- 2. The fictitious "Norwegian Mother's Letter to Her Son" read by Marian.
- 3. Verna reads from her brother's autobiography (with Lud coughing).
- 4. Verna tells of her grandparents coming from Norway to Washburn, her g'ma homesteading on County C. Parents married in 1899 (monther Helena Olson, father a Swanson).
- 5. About music in the family. Grandfather built a salmodikon, mother played the pump organ. Father died in 1921.
- 6. About the family's use of the pump organ for song and religious observations.
- 7. On Verna's mother's singing at home, with relevant passages from her brother's family history.
- 8. On the Maple Hill School.
- 9. More reading from the brother's manuscript: about the school, butchering time.
- 10. Verna discusses the songs she is abbût to sing, then she offers an evening prayer, and another Norwegian prayer before meals.

  Marian and Lud join in on the latter.
- 11. Lud gives a parody grace in Norwegian.
- 12. Verna and Marian talk about singing popular songs, "in English," at the house parties around Maple Hill.
- 13. Marian and Verna read music and sang popular songs. Kids would come over and sing pop songs while their mother played organ.

- 14. Louis Cuty, of Hugzzian descent, tells about his family's move from western Pennsylvania to Washburn in 1912 along with John Brevak. Other Hungarians came later to the town of Washburn; south of the Long Lake area. Louis worked on the railroad.
- 15. Louis sings a Hungarian song about Little Johnny and the girls.
- 16. Elmer can't recall the words to "Nikolina" (Elmer is Swedish), so Verna tries a snatch and eggs Ludwig to join in, but he's reluctant to sing.

- 19. "Pal Sine Honer"/Paul's Chickens (Mike and Elsie perform this number on their Swedish American record),
- 20. "Helsa Den Der Hemma"/Verna cites this as being in the Concordia hymnal.
- 21. "And Now We Must Bid One Another Farewell."
- 22. "A Kjore Vain." (:44)

- 23. "Kjaerringa Mae Staven." Verna is paging through her songbook for numbers to perform.
