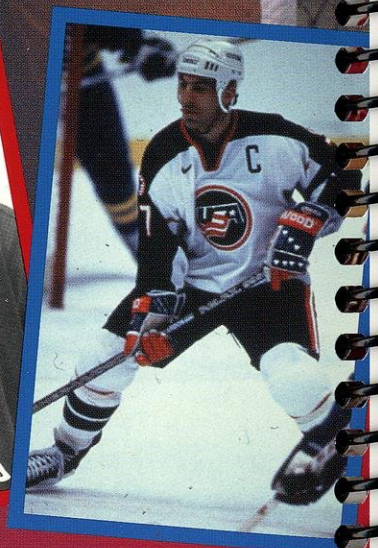
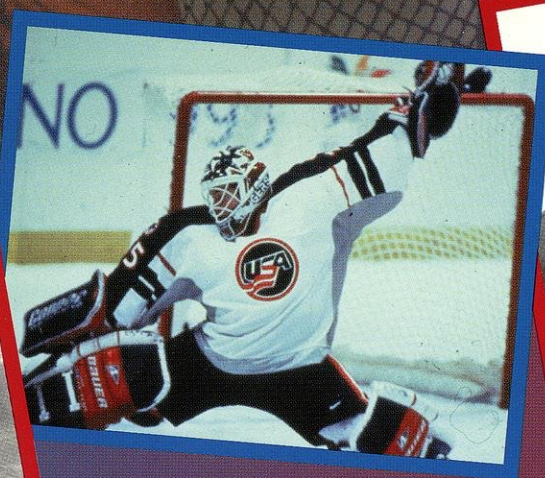
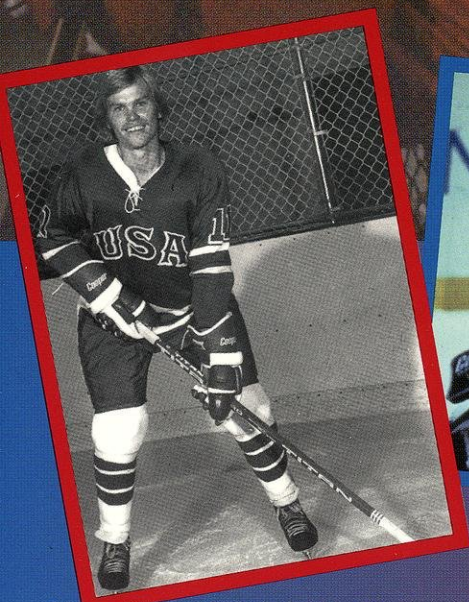


# WISCONSIN HOCKEY

# The 2001-02 Preview

The Badgers open their 39th season of the modern era (since 1963) this year, returning 19 letterwinners off of last year's 22-15-4 squad, which finished the season ranked eighth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll. In league play, the UW hopes to improve on a 14-10-4 mark and a fifth-place standing in the 2000-01 WCHA standings. The 20-win season was the 28th such campaign for a UW team and the 16th under head coach Jeff Sauer.

This year's team possesses an experienced group of forwards, led by seven seniors who have combined to play in over 700 games at Wisconsin. Defensively the Badgers will be young, especially in goal. Wisconsin must fill holes left by defensive partners Jeff Dessner (Glenview, Ill.) and Alex Brooks (Madison, Wis.), who played in a combined 300 career games, and goaltender Graham Melanson (Plymouth, Nova Scotia), a four-year starter and school record-holder for wins (81).

"We will take the strength of our team which is our forwards and we'll form our defensive system and strategies around that group," said head coach Jeff Sauer.

The UW nucleus, as mentioned previously, will be at forward, but the Badger roster is made up of 14 (9/seniors, 5/juniors) upperclassmen with plenty of game experience. Those players will build on last year's NCAA tournament appearance and are anxious to better previous campaign statistics. "The problem you have when you try and assess team and individual productivity from year to year is that personnel changes so much," said Sauer. Everyone has ups and downs, that is part of athletics. There are many reasons why some of these players have maybe not contributed as people thought they would, but I think it is more a reflection of what support they may or may not have had on their lines and the personnel that we've lost the last 2-3 years."

"Hopefully the players look at it all as a learning experience and everyone can look forward to a new season and coming back even stronger. It's up to us (the coaches) to get the right combinations together and let the players go from there."

## THE OFFENSE

Gone are the Steve Reinprechts and Dany Heatleys ... they've moved on to the NHL. For the last few years, the Badger offense has been keyed by a single line or select player(s) who for the most part have provided the offense. "The last couple of years we have been a victim of the mentality of expecting one or two people to provide the offense and to be there night in and night out to give us that punch when we needed it," said Sauer.

But, this season will be different ... very different.

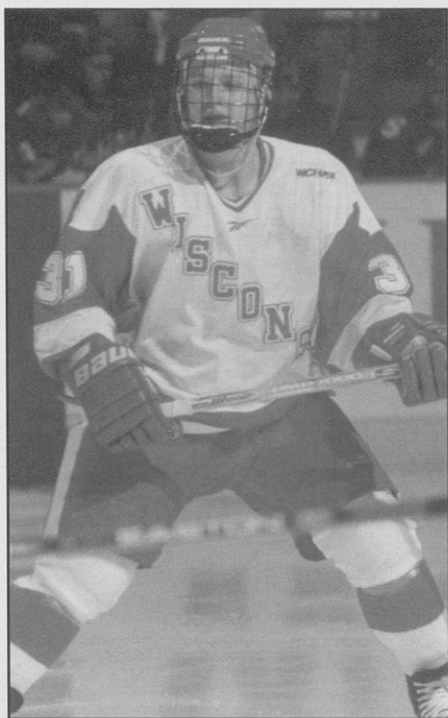
"The strength of this year's team is its depth and the number of players we have. Other teams won't be able to key on a certain individual(s) and it will be much harder for teams to defense us because of our balance and depth."

The position returns five of the top-six scorers and nearly 80 percent of goal scoring and point production. Matt Murray (Fond du Lac, Wis.), who scored 16-13=19 and Kent Davyduke (Saskatoon, Saskatchewan), who scored 11-18-29 a year ago, return as the leading scorers, tying for second in team point totals a year ago behind Dany Heatley (Calgary, Alberta). Seniors Andy Wheeler (Duluth, Minn.), Matt Doman (Sartell, Minn.), Dave Hergert (Bloomington, Minn.), David Hukalo (Edmonton, Alberta) and Matt Hussey (Plymouth, Minn.) are all looking to reach the 15-20 goal-scoring plateau and will be looked upon to do just that. All will be the backbone of a UW offense that has arguably the most balance, depth and experience than any team in the league.

As juniors, Murray and Davyduke tripled and doubled, respectively, their goal-scoring and point production from their sophomore campaigns. Murray was one of the team's more versatile players, chipping in a team-leading three shorthanded goals, and also three game-winning and two power-play markers. Wheeler and Doman also turned in season-best performances a year ago. Junior Brad Winchester (Madison, Wis.) has the size, strength and skill to be one of the league's best and hopes to rebound from a sophomore season that saw the second-round draft pick of the Edmonton Oilers score 9-16=25.

Classmate Erik Jensen (Madison, Wis.) was a pleasant surprise as he stepped up his play, especially the second half of the season.

goals. Heatley left as one of the highest scoring two-year players in Badger history.

"What we'll ask of our forwards is for a certain number of them to step up their offensive performances from previous years and hopefully that increased productivity will offset what we've lost with the departure of Dany (Heatley)," said Sauer.

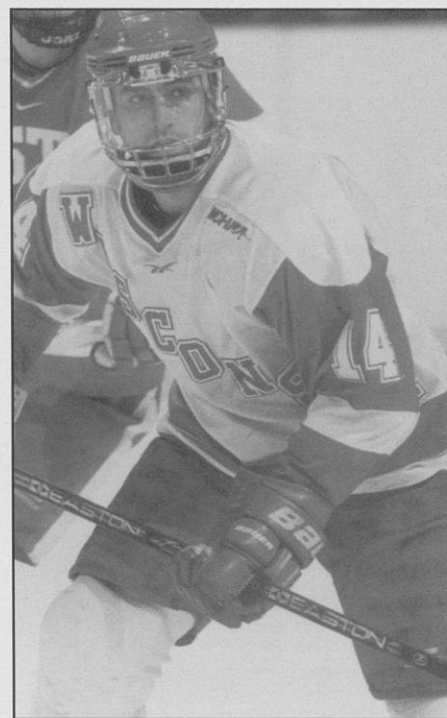
## ON DEFENSE

"Obviously a key to our early-season success will be how well we play defensively and how our defensive system comes around," said Sauer. I've never been too concerned about scoring goals and our teams have always been designed from the defense out."

Since 1997-98, the UW defense has been stingy allowing teams to score just 469 goals in 161 games for a team goals-against average of 2.91 in that four-year span.

Half of the Badgers' top-six blueliners were lost to graduation, including all-American Dessner and all-WCHA third-teamer Brooks. The duo not only showed remarkable consistency and dependability at their position, but were stalwarts for the UW defensive effort in their Badger careers. Dessner, the 2000 WCHA Defensive Player of the Year, left as one of the highest-scoring defensemen in UW history as well as possessing a career plus-minus of +75. Brooks didn't miss a game in his final two years and was the Badgers' best defensive defenseman.

Rob Vega (Madison, Wis.) returns as the lone senior on this year's blueline squad. He was voted the 2001 Badger Most Improved Player and enters his final season with the most game experience, having played in 97 career games to date. Juniors Brian Fahey (Glenview, Ill.) and Mark

The team's strongest player (benches 340) is also one of the WCHA's most physical.

Sophomore Rene Bourque (Lac La Biche, Alberta) contributed 10-5=15 in his first season as a Badger. The majority of those totals came in the final nine games of the season where Bourque tallied 7-5=12. He is one of three returning players to reach the double-figure mark in goals scored (along with Murray and Davyduke).

Other returning letterwinners at forward include John Eichelberger (Glencoe, Ill.), who played in 25 games and walk on Jake Heisler (Bloomington, Minn.), who saw action in five games a year ago.

The only newcomer at forward is Alex Leavitt (Edmonton, Alberta), who was a member of Canada's Under-18 team this past summer which competed at the Six Nations Tournament in the Czech Republic. Leavitt is a product of Athol Murray College of Notre Dame. The same school that produced former Badger Curtis Joseph (1988-89).

The biggest hole to fill will be that left by the early departure of Dany Heatley, who signed with the NHL's Atlanta Thrashers following the end of his sophomore season. The first-team all-American led his teammates in goals (24), assists (33), points (57), power-play (10) and game-winning (6)

Jackson (St. Albert, Alberta) are the other upperclassmen on defense. Both would like to improve on sophomore season performances and are key players on a youthful UW defensive unit. As a whole, the Badger defense will need to improve its play in front of the net, especially with the inexperience in goal this season.

One of the WCHA's best first-year players at defense a year ago, Dan Boeser (Savage, Minn.), finished as the top goal-scoring rookie defenseman. He saw action in every Badger game as a freshman and was one of just 10 league rookies who played in all of his team's contests and one of just three rookie defensemen who played in every game.

Jon Krall (Temperance, Mich.) will get his chance to earn a spot in the nightly lineup after seeing action against all nine WCHA opponents in his first year as a Badger.

Newcomers Joe Campbell (Superior, Wis.) and Andy Wozniowski (Buffalo Grove, Ill.) give the UW blueline needed size. Campbell, who played for the USHL's Des Moines Buccaneers last year is 6-4, 180 pounds, while Wozniowski is 6-5, 210 pounds (played for Texas in the NAHL last year).

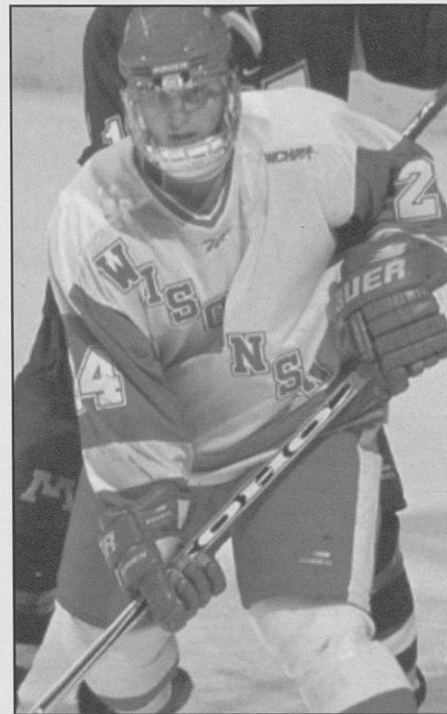




Assistant captain Kent Davyduke is coming off his best offensive season for the Badgers (11-18=29).

## IN GOAL

The most inexperienced and untested position on this year's squad is at goaltender. With the departure of four-year starter Melanson, the position is up for grabs with junior Scott Kabotoff (Sherwood Park, Alberta) and rookie newcomer Bernd Bruckler (Graz, Austria). Melanson set numerous school and league records which included Badger marks for wins (81), games played (140), saves (3,850) and minutes played (8,179). He also tied the school record with nine career shutouts.

Melanson's durability and solid play in goal didn't leave much room for his backups to see much action. Consider that he started 118 of the last 120 UW games, including the final 60 games of his UW career.

Kabotoff, who has served as Melanson's backup the last two seasons, enters the year as the player to beat for the starting position. He has started one game at Wisconsin, but has been the starter in exhibition games vs. tough European competition in Valerenga IF (Norway) and CSKA (St. Petersburg). Senior Mark Baranczyk (Green Bay, Wis.) is a two-year letterwinner, who initially walked on to the team in the fall of 1998.

Bruckler will battle for the No. 1 spot in goal. He played for the Tri-City Storm

(USHL) in 2000-01, joining the team in December of last year from Graz, Austria. Bruckler was drafted in the fifth round by the Philadelphia Flyers (150th overall pick) this past summer in the NHL's entry draft.

Despite playing just half the season in the USHL, Bruckler finished the year third among league netminders and was a USHL second-team all star.

## THE SCHEDULE

The 36-game schedule is again a tough one, as the Badgers play eight games the first half of the season against the 2001 Frozen Four field. The UW opens league play at 2001 NCAA runner-up North Dakota (Oct. 26-27) followed by a home series with defending national champion Boston College (Nov. 2-3). The Badgers play the other half of the NCAA semifinal field when they take on Michigan and Michigan State in the College Hockey Showcase in November.

