AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO REPORT OF THE COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMITTEE RELATIVE TO AMENDMENT OF LEASE BETWEEN COUNTY AND THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA OF GENERAL BILLY MITCHELL FIELD

Whereas, Certain foundry companies have petitioned the county board to take action modifying its existing lease with the United States of America of General Billy Mitchell Field so as to permit the government to provide quarters for laborers to be employed at said petitioners' plants while engaged in employment for the production of materials stated to be urgently needed by the armed forces of the United States in the successful prosecution of the war; and

Whereas, (a) It appears that the average distance of said foundry plants from the proposed housing location of said laborers is in excess of four miles;

(b) There is no public transportation facility available within a mile and a half radius of the proposed quarters at General Billy Mitchell Field;

(c) The labor understood to be employed comes from a warm climate, and, if required to walk a distance of one and a half miles to the nearest public transportation in temperatures prevailing in Wisconsin winter weather, would be subject to illness, or even if transported in trucks or buses, would be subjected to possibility of illness; or

(d) Alternatively, if the petitioner employers proposed to provide bus or truck transportation from their several plants to such proposed housing quarters of General Billy Mitchell Field, the present alleged shortage of gas and rubber claimed to be vitally needed by the armed forces will be unnecessarily accentuated; and

Whereas, There exist in the State Fair Park in the City of West Allis (in a location much nearer to a majority of the petitioning foundry companies) adequate housing and dining facilities, together with adequate public transportation available at the south gates of the Park; and

Whereas, In view of the foregoing reasons, it would appear that the petitioning firms and the representatives of the War Manpower Commission and War Production Board interested in this matter could more efficiently accomplish the objective sought by making arrangements with the State of Wisconsin to permit the housing of said labor in said buildings at the State Fair Park; Now, Therefore,

Be It Resolved, That the last paragraph in the majority report of the Highway Committee be amended by changing the period at the end thereof to a semi-colon, and adding the following language: "provided further that the proper officers of Milwaukee county shall not execute any document amending said lease as hereinabove provided until they are presented with satisfactory evidence that the firms petitioning for the amendment to the General Billy Mitchell Field lease have made application to the authorities controlling the State Fair Park at West Allis for permission to house said laborers in existing facilities at said Park, and that such permission has been definitely refused."

"Provided that permission be and the same is hereby given to the Government to sub-lease such portion of said leased premises as is now occupied by barracks and other living quarters originally intended for use by air force personnel for housing, so that the same may be occupied for the duration of the war by prisoners of war employed in manufacturing establishments located in Milwaukee county in cases where such personnel are employed in work directly relating to the prosecution of the war effort, and provided further that the Government will supply any and all facilities needed for such laborers."

And, Be It Further Resolved, That the War Department be granted permission to make the necessary alterations and improvements to housing facilities at said Billy Mitchell Field immediately (effective as of Jan. 4, 1945) without waiting until the amendment of the lease is executed.

MEMORANDUM FOR DIRECTOR, PRISONER OF WAR SPECIAL PROJECTS DIVISION

SUBJECT: Field Service Report on Visit to Prisoner of War Camp, Billy Mitchell Field, Cudahy, Wisconsin, 18-19 April 1945, by Captain Walter H. Rapp.

1. Status of Reorientation Program. This prisoner of war camp, with an approximate population of 1,000 German prisoners of war is commanded by Colonel Bechthold, whose Assistant Executive Officer is Lieutenant Kugel. The latter officer was formerly the Assistant Executive Officer at Prisoner of War Camp, Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia. The Commanding Officer is giving the program his full support and he is very much in favor of developing facilities necessary to the success of the reorientation program. Colonel Bechthold requested Captain Rapp to address his staff officers and inform them of their relationship to the program. Captain Rapp complied with that request. He believes that such informal discussions are not only enlightening to the officers participating, but often results in a greater coordination of effort at the camp level in developing a successful reorientation program.

