**AMENDMENTS TO THE WISCONSIN DAIRY AND FOOD
LAWS, AND NEW DAIRY AND FOOD LAWS
ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE
OF 1907.**

Ch. 99, 1907.

Relating to Babcock milk and cream test: samples; paying check. Section 1494aa. 1. In the use of the Babcock test, the standard milk measures or pipettes shall have a capacity of 17.6 cubic centimeters, and the standard test tubes or bottles for milk shall have a capacity of 2 cubic centimeters for each 10 per cent. marked on the necks thereof; cream shall be tested by weight and the standard unit for testing shall be 18 grams, and it is thereby made a misdemeanor to use any other standards of milk or cream measure where milk or cream is purchased by or furnished to creameries or cheese factories and where the value of said milk or cream is determined by the per cent. of butter fat contained in the same, or wherever the value of milk or cream is determined by the per cent. of butter fat contained in the same by the Babcock test.

2. In sampling cream or milk from which composite tests are to be made to determine the per cent. of butter fat contained therein, no such sample or sampling shall be lawful unless a sample be taken from each weighing and the quantity thus used shall be proportioned to the total weight of the cream or milk tested.

3. Every person, corporation or company operating a creamery when using the Babcock test as a standard to determine the value of any milk or cream received or bought by such person, corporation or company to be manufactured into butter, shall, when paying for such milk or cream, include in every statement or check issued to any patron in payment thereof a statement of the number of pounds of butter fat and the number of pounds of butter made for the period of time for which payment is made.

Ch. 77.

Relating to label on baking powder. Section 1. Section 4601b, statutes of 1898, is amended to read: Section 4601b. Any person who shall, by himself, his servant or agent or by the servant or agent of any other person, make or manufacture baking powder or any mixture or compound intended for use as a baking powder, or sell, exchange or deliver, or have in his possession with the intent to sell or exchange or expose or offer for sale or exchange such baking powder, or any mixture or compound intended for use as a baking powder, * * * unless each receptacle or package in which the same is kept for sale or sold, has securely affixed in a conspicuous place upon the side thereof, and plainly separated from other reading matter, a white or light colored label, upon the outside face of which label shall be printed in the English language with black ink, in type not smaller than eight point, bold-faced, gothic capitals, the name and address of the manufacturer of such baking powder, and the words: "This baking powder is composed of the following ingredients and none other," and immediately thereafter upon the same label, in color, style and manner above specified, the name of each ingredient contained in such baking powder, using the name by which each ingredient is commonly known, shall be punished as provided in the next preceding section, provided that for the purposes of this act, alum in any form or shape or any aluminum salt shall be designated by the term alum.

Ch. 78.

Relating to obstructing performance of dairy and food commissioner's duty and prescribing penalty. Section 1. Section 4607b, statutes of 1898, is amended to read: Section 4607b. Any person who shall obstruct the dairy and food commissioner of this state or either of his assistants, chemists or inspectors in the performance of their duty by refusing him entrance to any place he is authorized to enter or by refusing to deliver to him a sample of any article of food, drink or drug made, sold, offered or exposed for sale by the person to whom request therefor is made if the value thereof is tendered, shall be * * * guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days.

Ch. 168.

Relating to sale of adulterated articles. Section 1. Section 4600, statutes of 1898, as amended by chapter 207, laws of 1905, is amended to read: Section 4600. Any person, who shall, by himself, his servant or agent, or as the servant or agent of any other person, sell, exchange, deliver or have in his possession with intent to sell, exchange, offer for sale or exchange any drug or article of food which is adulterated, or any candy containing intoxicating liquor, shall be fined not less than twenty five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than thirty days nor more than four months. The term "drug" as used in this section shall include all medicines for internal or external use, antiseptics, disinfectants and cosmetics. The term "food" as used herein shall include all articles used for food or drink or condiment by man, whether simple, mixed or compound.

Ch. 173.

