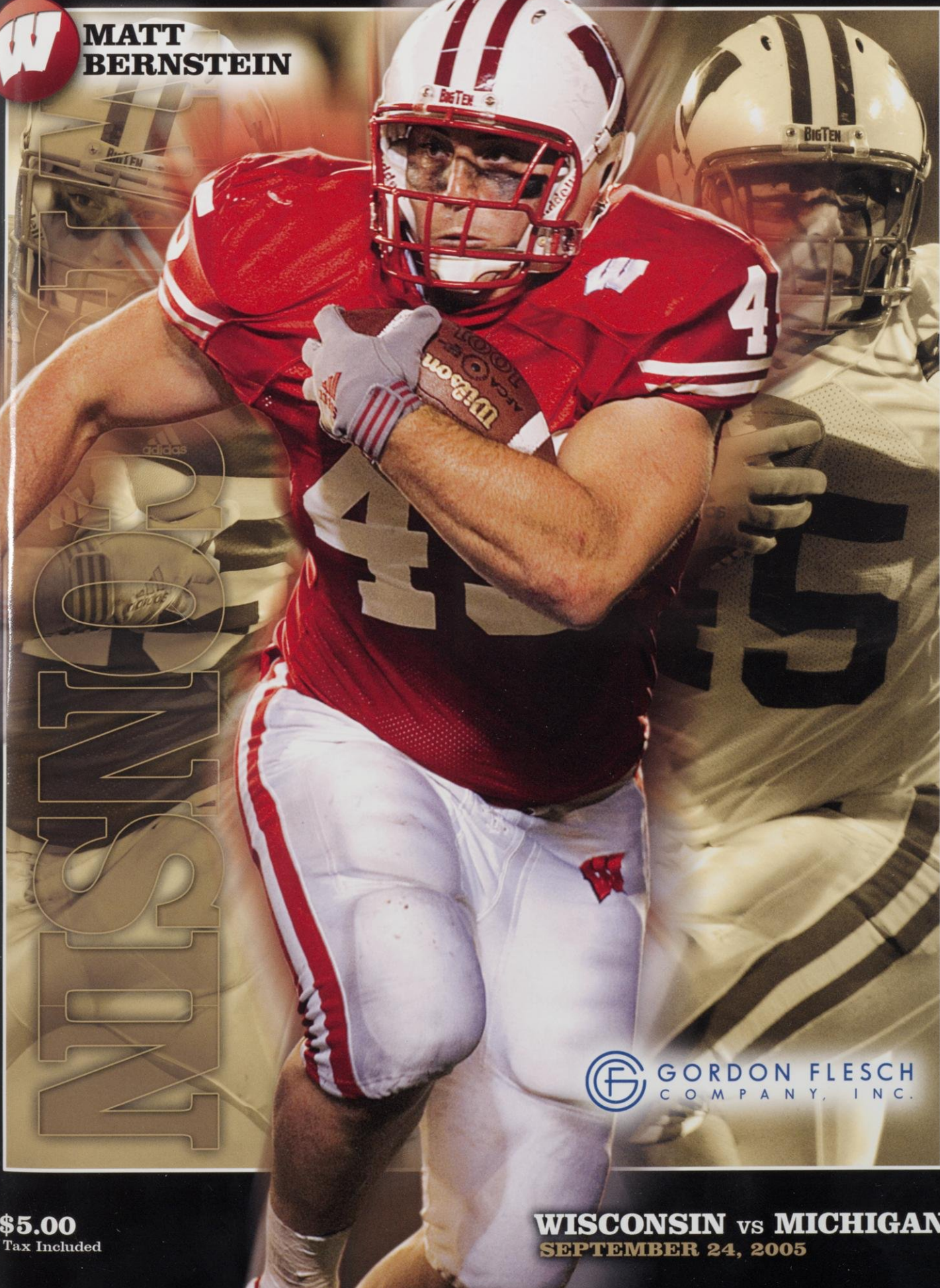

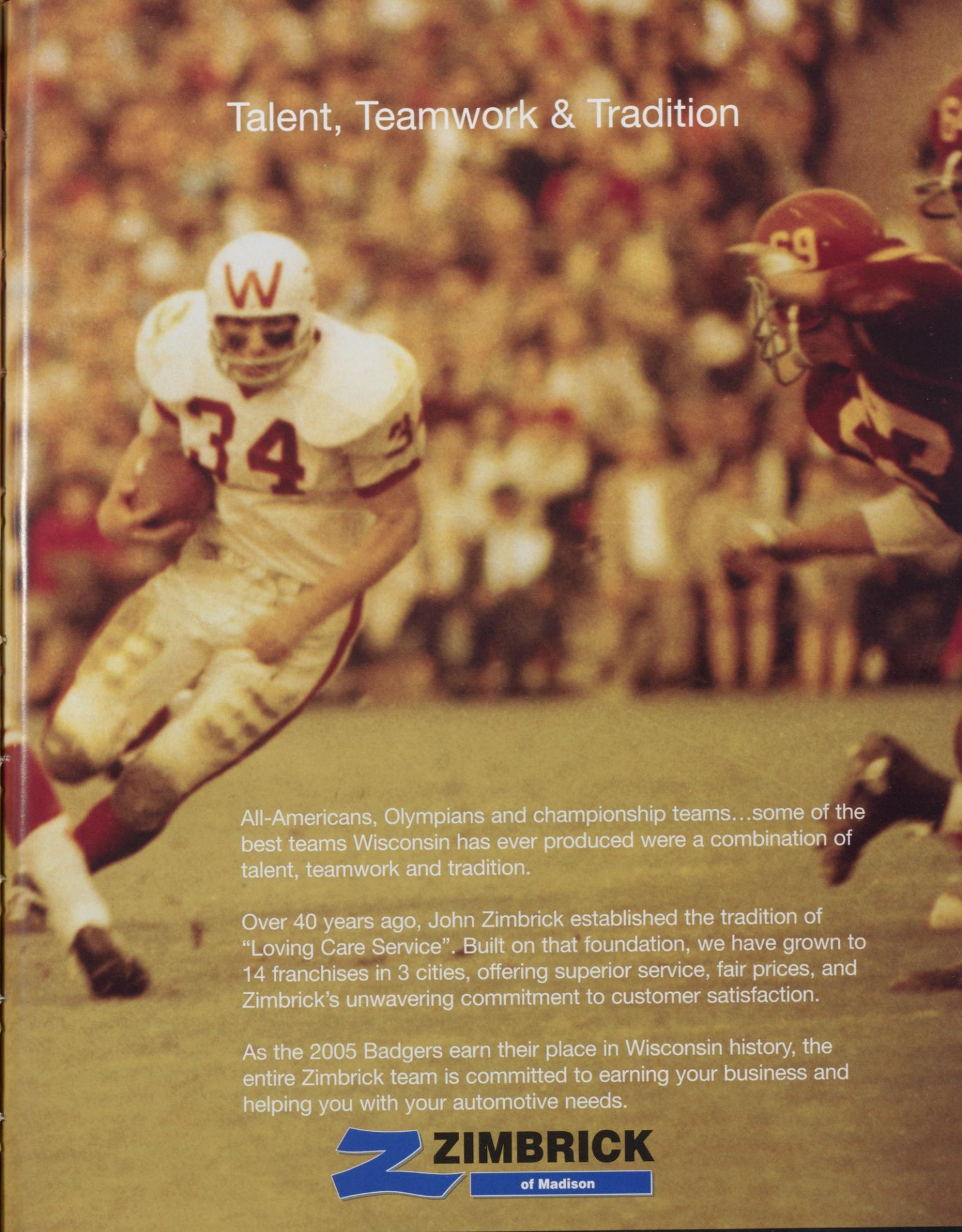

### Badgers Open Conference Season with No. 13 Michigan

Wisconsin (3-0) hosts Michigan (2-1) today at 80,321-seat Camp Randall Stadium (Field Turf). Kickoff is set for 5 p.m. CDT.

The game will be televised live by ESPN2 (Sean McDonough, Mike Gottfried and Alex Flanagan). The game also can be heard live on the 45-city Wisconsin Radio Network (Matt Lepay and Mike Lucas). WIBA (1310 AM, 101.5 FM) is the rightsholder in Madison.

Wisconsin Public Television (Mike Heller and Scott Nelson) will air its tape-delay telecast of the game statewide at 10:30 p.m. tonight.

Wisconsin improved to 3-0 and cracked the *USA Today* coaches poll (No. 24) for the first time this season after a 14-5 victory at North Carolina last Saturday. The Badgers got 171 yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns from RB Brian Calhoun. The Badger defense held its opponent without a TD for the second consecutive game.

Michigan, ranked 13th by the coaches (*USA Today*) and 14th by the Associated Press, is 2-1 after a 55-0 win at home over Eastern Michigan last Saturday. Today's game will be the Wolverines' first road contest of the season.

### UW-Michigan Series Info

Wisconsin is 10-47-1 all-time against Michigan ... the teams are meeting this season for the first time since a 21-14 Wolverine victory in Ann Arbor on Nov. 16, 2002 ... this will be Michigan's first visit to Madison since it won a 20-17 decision over the Badgers on Nov. 17, 2001 ... the Badgers have not defeated Michigan since a 31-19 victory in Ann Arbor on Oct. 29, 1994 ... UW's last win over Michigan in Madison was a 13-10 verdict on Oct. 30, 1993 ... one of Wisconsin's three wins over a No. 1-ranked opponent came in 1981 when the Badgers defeated the top-ranked Wolverines 21-14 ... the last four meetings between the two schools have been decided by a total of 18 points (4.5 points per game).

### Clamping Down

Wisconsin, No. 4 nationally in rushing defense (39.7 ypg), has allowed just one touchdown in the last 10 quarters of play.

The Badgers have not allowed a touchdown in their past two games. That marks the second time since the start of the 2004 season that UW opponents have failed to reach the end zone in back-to-back games.

Wisconsin has allowed just nine second-half points this season, including none in the third quarter.

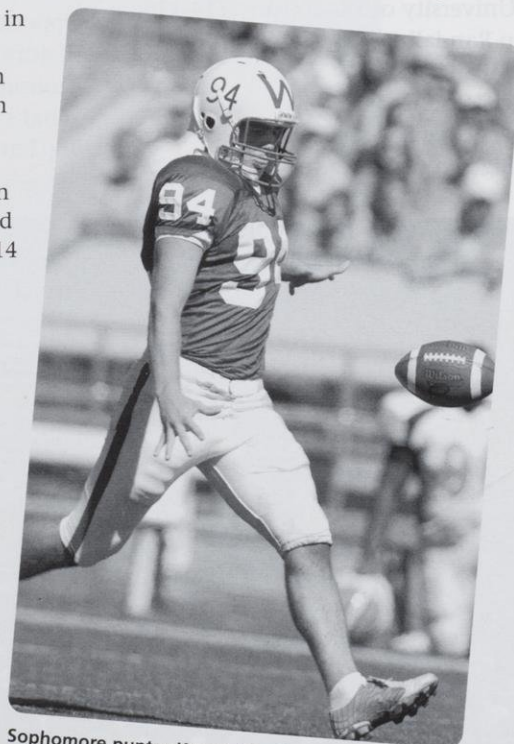
Dating back to the 2004 season-opener, Badger opponents have been limited to fewer than 100 yards rushing in 11 of 15 games (UW is 10-1 in those games).

Wisconsin allowed Temple just 45 yards of total offense. That is the best mark in UW history. The previous low was 71 by California on Sept. 28, 1946. Temple was credited with -11 rushing yards, the second-best mark in UW history. The lowest was -18 by Iowa on Nov. 17, 1951.

### Feeling Right at Home

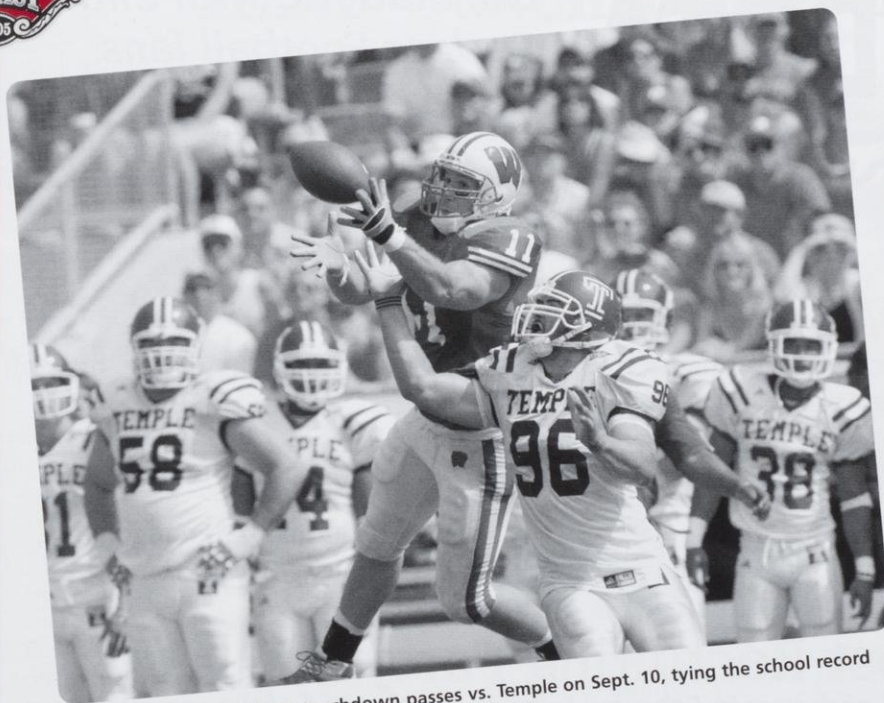
The Badgers are 13-3 in their last 16 home games and have won eight straight at Camp Randall Stadium (that is the ninth-longest current home win streak in the country). It is UW's longest home win streak since the 1998-99 Badgers won eight in a row.

Wisconsin's current eight-game home winning

streak is tied for the second-longest in modern-era school history. The modern era (mid-1940s) school record for consecutive home wins is nine games, accomplished twice (Oct. 31, 1953-Oct. 1, 1955 and Nov. 18, 1961-Oct. 12, 1963).

During their current eight-game home winning streak, the Badgers have allowed an average of just 10.9 points per game at Camp Randall Stadium. That includes Bowling Green's 42-point effort in this year's season-opener.

## Scoring Machine

Wisconsin scored 65 points against Temple on Sept. 10, the second-most in the modern era in school history. The most points scored in the modern era in school history was 69 vs. New Mexico State on Sept. 29, 1962. UW's 65-point margin of victory vs. the Owls was the most in the modern era in school history. It was the Badgers' first shutout since blanking Indiana 59-0 on Oct. 16, 1999.

In its first two games this season, Wisconsin scored a combined 121 points, the most for UW in consecutive games in the modern era. The previous high was 105 points in the

first two games of the 1957 season (60 vs. Marquette and 45 vs. West Virginia). The all-time school record for points in back-to-back games is 167 in the first two games of the 1915 season (82 vs. Lawrence and 85 vs. Marquette). That was also the last time Wisconsin had scored at least 50 points in consecutive games.

