History Of WHS



Waterford High School began with just three teachers and 42 students. The high school level was added to the graded school in 1904. The classes were held in three rooms of the graded school. The first class to graduate, in 1906, consisted of six students!

A separate building to house high school students was first built in 1916. That building was adequate until 1941 when a lack of space necessitated an addition. This addition included four new classrooms, a new library, and a gymnasium with a stage leading to the previous seven classrooms. A solarium was later built on the third story.

1957 saw many additions to the high school. The number of classrooms rose to 24 and the gymnasium and library

were enlarged. It was during this year that Waterford also acquired its present cafeteria and kitchen. Six years later, in 1963, another addition brought the number of classrooms to 38.

In 1964, the original section that had been built in 1916 had to be torn down because it was deemed unsafe. The present building, therefore, has no portions dating before 1941.

During this entire growth period, another expansion was taking place at Waterford High School. There was a sharp increase in enrollment. It grew from its original 42 to approximately 800.



The 1982 Homecoming Events

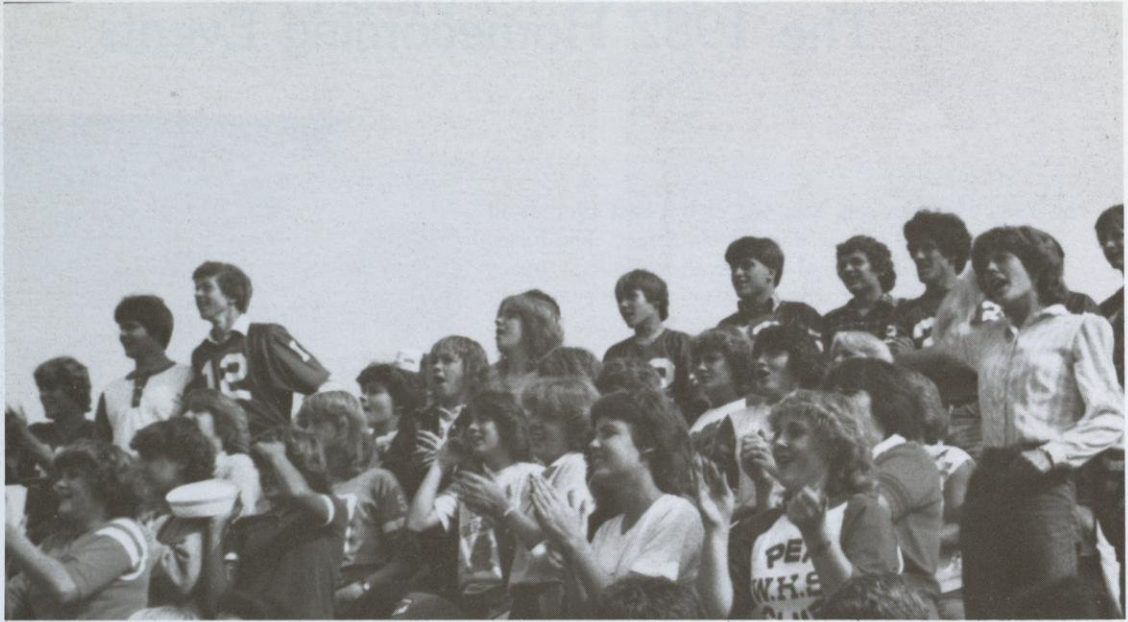

ADMINISTRATION

"I can't recall my graduating class prophecy that was distributed to us twenty five years ago, but I do know one thing for certain. I would have been the least likely candidate to become a School Superintendent. At that time I thought of being a lawyer, a businessman, or a professional athlete. Besides these interests, my classmates would attest that my behavior wasn't conducive to my becoming an educator unless you could preach that I could correct bad behavior because I had plenty of experience in it."

"Well, here I am. A question might be, how did I get here? An interest in teaching and coaching was kindled by athletic participation, experiencing good teachers, and the realization that I enjoyed schools and students. This career in education has included teaching, counseling, coaching and for the past 11 years I have been a High School Principal. While at times the pace has been hectic, it has been enjoyable and given much satisfaction, I view my selection as Superintendent as an opportunity to meet new challenges and to contribute what I can."



