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Upon recommendation of Regent Olbrich the following resolution was adopted:

 \checkmark RESOLVED, That the faculty of the university is hereby authorized to nominate as honorary fellows and scholars, applicants for same in number not to exceed inall the number of paid fellows and scholars, such fellows and scholars to receive as salary an amount equal to fees; such fellows and scholars to be nominated after careful examination, that they are worthy of such nomination, and also provided that such persons shall be eligible as have received the baccalaureate degree at least one year previous to their nomination.

Honorary fellows and scholars shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the president of the university.

(The details of awarding the fellowships and scholarships to be worked out by President Frank and Dean Slichter.)

✓ Dean Snell brought in the plans for the University Extension Building in Milwaukee. It was voted that the plans and specifications be approved, subject to the approval of the State Engineer; that when approved by the State Engineer authority be granted to advertise for bids.
