Do not attempt to unlock either cover unless opposite cover is locked, as posts should always be held in one of the covers.

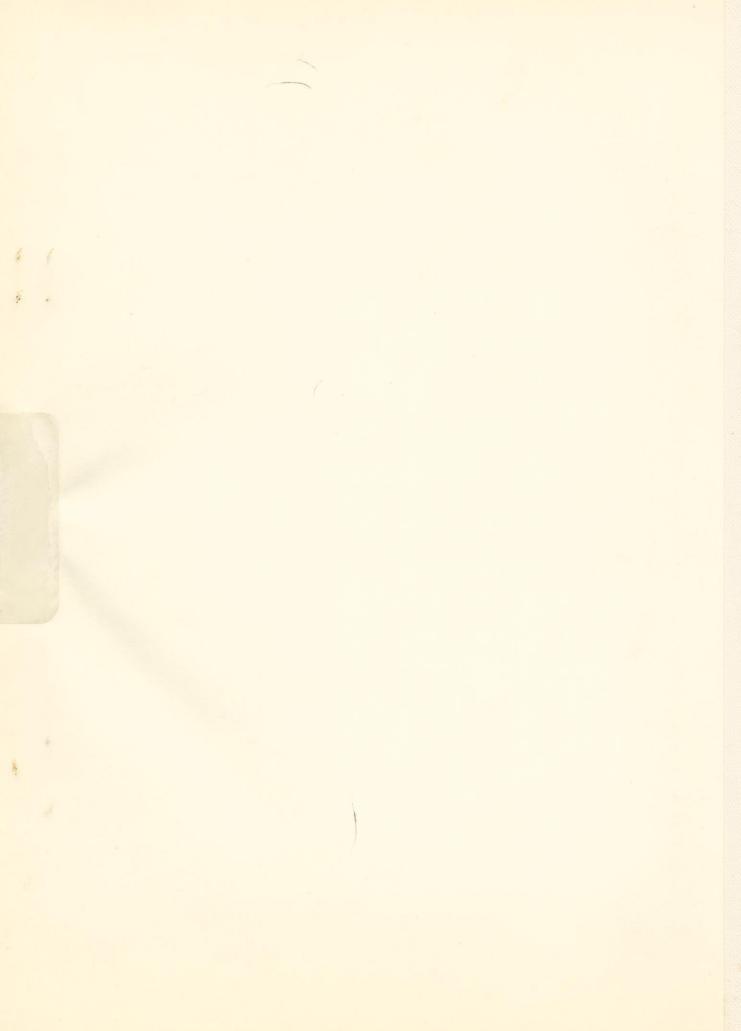
TO LOCK BOOK PERMANENTLY—This is only to be done when all the sheets are written up and placed in the binder, for once permanently locked, it is impossible to unlock or open it.

For this purpose two permanent locking buttons are furnished. Insert these sealing buttons into the round holes near end of locking case so that the slot in the Sealing Button runs lengthwise with the binder. 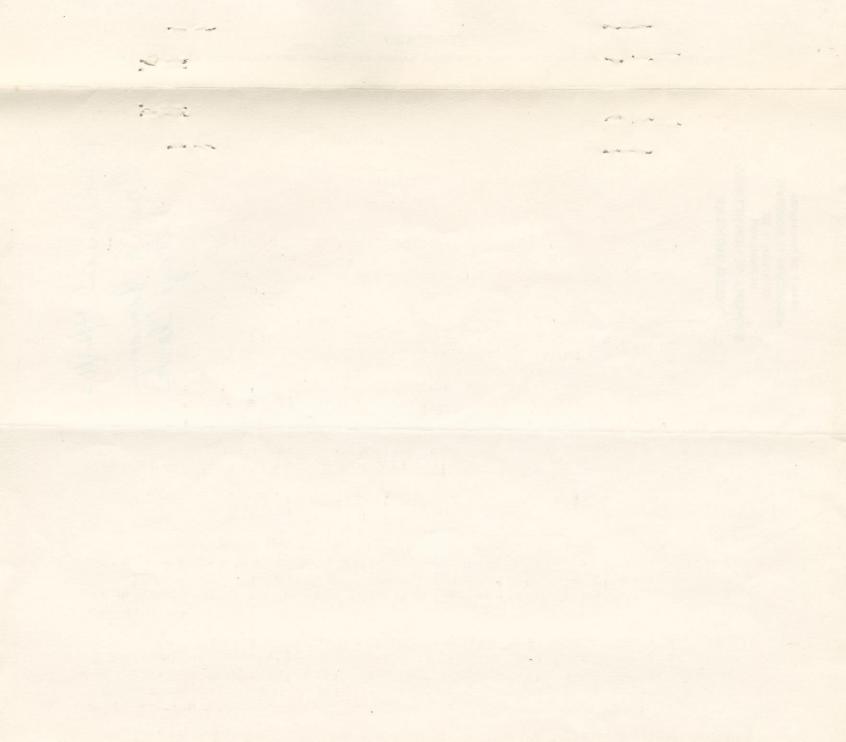