## Carrying the Load

Junior RB Brian Calhoun carried 38 times for 171 yards and two TDs at North Carolina last Saturday. He is the nation's No. 3 rusher at 157.0 yards per game. He leads the nation in scoring with eight TDs (16.0 points per game). Calhoun had five career touchdown runs entering this season.

## Doing it All

Senior WR/PR/KR Brandon Williams' 66-yard punt return for a touchdown in the second quarter against Temple on Sept. 10 was the first of his career and the first for a Badger since Jim Leonhard's 63-yard return vs. Purdue on Oct. 18, 2003. It was the longest punt return for a touchdown by a UW player since John Hunt's 89-yard

punt return for a TD on Aug. 31, 2000 vs. Western Michigan.

Williams ranks No. 8 nationally in punt return average (19.3 ypg) and No. 36 in the country in all-purpose yardage average (140.3). He also leads the Badgers with 10 catches for 144 yards.

## Tidbits

◆ Wisconsin is tied for the Big Ten lead with 12 QB sacks. Sophomore DLs Nick Hayden and Kurt Ware lead the Badgers with three sacks apiece.

◆ Wisconsin is 3-0 for the eighth time in the 16-year Alvarez era. In the previous seven seasons in which they started 3-0 under Alvarez, the Badgers averaged 8.6 wins per year.

◆ Wisconsin leads the Big Ten in time of possession, averaging an impressive 35:25 per game. That is nearly a 10 1/2-minute per-game differential.

◆ QB John Stocco is 12-3 in his career as a starting quarterback. His 2,556 career passing yards are good for 13th on UW's career list.

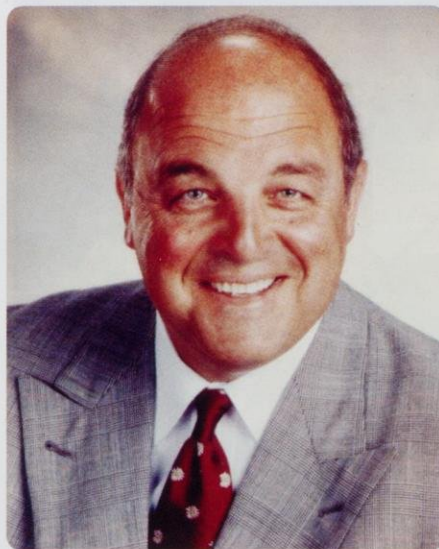
# HEAD COACH BARRY ALVAREZ

**B**arry Alvarez, the winningest football coach in Wisconsin history, has completed 15 seasons at the head of the program he transformed from a perennial second-division finisher to one that is nationally respected and is a fixture on the postseason bowl scene.

Alvarez, whose overall record with the Badgers is 108-70-4, became Wisconsin's Director of Athletics in April of 2004. He is one of just two people (UAB's Watson Brown) at the Division I level who serves as head football coach and athletic director.

Alvarez's list of accomplishments at Wisconsin is remarkable. Consider just a few of the most notable ...

- winningest coach in school history
- coached three Big Ten and Rose Bowl champions
- only Big Ten coach ever to win the Rose Bowl in consecutive seasons
- just the 10th coach in Big Ten history with 100 victories at one conference institution
- has coached five national award winners, including Ron Dayne (Heisman, Doak Walker, Maxwell), Jamar Fletcher (Jim Thorpe) and Kevin Stemke (Ray Guy)
- guided UW to back-to-back Big Ten titles in 1998 and 1999 (hadn't happened at Wisconsin since 1896-97)
- bowl record of 7-3 (.700)



- coached the three winningest teams in school history

When Alvarez arrived in Madison in 1990, Wisconsin had compiled a 9-36 record during the previous four seasons and attendance at Camp Randall Stadium had dipped to an average of 41,734 per game (54 percent of capacity). The program sorely needed a boost and got it when new Director of Athletics Pat Richter hired Alvarez from Notre Dame, where he had been an assistant coach under Lou Holtz.

Alvarez's coaching career began at the high school level. He served as an assistant at Lincoln (Neb.) Northeast High from 1971-73 before taking over as head coach at Lexington (Neb.) High from 1974-75. His last prep coaching stop was at Mason City (Iowa) High where he was head coach from 1976-78 and where his team won a 4A state title in his final year.

Iowa's Hayden Fry hired Alvarez as an assistant coach in 1979. The Hawkeyes played in six bowl games (two Rose Bowls) during Alvarez's eight years in Iowa City, compiling a 61-33-1 mark in the process. Alvarez's standout player with the Hawkeyes was LB Larry Station, a two-time All-American and two-time Academic All-American.

Alvarez left Iowa after the 1986 season to become linebackers coach at Notre Dame. He was promoted (linebackers to defensive coordinator to assistant head coach) by Holtz each of his three seasons as the Fighting Irish went 32-5 and won the 1988 national title. While in South Bend, Alvarez coached All-America linebackers Michael Stonebreaker, Ned Bolcar, Cedric Figaro and Wes Pritchett.

Alvarez grew up in Langeloth, Pa., a small town among the coal mines and steel mills in western Pennsylvania. He starred as a prep linebacker and went on to play at Nebraska (1965-67) for leg-

endary head coach Bob Devaney. Alvarez was the leading tackler for the 1967 Cornhuskers, who led the nation in total defense and created a school-record 40 turnovers. Alvarez played in both the Sugar and Orange Bowls at Nebraska (the Cornhuskers were 25-7 during his three varsity seasons). Alvarez earned his bachelor's degree in 1969 and added a master's degree in 1971, both from Nebraska.

Alvarez's family includes his wife, Cindy, daughters Dawn (Mrs. Brad Ferguson) and Stacy (Mrs. Mike Delzer), son Chad (wife Stephanie), grandsons Joe and Jake Ferguson and Jackson Delzer, and granddaughter Grace Delzer.

- Alvarez set a goal to become a collegiate head coach by his 42nd birthday and was named to the Wisconsin post three days after he turned 42.
- Alvarez added administrative duties to his job description in 2000 when he was named Associate Athletic Director. He became Wisconsin's Director of Athletics in April 2004, operating in a dual role as football coach as well.
- Alvarez grew up in a small mining town (Langeloth) in western Pennsylvania. He played all sports as a kid and idolized former Pittsburgh Pirates outfielder Roberto Clemente.
- Babcock Hall, which houses the UW-Madison's nationally acclaimed

dairy school, developed an ice cream flavor in honor of the Badger head coach in 1994. It was named Berry Alvarez, and the flavor was a mixture of raspberry, strawberry and blueberry.

- Alvarez, a big baseball fan, helped honor former Chicago Cubs' announcer Harry Caray by singing "Take me out to the ballgame" during a seventh-inning stretch in May of 1999.
- Alvarez was a finalist for ESPN's College Football Coach of the Decade Award in 1999. He was one of 18 coaches named to a new position in 1990 and is the only one still at the school that hired him.
- Barry Alvarez got his college coaching start with Hayden Fry at Iowa in 1979, one season after leading Mason City High School to the 4A state championship. One of the staffs of which Alvarez was a member featured six men who went on to lead their own college programs: Alvarez; Kirk Ferentz, Iowa; Dan McCarney, Iowa State; Del Miller,

# CHANCELLOR JOHN D. WILEY



Chancellor John D. Wiley received his bachelor's degree in physics from Indiana University in 1964. He attended graduate school at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and received master's and doctoral degrees in physics in 1965 and 1968, respectively. He joined the technical staff of Bell Telephone Laboratories at Murray Hill, N.J., from 1968 to 1974, and then spent a year at the Max Planck Institute in Stuttgart, Germany, as a recipient of the Alexander von Humboldt Senior U.S. Service Award for Research and Teaching.

Wiley joined the UW-Madison faculty in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering in 1975. His research and teaching focused on a variety of topics related to semiconductors and other materials, and processes important to the electronics field. He is a co-founder of several highly successful research centers, including the Center for X-ray Lithography and the Engineering Research Center for Plasma-Aided Manufacturing. From 1982 to 1986, he chaired the Materials Science Program, a graduate-level, interdepartmental-committee program for master's and doctoral degrees.

From 1986 to 1989, Wiley served as associate dean for research in the College of Engineering, with oversight responsibility for all aspects of graduate study, grant submission, agency liaison, research infrastructure and centers, and technology transfer. From 1989 to 1994, he was dean of the UW-Madison Graduate School and the university's senior research officer.

Prior to his appointment to the university's top position, Wiley served as provost and vice chancellor for academ-

ic affairs, which carries the responsibility of chief operating officer and deputy chancellor. As provost, he worked closely with deans, faculty, academic staff and student committees in the exercise of shared governance and the overall management of the institution.

Wiley was named UW-Madison's 27th chancellor on January 1, 2001. As chancellor, he has aimed to enhance the university's role in creating a new, more viable economic future for Wisconsin while opening avenues to innovation and learning. He also has worked to amplify the Wisconsin Idea—the belief that the boundaries of the campus are the boundaries of the state and beyond—and to build on the research and teaching strengths that have made the university so rich in accomplishment and tradition.

Wiley has presided over unprecedented growth on the west side of the campus, which is being transformed into one of the nation's great health-sciences centers. He also has mapped an east-side redevelopment that will create a vibrant arts-and-humanities district to anchor the lower State Street area, with an expanded Elvehjem Museum of Art, new classroom buildings and additional music-performance space. Wiley believes that the arts and humanities are an integral component of the research enterprise.

"Nurturing an environment of creativity—encompassing industry, the arts and individual expression—is important for attracting and keeping these very mobile, highly sought, knowledge-based workers within our borders," Wiley says.

The chancellor has been a leader in efforts to expand on-campus student housing to meet demand, stem high-risk drinking and integrate athletics into the mainstream of university life. Wiley has reached out to the private sector by creating the Office of Corporate Relations to serve the increasing needs of the business community and to help build a more prosperous Wisconsin economy.

"The Wisconsin Idea offers a shared medium through which we can help the state achieve its maximum potential as a participant in a world economy that embraces learning and the advancement of knowledge as much as it does material production," he says.

Camp Randall Stadium has the look of a winner, with its updated fan-friendly atmosphere. The stadium is a source of Wisconsin pride, but it is our fans and their rich history of loyalty that makes any Badger sporting event a truly special occasion.

Our student-athletes are also winners – on and off the field. On the playing fields, we've had many victories and championships to celebrate. And in the classroom, 186 Badger athletes registered a grade-point average of better than 3.5. Nearly one-quarter of our student athletes were Academic All-Big Ten honorees in 2004-05.

I am committed to helping ensure that our teams achieve the highest standards of excellence, not just in competition, but also in integrity, values and character.

In addition, athletics offers the university another opportunity to connect with alumni and friends.

# GREAT MOMENTS IN CAMP RANDALL HISTORY

*Each week this season, Wisconsin will be celebrating the Greatest Moments in Camp Randall Stadium history as voted on by you, the fans. The winning memories will be depicted on commemorative six-packs of Coca-Cola bottles in stores around the state this fall. One memory will be spotlighted during each home game. This week, we remember the Badgers' 1993 games against Michigan and Ohio State that propelled UW into the Rose Bowl.*

*To help us look back on this great moment, we have reprinted an excerpt from "Tales From the Wisconsin Badgers," a new book written by UW Director of Athletic Communications Justin Doherty detailing some of the best stories from UW football history.*

## A Chance to Say 'Thanks'

Two days after 76 people had been injured during the infamous "crowd surge" following the Badgers' 13-10 victory over Michigan at Camp Randall Stadium on October 30, 1993, Steve Malchow, then Wisconsin's men's sports information director, was visiting with reporters from three national newspapers when the phone in his office rang.

"There was a young lady on the other end of the line who said she was a student at the Michigan game," Malchow recalled. "She said she had been getting crushed in the stampede and that 'number three' had saved her life."

The stampede to which Aimee Jansen was referring had occurred when thousands of students surged forward in an effort to come out of the stands and onto the field to celebrate the win over the Wolverines. What happened instead was students were hemmed in against railings and

fences that eventually gave way. Bodies stacked upon each other as many students struggled to breathe.

After visiting some more with Jansen, Malchow concluded that "number three" was Michael Brin, a walk-on sophomore receiver. Jansen asked Malchow if he could help her contact Brin to thank him. Ed Sherman of the *Chicago Tribune*, Malcolm Moran of *The New York Times* and Gene Wojciechowski of the *Los Angeles Times* sat in Malchow's office listening to the conversation.

"I told [Jansen] that I had reporters from three of the biggest newspapers in the United States in my office at that moment, and I asked her if she would visit with them over the speakerphone," Malchow said. "She agreed. A terrible situation wound up creating some incredible stories."

Jansen proceeded to tell the reporters the story of how she had been crushed in the sea of bodies and how Brin had helped her out of the crowd. She told them Brin had saved her life.

Fortunately for Jansen, Brin had by chance remained on the field to look for friends in the stands. That's when he spotted her and others in distress. Brin and teammates Joe Panos, Tyler Adam, John Hall, and Brent Moss, among others, helped save several students that day. Brin, who was named ABC's Newsmaker of the Week, finally met Jansen a few days later.

## Before the Turnaround

Joe Rudolph remembers what it was like. The Belle Vernon, Pennsylvania, native recalls the early days of the Barry Alvarez era at Wisconsin.

"When I first got to Wisconsin [in 1990] nobody would wear their issued gear," Rudolph says. "We were made fun of by everyone, even some

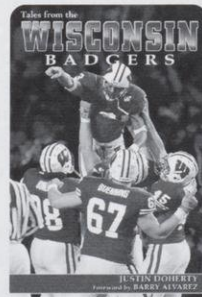

of our professors. People would talk about how the games weren't any good, but that at least they could enjoy the band."

Rudolph, a four-year letterwinner as a guard and a team captain in 1994, can also recollect a conversation between his mother and father.

"I can remember my mom telling my dad that someday he wouldn't be able to find a seat at Camp Randall," Rudolph recalled. "Then, years later during the 1993 Ohio State game, my dad stood up to cheer at one point and when he went to sit back down there were so many people in the stands that his seat had disappeared."