Relating to the misbranding of articles of food. Section 1. There is added to the statutes of 1898 a new section to read: Section 4601aa. Any person, firm or corporation by himself, officer, servant or agent, or as the officer, servant or agent of any other person, firm or corporation, who shall manufacture or solicit or take orders for delivery, or sell, exchange, deliver or have in possession any article of food within the meaning of section 4600, statutes of 1898, which is misbranded within the meaning of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days. The term "misbranded," as used herein, shall apply to articles of food, or articles which enter into the composition of food, which, or the package or label of which shall bear any statement, design or device regarding such article or the ingredients or substances contained therein which shall be false or misleading in any particular; or if in package form, and the contents are stated in terms of weight or measure, they are not plainly and correctly stated on the outside of the package; and to any food product which is falsely branded as to the state, territory or country in which it is manufactured or produced. Any article of food shall also be deemed to be misbranded if the contents of the package as originally put up shall have been removed in whole or in part and other contents shall have been placed in such package. The term "label," as used in this section and in section 4601, statutes of 1898, or in any other section of these statutes, relating to the adulteration or misbranding of food, unless otherwise specifically described and provided therein, shall apply to any printed, pictorial or other matter upon or attached to any package of a food product or any container thereof.

It is hereby made the duty of the dairy and food commissioner of this state, by himself, or assistants, chemists, inspectors and agents, to see that the provisions of this section are enforced and for this purpose all the powers conferred upon the said commissioner, his assistants, chemists, inspectors and agents, by section 1410a, 1410b, 1410d, of the statutes of 1898, or by any other provision of these statutes are hereby conferred upon said dairy and food commissioner his assistants, chemists, inspectors and agents, so far as the same may be applicable.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after October first, 1907.

Ch. 205.

Relating to standards of purity for food products. Section 1. There is added to the statutes of 1898 a new section to read: Section 4601—4a. In all prosecutions arising under the provisions of these statutes for the manufacture or sale of an adulterated, misbranded or otherwise unlawful article of food, drink, condiment or drug, the latest standards of purity for food products, established by the United States secretary of agriculture, shall be accepted as the legal standards, except in cases where other standards are specifically prescribed by the laws of this state.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after October first, 1907.

Ch. 206.

Relating to the duties of the dairy and food commissioner, laboratory expenses of the dairy and food commissioner. Section 1. Section 1410d, statutes of 1898, is amended to read: Section 1410d. The governor may authorize the commissioner or his assistants, chemists or inspectors, when not engaged in the performance of other official duties, to give such aid in farmers' institutes, dairy and food and farmers' conventions and the agricultural department of the state university as may be deemed advisable. For the necessary expenses of making the analyses contemplated in the foregoing sections the commissioner may incur an annual expense of not to exceed * * * one thousand dollars, the accounts for which, when verified and itemized, and approved by the governor shall be audited by the secretary of state.

Ch. 306.

Relating to wrongful use of milk and fraudulent accounts by butter or cheese manufacturers. Section 1. Section 1494a, statutes of 1898, is amended to read: Section 1494a. Any butter or cheese manufacturer who shall knowingly use or allow any other person to use for the benefit of himself or any other person than he who is entitled to the benefit thereof any milk or cream from the milk brought to him, without the consent of the owner thereof, or who shall refuse or neglect to keep or cause to be kept a correct account (which shall be open to the inspection of any person furnishing milk to him and to the dairy and food commissioner of this state, his chemists, assistants, inspectors and agents) of the amount of milk daily received, or to the number of pounds of butter, and the number and aggregate weight of cheese made by him each day, or of the number of cheese cut or otherwise disposed of and the weight of each, shall * * * be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction be punished by a fine not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days.

Ch. 370.