Mr. Zuelsdorf, who is in his 28th year of Secondary Education and his 26th year at Waterford High School, came here to teach biology, physics, and physics. He was given the coaching duties of Asst. football, head basketball, and the job of starting a track program. He was also assigned Sophomore class advisor and boys recreation, which met for one hour each week. He has also taught English, algebra, chemistry, and general science. He was the Athletic Director here for 14 years and Asst. Principal for 11.

SCIENCE



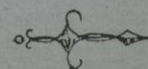
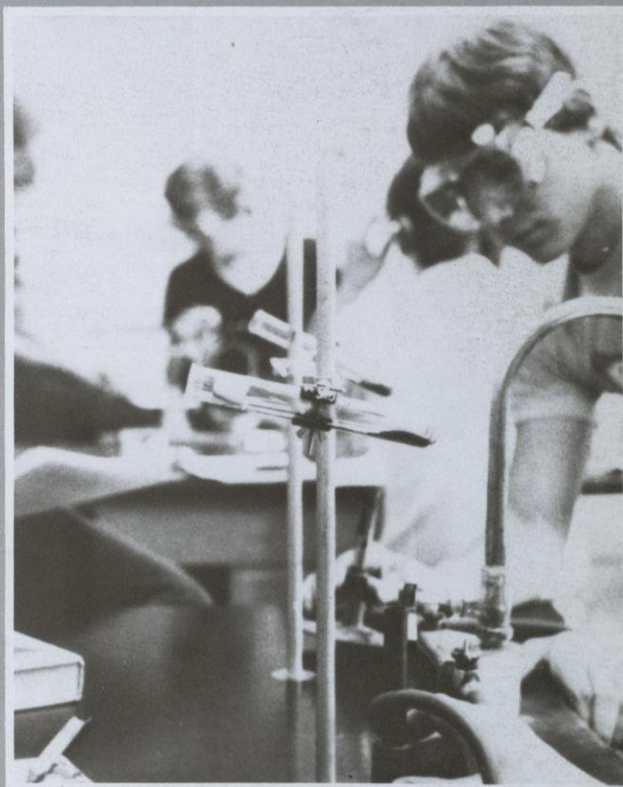

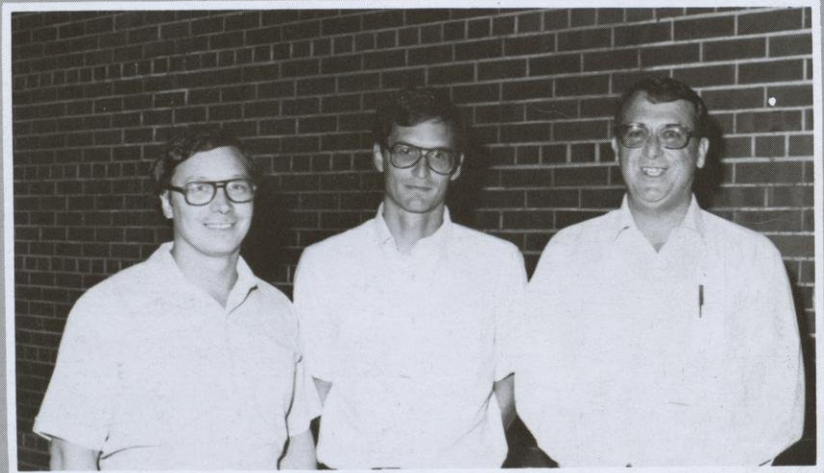


SOCIAL STUDIES

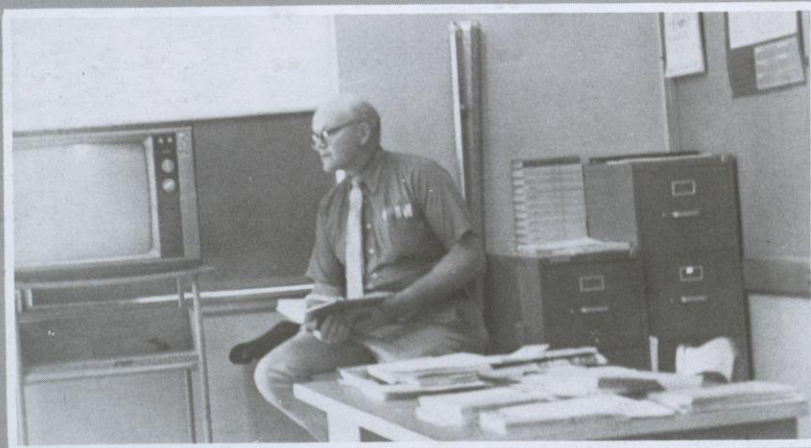

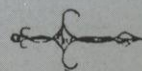
Clerical procedures and business machines are two more necessary skills which may interest the business-minded student. If you are concerned about your future, try Waterford's Business Education Department.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

