

Sirt In compliance with law we have the honor to submit the following report of the transactions of this department for the two years ending June 30, 1950.

#### SALE OF LAND

The withholding of State school lands from public sale as a general policy, which has prevailed since 1913, has been continued. A few isolated descriptions or tracts, located outside of any state or federal park or forest, have been offered at public sale and sold when it appeared to be to the advantage of the state to dispose of them because of their being isolated, expensive to administer, and unsatisfactory as forestry lands. Some normal school lands in Outagamie County which appeared on our records as unsold or conveyed, and which were involved under Chapter 94, Laws of Wisconsin for 1866, were sold direct at the appraised price under the provisions of Section 14.531 Wisconsin Statutes and deeded to clear title of record.

Sales of escheated urban real estate, both in number and in total receipts realized therefrom in the last two years, appears greater than usual but not uncommon. This property accrues to the state when a person dies intestate, leaving no heirs, because the Constitution provides that the proceeds from the sele of such real estate shall inure to the Common School Fund.

#### SALE OF TIMBER

During this biennium less than 1,500,300° of marked and designated timber were offered at public sale and sold because of no appreciable demand for stumpage. During this same period, however, approximately 6,500,000° of blown-down, wind-damaged timber on the school lands were sold. These sales were held whenever the timber sold could be removed without injuring the standing green timber which remained. Most of the above sales became necessary because of the severe wind storm in October 1949. About 2,200,000° of the blown-down and wind-damaged timber so sold was in the Flambeau River State Forest. During this same period approximately 7,500,000° of standing timber was marked and designated for public sale at a later date when the demand for stumpage would be more favorable.

#### INVESTMENT OF FUNDS

There has been a decided increase in loans granted from the State Trust Funds the last two years, especially to school districts. We are sure that such an increase over a span of two years has never been experienced by this office in the past. A total of \$7,407,414.75 was invested in school district loans this biennium compared to

\$1.685.015.95 in the last biennium. A great number of these loans were for large amounts and for the purpose of constructing school houses or additions to schoolhouses, which in most cases were needed because of school district consolidations under a recent law. Loans this biennium to municipalities other than to school districts amounted to \$2,277,647.36, compared to \$992,613.00 for the last biennium. U. S. securities which cost \$6.418.957.10, and which were held by the Trust Funds, were sold to secure cash to satisfy this demand for loans. To assure, as far as possible, that funds will be available for loans to school districts during the coming biennium. in which our sources of cash for loaning will be greatly reduced, this Commission has declared that applications by school districts for small loans should have preference because school districts and other municipalities which need large loans can borrow the money through bond issues at a net interest rate which probably would be less than the interest rate charge on a loan from this office. Further, limiting loans in this manner will enable this Commission to satisfy a greater number of school districts with the limited funds available for loaning. Large loans to school districts will be granted whenever possible.

SWAMP LANDS IN THE BAD RIVER, LAC DU FLAMBRAU AND LAC COURT ORBILLES INDIAN RESERVATIONS

This case is still pending in the United States Court of Claims, Washington, D. C. This is a case in which the Indians of the above reservations are attempting to recover from the United States Government the value of the swamp lands in these reservations to which the State of Wisconsin has a prior claim under the Swamp Act of 1850. There have been hearings on this case at Washington during this biennium but no decision has been reached to-date by the U. S. Court of Claims. The Commission, however, under date of April 5, 1950, offered to quitclaim to the U. S. Government the State's interest in these reservations under the Swamp Act upon payment of \$250,000.

#### ISLANDS IN THE MISSISSIPPI AND WISCONSIN RIVERS

There appears to have been no activity by the U. S. Government the last two years in surveying or patenting to the State any additional islands in the Mississippi River under the Swamp Act.

Some islands in the Wisconsin River have been, or are in the process of being surveyed, and especially "One Mile" island located in Sections 4 and 5, Township 8 North, Range 1 East. We expect "One Mile" island and others in the Wisconsin River, which will be surveyed soon, to be patented to the State by the U. S. Government under the Swamp Land Act of 1850. These islands which existed in 1848 and have never been surveyed are swampy in character because they are subject to annual overflow and in all probability eventually will come to the state under the Swamp Land Act.

#### FLAMBEAU TRACT

This is a solid tract of school trust lands of 1560 acres located in the Flambeau River State Forest which the State Conservation Department is interested in purchasing as a wilderness area. This tract contains approximately 13,000,000° of virgin Hemlock and hardwoods and was appraised in 1948, along with six other trust fund descriptions lying north of this tract, at \$457,115.63. The tract in question was appraised at \$398,434.88. On September 28, 1948, at the request of the State Conservation Department, this

Commission granted a 90 day option to the State Conservation Department to purchase this tract and the six descriptions at the above price of \$457,115.63. The Conservation Department did not exercise this option before it expired but on March 22, 1949, it made an offer of \$253,000 for said tract. This offer was rejected by this Commission because it was less than the value of the treat according to the last appraisal and hence, under the law, could not be accepted. We believe that the unit prices used in the 1949 appraisal which totalled \$457,115.63 were fair and ressonable, being comparable to, and in most cases below, prices received on sales of timber elsewhere under similar conditions. As the Constitution imposes upon this Commission a duty to administer the assets of the school funds in a manner which will result in the greatest benefit to said funds, and as such tract consists of old growth timber, an improvement cutting on this tract under the provisions of Section 24.39 Statutes must be instigated if this purchase by the State Conservation Department is not completed soon. Sometime ago the Commission withdrew this tract from public sale to preserve it for purchase by the Conservation Department for a wilderness area or for periodical timber improvement cutting by this Commission for the benefit of the state school funds. The Constitution and Statutes will not permit this Commission to hold this tract indefinitely as an unproductive wilderness area.