The 39th season of UW hockey opens at home the weekend of Oct. 19-20, when the Badgers face off against first-time opponent Wayne State University. It is the 'latest' season-opening date since the 1993-94 squad began their year on Oct. 22-23 at Denver.

The 13th annual Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown contested every year at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee, features teams from three Division I conferences in Brown (ECAC), New Hampshire (Hockey East) and Colorado College (WCHA). It is Brown's first appearance at the annual event and it will be the first time the Badgers and Bears have played each other since 1970. Both Colorado College and New Hampshire first competed in the '96 Showdown.

In exhibition action, the UW takes on the French Olympic team (Jan. 29). A Badger team has never faced a French team.

Postseason play begins the weekend of March 8-10 when the first-round of the WCHA playoffs kick off with the top-five finishers hosting the sixth- through 10th-place teams. The league's Final Five will again be held at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn., the weekend of Mar. 14-16.

NCAA East and West regionals will be held at Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. (March 22-23) and at the Centrum Center in Worcester, Mass., (March 23-24). The 2002 NCAA Men's Frozen Four (April 4-6) takes place at the Xcel Energy Center, marking the first time the national championships have been held in the midwest since 1997 when Wisconsin hosted the 50th anniversary of hockey's national championship at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee.



## THE WCHA

The WCHA celebrates its 50th anniversary this year and Badger head coach Jeff Sauer has been involved either as a player, an assistant coach or head coach with the league for 40 of those years. He holds the WCHA record for wins by a league coach (639), entering the 2001-02 season with 473 victories at Wisconsin and 166 wins while at Colorado College.

He also enters his fourth decade of coaching in the WCHA with the start of this season, the longest tenure of any coach in league history.

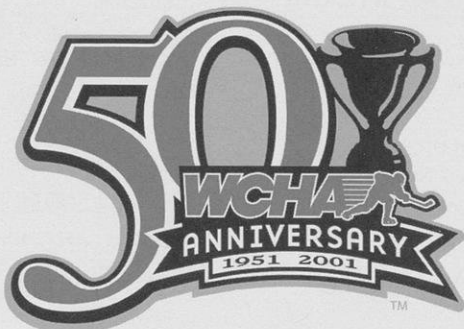
"What has obviously changed over the years is the number of teams playing hockey, shrinking the recruiting pool and creating a situation where more and more schools are competing for the same players. Additionally, this increase in the number of teams playing the sport collegiately doesn't allow teams to become as dominant as they were in the past."

"The biggest area of change, involves the demands put on players and coaches nowadays. Programs cost more to run and the pressure put on programs to produce and players to perform is much greater than its ever been."

"But overall the game is still the game and it has not changed. The college hockey game is still the same, exciting game it was 20-30 years ago."

"The players are the reason I have been doing this so long," said Sauer. Interacting with them and seeing them develop, not just as hockey players, but to see young players given an opportunity and how they use it to grow and learn from is very rewarding to me. I'm not in this for individual gratification or for the winning. I'm proud of the record and program we've been able to build and sustain here at Wisconsin, but to see the student-athletes develop into mature adults over their four-year careers is and always will be the biggest thrill for me and what I get the most pleasure from as a coach."

"There have been a lot of people throughout my lifetime that have had an affect on me. But, the biggest influence on my life has been my Dad," said Sauer. Bob Johnson was a huge influence on my coaching career and also the people behind the scenes have also played a role. People like the Otto Breitenbachs, the Elroy Hirschs and the Joel Maturis have been there with advice over the years and they were individuals that you were always comfortable talking to. Of course, there are many other people I could put into that category. But, I am who I am now because of my Dad."

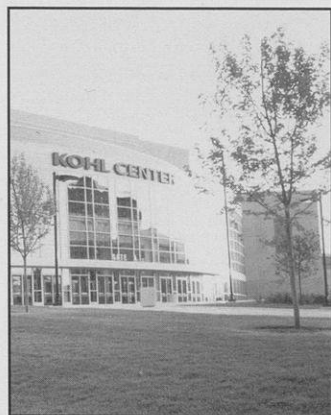
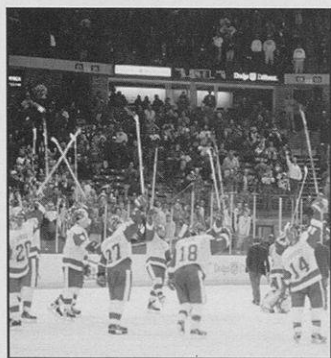


# The Kohl Center

## THE KOHL CENTER

On Oct. 3, 1998, the UW hockey team opened play in its new home -- The Kohl Center. It is the second-largest college-owned hockey arena in the country with seating for 15,237. The 2001-02 season will mark the fourth season of Badger hockey in the Kohl Center with a three-year total attendance figure of 727,347 for 62 home dates or an average of 11,731 fans per game.

The facility is named after U.S. Senator Herb Kohl, a 1956 UW-Madison graduate who donated \$25 million towards the construction of the arena. Kohl's gift is the single-largest private donation in UW history.

Albert 'Ab' Nicholas, a former all-Big Ten basketball player for the Badgers, and his wife, Nancy Johnson Nicholas, pledged \$10 million toward the project. For their generosity, the facility's basketball practice gymnasium is called the Nicholas-Johnson Pavilion.

The Kohl Center, which cost \$76.4 million, is also the home to both the men's and women's basketball teams as well as concerts, guest speakers, shows and sporting events.

This March, the Kohl Center and the University of Wisconsin will host one of the "Sweet 16" Final four regionals of the men's NCAA basketball tournament.

Entertainers who have already performed at the Kohl Center include Elton John, Faith Hill and Tim McGraw, Shania Twain, Cher, the Moody Blues, the Dave Matthews Band, Matchbox 20 and the Backstreet Boys to name a few. The Dalia Lama has also been at the Kohl Center.

## National Attendance Leaders

Since moving into the Kohl Center for the 1998-99 season, the UW hockey program has once again assumed the lead in national attendance. Wisconsin led the nation for 24 consecutive years from 1969-93 when the team played at the Dane County Coliseum.

## THE DEAN

His list of achievements in the college hockey circuit places him among the elite in the coaching ranks. He is not only the winningest coach in Badger history in any sport, but he is the WCHA's most victorious and most tenured coach.

This season marks Jeff Sauer's 31st year behind the collegiate bench and his 20th season in charge of the Badger hockey program. Since beginning his coaching career back in 1966, as a 23-year-old assistant to the legendary Bob Johnson at Colorado College, Sauer has become the fourth-winningest coach in NCAA history and is the only person in WCHA annals to coach 30 seasons in the league.

The 58-year-old Sauer holds numerous league coaching records including those for longevity and for most games coached (1,205). His 639 wins rank fourth (third among active coaches) on the all-time coaches victory list.

Sauer is one of just two current coaches in the WCHA with two national titles (Dean Blais of UND is the other). In fact, there have been only eight coaches in the history of the WCHA that have multiple NCAA championships and that list reads like a Who's Who of College Hockey Coaches. DU's Murray

Armstrong (5) and Michigan's Vic Heyliger (4) head the list followed by Bob Johnson (UW), John MacInnes (MTU), Herb Brooks (UM) and Gino Gasparini (UND), each with three.

## AT WISCONSIN

Entering his 20th year at the UW, Sauer has enjoyed unprecedented success. No other coach has won more UW games (473) or coached in more contests (802). Those 473 wins include a mark of 53-24-5 (.677) over the last two seasons.

Under his direction, Badger teams have flourished both in conference play and on the national scene.

He became the first coach in college history to win a national title in his inaugural season at a school when the 1982-83 Badgers won the school's fourth NCAA championship. His second national title came during the 1989-90 season when that team went 36-9-1 on its way to recording the school's second-winningest season in history.

Sauer has recorded four 30-win seasons (1982-83, 1987-88, 1989-90, 1999-2000), the most of any UW coach.

In WCHA play, the UW has finished in the league's top three 14 times during his tenure, winning league titles in 1990 and 2000.

Sauer won his 600th career game in December of 1999, joining an elite group of four others to pass that plateau. He is the only coach at the UW (in any sport) to win that many games and just the third coach in WCHA annals to win that many games at one school.

One of the most-respected coaches in the game, he continues to be a consummate diplomat for the game of hockey. Sauer remains involved at all levels of hockey, from instructing kids at summer camps to speaking at high school assemblies to coaching international-level athletes in world tournaments.

In the summer of 2000, Sauer was honored by USA Hockey, when he received the JOFA/USA Hockey Distinguished Achievement Award. The award is given annually to a U. S. citizen who has made hockey his or her profession and has made outstanding contributions, on or off the ice, to the sport in America.

## HIS PLAYERS

Many of Sauer's former players have received national honors and gone onto successful careers in pro hockey. Seventeen have earned all-America honors, including three first-team selections in the last two years -- Steve Reinprecht and Jeff Dessner (2000) and Dany Heatley (2001).

Reinprecht (runner up) and Heatley were also finalists for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award. In 1998, Erik Raygor won the Humanitarian Award, given to college hockey's finest citizen.

Names like Chelios, Driver, Flatley, Granato, Joseph, Mellanby and Richter have adorned NHL jerseys for decades after playing collegiately for Sauer at Wisconsin.



## THE PLAYOFFS

Over the years, Sauer's Badger teams have been very successful in the playoffs and have a reputation of peaking when the postseason arrives.

Over the years, his teams have averaged 25 victories per year and posted at least 24 wins 12 times. Under Sauer, Wisconsin teams have earned NCAA tournament bids in 11 of the last 14 years, including eight consecutive seasons (1988-95).

Sauer has guided the Badgers to a stellar 69-36-2 (.654) mark in the postseason. Noted for their second-half surges, the Badgers own a cumulative 255-145-26 (.629) record from Jan. 1 through the playoffs since 1982-83 and a mark of 160-89-16 (.634) from Feb. 1 through the playoffs in that same time period.

## INTERNATIONALLY SPEAKING ...

In addition to being one of college hockey's top coaches, Sauer has had a noticeable presence on the international scene as well. He is very active in USA Hockey, the national governing body for U.S. hockey, and is dedicated to the development and promotion of hockey at all levels in the United States. Sauer has been chosen frequently to coach U.S. select teams in international competition.

He currently serves on USA Hockey's International Committee which is involved in the selection of coaches and teams for various world tournaments and championships and will assist in determining Team USA for the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, Utah.

In August of 2000, Sauer coached his first-ever women's team at the women's Olympic Festival in Lake Placid, N.Y. Olympian Cammi Granato (a sister to former Badgers Tony, Don and Rob and a cousin to Kevin) was one of his players, becoming the fifth member of the Granato family to be coached by Sauer.

In August of 1998, Sauer was head coach for the inaugural WCHA All-Star Team that competed against elite teams from Germany and Switzerland in the Kolin Cup Tournament in Switzerland. It was the first time in collegiate hockey conference history that a league sent an all-star team overseas.

During the summer of 1997, Sauer was one of two coaches for the U.S. Select Team which played at the Tampere Cup in Finland. The team, made up of 20 of the top American-born collegiate players, competed against top international teams.

In the spring of '95, Sauer was chosen to be head coach of the U.S. National Team at the World Championships in Sweden. The American team finished first in Group B, emerging from first-round action with a 3-0-2 record. With wins over Austria (5-2), Norway (2-1) and the Czech Republic (4-2) and ties against Sweden (2-2) and Finland (4-4), the United States advanced to the medal round, before losing its first game to Canada (4-1).

Sauer was a finalist for both the 1992 and 1994 U. S. Olympic coaching jobs. In April of 1992, Sauer was an assistant coach for the U.S. at the World Tournament in Prague, Czechoslovakia.

At the 1990 Goodwill Games, Sauer served as head coach of Team USA. Prior to the Games, Team USA beat the Soviet Union's National Team in an exhibition contest at the Oakland Coliseum. It was the first time since 1980 that a U.S. squad had beaten a team from Russia.

That Goodwill Games team advanced to the gold medal game against the Soviet Union, but lost a 4-3 decision in a shootout at the end of sudden death.

In 1989, Sauer coached the USA Select Team at the Pravda Cup (Leningrad, U.S.S.R.). During the spring of 1985, he served as an assistant coach to the late Dave Peterson for the USA Hockey team that participated in the International Ice Hockey Federation World Championships in Czechoslovakia.

Sauer has also coached at the Olympic Festival (1987), served on the U.S. Olympic Hockey Committee (1984), been a member of the NCAA Rules Committee (eight years) and served as editor of the rule book.

## IN THE OFF SEASON

Since 1968 when he became an assistant coach at Wisconsin, Sauer has been involved with hockey schools during the summer. His Wisconsin Hockey Schools have been located in Madison, Milwaukee and St. Louis, Mo. over the years.

He has assisted at the Bob Johnson Hockey School in Aspen (Colo.) and has worked as a counselor for Stan Mikita's hockey camp for the hearing-impaired in Chicago for nearly 25 years. In 1997, he was honored by the Stan Mikita hockey schools for his service and dedication.



## AS AN ASSISTANT

Sauer began his coaching career at Colorado College as an assistant to the 'Badger' Bob Johnson. In addition to his coaching duties with the hockey program, Sauer was also an assistant baseball coach, a sport he played and lettered in as an undergraduate at CC.

In 1968, he followed Johnson to Wisconsin becoming his first full-time assistant at the UW. Sauer was an assistant coach for the Badgers when the UW made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA tournament in 1970. He served in that capacity until 1971, when he accepted the head coaching job at Colorado College.

At CC, where he served as head coach from 1971-82, Sauer won 166 games and was twice named WCHA Coach of the Year. His first award came following his rookie season, and the second followed the 1974-75 campaign when Colorado College posted a 23-16-0 record. The Tigers' third-place WCHA finish that season was the highest in 15 years for a CC team.

## PERSONAL

Sauer graduated from Colorado College in 1965 with a B.S. in sociology.

Sauer and his wife Jamie (also a CC alum) reside in Middleton, Wis., and are the parents of a son Chip and daughter Beth. Chip graduated from Wisconsin in 1999 with a degree in engineering mechanics and Beth is a senior at Colorado College this year.

