REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS

April 25, 1923

VOTED, That the matter be referred to the Acting Business Manager to report to the next meeting of the Board, or, if action is needed earlier, to the Executive Committee, with power to act.

Regent Waters reported to the regents that President Birge has been elected to membership in the American Philosophical Society, stating that this is one of the highest honors which can be given to an educator distinguished in scholarship and research.