Relating to the sale of vinegar and fixing standards therefor. Section 1. Section 46071 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 46071. No person shall sell, manufacture for sale, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell as apple, orchard or cider vinegar, any vinegar which has not been made exclusively by the fermentation of pure apple juice, known as apple cider; or vinegar which contains any foreign substance whatsoever; or vinegar which shall contain less than * * * four per centum by weight of absolute acetic acid; or vinegar which shall be found to contain less than one and * * * six-tenths per centum by weight of pure cider vinegar solids upon full evaporation at two hundred and twelve degrees Fahrenheit and no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell any cider vinegar unless each barrel, cask, * * * keg, or other original package or original container, containing the same, be plainly stenciled or branded or labeled, * * * with the words "Cider Vinegar," together with the name and place of business of the manufacturer thereof, and the strength of the vinegar contained in said barrel, cask, * * * keg or other original package or original container, containing the same, which strength shall be denoted by the per centum by weight of absolute acetic acid contained in said vinegar. And no person shall manufacture for sale, offer or expose for sale or have in possession with intent to sell, or sell, any vinegar which shall be adulterated within the meaning of sections 4600 and 4601 of the statutes of 1898, and laws amendatory thereof; or any vinegar which shall contain less than four * * * per centum by weight of absolute acetic acid; or vinegar which shall contain any artificial coloring matter or any preparation of lead, copper, sulphuric or other mineral acids, or any acid made from the distillation of wood or any ingredient injurious to health. And no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell any vinegar (except cider vinegar) made by fermentation without the intervention of distillation unless each barrel, cask, * * * keg, or other original package or original container, containing the same, be plainly stenciled or branded or labeled, * * * with the name and place of business of the manufacturer of said vinegar, and the strength of the vinegar contained in said barrel, cask, * * * keg, or other original package or original container, containing the same, which strength shall be denoted by the per centum by weight of absolute acetic acid contained in said vinegar, together with the words "Fermented Vinegar" and the true name of the fruit or substance from which said vinegar is made. And no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell any vinegar made wholly or in part from distilled liquor unless each barrel, cask, * * * keg, or other original package or original container, containing the same, be plainly stenciled or branded or labeled, * * * with the words * * * "Spirit Vinegar," together with the name and place of business of the manufacturer or dealer thereof and the strength of the vinegar contained in said barrel, cask, * * * keg, or other original package or original container, containing the same, which strength shall be denoted by the per centum by weight of absolute acetic acid contained in said vinegar. And no person shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell, any vinegar unless the stencil, brand or label hereinbefore required shall in the case of barrel, cask or keg be in black letters and figures at least one inch in height on one head of said barrel, cask or keg, and in case of other original package or original container in black letters and figures not smaller than eight-point Brevier caps on the outside of each original package or original container thereof.

Any person who shall be found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall * * * be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction shall be punished by fine not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after October 1st, 1907.

Ch. 386.

Relating to the appointment of additional employes by the dairy and food commissioner, prescribing their qualifications and duties and providing their compensation. Section 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 1410-1. In addition to the officials and appointees otherwise provided by law for the dairy and food commission, the dairy and food commissioner may, with the advice and consent of the governor, appoint one secretary; one assistant chemist; one cheese factory, dairy and food inspector; and one creamery, dairy and food inspector, whose duties shall be to assist in promoting the work of the dairy and food commissioner in the manner herein provided and in such way as may be required by the dairy and food commissioner in the enforcement of the dairy and food laws. The duties of the cheese factory, dairy and food inspector, in addition to the general duties hereinbefore provided, shall be to inspect cheese factories, dairies, foods and drugs under the direction and supervision of the dairy and food commissioner. He shall be an expert cheesemaker, skilled in the technical work of cheese factories, a competent judge of cheese factory products and versed in modern scientific and practical dairy husbandry. The duties of the creamery, dairy and food inspector, in addition to the general duties hereinbefore provided, shall be to inspect creameries, dairies, foods and drugs under the direction and supervision of the dairy and food commissioner. He shall be skilled in the technical work of creameries, a competent judge of creamery products and versed in modern scientific and practical dairy husbandry. The assistant chemist shall be a competent analytical chemist. The annual salary of the said assistant chemist shall be fifteen hundred dollars; the annual salary of the said secretary and of the creamery, dairy and food inspector shall be twelve hundred dollars each. The compensation of the cheese factory, dairy and food inspector shall be one hundred dollars per month. The aforesaid salaries and compensation shall be paid in the same manner as is provided by law for the payment of salaries of other state officers and employes. There shall also be paid to the assistant chemist and to each of the inspectors herein provided for, their necessary and actual expenses incurred in the discharge of their official duties, on the approval of the dairy and food commissioner and the governor, of verified and itemized accounts therefor, and the said officials shall have all the powers that are conferred by law upon any agent, inspector or assistant of the dairy and food commissioner.