Public Works - Utility Cashier T.I. Armeson reported that the June 1st readings and billings had been made on schedule. Clerk presented the preliminary plans for the reconstruction of Main Street as drawn up by the John Strand Engineering firm. Discussion of Street Survey project was held to determine the extent of the project this year. It was moved by Trustee T.I. Arneson, seconded by Wm.R. Thousand that final determination of extent be tabled until the Street Comm. could meet with Mr. Strand. Carfied. It was moved by Trastee T.I. Arneson and seconded by M.E. Arneson that a preliminary draft be made of a Special Assessment Ordinance by the Village Attorney and submitted for board approval. Carried.

Letter from the Wisconsin Power & Light Co. read regarding change of street light lamp proposal. It was moved by Trustee Wm. R. Thousand and 2nd by Marvin Arneson that the change be approved and that the Clerk inform and request two (2) additional street light installations. (Alley by Barneveld Impl. Co. & at west end of Jenniton Avenue.) Carried.

Parks - Trustee Wm. R. Thousand reported on the progress of the school in digging it's new dry well on the Village Ball Park. Open pit area to be fenced off as soon as possible because of children in the area.

Public Welfare - Trustee Otto Oimoen reported that there was going to be a meeting of local Health Officers at Dodgeville on June 8th concerning problems of new laws concerning communicalble diseases. The President urged Trustee Oimoen to attend said meeting.

Committee Reports:

Public Welfare: Health Officer 0. Oimoen reported on meeting held at Dodgeville on June 8, 1960, of County Health Officers. He stated that it appeared that the State's Concern in health problems had shifted from prevention of communicable diseases to municipal sanitation problems.

Public Works: Water Utility cashier T.I. Arneson reported on Mrs. Alice Jones' refusal to pay the unmetered water billing rate. No meter has been installed due to odd sized fittings necessary. It was moved by Trustee F. Watrud, 2nd by A. Powers to waive the unmetered additional charge of \$2.00 and accept payment of minimum rate of \$10.00. Carried.

Trustee A. Powers reported on meeting with Eldon Rule for an estimate on Main Street reconstruction. Since costs are estimated to run over \$2,000.00 it is the recommendation of the Village Attorney and the Street Committee that the Clerk be instructed to proceed with a letting of bids as follows:

1. The grading of MainStreet from the intersection of Main & Jones Streets East to the C & NW RR tracks, and 2. The installation of storm sewers, all according to the specifications for the reconstruction of Main Street as drawn up by the John Strand engineering firm. Carried.

Village Marshall Doell S. Brusveen came before the Board with the complaint and request to blacklist Mrs. Harold Uptegraw in accordance with State Statutes, because of the manner of her behavior in the local taverns recently. Mr. Brusveen also mentioned several othe r complaints he had had of the taverns and his manner of handling same.

Halvor Selseng came before the board to request permission to build a 14' X 40' frame garage on his lot. Referred to Comm. on Licenses and permits for recommendation after filing proper application for building permit.

Discussion held regarding the condition of the front windows in the library building. It was moved by Trustee T.I. Armeson and 2nd by M. E. Armeson that the Library Board investigate to cost of repairs and recommend action to the Board. Carried.

Board of Review being set by law for Monday, July 11, it was decided the Trustees O. Oimoen, A. Powers & F. Watrud, along with the Clerk and Assessor sit in session that day to receive formal objections and adjourn as they deem necessary to a later date form hearings before the full Village Board.

Meeting called to order at 8:05 PM by Pres. R. Stenseth. who stated the purpose of the meeting to be to decide on the Main Street project.

The Road & Street Comm. recommended that the bid of G. A. Watson (\$9,350.00) be rejected and that the Board authorize the Road & Street Comm. to accept those bids for gravel, storm sewer & prime coat which them feel are most advantagous to the Village.

It was moved and seconded that the Bid of G.A. Watson be rejected . Carried.

