RATIFIED TREATY NO. 34

DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE NEGOTIATION OF THE
TREATY OF JUNE 30, 1802, WITH THE SENECA INDIANS -
CITIZENS OF AMSTERDAM AND REPUBLIC OF BATAVIA

This Indenture

made the Thirtieth Day of June in the year of our Lords
 one thousand eight hundred and two Between the
 Sachins Chiefs and Warriors of the Seneca Nation of
 Indians of the first Part and Wilhem Willink Peter Van
 Eeghen Hendrik Vollenhoven W. Willink the younger, Willink
 Van Staproest Rod of Van Staproest the younger Cornelis
 Vollenhoven and Hendrik Sey by the said Joseph Ellicott
 their Agent and Attorney lawfully constituted and appointed
 for that purpose. **Now this Indenture witnesseth**
 that the said Parties of the first Part for and in consideration
 of the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars in gold
 and for the quit claim to the said Parties of the second
 Part their heirs and assigns of those lands situated
 lying and being in the County of Ontario and State of
 New York being part of the Lands reserved and reserved
 by the said Parties of the first Part in a Treaty Convention
 held by the Honorable Jeremiah Madsen Esquire under the
 Authority of the United States on the Seneca River the 15th
 Day of September 1797 in the Words following to wit: **Beginning**
 at the Mouth of the Cayuga River or Cayuga Falls or falls
 thence a line to be drawn parallel to Lake Erie at the
 distance of one mile from the Lake to the Mouth of Cataraugus

Creek, thence a line or lines extending twelve Miles up the North
 Side of said Creek at the Distance of one Mile therefrom, thence a
 direct line to the said Creek thence down the said Creek to Lake
 Erie thence along the Lake to the first mentioned Creek, and
 thence to the Place of Beginning. And the other Piece at
 Cataraugos Beginning at the Shore of Lake Erie on the South
 Side of Cataraugos Creek at the Distance of one Mile from the
 Mouth thereof thence running one Mile from the Lake thence on
 a line parallel thereto to a Point within one Mile from the
 said river down the said Creek, thence up the said Creek one Mile
 on a line parallel thereto thence a direct line to the said Creek
 thence down the same to Lake Erie thence along the Lake to the
 Place of Beginning. Reference being thereunto this will fully
 appear. And together with all usual Appurtenances, Rights, Privileges,
 Prerogatives and Appurtenances, Rights, Privileges or in any wise
 appertaining. And all the Estate Right, Title and Interest
 whatsoever of them the said Parties of the first Part and their
 Nations of in and to the said Tracts of Lands above described.

To have and to hold all and singular the said granted Premises
 with the Appurtenances to the said Parties of the second Part
 their Heirs and Assigns to their only proper use, Benefit and
 behoof forever. And in Consideration of the said Lands described
 and ceded as aforesaid the said Parties of the second Part by Joseph
 McCott their Agent and Attorney as aforesaid do hereby voluntarily
 cede release and quit Claim to the said Parties of the first Part and
 their Nation (the said Parties of the second Part reserving to themselves
 the Right of Preemption) all that certain Tract or Parcel of Land
 situate as aforesaid.

Beginning at a Post marked N^o
 Standing on the Bank of Lake Erie at the Mouth of Cataraugos
 Creek and on the North Bank thereof thence along the shore of
 said Lake N^o E 21^o 30' begin N 10^o E 45' bearing by C^o 44 bearing
 65 Links to a Post. Thence South 75^o East bearing twenty seven Links to a
 Post. Thence East bearing 10^o 30' bearing 100 Links to a Post standing
 in the Mouth of said Lake Erie. Thence North 75^o West bearing five
 Links to a Post standing on the South Bank of Cataraugos
 Creek. Thence West 80^o bearing 100 Links to a Post. Thence
 North two hundred and ninety Chains twenty five Links to a Post.
 Thence West four hundred and eighty in three thirty one Links
 to a Post. Thence North two hundred and ninety Chains fifty
 Links to a Post standing on the North Bank of Cataraugos Creek.

Thence down the said Creek along the South side thereof to
 the Place of Beginning. **To hold** to the said Parties of the first
 Part in the same Manner and by the same Tenure as the Lands
 reserved by the said Parties of the first Part in and by the said

Treaty or Convention entered into on Genesee River the 15th Day of September 1797 as aforesaid were intended to be held.

In Testimony whereof the Parties to these Presents have hereunto, and to two other Instruments of the same tenor and date, are to remain with the United States, one to remain with the said Parties of the first Part, and one other to remain with the said Parties of the second Part, interchangeably, set their Hands and Seals the Day and year first above written.
