PREVIEW 1971 FOOTBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The race for the Wisconsin State University Conference football championship could be as crowded as a rush-hour freeway.

Platteville ran away from the field with an 8-0 record last fall. The four teams that shared second place with 5-3 records figure to challenge the Pioneers eagerly in 1971. These four include Whitewater, Eau Claire, Oshkosh, and Superior.

La Crosse is another strong possibility. The Indians finished sixth with a 4-3-1 record, and 37 lettermen from that team are returning.

Platteville has figured in the last three championships, sharing the crown with Oshkosh in 1968 and Whitewater in 1969, before winning the bunting outright last fall.

During those three years the Pioneers were led by quarterback Chris Charnish, all-conference three straight seasons and the league's most valuable player the last two. But, he is gone, leaving with most conference passing and total offense records, including 60 career touchdown passes.

The Pioneers won 10 games last fall, outscoring opponents, 399-71, and stretching their victory string to 16 straight over two seasons before bowing, 16-0, to Texas A&I in the NAIA playoffs.

Platteville's regular season streak is in jeopardy this fall and the race to the wire is wide open.

Besides Charnish, Platteville Coach Gil Krueger will be without the services of end Rich Smigelski from the potent offensive unit, and defensive standouts end Wade White, tackle Jim Bunch, and linebacker Tom Barth.

The Pioneers still have some talented performers returning among 18 lettermen, including fullback Rich Smith, flanker Bob Faherty, and halfback Tom Knoble, the conference leader with 10 touchdowns last fall. NAIA All-American Jim Lawinger and fellow defensive backs Dick Kay and Don Williams give Krueger a strong start in the secondary.

This could be Eau Claire's year with junior quarterback Tom Bauer back for his third straight season as the Blugolds' regular signal-caller. Coach Link Walker also has a strong halfback, Gary Tepler, to carry the ball and will build a defense around all-conference end Bill Esselman and tackle Joe Aase. Some promising incoming freshmen and transfers could bolster Eau Claire's bid.

Oshkosh needs improvement from quarterback Larry Bornemann to fashion an adequate passing attack to go with some strong running. The loss of veteran all-conference running back Ron Cardo is cushioned by the return of fullback Bill Peshel, the conference's second ranked rusher last fall with 590 yards.

End Norb Mendleski, tackle Lee Baerwald, and all-conference halfback Len Washington form the bulwark of Coach Russ Young's defensive unit.

Coach Monte Charles promises to put the ball in the air often again this season at Superior. Quarterback Steve Russ will be back for what Charles hopes will be a banner season. Russ ranked second to Charnish as a passer last fall, averaging 127 yards a game through the air.

Charles also expects a strong defense, anchored up front by the likes of 290-pound Ron Bleck along with Craig Kuntz and George LaValley.

Most coaches would be satisfied with a 6-4 season but Whitewater's Forrest Perkins figures it was a "down" year and is anxious to get back in the driver's seat. He has 10 defensive starters returning from a unit that ranked with the best in the country, yielding only 57 yards a game rushing.

The big question mark is quarterback, where veteran Mike Gorecki and newcomer Ed Nowell will battle for the starting assignment. "The Warhawks will be tough to score on," Perkins says, "and, if we can find a quarterback, will give people all they want."

La Crosse also has quarterback problems with either Chuck Gouge or Joe Wagner scheduled to man that position. Dave Jaeger and Dan Tork are good running backs but Coach Roger Harring must develop an adequate passing attack if the Indians hope to climb in the standings.

Overall the team will have excellent speed. The strength is in the veteran defensive unit, where nine starters return. Experience and quickness remains their forte.

Mike Farley, River Falls' energetic coach, is building for the future and his prime goal this season is "improvement". His Falcons have nowhere to go but up after finishing with a 0-8 conference record last fall.

Falcon quarterback John Page is back with a year of experience, but newcomers must come through because Farley will be without halfback John O'Neill and end Joe Rozak, the conference's leading rusher and pass catcher, respectively.

