Approval of Minutes

Upon motion by Regent Schilling, seconded by Regent Flores, minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Regents held on March 8, 1991, were approved as distributed.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

Report of the Chair of the Council of Trustees, UW Hospital and Clinics

Regent Flores, Chair of the Council, reported that at the previous day's meeting Superintendent Gordon Derzon first reported positive financial results for the first eight months of the fiscal year, with an overall net income of more than \$19 million for that period. During March, however, patient volume dropped significantly, leading to near break-even status. Expectations were for positive trends in the remaining three months of the fiscal year, yielding a favorable financial position for the entire year, but not at the level that had been expected. Slower than usual payments by Medicare and other third-party payers had led to increases in accounts

receivable, and efforts will be exerted to lower the receivable balance and increase cash collections over the next several months.

Mr. Derzon also reported on a recent fire that occurred in portions of the Clinical Science Center and complimented hospital personnel for their efficient response in returning functions to normal. Dr. Gundersen requested that a report be provided at a future meeting of the hospital's fire safety inspections and its level of compliance with safety standards and fire department recommendations.

It was reported that the hospital was in the process of seeking from the Legislature's Joint Finance Committee approval for additional positions and expenditure authority.

The Council also reviewed and approved the hospital's long-range plan, a document developed by a subcommittee of the Policy, Management and Planning Steering Committee appointed in January 1989 by Chancellor Shalala and chaired by Vice Chancellor Noren. Dr. Noren provided an update on the status of the Committee's report to Chancellor Shalala, including a proposal for restructuring the hospital governance to increase management flexibility.

In review of the hospital's 1991-93 and 1993-95 capital budget proposals, Dr. Noren noted that the Building Commission had rejected or deferred a number of projects scheduled for the 1991-93 biennium. However, an expansion project shared by the Medical School and Hospital was restored. Associate Superintendent Les Brower presented the hospital's 1993-95 capital budget requests for three projects, totaling around \$3 million: a cardiac intensive care unit, expansion of the cardiac catheterization laboratory, and a child day-care center for hospital personnel. The Council approved the requests as presented.

In other business, legal counsel was directed to study the various methods by which the Council can be involved in review of quality assurance information to meet accreditation requirements.

In response to a question by Regent Grover, Vice Chancellor Noren explained that the Policy, Management and Planning Steering Committee had been working on a number of issues in the Center for Health Sciences, one of which was governance structure of the University Hospital. Others were relationships between faculty and their counterparts in the hospital in terms of education, and long-term space needs for the Center for Health Sciences. The committee submitted its report to Chancellor Shalala in November. After consultation with outside experts and others, the Chancellor will determine which of those recommendations should be supported. Approval at the campus and System levels, by the Board of Regents, and by the Legislature and the Governor would be required before implementation.

Regent Nicholas called attention to a recent incident in which a medical faculty member used university stationery to present personal opinions.

In response, Regent Flores had prepared a letter stating that, while people have a right to their personal views, they should not use university equipment, stationery or time to express them.

President Lyon noted that Vice Chancellor Noren had spoken with the faculty member and had sent a similar response to the person who complained.

Regent Weinstein added that use of a university title when expressing a personal opinion also seemed inappropriate.

Regent Hassett supplemented his written report by stating the VTAE Board's support for adding a student member to the VTAE Board, to be appointed by the governor for a two-year term.

Regent President Lyon referred to the written report distributed by Vice President Bornstein.

Regent Vos inquired about the rationale for opposing a limit of 80 hours of work per week for medical residents, pp 3-4

Regent Flores replied that those matters are sufficiently regulated by the accrediting associations.

Referring to testimony by Vice Chancellor Noren at a hearing on the legislation, Vice President Bornstein cited the position that inflexible limitation on hours would significantly restrict the educational process of physicians.

Regent Weinstein remarked that the expertise of accrediting agencies, rather than the question of flexibility, is the best reason for leaving oversight to those bodies.

Noting that the impetus for this legislation was a situation which arose in New York, Vice Chancellor Noren said the same circumstances do not exist in Wisconsin. The legislation would undermine the educational experience and also would prevent residents from providing service to small hospitals which rely heavily on resident coverage for weekends.

In reply to a question by Regent Vos, Dr. Noren explained that hours of work vary by specialty and by how hours are counted. If hours when residents are on call at home are counted, there are several specialties in which residents are working or on call more than 80 hours a week. This is not disruptive, he said, either to quality of care or the educational program. The residents themselves feel this way, and the resident staff organization testified against the bill for those reasons. The UW Hospital was joined by the Medical College of Wisconsin and by other hospitals in opposing the bill.

Regent Gundersen commented that residency review committees set the rules for accredited programs in all the major specialties, and there is no reason for state involvement.

