





The University of Wisconsin will be the first Big Ten Conference school to serve as host to two NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championships. The Wisconsin Field House was the site of the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship setting attendance records of 11,155 for the championship and 9,930 for the semifinals making it the most watched collegiate volleyball event ever. Wisconsin looks to repeat that feat again in 1998 when the championship returns to Madison.




The Wisconsin Field House was the site of the most watched collegiate volleyball event ever when Wisconsin played host to the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Championship. Wisconsin holds the No. 1, No. 3 and No. 5 all-time highest collegiate volleyball attendance figures.


The University of Wisconsin women's athletic department ranked No. 1 in the unofficial Big Ten Conference composite rankings for 1994-95.

Wisconsin led the Big Ten Conference in overall attendance in 1995 with a total of 30,788 spectators.


A former Olympic coach, John Cook begins his fourth year as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin. Cook not only brings Olympic credentials but also national championship experience to the Badger program.

Cook has led the Badgers to two NCAA tournament appearances in his three-year stint. In 1993, Wisconsin finished fifth in the always tough Big Ten Conference with an 11-9 record. In the first round of the NCAA tournament, the Badgers swept South Florida at home before losing at Hawaii in the second round. Wisconsin finished with a 19-13 mark overall with Joanna Grotenhuis earning honorable mention all-Big Ten honors.

The Badgers also appeared in the 1994 NCAA tournament losing at George Washington in a closely fought five-game match in the first round. Wisconsin again finished fifth in the league at 11-9 and 21-12 overall. Grotenhuis earned first-team all-Big Ten honors while Laura Abbinante was named to the all-Mideast Region second team.

In his first year at Wisconsin, Cook led the young Badgers to a 14-17 record and a seventh-place finish in the Big Ten Conference. Senior Arlisa Hagan was named to the second-team all-Big Ten Conference team while setting the all-time UW kills and blocking records.

Cook garnered international and Olympic coaching experience as the first



assistant coach with the United States Men's National Volleyball team. He aided the U.S. to a bronze medal in the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona. The team's defensive coordinator, Cook was also in charge of scouting and supervising the team's flexibility, strength and conditioning programs.

For his Olympic coaching experience, Cook was honored in June of 1993 at the NACDA/USOC Collegiate Coaches Recognition Awards Luncheon.

Prior to his appointment with the national team, Cook served as the head assistant coach with the University of Nebraska women's volleyball program from 1988-91. During his tenure, the Huskers advanced to the NCAA final four every year including a second-place finish in 1989. Nebraska also captured the NCAA Mideast Regional and Big Eight Conference championship each of those three years.

Cook served as the Huskers' recruiting coordinator, scouting chief, strength and conditioning coordinator, and was the liaison with the academic advising center. Nebraska earned seven volleyball academic all-America honors during a three-year period, ranking them No. 1 in the country.

Cook's collegiate coaching experience also includes being the head assistant coach at the University of California-San Diego from 1983-84. Cook aided the Tritons to a NCAA Division III National Championship in 1984 and a second-place national finish in 1983.

In U.S. Olympic Festival competition, Cook served as head coach of the bronze medal-winning North team in 1989, and was an assistant coach with the third-place West team in 1987.



A co-founder of the San Diego Volleyball Club, Cook served as a coach with the club from 1986–88. The club won two Southern California Regional Championships and finished among the final four teams twice in the USVBA Junior Olympics for girls 18 and under.


Cook's coaching credentials also include leading Parker High School in San Diego to two California state championships. During his six-year coaching stint, he had a .900 winning percentage with an overall record of 162–18, including a 90-match league winning streak.

A graduate of the University of San Diego, Cook earned his bachelor's degree in history in 1979. He completed his master's degree in teaching and coaching effectiveness from San Diego State University in 1991.


Cook and his wife Wendy are the parents of two children—Lauren, 4, and Taylor, 2.

## ■ Megan McCallister

**M**egan McCallister, a former member of the United States National Women's Volleyball team, begins her third year as an assistant coach with the Wisconsin volleyball program.


A six-foot outside hitter, McCallister was a member of the national team from 1991-93. She competed in the 1991 Pan American Games and 1991 World University Games earning a bronze medal. As a

member of the Chrysler Californians, she won the inaugural NORCECA Women's Club Championship in 1991.

A 1991 graduate of the University of Southern California in business administration, McCallister served as the Trojans captain as a senior. A four-year starter, she was a two-time all-PAC 10 selection. As a freshman McCallister led the conference and ranked fifth nationally in hitting percentage at .391. She was named to the PAC 10 all-freshman team. McCallister completed her career at USC with 1,472 kills and 375 blocks, and led USC to three appearances in the NCAA tournament. She was also named the USC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1991.

McCallister competed in the 1986 and 1987 U.S. Olympic Festivals earning bronze medals. A native of Manhattan Beach, Calif., she graduated from Mira Costa High School and was named the 1986 high school player of the year by *Volleyball Monthly*.

Following her graduation, McCallister worked as an assistant to the branch manager at Paine Webber in Beverly Hills, Calif. She is currently working toward her master's degree in educational administration at Wisconsin.




## ■ Craig Skinner

**A** former member of the Ball State men's volleyball team, Craig Skinner begins his second season with the Badger volleyball program.

As a member of the third-place 1990 NCAA Championship team, Skinner was team captain twice for the Cardinals. He finished 13th on the Ball State career list for service aces and digs. As a sophomore, Skinner received the Mid-American Conference Commissioner's Award for Academic Excellence. He graduated from Ball State with a bachelor's degree in accounting in 1993.