Stevens Point Coach Pat O'Halloran concentrated on building with freshmen and sophomores last fall. The Pointers finished a disappointing eighth with a 1-6-1 record but O'Halloran is convinced experience gained by his youngsters will boost the team this fall.

Only six of 40 lettermen were seniors. So, 11 who were freshmen, 13 sophomores, and 10 juniors return. Probably the most promising is Russ Bentley, who gained 444 yards rushing in five games as a freshman. Gary Sager's experience at quarterback as a sophomore should be beneficial.

Stout's hopes of improving a 2-6 record and seventh place finish center around veteran quarterback Steve Fedie and middle guard Mike Wettstein, who anchors the defense.

Coach Sten Pierce must build a running attack and the loss of all-conference halfback Nick Misch makes this difficult. Some talented incoming freshmen might be pressed into service early.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971

This could be the year the Blugolds hit the winner's circle for the first time since 1964. Coach Link Walker has some outstanding individuals back and the only critical loss is all-conference offensive guard Tim Hanson.

The offense remains in the capable hands of junior quarterback Tom Bauer, starting his third straight year as a regular. Joining him on the attack will be halfback Gary Tepler, one of the better performers in the conference last fall.

Tepler's 567 yards rushing and 4.0 average earned the 5-8, 185-pound senior fourth place in conference ground-gaining. He might be complemented by Joel Roesch, an all-state running back from Eau Claire North, and University of Wisconsin transfer Larry Knudtson, who could break into the lineup.

Bauer, an option quarterback, gained 479 yards rushing himself, good enough for seventh in the conference. This helped the Blugolds become the top rushing team in the league, averaging 214 yards a game on the ground.

Walker's job will be to build an adequate line and a strong defense. He starts with all-conference defensive end Bill Esselman and tackle Joe Aase. The Blugolds shared second place with a 5-3 mark last year and are shooting for the top.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971

The Indians suffer from many of the same problems that plagued them a year ago, particularly at quarterback, where Coach Harring must settle on either Chuck Gouge or Joe Wagner. Neither moved the team consistently last fall. So, Harring needs rapid improvement from one, or both.

The team will have excellent speed on both offense and defense, the latter unit returning almost intact. But, Harring must come up with some surprises if the Indians are to improve on their 4-3-1 conference finish of a year ago and crash the first division.

"We feel our strength will be with the veteran defensive team and the offensive speed and quickness to run a more diversified attack," Harring said. "With a little luck, we could be one of the top four teams in a very balanced conference."

The Titans are among those looking expectantly at the crown, which they last shared with Platteville in 1968. That was the beginning of the Pioneers' three-year reign, but the feeling persists that domination will come to an end this fall.

If Coach Young finds an adequate replacement for all-conference offensive guard John Yacukowicz, the attacking unit should hold its own with the improvement of Larry Bornemann at quarterback and fullback Bill Peshel running with the power he showed last fall.

Young loses the conference's No. 3 rusher, veteran all-conference star Ron Cardo, but Peshel ranked No. 2 last fall with 590 yards and should be even better.

Missing from the defense will be all-conference linebacker Dave Kanas and Al Wilcox, a dependable halfback who also was a good kickoff and punt-return man. But, Young still has all-conference Len Washington back in the secondary as well as end Norb Mendleski and tackle Lee Baerwald, both bulwarks in the line.

The race figures to be wide open this fall and Oshkosh gives every indication of being able to stay in contention all the way. The Titans possess size and speed, but to be effective Young must come up with a better passing attack than a year ago, when his club finished no better than sixth throwing the ball.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971

Can the Pioneers figure in their fourth straight conference championship? That question haunts Coach Krueger as well as rival coaches. The loss of quarterback Chris Charnish and end Rich Smigelski from the offense, and end Wade White, tackle Jim Bunch, and linebacker Tom Barth from the defense would preclude such a possibility.

