 or more points in five games last season, including a career-high 34 in the upset of Whitewater.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

The Pioneers won accolades as last season's "surprise" team of the conference hands down. Graduation losses following the 1988 championship left coach Bo Ryan in a rebuilding posture. The youthful Pioneers didn't read those predictions, or at least refused to believe them. They finished third in the WSUC at 13-3 and wound up 24-5 overall.

Now the "experts" consider the Pioneers among the 1989-90 favorites, although DeAndrae Woods, the catalyst of last season's success, is gone, along with Pat Nigl, a key player off the bench. And, bench strength played an important role in Platteville's success. Under Ryan's system nine players averaged 10 minutes per game last season. So, seven of those nine return with a wealth of experience.

Top returnees are Robby Jeter, who led the Pioneers with 14.1 points a game in the conference, and Sean Poole, who contributed 10.8. Others who shared in most of the action last season and should again are Delano Brazil, Andy Banasik, Shaun Frison, Brian Gilmore and Bill Freidig.

This is not a rebuilding year. Ryan must find a replacement for Woods, who averaged 32 minutes a game in the conference, more than any other Pioneer, but the rest of the cast is set. The coach again will rotate nine or 10 players, depending on the situation. The Pioneers expect to challenge for the title, although this season they won't be able to sneak up on anybody. The rest of the league has been forewarned.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

Coach Rick Bowen continues his rebuilding project at River Falls, which hasn't won a WSUC basketball championship since 1950. It's been a struggle, particularly playing in arguably the strongest non-scholarship conference in the country. He expects 1989-90 will be one of the best seasons yet in the WSUC and wants his Falcons to compete with anyone.

The Falcons lose only guard Adrian Bowdry from the starting lineup, so Bowen can count on some experience at the outset. Leading returnees are 6-2 guard Dean Cook, the only sophomore picked on last season's all-conference team, and Rick Montreal, who also provides stability in the backcourt. Cook finished second in conference scoring last season with a 21.8 average, while Montreal was ninth at 16.3.

Another big plus is 6-7, 220-pound center John Kinney, who sat out last season after breaking a foot bone during preseason. He should provide considerable help after averaging 11.9 points and 6.1 rebounds a game as a junior in 1987-88.

River Falls finished a disappointing seventh (5-11) in the conference without Kinney last season and was 12-14 overall. Although the Falcons aren't mentioned in the same breath with Eau Claire, Whitewater, Platteville and Oshkosh, the added maturity and experience picked up by Cook and Montreal could change their image. Bowen might make this club a contender if he can find a couple more quality players, especially a big banger for the middle.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

When third-year coach Bob Parker took charge of the Pointers in 1987, the player pool wasn't exactly depleted but it had slipped to a dangerous level. Parker had to build almost from scratch with an aggressive recruiting program. He emphasized youth and didn't look for any quick-fix formula. Now he finally has some experience with which to work.

Michael Lehrmann is the only starter missing. Returning regulars include 6-2 Scott Anderson, 6-4 Jon Julius, 6-2 Chas Pronschinske and 6-4 Mike Harrison. Anderson led the Pointers with a 12.7 scoring average in the conference and Julius was the top rebounder, grabbing 5.1 caroms a game. These statistics didn't put them among the upper echelon of the WSUC, but these two should move up the ladder with normal progression this season.

The Pointers still managed to finish sixth with a 6-10 record last season and were 13-14 overall. They won four of their last five regular-season games, including an impressive 92-71 decision over high-powered Oshkosh. Their late spurt earned them a berth in the NAIA District 14 playoffs where they lost by only three points to Platteville, the conference's third-place team.

Parker looks for help from 6-4 Darin Brown, 6-7 Troy Fischer, 6-3 Jim Glanzer, 6-6 Mike Hatch and 6-5 Ken Linsky, all of whom saw action last season. He does need more quickness out front and an imposing pivotman who can hold his own with some of the conference's more physical centers.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

The Blue Devils must erase last season's disastrous memories and do it without veteran coach Dwain Mintz, who announced his retirement last June. They finished dead last in the WSUC with a 2-14 record and wound up 9-17 overall. It marked the second straight cellar finish, something unprecedented in Mintz's tenure.