Vice President Bornstein added that Vice Chancellor Noren's testimony indicated the majority of residents at University Hospital work between 40-60 hours a week, including hours on call.

✓ Federal Government -

Report on Congressional Visits by President Lyon, p. 4

Regent President Lyon reported on his recent visits to the offices of seven members of the Wisconsin Congressional Delegation. Subjects of discussion included the importance of federal indirect costs to the doctoral campuses, funding for the Biotechnology Building, funding for the Babcock Institute of International Studies, the reinstatement of funding for the Small Business Development Centers, and the reauthorization legislation dealing with student financial aids.

Congressmen Klug, Gunderson and Petri are all members of the subcommittee dealing with the financial aid issue, and several hearings on this topic probably will be held in Wisconsin.

✓ Indirect Costs - Discussion, p. 4

In view of controversies at other universities, Regent Schilling asked what was being done in the UW System regarding the indirect cost issue.

Noting that Wisconsin's indirect cost rates are appreciably below those of many institutions, President Shaw suggested that a report on the subject be made to the Business and Finance Committee.

Regent Weinstein felt it would be instructive for the Board to be informed of peer institution indirect cost rates, particularly in view of the fact that monies spent on indirect costs are not available for research projects.

Regent Lyon added that United States Department of Agriculture indirect cost rates had declined in recent years from 40 percent to 14 percent. If other federal agencies moved in that direction, it would make a great difference in monies received by the university.

✓ Undergraduate Education -

Report on Undergraduate Education Hearings, pp 4-5

Regent President Lyon reported on the first two hearings on undergraduate education held April 2 at the UW Center-Fox Valley and April 3 at UW-Eau Claire. The Regent panel for the Fox Valley hearing consisted of Regent Grover (Chair), Regent Clusen, and Regent President Lyon. At the Eau Claire hearing, the panel consisted of Regent Hassett (Chair), Regent Gelatt, Regent Gunderson, and Regent Krutsch.

He thanked the host institutions--Dean Young, Chancellor Schnack, and their staffs--for providing arrangements for the hearings. He also thanked the Regent panels and the speakers who came to share their thoughts. Both hearings were quite well attended and useful testimony was provided.

On the basis of experience to date, President Lyon offered the following suggestions for the remaining hearings:

First, that there be more testimony from students, individual teaching faculty, and community members. While there were students at the first two hearings, a number of them had been asked by faculty to speak about the benefits of particular programs. While this testimony was helpful, more comments were needed on the broader scope of the undergraduate experience including areas of both strength and weakness.

Second, that those who testify identify specific means by which undergraduate education could be strengthened. At the first two hearings, the panels heard much about the strengths of current programs. While current strengths must be recognized, there was need to identify areas in which there is room for improvement and suggestions as to how those needs might be addressed.

Regent Clusen suggested that testimony be more closely tied to the assignments given the five Regent working groups, and Regent Grover agreed that these fundamental questions were not addressed vigorously in most of the testimony to date.

In introducing UW-Eau Claire Vice Chancellor Smelstor, President Shaw stated that the UW-Eau Claire Student Volunteerism Program is indicative of other campus programs where the students' educational experience is complemented by the skills that are acquired, the joys and importance of serving others, and, equally important, the impact made on the community.

Vice Chancellor Smelstor explained that UW-Eau Claire's Community Action and Life Learning (CALL) Program provides students with opportunities to give back to the community what the community has given to them by performing specific services.

Dr. Grafton Hall, UW-Eau Claire Chair of the Social Work Department, said that the freshman level class is required of all social work students and is an elective class for students with other majors. It has two primary purposes: to instill a sense of responsibility to the community; and, to build the habit of giving of oneself. Volunteering a total of 30 hours in approved agencies, students are required to provide a written log of their experiences. They volunteer with the elderly, children, people with disabilities, delinquents, and hold many varied responsibilities in the community. The community would be diminished without these volunteers who contribute approximately 2100 hours each year--approximately 25,000 hours since the program's inception in 1977. The program, run with 30-70 students per semester, continues through the summer months.

Sheree McMillan, a married UW-Eau Claire full-time student with a part-time job, reviewed her experience in giving her 30 volunteer hours to the Eau Claire area Hmong population. Her first assignment was to find housing for a man and his four children who had been homeless for six weeks. She helped them through interviews with appropriate agencies and, within a week, had found the family an acceptable apartment, obtained medical treatment for an ill child, and enrolled the rest of the children in school. She explained that she is continuing her volunteer service even though she has exceeded her required 30 hours of service.

Regent Dreyfus asked how these experiences were academically distilled.

Professor Hall explained that there are meetings with students three times a semester and a review of their logs. Being an introductory course in working with people, this course is not similar to the more intense internship which follows later in the program.