But, Krueger will greet some talented returnees, including fullback Rich Smith, flanker Bob Faherty, and halfback Tom Knoble, the conference leader with 10 touchdowns last fall, as well as offensive guard Dick Cowan and outstanding defensive backs Dick Kay, Don Williams, and Jim Lawinger, a NAIA All-American.

Bob Roloff and Guy Nelson figure to battle for the spot vacated by Charnish, who closed out his career with practically every passing and total offense record in the book, all-conference selection three straight years, and the league's most valuable player award for the past two seasons.

The Pioneers averaged 407 yards a game total offense last season. They probably won't approximate this kind of attack in 1971, but Krueger still possesses enough talent to make a strong run at four straight titles.

A winning tradition, good overall depth, outstanding pass defenders, and great receivers should go a long way toward guiding the Pioneers in the right direction according to Krueger.

An escape from the cellar is about all the Falcons can hope for in the coming campaign. They failed to win a conference game last fall with the league's top rusher and pass receiver, both of whom are gone.

The first problem facing Coach Farley is replacing this pair, halfback John O'Neill and end Joe Rozak, who meant so much to the offense. O'Neill gained 614 yards rushing in 1970 for a 4.3 average, and Rozak caught 37 passes good for 631 yards.

Quarterback John Page is back. His passes to Rozak were principally responsible for the Falcons finishing second to Platteville in team passing. Now Page must find a new target for his aerials.

Defense, though, remains Farley's chief headache. Despite a better than average attack, the Falcons were no match for opponents because of a porous defense. They were sacked for 37 points a game and all the yards the Falcons gained themselves between the 20-yard lines only delayed disaster.

Newcomers hold the key in the long run. "Improvement" is Farley's goal. He says the Falcons still are in the first stages of rebuilding, adding, "We feel more athletes are on campus and the effects of recruiting won't be seen until '72."

PROSPECTS FOR 1971

The football season of 1970 could be characterized as a nightmare for Coach O'Halloran. His club finished 1-8-1 and eighth in the conference with 1-6-1. Not a single Pointer received so much as honorable mention on the all-conference offensive unit.

The season was a struggle from the start, but O'Halloran saw steady improvement as the campaign progressed, including a 23-3 loss to champion Platteville in the finale. That was the Pioneers' lowest total of the season and possibly their toughest test during the regular schedule.

Chief losses were the team's most valuable player, Mike Breaker, a competent defensive back and strong punter, guard Steve Hovel, and placekicker Pat McFaul, Point's leading scorer with 10 field goals and eight conversions.

Only six of 40 lettermen last fall were seniors, so O'Halloran figures experience gained by 11 freshmen, 13 sophomores, and 10 juniors will be invaluable this year. One to watch is Russ Bentley, one of the frosh who moved into a starting berth and gained 444 yards rushing in five games. His 89-yard per-game average proved to be best in the conference.

Gary Sager, back after a good sophomore season at quarterback, veteran receiver Blane Reichelt, defensive end Mike Sexton, and the top freshman defender - linebacker Jack Mraz - should help the Pointers bid for at least a first division berth.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971

Despite a respectable 6-4 overall record and share of second place in the conference, 1970 was considered a "down" year for the Warhawks and Coach Perkins. Whitewater has figured in six titles in Perkins' 15 years at the helm and he expects the Warhawks to be in the thick of things this fall.

Replacing all-conference tackle Kirk Behrendt, along with halfbacks Steve Hanaman, last fall's most valuable player, and Tom Hauser, as well as quarterback Ron Dums complicates the job, but doesn't make it impossible. Class defensive returnees should ease the burden, particularly all-conference tackles Mike Lederer and Toby Ackerman, and linebacker Lon Kolstad.

Mike Gorecki gets the call at quarterback and he will aim most of his passes at all-conference end Mike Dressler, who caught 39 aerials for 659 yards last fall. Tackle Tom Zarzycki on offense and halfback Mike Yankunas on defense are among veteran stars returning.