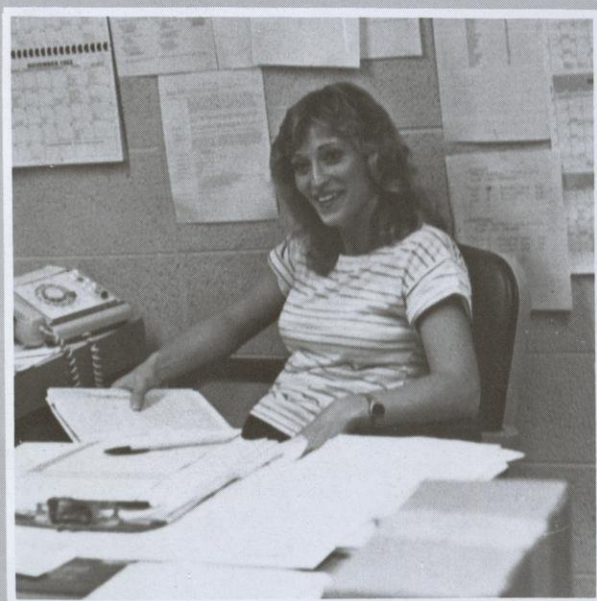

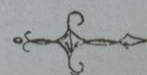

DRIVERS EDUCATION

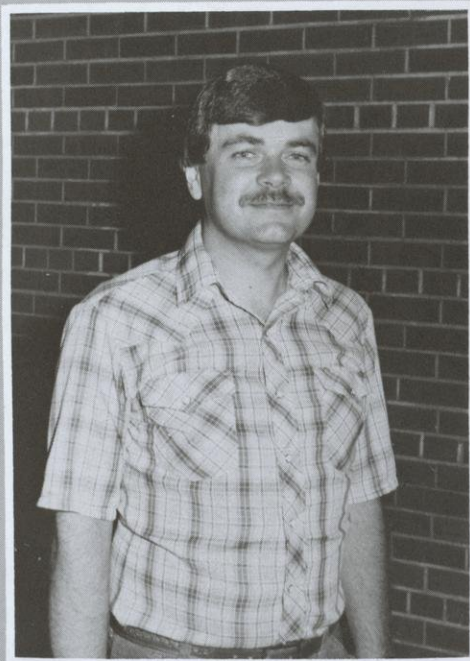

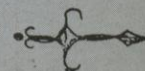

VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

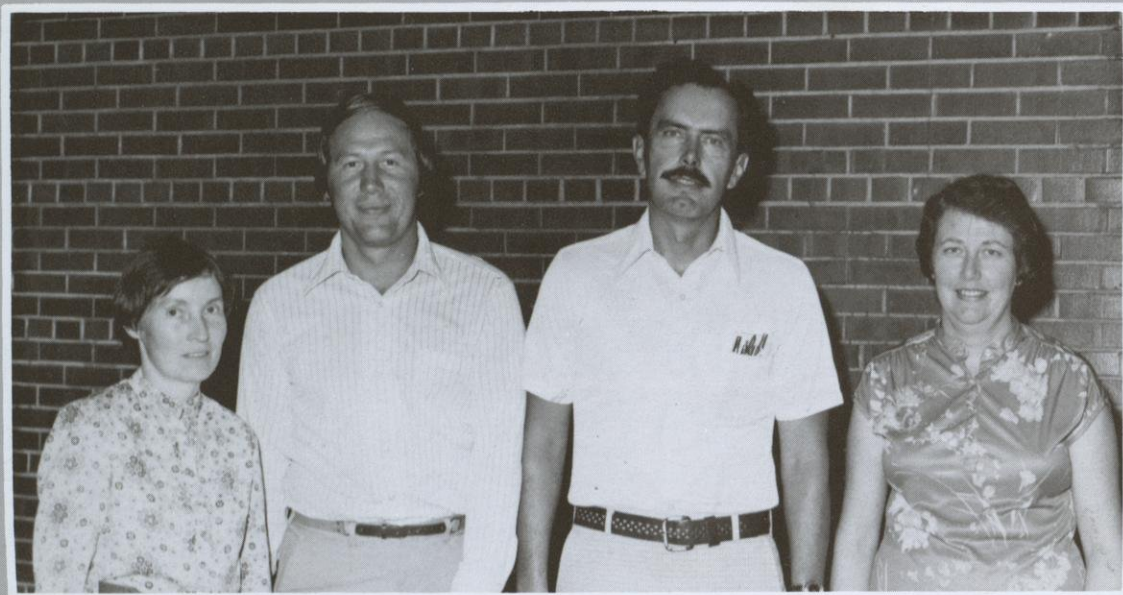

SECRETARIES



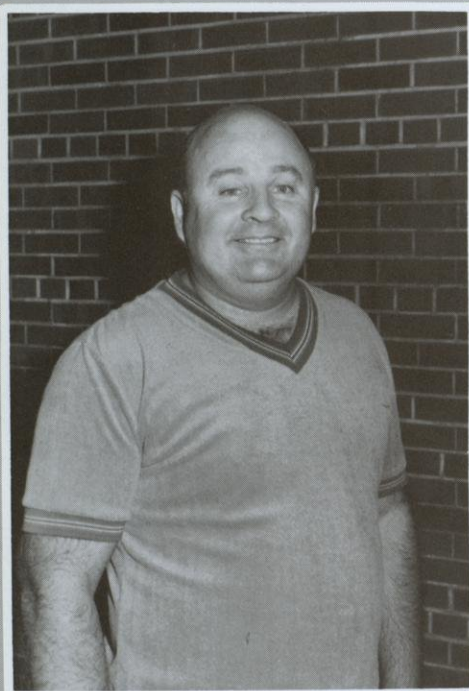