Allan Powers told of talking with George Wandtlandt at his Hollandale job who was interested in furnishing gravel & prime coat for this job but had not given any prices on either.

Pres. Stenseth reported that the County would do the job for 60¢ per cubic yard and the Rule Construction had submitted a bid on an hourly basis.

It was moved and seconded that the Contract for grading be wwarded to Rule Construction co., Mineral Point, on an hourly basis of as follows: D-7 Cat. \$14./hr, Turnappull Scraper \$14/hr, Frontend loader \$12/hr & Grader \$12/hr. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that the Road & Street comm. be given authority to let contracts for gravel, prime coat & storm sewer at the best bid received. Carried.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 PM by Pres. R. Stenseth.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and subsequent special meeting were read and approved.

Committee Reports:

Public Works - Streets - Trustee T.I. Armeson, in the absence of A. Powers, reported that the Storm Sewer construction contract had been let to Johnson & McDermott of Ridgeway, Wis. for \$1,885.00 and the base course gravel contract had been let to G.A. Watson of Barneveld, Wis. for \$1.60 per yard.

Discussion by the Board was held regarding the continuing of the Main Street Construction project to include curb & gutter construction at this time. It was announced that a petition for Curb & Gutter installation had been signed by all of the freeholders on Main Street east from Jones Street to the Chi. & NW Railradd crossing, with the exception of Fred W. Maahs.

resolution was unanimously adopted

It was moved, seconded and as/ried that plans & specifications be prepared for the letting of contracts to construct Curb & Gutter on Main Street as reconstructed and that the advertisement for bids on said construction be prepared for insertion, subject to the obtaining of the signature of Fred W. Maahs on the petition now being circulated.

Public Health - Health Officer O. Oimoen reported that his committee had met at the Barneveld Co-op mill and checked same for excess dust conditions. They reported that the dust collectors installed on grinders and mixers were operative and functioning in good order but that dust conditions are prevalent at the loading area on the west side of the building where the bulk feed truck is loaded with waste from grinding and milling operations. It is Their recommendation that this area be enclosed.

Mr. Alvin Evans appeared before the Board regarding opening new streets in unplatted areas of the village corporate limits. This is in the event he should buy a parcel of land which has not been platted and which does not at present have street access. It was recommended to Mr. Evans that he contact an engineer and/or lawyer for platting assistance.

Discussion was held regarding the hiring of additional employees on a fulltime basis for the Village. All members of the Board were in agreement that more services were required and that present employees should be augmented. It was moved, seconded and carried that this problem be given greater study with respect to wages, hours and capabilities of labor available.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the R. J. Olson Glass Co. of Madison be contacted to correct the library windows problem at their bid price of \$42.00. Clerk to notify.

The problem of cinders and ashes at the School building was discussed with the solution presented of "we'll haul if they will load". Agreed.

Pres. Stenseth stated that Albert Olson had indicated that he would refuse to pay for the cutting of weeds on his lot for various reasons, the bill being \$3.00. The Board was unanimous for cancelling the bill.

The question of raising the legal age limit from 18 years for the consumption of beer in the Village was discussed because of increasing disturbances, noise, parking and traffic violations in the vicinity of the two taverns. Because this situation could not be solved at this time it was decided to inform the Village Marshall to be much stricter in enforcing traffic regulations and disturbances of the peace in the community. Clerk to order two new "No Parking in Alley" signs from Waupun.

Application for Bartender license from Herman Duerst presented, without notary public acknowledgement or required fee. Approved subject to correction to comply with licensing regulations.

Notices of public hearings and results of public hearings by the County School Committee read by clerk and filed.

Mr. Harold Loutes of the State Board of Health appeared before the Board to discuss floridation of our public water supply. The State Board of Health recommends increasing the flourine content of our water to 1 to 1.2 parts to 1 million parts of water to help reduce tooth decay. After discussion by the Board the following resolution was presented and carried by unanimous vote.

Resolved, that the Fluoride content in the Barneveld Village Water Supply be increased to approximately one part per

million as recommended by the State Board of Health.

Because the curb & gutter work has been completed for this year, the following resolution for assessing costs to property owners was duly presented and carried.

Resolved, that the Barneveld Village Board receive and ratify the order for construction on the bid of \$2.30 per lineal foot submitted by John Herheim and Son, Madison, Wis., to install curb and gutter fronting both sides of Main Street from its intersection with Jones Street on the West to its intersection with the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Co. tracks on the East.

