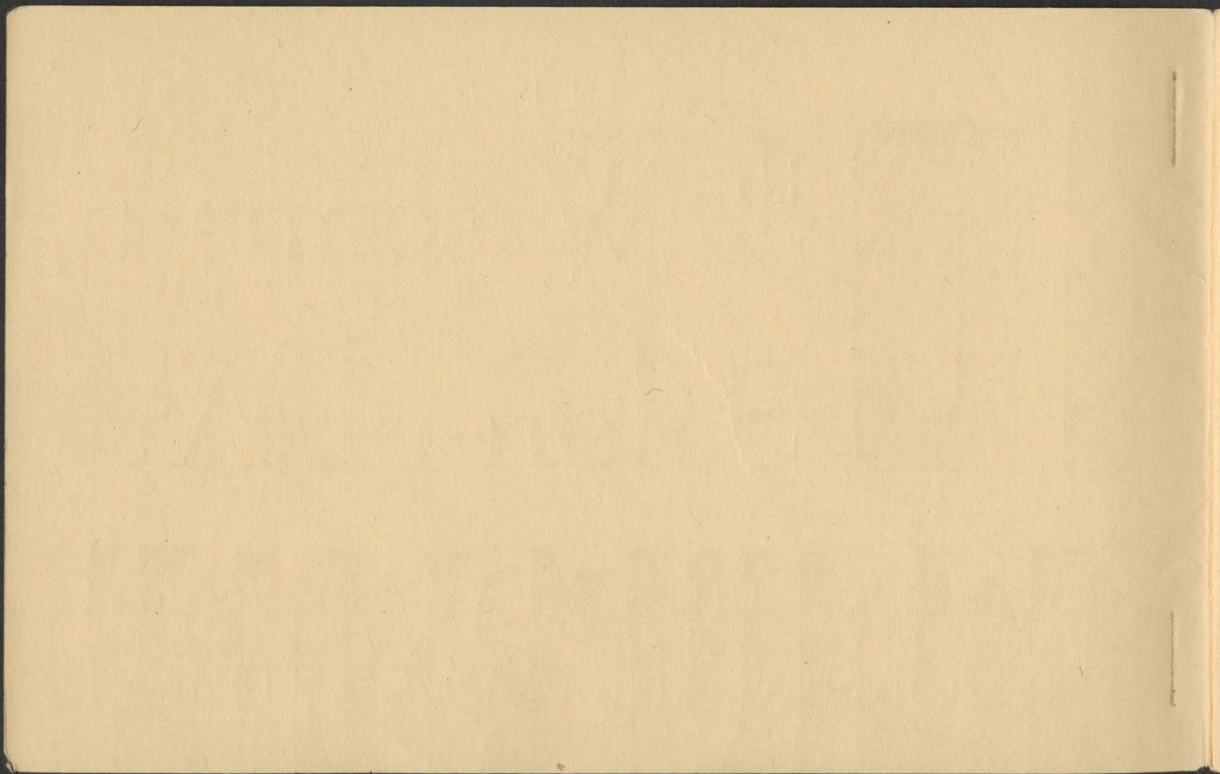

THE WISCONSIN SALON OF ART . . . 1943

The Wisconsin Union believes, in presenting this Tenth Annual Wisconsin Salon of Art, that it is important in wartime to encourage continuous creative art activity.

A student committee in 1934 established the first Salon. In 1943, to celebrate in a distinctive way the tenth anniversary of this original Salon, the Gallery Committee has invited all artists who have been represented by work in three or more Salons in the past to send one or two works which are exhibited without submission to the juror. Thus this anniversary Salon reflects, in a large measure, the common judgment of excellence among Wisconsin artists registered by various jurors over the ten year period.

The method of conducting the Salon is unusual in the field of large competitive art exhibitions. From beginning to end the arrangements are planned and executed by University students, working voluntarily as the Gallery Committee of the Wisconsin Union and aided by the Union staff.

In the last analysis, pictures are painted not only to be shown in exhibitions but also—and more important—to be owned by someone. Purchases may be readily arranged by inquiring at the Union desk. In most cases, the Union can supply full information concerning the artist and his works.
