



Administration

Dr. Kit Saunders, the former Director of UW Women's Athletics for nine years, assumed a new role in the Wisconsin Athletic Administration in 1983. As the Associate Director of Non-Revenue Sports, Kit oversees the policies and direction of the 22 men's and women's non-revenue sports.

Kit's long association with Wisconsin includes serving as the women's club sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education and women's tennis coach prior to her appointment as Director of Women's Athletics in 1974.

She has held positions of athletic leadership at the state, regional and national level. As one of the founders of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Kit served in numerous state offices including that of president. She was formerly a commissioner for the six-state Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW), and was elected vice-president for Division I schools of the former Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

In 1984, Kit was honored as the first member of the Wisconsin Women's Athletics Hall of Fame in recognition of her contributions to intercollegiate athletics for women on the UW campus. Paula Bonner became the Assistant Athletic Director in charge of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Program in 1983. Now in her eighth year of administrative association with the UW program, Paula oversees the complete operation of the 11-sport Badger women's program including budget preparation and expenditures, financial aid, special events arrangements, and recruiting.

She has served as the chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees, and heads the UW Athletic Board Women's Sports Committee. She is also a charter member of the Wisconsin Task Force on Women's Sports which is affiliated with the Wisconsin Women's Network, and serves on the steering committee for the Association of University Community Women.

Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 11-sport women's athletic program lies with Tamara J. Flarup, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Now in her ninth year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction, the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (W.I.S. Club) in its promotions and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, served as a coordinator for the CoSIDA Publications Contest Committee, and was a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee. She has been a contributing writer on women's sports in the NCAA Public Relations Manual the past two editions.

In 1983, Tam was selected as one of 34 sports information directors to serve as a media liaison director for the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs.

Academic Counseling

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the men and women student athletes.

Assistant Athletic Director Dr. Diane Johnson and Counselors Alan Zussman and Mary Weaver are responsible for the Wisconsin Athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Alan have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane, Alan, and Mary offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The counseling staff takes a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.

Sports Medicine

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a six-person staff of N.A.T.A. certified athletic trainers. Gordon Stoddard, Jan Tappon, Joe Baer, Dennis Helwig, Sherri Springer, and Jim Bossany are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and two certified graduate assistant as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Armory, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Program Assistants

Program Assistants Roxann Zimmerman, Marilyn Sheldon, and Jackie Larson assist the Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Program in operating at peak efficiency. Roxann and Marilyn work closely with the athletic directors and coaches, as well as with the W.I.S Club booster organization. Jackie assists the coaches in expense reports. All are an integral part of office efficiency and public relations.




The Wisconsin women's volleyball team completed its third season of official Big Ten Conference competition with a 1–12 record, finishing in fifth place in the Conference's West division and in a tie for ninth overall. The Badgers hope to improve upon their 5–23 overall finish with a solid nucleus of returning starters.

The foundation of Coach Carney's youth movement will be the experience of eight returning letter winners, including five starters. Juniors Julie Fautsch of Spring Lake Park, MN, Sue Gilmeister of Oak Creek, WI, and sophomore Kristen Roman of Barrington, IL will pace the Badgers. Fautsch led the team in block solos (33), and assists (71), and was second in digs (230) and in kills (192). Gilmeister recorded 239 digs and 827 assists as the Badger setter, including a 65 assist performance against Minnesota. Roman put away 275 kills during the 1984 season for a 9.8 kill per match average. Her 226 digs were the third best total for the team, and she led the Badgers with 38 service aces.

Volleyball has been a varsity sport for 11 years at the University of Wisconsin and has achieved an overall mark of 265 wins and 195 losses. Besides participating in the intercollegiate competitive season extending from September through November, the varsity team also competes in the "second season" as a school-sponsored USVBA team. The Big Ten volleyball teams will participate for the first time in an 18-match, double round-robin schedule beginning in 1985.








Former UW assistant Coach Russ Carney begins his fourth season as head women's volleyball coach. Carney came to Wisconsin from Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, MI, where he coached his 1980 women's volleyball team to the NJCAA National Championship Title.

The former U.S. National team member began his playing career at Kellogg and later transferred to Ball State University, where he lettered two years. Russ earned his bachelors degree in physical education from Ball State in 1977 and returned to Kellogg Community College as the assistant coach prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Besides the national champion women's team, Russ has had successful coaching endeavors with the Junior Olympics, where his men's team won the gold medal in 1980. Russ collected another gold medal in the 1981 National Sports Festival when he coached the men's East team to a first-place Festival finish.



Paula Martin joins the Wisconsin women's athletic staff as the assistant volleyball coach. A native of Rockford, IL., she has competitive experience as a four year member of the Northern Illinois University Volleyball program. She earned All-MAC conference honors her junior year and was selected captain of her senior squad.

A 1983 physical education graduate of Northern Illinois, Paula has coached the past two years at the Sports Performance Volleyball Club in Chicago, one of the nation's top junior volleyball teams. Additional coaching experience includes working as the assistant coach at Elmhurst College for the past year.

"Paula brings a good knowledge of volleyball to our program with a broad base of teaching skills and a good base in physical training," said Head Coach Carney. "She's young and enthusiastic about volleyball and wants to take the time and effort to keep our program moving forward."







The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.