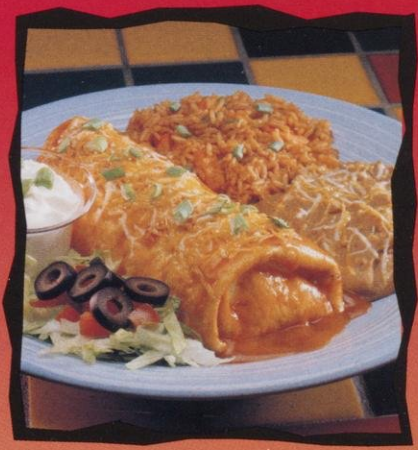
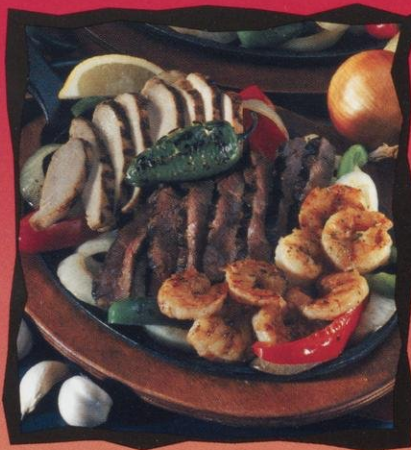

# WISCONSIN ASSISTANT COACHES

## BRET BIELEMA Defensive Coordinator & Linebackers

### At Wisconsin

- Enters his second season at Wisconsin. Was named in July 2005 as Barry Alvarez's successor beginning in January 2006.
- Through the first nine games in 2004, Wisconsin led the nation in scoring defense (9.1 ppg) and had allowed just nine touchdowns, fewest in the country. The Badgers ended up fifth in the nation in pass efficiency defense (100.1 pts), sixth in scoring defense (15.4 ppg), seventh in passing yards defense (167.2 avg) and ninth in total defense (291.2 ypg).



### Prior to Wisconsin

Co-Defensive Coordinator at Kansas State from 2002-03

- 2003 Kansas State unit finished sixth nationally in total (283.1 ypg), seventh in pass (174.6 ypg), eighth in scoring (16.3 ppg), 12th in pass efficiency (104.4 rating) and 17th in run defense (108.5 ypg).
- Wildcats led Big 12 in run defense in 2003.
- In 2002 the Wildcats led the nation in scoring defense (11.8 ppg), were second nationally in total (249.0 ypg) and rushing (69.5 ypg) defense and third in the nation in pass efficiency defense (91.69 rating).
- KSU was 22-6 (11-2 in '02 and 11-4 in '03) during Bielema's two years there.
- Helped Kansas State to its first-ever Big 12 title in '03.

Assistant Coach at Iowa from 1993-01

- Spent nine seasons as an assistant coach at Iowa, moving through the ranks with the Hawkeyes, starting as an undergraduate student assistant coach, then graduate assistant and, finally, full-time assistant (he coached Iowa's linebackers for six seasons).
- The 1997 Hawkeye defense posted three shutouts and ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring and pass efficiency defense, seventh in total defense and 11th in run defense.

## PAUL CHRYST Co-offensive Coordinator & Tight Ends

### At Wisconsin

- Enters his second season at Wisconsin (first since 2002).
- Also coached tight ends at Wisconsin in 2002.

- As offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Chryst helped the Beavers rank sixth nationally in passing yardage per game (328.1) and 10th in total offense (463.0 yards per game) in 2003.

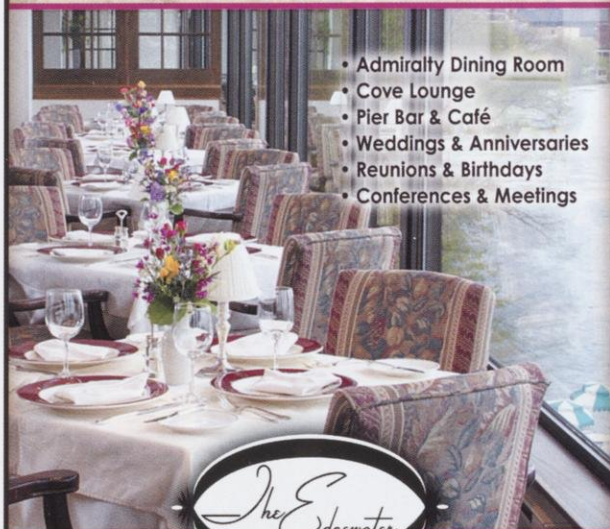

## JEFF HORTON Quarterbacks

### At Wisconsin

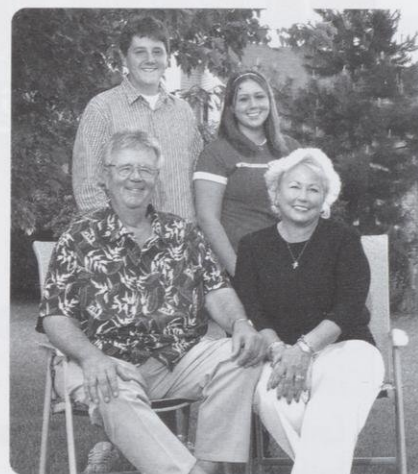
- Enters his seventh season at Wisconsin.
- A Badger quarterback has been selected in the NFL Draft two of the past three years (Brooks Bollinger, sixth round to the N.Y. Jets in 2003, and Jim Sorgi, sixth round to the Indianapolis Colts in 2004).
- Bollinger was the 1999 Big Ten Freshman of the Year and is the winningest QB in school history (one of only seven QBs in Big Ten history with 30 wins as a starter).
- Bollinger also became one of only seven players in Big Ten history with at least 20 rushing TDs and 30 passing TDs.
- Sorgi finished as Wisconsin's leader in career pass efficiency and on UW career lists he finished third in pass completion percentage (.555), fourth in TD passes (33) and fifth in passing yards (4,498).
- The Badgers have set the school record for passing yards in a season twice (2001 and 2003) in the past four seasons.



## JIM HUEBER Offensive Line

### At Wisconsin

- Enters his 14th year at Wisconsin and 22nd in the Big Ten (longest continuing tenured assistant in the conference).
- Has coached Badger offensive linemen for 10 seasons.
- More than 25 Hueber-coached players have made NFL rosters.
- UW's offensive lines paved the way for a 1,000-yard rusher every year from 1996-2002 (during a Big Ten-record 10 straight seasons).
- In 2002, tailback Anthony Davis rushed for a UW sophomore-record 1,555 yards behind Hueber's line that included Rimington Trophy finalist Al Johnson.
- Seven of his players have been drafted in the past six years.
- The 2000 Badgers broke in a new tailback and fought a lot of lineup inconsistencies, but Michael Bennett finished third nationally in rushing. Three of Hueber's seniors (Casey Rabach, Bill Ferrario and Dave Costa) earned pro contracts.
- The 1999 line helped Ron Dayne become college football's career rushing leader. Among Hueber's blockers was Chris McIntosh, the Big Ten's 1999 Offensive Lineman of the Year and a finalist for the Outland Trophy.
- One of his other former pupils was Aaron Gibson, a consensus All-American who also was a finalist for the Lombardi Award and the Outland Trophy.

- The 1994 UNLV squad won the Las Vegas Bowl and Horton was named co-Big West Coach of the Year.

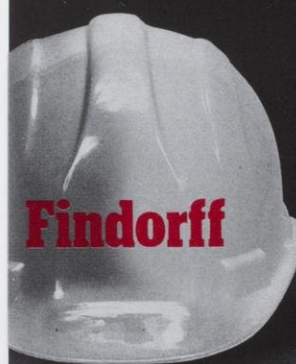

## RON LEE Defensive Backs

### At Wisconsin

- Enters third season at Wisconsin.
- Coached safety Jim Leonhard, who tied Jamar Fletcher for most career interceptions (21) at UW, to first-team All-Big Ten and All-America honors in 2003 and 2004.
- Also coached cornerback Scott Starks, a 2004 first-team All-Big Ten selection and team MVP. Starks was a third-round pick of Jacksonville in the 2005 draft.

Defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach at San Jose State from 2001-02

- The Spartans ranked No. 3 nationally in passes intercepted (23) in 2002 and No. 4 nationally in turnovers gained (38).

- Under Lee, Greg Myers won the 1995 Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's best defensive back.
- The Rams led the nation in turnover margin in 1997.

- Portland State was an NCAA Division II semifinalist in 1991.

## HENRY MASON Wide Receivers

### At Wisconsin

- Enters 11th season at Wisconsin.
- Recruited and coached Bedford, Ohio, natives Chris Chambers and Lee Evans who starred for the Badgers.
- Evans put together the greatest season ever by a Badger receiver in 2001 when he set the Big Ten record for receiving yards (1,545) in a season. He also set UW career records for receptions (175), receiving yards (3,468) and receiving touchdowns (27). He was a 2004 NFL first-round draft choice by Buffalo.
- Chambers, the school's MVP in 2000, is one of only three Badgers (Al Toon and Evans are the others) in history to record more than 2,000 yards receiving. He was picked by Miami in the second round of the 2001 Draft.
- In the mid-1990s, coached Tony Simmons and Donald Hayes who formed one of the best wide receiver tandems in college football. That duo ranks fourth (Simmons) and seventh (Hayes) in career yardage at Wisconsin.
- In 2002, with Evans injured, Mason developed freshmen Jonathan Orr and Brandon Williams into aerial threats. Orr's 842 receiving yards were a UW rookie record as were Williams' 52 catches.

- The Broncos led the Mid-American Conference in passing three times in Mason's four seasons.

Head Coach at Smith-Cotton (Mo.) High School from 1982-90

## BRIAN MURPHY Special Teams

### At Wisconsin

- Enters fourth season at Wisconsin.

- Brandon Williams was the Big Ten's seventh-ranked kickoff returner in 2003 and was eighth in 2002. He needs just 46 yards to become the school's all-time leading kickoff returner.

- Guided Erasmus James to become a consensus All-American and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 2004.
- His entire 2004 defensive line was selected in the 2005 NFL draft.
- Tutored Wendell Bryant, who was the 12th pick overall (to Arizona) in the 2002 NFL Draft after being named the Big Ten's Defensive Lineman of the Year for the second consecutive campaign.
- The 1998 Badger defenders ranked first nationally in scoring, fourth in rushing, fifth in total and seventh in pass efficiency defense. That defense was led by Tom Burke, the hard-charging defensive end tutored by Palermo. Burke led the nation and set a Big Ten record for quarterback sacks.
- His first national honor recipient at UW was Tarek Saleh, who set many school sack and TFL marks and earned All-America praise in 1996.
- Has been on staff for 107 of Alvarez's 108 victories at Wisconsin.

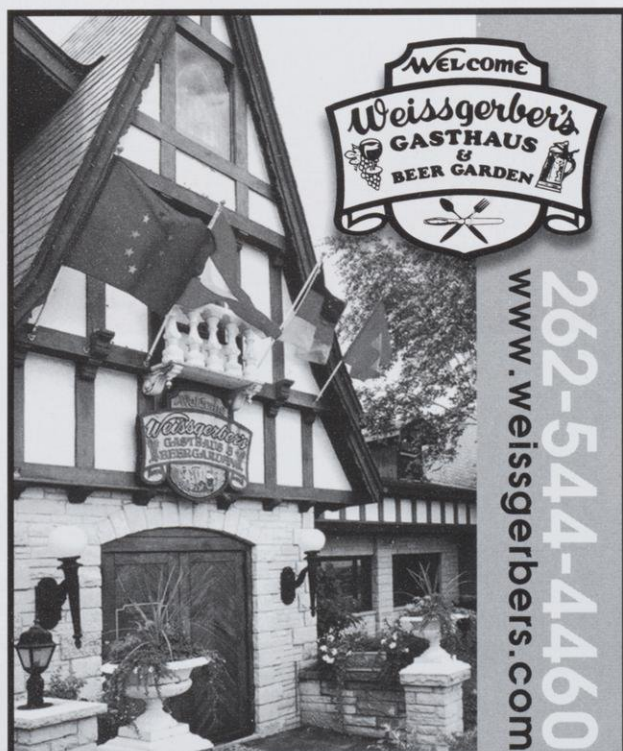

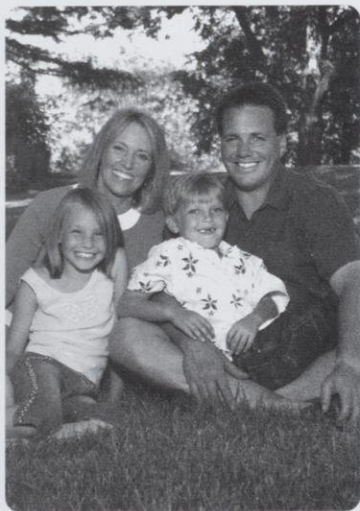

## BRIAN WHITE Co-Offensive Coordinator & Running Backs

### At Wisconsin

- Enters 10th season at Wisconsin and sixth as the offensive coordinator.
- Was named NCAA Division I-A Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association in 2004.
- In his rookie season at the controls of the offense (1999), the Badgers set a school scoring record and finished 10th nationally in that category.
- In 2000, first-year starter Michael Bennett was the NCAA's third-leading rusher, but the team also had a school-record six 200-yard passing games.
- In 2001 Anthony Davis was the nation's fifth-leading rusher and Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Lee Evans set the Big Ten record for receiving yards in a season (1,545) and quarterbacks Brooks Bollinger and Jim Sorgi each threw for more than 1,000 yards.
- Davis finished his career as the second-leading rusher in UW history and No. 5 all-time in the Big Ten.
- Evans set UW career records for receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns with White calling the plays.

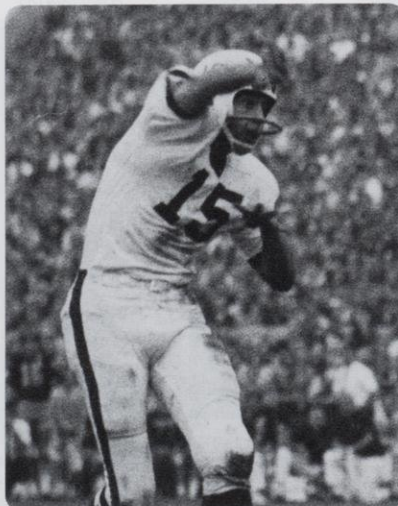

# UW ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT SENIOR STAFF

## Jamie Pollard Deputy Athletic Director



Jamie Pollard was named Deputy Athletic Director for the UW-Madison in 2003 and in that role serves as the No. 2 administrator in the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics. He is responsible for the overall administration

of the Badgers' 23-sport, \$72 million athletic department. In addition, he represents Barry Alvarez at all national, conference and university meetings when necessary.

Prior to being named Deputy Athletic Director, Pollard served as the division's Chief Financial Officer and Senior Associate Athletic Director. He developed a comprehensive strategic financial plan ("Keeping Big Red in the Black") that increased the division's operating reserve to \$7 million and allowed the university to move forward on the \$109 million renovation of Camp Randall Stadium. He also assisted with the development of the school's inaugural preferential seating program

that is generating more than \$9 million annually for the athletic program and he helped negotiate a multi-year, multi-million dollar contract for media and marketing rights that is one of the largest collegiate contracts in the country.

Pollard has also been the sports administrator for the men's and women's basketball programs since 2001-02. During that time the men's basketball program won back-to-back Big Ten championships, the 2004 Big Ten Tournament and advanced to the 2005 Elite Eight. He also served as the Tournament Manager when the university hosted the 2002 NCAA Men's Basketball Midwest Regional.