While attending Ball State, Skinner also worked as a coach and administrative assistant with the Munciana Volleyball Club, one of the most successful club volleyball programs in the country. Skinner was an assistant coach with the Munciana 18's, aiding them to three top-five finishes at the USVBA Junior Olympics. He also worked as the head junior varsity coach and assistant varsity coach at Muncie's Burriss High School. Skinner led the junior varsity program to an undefeated 17-0 season while the varsity program was crowned *USA Today* High School National Champions in 1990.

In addition to his club experience, Skinner has worked a number of volleyball camps around the nation.



As you look north at night, you may see a light on the horizon. It starts out as just a glow, but it soon fills the entire sky. It's the newest Northern Light—the Wisconsin Volleyball team reaching for the sky in '95.

Under coach John Cook, the Badgers began a quest three years ago to reach the heights of the volleyball world—to win the Big Ten Conference Championship and challenge for the NCAA title. Wisconsin has made two consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament and Cook expects the Badgers to take off in 1995 looking for three in a row.

"We're very young and talented," said Cook of his '95 squad. "Our returnees have worked really hard during the off season and our incoming freshmen are very athletic and enthusiastic. All of our players will help us move from being a fringe top-20 team to being a solid top-20 team."

Cook will rely on his upperclassmen of two seniors and one junior to use their experience and leadership to help the Badgers mature. Seniors Jaime Smith and Tricia Landry have appeared in three NCAA tournaments and know what it takes to win crucial matches.

"The seniors will do a great job of providing leadership at critical times," says Cook. "They will win some big matches for us with their leadership and determination. We're looking for Jaime and Tricia to help us reach the top."

"Jaime is a very dynamic back-row player. She can help us win a lot of matches with her serving, defense and passing. She makes an impact every time she gets into the game."

Smith, from El Toro, Calif., played in all 33 matches last season primarily as a back-row player. A two-time Academic all-Big Ten selection, the 5-9 defensive specialist finished fifth on the team in digs with 223. She also had 16 service aces.

A Milwaukee, native, the 6-0 Landry played middle blocker in 12 matches last season setting a match career high in attack percentage against Eastern Illinois. One of the hardest working players on the team, Landry is also one of the most reliable players according to Cook.

"Tricia plays up to her ability no matter what the situation is. She's a good role player that we can insert at the key times and something good is going to happen."

Along with strong leadership from his senior class, Cook also expects his junior class of Laura Abbinante and Holly Smith to spread their wings this season.

One of the premier setters in the country according to Cook, Abbinante is "ready to take this team and go with it."

"At her position, she can do it all—she can set, she can block, she can play defense and serve at a very high level. We're very strong at the setting position."


The 5-9 Abbinante, from Itasca, Ill., earned second-team AVCA all-Mideast Region honors last season. She set a UW season record for assists with 1,544, which

ranked fifth in the Big Ten Conference with 12.25 per game. Abbinante led the team with 36 service aces and ranked second in digs with 335. She also appeared in the 1994 and 1995 Olympic Festivals.


Smith, who missed several matches last season due to a sprained ankle, played in 18 matches averaging 1.14 kills and 0.86 blocks per game. One of the Badgers most consistent hitters, Smith ranks sixth on the UW career list for attack percentage at .261.

"Holly has to score points for us with her great blocking," says Cook of the Wheaton, Ill., native, who led the Badgers in blocking as a freshman. "She has the ability to be the best blocker on our team and lead us in blocking. Offensively, she can hit for a very high percentage because we'll set her in specific situations where she'll be successful for us."

Offensively is where the Badgers need to improve the most if they want to challenge for the Big Ten Championship and move up in the national rankings. Wisconsin had an attack percentage of .209 last season, which ranked seventh in the league. Cook is already looking for ways to improve his team's offensive percentage.

"Our success will be determined by ball control," says Cook. "We have to ball handle and pass the ball to Laura. We need to get her the ball in position so she can run our offense. Once we do that, we need to have our hitters execute. When we consistently pass the ball to Laura's target position, our hitters can execute more effectively."

Much of the Badgers offensive power will come from this year's sophomore class. As freshmen, Lauren Burny, Heather Dodaro and Amy Lee all saw significant playing time. Cook expects that trio, along with redshirt sophomore Dawn Kelly, to be among the Badgers rising stars.

"We're going to ask our sophomore class to do more than they did last year," says Cook. "They will have the confidence, the maturity and the discipline to raise their level of play and help the Badgers compete for a Big Ten Championship."

Dodaro, a native of Oak Lawn, Ill., is the Big Ten's top returning blocker. She led the team with 1.46 blocks per game as a freshman setting a UW season record for block assists with 159. Dodaro finished third on the team in kills with 268 including a career high 17 against George Washington in the NCAA tournament. The 6-0 Dodaro started all 33 matches at middle blocker for the Badgers last season and Cook expects her to continue her starting role at middle blocker or outside hitter this season.

"We're going to ask Heather to do more things offensively than she did last year," says Cook. "She's a very dynamic, high-level athlete

that is capable of carrying a big hitting and blocking load for us. She can do things that will give other teams a lot of problems.

Dodaro has also improved her back-row play and Cook expects her play all the way around this season. "She can make spectacular plays and run balls down all over the court."

Already making spectacular plays as a freshman was Lauren Burny. The 6-0 outside hitter served as one of the Badgers primary passers last season in addition to showing her range hitting and at the serving line. The 6-0 outside hitter ranked third on the team in digs with 313 and second in kills with 316 (2.77 per game). A jump server, Burny was fourth on the team in service aces with 24.


