# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

- 1. That \$120 be transferred from the Athletic Council funds to the School of Education.

  Adopted.
- 2. That Jean M. Fish be appointed assistant in psychology for the second semester of 1930-31; salary \$375 for the semester; charge to L. & S. Unassigned.

  Adopted.
- 3. That Morris Topchevsky be continued as lecturer in art, Experimental College, for two months during the second semester of 1930-31; salary \$200 for the period; charge to L. & S. Unassigned. Adopted.
- 4. That \$200 be transferred from the savings on the salary of J. D. Wickhem, Law School, to L. & S. Unassigned, to cover Topchevsky item.

  Adopted.
- 5. That Marie G. Ehmann be appointed county club agent for Ozaukee County, from April 1 to September 30, 1931; salary \$1,000 for the period, to be distributed as follows: University \$800, County \$200; charge to part time county leaders, p. 70, revolving fund. (The University may withdraw its portion of the salary after July 1, 1931, if funds are not available.)

  Adopted.
- 6. That Verlyn F. Sears be appointed county agricultural agent for Rusk County, beginning March 16, 1931; salary at the rate of \$2,400 per annum, twelve months' basis, to be distributed as follows: University \$1,700, County \$700; charge to aggregate amount for county representatives, p. 71, revolving fund.

  Adopted.

- 7. That Eugene F. Dietz be reappointed county agent for Iron County, beginning April 1, 1931; salary at the rate of \$2,400 per annum, twelve months' basis; to be distributed as follows: University \$1,700, County \$700; charge to item for Iron County, p. 72, 3-E and revolving funds.

  Adopted.
- 8. That Edith Bangham be reappointed home demonstration agent for Marathon County, beginning March 15, 1931; salary at the rate of \$2,400 per annum, twelve months' basis, to be distributed as follows: University \$1,500, County \$900; charge to item for Edith Bangham and additional home demonstration agent, p. 82.

  Adopted.
  - 9. That the resignation of Agnes Mattson, instructor in nursing, be accepted; to take effect February 1, 1931.

    Adopted.
- 10. That Flora Schrankel be appointed instructor in nursing, beginning April 1, 1931; salary at the rate of \$1,500 per annum, twelve months' basis; charge to nursing, p. 41, fund 10-A.

  Adopted.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

- 1. That upon the recommendation of Mr. Haas, the following transfers be made in the budget of the College of Agriculture:
  - \$ 400 from staff salaries (Marvin) to clerical and labor, Economic Entomology, 20.41 (1)(A) Operation.
    - 300 from staff salaries (Russell) to clerical and labor, Agr. Administration, 20.41 (1)(A) Operation.
    - from Assistants (Tough, Gray, and Lovendahl) to labor, Rural Sociology, 20.39 (8)(A) U.S. Grants.
    - from staff salaries to labor, Farmers' Institutes, 20.41 (3)(A) Farmers' Institutes.
    - 366.68 from staff salaries to labor, Agr. Journalism, 20.41 (1)(A) Operation.
  - 3,000 from staff salaries, Home Economics, to printing and publishing, 20.39 (8)(A) U.S. Grants.

Adopted.

- 2. That \$1,350 be transferred from the free balance, 20.41 (1)(A) in the Law School to the General Library, for student help. Adopted.
- 3. That the purchase of the Cape property, 308 North Orchard Street, for the sum of \$9,733, giving Mrs. Cape the privilege of removing the house from the premises, be approved. Amount to be charged to the item of \$11,000 in 20.41(1)R released for this purpose.