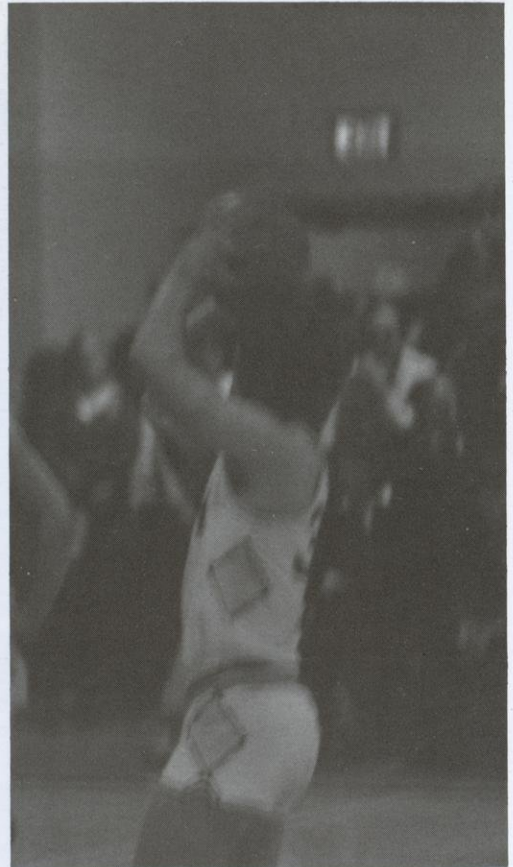

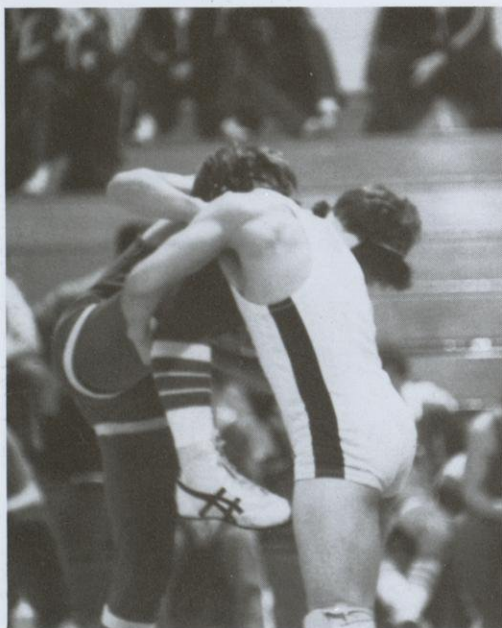

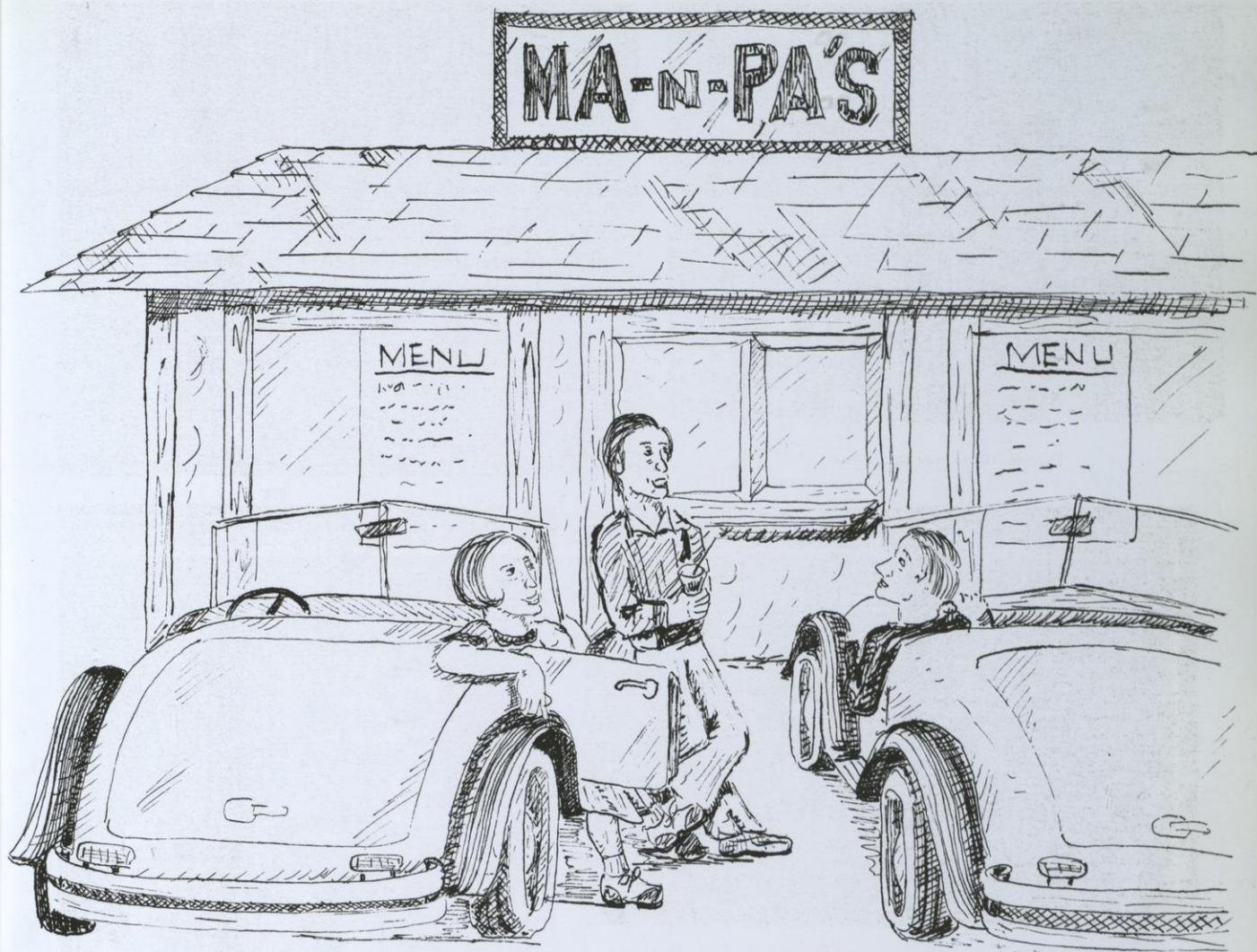

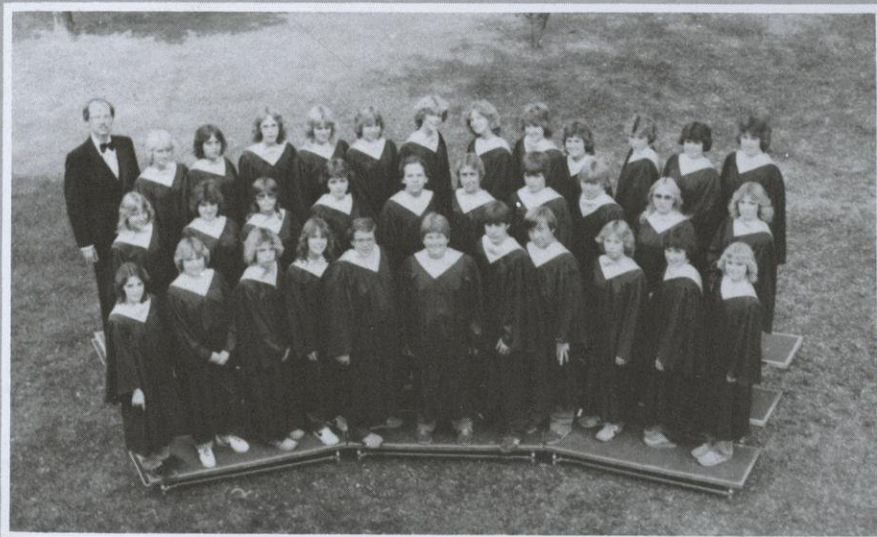