Be it further resolved, that upon completion of the stated improvement, one-half the costs thereof, based on the consent of the abutting owners under Section 66.60 (18) be levied as a special assessment against the property benefited thereby; and that the Chicago and Northwestern Railraod Company be billed as provided under Section 66.698, Wisconsin Statutes for 1959.

Such special Assessment, if not fully paid as required by the levy of the general 1960 taxes, shall be paid in four equal annual installments, the first installment to be due as on the general levied taxes for 1960 with interest on the unpaid balance at the rate of 47% from January 1, 1961.

CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

SECTION 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

Section 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

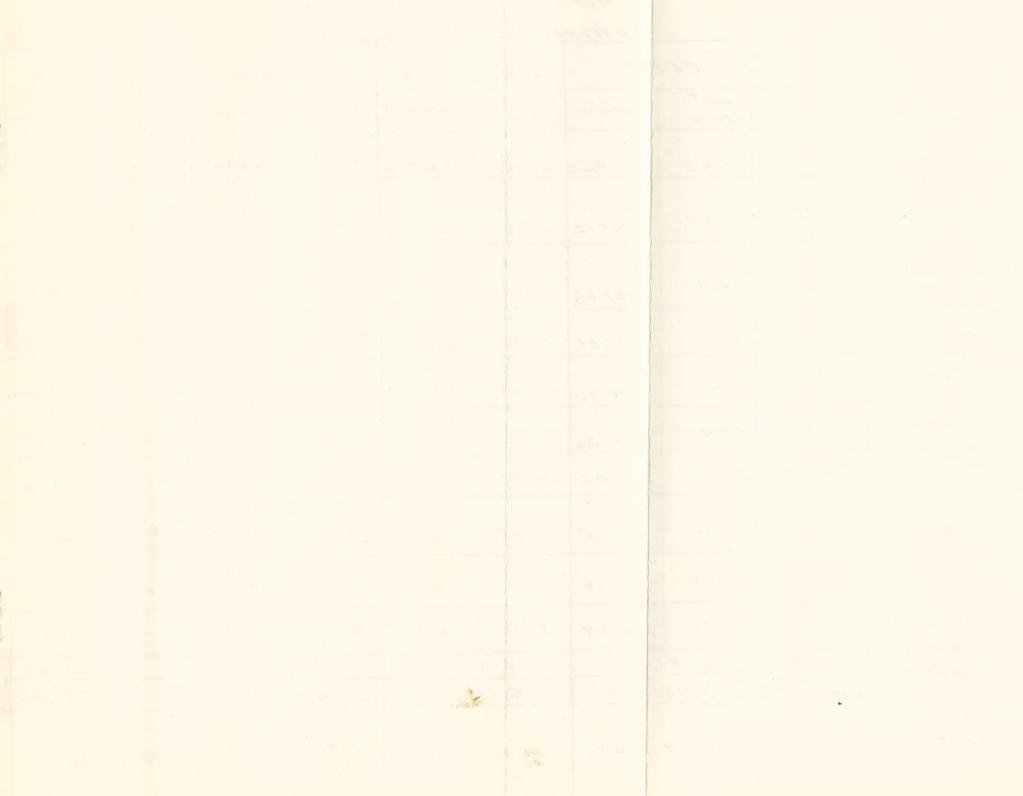

John Blaser, being duly sworn by the clerk, presented his objection to his assessment because his East one-half of Lot 3 is assessed higher than the West one-half of Lot 3 (Mercantile vs. residential). Clerk pointed out the front foot differences as follows: Lot 2 -(Blaser residential) \$12.41; Lot 3, East 1/2 - (Blaser mercantile) \$21.44; West 1/2 - (Moyer residential) - \$17.28; Lot 4 - (Campbell-mercantile) - \$32.33. After discussion with the Board, Mr. Blaser asked that his objection be dismissed and it was withdrawn.

Otto Oimoen, being duly sworn by the clerk, presented his objections to his assessment as follows:

- l. He felt that it is assessed for more money than he can get for the property on the present market. He stated that his understanding of the assessor's manual was that property could not be sessed for more than market value.
- 2. He insisted that the assessment was for more than the actual cash outlay to build the property in 1949, the total assessment being \$21,540. while his invoices show cash outlay of \$14,056.50.

Arneson reported that his comm. had not been able to get the final information necessary regarding refinancing the Village debt and the borrowing of additional money for local projects by this meeting. His committee recommends that the meeting be adjourned subject to the President's call for study on these matters at a future dtate following the close of regular business.

