Big Medicine - Cornelius Hill

My uncle, Cornelius Hill, was born on November 13, 1834. When he was ten years old, a white man arrived and took him back and sent him to be taught. When he was 13 years old, then they called him back and the leaders honored him. They taught him for five years when he returned. He was 15 years old when the leaders honored him and he began working for the Oneida people. Finally they also hired him to be a translator and they made him assistant to the priest. Then the time came that they agreed for him to become a priest. January 30, 1907 was when he died. He was 76 years old.