Ch. 478.

Relating to labeling stock foods. Section 1. There is added to the statutes of 1898, a new section to read: Section 4438g-1. 1. All mixed or compounded animal stock foods offered for sale in this state either in bulk or in small packages shall have printed upon sack or package in plain letters all of the different ingredients of which it is composed.

2. Any person who shall violate this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars.

3. It shall be the duty of the state dairy and food commissioner to enforce the provisions of this act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after May 1, 1908.

Ch. 557.

Relating to the sale of syrups, molasses, glucose mixtures and maple syrup mixtures, and to protect the public health. Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of chapter 152, laws of 1905, are amended and made sections of the statutes of 1898, to read: Section 4601-1a. No person, firm or corporation, by himself, officer, servant or agent, or as the officer, servant or agent of any other person, firm or corporation, shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell any syrup, maple syrup, sugarcane syrup, sugar syrup, refiners' syrup, sorghum syrup, molasses or glucose, unless the same be true to the name under which it is sold and as defined in the standards of purity for food products as * * * latest promulgated by the United States * * * Secretary of Agriculture, and unless the barrel, cask, keg, can, pail or * * * other original container, containing the same be distinctly branded or labeled with the true name of its contents, as defined in the above named standards; and no person, firm or corporation, by himself, officer, servant or agent, or as the officer, servant or agent of any other person, firm or corporation, shall sell, offer or expose for sale or have in his possession with intent to sell any syrup, maple syrup, sugarcane syrup, sugar syrup, refiners' syrup, sorghum syrup or molasses, mixed with glucose, unless the * * * barrel, cask, keg, can, pail or * * * other original container, containing the same be distinctly branded or labeled * * * so as to plainly show the true name of each and all of the ingredients composing such mixture, as follows:

First: In case said mixture shall contain glucose in a proportion not to exceed 50 per cent. by weight, it shall be labeled and sold as "Maple Syrup and Glucose," "Sugar-Cane Syrup and Glucose," "Sugar Syrup and Glucose," "Refiners' Syrup and Glucose," "Sorghum Syrup and Glucose," or "Molasses and Glucose," as the case may be;

Second: In case said mixture shall contain glucose in a proportion exceeding 50 per cent. and not more than 75 per cent. by weight, it shall be labeled and sold as "Glucose and Maple Syrup," "Glucose and Sugar-Cane Syrup," "Glucose and Sugar Syrup," "Glucose and Refiners' Syrup," "Glucose and Sorghum Syrup," "Glucose and Molasses," as the case may be;