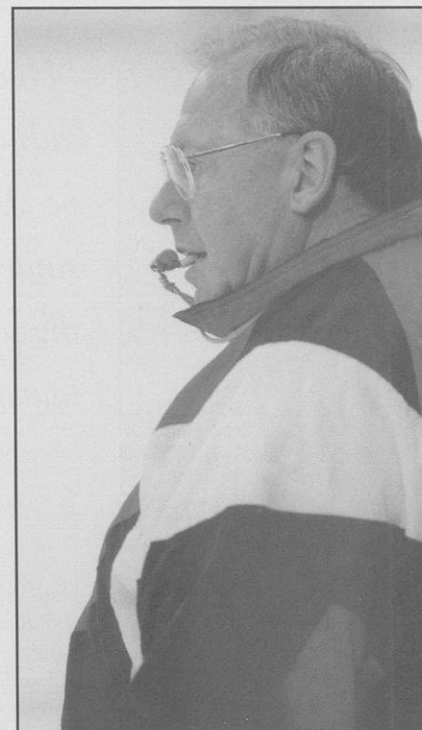

**PAT FORD** begins his 11th year as a Division I assistant coach and his eighth season with the Badgers in 2001-02. His duties as top assistant and recruiting coordinator include the identification and evaluation of top prospects, arranging official visits, monitoring NCAA compliance issues as well as written correspondence with prospective student-athletes.

He also works closely with the academic affairs office setting up class schedules and monitoring academic programs throughout the year. On the ice, Ford works with both the forwards and defensemen along with special teams.

Ford has played a major role in continuing the 'Learn to Read' program with various community schools. This program involves the student-athletes volunteering to read to elementary school children. Additionally, Ford has been actively involved with helping the Badger Student Fan Club the last couple of years.

In August of 2000, Ford was selected an assistant coach for the touring WCHA All Star Team, travelling to Norway for three games against Norwegian elite teams. The league all stars won all three games.

## COACHING BACKGROUND

Ford served as an assistant coach at Northern Michigan under Rick Comley for two years (1992-94), before returning to his alma mater. During those two seasons at NMU, the Wildcats posted a record of 43-34-5, which included an NCAA playoff appearance in 1993.

During the 1991-92 season, Ford came to Wisconsin to serve as a graduate assistant coach. The Badgers went 27-14-2 that year and lost in the NCAA Championship game to Lake Superior State.

As an assistant coach at Madison Edgewood High School, Ford aided former Badger Ken Keryluk for two years (1989-91). The Crusaders captured two state titles, including a 27-1-0 mark in 1990-91.

## PLAYING DAYS

A four-year letterwinner at Wisconsin, Ford played for Coach Jeff Sauer (1984-88), scoring 48-78-126 in 155 career games as a center. Ford was named to the WCHA all-academic team in 1987 and was voted honorable men-

tion all-WCHA in 1988.

He was a member of the Badger team that won the first-ever WCHA Playoff Championship (1988). Ford's best campaign for the UW came during his senior year. He ranked third in team scoring with 17-31-48 in 45 games, helping the Cardinal and White to a 30-13-2 record, just the fourth Badger squad at the time to post a 30-win season. Ford was also an Academic all-WCHA selection for the 1986-87 season.

Following college, Ford had a brief stint with the Canadian National Team as well as playing professionally in a premier league in England for the Swindon Wildcats.

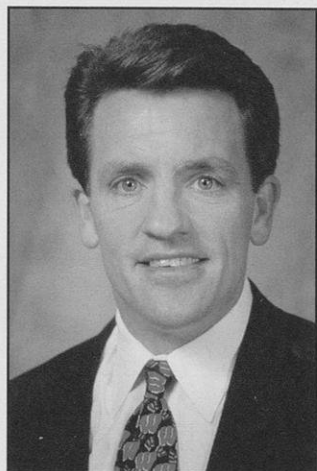

# Mark Johnson

MARK JOHNSON was hired as a Badger assistant coach on August 1, 1996. He is the third Johnson to coach at Wisconsin following his father, the legendary Bob Johnson (head coach from 1966-82 and his brother, Peter (assistant coach under Jeff Sauer from 1987-91). On the ice, he works with the forwards and defensemen as well as special teams. Off the ice, he is involved in identifying and recruiting top prospects and overseeing off-ice conditioning programs.

## COACHING BACKGROUND

Before joining the Badger staff, Johnson coached both at the high school and pro levels. After retiring from professional hockey, he served as an assistant coach at Madison Memorial (1993-94) before taking over as head coach at Verona High School (1994-95). He moved into the pro ranks as head coach and general manager of the Madison Monsters (1995-96), where he was responsible for all hockey operations including player contracts and transactions. As the Monsters' head coach, Johnson was the 1995-96 Coach of the Year in the Colonial Hockey League, guiding the club to a 37-30-7 mark, the best ever achieved by an expansion team in the CoHL.

## BADGER ALL-AMERICAN & OLYMPIAN

Johnson remains the Badgers' second all-time leading scorer with 125-131=256 in three seasons (1976-79). He holds UW records for most goals in a career (125) and season (48). In 1978-79, he tallied 41-49=90, setting the school mark for points in a season. He was part of the '76-77 NCAA Championship team and earned two first-team all-America distinctions (1978

and 1979). He was inducted as a charter member of the UW Athletic Dept. Hall of Fame in 1991.

Johnson was the leading scorer (5-6=11) for the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team's gold medal-winning effort in Lake Placid, N.Y. He scored two key goals in the game against the Soviet Union and tallied the game-winning score in the final game vs. Finland. Johnson and his teammates marked the 20th anniversary of the 'Miracle on Ice' in 1999-2000. The 1980 U.S. Olympic Team was honored by *Sports Illustrated* as giving us the 'Greatest Sports Moment of the Century.'

After the Olympics, he enjoyed an 11-year career in the NHL (1979-90), amassing 219-317=536 in 669 games. In 1983-84 he scored a career high 35-52=87 as captain of the Hartford Whalers and tied an All-Star game record with

three assists. During his NHL career, Johnson was a member of seven different U.S. National teams in addition to playing in three Canada Cup tournaments. He returned to international play in 1998 as a member of Team USA in the World Championship Pool A qualifying tournament in Austria.

In September of 1999, he was inducted into the International Ice Hockey Federation Hall of Fame. Johnson, who has represented USA Hockey in more international tournaments than any other athlete, also serves on the Athletic Advisory Committee for USA Hockey.

Johnson made his USA Hockey coaching debut in the summer of 2000, being selected as an assistant coach for Team USA in the IIHF Pool A World Championships in St. Petersburg, Russia.

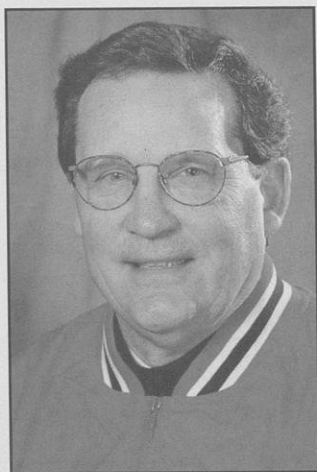

The 2001-02 season marks **BILL HOWARD'S** 28th year as a member of the Wisconsin coaching staff. He is a veteran of all five Wisconsin NCAA championship teams and continues to be the man behind the goaltending success of Badger teams.

During the off-season, Howard is actively involved in numerous summer hockey camps and seminars, including intensive goaltending schools in Chicago, Madison, Milwaukee, Minneapolis and St. Louis. After 34 years of teaching business law at Madison Memorial High School, Howard retired this past May.

In addition, Howard has also served as color commentator, both on radio and TV, for Badger hockey.

## AT WISCONSIN

During his tenure at the UW, Howard has helped develop all-Americans Julian Baretta (1977), Roy Schultz (1980), Duane Derksen (1992) and Kirk Daubenspeck (1997) plus eventual NHL standouts Mike Richter (New York Rangers), Curtis Joseph (Toronto Maple Leafs) and Jim Carey (Boston Bruins). His most recent standout in goal was Graham Melanson (1997-2001),

who finished his career at Wisconsin with school records in wins (81), games played (140), saves (3,850) and minutes (8,179).

## COACHING BACKGROUND

Before joining the UW staff full-time, Howard started the high school hockey program at Madison Memorial and was the Spartans' head coach for 10 years (1967-77). His teams won two state titles and posted a 136-72-1 (.653) record, including a perfect 44-0-0 mark from 1975-77.

## PLAYING DAYS

Howard enjoyed a distinguished career at Colorado College as a goaltender, where he played for Bob Johnson. He lettered two years for the Tigers in 1964-65 and 1965-66 and was the starting goaltender during the '65-66 campaign. Howard, a two-sport athlete at CC, was also a member of the Tiger baseball team.

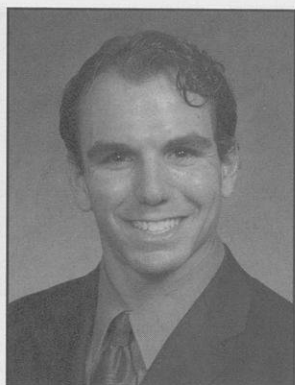

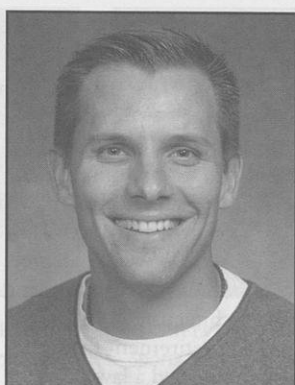
Goodman is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association and is a certified strength and conditioning specialist as well as being a certified USA Weightlifting Club Coach.

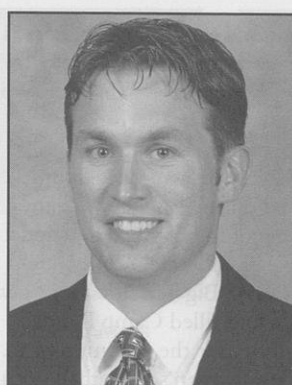

*Video Coordinator*

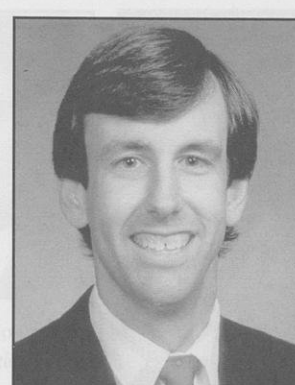

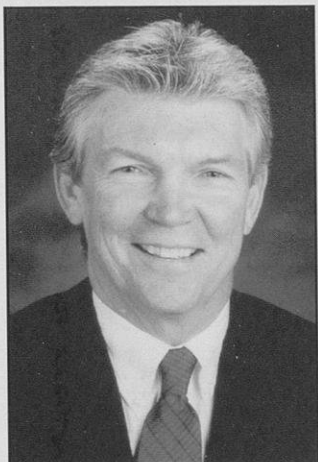
A native of Waupun, Wis., Malnory's duties include the planning and coordinating of all hockey road trips and serving as equipment manager.

# Pat Richter



**PAT RICHTER**, the dean of Big Ten Directors of Athletics, begins his 12th year heading the athletic department at his alma mater.

The former all-star student-athlete not only rescued the Badger athletic department in the early 1990s, but has also charted a plan for a prosperous future in the new millennium.

When Richter accepted then-Chancellor Donna Shalala's offer to run the division in '89, he inherited a \$2.1 million debt, a downtrodden program on the field, subpar facilities and deteriorating fan support.

During his administration, the Badgers have eliminated the red ink on the financial ledgers, won on the playing field, built new facilities, added three new women's sports and made it fashionable to "be a Badger."

The cumulative effect of

Richter's efforts are appreciated in a recent survey conducted by *The Sporting News* which ranked the Badgers as the 10th-best program in the nation.

Every program has flourished during his administration. Some of the highlights include:

- the football team, which has three Big Ten titles, six bowl wins and filled Camp Randall Stadium for the past nine years.

- the men's basketball team, which has played in five NCAA tournaments and three NITs and produced the two winningest teams in school history. In 2000, the Badgers made their second Final Four appearance in history.

- the women's hoops team, which has played in four NCAA tournaments and three NITs.

Three teams -- men's hockey (1989-90), men's crew (1989-90) and men's soccer (1995) -- have won national titles during Richter's tenure.

Richter's own college athletic prowess is well-documented. He earned all-America (1961-62) and academic all-America (1962) honors as a tight end.

Richter led the Big Ten in receiving twice and topped the nation as a junior. As a senior, Richter won the prestigious 1963 Big Ten Medal of Honor.

Richter was recognized for his college gridiron exploits in 1997 with his induction into the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame.

He also earned all-league honors in baseball at UW as a power-hitting first baseman, but the 6-5 center received his scholarship for basketball.

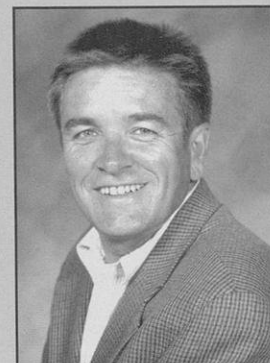
Pat was a first-round draft pick of the Redskins and played professionally from 1963-71. Richter earned his B.S. degree from the UW-Madison in landscape architecture (1964).

Upon retirement from the NFL, he earned a law degree (1971) from UW-Madison. After working at a Madison law firm, he joined Oscar Mayer where he was V.P. of personnel.

Richter was honored with an NCAA Silver Anniversary Award for post-college achievements in 1988. He is a member of the State Athletic and Madison Sports Halls of Fame and the NFL Player Alumni Association.

Pat was enshrined into the UW Athletic Department and Rose Bowl Halls of Fame in '91 and '94, respectively. In 1995, he gained induction into the GTE Academic All-America Hall of Fame. The Sales & Marketing Executives of Madison named Richter their "Executive of the Year" in 1997.

Pat and his wife, Renee, have four sons: Scott (wife Khaki and grandsons J.P. and Cole), Brad (wife Chrissy and grandson Max and granddaughter Samantha), Barry (wife Kim and grandson Blake and granddaughter Alexandra) and Tim.



## Special Assistant to the Chancellor

**DAVID MCDONALD**, the former chair of the UW Athletic Board, serves as a special assistant to the Chancellor for Athletics. In that role, McDonald will oversee some day-to-day operations of the Department of Athletics, including academics and rules compliance.

