WISCONSIN PLAYS ALL ITS HOME GAMES AND WILL HOST ONE OF THE TWO WCHA PLAYOFF SERIES MARCH 11-12-13 AT THE SPACIOUS DANE COUNTY MEMORIAL COLISEUM. THE COLISEUM'S 7,883 FIXED SEATS NOT ONLY GIVE WISCONSIN THE LARGEST FACILITY IN THE BIG TEN AND WCHA, BUT ALSO THE MOST COMFORTABLE--THE SEATS ARE UPHOLSTERED, SELF-RISING THEATER TYPE. THE COLISEUM'S ICE SURFACE IS 85 FEET BY 200 FEET.

THE BADGERS DREW 86,465 SPECTATORS TO 13 HOME GAMES IN 1969-70, SECOND ONLY TO DENVER, WHICH DREW 86,888 FOR 18 HOME DATES. WISCONSIN LED COLLEGIATE HOCKEY IN AVERAGE ATTENDANCE FOR HOME GAMES--6,651. THE BADGERS PLAYED BEFORE 156,993 SPECTATORS FOR 34 DATES, HOME AND AWAY, INCLUDING THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT AT ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN; THE ST. LOUIS HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT; THE WCHA PLAYOFFS AT DENVER; AND THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT LAKE PLACID, NEW YORK. WISCONSIN'S OVERALL ATTENDANCE FOR SEVEN SEASONS AND 113 HOME GAMES IS 295,421 FOR AN AVERAGE OF 2,611.

REVIEW OF THE 1969-70 HOCKEY SEASON

WISCONSIN'S SEVENTH SEASON OF INTERCOLLEGIATE HOCKEY WAS A TREMENDOUSLY SATISFYING ONE--ON BOTH TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL LEVELS. THE BADGERS SHOCKED COLLEGIATE HOCKEY AGAIN AND AGAIN BY FIRST FINISHING FOURTH IN THE TOUGH WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION-- ALL OTHER FIRST YEAR TEAMS FINISHED LAST--THEN WINNING THE WCHA WESTERN SECTIONAL AT DENVER BY DEFEATING DENVER, 3-2, AND FINALLY FINISHING THIRD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT AT LAKE PLACID, NEW YORK.

THE BADGERS STARTED OUT FAST, WINNING ITS FIRST THREE WCHA GAMES ON THE ROAD FOR AN EARLY LEAGUE LEAD. BUT WISCONSIN'S ONLY SLUMP OF THE SEASON--A FIVE GAME LEAGUE LOSING STREAK--DROPPED THE BADGERS ALL THE WAY TO EIGHTH. THE BADGERS INTERRUPTED THEIR SLUMP LONG ENOUGH TO WIN THE THIRD ANNUAL BIG TEN TOURNAMENT AT ANN ARBOR AND THE ST. LOUIS HOLIDAY TOURNAMENT. DEFENSEMAN JOHN JAGGER WAS NAMED MOST VALUABLE PLAYER AT ANN ARBOR AND JOINED GOALTENDER WAYNE THOMAS AND CENTER JIM BOYD ON THE ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM.

THE TURNING POINT OF THE SEASON, ACCORDING TO COACH BOB JOHNSON, CAME IN EARLY JANUARY WHEN THE BADGERS SPLIT A PAIR OF 3-2, OVERTIME DECISIONS WITH MICHIGAN TECH IN MADISON. IT WAS IN THIS SERIES THAT THE WISCONSIN DEFENSE CAME OF AGE AND THOMAS BEGAN HIS TRULY PHENOMENAL PLAY IN GOAL.

THE BADGERS WON NINE OF THEIR FINAL 14 LEAGUE GAMES, INCLUDING A 5-4 DECISION AT DULUTH IN WHICH THOMAS WAS INCREDIBLE; A 10-1 ROUT OF MINNESOTA IN WHICH MURRAY HEATLEY SCORED FOUR GOALS AND JIM YOUNG THREE; AND BACK TO BACK SHUTOUTS BY BOB VROMAN AT MINNESOTA AND THOMAS AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE.

TWO GOALS BY HEATLEY, ONE BY JIM BOYD, AND THE TRULY GREAT GOALTENDING OF THOMAS DEFEATED DENVER IN THE WCHA WESTERN SECTIONAL TO GIVE WISCONSIN ITS FIRST TICKET TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT. CORNELL, THE EVENTUAL CHAMPION, ENDED THE BADGERS DREAM OF AN NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP WITH A 2-1 DEFEAT. BUT THE BADGERS, WITH BOB POFFENROTH SETTING AN NCAA TOURNAMENT RECORD OF FIVE ASSISTS--FOUR ON GOALS BY HEATLEY--EDGED MICHIGAN TECH, 6-5, FOR A PROUD THIRD PLACE FINISH.