In the fall of 2003, Pollard was selected by *Street & Smith's Sports Business Journal* as a recipient of its "Top Forty Under 40" Award. It is given annually to the 40 most influential and creative individuals in sports under the age of 40. Pollard is the first intercollegiate sports administrator ever honored by the magazine.

Pollard has served as the President for the Collegiate Athletic Business Managers Association (CABMA) and was chosen by his peers as the 2002 Business Manager of the Year.

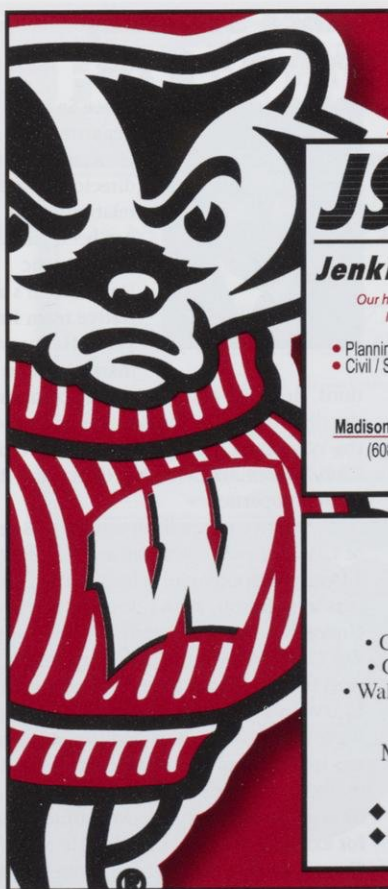
He was appointed by UW-Madison Chancellor John D. Wiley to serve as the cam-

pus chair of the Partners in Giving campaign that benefits more than 300 non-profit organizations. Pollard led the 2004 campaign for the University, which resulted in 4,500 employees donating \$1.46 million. Both the number of donors and donation levels were records for the institution.

His other intercollegiate administration experience came as Associate AD for Administration at Maryland (1994-98) and Associate AD for Internal Operations at St. Louis (1989-94). In both roles, he assisted with balancing budgets and creating reserves while helping implement gender equity plans.

In addition to his role at Wisconsin, Pollard founded Collegiate Financial Services, LLC, a private data research company that provided strategic financial planning and research services to athletic administrators, university presidents and conference commissioners.

Pollard, who was the 1987 NCAA Division III national champion in the 5,000-meter run and a two time Division III All-American, has a B.S. degree in business administration from UW-Oshkosh (1987). He is in that school's athletic hall of fame. Pollard and his wife, Ellen, have four children, (Thomas, Annie, Maggie and James).

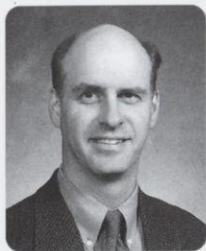

Terry Gawlik was promoted to associate AD for sports administration and Senior Woman Administrator in 2005 after serving seven years as assistant AD for sports administration.

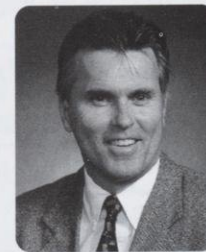
Gawlik oversees men's and women's cross

# THE BARRY ALVAREZ YEARS

## The Woman Beside the Man

Meet Cindy Alvarez, the woman behind – no, scratch that – beside Wisconsin head football coach and director of athletics Barry Alvarez. Just think of her as another assistant coach. All the work going on behind the scenes certainly is deserving of a similar title.

"She has really been a part of my staff all these years," Barry Alvarez said. "From hosting alumni to having the team over for dinner, she is totally involved. Our house is full of people after every game, along with comradery, win or lose. In our business, if you don't have a wife who understands and is totally supportive, it's tough for a coach to make it."

From the moment Cindy Jelinek met Barry Alvarez, she knew he was going to be a head football coach someday. She has been there, standing by his side, for the last 39 years.

The pair met back in 1966 in Lincoln, Neb., while Alvarez was playing football for the Cornhuskers, and Cindy had returned home from school in Chicago for the summer to work in a local restaurant. A couple of friends had set them up on a blind date.

"Some friends asked if I wanted to go to a football party and meet some players," Cindy Alvarez said. "But the party didn't pan out and it ended up just being Barry. So he asked for my phone number."

Their first date was one they both clearly remember.

"She stood me up," Barry Alvarez remarked.

Yes, it is a true story.

"I was afraid of him," remembered Cindy. "I thought he was so big. But I felt really guilty so I called him and apologized."

On their first real date, the two set off for a nearby lake in Lincoln and went swimming. They courted for two years. What Cindy remembers most during that time was, of course, the football games.

"The girls who dated the football players would really dress up for the games," Cindy recalled. "We wore dresses and cowboy hats with their numbers on them. You would work all summer on what dress you would have for football season."

In his senior year as a Nebraska linebacker, Alvarez was invited to play in the Senior Bowl – which at the time paid its players to participate. This meant Alvarez would have money to buy a ring.

"We were dancing at the Red Ram," Cindy said, "and it wasn't an actual 'Will you marry me?' He just said, 'I am going to get this money from the Senior Bowl' and we went and picked out the ring."

On April 18, 1968, the two were married in a chapel that overlooks John F. Kennedy's grave in Arlington National Cemetery. Cindy's father, Joseph Jelinek, was a United States general who worked at the Pentagon and had military connections.

Following their wedding, the newlyweds soon headed back to Lincoln, and Barry was hired by the local police department while Cindy taught junior high. Barry Alvarez loved his work as a police officer and decided to apply to the Federal Investigation Bureau. At the same time he was accepted into the FBI, he was offered his first coaching job as an assistant at Lincoln Northeast High School. Needless to say, Alvarez took the football job. The reason?

"We didn't have any money to move," Cindy Alvarez pointed out. "So we stayed in Lincoln instead of going to Los Angeles or Miami."

Once Alvarez got his feet wet in the coaching business, he started to slowly move up the ladder. Following his stint at Northeast, Alvarez accepted his first head coaching job at Lexington High School in Lexington, Neb. Though she knew it was an excellent opportunity for her husband, Cindy's reaction was not full of excitement.

"I cried the whole way," Cindy remembered. "It was a town of 6,000 and there was nothing there, and it ended up being wonderful. We still have dear friends from Lexington. It was a great town with great people and it was a lot of fun. It also was good for me because that was where I got my start in gymnastics."

Cindy Alvarez earned her B.S. in physical education from Nebraska, where she ended up transferring, in 1969. Though she admits she did not know anything about football, her focus was primarily on dancing and gymnastics.

In Lexington, Cindy Alvarez found work as an elementary school teacher. She randomly discovered some gymnastics equipment while passing a room one day, and asked if anyone was using it. She was given the equipment and Alvarez put her idea to work.

"I put an ad in the paper that said 'Come to Cindy Alvarez's Gymnastics School' and 50 kids showed up," Alvarez said. "It was a lot of fun."

Following two years in Lexington, it was once again time to move on, and Barry Alvarez became the head coach at Mason City High School in Iowa, his last high school job before moving on to become an assistant at the University of Iowa. By the time the Alvarez family had moved to Mason City, the members of the family had increased. All three Alvarez children were born by that time: Dawn, Stacy, and the youngest, Chad, who was just six months old when the family made the move.

After two years in Mason City, the college ranks came calling. In 1979, Barry Alvarez accepted an assistant coaching position at Iowa, where the family spent the next eight years.

In Iowa City, Cindy Alvarez immersed herself in her gymnastics school, which was enough to keep her plenty busy on top of and in between football seasons.

"I taught at the university, where there was a very good recreational program, and I worked with college kids who wanted to coach gymnastics. I also had two teams that I coached as well."

On top of her gymnastics, Alvarez was busy at home playing the dual role of mother and wife, not to mention the additional responsibilities as a coaches' wife. But Iowa was full of memories. Not only was it where the oldest, Dawn, graduated from high school, but there was a lot of growth to the football program as well.

"What was neat about Iowa City is that we got to grow with the program," Cindy Alvarez remarked. "The state, the football staff and the family all grew. We didn't walk into a big winning program, we helped build it."

Cindy Alvarez can recall one special moment while her husband was with the Hawkeye program, when the team traveled to Madison to play the Badgers at Camp Randall.

"I brought Chad to Madison for a football game," Cindy Alvarez remembered. "We ate cheese curds and came out on Breese Terrace and all the bands were playing. I said to Barry, 'If you ever can get a head job, get one here.' I thought it was so much fun. It was beautiful, the food was great and the atmosphere was great."

In 1987, Alvarez continued his climb as an assistant at Notre Dame. It was in South Bend where Cindy Alvarez got her first real experience as an event planner and social organizer – two of her many roles as a football coaches' wife. Because Lou Holtz, Notre Dame's head coach at the time, was not quite as sociable, gatherings could be found at the Alvarez home.

Hosting social functions was just one of many Alvarez traditions. Whenever the team would win on Saturday, the Alvarez kids would get donuts on Sunday. A win also meant a new tie for Barry, courtesy of Cindy, but that was one tradition that did not last very long.

"They kept winning and he got too many ties, so we had to quit that," Cindy Alvarez said.

It was also in South Bend where Stacy earned her high school diploma. In fact, the Alvarez family made a pact not to move once one of the kids entered high school. Chad would later attend high school in Madison.

The Alvarez family was in Miami for the 1990 Orange Bowl when word came that Barry Alvarez would be the new head

coach at the University of Wisconsin. Madison would be home for the Alvarez family for the next 15 years – and counting.

"I cried when I found out," Cindy Alvarez said. "I did not understand the magnitude of what it meant at the time, but I knew I really wanted to come somewhere and establish roots. I didn't want to move every two or three years; I wanted a place to have a family and a place to retire. I wanted to know where I am going to be buried. I really did think about that. The fact that it has happened is wonderful. My children are all here. We will be able to retire here."

Over the past 15 years at Wisconsin, Cindy Alvarez has kept very busy – especially on football Saturdays. She feeds anywhere from 20 to 60 guests who find their way to the Alvarez home after games at Camp Randall. She also plans and organizes bowl trips for the travel party, comprised mainly of wives and children of the football staff. Alvarez thinks it is important to reward the families on bowl trips, and also makes sure the food is affordable and accessible, and that there are activities for women and children away from home. On top of those very important responsibilities, however, Cindy Alvarez still finds the time on Thursdays – as does Barry – for their "date night."

"Barry decided he wasn't going to be a hermit when we moved here," Cindy said. "We were going to be out in the community. We get out every week. Thursday is date night; it always has been. Barry also thinks it is un-American to stay home on Friday night. Next year when he won't be with the team, we will be out on Friday night, doing something."

Aside from all that, Cindy Alvarez still finds the time for bridge and local service organizations, Junior League and Attic Angel, as well as being very involved in bringing Gilda's Club, a place for people with cancer to live for free along with the necessary emotional support, to Madison.

And after 37 years of marriage, the Alvarez duo are as happy as ever.

"We are still laughing and still enjoying each other," Cindy Alvarez noted. "That is the best thing."

Though, she admits: "I pray to God he'll cook next year."



## NFL UPDATE

### Receivers Make Impact in Season Openers

Chris Chambers, the Badgers' MVP in 2001, has been the go-to-receiver for the Miami Dolphins the past four years, totaling more than 3,400 receiving yards in only 62 games. Chambers has averaged seven touchdowns each season, with his season-best of 11 in 2003. Chambers tallied 101 total yards on five catches for 40 yards, as well as a 61-yard reverse play that set up an Olindo Mare field goal to give the Dolphins the early lead in their 34-10 win over the Broncos on NFL opening day 2005.

Second-year man and UW career receiving leader, Lee Evans started off on the right track as he totaled 68 receiving yards on three catches in the Buffalo Bills' season-opening win over the Houston Texans. With nine touchdowns last season, Evans, like Chambers, is the No. 1 receiver that the Bills look for when going to the air.

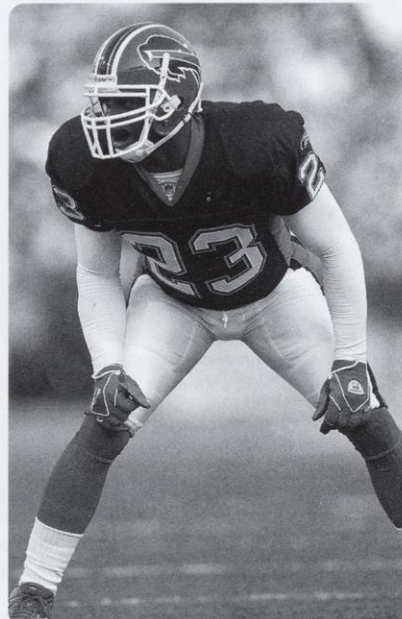
### Linemen Getting More Respect

Four former Badger offensive linemen, now residing in the NFC, are off to a good start for the 2005 season. Center Al Johnson began his second season as the anchor to Bill Parcells' offensive line in Dallas. The Cowboys beat the dangerous San Diego Chargers, 28-24, as he and the rest of the offensive line blocked for second-year running back Julius Jones as he totaled 111 yards and a touchdown in their season-opener.

Mark Tauscher, who has started every game in the last two seasons, will again be protecting Brett Favre for the Packers. Tauscher is now the anchor of the Green Bay line, as the team lost Pro-Bowl guard Marco Rivera and Mike Whale to free agency in the off season.

A starter all season for Baltimore a year ago, Casey Rabach signed with Washington as a free agent in the spring and is the starting center. He and the rest of the offensive line blocked for Clinton Portis, who totaled 121 rushing yards on 21 carries as the Washington Redskins beat the Chicago Bears 9-7 on opening day.

This past Sunday, NFL rookie Dan Buenning, along with the rest of the Tampa Bay offensive line,

blocked for fellow rookie running back Carnell "Cadillac" Williams as he rushed for 128 yards on 24 carries and had a touchdown. The Buccaneers took care of Buffalo 19-3 to get their second win of the season. Buenning has started at left guard in each of Tampa Bay's two wins.

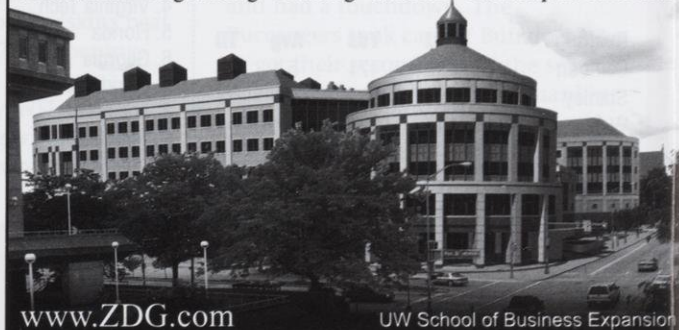

## COACHES' CORNER

*Each week this season, the Badger Football Gameday Program will take fans inside the UW coaching staff and find out what it's like to try and prepare the Badgers for a game. A different assistant coach will be profiled each game. Hopefully fans can get a glimpse inside the life of the coaches. This week, we sat down with co-offensive coordinator and running backs coach Brian White, who is in his 11th season at UW.*

### **What is the first thing you tell the running backs on the first day of fall camp?**

First thing I tell them is that I don't care who plays. Regardless of whether you're a freshman or a sophomore or a junior or a senior, the best players are going to play. And I think we've been able to validate that through the years. After that we really start focusing on teaching concepts. Then after they can understand the concept of a play, you have to put them in body positions of strength to be successful. I believe we do a really good job of using drills that apply to what happens in a game which leads to success on the field. Coach Alvarez's slogan is you have to teach the big picture first. So you have to teach them the game, teach them the concept of a play, then how they fit within a play. But the more they know about a play, the more panoramic they are, then they can really become detailed about their specific responsibility.