2. Assistant Executive Officer. Although this camp was activated only last January and the first prisoners did not arrive until the early part of March, considerable progress has been made in establishing a reorientation program. It is the opinion of the camp commander that such progress has been made possible by the excellent work performed by Lieutenant Kugel. Captain Rapp believes that Lieutenant Kugel's apparent failure at Patrick Henry may have been the result of his inability to establish a harmonious relationship with that prisoner of war camp commander. Here at Billy Mitchell Field the situation is quite different. The Camp Commander expressed his complete confidence in Lieutenant Kugel and he is pleased because of the initiative and ingenuity of his assistant executive officer, who makes all decisions relating to our program. Lieutenant Kugel is a hard working officer and he takes great pride in his accomplishments. The entire incident at Patrick Henry should be considered a closed issue. The relationship between this Camp Commander and Lieutenant Kugel is excellent. The assistant executive officer is making every effort to provide the prisoners of war with the facilities and media necessary to foster the reorientation program. There is considerable construction and improvement of media facilities still to be completed but Captain Rapp believes that within a few more weeks the Intellectual Diversion Program should be well established at this camp.

3. Observation. Most of the prisoners of war at this camp are working in a battery plant which has been set up on the air field. They were

transferred from other base camps within the Sixth Service Command. The Intelligence Officer stated that most of the prisoners of war were carefully screened before they were sent to this camp and that he has little trouble as far as Nazi activities are concerned. The Intelligence officer agreed with Captain Rapp that it is necessary to be alert at all times in order to uncover individuals attempting to enforce Nazi control. Der Ruf has been received without much comment from the prisoners of war and they seem to read and enjoy that magazine. The spokesman impressed Captain Rapp as being most cooperative and the Camp Commander substantiated that impression by stating that he is satisfied with that prisoner of war. As a whole, it can be stated that the conditions at this camp are very favorable insofar as the Intellectual Diversion Program is concerned.

4. American Personnel. This camp has a day room for American enlisted men which has been attractively decorated by prisoners of war. There is a well equipped library, with an experienced librarian to serve the American soldiers. The morale of the American personnel seems to be exceptionally high. The Commanding Officer is very considerate of his subordinates, and as a result there have been few complaints by the American personnel concerning the treatment of prisoners of war. The day room for American enlisted men was painted and decorated by prisoners of war through an arrangement with the canteen. Payment for the work of the prisoners of war was given to the canteen out of funds belonging to the American enlisted personnel. It seems that that procedure would be an excellent means for improving the living conditions and morale of American personnel stationed at other prisoner of war camps. The facilities provided our American personnel is often inferior to that available to officer prisoners of war, if the day rooms can be used as a criterion for comparison.

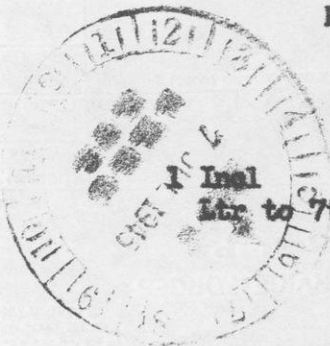
3. Direct communication has been authorized in order that you may communicate with the Commanding General, Seventh Service Command, concerning the details of this transfer.

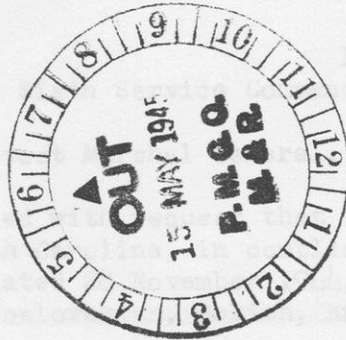

1. This date Prisoner of War Gefreiter Peter Stachowski, 81G-244630, made the statement contained in the following paragraph and signed by him in my presence, which says:

a. "I request respectfully that the rules governing non-German Polish prisoners of war be applied in my case for the following reasons:

b. I was born in 1904 in Essen, of Polish parentage, my parents being natives of that part of Prussia which in 1919 was ceded to Poland on account of its predominantly Polish character.

c. After the First World War my family moved back to their original home, which had become Polish, and after acquiring Polish citizenship I serviced in the Polish Army in 1926.

d. After the Nazis moved in in 1939, I was asked to change my name to "Starmann" and with the promise of getting treatment better than that of my Polish compatriots, which I refused.