"Lauren has the capability of leading our team in digs and her jump serve is a threat to score a point everytime she serves," says Cook of the Elmhurst, Ill., native.

"We need Lauren to spread her intensity around the court. She has a love for a hard battle and we need her to share that with the rest of our team."

One of the biggest stars for the Badgers this season could be Amy Lee. A 6-0 left-handed outside hitter, Lee started several matches last season. She finished fourth on the team in kills with 212 including a career high 19 against Bowling Green State.

"Amy will add something to our attack that we haven't had before which is a left-hander hitting on the right side," says Cook. "Opponents will now have to deal with both the left side and the right side attack. Amy will score a lot of points with her attack. The more we get Amy the ball, the better it is going to be for the Badgers."

Opponents may also have to worry about the Badgers' middle attack with the emergence of middle blocker Dawn Kelly. After show-

ing signs of brilliance during the spring, the 5-11 Kelly could make a major impact for the Badgers this fall. The Neenah, Wis., native, played in only seven matches last season recording career highs of five kills and five blocks against UW-Milwaukee.

"If Dawn can continue the development that she showed this spring, she is going to have the opportunity to get a lot of playing time," says Cook. "She has the talent and the athletic ability to be unstoppable, but she has to prove that she can compete consistently at a high level."

In addition to the sophomore class spreading its wings in 1995, Cook is counting on at least one of his freshmen to take off and step into a starting role. Cook calls his freshman class "good all-around athletes that can do many things to help our team."


Leading the way is 5-11 outside hitter Marisa Mackey. A 1995 *Volleyball* Fab 50 selection, Mackey led Muncie's (Ind.) Burris High School to three state championships. She is a 1994 Mizuno second-team all-American and 1993 USVBA second-team all-American. A two-time all-state honoree, Mackey was named the Delaware County Player of the Year.

"Marisa is a solid all-around player—she performs all the skills well," says Cook. "She can do a lot of things to help our team win and be successful. Her intelligence and maturity level are going to allow her to contribute her freshman year."

Another *Volleyball* Fab 50 selection is 5-9 setter Colleen Neels. A native of Pewaukee, Wis., Neels is the 1994 Wisconsin Volleyball Coaches Association and Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association Player of the Year from Waukesha's Catholic Memorial High School. She is a 1995 Junior Olympic third-team all-American and 1994 USVBA first-team all-American. Neels also earned Mizuno honorable mention all-American honors. A three-time all-state selection, Neels was named the Metro Conference Player of the Year.

"Colleen is one of the best competitors that I've ever seen at the high school level," says Cook. "She has the confidence to step onto the court and contribute right away whether she's setting or playing the back row."

The first member of the Wisconsin team from Canada, Pauline Bresky could play either outside hitter or middle blocker for the Badgers. The 5-11 Bresky did not play high school volleyball, but competed as a member of the Scarborough (Ontario) Solar's Eclipse. Her team

finished second in the Prince Edward Island national championship and seventh in the British Columbia national championship. Bresky was named to the Prince Edward Island all-star team and is also a junior provincial all-star.

"Pauline is somewhat of an unknown for us," says Cook. "She's the freshman that we know the least about, but we really like what we've seen. She's a tremendous athlete, very quick and very competitive."

The Badgers will complete their roster with a 5-5 defensive specialist from Sparta, Wis. Lindsey Buswell is a three-time all-conference selection. She was named team captain twice and was also named her team's most valuable player.

"Lindsey has the opportunity to be a star at Wisconsin," says Cook. "She's the type of player that Wisconsin fans love to watch—she's small, gritty and determined. Lindsey hasn't had the experience that the other freshmen have had, but somewhere down the road, she's going to have the opportunity to be a celebrity."

With the loss of all-Big Ten player Joanna Grotenhuis and four-year letterwinners Laurie Smith and Cathy DeZutel, Cook expects any number of players to become stars this season.

"This season players will be able to take challenge and emerge as stars," says Cook. "Some players will become great players and have

tremendous seasons. The exciting part for the fans will be to see which players reach for the sky."

The Badgers have little time in their schedule to wait for players to develop. The nonconference season opens at the Houston Kickoff Tournament featuring 1994 NCAA fifth-place finisher Houston, and 1995 NIVC seventh-place finisher Arkansas. Wisconsin will also take on perennial national power Nebraska in the First-Tier Invitational in Lincoln.

The Badgers open the Big Ten Conference season with their first four matches on the road including matches at 1994 NCAA semifinalists Ohio State and Penn State. The league home season begins on Oct. 6 when Wisconsin plays host to Northwestern in the fifth annual Steve Lowe Night.

"I think the Big Ten race is wide open," says Cook. "We could win the Big Ten or we could finish 11th. That's how competitive this conference will be this year.

"One of the biggest challenges to being in this conference is that you have to play Friday and Saturday back-to-back. We have never swept two Big Ten road matches since I've been here. We've accomplished sweeping at home, but you have to win on the road and win the big matches. To win a Big Ten Championship, we have to have the mentality that we're going to take matches away from the home team. Nobody is going to give you anything on the road, you have to earn it."

Cook expects the Badgers to continue to be tough at home after going 13-3 in the Field House last season. "Our fans make the Field House a special place. I want our players and fans to 'feel the Field House' because it is one of the most exciting places to play in the country."

Our fans make the Field House a big plus for the Badgers as they challenge for the Big Ten Championship and look for their third consecutive NCAA tournament bid.

"Winning the Big Ten is one of our goals and the other is to get to the NCAA tournament," says Cook. "We have to do that by winning some big matches during the nonconference season and do well in the Big Ten. To do that we have to learn to win the close matches and win the important points."