If Perkins can muster some offense, the Warhawks will rank with the chief challengers because his defense perennially is strong, ranking No. 1 against the rush last fall, yielding only 57 yards a game. The 160 yards total defense also was best in the league.

Perkins begins his 16th season as head coach and needs only two victories to tie for the all-time winning record for a Whitewater coach. The record is 96 by Chick Agnew in 22 seasons. Perkins should surpass the 100 victory mark this year.



PREVIEW 1971-72 BASKETBALL SEASON
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The specter of Eau Claire's basketball dynasty haunts Wisconsin State University Conference coaches as they prepare for the 1971-72 season.

The Blugolds have won two straight conference championships, guided by veteran Coach Anderson and sparked by 6-10 center Mike Ratliff, chosen as the WSUC most valuable player both years. During that span the Blugolds lost just once in 32 conference games.

Anderson lost no one from the awesome outfit which averaged 84.6 points offensively and 62.7 defensively last season. Nine lettermen return, including the six Anderson considers - "regulars" - 6-0 James Lindsey and 6-0 Frank Schade in the backcourt along with 6-5 Tom Jackson, 6-8 Steven Johnson, 6-8 Tom Peck, and Ratliff in the front line.

"Eau Claire should repeat," represents a typical conclusion from opposing conference coaches. "Eau Claire is head and shoulders above everyone," is another. "Eau Claire is by far the best team," and "Eau Claire! With the other positions up for grabs" are included in the opinions of rivals.

Anderson inherited a team that compiled a 7-13 record three years ago and rebuilt mostly with freshmen, boosting the Blugolds to 14-8 his first season.

Eau Claire caught fire the following year, losing only to Stout during the regular campaign, winning the conference championship with a 15-1 record, and advancing to the NAIA national tournament at Kansas City, bowing out in the second round to eventual winner Kentucky State.

Last season the Blugolds repeated as conference champion with a perfect 16-0 record, but lost again to Kentucky State, 71-67, in their own holiday tournament. Anderson again guided his team to Kansas City, where the Blugolds set their sights on the defending champion Thoroughbreds. But, Eau Claire lost this time in the quarter-finals, 87-80, to eventual runner-up Eastern Michigan, a team the Blugolds defeated, 90-77, at Ypsilanti during the regular season.

Now the Blugolds are favored to return to Kansas City for the third straight year and the chief reason is Ratliff, who ranked as the conference's leading rebounder with 14.2 a game and No. 5 scorer with an average of 17.3 points, back for his senior year.

Anderson has compiled his three-year winning percentage of .844 (64-12) with homegrown talent. He insists the state high schools play a caliber of basketball equal to any place in the country and has recruited only Wisconsin players.

Bolstering an already talented array of cagers this year is Rich Reitzner, an all-state guard from Appleton West who is scheduled to enroll as a freshman at Eau Claire.

Undaunted by these seemingly insurmountable odds, conference coaches still plan ways to ambush the Blugolds. River Falls, Stout, and Whitewater are given the best shot, although not necessarily in that order, with Oshkosh rated as a dark-horse possibility.

River Falls managed only a 6-18 record last season but Coach Newman Benson welcomes back an experienced squad with good size, especially in 6-9 Ron Penning, who earned all-conference recognition as a junior on the strength of his 14.6 scoring average and 10.1 rebounds per game.

Stout shared second place with Stevens Point last year and, although the Blue Devils will miss all-conference Cal Glover, they still have experienced performers, headed by 6-2 forward Terry Alexa and 6-8 center Dale Magedanz.

Whitewater's scrappy freshmen are now sophomores and Coach Eli Crogan expects the Warhawks to finish higher than the sixth place they settled for last season. Bob Opps, a 6-4 forward who earned all-conference berth as a freshman, shows the way. He will get help from fellow sophomores Hugh Gnatzig and Tom Van de Bogart.

If Oshkosh can shore up its defense, the Titans could improve the 8-8 record and share of fourth place of last season. They averaged 83 points a game but also yielded 84.1. One of the keys is 6-5 forward Greg Seibold, who averaged 12.5 points.