Public Welfare: Trustee M.E. Arneson reported that the civil defense emergency material had arrived and had been unloaded and stored at the Masomic Hall as planned. Mrs. Raffaelle had not been contacted at the time due to the lateness of the hour.

Discussion was held concerning the offices of Justice of Peace and Marshall. It was agreeable to all members present that due to possible misunderstanding, the heretofore unwritten policy of this Board shall be inserted in these minutes, as follows:

This Board has not at any time in the past, does not at this time, and does not anticipate at any future time; 1. set a schedule of fines to be levied by the Justice of Peace at his court, and 2. request partiality on the part of the Marshall in his duties with regard to violations of local law. The Board feels that it is the duty of the Justice to be governed by State Statute and his own judgement with regard to punishment for violations of local laws and regulations. The Board also feels that utmost care and good judgement must be shown and exercised by village law enforcement officers in their duties.

Discussion was held concerning local tavern operations and reported abuses by the customers of these business places. The possiblity of raising the age limit for these taverns from 18 years was discussed. It was decided that the proprietors of both taverns be requested to be present at a future meeting to discuss this more fully.

The heating plant at the Library was discussed because of past trouble with the oil burning space heater presently in use. After the various types of heating units were mentioned it was decided that Trustee W.R. Thousand should obtain cost figures for conversion to a gas-type heater.

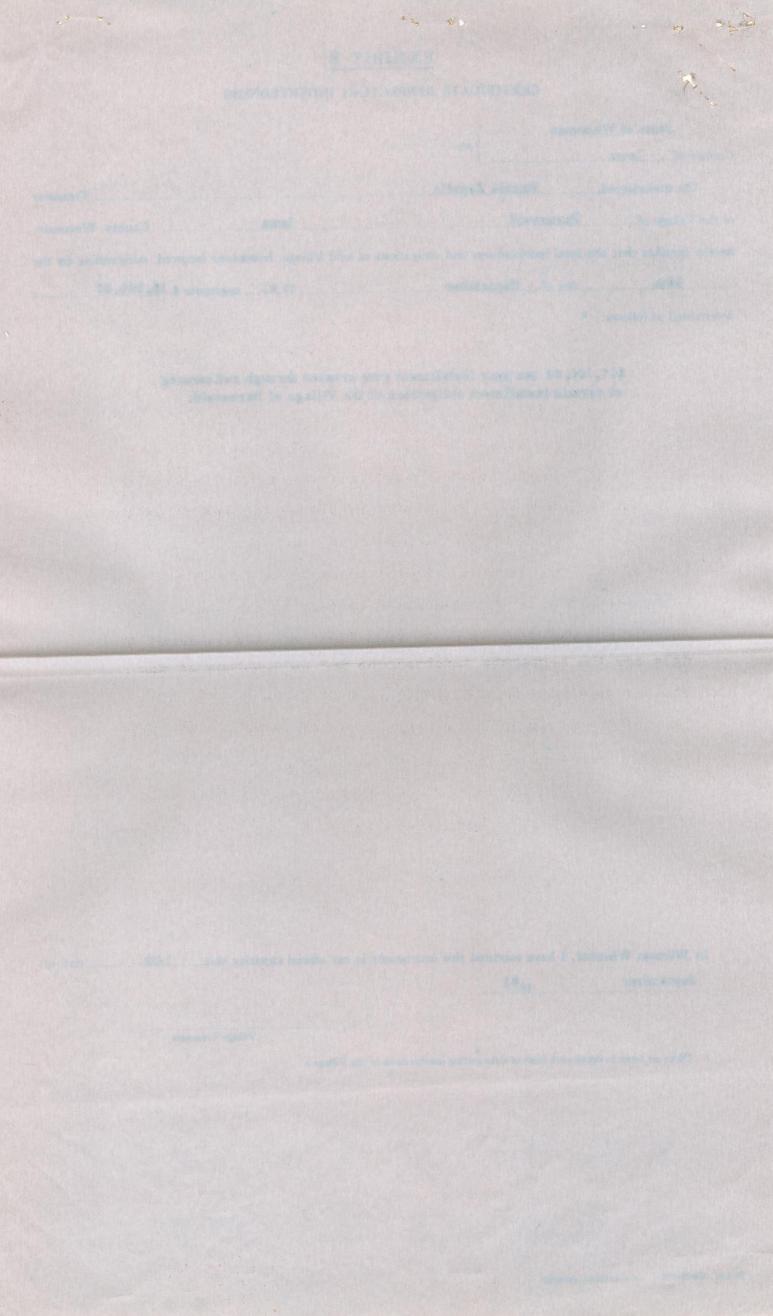

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM by Pres. R. Stenseth, who stated the purpose of the meeting to be to consider and decide on a financing plan for the village debt and to handle any other matters which might properly opme before the meeting.