McDonald, a history professor first appointed to the 22-member UW Board of Athletics in 1994, served as its chairman one year succeeding Jim Hoyt.

McDonald's research and teaching interests are in the history of imperial Russia (1649-1917). He is the author of *United Government and Russian Foreign Policy, 1900-1914* (Harvard University Press, 1992).

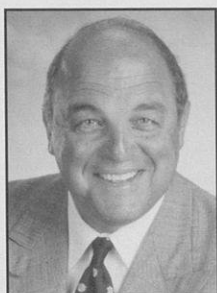

## FINAL RECORD

Wisconsin finished the 2000-01 season with a 22-15-4 record, the 28th 20-win season since 1967-68 for a Badger squad. In the WCHA, the Badgers completed their 32nd season as a member of the league with a 14-10-4 mark and a fifth-place finish.

## THREE OUT OF FOUR

The Badgers were one of 12 teams to participate in the NCAA tournament in 2001, marking the 19th time in school history that a Badger team made the NCAA tourney field. It also marked the third time in the last four years that a Wisconsin team received an NCAA bid.

## AGAINST THE FROZEN FOUR

The 2001 Frozen Four field included WCHA leaguemate North Dakota, Hockey East member Boston College and CCHA representatives Michigan and Michigan State. The Badgers faced all four of those teams during the 2000-01 regular season, accumulating a 1-3-2 mark. Interestingly, the Badgers were 1-0-2 against BC and North Dakota this past season. BC defeated UND 3-2 in overtime to win the 2001 NCAA title.

## WORTHY OPPONENTS

Nineteen of 41 games (46.3 percent) played this past season were against teams ranked in the final *USA Today* / American Hockey Magazine poll. The Badgers played top-ranked Boston College (once), second-ranked North Dakota (twice), third-ranked Michigan State (twice), fourth-ranked Michigan (once), fifth-ranked St. Cloud State (four times), sixth-ranked Colorado College (five times) and ninth-rated Minnesota (four times).

## BEHIND THE BENCH

Jeff Sauer completed his third decade in the collegiate coaching ranks and his 19th year as head coach of the Wisconsin Badgers. The winningest coach in league history is also the first coach to coach 30 seasons in the WCHA. Sauer ended the year ranked fourth on the all-time coaches' win list with 639 wins.

## FINAL RANKINGS

The Badgers finished the year ranked eighth in the final *USA Today* / American Hockey Magazine poll. It marked the third time in the last four seasons that the UW finished among the nation's top eight teams. Wisconsin ended the 1997-98 season ranked sixth and the 1999-2000 campaign fifth in the final polls.

## DOWN THE STRETCH

The Badgers played tough down the stretch, closing the season with an 8-4-3 mark in the last 15 contests, including a five-game win streak from Feb. 24-March 10. The month of February saw the Badgers play six of eight games away from home, including road series at then-third-ranked North Dakota and eighth-ranked Colorado College. The only home series in February was against fourth-ranked St. Cloud State.

In a 12-game string from Jan. 12-Feb. 24, the UW played 10 games against teams ranked in the top 15 in the country with eight games against foes rated in the top 8 in the nation.

## SLIM TO NONE

Twenty-one of the Badgers' 41 games (51.2 percent) this season were decided by one goal or less. Prior to postseason play, Bucky played 14 games the second half of the season and nine were one-goal games or ended in ties. The games on Feb. 24 (at CC) and March 2 (vs. MTU) were both 5-3 games that included empty-net goals by the Badgers to seal victories. (The 1994-95 UW squad played in 21 games decided by a goal or less.)

## WE'RE GOING TO OVERTIME

The 2000-01 team set a Badger record for most consecutive overtime games. The first four games of February all went to overtime, including both games at Alaska Anchorage and at North Dakota. The UW was 1-0-3 in those four games. On the season, Bucky played in nine extra-session games (3-2-4) and at one point during the second half of the season went to overtime in five of seven games from Jan. 13 through Feb. 10. It was the most overtime games in a season for a Badger squad since the 1992-93 team played in 10 games decided in overtime.

## BADGER FANS ARE NO. 1 ... AGAIN

For the third year in a row and the 27th time in school history, Wisconsin fans gave the Badger hockey program the nation's top attendance ranking. Wisconsin drew a total of 229,219 to 20 home dates during the 2000-01 season for an average of 11,461 per contest. The Badgers sat atop the national attendance leaderboard for 24 consecutive years from 1970-93. After moving into the Kohl Center with the start of the 1998-99 campaign, the Badgers have regained the top attendance ranking the last three seasons.

## UPPER DIVISION

Wisconsin went 14-10-4 during the regular season in WCHA play, finishing fifth in the league standings with 32 points. The top-five finish was the 28th for a Badger squad since joining the WCHA for the 1969-70 campaign. It also marked the 17th in head coach Jeff Sauer's 19 years at the UW.

## HEATLEY IS HOBEBY FINALIST

For the second straight year, the Badgers had a representative on the Top-10 finalists list for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award. Dany Heatley was one of just two sophomore forwards among the finalists. During the 1999-2000 season, senior center Steve Reinprecht finished as the runner up for the Hobey, the highest finish ever for a Badger in the Hobey voting.

Wisconsin has had a total of six student-athletes named finalists for the Hobey Baker. In addition to Heatley and Reinprecht, Duane Derksen (1992), Paul Ranheim (1988), Tony Granato (1987) and John Newberry (1982) were all in the running for the nation's best collegiate hockey player in their respective years.

**Graham Melanson** started his last 60 games, setting a UW record. From January 14, 2000 through March 25, 2001, Melanson started every contest for the Badgers.

Eight Badgers established season highs in scoring. **Alex Brooks** (assists and points), **Kent Davyduke** (goals, assists and points, nearly tripled output from sophomore season), **Matt Doman** (goals, assists and points), **Dave Hergert** (points), **Matt Hussey** (goals and points), **Erik Jensen** (doubled goal and point scoring), **Matt Murray** (goals, assists and points), **Andy Wheeler** (doubled goal and point totals).

Freshman **Rene Bourque** really came on down the stretch. The winger from Lac la Biche, Alberta, ended the season with points in seven of his last nine games, including seven goals in that stretch. He scored 7-5=12 of his season total 10-5=15 in the final nine contests.

Rookie defenseman **Dan Boeser** also made his mark in his first year at the collegiate level. Boeser was one of the league's top-scoring first-year defensemen, tallying 4-13=17 and playing in all 41 games for the UW. His four goals were the most in the WCHA for a freshman blueliner.

**Heatley** became just the fourth UW player to reach the 50-goal plateau during his sophomore season. ## MELANSON RE-WRITES RECORD BOOKS

Senior netminder Graham Melanson established new Badger marks during the 2000-01 season for most wins (81), most games played (140), most saves (3,850), most minutes played (8,179) and most shutouts (9). In addition, he leaves tied for the school record with 31 season wins during the 1999-2000 campaign and four shutouts this past season.

He broke WCHA records for games and minutes played and his 81 career wins were just one shy of the league standard set by Ron Grahame of the University of Denver (1969-73). His 8,179 career minutes rank as the second-highest total ever recorded by a goaltender in NCAA ice hockey history.

## DEFENSE WINS GAMES

Nineteen of 22 wins this season came in games where the UW defense held the opponents to three or less goals and when the Badgers were ahead or tied after two periods of play. The UW won twice last season when trailing to start the third period (back-to-back games vs. MSU, Mankato, Oct. 21 and at Boston College, Oct. 27).

## SHOWDOWN CHAMPS

For the seventh time in the 12-year history of the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown, the Badgers won the Pettit Cup with a 3-2 win over Boston University in the championship game. It also marked the seventh time the title game was decided by just one goal. Wisconsin has also won Showdown championships in 1989, 1990, 1991, 1993, 1994 and 1997.

## WHO WON?

The four ties the Badgers earned during the 2000-01 season (22-15-4) are the second-most in school history. Three other UW teams also recorded four ties (1982-83, 1994-95 and 1998-99). The school record is five ties in a season set by both the 1974-75 and 1988-89 teams. In league play, Bucky was 14-10-4, the most ties in WCHA play since the 1994-95 campaign.

## GOING THE DISTANCE

The Badgers finished the year winning three games in overtime (the most of any league counterpart) against WCHA foes -- Oct. 20 vs. MSU, Mankato (W 4-3), Dec. 2 at Minnesota-Duluth (W 4-3) and Feb. 3 at Alaska Anchorage (W 3-2). Conversely, the UW lost just once in overtime to a WCHA opponent -- vs. Colorado College on Nov. 18 (L 4-5).

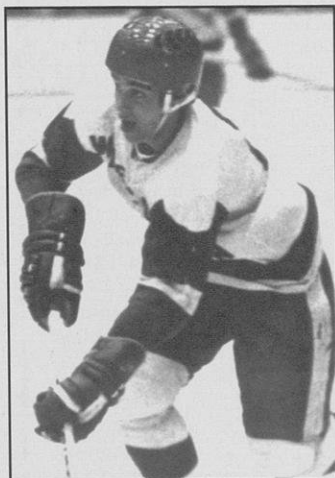

## IN THE BEGINNING ...

While the earliest mention of hockey at the University of Wisconsin was a reference to a hockey club in 1892, it officially became a sport in 1922 after operating on an informal basis since 1914.

Wisconsin, Minnesota and Michigan formed the Western Intercollegiate Hockey League (WIHL) prior to the 1922 season and on Jan. 14, 1922, the Badgers played their first-ever game against the Milwaukee Athletic Club. Despite losing 4-1, the members of that first Wisconsin squad had no idea the tradition they had just started, nor the successes that future Badger hockey teams would enjoy.

Twelve years later, following the 1933 season, hockey was dropped as an intercollegiate sport by the University, mostly due to the depression. Badger teams continued playing in the WIHL until 1935, when the players disbanded.



The 1928-29 Badger hockey team posted an 11-7-2 record under the direction of head coach John Farquhar. They were the winningest team in the pre-modern era of Wisconsin hockey.

## Badger Firsts

### First Game

Jan. 14, 1922 — The Badgers' first game is a 4-1 loss to the Milwaukee Athletic Club.

### First Win

Jan. 20, 1922 — With a 1-0 shutout over visiting Michigan, the first win in UW history is recorded.

### First International Game

Jan. 21, 1927 — The UW loses 7-0 to the University of Manitoba in the first international game played at Wisconsin.

### First 10-win Season

1928-29 — Under head coach John Farquhar, the UW earns its first and only 10-win season of the pre-modern era with an 11-7-2 mark.

### First WCHA Game

Dec. 11, 1964 — In East Lansing, Mich., the Badgers lose 9-2 in their first-ever game against a WCHA opponent.

### First Game As a WCHA Member

Nov. 14, 1969 — Wisconsin defeats North Dakota, 8-4, in Grand Forks to win its first game as a member of the WCHA. The Badgers go on to defeat the Sioux 7-4 in the second game to record their first league sweep.

### First NCAA Tournament Game

March 19, 1970 — Finishing the regular season with a 22-10-0 record, the Badgers earn a spot in the NCAA tourney field and face national powerhouse Cornell in semifinal action, losing 2-1.

### First NCAA Tournament Win

March 21, 1970 — Wisconsin defeats Michigan Tech, 6-5, to finish third at the NCAA tourney.

### First 30-win Season

March 9, 1977 — With a 3-1 win over Colorado College in first-round action of the WCHA tournament, the Badgers won their 30th game of the season securing the school's first 30-win season.

### First Game in Kohl Center

Oct. 3, 1998 — Wisconsin opens the Kohl Center in the College Hockey Hall of Fame Game against Notre Dame.

## In The Spotlight

### Bert DeHate

Feb. 24, 1967 — DeHate pours in five goals in one game against Ohio University in a 15-3 Badger win. He is the first player to have a five-goal game at Wisconsin and one of just three in Badger history to accomplish the feat.

### John Jagger

1969-70 — Jagger became Wisconsin's first all-American. The defenseman helped guide the Badgers to the NCAA tournament and a third-place finish at the championships.

### Mike Eaves

March 25, 1978 — Eaves ends his UW career in Providence at the NCAA championships and leaves as the school's all-time leading scorer with 94-173=267.

### Mark Johnson

March 25, 1978 — Scoring the first goal of the game in the NCAA consolation game vs. Bowling Green in Providence, Johnson notched his 48th goal of the season and became the UW's single season goal-scoring leader (a record which still stands). Johnson also left the UW with the career goal-scoring mark (125).

### Kirk Daubenspeck

March 8, 1997 — In the nets for the longest collegiate game in college hockey history, Daubenspeck makes a school-record 75 saves in the 1-0 four-overtime loss to Colorado College. The game lasts five hours and 24 minutes.

### Jeff Sauer

Jan. 3, 1998 — Head coach Jeff Sauer becomes the winningest coach in WCHA history with his 556th career win (a 5-3 victory at Denver) as a league coach.

### Dany Heatley

June 24, 2000 — Heatley is taken second in the NHL Entry Draft by the Atlanta Thrashers. He becomes the highest-drafted player in UW history.

### Graham Melanson

March 24, 2001 — With a 4-1 win over Providence in the NCAA West Regionals, Melanson wins his school-record 81st game. He leaves with 140 games played, a school and WCHA record.

### COACHING LEGENDS ...

The University of Wisconsin boasts two of college hockey's most successful coaches in the legendary Bob Johnson, who also guided the NHL's Pittsburgh Penguins to a Stanley Cup title in 1991, and current head coach Jeff Sauer. After playing for Johnson at Colorado College and serving as an assistant coach under Johnson both at Colorado College (1966-68) and Wisconsin (1968-71), Sauer succeeded "Badger" Bob at the UW following the 1981-82 season.

Johnson molded the Badger hockey program into one of the nation's elite, guiding his squads to the 1973, 1977 and 1981 NCAA titles. Sauer picked up where Johnson left off when, in his first season as the Badger head coach, Wisconsin won the school's fourth NCAA title (1983). His second national championship came in 1990 when that team posted the second-best record in school history (36-9-1).

This season, Sauer enters his third decade of head coaching at the collegiate level and his 20th season at Wisconsin. He is the WCHA's winningest coach with 639 wins and also ranks fourth all-time with that victory total.

Of the 886 wins in the modern era of UW hockey, Johnson (367) and Sauer (473) have 840 of those victories or 94.8 percent.