Third: In case said mixture shall contain glucose in a proportion exceeding 75 per cent. by weight, it shall be labeled and sold as "Glucose flavored with Maple Syrup," "Glucose flavored with Sugar-Cane Syrup," "Glucose flavored with Sugar Syrup," "Glucose flavored with Refiners' Syrup," "Glucose flavored with Sorghum Syrup," "Glucose flavored with Molasses," as the case may be. The labels provided for in this section shall be printed in type not smaller than eight-point Brevier caps and shall bear the name and address of the manufacturer or dealer. In mixtures in which glucose shall be mixed with any syrup or molasses in the proportion of not more than 50 per cent. by weight of the total product, the word "Glucose" shall be printed in type of the same size and style and the same color as may be used in printing the name of any syrup or molasses with which the glucose may be mixed, and said mixture shall be so labeled and sold. In mixtures in which glucose shall be mixed with any syrup or molasses in the proportion of not more than 75 per cent. and not less than 50 per cent. by weight, the word "Glucose" shall be printed in the same color and in type of the same style but one-third larger than the size of the letters which may be used in the printing of the name of any syrup or molasses with which it may be mixed, and such mixture shall be so labeled and sold. In all mixtures in which glucose is used in the proportion of more than 75 per cent. by weight, the name of the syrup or molasses which is mixed with the glucose for flavoring purposes and the words showing that said syrup or molasses is used as a flavoring, as provided in this section, shall be printed on the label of each container of such mixture in the same color, and in the same style of type but not larger than ten-point caps. * * * The mixtures or syrups designated in this section shall have no other designation or brand than herein required that represents or is the name of any article which contains a saccharine substance; and all brands or labels required shall be an inseparable part of the general or distinguishing label, and the general or distinguishing label shall be the principal and conspicuous sign under which it is sold; nor shall any of the aforesaid glucose, syrups, molasses or mixtures contain any substance injurious to health, nor any other article or substance otherwise prohibited by law in articles of food.

Section 4601—2a. No person, firm or corporation, by himself, officer, servant or agent, or as the officer, servant or agent of any other person, firm or corporation, shall solicit or take orders for delivery, or sell, exchange, deliver or have in possession with intent to sell, exchange or expose, or offer for sale or exchange, any maple syrup mixed with sugar-cane syrup, sugar syrup, refiners' syrup, sorghum syrup or molasses, unless the same be labeled and sold so as to show the true name of each and all of the ingredients contained therein and unless each barrel, cask, keg, can, pail or other original container, containing the same, be distinctly branded or labeled and sold so as to plainly show the true name of each and all of the ingredients composing such mixture, as follows:

First: If said mixture shall contain 50 per cent. or more by weight of maple syrup, it shall be labeled and sold as "Maple Syrup and Sugar-Cane Syrup," "Maple Syrup and Sugar Syrup," "Maple Syrup and Refiners' Syrup," "Maple Syrup and Sorghum Syrup," or "Maple Syrup and Molasses," as the case may be;

Second: If said mixture shall contain not less than 25 per cent., nor more than 49 per cent., by weight, of maple syrup, it shall be labeled and sold as "Sugar-Cane Syrup and Maple Syrup," "Sugar Syrup and Maple Syrup," "Refiners' Syrup and Maple Syrup," "Sorghum Syrup and Maple Syrup," or "Molasses and Maple Syrup," as the case may be;

Third: If said mixture shall contain less than 25 per cent., by weight, of maple syrup, it shall be labeled and sold as "Sugar-Cane Syrup flavored with Maple Syrup," "Sugar Syrup flavored with Maple Syrup," "Refiners' Syrup flavored with Maple Syrup," "Sorghum Syrup flavored with Maple Syrup," or "Molasses flavored with Maple Syrup," as the case may be.

All labels provided for in this section shall be printed in English, in type not smaller than eight-point Brevier caps and shall bear the name and address of the manufacturer or dealer. In mixtures in which maple syrup shall be mixed with molasses or any or either of the syrups designated in this section in the proportion of not less than 50 per cent. by weight of the total product, the word "Maple" shall be printed in type of the same size and style and in the same color as may be used in the printing of the name of any other syrup or molasses with which the maple syrup may be mixed, and said mixture shall be so labeled and sold. In mixtures in which maple syrup shall be mixed with molasses or any or either of the syrups designated in this section, in the proportion of not less than 25 per cent. and not more than 49 per cent., by weight of the total product, the word "Maple" shall be printed in the same color, and in type of the same style, but not larger than two-thirds of the size, of the letters which may be used in printing the name of any syrup or molasses with which maple syrup may be mixed, and such mixture shall be so labeled and sold. In all cases in