Regent Dreyfus asked if there is a final examination, to which Professor Hall responded in the affirmative.

Regent Clusen wondered if the program might be expanded to include volunteerism in political parties or civic organizations.

Professor Hall answered that this aspect is part of the regular curriculum for social work students because ultimately most of the decisions that affect social welfare are made in that arena. However, those volunteer organizations had not been included on the roster of agencies for the course.

Regent President Lyon thanked the panel members for a well-planned presentation.

President Shaw expressed appreciation to Dr. Albert Beaver for his many contributions as Acting Vice President for Academic Affairs during the past ten months. On issues of undergraduate education, assessment, teacher education and strategic planning, advanced placement and others, he had provided needed stability and strength, all of which was accomplished with a reduced staff.

President Shaw expressed appreciation to Chancellor Portch, who was leaving the UW Centers to become Vice President for Academic Affairs. He became Chancellor at the important time of implementing *Planning the Future*, including credit transfer issues that were essential to the Regents' vision of what the UW System should be, and he was able to work effectively with the universities to achieve those goals. "Chancellor Portch elevated the image of the Centers by his enthusiasm, embodied in a strong belief that these were institutions that are essential to the well being of the state and to the effective operations of our System. He accurately portrayed their worth and developed a sense among the people in the Centers of their importance to the System and to the state."

Chancellor Portch expressed his gratitude for having had the opportunity to serve UW Centers as a faculty member, a dean and a chancellor; for the strong group of deans, faculty, academic staff, and central office staff; for the strong and sensible leadership of the senate and academic staff; for the wisdom of Vice Chancellor Kaplan; for the boards and communities who support the Centers; for the help of his chancellor colleagues; and, to his spouse for her tireless work on behalf of the UW Centers. He also thanked the Board of Regents, the President, and System Administration staff for giving the UW Centers the support it needs to play the cornerstone role in the UW System. "I want to thank you for giving me the opportunity to do a little polishing on the jewel in the UW crown."

President Shaw congratulated the men's and women's athletic teams and individuals throughout the UW System who had participated in national tournaments and won championships.

Regent Committees - Audit Subcommittee -

REPORT OF THE BUSINESS AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Regent Gelatt, Chair, gave the report.

Report of the Audit Subcommittee, p. 7

The Audit Subcommittee of the Business and Finance Committee received a status report of internal audits in process and those recently completed.

Approval of Gifts, Grants and Contracts

Reporting to the Committee on gifts, grants and contracts, Vice President Poellnitz called attention to the gift-in-kind of the former Walgreen store, given to the UW-Madison by the University of Wisconsin Foundation as a site for the new Grainger Hall of Business.

It was moved by Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Gundersen, and carried that Resolution 5739 be adopted by the Board of Regents. Regent Davis abstained from the vote.

Resolution 5739: That, upon recommendation of the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the gifts, grants and contracts presented at this meeting (copy on file with the papers of this meeting) be accepted, approved, ratified and confirmed; and that, where signature authority has not been previously delegated, appropriate officers be authorized to sign agreements.

✓ Athletics - Discussion

Stating that he had reviewed again the December 1990 Legislative Audit Bureau report, Regent Flores conveyed his intention to ask the Board to review the budget of the Athletic Department if the Athletic Board voted again to eliminate five sports. For the 1989-90 and 1990-91 fiscal years, he pointed out the department had a balanced budget, the deficit having occurred in previous years before current management arrived. He was not convinced the accumulated deficit warranted cutting five sports, including successful programs and the oldest sport at the university.

Regent Weinstein recalled that the \$10 per semester segregated fee for athletics was approved with the understanding that the purpose was to avoid eliminating sports.

Regent Nicholas commented that the \$2 million deficit would have to be paid and a reserve accumulated. To do so required making tough decisions, and he supported the Athletic Director's stance in that respect.

Regents Davis and Dreyfus cautioned the Board against substituting its judgment for that of the manager hired to deal with the problems.

✓ Audit, Class - Discussion on policy, pp 8-9

Class Audit Policy

Regent Davis called attention to the impact on disabled students of the new policy on auditing classes. While he was comfortable with the policy's elimination of age discrimination, he had not been aware of the effect of the policy on disabled auditors and requested information sufficient to revisit that aspect of the decision.

In response to a question by Regent Schilling, Regent President Lyon said information on the number of disabled auditors would be provided at the next meeting, while the policy as a whole could be reviewed at a later time.

Regent Hassett recalled that he had requested a report on the impact of the policy a year after it took effect.

Regent Gelatt encouraged the Board to allow the policy to remain in effect for a year before reviewing it. He thought it would be inappropriate

at a time of budget shortages to rescind the policy requiring auditors to pay a fee for the educational benefit they receive.