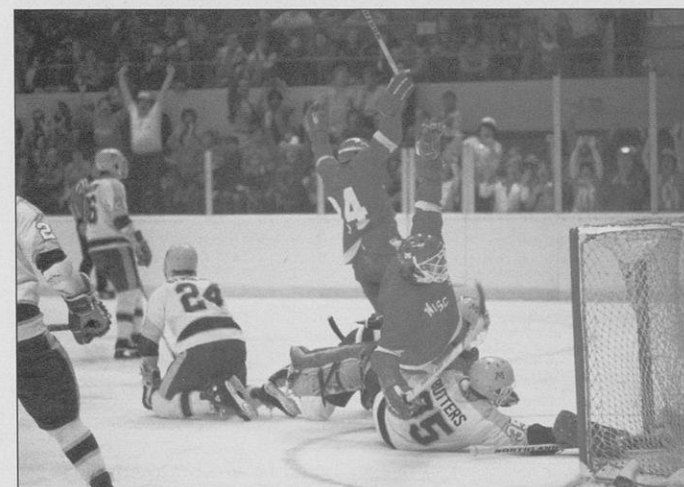

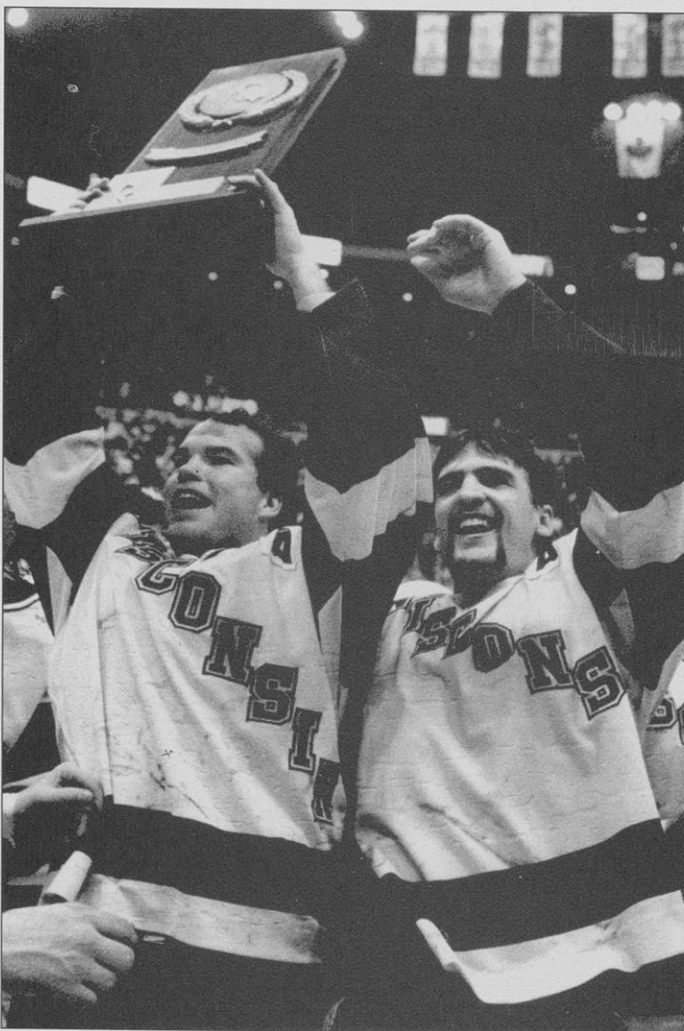

## Unforgettable Moments ...

### March 16, 1973

Wisconsin stuns Cornell, 6-5 in overtime, to advance to the NCAA Championship game against Denver. A goal with five seconds left in regulation by Dean Talafous ties the game and then with 33 seconds left in overtime, Talafous tallies the game-winner.

### February 19, 1977

With a 6-4 win over Minnesota-Duluth, the Badgers win the WCHA regular-season title for the first time and take home the MacNaughton Cup.

### March 26, 1977

Steve Alley culminates the Badgers' finest season with a goal 0:23 into overtime to give the UW a 6-5 win over Michigan for the school's second NCAA title.

### March 28, 1981

For the third time in school history, the Badgers take home the NCAA crown. With a 6-3 win over heavily favored Minnesota, the Badgers defeated the No. 1 teams in the ECAC (Clarkson), CCHA (Northern Michigan) and WCHA (Minnesota) on their way to the title.

### March 26, 1983

In Grand Forks, N.D., the Badgers beat Providence (2-0) and Harvard (6-2) to win the fourth national title for the University of Wisconsin.

### April 1, 1990

Jeff Sauer wins his second NCAA title and guides the Badgers to their fifth national championship at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit. Senior John Byce records a hat trick as the UW downs Colgate 7-3.

### February 25, 2000

For only the third time a Badger team claims the MacNaughton Cup and the WCHA regular-season championship. At Mariucci Arena, the UW wins 4-2 against arch-rival Minnesota to wrap up the league title.

## Showdown Celebrates 13th Year

Its hard to believe that 2001 marks the 13th Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown. Since the inaugural Showdown in December of 1989, the tournament has grown into one of the most successful and highly-attended college tournaments in the nation. Every year Banc One Corporation, the Bradley Center and the University of Wisconsin combine to bring top-rate teams, first-class competition and superb individual talent to Milwaukee for the annual holiday event.

The brainchild of Coach Jeff Sauer, the Showdown has featured defending NCAA champions, Hobey Baker winners and finalists and numerous future NHL stars. Praised by coaches, players and fans as one of the best showcases of college hockey talent in the nation, the tourney has become one of the most successful in the country.

Since 1989, over 330,000 fans have witnessed the December spectacle in Milwaukee, averaging nearly 28,000 fans per year and 14,000 spectators a day.

The Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown is contested at the state-of-the-art, 17,800-seat Bradley Center, which was the site of both the 1993 and 1997 NCAA Hockey Championships and will host its third NCAA Frozen Four in 2006. Considered by many to be the premier hockey facility in the nation, the Bradley Center is located in the heart of downtown Milwaukee.

Wisconsin has enjoyed much success at the Showdown, winning seven of the 12 championships. The Badgers have defeated hockey powers Boston College (1989), North Dakota (1990), Maine (1991), Northern Michigan (1993 and 1997), Bowling Green State (1994) and Boston University (2000) to win titles. Boston University (which has won two Pettit Cups — 1992 and 1995) and New Hampshire (1996) have won the tourney for Hockey East, while Bowling Green State was the first CCHA team to win the Showdown in 1998. At the 1999 event, North Dakota became the first WCHA team other than the Badgers to win the Pettit Cup.

## Showdown 2001

This year's participants include WCHA foe Colorado College, first-time field member Brown University (ECAC) and New Hampshire (HEA). Colorado College and New Hampshire are both making their second appearances at the Showdown. The Tigers and Wildcats played for the 1996 Pettit Cup with UNH defeating CC, 4-3 in the championship game. ECAC representative, Brown, is making its first showing in Milwaukee and is the seventh member of that conference to take part in the Bank One Badger Hockey Showdown. Brown University becomes the 25th different school to make up a Showdown field.

## Top Competition

Strong competition and top-notch fields have been a trademark of the tourney, featuring teams from Alaska to Maine. Consider that ...

- The Showdown has featured the defending NCAA champion four times. Lake Superior State was part of the field in 1994 after winning the NCAA title earlier that year and, in 1996, Boston University entered the tournament as the defending NCAA champion. The Badgers entered the 1990 Showdown as the defending NCAA titlist.
- In addition, the field has included several teams that advanced to the NCAA semifinals in the same year. In 1995, Boston University went on to win the NCAA championship after taking part in the Showdown. The 1996 field included Colorado College, Vermont and New Hampshire, all of which went on to compete in NCAA post-season play. Colorado College and Vermont made it to college hockey's national semifinals that year.
- In 1997, the Bank One Showdown field included Boston College, which went on to play for the national title against Michigan and in 1999, North Dakota defeated the Badgers 3-2 (ot) to win the Showdown championship before ending the season as the NCAA champion. Last season, North Dakota played for the NCAA title, while the Badgers made it into second-round NCAA action.

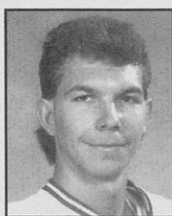

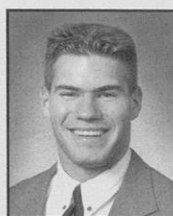

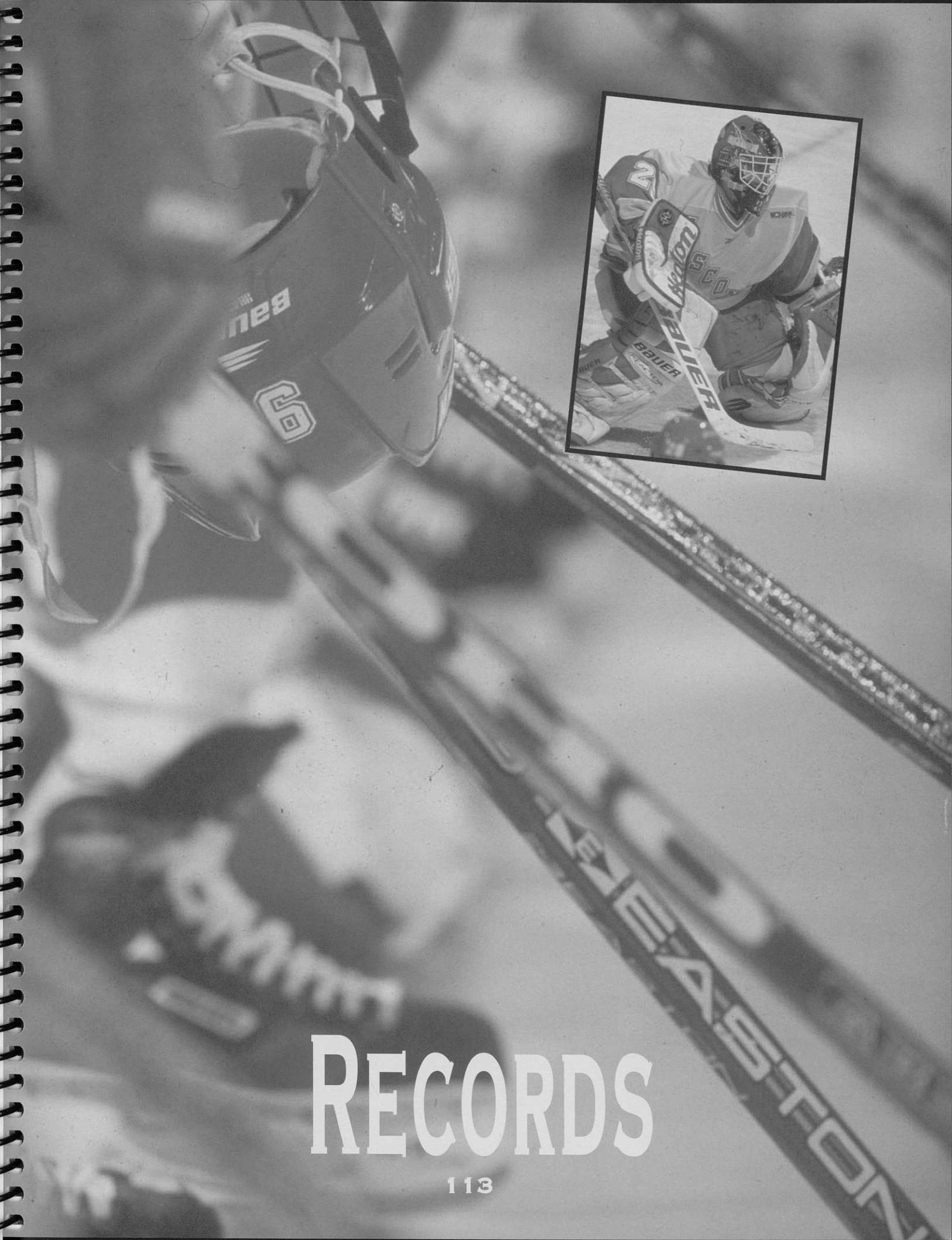

## THE HAT TRICK

There have been 182 hat tricks in UW history, including 154 three-goal, 25 four-goal and three five-goal 'tricks'. Listed below are the last UW players to record a three-, four- or five-goal game.

### Three goals

Dany Heatley scored the most recent Badger hat trick at Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 19, 2000.

### Four goals

Blaine Moore was the last player to score four goals in a game. On March 13, 1993, Moore scored four goals in a 10-3 win over Colorado College in the first round of the WCHA playoffs at the Dane County Coliseum.

### Five goals

Current assistant coach Mark Johnson is one of only three players in UW history to score five goals in one game. On Jan. 27, 1978, Johnson hit the back of the net five times in a 10-2 win over Michigan Tech in Madison. (Bert DeHate, 2/24/67 and Mike Meeker, 10/29/77 previously accomplished the feat.)

### Natural hat trick

Only seven players have notched a natural hat trick. The most-recent Badger to accomplish a pure hat trick Dany Heatley at Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 19, 2000. He scored the first three goals in a 5-0 win by the Badgers.

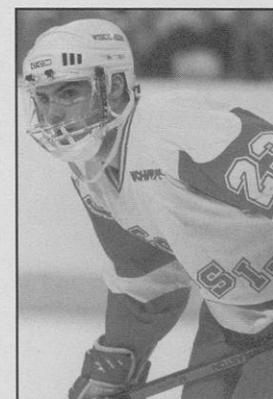
This season, Bernd Bruckler (Graz, Austria) will become the first European-born goaltender to ever play for the Badgers.

# Badger Coverage

## CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials must be placed with the UW Sports Information Office in writing at least one week in advance of the game(s) you wish to cover. Requests should be made by the media agency's sports editor or director and addressed to Julie Kluge, Assistant Sports Information Director, 1440 Monroe Street, Madison, WI 53711. If faxing your credential request, the fax number is (608) 262-8184. Media covering the Badger beat may request credentials for road games through Kluge.

Credentials are issued according to the following guidelines:

- (1). National publications and newspapers filing for the following day's publication.
- (2). All newspapers designated by the visiting sports information director.
- (3). Television and radio stations originating a live broadcast.
- (4). Television and radio stations covering for nightly news.
- (5). All other requests will be evaluated on a space-available basis, with preference given to those who regularly cover Wisconsin hockey.