To win the close matches, the Badgers will rely on tough defense, serving and blocking. Wisconsin has always been known as a tenacious defensive team, and last season finished fourth in the league in digs with 16.21 per game. The Badgers were also fourth in the conference in blocks per game with 2.83.


"We're going to emphasize serving, blocking and defense because I believe you have to have that to be competitive every night," says Cook. "We'll have some jump servers and really stress teams with different serving strategies.

"We also have the capability of being an exceptional blocking team. And defensively, we're always going to be pretty good because it's something we emphasize and practice a lot."

With an impressive group of athletes that have the commitment to be great on and off the court, look for the Badgers to be a more physical and powerful team in 1995. And as you look north during the month of November, that light you see in the sky just might be from the Badger volleyball team!

**The Records:** Wisconsin finished with a 21-12 overall record, and 11-9 in the Big Ten Conference for fifth place.

**NCAA Tournament:** The Badgers advanced to the NCAA tournament for the second consecutive year. Wisconsin lost at George Washington, 2-3, in the first round of the tournament after being down two games to none. The Badgers have made post-season appearances five of the last six years.

**Coach John Cook:** Cook wrapped up his third year with the Badgers with a 54-42 (.563) career record. He is 31-29 (.517) in Big Ten games.

**Abbinante Named all-Mideast:** Abbinante was named to the all-Mideast Region second team. She is only the fifth player in UW history named to the honor team. The sophomore setter ran the Badger offense averaging 12.25 assists per game.

**Grotenhuis Honored:** Joanna Grotenhuis was named to the Big Ten all-conference team. She led the team all season in kills with 4.76 per game, which ranked second in league. Grotenhuis ranked sixth in the league in digs per game with 3.12 and 14th in attack percentage at .266. She is only the fifth person in UW history to tally over 1,000 kills in her career. Grotenhuis finished her three years at Wisconsin with 1,009 kills.

**Badgers in the Polls:** Wisconsin ended the season ranked eighth in the final NCAA Mideast Regional poll. In the AVCA/Tachikara Coaches Top 25 poll, the Badgers achieved a top ranking of 19th on Oct. 4.


**Nationally Ranked Attendance:** Wisconsin finished the season ranked seventh in the nation in attendance. The Badgers averaged 1,924 spectators per match. Wisconsin finished second in the Big Ten Conference behind Illinois.

**Dodaro Sets Block Record:** Freshman Heather Dodaro set the UW season record for block assists with 159. She ranked second in the Big Ten with 1.49 blocks per game.

**Abbinante Assists:** Sophomore Laura Abbinante set a UW season record for assists with 1,544. She averaged 12.25 assists per game which ranked fifth in the Big Ten. Abbinante is on track to become the UW's career assist leader. She currently has 2,835 assists in two years and is 1,272 sets away from breaking Liz Tortorello's career assist record of 4,107.

**Grotenhuis Sets Kill Record:** Senior Joanna Grotenhuis set a UW season record for kills with 576 overall and 367 during the Big Ten season. She also set UW season records for attack attempts with 1,464 overall and 942 during league play.

**Three Named Academic All-Big Ten:** Three Badgers were named to the Academic All-Big Ten team. In order to be named to the team, student-athletes must maintain a 3.0 cumulative grade point average,

be a letterwinner, and be in at least their second year at the institution. Jaime Smith, who maintains a 3.362 GPA in business, received her second honor while sophomores Kelli Luther and Dawn Kelly were each honored for the first time.

**Winning Streak:** The Badgers started the 1994 season with a 10-0 record. Wisconsin won tournament titles at the Northern Illinois Invitational and its own Inntowner Invitational. The winning streak ended at the Mizuno USA Volleyball Cup against fourth-ranked UCLA.

**Tournament Champions:** Wisconsin extended its tournament winning streak to four with wins in the Northern Illinois Invitational and Inntowner Invitational. The Badgers won two tournaments in 1993 including the Inntowner.

**All-Tournament Teams:** The Badgers landed players on the all-tournament teams of all three tournaments they played in 1994. At the Northern Illinois Invitational, Grotenhuis and Abbinante were named to the honor team with Grotenhuis receiving MVP honors. Abbinante was named the MVP of the Inntowner Invitational with Laurie Smith, Heather Dodaro and Grotenhuis being named to the all-tournament team. Abbinante was the only setter named to the all-tournament team at the Mizuno USA Volleyball Classic.

**Team Awards:** Five Badgers were honored with team awards for the 1994 season. Grotenhuis was named the team's most valuable player while Abbinante received the player's award for outstanding effort. Cathy DeZutel was honored with the Play Like a Badger award for her intensity, commitment and desire. Captain's awards were presented to Laurie and Jamie Smith.

**Big Ten Rankings:** In final Big Ten Conference individual statistics, the Badgers had a number of athletes among the top competitors. In attack percentage, Grotenhuis ranked 14th (.266). She was also second in kills per game (4.76) and eighth in digs (3.12). Freshman Heather Dodaro was second in blocks per game (1.46) while Abbinante was fifth in assists (12.25).

**Seniors Rank in Career Categories:** Seniors Laurie Smith and Cathy DeZutel completed their four-year careers on the UW all-time lists. Smith ranks among the top 10 in six career categories while DeZutel ranks ninth in service aces.

**Freshmen Contribute:** Wisconsin's 1994 freshman class was ranked fifth in the nation and best in the Big Ten Conference by *Volleyball Magazine*. All three freshmen, Lauren Burny, Heather Dodaro and Amy Lee started at least part of the season, and contributed 43 percent of the team's kills and 45 percent of the team's blocks.

