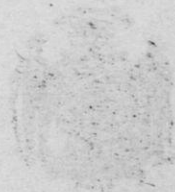

DEAR SIR:—We have the honor to submit in compliance with law, our biennial report of the transactions of this department for the two years ended June 30, 1918.

The policy of withholding state lands from sale, adopted in 1913, has been continued to the present, with modifications only in cases where best interests of the state clearly warranted selling. Under such modifications of the rule, about 1100 acres of swamp and overflowed lands along the Mississippi river in Crawford county were offered at public sale in February, 1918, after being reappraised and advertised pursuant to law. Most of the lands were sold at prices about 100 per cent higher than those at which the same had been offered prior to withdrawal from market in 1913. Account of these sales, with others, will be found in Exhibit B, herewith. Other sales were only such as directed by legislation to perfect titles and establish justice.

It is felt that much was accomplished in settlement, as authorized by Chapter 405 of the laws of 1903, of the long standing controversy between the State and the Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis and Omaha Railway Co., in relation to a large quantity of lands, which was concluded in January, 1917. In the adjustment, the railroad company executed a disclaimer of title to some 43,000 acres of land for which a deed had been given by the Governor pursuant to state legislation many years ago, said disclaimer recorded in counties where lands are situated, and filed in the General Land office at Washington, removes vexatious cloud from title. To rectify an error by which 2,573.82

acres of swamp lands had been conveyed to the railroad company on belief that it was entitled thereto under a grant, the railroad company paid to the State the sum of \$8,330.40, which it had received from innocent parties to whom 2,187.08 acres of said lands had been sold by the company. The remainder of the 2,574.82 acres erroneously conveyed to the railroad company, 387.74 acres were deeded back to the state by said company and is now part of state public land. In considering the controversy, it was found that the railroad company was entitled to 2,517.37 acres granted by Congress, which the state, as trustee, had failed to convey. To adjust this, a deed was issued duly conveying said lands, by description, to the said railway company.

Sec. 24.39, Wisconsin Statutes, created by Chapter 454, Laws of Wisconsin, 1917, empowers the Commissioners to lease parcels of the public lands and to sell timber thereon that has become damaged by fire or wind. Under that section, there have been a few leases executed for pastures and hay meadows, and small lots on shores of northern lakes for summer homes and hunting and fishing lodges. Before revision of laws of 1917, relating to state forest reserve, the state board of forestry had made several leases of public lands for terms of ten to twenty years. These leases we have recognized as equitably valid and annual payments of rent therefrom have been collected and paid into proper funds. Applications to lease large tracts for agricultural purposes and as ranges for herds of sheep have been denied, it being considered impracticable to have lands on which there is more or less timber growing, plowed up for crops on a short term lease, or to have large tracts on which homes might be established, held as stock ranges.

Sales of damaged timber on state lands have been confined mainly to "dead and down" timber, valuable only for household fuel, for which there is growing demand by settlers since the recent great advances in prices of coal, and marketable wood. In selling dead and down timber to settlers, we have in mind the necessity for conservation of fuel supplies during the war, and make the price nominal, to encourage people to gather up and use the same. It has not been thought advisable to sell standing dead timber because of the difficulty of protecting live timber on same tracts. Choppers are said to be careless and liable to mistake live for dead or damaged trees when making selections.

Under operation of Chapter 477, Laws of 1915, three hundred thousand dollars worth of old state certificates have been retired and that amount added to the state school fund. Practically all of this has been reinvested in loans to school districts and other municipalities of the state, as authorized by law. Pursuant to the act cited, there will be \$100,000.00 of the old certificates retired annually until all are extinguished. It is, therefore, possible that in the near future the sum of trust funds in the treasury may exceed the amount that can be invested under present laws. To meet such contingency, it is suggested that the law authorizing the Commissioners to invest trust funds in bonds of the United States and states of the Union, (Paragraph four (4), Section 258, Wisconsin Statutes, 1915), which was

repealed by revision of the statutes in 1917, should be reenacted, at least so far as to authorize purchase of bonds of the United States.

Recent decisions by the United States Supreme Court, of long pending suits, determine that 16th. section lands within boundaries of Indian reservations do not inure to the state under the provision in State Constitution granting each 16th. section to the state for benefit of schools. Proceeding on an adverse view of the law from admission of the state to the Union, in 1848, the state has assumed and exercised the right of ownership to the 16th. sections within the Indian reservations, the same as to other 16th. sections of the state, except as to right of occupancy. No doubt being entertained as to the state's legal title to the lands in question, they have been practically all sold to individuals by the state and money received therefor, paid into the school fund. The U. S. Supreme Court's decision makes such conveyances by the state void, and purchasers and their assigns are bereft of title, with no recourse beyond claims against the state for moneys paid. On request of parties interested in two sections of the land involved, statements have been compiled of amount received by the state on account thereof, and interest computed from dates of payment to Jan. 1, 1918, at 6 per cent per annum, from which it appears that the claims against the state on account of the two sections is about \$10,000.00. There are twelve or more 16th. sections in the Indian reservations, which have been sold, presumably affected by the same decision. Claims on account of these, if presented, are not likely to vary greatly in amount from the calculation made on two sections, and in the aggregate may amount to \$60,000.00 or more. Legislation on the subject may be found necessary. The Supreme Court decision implies that the state may seek indemnity from the United States for the 16th. section lands of which it is deprived by the decision.

Pursuant to Chap. 572, Laws of 1917, many claims of towns and individuals for taxes on lands purchased by the State Forestry Board, have been adjusted during the term covered by this report. Amount of such claims will be found in report of the Secretary of State. All the lands on which such tax claims have been paid are held as belonging to the Normal School Fund, under decision of the State Supreme Court, in case of "*State of Wisconsin, ex. rel. Walter C. Owen, Attorney-General, vs. John S. Donald, Secretary of State.*" Amounts paid have, accordingly, been charged to the Normal School Income Fund.

Exhibits A to K and Appendices 1 to 4, inclusive, herewith, are intended to show in sufficient detail, the transactions of the department for the biennial term.