La Crosse needs a strong performance from 6-6 Dave Schreiber at center and another fine season from guard Dave Selbo, who averaged 16.1 points as a sophomore, if the Indians hope to climb.

This looks like a rebuilding year for Platteville with Jim Lawinger and Rich Ludka missing, and guard Dennis Brown the only solid veteran back.

The same can be said for Stevens Point with conference scoring champion Tom Ritzenthaler, guard Quinn VandenHeuvel, forward Bob Henning, and center Terry Amonson gone. Coach Bob Krueger must rebuild almost from scratch.

Superior starts well with Wayne Peterson, the conference's only new coach, and a 5-11 veteran guard, Jim McCorison. From there the Yellowjackets face a struggle to improve their 3-18 record and last place finish (1-15) in the conference.

Anderson uses a double post and has his Blugolds fastbreak when possible. He is seeking more outside shooting and additional quickness and agility in the front line. Ratliff led the WSUC last season with 14.2 rebounds a game. He ranked fifth in scoring with 17.3, while Schade was eighth with 16.6.

With nine lettermen and five starters returning, the Blugolds won't be expected to need any more help to repeat as champions and head for another NAIA tournament, but two additions could make them even stronger -- all-state guard Rich Reitzner of Appleton West, and DuWayne Nash, a transfer from St. Norbert.

Veteran Coach Phil Hey is attempting to find the formula which might boost the Indians into the first division following an eighth place finish last season. Missing this year, though, is playmaking guard John Selbo, who averaged 12.9 points last season.

However, Hey still has excellent quickness at the guard position, headed by John Selbo's brother Dave, who led the Indians in scoring last season with a 16.1 average. Other lettermen backcourt personnel are Dave Brown, Bill Horn, and Greg Kostechka.

The biggest returning lettermen is 6-6, 220-pound center Dave Schreiber. Also back is 6-3 forward Mike Hass. One of Hey's chief problems centers in the front line where he must strengthen the inside defense and rebounding. Marty Thompson, one of the graduated lettermen, led the team in rebounding last season with an 8.0 average.

Hass averaged 8.5 points and 6.7 rebounds during the 1970-71 campaign and Schreiber 8.3 points and 6.1 retrieves. Hey does feel, however, "three transfers and possibly one or two freshmen could strengthen us at forward and center".

Oshkosh could score last season, but the Titans also had a penchant for giving up more points to the opposition. While averaging 83 points a game, they also yielded 84.1 and as a result finished with an 8-8 conference record and 9-15 overall.

Shoring up the defense remains a formidable task for Coach Bob White. Lack of a big man makes the job particularly difficult. Gene Graham, a 6-3 jumper, gets the call at center and White expects to see the Milwaukee North senior become more consistent with experience.

Help in the front line will come from 6-5 Greg Seibold, the highest scorer among six returning Titans. He average 12.5 points last season dividing his time between center and forward. He is expected to concentrate on the wing this year. Additional help could come from 6-7 Bruce Borchart, back after four years in service. He could cushion the loss of Ken Ver Gowe.

Guard should be solid with starters Rocky Jiroch and Todd Lindeman back after acquiring some solid experience in their sophomore season. Lindeman averaged 10 points a game his first year on the varsity and Jiroch 8.7 points. Freshman Tom Norris also could bolster the backcourt, taking some of the heat off with Jeff Stang gone.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971-72

This will be a rebuilding year, according to Coach Dick Wadewitz, whose chief assignment will be to find replacements for guard Jim Lawinger, forward Rich Ludka, and center Dennis Nodolf. Wadewitz starts with returning guards Dennis Brown and John Steffen.

Lawinger is toughest to replace. A varsity performer four straight years, he finished second in conference scoring the past two seasons, averaging 20.3 points a game during the 1970-71 campaign. Ludka ranked seventh in the league with a 16.6 average.

