RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

1. That the plans and specifications for the storage battery room and equipment, Sterling Hall, be approved, and that authority be granted to advertise for bids.

Moved by Regent Richardson, seconded by Regent Butler, that in the absence of the Business Manager during the summer of 1930, A. W. Peterson, Assistant to the Business Manager, be authorized to sign and approve requisitions and other documents and papers ordinarily requiring the signature of the Business Manager.

Moved by Regent Richardson, seconded by Regent Butler, that the offer of Zeier Bros. of Madison, Wisconsin, to purchase the building formerly occupied by the branch postoffice at 1214 University Avenue for the sum of \$55.00 and to remove the building from the premises to the foundation level be accepted.

Moved by Regent Butler, seconded by Regent Richardson, that all bids submitted for the construction of the sewer to the engineering tract be rejected, and that authority be granted to advertise for new bids.

Upon motion of Regent Butler, seconded by Regent Richardson, the creation of a trust fund for summer session earnings and death benefits was approved, subject to the approval of the plan by the Director of the Budget. The following is the plan for the operation of the fund:

1. That the amounts now standing to the credit of members of the faculty be transferred, when request is received in writing, to the principal of the university trust funds, to an account to be designated "Summer Session Deposits".

2. That a sufficient sum be kept at all times in the summer session deposit account to meet requests for cash withdrawals.

3. That sums in excess of a sufficient amount to meet cash withdrawals be invested as other Trust Funds are invested and the Income each year be credited to an account to be designated, "Summer Session Income Account for Death Claims".

4. That any faculty member who has cash on deposit for teaching in summer session at time of death be automatically awarded a settlement on the basis of <u>leave</u> on full salary for the period to be determined from the amount of the deposit; i.e., one-fourth year for each six weeks summer session credit on deposit.

S.S. J. nuct Fund 5. That at the close of each future summer session complete pay rolls shall be issued and those who are permitted to deposit their checks upon approval of the Director of Summer Session may endorse the checks and deliver them to the Secretary of the Regents to be turned over to the summer session deposit account.

6. That all interest earned on moneys in the summer session deposit account shall be credited to the Summer Session Income Account for Death Claims, and that no interest is to accrue to any depositor who elects at any time to withdraw in cash the amount on deposit to his credit.

The Business Manager called attention to the desirability of acquiring the Cape property at 307 North Orchard Street in order that the site may be used for the utilities necessary in connection with the development of the University electrical distribution <u>system</u>. It was understood that consideration would be given to this purchase when the distribution of the \$81,092 remaining in 20.41 (1)(R) is made.

The meeting adjourned until 9 o'clock Friday, June 20.

Upon recommendation of the Memorial Union Finance Committee the salary of Miss Lee Bacon, hostess, was increased to \$150 per month for ten months, beginning July 1, 1930. Increase charged to Miscellaneous Labor and Contingent.

√The matter of the distribution of the balance of \$81,092 in 20.41(1)R was discussed and upon motion of Regent Richardson, seconded by Regent Butler, it was

VOTED, That \$35,000 be made available for buildings for animal research and \$16,000 for the purchase of land in the heating plant block; that the balance of \$30,092 be made available for such needs as may develop, as determined by the executive committee.
