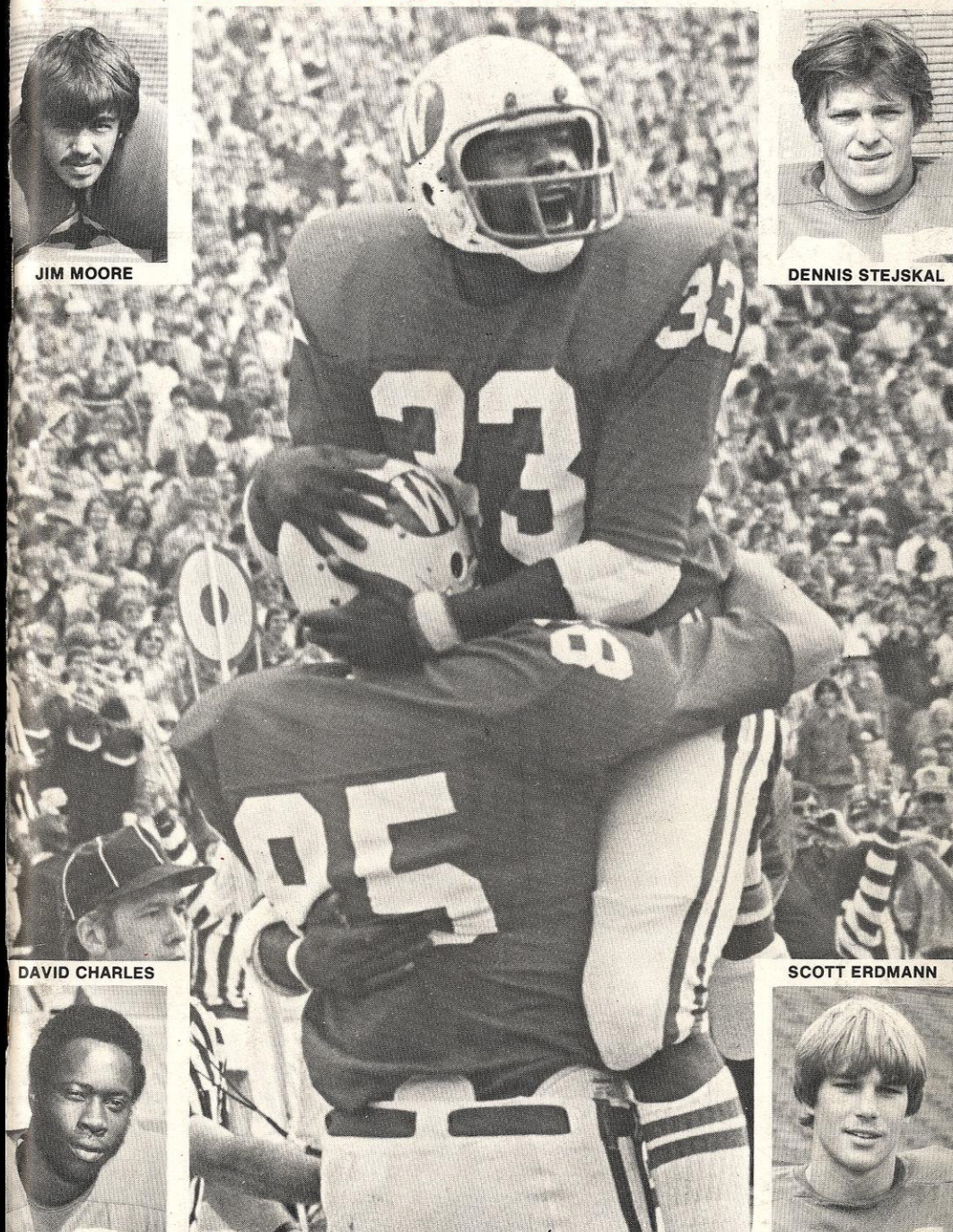

## COVERING THE BADGERS

**COMMUNICATIONS CENTER:** Wisconsin's working facilities for press-radio-television are located on the west side of Camp Randall Stadium and can be reached from Breese Terrace via the elevator at Gate 6.