Truste e T.I. Arneson reported that the Finance Comm. had finally obtained the nesessary information and presented that committee's recommendations:

- 1. That the present village debt of \$17,100. consisting of \$3,000. for Water Utility extension, \$2,400. for Ball-park lights and \$11,700. for Street Reconstruction, be refinanced with the First National Bank of Madison on a 10 year amortization at 4%; and,
- 2. because additional funds are necessary for street work and water utility extensions, that an additional \$15,000. be borrowed from the First National Bank of Madison on a 20 year amortization 10 year maturity at 4%, to be used, \$7,000. for street work and \$8,000. to be loaned to the Water Utility for main extensions.

It was moved by Trustee T.I. Arneson, seconded by M.E. Arneson, that these resolutions in for form of the copies attached hereto and made a part of these minutes be adopted. Carried.

Pres. Stenseth requested suggestions from the Board as to possible replacements for Max Theobald as Justice of Peace, as he had indicated an interest in resigning the position. No action taken.

Severtsen presented facts and figures on the effects of alcholic beverages as pointed up in a study, "A Christian Approach To The Alcholic Beverage Question" by the Committee on Social Action of The American Lutheran Church.

Trustee T.I. Arneson stated that he would prefer the Board to issue a warning to the tavern operators at this time rather than arbitrarily raising the age limit.

Trustee O. Oimoen stated that he wished to be on record as being in favor of raising the age limit to 21.

Pres. Stenseth expressed his opinion of being in favor of not raising the; age 1 imit immediately without first discussing fully the issue with the Pastors, tavern operators and the Board as a whole.

Trustee M. E. Arneson stated that he felt the changes should be made at a higher level of government, such as County or State and that advertising of beer and liquor should be more rigidly controlled.

Fred Olson and Milton Hughes, operators of the Village Bar and Vet's Bar respectively, appeared before the Board at it's request to discuss this issue. They both felt that their places of business were run in an orderly=enough manner, and that the Masshall should exericse more controll of individuals on the street and in cares, rather than park some distance away where he cannot adequately observe and control matters which might get out of hand.

Pres. S^Tens eth stated the Board's position on this matter to Olson and Hughes in that complaints had been made and the Board felt that something should be done now before more serious happenings occur. Both were informed as to the possibility of the raise in age limits. Mr. Olson and Mr. Hughes both individually stated that they would do all that they could to maintain orderly places of business, but felt that one their customers left their places of business, they should not be held accountable for the customers actions.

Trustee W.R. Thousand reported that a gas furnace, floor model, complete with controls and bottlegas hookup could be installed for \$45. with present heater and' tank traded in. It was moved by Trustee M.E.Arneson 2nd by A. Miller to install such heater. Carried.

Clerk reported on annual street rport to State wotj School Corssing signs. It was moved and seconded by Trustee J. Koenig and W. Thousand to purchase additional school signs and crossing signs as suggested by the Clerk. Carried.

Trustee J. Koenig requested opinion of Board with regard to Johnson and McDermott being requested to remove rock on trench and grade back to proper condition.

Referred to Street Committee.

CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

Section 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
 - SECTION 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

ORDINANCE NO. 27

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL JUSTICE OF THE PEACE FOR THE VILLAGE OF BARNEVELD

The Village Board of the Village of Barneveld, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Municipal Justice of the Peace created. Pursuant to the authority granted by S. 62.24, Wisconsin Statutes of 1961, there is hereby created the office of Municipal Justice of the Peace for the Village of Barneveld.

Section 2. Election: Term. The Municipal Justice of the Peace shall be elected at large at the spring election commencing with the April, 1963, election for a term of two (2) years commencing on May 1 succeeding his election.

Section 3. Salary. The Municipal Justice of the Peace shall receive a salary of at least Twenty-Four and No/100 Dollars (\$24.00) per year as determined from time to time by the Village Board payable in equal monthly payments which shall be in lieu of fees and costs. No salary shall be paid to the justice for any time during his term for which he has not executed and filed his official bond and oath as required by Section 4. of this ordinance.