e. Eventually I was made a member of the Nazi Automobilist Association, a German citizen, and drafted into the Nazi Army on 20 April 1943 as a driver, my shop being confiscated at the same time for the benefit of German-speaking Bessarabians. I was confined for thirteen (13) days while in the Nazi Army for "derogatory remarks."

f. After capture on 4 June 1944, near Fescalia, Italy, all Poles were given a chance to be segregated on 7 June 1944, in a PW camp in Naples. In the line-up at the time were 63 German medics, who were to be exchanged. One of these medics from Prust, county Schwetz, 10 miles from home, threatened to have action taken against my wife and my children should I step forward to be segregated. Under this threat I neglected taking advantage of this change.

The Commanding General, Eighth Service Command, has been requested to transfer, under guard, as soon as practicable, approximately seven hundred (700) German Army enlisted men prisoners of war, their personal effects and records, from that Service Command, to your custody at Prisoner of War Camp, Billy Mitchell Field, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
3. The Commanding General, Eighth Service Command, has been requested further to inform you, in advance, the approximate date and time of arrival of these prisoners of war at destination.
4. The arrangements concerning the transfer of necessary guard and administrative personnel are to be made between your headquarters and the Commanding General, Eighth Service Command.
5. It is requested that upon arrival of these prisoners of war at destination, you accept custody from the Commanding General, Eighth Service Command, and intern them at Prisoner of War Camp, Billy Mitchell Field, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

1. Colonel Urwiller, Chief, Labor & Liaison Branch, POWODiv., this office, telephoned Captain Winkenhofer from Chicago, Illinois, on 27 January 1945 and requested the transfer of 2500 German prisoners of war from the Seventh Service Command to the Sixth Service Command be reduced to 1800 prisoners of war. He requested further that the Eighth Service Command transfer 1700 German prisoners of war to the custody of the Commanding General, Sixth Service Command.

2. In accordance with the above instructions, Captain Winkenhofer called Captain Kessler, Seventh Service Command, and Captain Van Slyke, Sixth Service Command, and it was agreed that the Seventh Service Command would transfer 1100 prisoners to PW Camp, Camp Ellis, Ill., 350 prisoners to PW Camp, Camp Grant, Ill., and 350 prisoners to PW Camp, Fort Sheridan, Ill.

3. On 29 January 1945, Lt. Strange, in telephone conversation with Captain King, Eighth Service Command, requested the Eighth Service Command to transfer 700 German prisoners of war to the custody of the Commanding General, Sixth Service Command, at Billy Mitchell Air Field, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

4. All prisoners of war referred to above are to be transferred as soon as practicable.

It is requested that, upon arrival of these prisoners of war at their new camp, you accept custody from the Commanding General, Seventh Service Command, and return them to Prisoner of War Camp, Billy Mitchell Field, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Your attention is invited to paragraph five of enclosed copy of letter, 6 July 1945, to the Commanding General, Seventh Service Command, wherein it is requested that appropriate guard and administrative personnel will be transferred with the prisoners of war.

For a new camp, Billy Mitchell is remarkably developed in respect to both physical equipment and constructive activities. The prisoners and some officers are from other POW camps and there is an evident carry-over of their experience in these previous locations.

This is a labor camp. At present there is not enough work to absorb all of the men, but additional equipment may be installed and two shifts put to work. Now the men are rotated so that all work at some time. Capt. Wettenhall, formerly of Camp Ellis, is in charge of the work project.

RELIGION

The chapel still needs a number of things -- seats and painting -- but the important thing is that there is a chapel. A beginning has been made in preparing it-- an altar has been placed here and a number of benches made. The prisoners of war and camp authorities have shown in this provision of a chapel an initiative and resourcefulness which have given this new camp many of the developments found usually in an older camp.

