GETTING TO KNOW YOU

Last fall, the Wisconsin Union's Membership Office and Marketing Department conducted a random survey of Union members (maybe you!) to find out how well the Union is serving its members, and to learn what improvements we can make. We were thrilled when over 65% of the 1,000 members surveyed sent back responses and suggestions that will help the Union staff serve you better. With that much information, we have the opportunity to really get to know our members, such as...

- 93% of those surveyed had college degrees (only 20% of the general American public holds college degrees or higher).
- 77% heard about membership while they were students on campus.
- No surprise here...the Union's hot spots are the Terrace and the Rathskeller.

- Over half of the respondents thought UW affiliation was necessary to become a Union member...in case you didn't know, you don't have to be part of the UW in order to join the Union!
- Most people come to the Union for entertainment (76%) and to spend time with family and friends (56%).
- The single biggest improvement that was identified: MORE PARKING!

Unfortunately, the Union has very little control over this problem (parking is a University responsibility), but the UW has proposed building additional parking lots in the vicinity of the Union.

To all the members who participated in this survey, the Union thanks you. It's great to renew acquaintances!



Multicultural Murals Give Trophy Room a Face Lift

The Wisconsin Union Directorate and the Multicultural Mural Committee proudly announce the upcoming installation of two multicultural murals in the Trophy Room of the Memorial Union. This student-initiated project continues the tradition of murals in the Memorial Union by adding the work of muralist Leo Tanguma to the Union's permanent art collection.

Since the early 1960s, Mr. Tanguma has enhanced many environments across the country with his colorful and expressive murals, and now his work will grace the walls of the Memorial Union. With input from

multicultural students at UW-Madison, the murals will depict the joys and pains of these students and provide a symbol of unity among all students.