Section 4. Bond: Oath. The Municipal Justice of the Peace shall execute and file with the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Iowa County the oath prescribed by law (S. 256.02 of the Wisconsin Statutes) and a bond in the minimum penal sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as prescribed by S. 61.30 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Section 5. Jurisdiction. The Municipal Justice of the Peace shall have such jurisdiction as provided in S. 62.24 of the Wisconsin Statutes and exclusive jurisdiction of violations of Village Ordinances.

Section 6. Procedure.

- a. The Court of the Municipal Justice of the Peace shall be called the "Municipal Justice Court for Barneveld, Wisconsin" and shall be open as determined by order of the Municipal Justice.
- b. The Municipal Justice shall keep his office and hold Court in the Village Hall in the Village of Barneveld on the first and third Wednesdays of each month.
- c. Except as provided by law, the procedure in Municipal Justice Court shall be the same as applicable to other justices of the peace.
- d. The Municipal Justice of the Peace shall collect all forfeitures, fines and taxable costs in any action or proceeding before him and shall pay over such moneys to the Village Treasurer not later than the second business day succeeding his receipt thereof.
- e. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect on January 1, 1962, upon passage and posting as provided by law; provided the Village Board shall appoint a temporary Municipal Justice to assume jurisdiction under this ordinance on January 1, 1962, and serve until a regular Municipal Justice is elected and qualified pursuant to this ordinance. Such temporary Municipal Justice shall comply with the requirements of Section 4. of this ordinance within 10 days after notice of his appointment.

Resolution designating Barbara Arneson as having authority to pay out and receive miscelleneous municipal funds for the Library Board moved by Trustee T.I.Arneson, 2nd by J. Koenig, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. Carried.

Pres. Stenseth explained briefly the County Board's Library Committee's duties and position regarding the Library Processing Center and of its value to the Village abd County as a whole.

The Auditing Committee consisting of the Village President and tho-se Trustees present as indicated above audited the books of the Clerk and Treasurer for the General Fund and after inspecting and reading each order and the income account, moved that the balance to the credit of the Village of Barneveld General Fund of \$2,883.19 as shown on the respective books of the Clerk and Treasurer agreed with the balance to the credit of the said Village on the books of the Barneveld State Bank, Barneveld. - 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

SECTION 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

Section 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. - (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

WHEREAS, the Village Board of said Village deems it necessary to its safety and interest to borrow said amount, and said money is needed for the following purposes:

Water main replacement and extension and current expenses,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village Board of the Village of Barneveld of Iowa County of the State of Wisconsin, that imm order to pay the current and ordinary expenses of said Village, the President of said Village Board and the Clerk of said Village be and they are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from Barneveld State Bank the sum of Ten Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) and to evidence such indebtedness of said Village, said President and Clerk shall execute and deliver to the Lender the promissory note of said Village to the amount of Ten Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) each, which note shall bear interest at the rate of four per cent (4%) per annum, said note to be dated July 10, 1964, and shall be payable on the 1st day of April, 1965, and signed by the said President and Clerk and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to provide for the payment of the principal and interest of said note on or before the thirtieth (30th) day of August following the next tax levy there shall be and there is hereby levied on all the taxable property of said Village, in addition to all other taxes, a sum sufficient to pay the principal of Ten Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) and interest thereon at the rate of four per cent (4%) per annum from the date of said note to the date of maturity of said note as aforesaid, which tax after receipt of the borrowed money shall become and continue irrepealable and shall be carried into the next tax roll of the Village and collected as other taxes are collected, as provdided by law and when said tax is so collected it shall be kept in a separate and distinct fund and be used for the sole purpose of paying the principal and interest on the said note provided for in this resolution.

This resolution is made by virtue of and under the provisions of Section 67.12 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Meeting called to order by Pres. Stenseth who called on Trustee T.I. Arneson for report of Finance Committee regarding the Budget. T.I. It was reported that the replacement valves for the water utility had arrived and would be installed in the near future.

Discussion was held concerning the condition of the Town of Brigham Fire Dept. water tanker. Matter referred to Fire Dept. Engineer V. Jabs to take care of and to inform Town officials.

Police Chief Albert Miller reported that he was hving trouble with the offical light on his car and requested a different type to replace it with. It was moved by Trustee J. Koenig seconded by T.I.Arneson for Miller & Clerk to order necessary light. Carried. Matter of bike riding was also discussed. Letterof opinion from Village Attorney H. Cook read by Clerk which stated that existing State Statutes adequately covered this problem unless the village wished to license bicycles.

Pres. Stenseth reported that Curtis Zepplin would rent garage space in his building to the village at \$10.00 per truck per month. There being no other available space it was moved by Trustee W.R. Thousand seconded by J. Koenig to lease same at that rate for the winter months. Carried.