### **Do you have any favorite drills you like to have the running backs do?**

The first drill we do every day and the first drill we've done every day since I've been here is just a little pocket drill to make sure they understand how to properly secure the ball. I know it sounds ridiculous but we've done as good a job as anyone in the country with ball security and it's because it's properly conditioned and correctly taught. It's something that you can never take lightly. The

whole game is all about the football and if you don't have good fundamentals then you can lose a game like Ohio State did against Texas or you can lose a chance at a national championship like UCLA did against Miami in the 1998.

### **When you're on the sidelines, is there one thing one of your guys can do to get you excited?**

I love it when they hammer a blitz. Book (Booker Stanley) stoned a blitz last week in the game (vs. Temple). Bernie's (Matt Bernstein) block against Arizona where the guy took a standing eight count. He knocked him to the ground, he got up and then he fell back down. A great run on the sidelines. Jamil (Walker) had a really good run on the sidelines last week (vs. Temple). Booker had a great run on the sidelines. Brian Calhoun's two runs in the first game (vs. Bowling Green), finishing runs, scoring. Plays that are physical, where you're breaking tackles, finishing a run or finishing a block, those are things that get you cranked up as a coach.

### **How important is film work in your game preparation?**

On Monday you look at last week's game quickly to validate the good things but also correct the things you need to address from a fundamental standpoint. But then you have to quickly get on to the next team because people are different schematically and you have to be able to teach a new gameplan quickly. So filmwork is critical. The more you watch the better you're going to be because you'll find indicators and little tips that are going to be able to allow you to play fast. One of the little slogans we use is being able to have the answers to the test before the test.



Co-offensive coordinator Brian White is in his 11th season as the UW's running backs coach. The Badgers have led the Big Ten in rushing three times in that span.

### **What is a typical day during the week like?**

Tuesday and Wednesday are our big work days so we'll come in at about 7 a.m. and have a staff meeting with Coach Alvarez for about a half hour. Then we go to work gameplanning. We each have our different areas of responsibility towards the game plan that we have to present and put together for us to collectively look at. We have individual projects then we get together as an offensive staff and put together our plays according to situations. Game plans are very situationally driven. I'll have blitz protection, Coach Horton has third down, Coach Mason has normal down-and-distance passing game, Coach Hueber has the run game, Coach Chryst has the red zone. We all have our different segments. We'll put scripts together for practice, kind of choreograph things. Go out and practice it. Come back after practice, eat dinner and then go watch what we just choreographed.

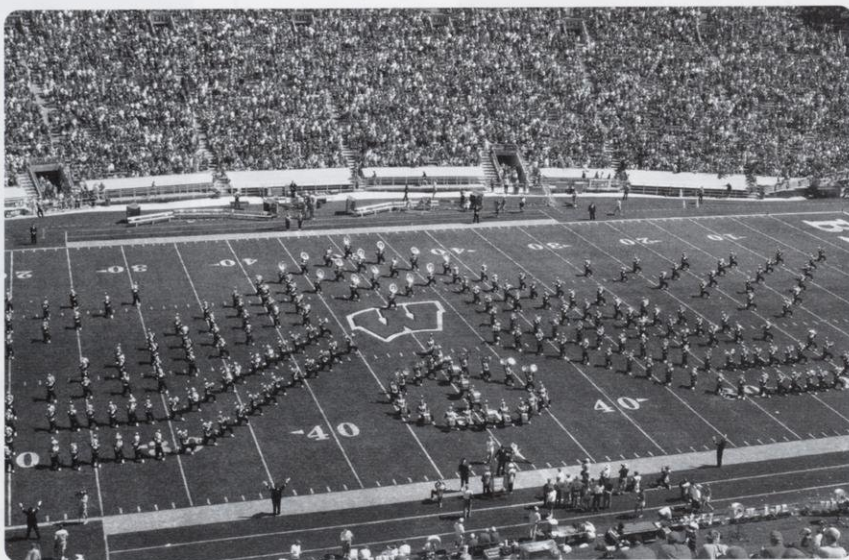

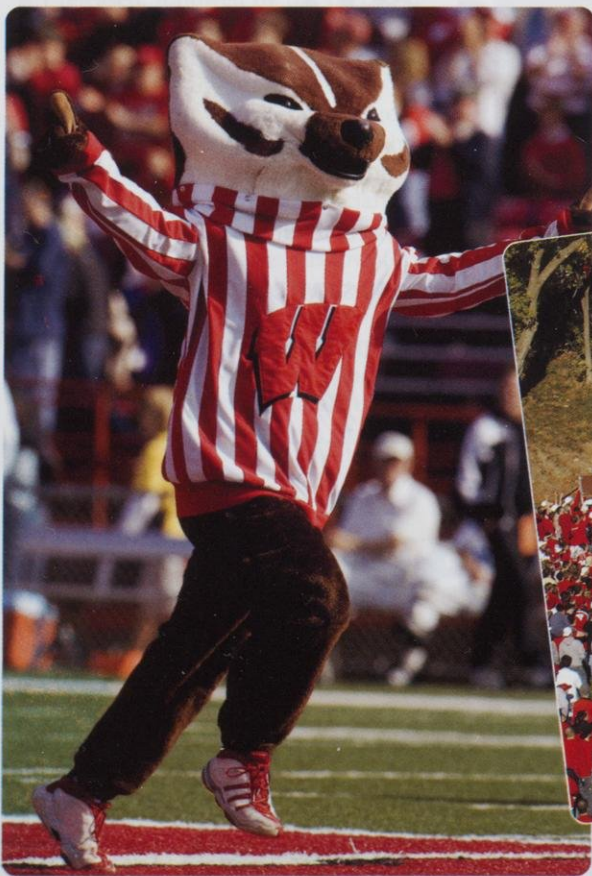
# SATURDAYS AT CAMP RANDALL

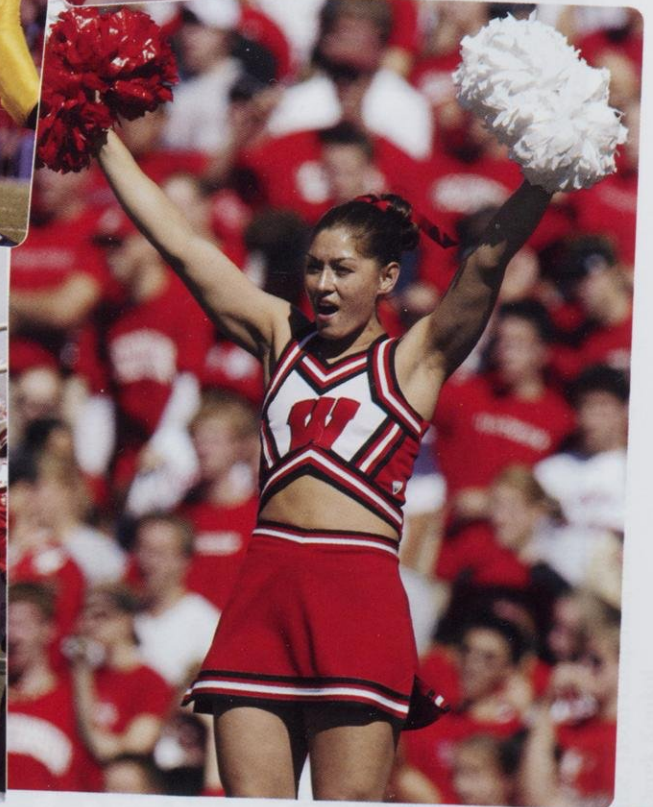

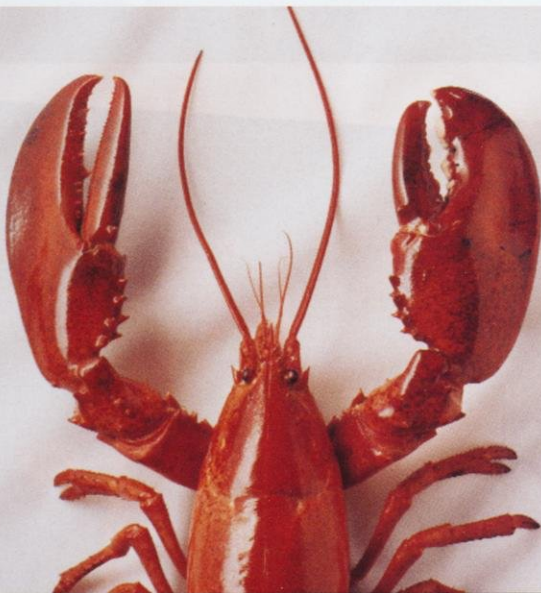

# WISCONSIN TRADITIONS

## Badger nickname

The athletic teams' nickname (Badgers) was borrowed from the state. The territory was initially dubbed the "Badger" state. The reason for the moniker was not because of badgers in this region, but instead because of an association with lead miners in the 1820s. Prospectors came to the state looking for minerals. Without shelter in the winter, the miners had to "live like badgers" in tunnels burrowed into hillsides according to folklore.

## Bucky Badger

Badgers in various forms have been recognized as the school mascot for decades. The version currently known as Bucky, sporting a cardinal and white striped sweater, was first drawn in 1940 by artist Art Evans. At that time, the badger went by names like Benny, Buddy, Bernie, Bobby and Bouncery. Art Lentz, the department's publicity director, had the idea to bring the mascot to life.

The original badger mascot was too vicious to control. On more than one occasion, the live badger escaped his handlers. It was decided in the interest

of fan and player safety that Wisconsin's mascot be retired to the Madison Zoo. The Badger Yearbook replaced the live badger with a small raccoon named Regdab (badger spelled backwards) and passed it off as a "badger in a raccoon coat."

In 1949, a student in the university's art department, Connie Conrad, was hired to mold a paper-mache badger head. Cheerleader Bill Sagal, of Plymouth, Wis., was directed by homecoming chair Bill Sachse, to wear the outfit at the homecoming game. A contest was staged to name the mascot. The winner was Buckingham U. Badger, or Bucky. The name came from the lyrics in a song which encouraged the football team to "buck right through that line."

Bucky Badger has persevered through the years, even surviving a threat by then assistant attorney general, Howard Koop, in 1973. He suggested that Bucky be replaced by Henrietta Holstein, a loveable cow. Koop argued that "kids love cows. A generation could grow up supporting the university and Henrietta Holstein." Koop's effort to overthrow Bucky failed.

Bucky even survived a cameo appearance by former Sports Illustrated writer Rick Telander. In preparation for a book about the department, Telander wore the Badger costume at a 1991 volleyball game. Telander overcame "terminal claustrophobia" in his first and only act as Bucky.

## Bud song

An integral part of any Wisconsin band performance is the playing of the Bud song. The tune is a spinoff of the song "You've Said It All," a jingle with words and music originally written by Steve Karmen for Budweiser beer commercials.

The song has become legendary at the University because of its polka-like rhythm. Band director Michael Leckrone said the song's popularity got started at a 1975 hockey game. "The crowd wanted to hear a polka," he said. "I didn't have any polkas. We had, just by accident, added this beer commercial to the tunes we play. I told the band if we substituted the word 'Wisconsin' for 'Budweiser' it would work."

Leckrone said the song became a football tradition after a 1978 come-from-behind victory over Oregon. "Wisconsin was behind by three touchdowns, and the crowd was really dead. I played the song to get everyone pepped up. About 20 seconds after that, Wisconsin scored a TD. I played it again, and we scored another touchdown. From then on, the band could never play enough 'Bud,'" said Leckrone.



## Motion W

When Coach Barry Alvarez came to Madison, he decided that the helmet logo needed to be updated to signal a new era. He entertained 15-20 designs in 1990 before Rayovac artist Rick Suchanek developed the "Motion W," which originally included a tail at the back of the logo. Alvarez thought the tail was a bit much, but when it was removed, decided to go with it. The University bought the rights to the design, and the logo has been adopted by all other UW sports.







## Fifth Quarter

The Wisconsin band has become famous for its post-game celebration called the Fifth Quarter. Win or lose, fans sing, dance and cheer with the band as they play traditional favorites like "On, Wisconsin" and the Bud song. Originally, the post-game concert was designed to give the fans something to listen to on their way out, but it developed into a post-game party as the band built in audience-participation activities.

## "On, Wisconsin"

The school's fight song was originally composed in 1909 by Chicago's William Purdy, and the words were written by Carl Beck. Purdy and Beck had been fraternity brothers at Hamilton College (Clinton, N.Y.) and were roommates in Chicago. Purdy was going to submit the song for consideration to win a \$100 prize that the University of Minnesota was offering for a new football song. When Beck heard the music, he offered to write words and suggested that Purdy offer it to Wisconsin, where Beck had once studied. The song was an instant hit on campus and spread throughout the world.



Some 2,500 schools have adopted the music and changed the words to suit their needs. "On, Wisconsin" was sung for the first time at the 1909 homecoming game vs. Minnesota.

The music was adapted by Band Director Michael Leckrone in 1969. The original version had been played virtually unchanged since its inception. "I got a lot of flak for the change," Leckrone said. "The old version was one you had to wait on. I wanted to generate immediate crowd reaction, so I stepped it up a bit."

## Paul Bunyan Axe

The most-played rivalry in Division I-A football continues this fall when Wisconsin and Minnesota meet. The UW-UM series is the nation's oldest and has been played continuously since 1907. The game has alternated sites between the university campuses since 1946. Much prestige was always associated with the game, and the significance was emphasized with its place on the schedule. Between 1933 and 1982, the Wisconsin-Minnesota game was always the final regular-season contest for each school.

The series took an added twist in 1948 when more than state bragging rights were on the line. After a 16-0 setback that season, the Wisconsin letter-winners group, the National "W" Club, presented Minnesota with an axe wielded by Paul Bunyan. He was the mythical giant of midwestern lumber camps. Each year since, the winner of the annual battle between the Big Ten rivals is presented with the axe, complete with scores inscribed on the handle, for display on its campus.

## "Varsity"

The traditional arm-waving at the end of the song, "Varsity," was the 1934 brain-storm of then-band leader Ray Dvorak. He saw Pennsylvania students wave their caps after losing a game. Dvorak later instructed Wisconsin students to salute UW-Madison President Glenn Frank after each game.