Spouses, dates, children and other non-workers are not allowed in any of the media areas.

## PHOTOGRAPHERS

Those wishing to photograph UW hockey games should submit requests on your company's letterhead to the UW Sports Information Office and are granted on a priority first-come, first-served basis. Photographers are free to shoot from most locations in the Kohl Center but are reminded to be considerate of patrons. Credentials must be prominently displayed at all times.

Strobes are available for use by photographers and will be granted on a first-come, first-served basis. Cost for strobe use is \$200 per event.

## RADIO ORIGINATIONS

Radio stations wishing to broadcast Badger hockey games should contact the UW Sports Information Office at least one week in advance

The media entrance at the Kohl Center is located on the northeast corner next to Gate A off of Frances Street. The press area in the Kohl Center is in section 208.

## PHONE LINES

All requests for installation of phone lines should be made through Rex Owens, Associate Director of Facilities at the Kohl Center. His phone number is (608) 265-4705. Broadcast locations are assigned by the UW Sports Information Department based on involvement with the co-op line arrangement. If you are not part of the WCHA co-op agreement, you must make your phone line requests (especially if you need ISDN lines) at least two weeks in advance of the game(s).

There are courtesy phone lines made available by the UW Sports Information Office in media room, located ice level in the northeast corner of the Kohl Center.

## CREDENTIAL PICK UP

Upon receipt of applications appropriate credentials are either mailed, made available at the Sports Information Office or left with the parking attendant at the entrance to Lot 91 off of Bedford Street on gamedays. A map showing parking locations is on page 155.

## MEDIA WORKROOM

The Kohl Center features a large media workroom that contains the following:

- post-game interview area
- numerous working locations from which media can file stories
- platform for video cameras
- copy and fax machines
- pre-game dining area
- photo darkrooms
- restrooms

Game programs, line charts, game notes and media guides are available in the workroom.

Media may store personal belongings in the workroom from the time they arrive at the Kohl Center until after the game.

The workroom is located at the northeast corner of the arena at ice level. To access the workroom from outside the arena, enter through the media gate and proceed down the stairs on your right.

## VIDEO SERVICES

Television stations desiring highlights of Badger players should contact Mark King of the UW Video Department in Camp Randall Stadium. His phone is (608) 265-6146.

## SCOUTING TICKETS

Per the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's policy, professional hockey scouts must purchase tickets through the UW Ticket Office at 1-800-GOBADGERS or (608) 262-1440.

## PRACTICE

The Badgers will practice on Sundays this year, both following home weekends and after road trips when the team returns on Saturday nights (Minnesota, MSU, Mankato, St. Cloud State). Mondays will then become the day off during the above-mentioned weekends. Following road trips to Alaska Anchorage, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota-Duluth and North Dakota, the UW will NOT practice on Sunday, but on Monday.

The Wisconsin hockey team has three different practice locations -- the Kohl Center, the Dane County Coliseum and the Dane County Arena. Please call the UW Sports Information Office for specific practice times and sites.

Many times the UW hockey team conducts split practices and most players only participate in one of those practice sessions. If you need to interview a specific player, please call ahead to make sure he will be available.

Typical practice times are from 3-6 p.m., Monday-Wednesday. Thursday practices (during weeks of home games) normally run from 3:15-5 p.m. Practice times are subject to change.

## INTERVIEWING SAUER

Head coach Jeff Sauer will be available for interviews before and after practice sessions, Sunday-Thursday.

Sauer holds a weekly media conference throughout the season. These sessions begin at 1 p.m. and will be held in the "W" Club Room in Camp Randall Stadium through the football season and then will move to the Media Room at the Kohl Center. Audio cuts from this weekly press conference are available on the UW Athletic Department website at UWBADGERS.COM.

On the road, Sauer is available at the Badgers' hotel or following practice sessions.

Those media wishing to conduct a phone interview with Coach Sauer should call the hockey office directly at (608) 262-3932. It is easiest to reach Sauer by phone in the mornings, Mondays through Wednesdays.

## PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Badger players are available for interviews AFTER practices (except on gamedays). Practices are usually held from 3-5:30/6 p.m. regardless of site.

## 2001-02 MAJOR RULE CHANGES

**Rule 1:** Face-off diagram altered to include imaginary line between end-zone face-off dots.

**2-2-b:** Players to dress in game jerseys during warm up.

**2-3-a:** Penalty for starting with less than two goaltenders changed to forfeiture (score recorded as 1-0).

**2-3-a:** Rules committee as sole arbitrator of extenuating circumstances for two goaltender rule.

**2-5-b:** Line changes limited to five seconds. If there is an undue delay by either team in changing lines, the referee shall order the offending team or teams to take their positions immediately and shall not permit a line change.

**2-6-d:** Injured penalized player allowed to return to box. An injured penalized player who has been substituted for on the penalty bench may not return to play until the penalty has expired. However, if the injured penalized player is ready to return to the game, he play may take the substitute players' place on the penalty bench during a stoppage of play. The substitute player becomes eligible to participate in the game.

**3-5-b:** Jewelry not allowed, except for religious or medical medals, which shall be taped to the body under the uniform. The penalty is a misconduct.

**5-4-a (note):** Assistant referees' duties clarified. The prime responsibility to call penalties resides with the referee. It is expected that assistant referees will call major penalties, minor penalties behind the play, and flagrant minor penalties (not observed by the referee), particularly those that deny a scoring opportunity or could lead to injury or an altercation, regardless of where they occur on the ice surface.

**5-10:** Instant replay official must be in the rink proper and have a clear view of ice surface.

**6-9-d:** Displacing goal post to prevent a goal penalized by penalty shot / optional minor.

**6-10:** Diving penalty changed to minor infraction. A player shall not attempt to draw a penalty by their actions ("diving").

**6-13-d:** Players must take a stationary position before the puck is dropped.

**6-13-n:** Face-off due to official's error may be changed if it unduly penalizes one team. If an on-ice official mistakenly stops play, the face-off shall be at center ice unless, in the opinion of the official, the center ice face-off would unduly penalize either team.

**6-26:** Penalty for instigating added. When an altercation results in penalties on both teams and, in the opinion of the official, one player instigates the altercation, that player shall receive an additional penalty for instigating.

**6-48:** No more than five pucks and six players allowed on ice during time outs.

**7-1:** Added 12- or 15-minute mark to intermission section and that the official will signal the timer to start the clock.

**7-2-a:** Clarified warm-up procedure. Both teams must warm up. Only two goal cages are permitted on the ice during the pre-game warm-up period.



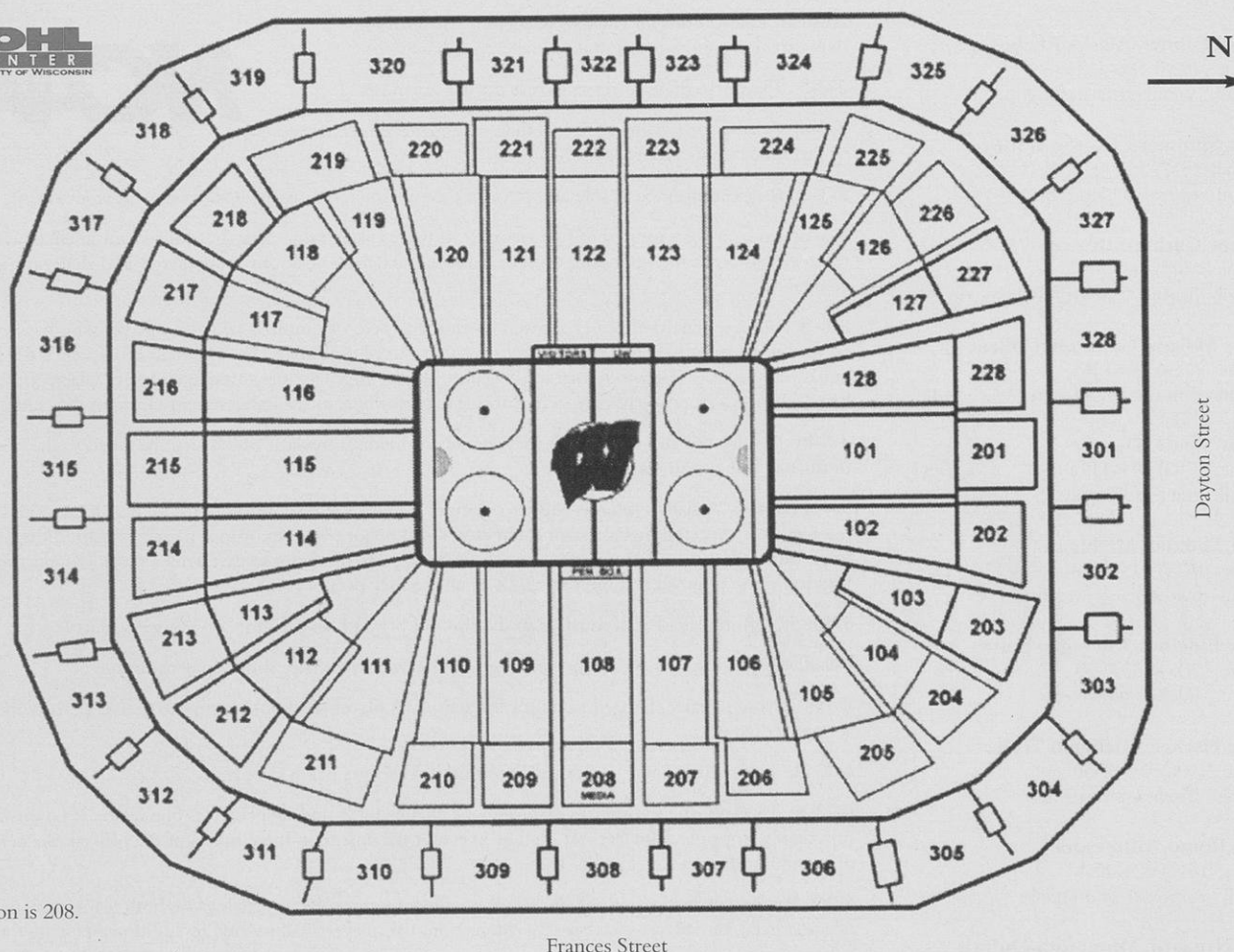
### Points of Emphasis

The "Points of Emphasis" section calls attention to certain areas of the game that the NCAA Men's and Women's Ice Hockey Rules Committee believes must be improved, not through additional rules but by a stronger emphasis on existing rules.

This year the rules committee requests that players, officials and coaches concentrate on the following areas:

1. Obstruction
2. Intent to Injure
3. Diving
4. Speeding up the Game

## KOHL CENTER FACTS

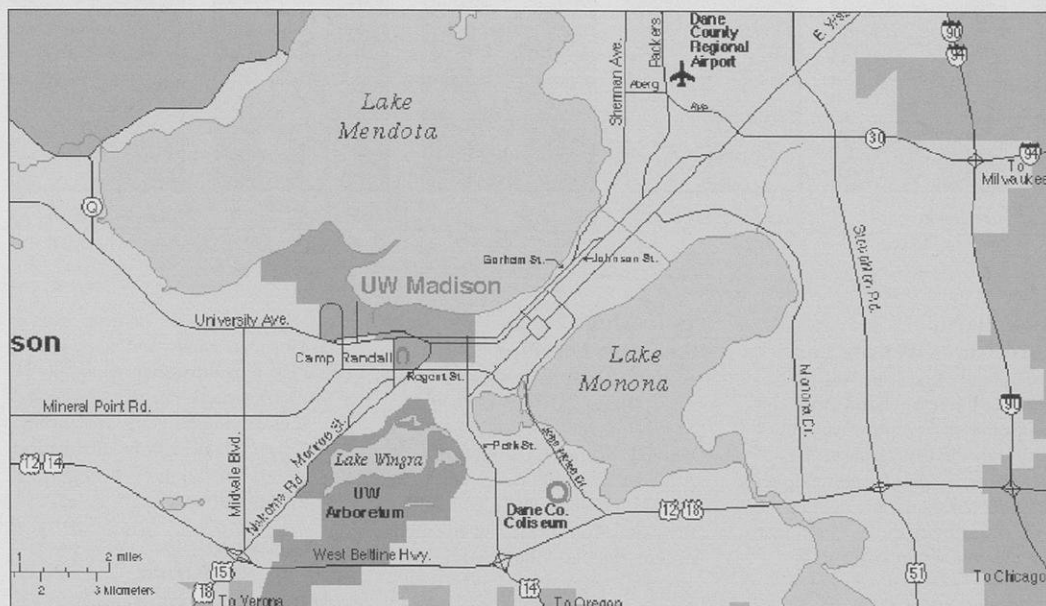
- The building is named for U.S. Senator Herb Kohl (D-Wisconsin), a 1956 graduate of the University of Wisconsin (B.S. in American Institutions), who donated \$25 million to the project. His gift is the single-largest private donation in UW history. In addition, former UW basketball player Albert "Ab" Nicholas and his wife, Nancy Johnson Nicholas, pledged \$10 million toward the building of the Kohl Center. Nicholas received both his B.S. and M.B.A. degrees from Wisconsin. The facility's practice gymnasium is named the Nicholas-Johnson Pavilion. The Kellner family -- Jack F. and his sons, Ted and Jack W. -- of Milwaukee gave \$2.5 million. All three Kellners received degrees from the UW-Madison.
- The 40,000 cubic yards of concrete used in constructing the Kohl Center could build a sidewalk from Madison to Chicago.
- Eleven miles of coolant pipe is embedded in the hockey floor.
- It would take 1,351,990,520 hockey pucks to fill the Kohl Center.
- The total cost of the Kohl Center was \$76 million with \$49 million raised from private donations.
- The seating capacity for hockey games is 15,237. For basketball, the Kohl Center seats 17,142.