which maple syrup shall be mixed with any of the syrups designated in this section, in the proportion of less than 25 per cent., by weight of the total product, the word "Maple" and the words showing it to be used as a flavor, as provided in this section, shall be printed on the label of each container of such mixture in the same color and in the same size and style of type, but not larger than ten-point Brevier caps. The mixtures or syrups designated in this section shall have no other designation or brand than herein required that represents or is the name of any article which contains a saccharine substance; and all brands or labels required shall be an inseparable part of the general or distinguishing label, and the general or distinguishing label shall be the principal and conspicuous sign under which it is sold; nor shall any of the aforesaid glucose, syrups, molasses or mixtures contain any substance injurious to health, nor any other article or substance otherwise prohibited by law in articles of food.

4601—3a. Whoever shall do any of the acts or things prohibited, or neglect, or refuse, to do any of the acts or things required by this act, or in any way violate any of the provisions of this act shall * * * be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten days nor more than sixty days.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after October 1, 1907.

CHEMIST'S ANALYSES.

HONORABLE J. Q. EMERY,

SIR:—During the period from January 1, 1907, to December 31, 1907, 2157 samples of foods and drugs were analysed in the laboratory of the commission, of which 1097 were pronounced unlawful by reason of being adulterated or misbranded. It should be emphasized that these figures and those given in the appended summary do not by any means represent the true condition of the Wisconsin market. In most instances only such samples were sent to the laboratory for analysis as were suspected of being adulterated. This was particularly true of butter, cheese, cream, milk, oleomargarine and canned goods, where the ratios of unlawful to lawful samples are very much higher than the actual figures. For example, while the actual number of samples of milk collected by our inspectors from creameries and cheese factories was 4470, only 143 were sent to the laboratory as suspicious. Of these 143 samples, 123, or 2.75% of the total number, were found adulterated. In the case of drugs, however, the figures in most cases show the actual conditions of the Wisconsin market in respect to the kinds of drugs analysed.

Aqua Ammoniac (AMMONIA WATER)

"Ammonia Water" of the U. S. pharmacopoeia should contain 10 per cent by weight of ammonia gas. It is specifically stated in the text of the pharmacopoeia that the solution deteriorates on keeping and should be tested frequently, and that it must not be dispensed for medicinal purposes if it contains less than 10 per cent by weight of the gas.

Most of the samples purchased were below legal strength. In a few cases, however, they were very much above legal strength, warranting the assumption that the dealer suspected that the samples were intended for inspectional purposes and dispensed his stronger ammonia water for ammonia water, perhaps not realizing that this was as great an offense under the law as the dispensing of ammonia water below legal strength.

S. pharmacopoeia should contain not less than 99.8 per cent of pure arsenic trioxide, the solution of potassium arsenite should contain not less than 0.998 gms. of absolute arsenic trioxide in 100 gms. of the solution. Many of the samples analyzed seemed to have been either very carelessly made or very impure arsenic trioxide was used in their preparation.

Spiritus Aetheris Nitrosi (SPIRIT OF NITROUS ETHER)

Spirit of nitrous ether according to the requirements of the U. S. pharmacopoeia should, when assayed according to the official method, yield not less than 4 per cent of ethyl nitrite.

Only three samples analysed came up to these requirements and in more than one-third of the cases the preparations were of less than half strength. In some instances the deficiency in strength was probably due to the age of the preparation, which deteriorates upon standing, especially when contained in colorless bottles instead of the dark amber-colored vials prescribed by the pharmacopoeia as containers for this preparation. In the worst cases, however, the poor quality of the preparation was due to the use of diluted alcohol as manufacture instead of the official alcohol of the U. S. pharmacopoeia, since ethyl nitrite hydrolyzes much more rapidly in dilute than in strong alcohol solutions. Alcohol determinations were not made on all of the samples analysed.

Spiritus Camphorae (SPIRIT OF CAMPHOR)

The latest current edition of the U. S. pharmacopoeia, as well as the previous edition, requires that 100 ccs. of spirit of camphor contain 10 grams of camphor dissolved in alcohol.