## Slab of Bacon

The Slab of Bacon trophy was the precursor to Paul Bunyan's Axe as the prize in the Wisconsin-Minnesota football series. Apparently, the trophy was presented to the winning school by a sorority from the losing institution. The trophy was discontinued in the 1940s and was discovered by UW Sports Information intern Will Roleson in a storage room at the UW Department of Athletics in 1994. It is currently housed in the football office at Wisconsin. "We took home the bacon," Coach Barry Alvarez said, "and kept it."

## Yes, We Can

For those of you who have not heard the buzz around Madison about "Yes, We Can," I am going to take this opportunity to inform you about this great program. "Yes, We Can" is a collaboration community service project conducted by the Madison School District's Elementary Schools, Community Action Coalition for South Central Wisconsin, and the Badger football team.

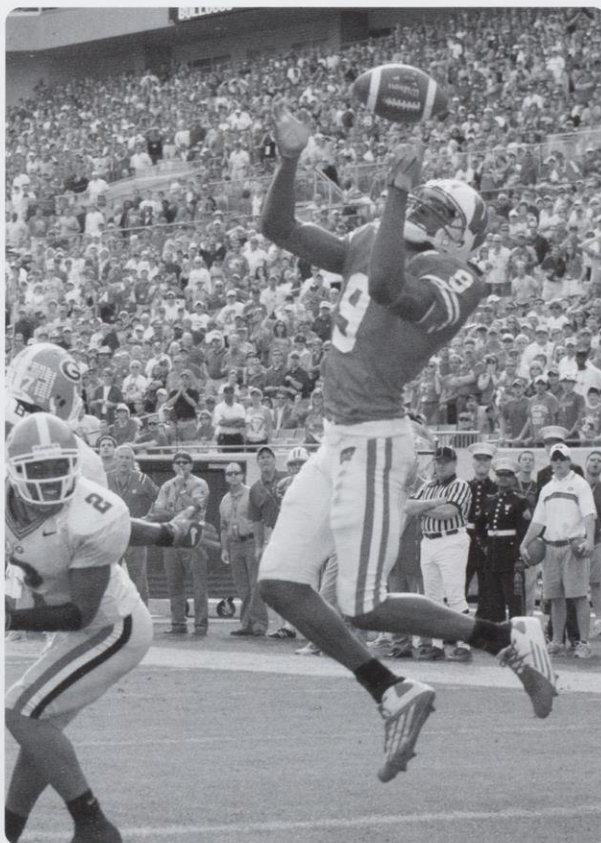
This campaign began on Sept. 15 and will run through Oct. 15. There are about 20 Madison-area elementary schools participating. Students and staff at the schools can bring canned goods and other non-perishable food items to school and make their donations to containers provided by the Community Action Coalition for South Central Wisconsin.

In mid-October, several members of our team will make our own donations and visit with students from the three or four

schools that have the highest number of donations. We will also help collect the donations for delivery to Dane County food pantries.

We were recently asked why we would choose to embark on this project at such a hectic time of the year. There are three main reasons for starting this campaign. First, our team consists of individuals from all over the country. The Madison community has opened up its doors and welcomed us with open arms. ## A SUMMER OF SOCCER

While most UW students spent the summer of 2005 working in their hometown, going on family vacations or doing internships, six members of the Wisconsin women's soccer team spent their summer playing soccer.

Their summer of soccer, however, was not a typical one. Sure, there was training, conditioning, practices and games. But these student-athletes were not just competing in your basic summer league, they were members of the prestigious W-League, and spread in cities across North America.

The W-League was the first national soccer league for women. Consisting of 34 teams that are divided into geographical regions, the W-League is an amateur organization that includes players from all over the world and is therefore recognized as North America's best women's development organization. The W-League also gives the nation's best college players the opportunity to maintain their eligibility while building upon their soccer skills.

Wisconsin senior Marisa Brown, a native of Geneva, Ill., had arguably the most successful summer in the W-League as a member of the Boston Renegades. Brown was joined by Badger teammate Kara Kabellis for the first half of the summer in Beantown, where the two lived with a host family in suburban Weston.

"It was great," Brown said. "We met tons of different people from all over who had different backgrounds and were of different ages. It was very challenging because we both went into it not knowing what to expect. We just wanted a new experience."

Brown led the Renegades with 14 goals during the summer, which ranked second in league statistics. Her 35 points ranked third among league players and her seven assists also ranked in the top 10. Additionally, Brown had the distinction of being one of 11 players named All-Eastern Conference following regular-season play.

Brown's achievements did not come easily. Upon her arrival, she discovered there were 11 other center midfielders on the Boston roster, which made for some tough competition if she was planning to get quality playing time.

"In the beginning, I didn't really get to play much," Brown said. "We all knew we were going to have to fight for playing time and at first, I didn't know if I was going to stay. But I decided to stick with it and it really turned out to be a great experience."

Unlike Brown, Kabellis had a more difficult time in Boston, especially being so far away from family and friends. She made the decision to return to her hometown of Lockport, Ill., midway through the season, but was determined not to give up on the W-League. The team based in the Windy City, the Chicago Gaels, offered Kabellis the opportunity to finish out the season as a member of its team. Kabellis again joined a Wisconsin teammate. Senior Jessica Ring also spent her summer playing for the Gaels.

"It was a good summer, playing in two different cities and getting two different experiences," Kabellis said. "I knew a lot of girls from high school and club teams in Chicago. It was a lot of fun. I love soccer. I couldn't get enough."

In addition to members of the Wisconsin squad representing the Badgers on the east coast and in the midwest, juniors Natalie Horner and Allison Priess spent the summer playing out west for the Arizona Heatwave, while senior Amy Vermeulen was a

member of the Ottawa Fury in her native Canada.

Vermeulen also had a successful summer campaign, playing for the Fury for a fourth season. Ottawa claimed the regular-season championship and advanced to the league's championship game following a thrilling 2-1 overtime victory over Central Florida in the semifinals. Despite falling to New Jersey in the championship contest, Vermeulen was able to experience the thrill of a title run, which included an appearance on national television.

"It was a really good experience," Vermeulen said. "It's not just a summer league, it is really high quality and is really fast-paced. It prepares you really well to go back to your college team. It keeps you in shape."

Keeping in shape and improvement on the soccer field is exactly what Wisconsin head coach Dean Duerst hoped his student-athletes would take from the W-League.

"It's invaluable experience," Duerst said. "They played at a very high level on a consistent basis. They trained and met a lot different people. It was great for them just to be able to concentrate on soccer, because they can just focus on playing. There aren't the responsibilities of academics to worry about in the summer. For those months, it's just about soccer."

# UW's RETIRED NUMBERS



## #40 Elroy Hirsch

Elroy Hirsch played only one season (1942) at UW, but he was one of the most beloved sports figures in school history. Hirsch, nicknamed "Crazylegs," rushed for 786 yards for Wisconsin's 8-1-1 team in 1942. He starred for nine years with the L.A. Rams and later served as UW's Director of Athletics (1969-87).



## #35 Alan Ameche

Alan Ameche, the 1954 Heisman Trophy winner, was a three-time All-American and ended his career as the NCAA's all-time rushing leader. He led the Badgers to the 1953 Rose Bowl and rushed for 133 yards in that game. The four-time NFL Pro Bowl pick was inducted into the College Hall of Fame in 1975.



## #83 Allan Shafer

The memory of former quarterback Allan Shafer is continued with the "Living Memorial" Scholarship that is given in his name. Shafer was fatally injured during the 1944 Wisconsin-Iowa game. Shafer is one of two Badgers (Jay Seiler is the other) to die from a football-related injury.



## #80 Dave Schreiner

Dave Schreiner, the two-time All-America end, was named Western Conference Player of the Year in 1942. Schreiner lettered three years at the UW as an end, both on offense and defense. He is a member of the National Football Foundation and W Club Halls of Fame. He was voted to the UW's all-time team in 1969.

## ■ ALL-TIME TEAM

In conjunction with the centennial celebration of college football in 1969, Wisconsin fans selected the school's all-time team. The 11-man unit features 1954 Heisman Trophy winner Alan Ameche, who was voted "All-time Greatest Player."

**KEN BOWMAN** (1961-63): 10-year NFL career with Packers ... played in East-West Shrine Game

**PAT HARDER** (1941-42): Second pick in NFL draft ... MVP of *Chicago Tribune* College All-Star Game

**ELROY "CRAZYLEGS" HIRSCH** (1942): Set many receiving records with Rams ... eventually served as Badger A.D.

**DAN LANPHEAR** (1957-59): Madison native was a 1959 All-American before pro career with Oilers

**ARLIE MUCKS, SR.** (1914): All-American on gridiron and silver medalist at Olympics (discus)

**PAT RICHTER** (1960-62): Hall of Fame inductee both on field and in classroom ... former Badger A.D.

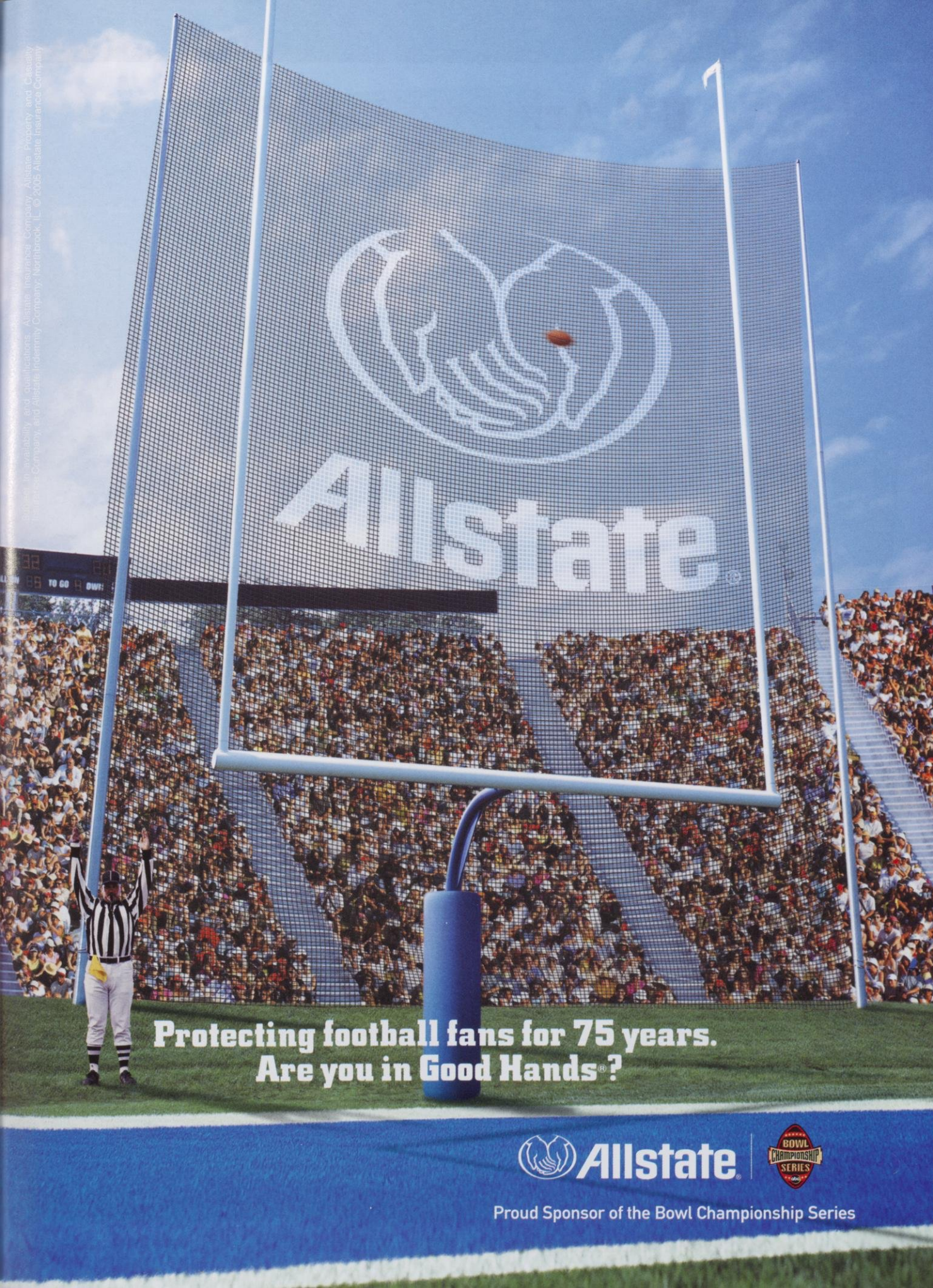
**DAVE SCHREINER** (1940-42): First two-time All-American ... three TD catches in one quarter still a school record

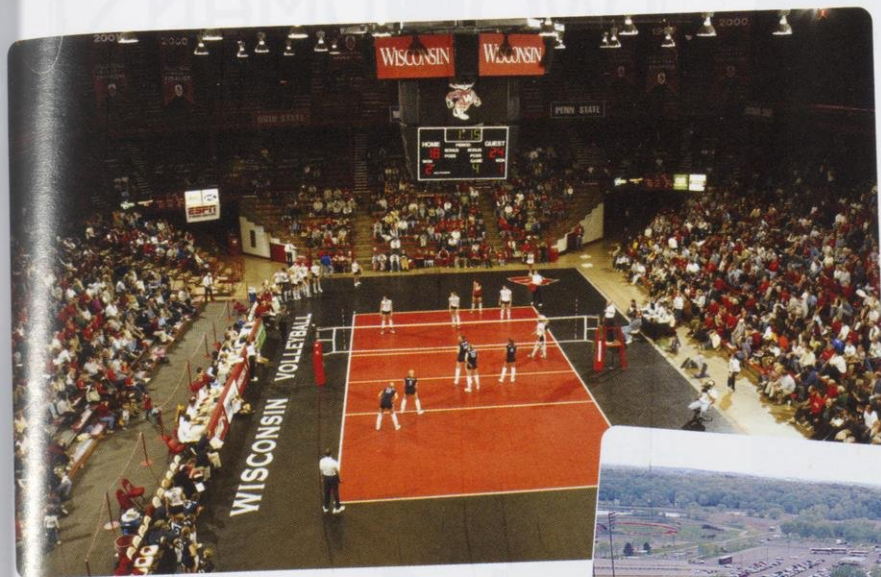

# CAMP RANDALL STADIUM POLICIES

## Conduct Code

In order to keep Wisconsin football games as enjoyable as possible for our fans and their families, we ask that you respect others around you. If a ticket holder's conduct endangers or disrupts players, coaches, officials or other patrons, the University reserves the right to remove the ticket holder from the premises. No refund will be made in such cases. Stadium violations (body passing, throwing objects, and possession of alcohol 21 or older) and object passing may result in a \$181 fine.

## Smoke-Free Facility

Smoking is prohibited in all state-owned buildings, including Camp Randall Stadium. Designated smoking areas are located within the stadium perimeter.

## Entry / No Re-entry

Please enter the gate printed on your ticket to allow for the most efficient entry to the stadium. Gates open 90 minutes prior to kickoff. Fans may not leave the stadium and then re-enter during the game. If an emergency arises, check with gate security.