There is neither protestant nor Catholic prisoner of war pastor here. Chaplain Schott's assistant at Ellis, Kreuz, has assumed leadership for Protestant services and, with some assistance from a local Evangelical and Reformed clergyman, Pastor Gosner, has been a factor in the growth of communal religious life here. A local priest, Father Koller, has been conducting services and has been of considerable help in providing for certain needs in the religious work

SCHOOL AND LIBRARY

The almost total absence of books -- texts and general reading-- has hindered the school greatly. Those here are mostly religious, bought by Father Koller. I told the school leaders about a shipment of books under way from

~~the YMCA and that a set of educational books in English would be sent if suitable books could still be found in quantities to permit purchases of additional copies, should the camp desire them for class use. If agreeable to camp authorities, the Central YMCA (Mr. Kraft) of Milwaukee will seek to gather some German books locally.~~

The receipt of fifty Sprachlehre and sixteen dictionaries from the YMCA gave a lift to the English instruction, the main part of the educational program at present. The School leader is working to develop numerous other classes and seems academically qualified to give leadership to this program.

ARTS AND CRAFTS

The idea of a painting, carving and writing competition had been in the thought of camp leaders following receipt of the letter of proposal earlier this year. The field secretary will send YMCA prizes from materials on hand for this purpose. There is here a Billy Mitchell Field the great interest in arts and crafts usually found in other camps. The competition has been approved by Col. Bechthold and will take place late in April.

To encourage the interest even more and to achieve greater utilization of tools, a craft shop for carvers, etc., similar to a small room now available for painters, may be set aside and equipped in the near future.

SPORT

The early March spring had accentuated the already keen interest in outdoor sports. The immediate need was for grading the sports area just recently set apart and enclosed. There are also areas for faustball.

THEATER AND MUSIC

At the time of my visit a theater was under interior construction (stage and inclined benches). If space permits, one building may be used for theatricals and concerts and another for 16 mm. movies. No theatricals have yet been presented, but soon after the construction work is completed, the theater will be inaugurated with a performance. Some YMCA supplies for the theater had already arrived. Three German movies from the YMCA had already been shown and had been enthusiastically received.

A few instruments from the YMCA and a few from other camps (personally owned in-

struments) make up the total instrumentation at the present time. The YMCA will undertake to secure for the camp as many of twenty-three requested instruments as are approved by the custodian of the PW Fund. A male chorus is in the process of formation.

HOSPITAL

The hospital is and will be cared for from camp resources. 16 mm. movies have already been shown.

Although the visit was brief and there was no occasion for the more informative informal conversation with camp leaders, a more leisurely visit would only have confirmed the impression that early and imaginative action by authorities and camp leaders had cut in half the time usually consumed by new camps in developing a constructive camp program. There are many good things to be begun or developed, but an excellent beginning has been made.

The buildings occupied by the prisoners of war formerly housed American personnel. The barracks are of the standard theater of operations type.

All of these prisoners were received from other camps in this country. Included in this total are three enlisted men claiming protected personnel status who have not yet been certified, but who are employed as sanitary corps at the hospital.

12. Sanitary conditions: Sanitary facilities at this camp are of the standard type and entirely adequate. Because of the fact that the base has been on a standby basis for some time, some necessary minor repair of the buildings is now under way and attention will be given to providing more adequate surface drainage as soon as weather permits.

13. Medical facilities: A well equipped hospital staffed by two American doctors and one American dentist is available for use of the prisoners. On March 4, 1945, 23 prisoner patients were in the hospital, none in serious condition. There have been no deaths at this camp.

Daily sick call is taken at the hospital. There is no dispensary in operation in the compound.

14. Recreational facilities: Since this camp was only recently activated, the recreational and leisure time activities program has not been fully organized. However, good progress is being made in this regard. Some athletic equipment, loaned by prisoner of war camp at Fort Sheridan, has been made available temporarily for the use of the prisoners. A grant from the Central Prisoner of War Fund has been approved and sports equipment and indoor games for the day rooms are on order. The usual magazines and newspapers are available to the prisoners, but the library is very poorly stocked at present.

A school program has been started, and classes are held each evening Monday through Friday. Classes in English, history, mathematics and several other subjects are already under way. A prisoner of war choir has been formed and theatrical performances are contemplated. Moving pictures are shown weekly at the post theater, and a prisoner of war theater within the stockade, which will be used for the showing of 16 MM films, is now being constructed.

14. Work activities: On the date of this visit 638 prisoners of war were employed in paid status. There are no branch camps.