**WORKING TICKETS:** All Requests for Communications Center tickets must be placed with the Sports Information Office. Upon acceptance of applications, appropriate tickets are either mailed or held for pickup at the Press Will Call window at the ground level entrance at Gate 6, Section E. Working press tickets contain assigned seat locations. Telecopier service will be available to members of the working press by the appropriate servicing organizations.

**RADIO:** Each station admitted for broadcasting by signed contract will be issued five booth tickets. Booths are assigned and tickets mailed upon receipt of necessary fees and signed contract. If tickets are not mailed, they may be picked up in advance at the Sports News Service Office, or on game day at the Press Will Call window.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Field passes are limited to daily newspaper, wire service, and television photographers. Photographers may work from assigned space in booths on the Radio-TV level, or from the west sideline (except between the 35-yard lines) and beyond the end zones.

**PARKING:** A limited number parking passes for Lots 18 and 19 are available to working people only. They will be issued as requested.

**PLAYER INTERVIEWS:** Media representatives may interview Badger players in the dressing room after a short post-game cooling off period. Players also are available for interviews or pictures prior to or following practice sessions during the week. Requests should be made through the Sports Information Office. Suggested best appointment times are 2:30 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

**COACHES INTERVIEWS:** John Jardine will meet with media representatives following each game after a short cooling off period. Meeting room will be the "W" Club annex off the Camp Randall concourse near the players entrance. Best time to interview Coach Jardine on a daily basis is from 2:30 to 3:15 p.m. daily in his office (in person or by telephone), and following practice each day in the "W" Club Annex.

**YOUR HOSTS** in Camp Randall Stadium and at all University of Wisconsin athletic events are **Jim Mott**, Sports Information Director, and **Bob Leu**, Radio-TV Director.

**Jim Mott** is a Madison native and has B.A. degrees in Zoology and Journalism from the University of Wisconsin. As an undergraduate, he served as Wisconsin's basketball team manager for four years, earning a major "W" award for his work.

**Jim** is a past president of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and the Madison Pen and Mike Club.

He and his wife **Dorothy** are the parents of three sons — **William 15**, **David 12**, and **Eric 10**.

**Bob Leu** joined Wisconsin's Athletic Department staff as Radio-TV Director in September, 1973 from WHA-TV where he had served as producer-director and director of sports.

He's a Milwaukee native and a 1960 graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a Bachelor of Arts degree in speech.

**Bob** is the producer of Wisconsin's post-season football, basketball, and hockey highlight films, does color commentary on the Badger hockey broadcasts, and is the producer-host of Badger Football which is seen each season on the state's public television stations.

He and his wife **Janis** are the parents of daughters **Dawn 18**, **Amie 15**, and son **Adam 6**.

# 1977 WISCONSIN FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

"If we get off to a good start and our key players have good years, we hope to challenge for the title.

"We have an outstanding schedule. We open at Indiana instead of Michigan, and that's a hell of a change.

"Wisconsin posted a 5-6 record in 1976 — 3-5 in the Big Ten — and the Badgers lost their five conference games by a total of 32 points — 15-14 at Indiana; 18-16 to Purdue; 31-25 at Illinois; 30-20 to Ohio State, and 40-27 at Michigan.

"A total of 17 of the 22 starters in last year's final game victory over Minnesota (26-17) return for 1977 play including national leaders **Ira Matthews** and **Scott Erdmann**.

"**Matthews** paced the nation in kickoff returns — 14 for 415 yards and two touchdowns (97 vs. Northwestern and 100 yards vs. Iowa) — and was the conference leader in both kickoff and punt returns.

"**Ira**, who ran for 535 yards from scrimmage, caught 19 passes for 238 yards, returned 15 punts for 138 yards, in addition to his kickoff return exploits, ranks as the only Wisconsin player to score a touchdown by running, pass reception, punt and kickoff return in a single season.