## Alcohol

No alcohol may be brought into the Stadium. Possession may result in police arrest and a fine of \$181. The fine for first offense for underage possession/consumption of alcohol is \$243.



## Emergencies

In the event of a medical emergency, immediately notify a security guard, usher, police officer or paramedic in your area. UW Health First Aid Stations are located in the upper deck at Section FF, in the 5th level concourse behind Section T, and under Section YZ in the south end zone concourse.

It is possible to contact a patron during a game if you know their exact seat location by calling (608) 265-8676. No announcements will be made over the stadium sound system.

## Lost and Found

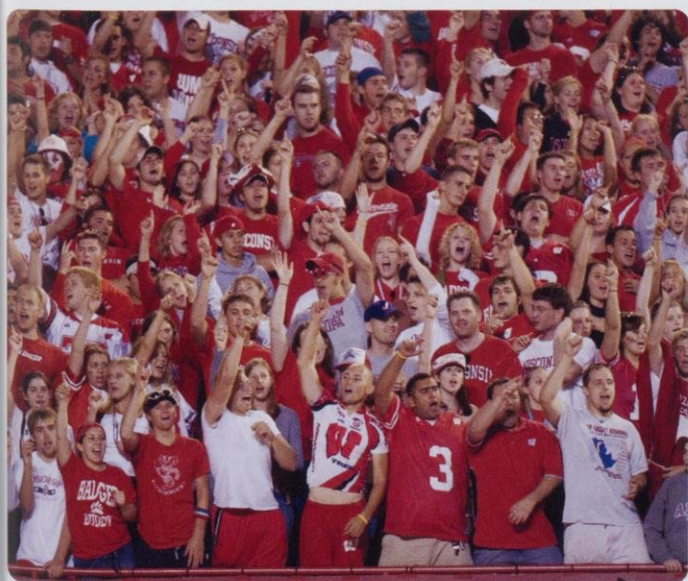

# CAMP RANDALL STADIUM RENOVATION

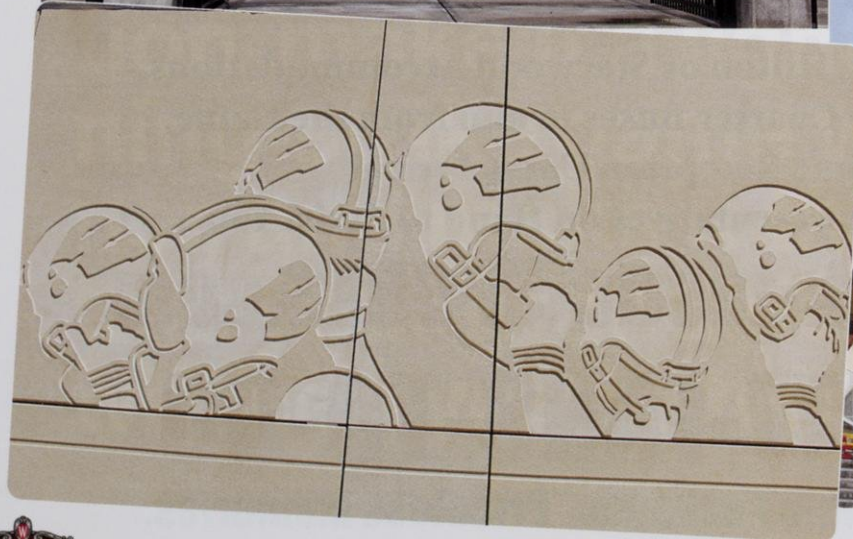
## NEW LOOK, SAME OLD CHARM FOR CAMP RANDALL

One of college football's legendary facilities—Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium—has just undergone a four-year, \$109 million renovation. The improvements are plentiful: new FieldTurf, suites and club seats, new video scoreboards, new offices, increased seating capacity and better fan amenities like concession areas, restrooms and traffic flow.

The enhancements, however, have not detracted from Camp Randall's charm; rather, the stadium's character has been enhanced greatly by the improvements, ensuring that future generations of Badger fans will have a first-rate facility at which to watch their beloved Badgers play on Saturdays in the fall.

Camp Randall was originally used as a Civil War training site. In fact, some 70,000 soldiers trained at the camp, which also included a hospital and a prison for Confederate soldiers on its grounds.

Named for Alexander Randall, the state of Wisconsin's first wartime governor, Camp Randall Stadium opened in 1917 and was officially dedicated when the Badgers defeated Minnesota, 10-7, on Nov. 3, 1917.

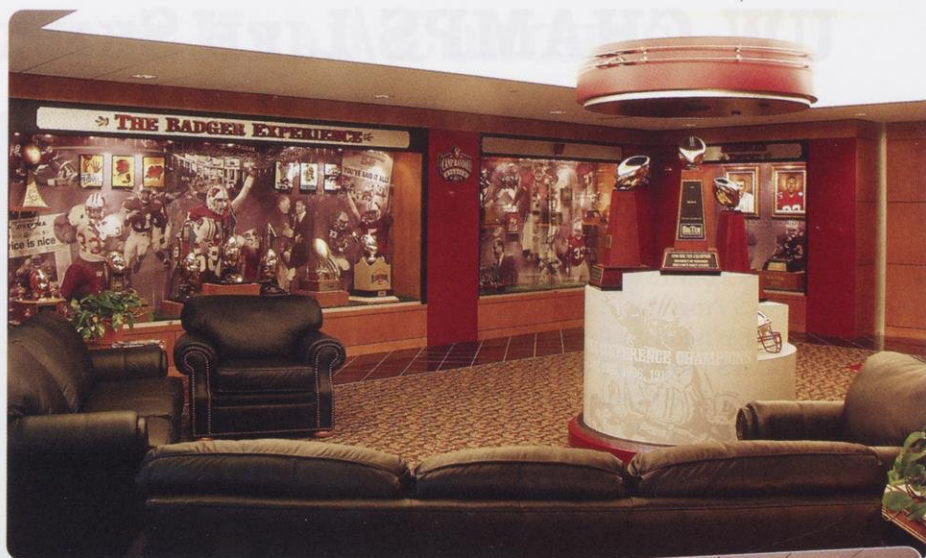

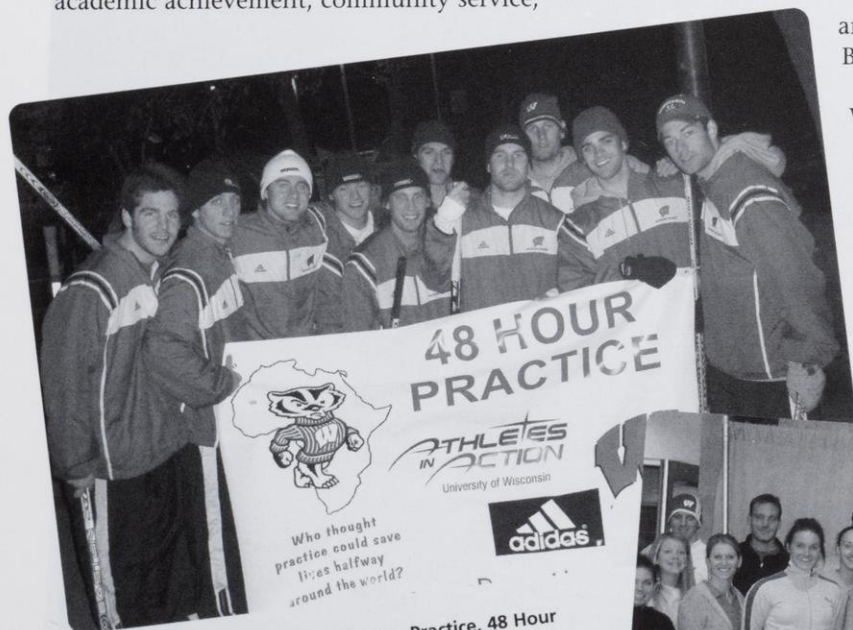

He also was named an "Unsung Hero" by the NFL Players' Association and was featured on the Fox Sports All-Madden Team as one of the National Football League's "good guys."





# THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE

## This is the Big Ten Conference

The Big Ten Conference is an association of 11 world-class universities whose member institutions share a common mission of research, graduate, professional and undergraduate teaching and public service. Intercollegiate athletics has an important place within the mission.

Founded in 1896, the Big Ten has sustained a comprehensive set of shared practices and policies that enforce the priority of academics in student-athletes' lives and emphasize the values of integrity, fairness and competitiveness. Big Ten universities provide in excess of \$82 million in athletic scholarship aid to more than 8,500 men and women student-athletes who compete for 25 championships, 12 for men and 13 for women. In 2004-05, the Big Ten distributed over \$116 million in revenues to its 11 member institutions. Conference

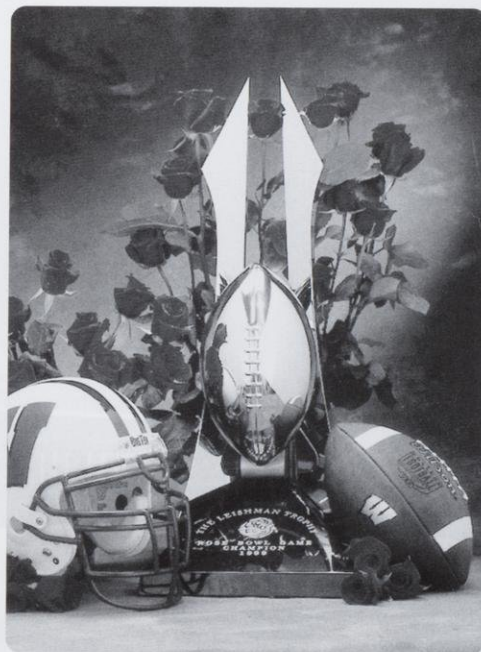
institutions sponsor broad-based athletic programs with more than 270 teams.

- Big Ten Universities are members of the nation's only conference whose constituency is entirely composed of institutions that are members of the AAU, a prestigious association of major academic and research institutions in the United States and Canada.

- Big Ten Universities host more than 70 Nobel laureates as faculty, students or researchers.

- Big Ten Universities enroll students of whom more than 41 percent have graduated in the top 10 percent of their high school class, while 74 percent graduated in the top quarter of their class.

- The Big Ten showcased more than 300 events that were televised national-



ly, regionally and locally last year, representing over 600 hours of programming.

- Since 1992, the Big Ten has created in excess of 2,000 new opportunities for women student-athletes and established 28 new women's teams.

- Throughout the conference, the Big Ten had more than 8,400 student-athletes playing on over 270 teams in 2003-04. Those student-athletes received in excess of \$82 million in direct financial aid.

- Big Ten student-athletes graduate at a rate of 10 percent higher than all Division I student-athletes.

- The Big Ten recognized 1,952 Academic All-Big Ten honorees during the 2004-05 academic year, the highest total in the last decade. Over the past five years, the Conference has annually acknowledged more than 1,700 student-athletes as Academic All-Conference honorees.

- In the past 10 years (1995-96 through 2004-05), the Big Ten claimed 40 NCAA team championships and 155 individual titles.

## BIG TEN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL INSTANT REPLAY FACTS

The Big Ten Conference will begin year two of its college football instant replay program in 2005. In addition, other leagues will also implement their own instant replay system after the NCAA approved the Big Ten's proposal to allow all NCAA conferences and independent institutions to experiment with the use of video replay for the 2005 season.

The goal of the Big Ten's football television replay plan is to: See, Review, Change (if warranted). Only specific plays are reviewable, and only those plays where the absolute standard of indisputable video evidence is met can a play be overturned.

Only the Technical Advisor serving as the review official for the game. Neither the game officials nor the coaches may ask for a review. The Technical Advisor will have the sole authority to change a call, or no call, on the field. Unlike the NFL model, officials working Big Ten games will not have the ability or capacity to view the replay(s).

The Big Ten Conference replay system allows for specific types of officiating mistakes to be immediately reviewed and corrected once the standard of indisputable video evidence is met. The replay system will not guarantee that all officiating mistakes are identified and corrected.

During the 2004 campaign, play was stopped in only 28 of 57 contests (49 percent) for a total of 43 stoppages and 21 overturned calls (49 percent of stoppages). The length of the 57 games utilizing instant replay in 2004 was only three hours and 16 minutes, compared to three hours and 13 minutes in all 2003 contests. Less than one stoppage occurred per game in 2004, as the Big Ten's average length of review was only two minutes and 39 seconds, compared to the National Football League average of three minutes and 20 seconds for its instant replay system.

# COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

## National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame

These seven former Badgers have received the highest honor the game of football affords. They have been inducted into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. They are the greats of the game and their achievements are documented at the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind.



Pat O'Dea (elected in 1962), nicknamed "The Kangaroo Kicker," was a two-time All-America fullback and punter between 1896-99. He also was a two-time team captain.



Robert Butler (elected in 1972) was a three-year letterwinner at tackle and won all-league (1912-13) and All-America (1913) laurels.



Pat Harder (elected in 1993), an All-America fullback, was the Big Ten's scoring and rushing champion in 1941.



Dave Schreiner (elected in 1955), the two-time All-America end, was the Western Conference MVP in 1942.



Pat Richter (elected in 1996) was a two-time All-America end and led the nation in receiving as a junior.




Marty Below (elected in 1988), a rugged right tackle, earned All-America praise as a senior.

# LEGACY OF CAMP RANDALL

*Today's Camp Randall experience is one of boisterous cheering, fan camaraderie and first-class football among a sea of red. This, however, was not always the case. On the same ground that today's young student-athletes do battle on the gridiron, young soldiers-to-be prepared for battle in the Civil War. From 1861 to 1865 the area where Camp Randall Stadium stands served as Civil War training grounds. In this season's game programs this page will be dedicated to the legacy of Camp Randall and its history in its pre-football days.*

On April 8, 1862, outnumbered Confederate troops surrendered their hold on Island No. 10 in the Mississippi, near where Missouri, Tennessee and Kentucky meet. The Confederates had held the island for a year, hindering the Union army's path for troops and supplies to the south. Two weeks later, of the Confederate soldiers captured at Island No. 10, just over 1,000 were sent as prisoners to Madison's Camp Randall. Carpenter and Hyer's Wisconsin Patriot wrote of the prisoners' arrival on April 26, 1862. The article described a crowd of local citizens coming to catch a glimpse of the prisoners while the Confederates themselves seemed in generally good spirits and even joked with people in the crowd. The newspapers also reported no indication of triumph from the locals, rather a sympathy and some even took steps to make their stay more comfortable, buying them postage stamps and tobacco.

