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REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS

Tuesday and Wednesday, December 7-8, 1937

The meeting convened on December 7 at 10 A.M., President Wilkie presiding

At 11 A.M. a recess was taken to 2 P.M. in order that the Regents might attend the meeting with the Emergency Board in the Governor's office.

At 2 P.M. the Regents reconvened.

Regent Gates presented a plan for the construction of prefabricated dormitories, and drawings and elevations were explained by representatives of the Harnischfeger Corporation of Milwaukee.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

1. That upon the recommendation of Dean Christensen, authority be requested of the Governor to replace a 1936 Chevrolet operated by the College of Agriculture Extension Service with a new car at an estimated net cost of \$360, chargeable to 15A, U.S. Grants - Extension.

2. That upon the recommendation of the Executive Committee (Minutes of November 30, 1937), and in accordance with the authority of the Regents as given in an opinion of the Attorney General dated November 29, 1937, the following resolution be adopted:

sity of Wisconsin, as lessor, and the State Highway Commission of Wisconsin, as lessee, submitted to this meeting and marked for identification as "Exhibit A" for inclusion in the minutes of this meeting, which lease pertains to a certain parcel of land which is leased by the Regents to the Highway Commission for a period of forty years from December 1, 1937, and the President and Secretary, respectively, of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin are hereby authorized, empowered and directed for and on behalf and in the name of the said Regents to sign and countersign, execute and deliver an original and as many copies as shall seem to them necessary or desirable of a lease in the form of the said lease marked "Exhibit A", under the seal of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin which the Secretary of the said Regents is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to affix and attest prior to delivery of the said original and copies of the said lease;

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FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper officers of the University of Wisconsin be and they hereby are authorized, empowered and directed to do and perform any and all acts or
things which may be necessary or advisable fully to perform
the terms, covenants and conditions set forth in the said
lease. (Copies of the proposed lease were mailed to each Regent on November 30, 1937.)

3. That upon the recommendation of Dean Christensen, authority be granted to lease 60 acres of farm land (known as the Tadey farm) adjoining the University Branch Experiment Station at Sturgeon Bay from Tony, Stanka, and Rudolph Tadey, for a period of five years from January 1, 1938, at an annual rental of \$400, payable \$200 on June 30 and \$200 on December 31, Chargeable to 3K Dairy and Farm Sales, and that the Business Manager be authorized to sign the lease for the Regents.

President Wilkie read a letter from Mr. W. A. Boardman, Counsel for the Wisconsin State Employees' Association, in relation to Section 10-A, Chapter 6, Laws of 1937 (Cashman Act). Following discussion of this matter, President Wilkie presented the following resolution:

MOVED, That the Regents authorize the immediate commencement of an action by them in the nature of mandamus or such other form of action as they may lawfully, in the opinion of the Attorney General, maintain for the purpose of securing an adjudication directing and authorizing payment by the appropriate state officers of the amounts due University employees for back pay under the provisions of Section 10-A, Ch. 6, Laws of 1937. The Attorney General is further requested to appear for the Regents in any action brought to secure such a determination, and to aid in the expeditious conduct of such action so as to secure an adjudication at the earliest possible time. If the law is sustained then all University employees covered by the law and similarly situated will be paid on the same basis in each department of the University whether the employees are paid out of specific appropriations or from revolving funds.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Glover, adopted.

The Business Manager presented petitions for salary increases from employees in the civil service ranks. The petitions were received and placed on file.

The matter of proposed salary increases to be requested of the Emergency Board, to become effective January 1, 1938, was discussed. It was

President Dykstra reported upon the following adjustments in the Medical School:

The President of the University of Wisconsin submitted to the meeting a letter dated November 2, 1937, received from the Trustees under the Last Will and Testament of La Verne Noves, deceased, outlining the terms of a proposed gift in trust to the Regents of the University of Wisconsin, to be held for the use and benefit of the University of Wisconsin, and also submitted a proposed form of contract received from said Trustees;

Thereupon, after discussion, the following resolutions were adopted:

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the President of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin be and he is hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of this Board, to execute said contract when the same shall be submitted in final form, and that the Secretary of the Regents of the University of Wisconsin be and he is hereby directed to affix thereto the corporate seal of these Regents when said contract has been so executed.