Contributing to last season's demise were a rash of injuries, particularly to senior Luther Forrest, who played in only eight conference games, averaging 18.5 points in those contests. Forrest's departure left a serious void in the lineup.

Vince Mathews, a 6-2 forward, picked up the slack admirably but left Mintz with a hole in the offense after starting with a fairly prolific one-two punch. Mathews averaged 15.8 points in the conference and in a game against River Falls poured 39 points through the hoop, just three shy of the school record. He is counted on for leadership this season.

Besides his scoring, Mathews had 52 steals and 30 assists last season. The new coach, who hadn't been named by the time this book went to press, undoubtedly will have to rely heavily on Mathews, who will be playing his second year in the WSUC.

Other veterans expected to help are 6-5 Chris Conklin, who averaged 9.8 points as a freshman last season, and Rob Larson, who averaged 9.2 points and 5.2 rebounds in 14 conference games.

The backcourt is fairly well stocked with Troy Hamilton, Willie Tucker and Tom LaChance. Mathews, Conklin, Larson and Thad Gabrielse are top returnees in the front line. But, the Blue Devils need more height and strength in the middle.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

The Yellowjackets lost three of their four leading scorers from last season, including two-time all-conference guard Max Christie. So, coach Glenn Carlson faces a huge rebuilding project to make his club competitive in the high-powered WSUC. Christie in particular will be missed. He averaged almost 20 points a game and finished sixth in conference scoring.

Superior wound up eighth in the WSUC with a 4-12 record and was 10-16 overall. The Yellowjackets, though, were capable of competing with the best. Their season included a non-conference victory over Northern Michigan as well as decisions over Stevens Point and Oshkosh, two conference rivals who were playing some of the best basketball in the league by season's end.

Undaunted by last season's finish and the graduation losses, Carlson speaks optimistically about the coming campaign. "We'll be young and untested," he conceded. "But, I'm most optimistic. Those players coming back used to beat the regulars 40 percent of the time in practice. We have better players in the program. We'll see how they develop this year."

Leading returnees include guards Mike Udovich and Clarence Williams, along with forwards Steve Sutherland and Keith Yadon and center Kurt Christiansen. Although the front line averages better than 6-6, the Yellowjackets lacked consistent rebounding last season and this is one area Carlson must improve. Someone also must pick up the scoring slack. The Yellowjackets depended on Christie for most of their firepower the past two years and he usually responded.

PROSPECTS FOR 1989-90

Last season coach Dave Vander Meulen expected to put a good team on the floor but not a dominant one. That assessment changed quickly and the Warhawks not only grabbed a share of the WSUC championship with Eau Claire, but soared to the NCAA Division III national crown, their second in five years.

The Warhawks averaged 88.1 points a game, the most prolific offense in the conference. They were led by Elbert Gordon, the WSUC most valuable player, and Jeff Seifriz, one of the best three-point shooters in the country. Both averaged 20.6 points a game in the conference. But, Seifriz is gone, along with Pat Miller, Claude Robinson and Dave Richter. Miller averaged 15.8 points and, like Seifriz, was a sharpshooter from three-point range.

Vander Meulen, who has compiled a remarkable 228-81 record (.738) in 11 years at Whitewater, will build his current team around Gordon and Ricky Spicer, a 5-10 guard who led the conference with 9.1 assists per game last season. Leading contenders for starting jobs are 6-2 guard Dodd Davey and 6-3 Craig Coulthart, 6-6 James Hodges, 6-9 Rick Jones and 6-5 Paul Kneubuehl in the front line.

As usual, coaches predict the conference will be strong top to bottom this season. Vander Meulen believes his Warhawks can compete with the best and they show signs of being able to add another championship.