When Steve Lowe unexpectedly passed away on Aug. 22, 1991, the University of Wisconsin and the Madison community lost a true friend and a winner on and off the court.

With Lowe at the helm, the Badger volleyball program burst onto the national scene. In 1989, he directed the Badgers to the title in the inaugural National Invitational Volleyball Championship, their first post-season appearance ever.


The following year he steered Wisconsin to its first Big Ten Conference title and guided the Badgers to their first NCAA tournament appearance and first national ranking, finishing 10th in the final 1990 NCAA poll. Lowe also produced Wisconsin's first volleyball all-American with Lisa Boyd earning second-team honors in 1990.

Lowe, who had a 108-64 career record in five years at Wisconsin, earned 1990 Big Ten and Mideast Coach of the Year honors.

In honor of the former coach, the University of Wisconsin has established the Steve Lowe Memorial Scholarship for a UW volleyball player. In 1994, for the first time, the scholarship was presented to senior Laurie Smith.

Every year Wisconsin's Big Ten Conference home opener will be designated "Steve Lowe Night." This year's match is on Friday, Oct. 6, versus Northwestern, which is coached by Lowe's former player and assistant coach Margie Fitzpatrick. A portion of the gate receipts from this match will go to the scholarship fund.

The University of Wisconsin benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference, one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. Big Ten women's athletics programs take pride in leading the nation in basketball and volleyball attendance, and in receiving more network and cable television exposure than any conference in the nation.

Begun in 1895, the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics with emphasis on the student-athlete. The conference is celebrating its centennial anniversary during 1995-96 season.



The women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial conference championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972. Penn State became the 11th university to join the conference in 1991.

As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin women athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

The Big Ten Conference volleyball champion is determined by the match record within the conference. The teams play a double, round-robin schedule with all teams playing each other twice, both at home and away, for a total of 20 matches.

The conference champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. In 1994, the Big Ten was represented by six universities in the NCAA Volleyball Championship. Penn State University and Ohio State University both advanced to the NCAA Championship losing in the semifinals.

For five consecutive years, the Big Ten Conference has led the nation in volleyball attendance. In 1994, six schools finished in the top 20 in attendance, and overall the league drew a total of 173,646 spectators for the season. The University of Wisconsin led the conference and finished sixth in the nation in attendance drawing 30,788 spectators. Illinois was seventh with 29,176; Ohio State finished 10th with 22,897; Penn State was 13th with 19,833; Minnesota was 17th with 18,773; and Purdue was 20th with 15,946 fans during the season.

## ■ A World-Class University

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students enrolled February 5, 1849. Today, UW-Madison ranks as the nation's sixth largest university with 40,305 students. The student body is one of the most diverse in the country with students coming from every state in the country. Wisconsin also ranks third in the nation for foreign student enrollment.

More than 4,546 courses and 12,762 sections are offered in UW-Madison's 12 schools and colleges. Majors are available in 150 undergraduate, 182 master's, and 125 doctoral and professional degree programs.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. The quality of its undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized around the world.

One survey rated 49 different undergraduate programs at UW-Madison among the top 10 in the nation. Among those ranked include sociology, German, chemical engineering, geography, statistics, plant pathology, molecular biology, biochemistry, Spanish, Portuguese, zoology, political science, chemistry, economics, mathematics, and history.

UW-Madison faculty or alumni have been awarded 12 Nobel Prizes and 20 Pulitzer Prizes. There are 44 faculty members who are winners of Presidential Young Investigator awards, 10 winners of the National Medal of Science, and four Searles scholars. Forty-four professors are members of the National Academy of Sciences, 14 are members of the National Academy of Engineering, and two in the National Academy of Education. The university also ranks third in the nation in research and development expenditures.

UW-Madison is one of the nation's first land-grant colleges, establishing a tradition of research in agriculture and the life science. The founders of the university developed the "Wisconsin Idea" as making "the beneficent

influence of the university available to every home in the state."

UW-Madison is the largest institution in the University of Wisconsin System. It has the only public law and medical schools in the state as well as the only school of veterinary medicine.

### ■ A Scenic Campus

One of the most picturesque college campuses in the country, UW-Madison lies along the beautiful shores of Lake Mendota.





One mile from the capitol, traveling down historic State Street, the city was designed so the University and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of the academic and political life of Wisconsin.

Madison's lakes, rolling hills, architecture, parks and arboretum have enhanced UW-Madison's reputation for scenic beauty. The city of Madison is frequently listed among the top five best places to live in the nation.

Tree-lined Bascom Hill, which features a bronze statue of Abraham Lincoln, is one of the University's most famous landmarks. Others include North Hall, the first building on campus; the Carillon Tower in front of the Social Science building; the Library Mall, with its clock tower and fountain; and Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula complete with hiking and biking trails—one of the most romantic spots on campus.

A favorite area for UW students to congregate is the Memorial Union and its lake-side terrace. Here students can study or socialize against a backdrop of sailboats, canoes, sailboards, kayaks and swimmers, while enjoying the sunshine and breezes from Lake Mendota.

## The Student Body

More than 40,000 students populate the 900-acre UW campus, including more than 10,065 graduate students in numerous fields.

Although a UW Board of Regents policy limits undergraduate enrollment from outside

the state to 25 percent, the University still maintains one of the nation's most diverse student bodies.

Students hail from every county in the state and every state in the nation, as well as from approximately 115 foreign countries. UW-Madison ranks third in the nation for total foreign student enrollment.

A greater effort is also being made to recruit and retain minority students and faculty. In the fall of 1994, African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and other minority groups accounted for 8.9 percent of the student body.