Regent Nicholas agreed with the importance of reviewing policy after a year. He was concerned about the ill will that may be created by the new policy.

Review of Student Services Charges to Residence Halls, p. 9

Regent Gelatt reported on a review of student services charges to residence halls being conducted as a result of a presentation by the UW-Stevens Point student government at the last meeting.

System Administration staff met with campus administrators and the student government president to ascertain the rationale used to support the assessment of charges and the role of students in the budget process.

Based on the information provided, it appeared students have been involved in reviewing and approving that part of student life services funded by residence hall receipts. UW-Stevens Point, as a part of its strategic planning process, is reviewing student life services programs and the appropriate funding sources of these programs. Until a systemwide study is completed, it is not possible to determine whether the charges assessed to residence halls are appropriate, although there is indication that some inappropriate charges may have been made.

System Administration is performing a comparative analysis of student services programs at other institutions. Funding sources of these programs will be reviewed for compliance with the System's General Administrative Policy Paper (GAPP) 15. A report will be made to the Board upon completion of this study, tentatively scheduled for the June meeting. The Committee discussed the genesis of GAPP 15 and was told that it was a result of a legislative audit in which students were involved. Once all the information from the institutions has been received, it will be used to assess whether the existing policy paper should be revised, and to assist in any revisions that need to be made.

✓ Regents Committee - Bus & Finance Committee

Extension of Investment Managers Contracts, p. 9

Regent Gelatt announced that at the March closed session the Committee extended the investment managers' contracts by one year, as permitted by the original purchase order. The investment advisors were hired on a three-year contract with a one-year option which was being exercised.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Regent Gundersen, Chair, presented the report.

Consent Agenda Items

Regent Gundersen presented Resolutions 5740-5744, which were approved unanimously by the Committee, and moved their adoption by the Board as consent agenda items. The motion was seconded by Regent Hassett.

With regard to Resolution 5741, Regent Nicholas commented that he was pleased to see UW-Milwaukee's commitment to raising \$1 million in gift funds to support the new School of Business building, which is much needed in the Milwaukee area.

In response to a question by Regent Vos, Vice President Brown explained that the budget increase was due to an increased number of parking stalls and that funding will be by program revenues. Regent Vos commented that \$1 million was not a large amount for a city the size of Milwaukee, especially when compared to fundraising requirements on campuses in much smaller cities.

Eric Schenker, Dean of UW-Milwaukee's School of Business, thanked the Board, System Administration, the Governor, the Legislature, and others who had participated in this long-awaited project. The facility will accommodate 2,030 students at one time in the classrooms and laboratories. He noted that 80-90 percent of the students attending UW-Milwaukee stay in Wisconsin, supplying the state's businesses. The groundbreaking for the new facility was expected to be in October.

Regent Flores asked if the \$1 million in gift money was already in hand, and Dean Schenker replied that the \$1 million requirement was recently added by the Governor, the Regents having recommended that the building be funded entirely by state money. Because the gift funds were to be used for equipment, the bidding process for the building would not be affected. Chancellor Schroeder would be working with the Foundation and business community leaders to organize a fundraising drive to meet the \$1 million goal.

Regent Nicholas observed that fundraising for UW-Milwaukee historically had been difficult and that \$1 million would not be easily raised.

Regent Schilling asked if the \$1 million was added to the originally scheduled cost of the building.

Dean Schenker replied that the Building Commission kept the dollar amount the same and reduced the state participation by \$1 million.

Put to the vote, Resolutions 5740-5744 were adopted, with Regent Vos voting "No" on Resolution 5741 because he felt the gift requirement should have been larger.

Bldg Fund

UW-Parkside Land Conveyance to Village of Pleasant Prairie, Kenosha County, R 5740, P. 11

Resolution 5740: That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Parkside Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the President or Vice President and Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System be authorized to convey the following property consisting of about .28 acre of unimproved land to the Village of Pleasant Prairie, for street purposes.

Part of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 32 Town 1 North Range 23 East, Village of Pleasant Prairie, Kenosha County, Wisconsin described as follows:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of Lot 105, Chiwaukee Subdivision, a recorded subdivision in Kenosha County; thence Northwesterly 100 feet along the East line of said Lot 105; thence East 25 feet parallel to the South line of said Lot 105; thence Northwest along the East line of Lot 105 to the North line of said Lot 105 and South right-of-way line of 116th Street; thence West 68 feet along the North line of said Lot 105; thence Southeast along a line parallel to the East line of said Lot 105 to the South line of Lot 105; thence East along the South line of said Lot 105 to the point of beginning, except the north five feet thereof.

The purpose of the transfer is to permit the extension of First Court to the north between 116th and 117th Streets.

The lot being conveyed was obtained in 1976 from Kenosha County.

UW-Milwaukee Budget Increase and Authority