"**Scott Erdmann**, playing safety, ranked among the top ten nationally with seven pass interceptions and a return yardage total of 143 yards and one TD last year.

"**David Charles**, who caught 34 passes a year ago and ranked second in Big Ten play, returns for his junior year at split end.

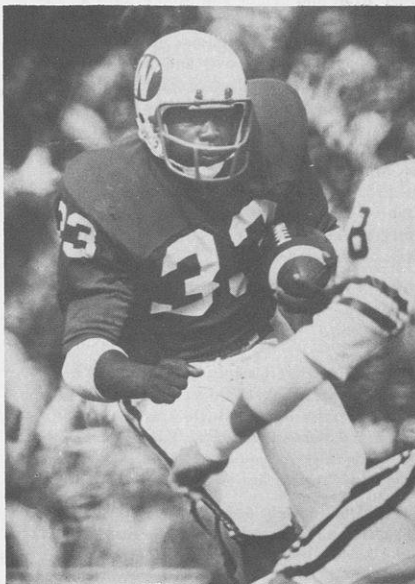
"**Greg Barber** lettered behind the departed **Ron Egloff** at tight end and had a good spring and appears set for a fine junior year.

"Wisconsin's offensive line is experienced with senior tackles **Tom Kaltenberg** and **Steve Lick**; junior guards **Brad Jackomino** and **Dave Krall** both saw considerable playing time in starting roles last year; and center **Jim Moore**, a 6-3½, 224 junior is as fine a center as we've had at Wisconsin — (consider that we sent **Mike Webster** to the NFL following the 1973 season).

"**Mike Morgan** comes back from knee surgery for his senior year and he had a good spring practice. He's a versatile running back with good power and speed.

"**Terry Breuscher** saw much playing time during the latter stages of 1976 and along with **Kevin Cohee**, who shows much promise, provides depth behind Morgan.

"**Tim Halleran** moved in at the fullback position in spring practice after lettering as a

linebacker — he was the team's top tackler at the position — in 1976.

"**Joe Rodriguez**, who gained playing time behind the departed **Lawrence Canada** last year, is the back-up fullback. He gained 149 yards from scrimmage and caught four passes for 42 yards — two of them for TD's — in his understudy role in 1976.

"Junior **Anthony Dudley** came to the front during spring drills and was No. 1 at the quarterback position when spring practice ended. Vying with him when 1977 preparations begin on August 22 will be junior **Charles Green**, a letterwinner as a freshman in 1975; and sophomore-to-be **Mike Kalasmiki**.

"**Mike Carroll** directed our multiple offense to an average of 380 yards per game running and passing in 1976 and the continued development of our quarterbacks during the 1977 season can make our offense very exciting ... and put the ball in the opponent's end zone.

**OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK** — A total of 16 lettermen return, including eight players with four or more starts in 1976.

**Strengths** — Wide Receiver **David Charles** returns after a terrific sophomore campaign in which he paced Badgers with 34 catches for 449 yards and three TD's.

Starting tackles **Tom Kaltenberg** — he missed final three games — and **Steve Lick** return while starting guards **Brad Jackomino** and **Dave Krall** and center **Jim Moore** form an experienced interior front line.

**Krall** started first four games of 1976 at left guard; **Jackomino** took over and did a thorough job; **Krall** has been shifted to right guard to replace the departed **Terry Lyons** who was a steady performer all through 1976 at the position.

**Ira Matthews** — the Badgers' Mr. Excitement in 1976 — and **Mike Morgan** are experienced running backs returning for 1977 play.

**Morgan** was injured (knee surgery) against **Purdue** and missed remainder of season.

**Major Losses** — Tight end **Ron Egloff**, 20 catches for 308 yards and 4 touchdowns;

Right Guard **Terry Lyons**; steady, 11 game starter

Quarterback **Mike Carroll**, Big Ten's 2nd leading passer and ranked 3rd in total offense. He was the Badgers' most valuable player in 1976.