## The Community

Located in southern Wisconsin, Madison is the home of the University of Wisconsin and the state capital. Considered one of the Midwest's most vibrant communities, it offers an endearing quality of life for full-time residents and students.

With a diverse population of 198,392, Madison offers the "big city" spheres of politics, arts and entertainment, as well as the attributes of a small town. It is a family, action-oriented community that promotes participation in government, education, the arts, sports, and recreational activities.

The July 1995 issue of *Outside* magazine called Madison a Dream Town. The magazine also rated Madison as one of the top 15 "great sports towns" in the country. *U.S. News and World Report* named it one of the country's 10 Hottest Cities while *Money* mag-



azine listed it as the second most livable city in the nation in a 1993 survey.

Madison was featured on the front page of the Life section of *USA Today* on July 12, 1995. The city was also recognized by Zero Population Growth (an advocacy group) as the best U.S. city for kids.




## WHERE WISCONSIN RANKS

Since 1910, the University of Wisconsin has ranked on the top ten lists in every objective national faculty reputational survey. The quality of Wisconsin's undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized worldwide.

The 1994 *Fiske Guide to Colleges*, the best-selling guide to colleges, gives the UW-Madison its highest academic ranking. In fact, UW-Madison is one of only eight public institutions in the country to receive the five-star rating. *U.S. News & World Report* also lists UW-Madison among 25 national universities in the "Best College Buy."

One recent survey rated 49 undergraduate programs at the UW-Madison among the top ten in the nation.

Academic, financial, and other rankings are summarized below to offer a flavor of the quality at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.



### Funding and Support

► **Federal Grants:** UW-Madison ranked ninth nationally in 1992, receiving 1.2 percent of the federal budget for university research support.

► **Research and Development Funds:** UW-Madison ranked third in the country for research and development expenditures in 1993, with \$372.4 million, according to the National Science Foundation.

► **Tuition:** Over the last 10 years, tuition for resident undergraduates at the UW-Madison has been consistently lower than the average for public Big Ten schools. The UW-Madison has the second-lowest resident undergraduate tuition, behind the University of Iowa, and the third-lowest nonresident undergraduate tuition of the public Big Ten institutions.

► **Private Support:** UW-Madison ranked sixth in the nation, and first among public institutions in 1992-93 by receiving nearly \$165 million in private support.

► **Alumni:** UW-Madison is the number one ranked independently financed alumni group in the Midwest and the second largest in the U.S.

### Degrees

► **Graduates:** Standard & Poor's 1994 survey lists the University of Wisconsin as one of the nation's top producers of corporate executives, ranking second in undergraduate degrees and fourth in undergraduate and graduate degrees.

► **Doctoral Degrees:** UW-Madison is a national leader in number of doctoral degrees awards. Between the school's founding and 1993, the University of Wisconsin-Madison awarded 29,628 Ph.D.s.

### Departmental Academic Rankings

► **Liberal Arts:** In its first ranking of graduate programs in the liberal arts in 1992, *U.S. News & World Report* listed UW-Madison's sociology department as tops in the country. The magazine also ranked psychology 12th, history ninth, political science 10th, economics 11th, and engineering 12th.

► **Education:** The School of Education is the nation's best according to a survey by the University of Illinois released in 1994. The UW's educational administration and elementary education rank second.

► **College of Agricultural and Life Sciences:** In 1993, the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences was ranked one of the top 10 agricultural schools in the country according to *Farm Futures* magazine.


► **Journalism and Mass Communication:** The faculty at the School of Journalism and Mass Communication was rated first in the

nation in research productivity in 1988 by *Journalism Quarterly*.

► **Science Programs:** According to *U.S. News and World Report's* annual graduate school ratings, published in March 1993, six UW-Madison science programs ranked in the top 12: computer science, tied for eighth; biology, tied for ninth; chemistry, 10th; nursing, tied for 11th; health-sciences administration, tied for 12th; and engineering, 12th.

► **Libraries:** The UW-Madison has the 13th largest university library system in the United States, with more than 5.4 million books in 40 locations across campus.

► **Business:** The School of Business's MBA program ranks in the top five percent among business schools, according to *U.S. News & World Report* (1993). The real estate program ranks third and the school's risk management insurance program ranks fourth.



## UW-Madison Sets the Pace

- ▶ with the oldest Scandinavian studies (1875), psychology (1888), agricultural economics (1909), genetics (1910) and wildlife management (1939) departments in the United States
- ▶ in establishing the nation's first magnetic observatory (1876)

- ▶ in discovering the anti-cancer drug, fluorouracil (early 1950s)
- ▶ as Elizabeth and James Miller, UW Medical School professor of oncology and professor emeritus of oncology, were the first to identify characteristics among chemicals that cause cancer (1950s, 60s)
- ▶ with launching the Orbiting Astronomical Observatory, the world's first true observatory in space
- ▶ in revolutionizing brain surgery, as Dr. Manucher Javid, UW Medical School professor of surgery, became the first neurosurgeon to use a solution from the age-old compound urea during brain surgery on a human (1957)
- ▶ in laying the foundation for the U.S. Food and Drug Administration adoption of Sun Protection Factor (SPF) on sunscreens (1960)
- ▶ National Organization for Women is first housed in Kathryn Clarenbach's faculty office on UW-Madison campus
- ▶ in developing new techniques to measure bone tissue loss, known as osteoporosis
- ▶ with the Biotron, a research building that can control environmental conditions for experimental purposes