The question of village employees doing plumbing work in private residences while on Water Utility business was discussed. Because the Board felt that this was infringing on private business it was moved by Trustee T. Myers seconded by J. Koenig that village employees not be allowed and shall have no authority to do any plumbing work in private homes when on Village Water Utility business. Carried. The question of liability for damage to water meters thru freezing was also raised. Trustee T.I.Arneson reported that Utility P.S. rules state that cost of repairs to meters damaged by frost thru negligence of property owner is the responsibility 66 the property owner or water user. The question of non-admittance to homes by owner of meter reader was discussed. The Board felt that police officer should accompany reader on second visit in order to maintain law % order.

Pres. Stenseth reported that he had been appointed to a committee formed to protest curtailment of service of CGNW RR. Board as a whole felt that this action was too light and too late and recommended that he not attend meeting.

Bartender License application of D. Wayne Dyreson was approved on motion of Trustee T.I.Arneson seconded by T. Myers and carried.

Letter of opinion regarding the changing of names of streets was read by Clerk. Motion by J. Moenig seconded by M.E.Arneson to change the name of Water Street to Arneson Road was carried.

(1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

- 34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.
- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

- 34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.
- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

- 34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.
- 34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in s. 34.105 (1) shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).
- 66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).
- (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.
- (3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall countersign all order checks. [In school districts having 5 or more school board members the actual signature of any board member other than the clerk or treasurer may be used in place of the director's signature]. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.
- (4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.
- (5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.
- (6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.
- (7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

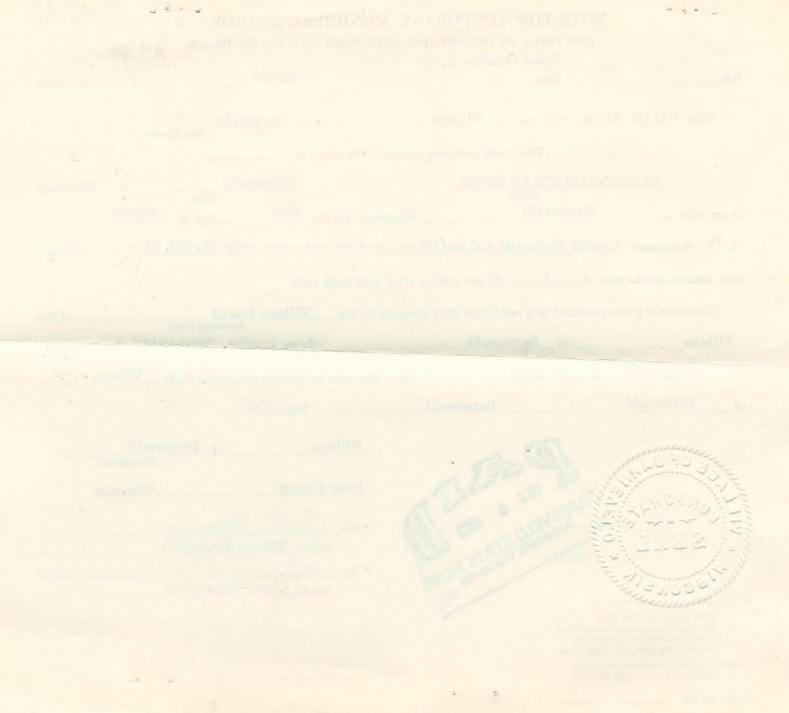

Dear Ted:

We have obtained information from Roland Strahota on the condition of the pump he removed from your well, reviewed our data on your water supply system, and came up with some recommendations.

Very briefly, we are thinking of the following step by step procedure:

1. Remove present submersible pump.

2. Make alinement test on well.

3. Install present lineshaft pump repaired for 18 month operation. Steps 1, 2, and 3 would be accomplished in one continuous operation so that the reservoir could supply water demand until the well was again operating.

4. Make study of Village water supply system, with recommendations on second well, type of pump to be used in present well, rebuilding of existing lineshaft pump to fit conditions of operation in well in which it is to be used, location of standby engine drive, pressure levels to be maintained in system, system storage, and water main improvements.

Construction of new facilities and revision of existing facilities as agreed upon by Village.

The suggested program will result in an adequate dependable future water supply and also give the Village the greatest dependability possible until improvements are completed. We suggest a meeting with the Village Board at which we will explain our recommendations so that the Board can decide what they wish to do.