Fullback **Lawrence Canada**, Top rusher with 993 yards to lead team; ranked 5th in Big Ten; an outstanding blocker.

**Counted on to Help** — Letterman **Greg Barber** at tight end; **Bruce Muschinske**, **Ray Sydnor** and **Charles Harper** all in the battle at this position.

Sophomores **Dan Westerlind**, **Ken Burney** and **Jim Martine** provide depth behind the guard positions.

Juniors **Anthony Dudley** and **Charles Green** — he started four games in 1975 — along with sophomore **Mike Kalasmiki**

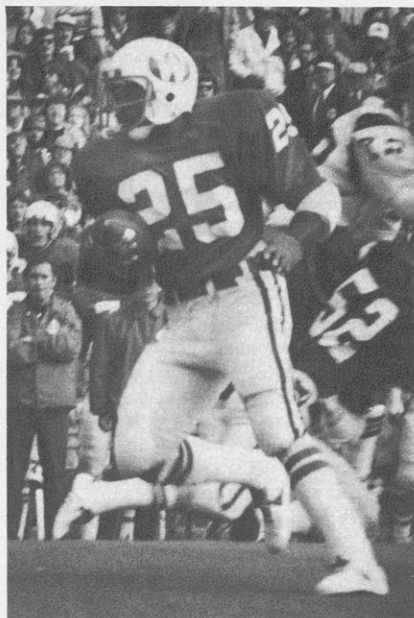

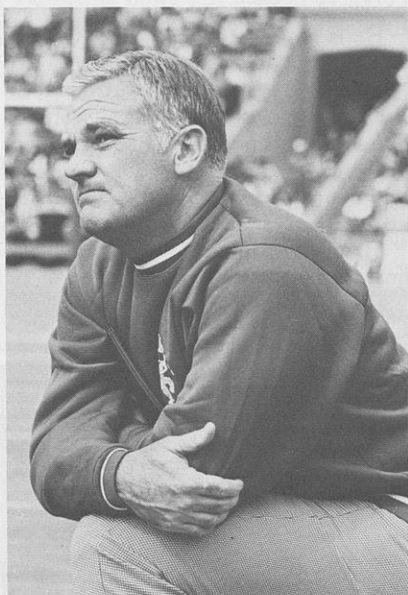
The 41-year-old **Jardine** came to Wisconsin after serving at UCLA for five years as offensive line coach under Tommy Prothro — a span in which the Bruins compiled an overall 35-13-3 record.

**John** was a letterwinner in football, basketball and swimming at St. George high School in Evanston, Illinois. He attended Purdue University where he was a starting offensive guard in 1956 and 1957 despite weighing only 186 pounds.

Mike is starting his third year on the Wisconsin staff. He coached the offensive backfield in 1975 and was named offensive coordinator a year ago.

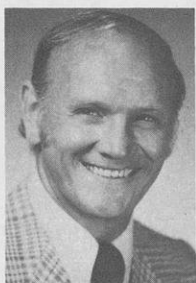
He is a native of Barberton, Ohio and had been backfield coach six years under Ara Parseghian at Notre Dame prior to coming to Wisconsin in February 1975.

Mike is a graduate of Northwestern where he won All-Big Ten honors as a full-back and was the league's top scorer in 1959.

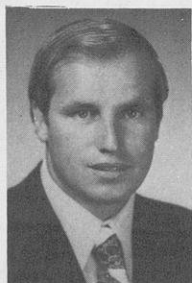

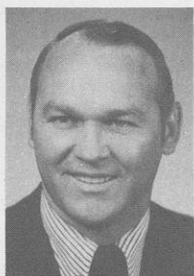

He was a graduate assistant football coach at Iowa 1966-67 and did work toward's his master's degree in Physical Education.

