RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

- Administration and General -

1. That the allotment of \$975 from Regents Unassigned for placement and attainment tests in Foreign Languages be budgeted as follows:

\$375 stipend to Professor Cheydleur 250 printing and publishing 350 clerical help \$975

Adopted.

- Letters and Science -

1. That Mrs. Harriet Morgan Powell be appointed to complete the records in the office of the Experimental College for the summer of 1932 and the first semester of the academic year 1932-33, to be paid at the rate of \$57.50 a month (total \$431.25); charge to Regents Unassigned. (No waiver) Adopted.

- Agriculture -

1. That the resignation of W. C. Snyder, assistant in plant pathology, be accepted; to take effect at the beginning of the academic year 1932-33, p. 85. Adopted. 2. That Merl W. Stubbs be appointed half-time assistant in plant pathology for the academic year 1932-33; salary \$600 less waiver of \$18, net \$582; charge to item vice Snyder, p. 85, fund 3-R. Adopted.

3. That Melvin E. Anderson be appointed half-time assistant in plant pathology for the academic year 1932-33; salary \$600 less waiver of \$18, net \$582; charge to item vice Snyder, \$97 to fund 1-A and \$485 to fund 3-R, p. 85.

Adopted.

4. That the State Conservation Department continue to pay the salary of H. H. Hull according to the existing arrangement from October 1 for three months; salary \$100 per month, p. 87, fund 3-A. Adopted.

5. That the appointment of Sergius A. Wilde, research assistant in soils, be continued from September 1 for two months; salary at the rate of \$150 a month (total \$300) less waiver of \$9, net \$291; charge to item for salary of H. H. Hull, p. 87, fund 3-A. Adopted.

- Summer Session -

 That the title of Loraine Maytum, appointed for the 1932 summer session, be changed from life-guard to assistant in physical education - women. Adopted.

Upon recommendation of President Frank, it was VOTED, That Professor C. V. Easum be permitted to deposit his 1932 summer session salary for leave, amounting to \$560.74, subject to the President's approval after conferring with the Director of Summer Session. - above wor allowed - (Helsenhoff)

4. That the salary of Assistant Professor V. E. Kivlin, Agricultural Education, be increased \$9.38, chargeable to the item for labor, College of Agriculture, Administration, Fund 1-A, Page 71. (For automobile liability insurance.) Adopted.

The Business Manager presented the following recommendation from the Director of Summer Session:

✓ That a faculty member may upon due notice in writing withdraw his deposits in cash, thus cancelling his leave-of-absence credit. In the event he has several deposits and desires to withdraw only part of them, they will be paid him in the order of their age, the oldest deposit being paid first. Adopted.

The matter of the Rieder farm was discussed and it was VOTED, That an appropriation from Regents Unassigned of \$2200 be made for the rent for the current year, to be used only in the event that the Emergency Board upon further consideration fails to make an appropriation for the purchase of the farm.