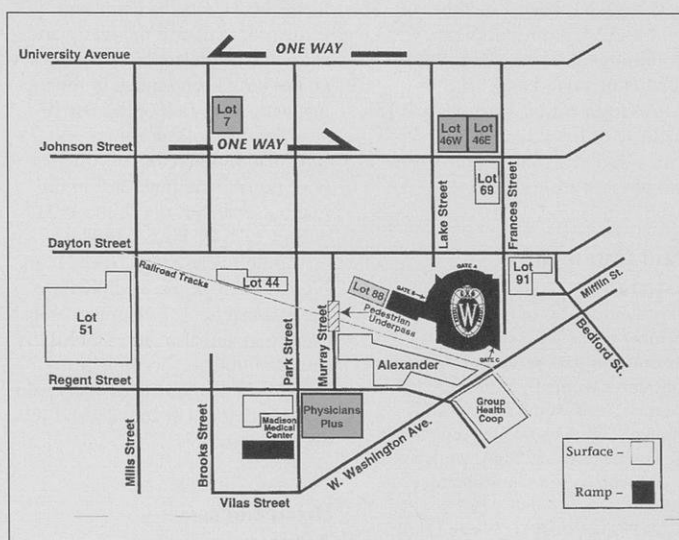

## Directions to the Kohl Center

### From the Dane County Airport

- Exit airport via International Lane to Packers Avenue (Hwy. 113). Turn left on Packers Avenue, which changes to Pennsylvania Avenue, Johnson Street, Gorham Street and then University Avenue. Stay on University Avenue through the campus until you reach Frances Street. Turn left onto Frances Street and proceed two blocks to Dayton Street. The Kohl Center will now be in view.

### From West I-90/94

#### (from Minneapolis)

- Take I-90/94 to Highway 151 South (East Washington Ave.). Continue on East Washington to the State Capitol Building. Turn right onto Butler Street, proceed to Gorham Street and turn left. Continue on Gorham Street which becomes University Avenue. Stay on University Avenue into campus until you reach Frances Street. Turn left onto Frances Street and proceed two blocks to Dayton Street. The Kohl Center will now be in view.

### From South and I-90

#### (from Chicago)

- Take I-90 to the Madison beltline (Highway 12/18). West on the beltline to Park Street (Hwy. 151). Exit right (north). Turn right onto Dayton Street, then approximately three blocks to the Kohl Center, which will be on the right.

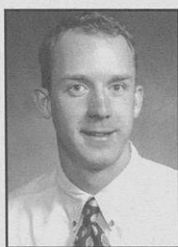

## BADGERS ON FOX SPORTS

Fox Sports Net, which bought out Midwest Sports Channel a year ago, reaches over 74 million homes through its 21 regional sports channels, serving as the first truly nationwide, regional and local supplier of sports programming. Fox Sports Net provides sports fans with an extensive line-up of live MLB, NBA and NHL action as well as continued home team coverage from the collegiate and scholastic levels. Today, Fox Sports Net regional networks serve as the cable television home to 69 of 79 MLB, NBA and NHL teams based in the United States and produces over 4,000 live events annually. Fox Sports Net is a service of National Sports Partners, an equal partnership between Cable-vision's Rainbow Media Holdings, Inc. and FOX.

Paul Braun (play-by-play) and John Johansson (color) enter their fourth year teaming up to call Badger hockey action. Braun has been doing UW hockey play by play for over 25 years, and has been behind the mike for four of the five Wisconsin NCAA hockey championships. Along with Jim Santulli, WHA-TV's Assistant Director of Radio and TV, he helped start the statewide tape-delayed telecast of Badger hockey in 1973-74. Braun has called action for both radio and television hockey broadcasts as well as being the play-by-play announcer for WHA-TV for delayed telecasts for both UW football and basketball.

Johansson, a native of Rochester, Minn., played center at Wisconsin and was a four-year letter-winner from 1980-84. He was a member of three straight (1981-82-83) Frozen Four teams, including NCAA Championship teams in 1981 and 1983. He holds the UW record for consecutive games played (171), scoring 64-112=176. He is the only Badger to be named to the NCAA Division I all-Academic team (1984).

After being drafted by the New Jersey Devils in 1981 and following a short stint in the NHL, Johansson returned to the Twin Cities. Since college he has been involved in real estate development and is currently employed by Welsh Companies, Inc. out of Minneapolis as the Vice President of Retail.

## BADGERS ON WISCONSIN PUBLIC TELEVISION

Wisconsin Public Television is nearing the end of its third decade of airing UW hockey games. Entering its 29th year, WPT has provided delayed broadcast coverage of most UW home games across the state of Wisconsin on its seven-station network. In addition to its on-ice coverage, WHA-TV created the 7th-Man Award in 1980, which is voted on by the viewers and given to a UW hockey player each year. The award was re-named the WHA-TV Jim Santulli 7th-Man Award in 1997 in honor of the late producer who initiated Badger hockey broadcasts on WHA.

WPT's on-air team features veteran radio announcer Brian Posick and former UW defenseman Rob Andringa. Posick, the sports director at WIBA-Radio, is in his 11th year at the radio station. He brings a broad scope of sports announcing experience to the broadcast, producing and hosting both the Badger football pre- and post-game shows and calling the action for the Badger women's basketball team. Posick anchors the morning sportscasts on WIBA as well as on sister-station ESPN Radio (1070 AM).

Andringa enters his sixth season as the color analyst for WPT. He was a four-year letterwinner for the Badgers (1987-91) and a member of the 1990 NCAA Championship team. A member of the NCAA all-tournament team in that championship season, Andringa played in a school-record 179 games for the UW. Currently he is an investment executive with Dain Rauscher.

Exclusive radio coverage of Wisconsin hockey is heard on WIBA (1310 AM).

The team features long-time Madison radio personality Michael Bahr who is currently the morning host on WIBA. Bahr has been at the station since 1988 and starts his fourth season calling the action for UW hockey. He has also anchored WIBA's extensive pre- and post-game coverage of Badger football.

The University of Minnesota graduate majored in communication arts. Prior to coming to Madison, he served as sports director for Phillips Broadcasting in the Menomonie-Eau Claire market.

Entering his 24th year covering the UW hockey team is Bill Brophy. The 2001-02 season marks Brophy's 12th as the color analyst on Badger radio broadcasts. He has also called UW hockey action for WTSO (1990-95) and for the Wisconsin Radio Network (1995-96).

Brophy is the former sports editor of the Wisconsin State Journal, a position he held from 1984-96. He is currently the Communications Director for the Diocese of Madison. Brophy has covered the Western Collegiate Hockey Association for 25 years.

WIBA carries all home and away Badger hockey games, including all postseason contests. UW head coach Jeff Sauer will also have a weekly one-hour show on WIBA and will be featured on weekly morning conversations with Bahr during his morning show.

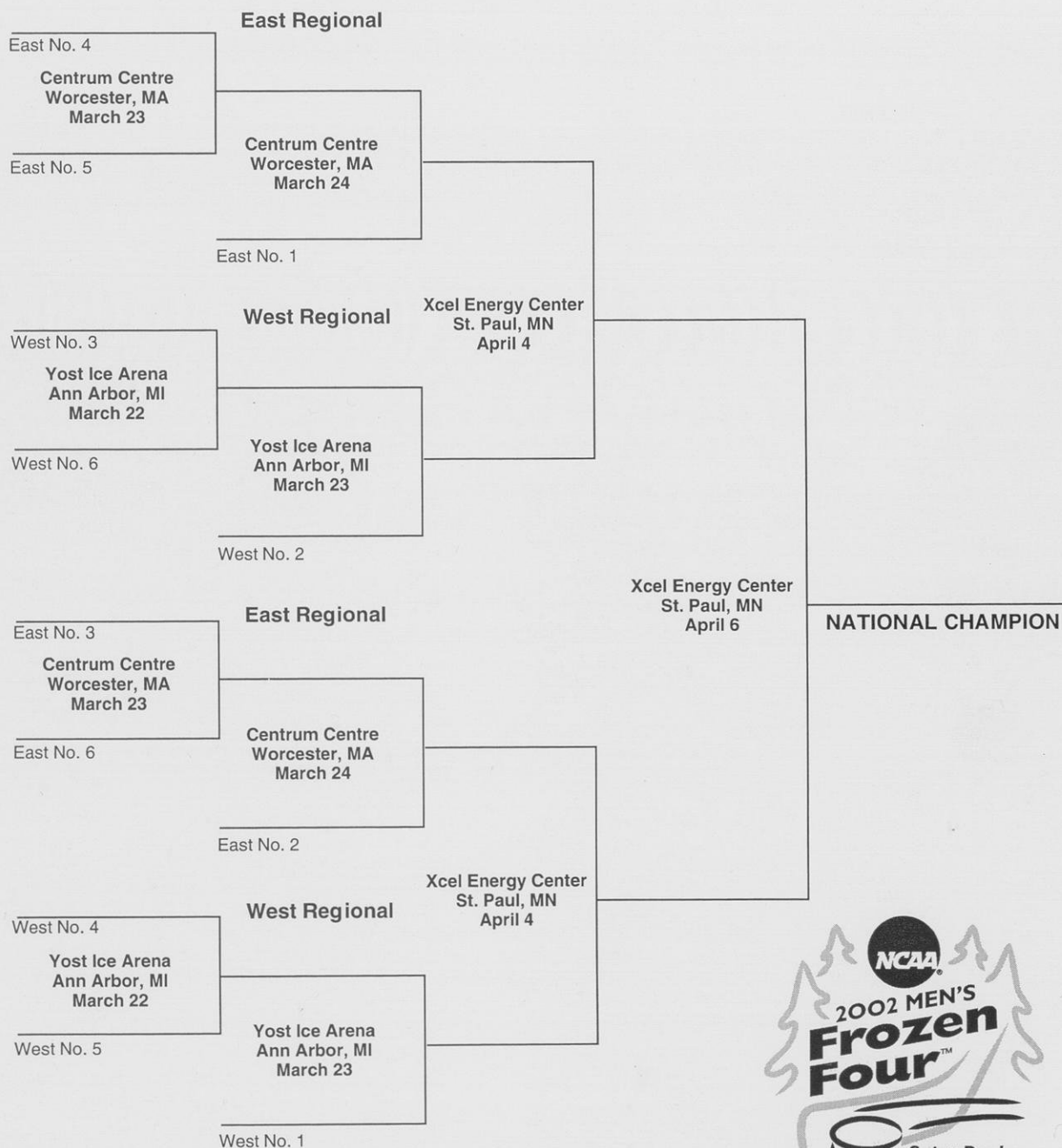

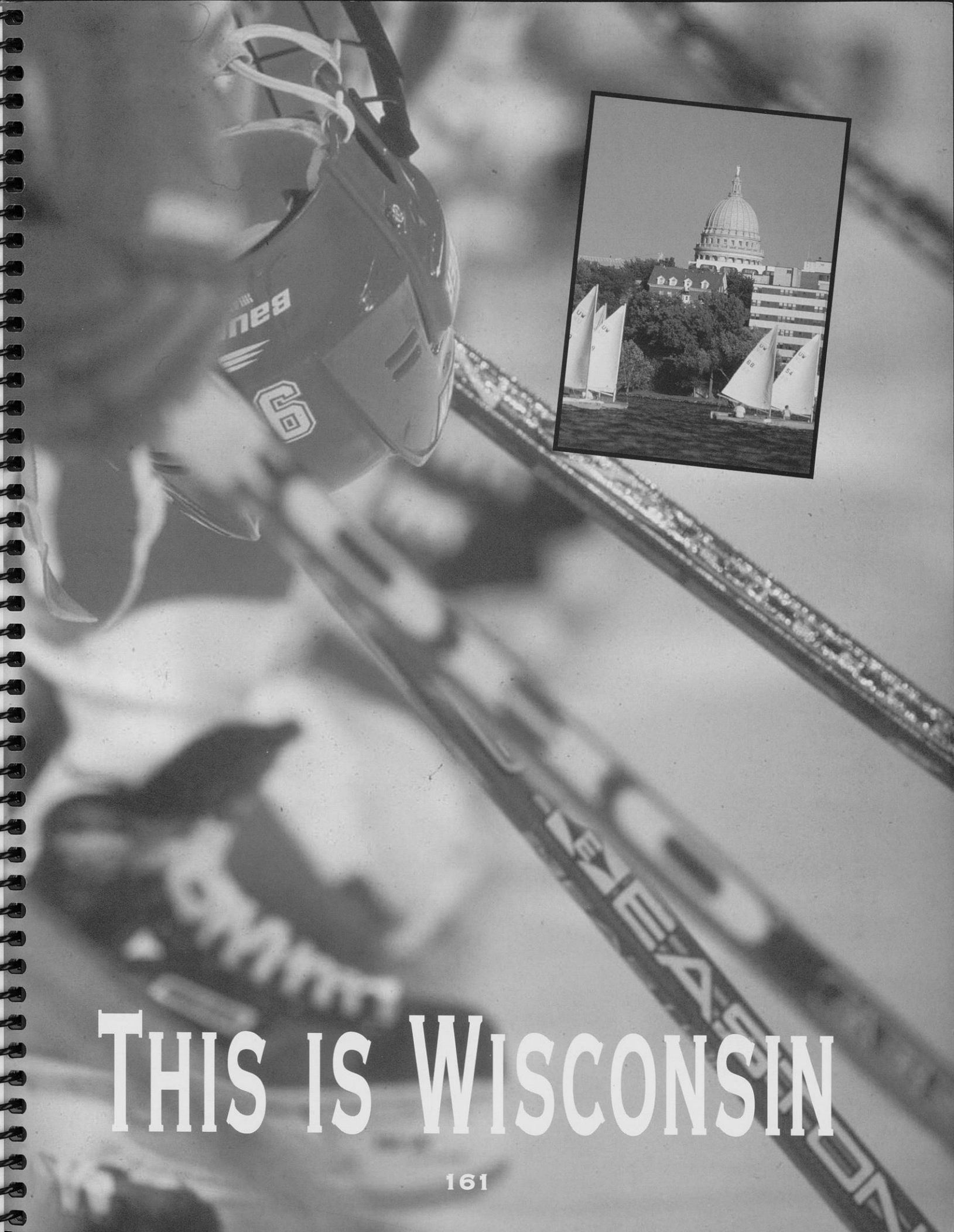

**F**or the fourth consecutive year, the University of Wisconsin was named the eighth-best public university in the 2002 "America's Best Colleges" guidebook published by *U.S. News & World Report*.

Some individual UW-Madison schools which were ranked included the School of Business and the School of Engineering, both ranking 12th. Within the business school, its insurance/risk management program ranked fourth, while the engineering school's chemical and nuclear engineering programs were fourth. Other rankings include ...