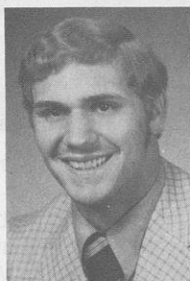

Following the 1974 season, he left Delaware State to become an assistant coach at Marshall University.

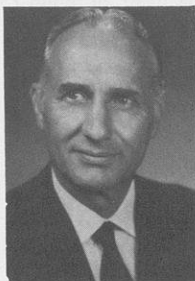

He is married to the former **Nancy Steiner** of Stevens Point.



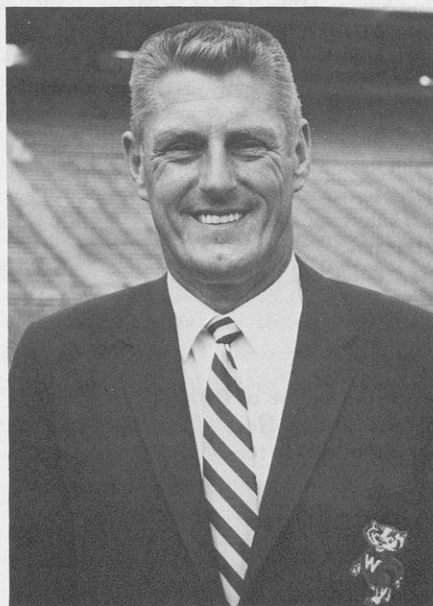
## Hirsch Guides Wisconsin Athletic Program

Elroy Hirsch is in his ninth year as Wisconsin's Director of Athletics and he's the guiding force behind one of the finest athletic programs for men and women in the United States today.

The Wausau native came back to Wisconsin — where he gained collegiate fame as a star sophomore running back in leading the Badgers to a No. 3 ranking during the 1942 football season — from the Los Angeles Rams on February 28, 1969, and his original appointment as athletic director, slated to end in 1979, was extended in 1974 by the school's athletic board through June 30, 1984.

Professor **Frederick W. Haberman**, athletic board chairman, points out, **"Elroy richly merits our confidence. His dynamic personality has infused our entire operation with that indefinable quality we usually call spirit. He has heightened the total consciousness of the state and of our alumni throughout the country. He's taken the role of the leader."**

Following the 1942 season when the Badgers posted an 8-1-1 record, Elroy played at Michigan in 1943 as a Marine trainee, — football, basket-

ball, track and baseball — to become the only athlete at Michigan ever to win an "M" in four sports in one season.

Elroy had an highly successful professional football career that started in 1946 as a halfback with the Chicago Rockets of the post-war All-America Conference. Later, he put in nine great seasons with the Los Angeles Rams as one of the all-time great ends.

He's been named to the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame, (1965), to professional football's Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio (1968), to the National Football Hall of Fame in New York (1974), and to the Madison Sports Hall of Fame (1977).

He's also a member of the all-time NFL All-Star team for his play as end and flanker with the Los Angeles Rams that served to change the game from one of two-way players to offensive and defensive specialists under free substitution.

**Elroy** and his wife **Ruth** are the parents of a son **Win Stephen** 27, and **Patricia Caroline** 19.

## ATHLETIC OFFICIALS

### PROF. FRANK J. REMINGTON

Frank has served as Wisconsin's Big Ten Faculty Representative and a member of the school's athletic board since 1959, except for the 1970-71 school year. He chaired the athletic board in 1966 and 1967.

The lawyer-educator, who has been a member of the law faculty since 1949, is one of the nation's foremost authorities on criminal justice and administration.

## TWO BADGER NUMBERS RETIRED

Two football jersey numbers have been retired in Wisconsin's football history. They are No. 80, worn by All-American end **Dave Schreiner** when he was an All-American end in 1941 and 1942; and No. 83, worn by quarterback **Allan J. Shafer** in 1944.

