## The University of Wisconsin


We welcome you to the campus of the University of Wisconsin and hope that you share our feeling for its beauty. Unfortunately, if you come by car, you must also share one of our problems: a shortage of parking spaces.


Parking spaces in the campus area are limited by our desire to maintain the natural beauty of the campus, by the fact that enlargement and maintenance of parking lots must be paid for by our faculty and staff through the fees they are charged for parking, and by our need to keep roads, fire zones, and loading zones clear for the protection of our students.

We have set aside a limited number of spaces in campus lots for those unable to climb our hills or whose visit is so brief that it does not justify the delay of a bus trip. These permits are distributed, free of charge, at the Information Booth near the corner of Park and Langdon Sts. and at the Department of Protection and Security, 324 North Charter St.

Generous space is available to all visitors in Parking Lot 60 at the intersection of Walnut St., Marsh Lane, and Willow Drive. There you may park without permit or charge-even overnight if you wish-and ride our special bus to your destination on the campus for a ten cent fare. These buses operate at five and ten minute intervals over the route shown on the back page from 7:10 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., Monday through Friday; 7:15 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. Saturday; and there is a shelter at Lot 60 for bad weather bus waiting.

We realize that these arrangements are not ideal and may cause some hardships. But be assured they are hardships you share with some 18,000 students, more than 6,000 faculty and staff members who spend the academic year with them.