POFFENROTH ENDED A GREAT CAREER BY BEING NAMED TO THE NCAA ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM; JAGGER BECAME WISCONSIN'S FIRST HOCKEY ALL-AMERICAN; THOMAS WAS NAMED MOST VALUABLE BY HIS TEAMMATES; VROMAN RECEIVED THE IVAN B. WILLIAMSON AWARD FOR SPORTSMANSHIP, SCHOLARSHIP, AND PROFICIENCY; JEFF ROTSCH WAS CHOSEN THE BADGERS' MOST IMPROVED PLAYER; AND JIM BOYD WAS NAMED CAPTAIN FOR 1970-71.

ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON
WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

NOT EVEN WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH BOB JOHNSON WOULD HAVE PREDICTED A THIRD PLACE FINISH IN THE 1970 NCAA HOCKEY TOURNAMENT FOR HIS BADGERS. BUT IN JUST FOUR YEARS IN MADISON, BY INFUSING HIS UNBOUNDING ENTHUSIASM INTO THE UNIVERSITY HOCKEY PROGRAM AS WELL AS AT ALL LEVELS OF THE SPORT THROUGHOUT THE STATE, JOHNSON HAS MADE BELIEVERS OUT OF THE WISCONSIN HOCKEY COMMUNITY.

IN FOUR YEARS UNDER JOHNSON, THE BADGERS HAVE NEVER HAD A LOSING SEASON. WISCONSIN HAS WON AT LEAST 20 GAMES FOR THREE STRAIGHT YEARS, AND HAS COMPILED AN 82-41-2 RECORD FOR A .667 PERCENTAGE. LAST SEASON, WISCONSIN'S HOCKEY PROGRAM REACHED NEW HEIGHTS AS THE BADGERS FINISHED SECOND IN THE BIG TEN; FOURTH IN THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION AS A FIRST YEAR TEAM (ALL OTHER FIRST-YEAR TEAMS HAVE FINISHED LAST); WON THE BIG TEN AND ST. LOUIS TOURNAMENTS; UPENDED DENVER, 3-2, TO WIN THE WCHA WESTERN SECTIONAL AT DENVER; AND FINISHED THIRD IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT IN LAKE PLACID, NEW YORK.

JOHNSON, 39, A NATIVE OF MINNEAPOLIS, HAS HAD A SUCCESSFUL ATHLETIC BACKGROUND--BOTH AS A COMPETITOR AND AS A COACH.

HE WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN HIS SENIOR YEAR IN THE LATE '40s. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

JOHNSON PLAYED COLLEGIATE HOCKEY AT NORTH DAKOTA IN 1950-51, AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54. THE GOPHERS WON THE WCHA TITLE BOTH YEARS JOHNSON PLAYED. HE ALSO WON LETTERS IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

FOLLOWING ARMY DUTY IN KOREA AND A SHORT FLING WITH THE CHICAGO WHITE SOX ORGANIZATION, JOHNSON BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER AT WARROAD, MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOL IN 1956. A YEAR LATER, HE BECAME HEAD COACH AT MINNEAPOLIS ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL, WHERE HIS TEAMS WON 51 OF 60 CONFERENCE GAMES IN SIX SEASONS THROUGH 1962-63.

JOHNSON LEFT MINNEAPOLIS IN 1963 TO SERVE COLORADO COLLEGE AS BOTH HOCKEY AND BASEBALL COACH FOR THREE SEASONS. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS POSTED A COMBINED 29-51-3 RECORD. JOHNSON'S BASEBALL TEAMS WERE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL. IN BOTH 1964 AND 1965 HE WAS NAMED 'COACH OF THE YEAR' FOR THE NCAA COLLEGE DIVISION ROCKY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT. HE ALSO ASSISTED IN FOOTBALL AND TAUGHT IN THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM WITH THE RANK OF ASSISTANT PROFESSOR.

JOHNSON RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954 WITH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SOCIAL STUDIES. HE GAINED HIS MASTERS IN 1961 AND HIS PH.D IN 1963, BOTH FROM MINNESOTA IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION. HE IS NOW AN ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

HE IS THE AUTHOR OF TWO BOOKS, COACHING HIGH SCHOOL HOCKEY, AND ICE HOCKEY, THE LATTER PUBLISHED IN 1968. JOHNSON CONDUCTS AN ANNUAL COACHES CLINIC IN WISCONSIN; INSTRUCTIONAL CLINICS THROUGHOUT THE STATE AND NORTHERN ILLINOIS; ORGANIZED THE FIRST SUMMER HOCKEY CLINIC IN BOTH MINNESOTA (1960) AND WISCONSIN (1970); AND HAS BEEN DIRECTOR OF THE ASPEN, COLORADO SUMMER HOCKEY SCHOOL FOR SIX YEARS.

HE AND HIS WIFE, MARTHA, ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.