At Camp Randall the prisoners received the same rations and conditions as the soldiers, except for their clothes, which proved a problem in the cold, harsh winters of Wisconsin. Many prisoners came to the camp with illness from exposure. In the first month, the prisoners' death toll was very high, at times up to 10 a day, but Confederate and Union officials alike did not blame the conditions at Camp Randall, but rather the condition many of the prisoners

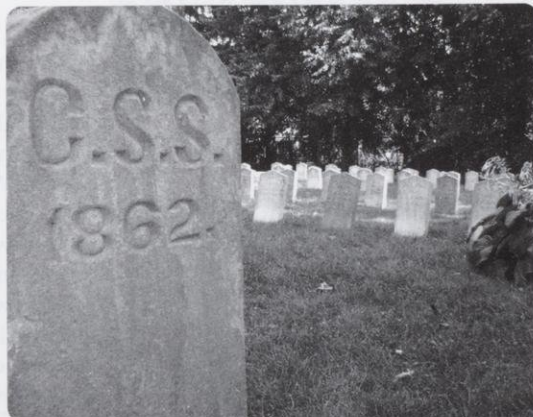
were in when arriving. In total, 140 prisoners died while at Camp Randall.

Those that died at Camp Randall were laid to rest at the Forest Hill Cemetery in a plot that has come to be known as the "Confederate Rest." The cemetery is located in Madison on Speedway Drive and is open daily for visitors to the Confederate Rest, Union Soldiers Lot as well as many others laid to rest in the cemetery.

Soon after they were buried, the Confederate Rest became forgotten by many in the area and the plots were neglected and overgrown. That is until, Mrs. Alice Whiting Waterman took up residence in Madison in 1868, six years after the soldiers' burial. A native of Baton Rouge, La., Waterman was widowed and managed the Vilas House Hotel. When she learned of the uncared for condition of the Confederate Rest she, at her own expense, maintained the plots of strangers until her death in 1897. After 25 years of tending to "her boys," as she called them, she was buried among them. Along with her marker, the Daughters of the Confederacy erected a monument with the names of all the soldiers resting there and a special tribute to Waterman.

## Men's Soccer

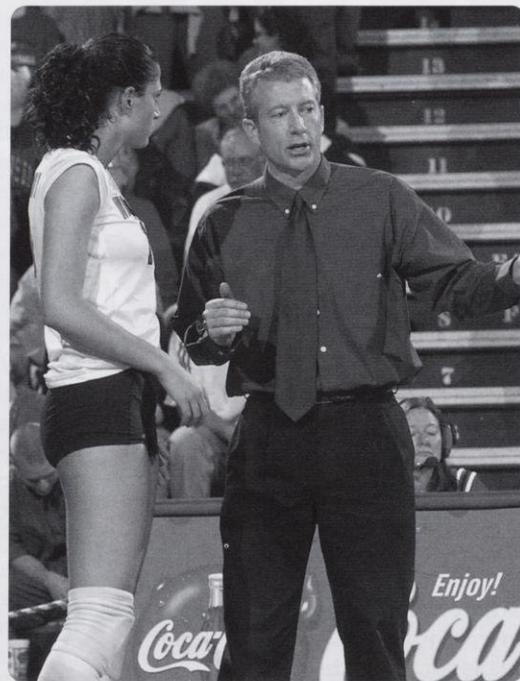

less animals along the Gulf coast. The association provided \$2,000 in matching funds, for a total of \$4,449 raised.

## More, faster, better

Mobility is the new mantra for students, according to an annual survey that finds laptop computer ownership about to surpass desktop computers and an expanding interest in wireless access.

The survey polled 1,600 students last spring to look at trends in technology use as well as future needs.

Laptop ownership has climbed from 26 percent of students in 2001 to 56 percent this year, while desktop computer ownership slumped from 74 percent to 61 percent over the same time.

One in five undergraduate students and two in five graduate students reported owning both laptop and desktop computers.

To accommodate the increase in laptop usage, wireless network development is a priority. UW-Madison currently has wireless access in most of the university's public access areas, such as the unions, libraries and some residence halls, but the goal is to have a ubiquitous wireless environment by summer 2006. A completely wireless network will involve creating 2,600 access ports around 130 buildings on campus.

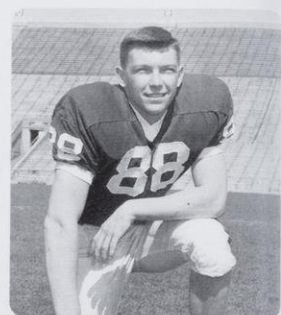

To gain admittance to the Hall, student-athletes must be former Academic All-Americans who distinguished themselves off the playing field after graduation.

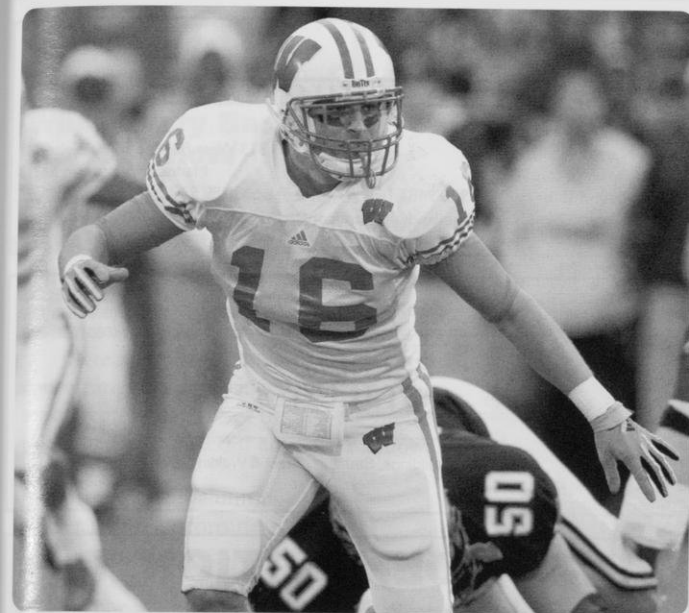
Ameche, who played professionally after graduation, retired in Philadelphia after his career and became one of the city's philanthropic leaders. Richter played pro football in Washington before returning to the UW to earn his law degree. He worked at a Madison law firm and at Oscar Mayer before his appointment as Director of Athletics at the University of Wisconsin.

# NCAA GUIDELINES

## What Every Badger Fan Should Know

With increasing numbers of NCAA rules governing outside intervention in recruiting, coaches cannot afford to have any extra "help" in recruiting elite student-athletes to the University of Wisconsin. The penalties are too severe.

Here are some tidbits of information concerning you and Badger athletics ... You are a "representative" of the UW's athletics interests (i.e., booster) if any of the following apply:

- a) you are an alumnus of the University of Wisconsin;
- b) you have ever made financial contributions to the athletics department, to an athletic booster organization of the UW, or to a UW athletics program;
- c) you have ever helped to arrange employment of enrolled student-athletes and/or National Letter of Intent signees;
- d) you have ever been involved in any way promoting the Badger athletic program.

Once an individual is identified as an "athletics representative/booster," the person retains that identity forever, even if that person no longer contributes to or supports the athletics program.

**NCAA Bylaw 13.01.5 states:** In Division I, a representative of the UW's athletics interests is prohibited from making in-person, on-or-off campus recruiting contacts, or written or telephonic communications with a prospect or the prospect's relatives or legal guardians.

A prospect is any student who has started classes for the ninth grade. In addition, any student younger than ninth grade could become a "prospect" if they receive any benefits from an institution or a booster. Student-athletes enrolled in preparatory school or two-year colleges are also considered prospective student-athletes.

## What Can You Do?

If you know of a high school or junior college student-athlete who might want to attend the UW, the only permissible activity for a representative is to call the appropriate UW coach.

### Extra Benefit Rule

A representative of UW athletics interests cannot provide an "extra benefit" to a prospective or enrolled student-athlete. An extra benefit is any special arrangement by



an institutional employee or a booster to provide for a student-athlete or a student-athlete's friend or relative not expressly authorized by NCAA legislation. Some examples of prohibited activities are:

- a) providing gifts or reduced cost services;
- b) providing a loan, or arranging for or co-signing a loan;
- c) employing relatives or friends of a prospective student-athlete as an inducement for the enrollment of the prospect;
- d) providing use of an automobile;
- e) providing rent-free or reduced-rent housing;
- f) providing tickets to an athletic, institutional or community event;
- g) entertaining or contacting a prospective student-athlete or a prospective student-athlete's family on or off campus;
- h) promising to provide any of the above;

According to NCAA rules, the University of Wisconsin Athletic Department reserves the right to withhold any benefit or privilege associated with their athletic department (i.e., booster clubs, ticket privileges, etc.) from individuals that are involved in a violation of NCAA legislation.

## Employment

NCAA rules are such that opportunities for your interaction with student-athletes are very limited. One of the best opportunities for alumni or friends of the program to assist student-athletes financially and provide them with a valuable internship experience is through employment. A representative of athletics interests is permitted to provide employment for student-athletes under the following conditions:

- Compensation can't include any remuneration for value or utility that the student-athlete may have for the employer because of the publicity, reputation, fame or personal following that he or she has obtained because of athletics ability;
- Compensation for only work actually performed; and
- Compensation at a rate commensurate with the going rate in that locality for similar services.

With more than 700 student-athletes competing at the UW, the Department of Athletics encourages businesses to hire Badger student-athletes. 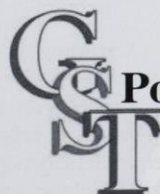

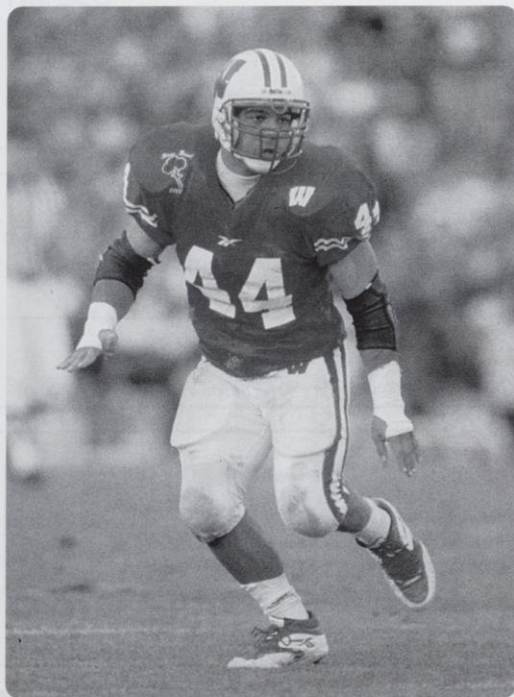

## ACCOMPLISHED WALK-ONS FOR THE BADGERS

They may have been told by many non-believers in their senior years of high school that they weren't big enough or fast enough to contribute to a Big Ten football program. However, a number of individuals have gone on to make their mark on the University of Wisconsin football program during the Alvarez era by originally joining the team as a walk-on.

Below is a partial list of some of the individuals that joined the Badgers as non-scholarship players, only to make major impacts at the UW and beyond.

• **Bob Adamov, linebacker:** four-year letterwinner; team captain and starter on the Badgers' 1998 Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion squad; Ivan Williamson Scholastic Award winner in 1998; one of nine senior starters named team MVP his final season.

• **Chad Cascadden, linebacker:** named the team's Special Teams Player of the Year in 1994; Academic All-Big Ten selection his senior year; letterwinner on UW's 1993 Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion squad; played for the NFL's New York Jets.

• **Matt Davenport, placekicker:** semi-finalist for Lou Groza Award; consensus first-team All-Big Ten in 1997 and 1998; scored 99 points as a senior, the most in school history for a placekicker; career field goal percentage (.868) is No. 1 at UW.

• **Jason Doering, safety:** team captain in both 1999 and 2000; led Badger defensive backs in tackles his final three seasons; ranks fourth all-time in career

solo tackles (250); starter on two Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion teams; currently plays for the NFL's New York Giants.

• **Joe Panos, offensive tackle:** team captain in 1993; starter on the Badgers' 1993 Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion team; first-team All-Big Ten and second-team AP All-American in '93; played for the NFL's Philadelphia Eagles and Buffalo Bills.

• **Mark Tauscher, offensive tackle:** three-year letterwinner; member of two Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion squads, including a starter on the 1999 team; helped Ron Dayne become NCAA all-time leading rusher; currently a starter for the NFL's Green Bay Packers.

• **Donnel Thompson, linebacker:** team captain in 1998 and 1999; starter on a pair of UW Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion teams; ranks 10th all-time in career tackles; two-time team-leader in tackles; played for NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers and Indianapolis Colts.

• **Mike Schneck, long snapper:** three-year letterwinner at Wisconsin; member of 1998 Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion team; signed free agent contract with Pittsburgh and currently plays for the Steelers.

• **Sam Veit, punter:** four-year starter and letterwinner; member of UW's 1993 Big Ten and Rose Bowl champion squad; ranks third all-time in career punts (209) and career punting yards (8,016); three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.

## LEONHARD WAS ULTIMATE WALK-ON SUCCESS STORY

Jim Leonhard's (pictured left) football accomplishments are worth noting all by themselves: three-time first-team All-American, three-time first-team All-Big Ten, holder of several Big Ten and school records for his play as both a defensive back

and punt returner. But that's only half the story.

Leonhard's accolades off the field are just as impressive. A 2004 first-team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American as selected by CoSIDA, Leonhard was honored in New York as one of 15 National Football Foundation Scholar-Athletes (with that goes an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship).

The 5-8, 186-pound Leonhard (who once won a team basketball slam dunk competition), a native of tiny Tony, Wis. (pop. 105), will go down as one of the most decorated players (let alone walk-ons) of the Alvarez era.

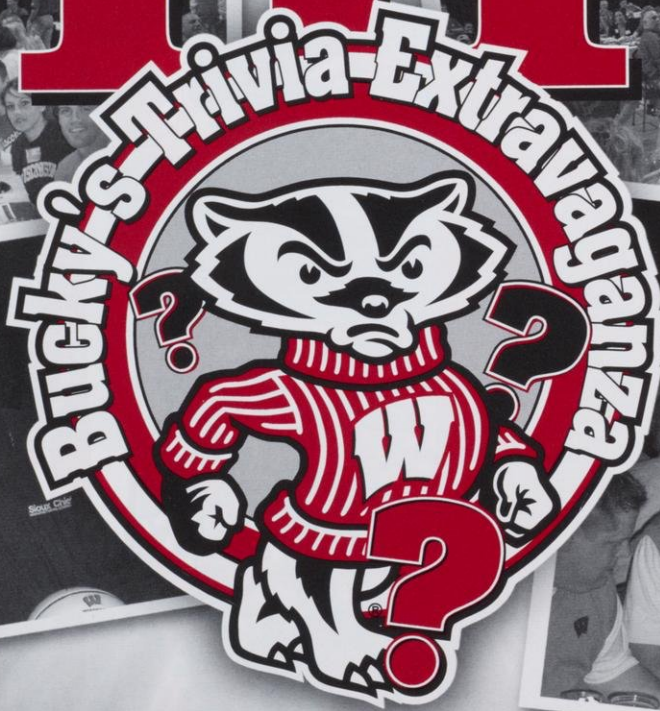

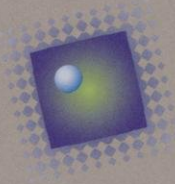