- In the 2000 *U.S. News & World Report's* college rankings, Wisconsin's sociology, women's history and speech pathology departments were rated No.1 in the nation. Educational psychology (second), education (third), nuclear engineering (third), chemical engineering (fourth) and veterinary medicine (ninth) were rated among the country's 10 best.

- *Money* magazine ranked the UW-Madison fourth in academic reputation among public universities. Wisconsin tied with UCLA in fourth place, behind Cal-Berkeley, Michigan and Virginia.

- UW Hospitals & Clinics is among the leading transplant centers in the nation. *U.S. News & World Report* has ranked the hospital among the top three percent in the U.S.

- UW-Madison has produced 17 Nobel Prize winners and 23 Pulitzer Prize winners. Additionally, 10 faculty members have received National Medals of Science.

- The Wisconsin Alumni Association, the second-largest independently financed group in the United States, has a network of 125 chapters around the world helping to serve more than 330,000 alumni.

- The UW-Madison is a city within a city, maintaining its own police force, food service, maintenance staff and hospital -- not to mention a dairy plant and store. In addition to 2,200 faculty members, there are over 5,000 classified staff and 5,400 academic staff.

- At any one time, about 9,500 research projects are being conducted at the University.

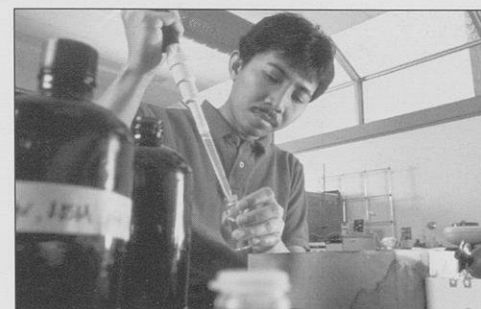

Bascom Hall is the university's main administrative building and serves as the centerpiece of the campus. It sits atop Bascom Hill, exactly one mile west, along historic State Street, of the State Capitol

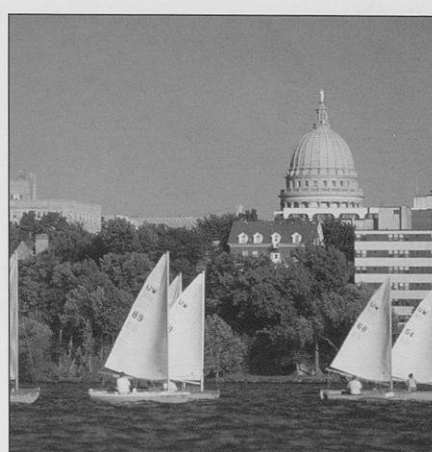
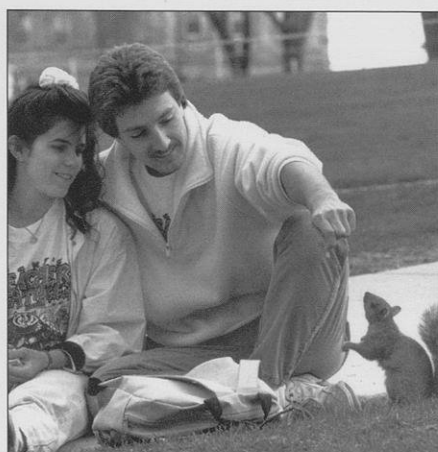
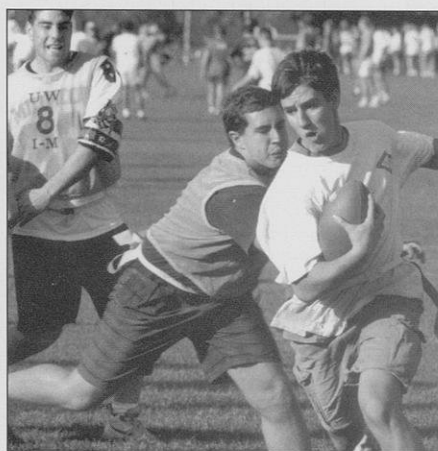
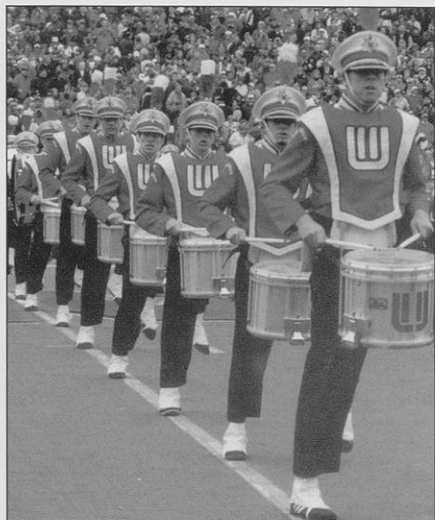
Points of interest on campus include North Hall, the first building on campus; Carillon Tower in front of the Social Science Building; the Library Mall with its clock tower and fountain; Picnic Point, a peninsula of woods, trails and beaches that jut out into Lake Mendota; Science Hall and the Armory-Gymnasium on Langdon Street, both of which are Historic Landmarks; and the Memorial Union, whose lakefront terrace offers a popular meeting place for students and community members. South of campus and along the shores of Lake Wingra lies the UW Arboretum, which features natural and restored samples of Wisconsin plant and animal life.

Before the city of Madison existed, UW-Madison's lakeshore site was an Indian encampment. Indian effigy mounds -- many in the shape of animals -- are still evident around the campus.

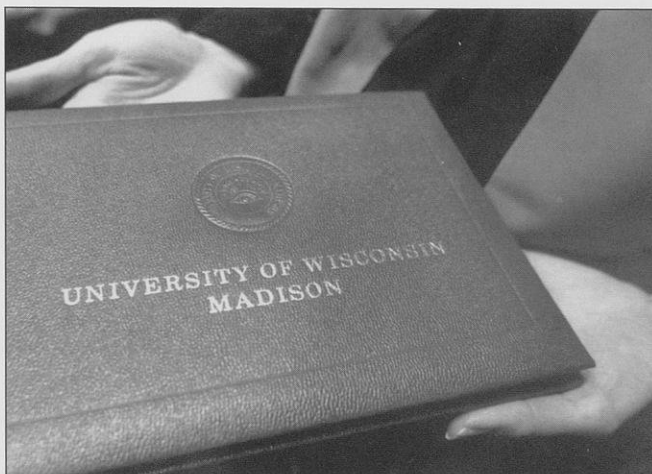
## The Sears Director's Cup

John D. Wiley

UW Chancellor John Wiley

John D. Wiley, chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Madison, is the 27th leader of the university. He assumed office Jan. 1, 2001.

From 1994-2000, Wiley served as the university's provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. From 1989-94, Wiley was dean of the UW-Madison Graduate School and the university's senior research officer. From 1986-89, he served as associate dean for research in the College of Engineering.

In his campus-level positions, Wiley has represented the institution for a variety of external constituencies, including alumni groups, the boards of trustees of university-affiliated foundations and other organizations, domestic and international inter-university cooperatives, chambers of commerce and service clubs, the state legislature and governmental bodies, the UW System Administration, and the UW System Board of Regents.

He also has been deeply involved in fundraising from individual and corporate donors, and charitable foundations.

As provost, Wiley was chief operating officer and deputy chancellor, working closely with deans, faculty, academic staff and student committees in the exercise of shared governance and the overall management of the institution. As graduate school dean, Wiley oversaw all aspects of graduate study, grant submission, agency liaison, research infrastructure and centers, and technology transfer.

Wiley received his bachelor's degree in physics from Indiana University in 1964; attended graduate school at UW-Madison as an NSF Fellow and received master's and doctoral degrees in physics in 1965 and 1968, respectively. He joined the technical staff of Bell Telephone Laboratories at Murray Hill, N.J., from 1968 to 1974 and then spent a year at the Max Planck Institute in Stuttgart, Germany as an awardee of the Alexander von Humboldt Senior U.S. Service Award for Research and Training.

Wiley joined the UW-Madison faculty in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering in

August 1975. His research and teaching focused on a variety of topics related to semiconductors and other materials and processes important to the electronics field. He is a co-founder of several highly successful research centers, including the Center for X-ray Lithography and the Engineering Research Center for Plasma-Aided Manufacturing.

From 1982 to 1986, he chaired the Materials Science Program, a graduate-level, interdepartmental-committee program for master's and doctoral degrees.

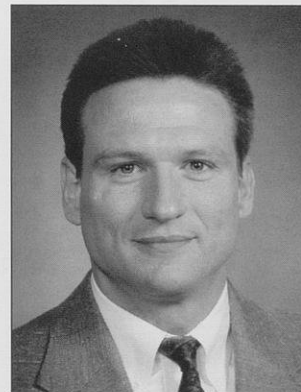
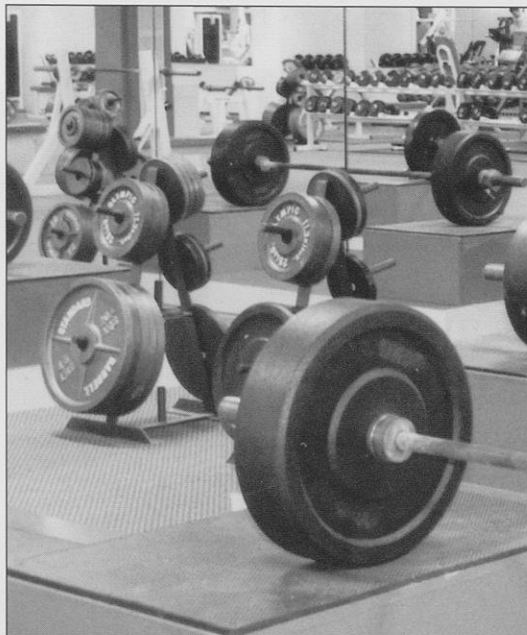
## Strength & Conditioning

**T**he Badger hockey team has one of the best strength and conditioning programs in the country guiding them both in and out of season. The program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete. Throughout the year, UW athletes spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their game.

During the off-season, hockey players work on strength improvement, speed, power, agility and conditioning. The in-season program is devoted to the continuation of strength gains and performance-related conditioning.

When athletes appear on campus, measures of body composition, plus weight and frame size are recorded. With this information, personalized workout plans are established for each individual player.

The fully-equipped McClain weight room recently added on an \$80,000 Sports Impact rubber floor to help provide better traction and support for athletes when lifting.

## The Fetzer Academic Learning Center

**T**he Fetzer Center opened in the Spring of '97 to aid Badger student-athletes in the pursuit of their scholastic goals. The fully-equipped facility includes study rooms, a computer workroom equipped with 22 computers, a 55-seat auditorium, conference rooms and offices for the academic affairs staff.

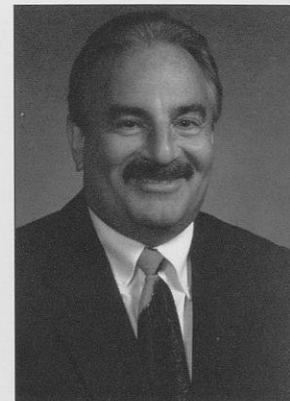
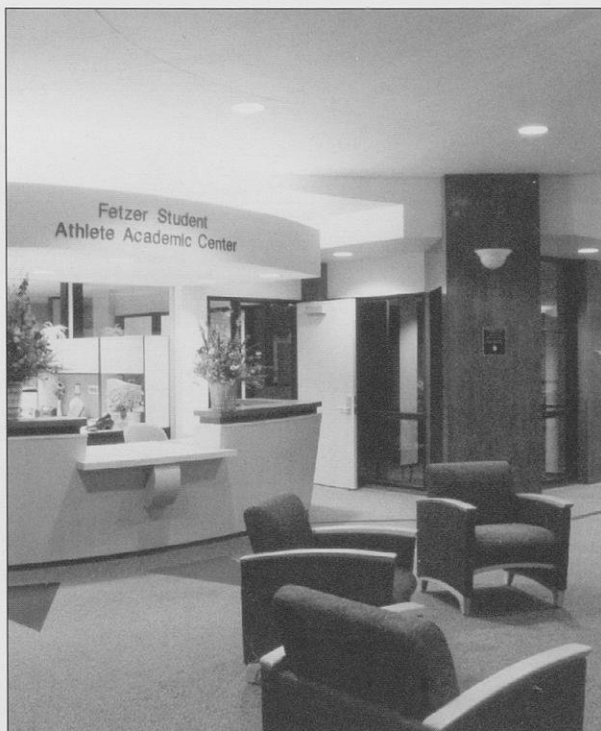
The primary objective of the student affairs office is to ensure the academic success of all UW student-athletes.

The academic and student affairs staff assists the Badgers' 700 student-athletes in registration and course selection, monitoring progress toward degrees and career guidance.

Staff members work with student-athletes who desire extra academic help. The department utilizes the services of more than 100 tutors to provide one-on-one academic assistance or group tutoring.

The department arranges for exam proctoring, offers advice on resume preparation and sponsors an annual career fair.

The \$1.6 million Fetzer Center, located in the McClain Facility, aids student-athletes in achieving academic success.

## The UW Athletic Training Staff

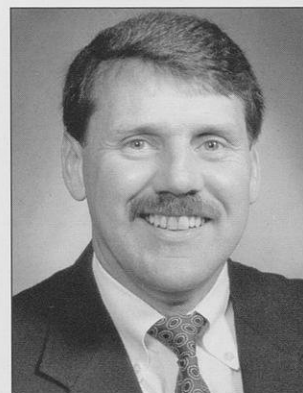
**T**he Wisconsin Sports Medicine program features state-of-the-art facilities and the outstanding services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals. The UW Sports Medicine staff, headed by Dennis Helwig, employs seven full-time certified athletic trainers, three graduate assistants and one part-time athletic trainer/physical therapist.

The UW Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provides dietary analyses, measures physiological capacity and outlines programs to improve an athlete's flexibility.

The UW is one of a handful of schools in the nation with an on-site X-ray machine, enabling physicians to quickly and thoroughly evaluate injuries and prescribe treatment and rehabilitation.

Athletic trainers and physicians work together to design rehabilitation programs for injured athletes. A variety of facilities and equipment, including a rehabilitation swimming pool, Cybex equipment, an Impulse Inertial Exercise System, Stairmasters and Fitron Bicycles, help athletes rehabilitate injuries and minimize loss of fitness during recuperative time.

The University also has a sports nutritionist dedicated to ensuring that student-athletes meet their dietary and nutritional needs.
