Updated English Curriculum



Mrs. Cooley explained Anglo-Saxon literature to the seniors.








Language Broadens Horizons

History class this year. This course is required for all Juniors. The election for Junior Class officers was held in history in order that students could see how elections are held.








Science Is The

General Science is designed as a prerequisite















What are we doing in Phy. Ed. (gym!) class? This is one of the questions the girls asked the new Physical Education teacher, Miss Schuster. With her


southern drawl, she stated, "Yo' all will learn many new things this year, from tennis to modern dancing.