Brown figures to be the hub of the attack this year. He was ninth in conference scoring as a junior with a 16.4 average. Critical problems loom, though, with lack of rebounding and the dire need for scoring out of the forwards and center.

The Pioneers shared fourth place last season, splitting 16 games, while finishing 10-12 overall. Inexperience will make it difficult to repeat even that record, although sophomores Bruce Gibson, Tom Jorris, and Jim Crook, moving up from the freshman team, could speed up rebuilding plans.

Coach Benson has no illusions about the job ahead trying to derail mighty Eau Claire, but he knows the Falcons have nine returning lettermen, who could develop into the finest River Falls team in sometime.

This is an experienced squad with good size, especially with 6-9 Ron Penning, 6-7 Mark Peck, 6-5 Randy Schultz and Todd Prink, along with Bob Parker and Ray Swetalla, both at 6-4. Penning earned all-conference recognition last season on the strength of his 14.9 scoring average and 10.1 rebounds per game.

Penning started last year along with Schultz and Parker in the front line and John Langlois and Jerry Hughes in the backcourt. Both guards also are lettermen. Langlois was the "quarterback" of the offense and averaged 11.6 points a game himself.

Schultz and Parker ranked among the conference leaders, Schultz averaging 12.2 points and 6.4 rebounds with Parker at 11.8 points and 7.5 retrieves. Although the Falcons wound up seventh at 4-12 last season, Benson is convinced "we have an excellent chance to finish high" in the 1971-72 campaign.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971-72

The Pointers have lost the heart of their second place team, leaving Coach Krueger with some major problems to solve, most critical being inexperience, lack of size, and inadequate depth. This will make it difficult to come close to last season's 13-3 conference record and 19-5 overall mark.

Most serious loss is Tom Ritzenthaler, a three-year regular who last season won the conference scoring championship, leading the league with 155 field goals, 372 points, and 23.3 per game average. His .475 shooting average also ranked with the best in the conference.

Krueger also must find replacements for guard Quinn Vanden Heuvel and forward Bob Henning, both of whom finished among the top 15 scorers, and 6-5 center Terry Amonson, one of the better rebounders in the conference.

Six lettermen are returning, but lack of experience will hamper most of them, at least early in the season. Among returnees is 6-7 sophomore Dennis Peters, who could help considerably under the boards. Krueger's one hope is that he can prevent disaster early and bring this group along for a strong showing in the second half of the season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971-72

The Blue Devils will be without three-time all-conference forward Cal Glover but still expect to finish high again in the coming season. Most observers concede Eau Claire will repeat but Stout is considered one of the few teams capable of an upset.

Despite the loss of Glover, the conference's No. 1 ranked scorer last season with a 20.1 average, Coach Mintz figures his team will have more depth in the coming campaign. He says the key to the Blue Devils' success will be the progress of 6-8 center Dale Magedanz, a junior from Neenah.

Heading seven returning lettermen is 6-2 forward Terry Alexa, an all-conference performer who finished among the conference leaders with his 12.4 scoring average and 10.1 rebounds per game. He is the principle reason Stout's team strength lies in defense and rebounding.

New Coach Wayne Peterson inherits a team that won only three of 21 games last season. Peterson, a native of Duluth, Minn., is the third Superior basketball coach in three years. He succeeds Wendell Carr, who served one season at the helm of the Yellowjackets.

Peterson will start with seven returning lettermen, headed by 5-11 guard Jim McCorison, the leading Yellowjacket scorer last season in conference competition with 158 points and a 10.5 average. The new coach will be starting from scratch, however, being totally unfamiliar with most of his candidates.

PROSPECTS FOR 1971-72

The period of experimentation for Coach Crogan and his young Warhawks is over. They concentrated on learning and building last season and now are ready to make their move. Strong rebounding and defense give them a head start in the coming campaign.

Whitewater's top three performers last season were freshmen, including all-conference Bob Opps, a 6-4 forward who finished fourth in conference scoring with an 18.7 average and ranked third in rebounding with 12.8 per game.