The former hangar at this base has been converted into a factory for the assembly of dry-cell batteries.

On

On the date of visit 578 prisoners were engaged on this work project. It is expected that a larger number of prisoners will be employed on the project as soon as sufficient quantities of the necessary materials can be obtained. Meanwhile, the prisoners are assigned on a rotating basis for training purposes, so that all will be available for work when full capacity is reached.

Initially, some resistance on the part of the prisoners was encountered on the basis that this work was thought by them to be not in accordance with the Convention. This difficulty has now been largely overcome, and following his inspection of the plant, the representative of the Swiss Legation further assured the prisoners through the spokesman that the work they are performing is of a type permitted under terms of the Convention.

Work conditions on this detail are good, and every attention has been given to safety methods and the elimination of work hazards. The men work 8-hour shifts and are given a 10-minute rest in the morning and again in the afternoon.

15. Food and cooking: Two fully equipped 500-man messes are in operation at the present time. In addition, two 250-man capacity mess halls are available and will be used when the camp is at full capacity. There were no complaints concerning either the quantity or the quality of the food ration.

16. Clothing: All of the prisoners had received a full clothing issue prior to arrival at this camp. Therefore, only necessary replacements have been issued here.

17. Canteen facilities and available commodities: Canteen facilities are available to prisoners at this camp and the articles in stock are in accordance with War Department regulations. Prisoners are limited to four packages of non-standard brand cigarettes per week. Pipe tobacco is not rationed.

18. Discipline: Disciplinary action taken at this camp has been mostly in connection with the refusal of prisoners to work or attempting to slow down production. During the month of February six prisoners were subjected to disciplinary punishment. Four of these were in connection with inadequate performance on work assignment, while the other two offenders had taken food within the compound without permission.

There have been no court-martial trials since the activation of this camp.

19. Comments:

The Swiss representative commented favorably on the progress which had been made in developing the program at this camp, since its recent activation. He expressed confidence after his talks with the American personnel in charge that the program would be further successfully developed.

19. Comments: Colonel Pechtold was not present at the time of this visit, having been called to Chicago on urgent business.

The visitors, however, were well received and their inspection facilitated in every possible way by Major Lynam, Executive Officer, and Lieutenant Leon Savin, Adjutant. The factual material which had been requested by letter by the Swiss Legation had been prepared and was ready for Mr. Walker.

In the concluding conference with Major Lynam, Mr. Walker informed him that the spokesman had mentioned that following a search which had occurred a short time prior to the visit several of the prisoners of war had alleged that personal articles and watches were missing. The obvious implication was that American personnel conducting this search had improperly removed these articles. Major Lynam replied that since it had been learned from experiences in the past that following such searches allegations of this sort were frequently made, extreme care is taken in conducting such a search to insure against the possibility of American personnel removing any personal articles without the giving of a receipt. He doubted that these particular allegations had any foundation, especially, since the American personnel making the search had themselves been searched before entering the compound and again when leaving the compound. He agreed, however, to give the matter further consideration.

The prisoners, through their spokesman, inquired whether it would be possible to establish a dispensary in the compound for treatment of minor illnesses and injuries not considered serious enough to report for sick call at the hospital. This matter was discussed by the Swiss representative with Major Kennedy, the American Medical Officer, who stated that in his opinion such a procedure was not desirable from a medical standpoint. He prefers to have any prisoner who is suffering from an illness or an injury, no matter how trivial, report to the hospital where competent diagnosis can be made and suitable treatment given. He believed that if prisoners were allowed to receive treatment from members of the German sanitary corps within the compound, treatment not suitable to the injury or illness might be given and complications result. Major Lynam supported this view and stated that consideration had already been given to the prisoners' request and it had been decided that the procedure presently in effect was more desirable and would be continued. Mr. Walker stated that he wished to make it entirely clear that in taking up this matter with the camp authorities he did not wish it construed as a complaint in any sense, since he was entirely satisfied that the medical facilities available to the prisoners were entirely adequate.

The Swiss representative commented favorably on the progress which had been made in developing the program at this camp, since its recent activation. He expressed confidence after his talks with the American personnel in charge that the program would be further successfully developed.