A communication was presented from the City Clerk, together with a resolution passed by the Common Council of the City of Madison, requesting the removal of the barracks at Camp Randall. Upon motion of Regent Gates this matter was referred to the Business Committee.

The Business Manager presented a communication from Lt. Colonel W. G. Weaver of the Military Department, stressing the need for target ranges, classrooms and storage space. The matter was referred to the Business Committee.

The matter of the Rieder Farm was discussed and it was reported that the taxes on this farm for 1936 were \$376.34. Upon motion of Regent Mead, seconded by Regent Glover, it was VOTED, That the Wisconsin University

RESOLVED, That the proper officers of this corporation be and they hereby are authorized and empowered in the name and on behalf of this corporation and under its corporate seal, to make application to the Federal Housing Administration for approval as a mortgagee under the provisions of Title II of the National Housing Act; to submit applications to the Federal Housing Administration for insurance of mortgages under such Title II; and, to enter into any agreements, execute any documents or papers and furnish any information required or deemed necessary or proper by the Federal Housing Administration in effecting such applications and such insurance; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Federal Housing Administration is authorized to rely upon the foregoing resolution and to deal with such officers as the authorized agents of this corporation until receipt of written notice from the secretary of this corporation to the contrary.

The Secretary presented the matter of dedicating the Arboretum Road to the public and the question of whether the connection to the west end of Capitol Avenue would be through Balden Street, or whether a new road should be constructed by CCC labor starting at the east end of the concrete which is remaining on Capitol Drive, the balance of the concrete on Capitol Drive having been removed in connection with the development of the islands and waters in the Arboretum.

Upon motion of Regent Glover it was VOTED, That the Arboretum Committee be authorized to negotiate with the Madison Township Board with reference to the entire matter and bring back to the Board definite drawings and recommendations for final action by the Board.

President Dykstra made a brief statement with reference to his conferences with the Teachers Union.

At 4:35 adjournment was taken to Wednesday, December 8, at 9 A.M.

RESOLVED, That the Wisconsin University Building Corporation is authorized to negotiate a loan for the purpose of building and equipping one or two housing units for men students at a total cost of not to exceed \$20,000 for one or \$40,000 for two units, interest to be at not over 4% and amortization schedule as may be mutually agreed upon.

RESOLVED, That the Wisconsin University Building Corporation is authorized to advertise for bids for one or not more than two housing units each to accommodate approximately 30 to 40 boys and to be constructed along the general lines of plans presented to and discussed by the Board on December 7, when such plans have been approved by the special dormitory committee of this board and by the Executive Committee of the Board; that the Executive Committee is authorized to give approval for the location of such building or buildings and to approve the necessary contracts to be entered into by the Wisconsin University Building Corporation when funds are available for the purpose.

The Committee recommends that the following plan be tried out as an experiment for the academic year 1938-39:

That the fee be reduced from \$200 to the reciprocal fee or \$100, whichever is higher, in the case of undergraduate students who:

- (1)have attained sophomore standing; and
- (2)have had at least one year's work at Wisconsin, and
- (3) have earned a 2.0 grade-point scholastic average during their last year at Wisconsin;

and in the case of graduate students who:

- enter this University with a 2.0 grade-point scholastic average in accredited institutions for their undergraduate work; and/or
- have earned a 2.0 grade-point scholastic average in work at this institution during the immediately preceding year.

President Dykstra referred to the report on dormitories known as the "Kowalke report". This was received and placed on file.

By Faculty

The report of the Faculty Dormitory Committee, signed by D. L. Halverson, Chairman, was received and placed on file.

Regent Hones brought up the matter of the Business Manager's recommendation No. 3, the rental of a 60 acre farm in Door County/and stated that he had learned that there would be a rental of \$120 a year from the house, reducing the farm rental to a net of \$280, which was regarded as a reasonable rent. Upon motion of Regent Hones, seconded by Regent Glover, it was

VOTED, That recommendation No. 3 of the Business Manager be approved. (see p. 8)