Schreiner was killed in action with the U. S. Marine Corps during the battle of Okinawa, June, 1945. Shafer was fatally injured in the second half of the 1944 Wisconsin-Iowa football game and died shortly after Wisconsin had defeated the Hawkeyes 26-7 in Camp Randall Stadium, November 11, 1944.

## CAMP RANDALL HISTORY

The University of Wisconsin is proud that its sports center is more than just an athletic field—and that the drama and excitement of football seasons are set against a backdrop of colorful Wisconsin history.

In its 84 years of ownership, the University has expanded the facilities there until they include a large stadium, fieldhouse, memorial practice building and football practice fields.

But the University didn't name it. The name was decided long before that by veterans of the Civil War who knew it was a great military camp named for a wartime governor. When the University took it over they insisted that the name be preserved forever as a memorial to their fallen friends.

In the days before the Civil War, the site was owned by the State Agricultural Society whose yearly state fairs attracted holidaying throngs there. With the outbreak of the war, however, the society turned the place over to the government to become the state's major training center.

The land again became the state fair grounds when peace returned and when Gen. U.S. Grant visited it 15 years later he hailed the transformation as "a symbol of beating the spears of war into the plowshares of peace."

Other visitors to the grounds were Gens. Sherman and Sheridan and Pres. Hayes. When the state fair was moved to Milwaukee and a few years later even the Dane County Agricultural society stopped using it for fairs, the Civil War veterans were furious to learn the land was to be sold for building lots.

Blasting the "sordid sacrilege," they urged the legislature to buy it and in 1893 the state presented it to the University as a memorial athletic field.

When the question of a name arose, the veterans promptly carried the day for "camp" instead of "Field."

Intercollegiate athletics had been started at Wisconsin in 1881 and the University has had a football team since 1889. The school won its first great victory in 1894, defeating Minnesota 6-0 in a game on the lower campus that part of the crowd watched from fringed surreys. The great teams of '96, '97, and '01 were among the first to play at the new field.

The University had a "real" stadium by 1913 but its stands were still wooden. The legislature declined to pay for concrete—and consequently, was promptly blamed when a large section collapsed Nov. 21, 1915, at the climactic Wisconsin-Minnesota game.

Twenty people were injured, some seriously, and only the fact that the seats fell slowly prevented more casualties among the 1,800 in the area.

So in 1917 the present stadium—following completion of the past year's addition—was started with a grant of \$15,000 from the legislature. The rest of the money was earned by athletic events and the stadium, which now seats 77,280, is the only one in the Big Ten to "pay its own way" that way. Permanent dormitories were built, housing 150 men, but this space now is used as athletic department offices and training quarters.

The first game to be played in Camp Randall Stadium was the 1917 homecoming game against Minnesota's Golden Gophers. The Badgers won the game 10-7 to hand the Gophers their only Big Ten loss, relegating them to second place in the final conference standings.

The original capacity of the stadium when first utilized in 1917 was 10,000, with permanent seats being added in stages to increase seating capacity.