- ▶ with bone marrow transplants. Using techniques developed at UW-Madison, the first bone marrow transplant in the U.S. was done at UW Hospital. A UW team also discovers how to predict the success of bone marrow transplants by matching genes.
- ▶ in finding evidence linking cancer in laboratory animals with saccharin and cyclamates
- ▶ in finding that the anti-estrogen drug tamoxifen can prevent breast cancer from recurring in certain women who have had cancer previously
- ▶ as UW Hospital and Clinics develop the nation's first Mobile Critical Care Unit, which duplicates facilities of a hospital intensive care unit and laboratories
- ▶ with the first and only medical physics department in the nation to exist within a medical school
- ▶ as UW-Madison researchers describe the atomic structure of a common cold virus
- ▶ with the establishment of the Center for Dairy Research, the nation's first such center to be established at a university (1986)
- ▶ in organ preservation breakthroughs. In 1987, Dr. Folkert Belzer used a cold storage preservation solution to preserve dog livers up to 36 hours and dog pancreases up to 72 hours. Clinical use of this new solution decreases the need for emergency transplantation, increases the number of livers and pancreases available to people who need



transplants, and improves organ sharing among transplant centers

- ▶ in improved world map projection developed by professor Arthur H. Robinson.
- ▶ with the development of the world's first genetically altered trees
- ▶ in Hector F. DeLuca, discoverer of a "super vitamin-D" compound, and continuing techniques for synthesizing the compound

The University of Wisconsin-Madison offers its student-athletes one of the premier intercollegiate athletic programs in the country.

A member of the prestigious Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin offers its student-athletes the best in education, opportunities, coaching and on-field competition at the NCAA Division I level.

With a number of sports begun more than 100 years ago, men's teams compete in basketball, cross country, football, golf, ice hockey, rowing, swimming and diving, soccer, tennis, track and field, and wrestling.

Established July 1, 1974, the 10-sport women's athletic program offers basketball, cross country, golf, lightweight rowing, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, and volleyball.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 25 NCAA Division I programs for the past two years. In 1994-95, Wisconsin finished 17th in the Sears/National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics Directors Cup competition, which recognizes the best Division I college sports program in the nation.



### ■ Chancellor David Ward

Chancellor David Ward, the university's 25th chief executive, is actively positioning the University of Wisconsin for continued excellence in the next century.


Ward insists that the university must be sensitive to societal changes relevant to higher education, and envisions the university as a stronger partner with public schools, businesses, industry, its alumni and friends.

"We have a tradition of excellence upon which to build and much to preserve, but I believe it is time for the university to start doing some things differently—not just doing the same things better," said Ward in "A Vision for the Future: Priorities for UW-Madison in the Next Decade."

To this end, Ward has led efforts to improve the quality of undergraduate education, improving class access and increasing undergraduate engagement in research. He served as chair of the geography department and as associate dean of the Graduate School. He was named chancellor in June 1993 after serving as vice chancellor for academic affairs and, additionally, as provost.

Ward is married to Judith B. Ward, who is the executive associate director of the Waisman Center on Mental Retardation and Human Development. They have two sons.



### ■ Athletic Director ■ Pat Richter

Pat Richter, the guiding force behind University of Wisconsin Athletics, is no stranger to the sports or business worlds.

A former UW student-athlete, professional football player, successful businessman, and family man, Richter was the perfect choice to become Wisconsin's new athletic director in December of 1989.

He was an all-America tight end for Wisconsin's 1963 Rose Bowl football team. Richter also earned Academic all-America honors in 1962, and was named Wisconsin's Big Ten Medal of Honor recipient in 1963. He earned his bachelor's degree in landscape architecture from the UW in 1964 and returned to the UW where he received his law degree in 1971.

He was inducted into the GTE/CoSIDA Academic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Richter enjoyed a long and distinguished career as a standout with the National Football league's Washington Redskins. After employment with a Madison law firm, he joined the Oscar Mayer Co., and worked his way up to vice president of personnel. Richter has the essential experience as a student, an athlete and an administrator. He is committed to excellence in the classroom as well as on the playing field. Richter is committed to Wisconsin, and to providing UW student-athletes with an experience they will cherish the rest of their lives.



### ■ Associate Director ■ Cheryl Marra

Cheryl Marra begins her fifth year with the University of Wisconsin as the associate athletic director in charge of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. She also serves as the primary women's athletic administrator to the Big Ten Conference and the NCAA.

Marra served as the women's athletic director at Denison University, a division III school in Ohio, from 1983 to 1990. She also served as an assistant professor in the Denison physical education department for seven years, the women's soccer coach for 11 years, and the women's track and field coach for nine years.

She has been a member of the NCAA's Committee on Women's Athletics since 1987, and also served as the chair of the NCAA Division I women's soccer committee.

A 1977 graduate of Slippery Rock State College with a bachelor's degree in physical education and health, Marra received her master's degree in physical education from The Ohio State University in 1983.




## ■ Associate Director ■ Joel Maturi


## ■ Associate Director ■ Alan Zussman

Adams received his bachelor's degree in management information systems from Rhode Island in 1989, and is pursuing a master's of business administration in international sports management.


## Academic & Student Services

The advising staff of **Mary Weaver, Jean Patt, Craig Hudson, Christine Sayler, Mary Moroder, Andrew Berns, Liane Kosaki** and **Jerry Darda** have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all University departments.

For those student-athletes who request assistance, counseling sessions are offered on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The counseling staff takes a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, personal or academic.

Student-athletes may receive academic honors in a number of ways. The Big Ten Conference honors scholar athletes with Academic all-Big Ten honors while the UW Athletic Board names Athletic Board Scholars for the highest grade point average in each sport. In addition, student-athletes may be nominated for Academic All-America honors through the sports information office.