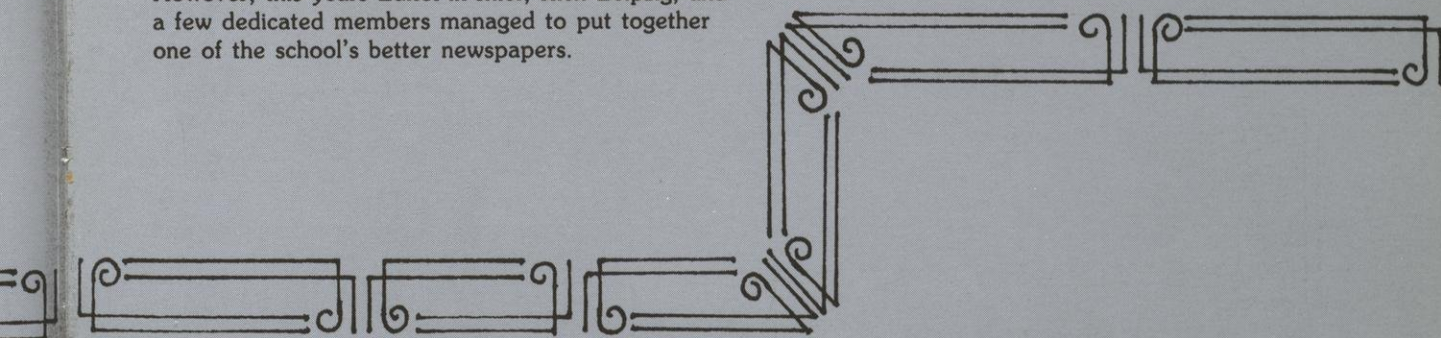

Yearbook Takes On A New Look

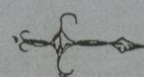

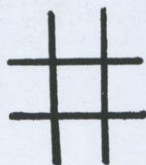

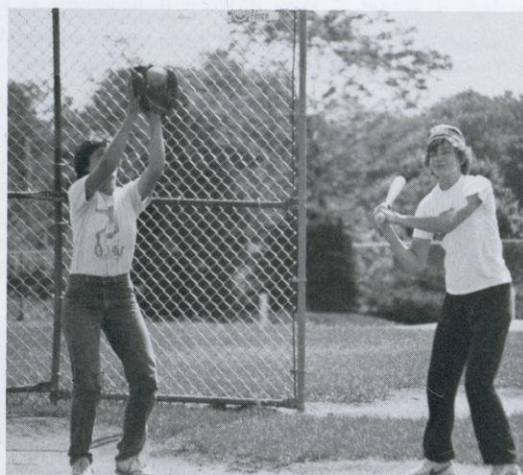