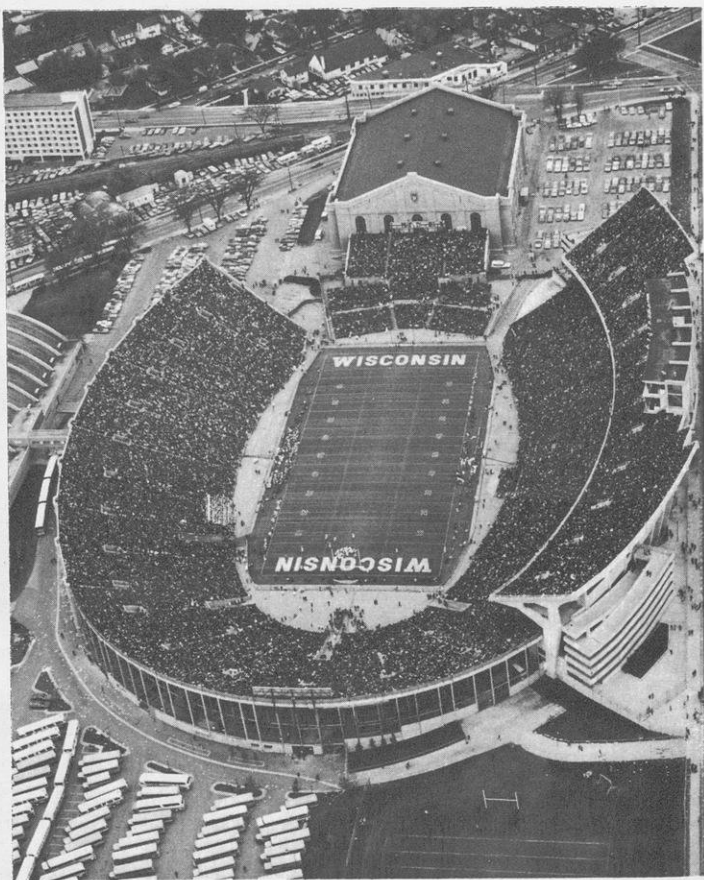
There have been three enlargements to Camp Randall Stadium since the end of World War II. The first, in 1950 and 1951, saw the completion of the horseshoe at the north end of the stadium.

The running track was eliminated in 1958 expansion which saw the playing field lowered by ten feet to add almost 12,000 seats to the stadium capacity which grew to 63,435 at that time.

The addition of the second deck on the west side of the stadium in 1966 added almost 13,000 prime viewing seats, including the modern Communications Center.

The current capacity of 77,280 makes Camp Randall Stadium the fifth largest college owned stadium in the United States — exceeded only by those at Michigan, Stanford, Ohio State and Tennessee.

The fieldhouse at the open end of the stadium horseshoe was built in 1930 for almost \$500,000 and has a seating capacity of 12,204 following renovation in 1976.



## CAMP RANDALL STADIUM

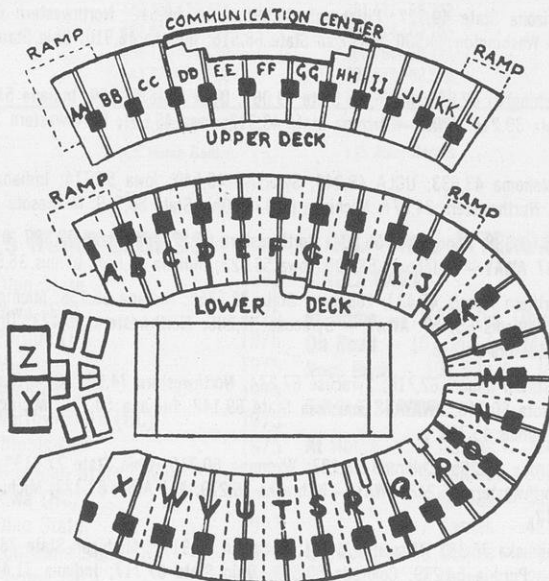

Fifth in number of full-time students, and seventh among alma maters of presidents serving the nation's largest corporations.

Excellence results from the continued financial support provided by the citizens of Wisconsin, and from the University's dedication to providing maximum educational opportunities for all state citizens, the acquisition of new knowledge through research, and the application of knowledge to the improvement and use of society.

An immense variety of intellectual experiences awaits the students on the Madison campus. Here is a nuclear reactor, one of the finest textile collections in the country, a building in which nearly every conceivable environmental condition can be simulated, a 50 mev fixed-field alternating gradient Synchrotron, a collection of over 1,700 United Artists movies from 1919-1951, and full scale models of a mastodon and gypodon.

The faculty has created special earth-satellite cameras that reveal weather patterns on a scale never believed possible, is conducting experiments with moon-rock samples returned by the Apollo 15 crew, and still others are working in one of the nation's premier cancer research centers.

True, much praise has come from the University's research efforts, but basically, the campus is a place of scholarship. And next on the list is serving the people of Wisconsin and the nation.