## Scholarships

UW-Madison is proud to offer to its prospective student-athletes one of the most comprehensive athletic scholarship programs in the nation. As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year renewable basis if scholastic and athletic commitment are maintained.

## ■ Sports Medicine

The care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a staff of six N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. Wisconsin's Sports Medicine program features state-of-the-art facilities and the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals.

Under the direction of head athletic trainer **Dennis Helwig**, the Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members **Chuck Hart, Jan Helwig, Mike Johnson, Barb Pearson, Henry Perez-Guerra**, and **Andy Winterstein** utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility. Should an injury occur, athletes are seen immediately by team physicians affiliated with the UW Hospitals and Clinics headed by **Dr. Ben Graf**.

In addition to the headquarters in the McClain Athletic Facility, auxiliary training rooms are located in the Stadium, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Field house. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.



The UW Strength & Conditioning program is headquartered in the McClain Athletic Facility which features a 7,000-square-foot weight training area available to the men's and women's athletic teams.



The Wisconsin Sports Medicine Facility, located in the McClain Athletic Facility, features state-of-the-art facilities for the care, prevention and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes.

## ■ Strength & Conditioning

The Wisconsin strength and conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete.

Weight training areas in the McClain Center and Camp Randall Stadium feature Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in spacious, carpeted rooms. Four full-time and one part-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes. Head strength and conditioning coach **John Dettman** along with assistant coaches **Robert Hackett, Steve Myrland, Stieg Theander** and **Scott Hettenbach** work with the individual sport coaches to develop programs specific for that sport.

The UW also offers a sports nutrition program to assist athletes in meeting their nutritional demands and body composition goals.

## ■ Sports Information

Directing the communications for the 10 women's sports in the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics is the responsibility of the Women's Sports Information Office. This office utilizes a variety of communications systems to provide student-athletes the opportunity to be recognized for their athletic endeavors.

The office provides and maintains many resources such as records, fact sheets, photographic files, statistics, media guides and event programs in meeting the information requests of the media, coaches, administrators, opponents and the general public.

Women's Sports Information Director **Tamara J. Flarup**, associate director **Diane K. Nordstrom** and intern **Debbie Rosenfeld** maintain close contact with local, regional and national media as well as the athlete's hometown media in providing information. The office prepares news releases, designs sports brochures and media guides, covers all women's sports, and provides post-event results for print and electronic media.

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from outstanding sports facilities. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its athletes.

The Wisconsin Field House, which seats 11,500, is the practice and competitive facility for the Badger basketball and volleyball teams. The Field House features four locker rooms, an athletic training area and state-of-the-art scoreboard, sound and lighting systems.

The Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center or Shell, located next to Camp Randall Stadium, is a multi-purpose facility used by all students. A newly resurfaced 200-meter Martin rubber track surrounds four basketball/volleyball courts that double as throwing and jumping areas for indoor track meets. With a seating capacity of 2,500, the Shell is the site of a numerous track meets including the 1996 Big Ten Women's Indoor Track Championship.

One of the most versatile buildings is the McClain Athletic Facility. Over 76,000 square feet of artificial turf offers the ideal indoor practice facility for football, soccer and track. The lower level features the headquarters of the Badgers Sports Medicine staff and a fully-equipped weight room. Locker rooms for football, and men's and women's track are also located on the lower level.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have the competitive advantage of playing year-round at one of the best college facilities in the



Opened in 1988, the McClain Athletic Facility offers indoor practice facilities for football, soccer and track and field. A 90-yard artificial turf practice area is contained in the 76,380 square foot main floor.

United States—the Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The stadium features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, one squash doubles court, and seats 1,500 spectators. The stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

One of the newest facilities at Wisconsin is the outdoor track and soccer complex located at the west end of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, named for the former UW men's coach, features a newly resurfaced 400-meter Martin rubber track. The track, which was the site of the 1994 Big Ten Conference Outdoor Track Championship, surrounds the Olympic size, natural grass soccer field. The facility, which is fully lighted, was completed during the fall of 1993. Building permanent seating with locker rooms and a media facility is scheduled to begin in the near future.

The swimming and diving teams have the luxury of two pools for practice and competition—the Natatorium and Southeast Recreational Facility. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with an automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The SERF facility features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.



The Wisconsin Field House, home to the Wisconsin basketball and volleyball teams, saw record crowds for women's basketball in 1995 including the first ever sell-out of a UW women's athletic event.

Situated between five lakes, Madison is the perfect location for a rowing program. The Badger crews are headquartered in the boat house, situated on Lake Mendota. The boat house provides the Badger crews with an indoor rowing tank during the winter season. During the warm months, crews can often be seen on any one of the five Madison lakes.


With the opening of University Ridge in 1991, UW golfers now have the opportunity to compete on one of the finest facilities in the Midwest. The par 72, 18-hole course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. The facility also features a 15,000 square foot practice green and 5,000 square foot chipping green.

The newest UW facility is for the newest UW sport—softball. The Badgers compete on the field located on the west end of campus.



Telephone lines must be installed in advance of the match by calling Ameritech at 800-660-3000. Event programs, media guides, event notes and computerized statistics will be available at the match.

## Photographers

Photographers may work from either end of the court and the west side of the floor. Photographers may not work in front of team and scoring benches.

## Post-event Interviews

All post-event interviews will be conducted in the media/basketball locker room located below the main floor on the west side of the Field House. The visiting coach and players will be interviewed approximately 10 minutes following the completion of the event. The Wisconsin coaches and players will follow immediately. All requests for interviews should be directed to the sports information personnel prior to the completion of the event.