JEFF SAUER, FORMER COLORADO COLLEGE HOCKEY STAR, BECAME WISCONSIN'S FIRST FULL-TIME ASSISTANT COACH ON JULY 1, 1969. HE COACHES WISCONSIN'S JUNIOR VARSITY TEAM, SCOUTS, AND AIDS BADGER RECRUITING.

SAUER WAS DISCHARGED FROM THE UNITED STATES ARMY IN JUNE, 1969, AFTER A THREE-YEAR TOUR OF DUTY. HE IS A NATIVE OF ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA, WHERE HE EXCELLED IN HOCKEY, BASEBALL, AND FOOTBALL AT WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL.

HE PLAYED HOCKEY AND BASEBALL AS A COLLEGIAN UNDER THE TUTELAGE OF CURRENT WISCONSIN HEAD COACH BOB JOHNSON, WHO COACHED BOTH SPORTS AT COLORADO COLLEGE.

SIX HOPEFUL CANDIDATES WILL VIE FOR THE TWO VARSITY POSITIONS--SENIOR JOHN ANDERSON AND JUNIOR BOB ZIMMERMAN OF MADISON, SENIOR GARY ENGBERG, JUNIOR CHRIS NELSON, AND FRESHMEN DOUG SPITZIG AND JIM MACKKEY.

DEFENSE -- WITH THREE OF LAST YEAR'S REGULAR DEFENSEMEN RETURNING, LED BY SENIOR ALL-AMERICAN JOHN JAGGER, WE SEEM TO BE IN PRETTY GOOD SHAPE HERE. JUNIOR JEFF ROTSCHE IS DEFINITELY ALL-AMERICAN CALIBER, AND SENIOR DAN GILCHRIST HAS BEEN A REGULAR FOR TWO YEARS. THREE TOP JUNIOR PROSPECTS--AL FOLK, BRIAN ERICKSON, AND BRIAN WRIGHT--AND SOPHOMORE ERNIE BLACKBURN WILL FIGHT FOR THE OPEN POSITIONS. FRESHMAN DAVE ARUNDEL MAY SURPRISE.

CENTER -- LIKE GOALTENDING, WE MUST REPLACE OUR TWO ALL-TIME LEADING SCORERS, BOB POFFENROTH AND BERT DEHATE. WE HAVE A GOOD START IN SENIOR CAPTAIN JIM BOYD, AN ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE. LLOYD BENTLEY, WHO PLAYED FOURTEEN GAMES AS A REGULAR LAST YEAR AS A FRESHMAN, JUNIOR TOM CHUCKEL, AND TWO FRESHMAN CANDIDATES, BOB SHAUGHNESSY AND GARY WINCHESTER, WILL BATTLE FOR THE OPENINGS AT THIS KEY POSITION.

LEFT WING -- I THINK WE HAVE THREE OUTSTANDING LEFT WINGS RETURNING IN JUNIOR JIM YOUNG, SOPHOMORE TIM DOOL, AND LEADING GOAL SCORER MURRAY HEATLEY. HEATLEY, A SENIOR AND AN ALL-AMERICAN CANDIDATE THIS YEAR, MAY MOVE BACK TO HIS SOPHOMORE POSITION OF RIGHT WING. THE THIRD SPOT WOULD THEN BE BETWEEN NEWCOMER PHIL UHLEIN AND SENIOR STU HENRICKSON.

RIGHT WING -- WE SEEM TO BE VERY STRONG HERE WITH FOUR LETTERMEN RETURNING--SOPHOMORES JIM JOHNSTON AND NORM CHERREY, JUNIOR PAT LANNAN, AND SENIOR MATT TOCHTERMAN. JOHNSTON AND CHERREY WERE REGULARS AS FRESHMEN LAST YEAR AND WERE BOTH IMPORTANT IN THE BADGERS' STRETCH DRIVE TO THE NCAA TOURNAMENT. JUNIOR DOUG KELSO AND FRESHMAN BILLY REAY JR. MAY BE PLEASANT SURPRISES. MURRAY HEATLEY COULD STRENGTHEN THIS POSITION EVEN MORE.

GENERAL OUTLOOK -- THE WCHA LOOKS AS GOOD AS EVER THIS YEAR AND COMPETITION WILL BE KEENER. I JUST HOPE THAT WE CAN FINISH SOMEWHAT IN THE SAME MANNER AS LAST YEAR. THIS MAY BE A REBUILDING YEAR FOR US, ESPECIALLY IN THE KEY GOALTENDING AND CENTER SPOTS. WE WILL SKATE ONE OF THE YOUNGEST TEAMS IN THE WCHA. WE LOST EIGHT SENIORS FROM LAST YEAR'S SQUAD AND HAVE ONLY FOUR JUNIOR LETTER WINNERS RETURNING. I KNOW OUR PLAYERS, COACHES, STAFF, AND FANS ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO THE TOP COMPETITION OF THE WCHA IN 1970-71.