Some of the samples analysed had evidently been prepared according to the pharmacopoeia of 1880, which permitted the use of about 20 per cent of water in spirit of camphor, but required practically the same strength of camphor. Many of the samples analysed were found to be deficient in camphor as well as to contain added water. Alcohol determinations were, however, not made on all of the samples.

Tinctura Iodi (TINCTURE OF IODINE)

Tincture of iodine according to the latest current edition of the U. S. pharmacopoeia should contain not less than 6.83 gms. of iodine and 5 gms. of potassium iodide in 100 ccs.

A number of the samples analyzed were of official strength in iodine, but contained no potassium iodide, having evidently been prepared according to the previous edition of the U. 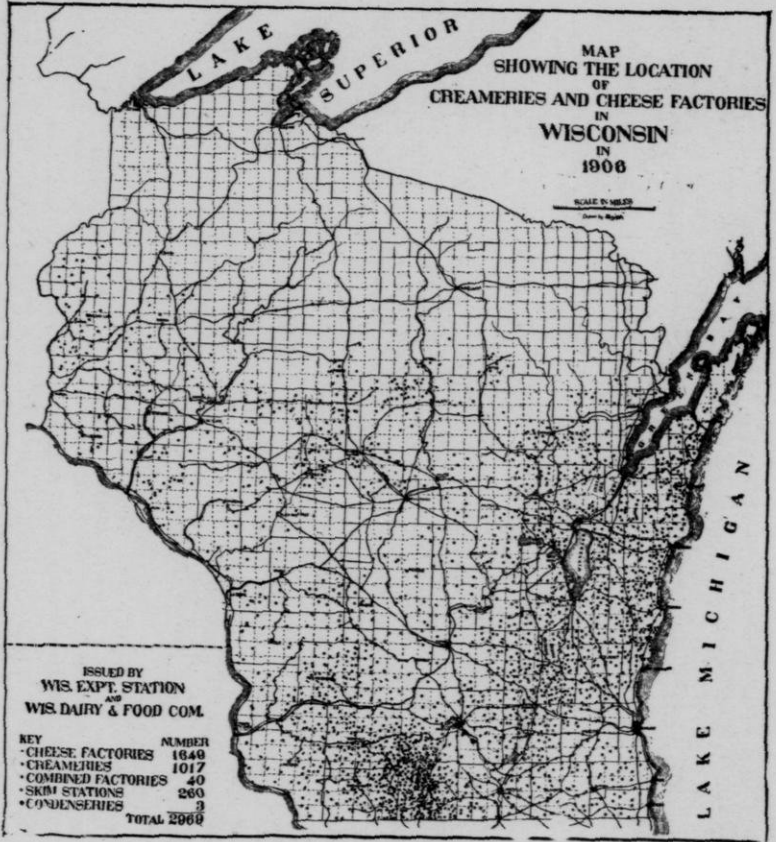

The information charged that the defendants at the county of Jefferson did unlawfully, by themselves, their agents and servants, have in their possession with intent to sell, and did offer and expose for sale, and did sell, a certain article, product and compound which was made partly out of fat, oil and oleaginous substance, and partly out of a compound thereof, and neither the said article, product or compound, nor the said fat, oil and oleaginous substance, nor the said compound thereof, was produced from unadulterated milk, or from cream from unadulterated milk, and said article, product and compound and said substance of said compound contained the admixture and addition of fat foreign to unadulterated milk, and foreign to unadulterated cream, and said article, product, or compound was then and there in imitation of yellow butter, with or without coloring matter, such butter being produced from said unadulterated milk or cream from the same, etc.; that said article was in fact oleomargarine and in imitation of yellow butter.

SUMMARY OF THE TESTIMONY.

The following is a summary of the testimony in the case, as prepared by John M. Olin of counsel for the state in his brief submitted to the supreme court:

(a) THE ARTICLE SOLD AN IMITATION, AS TO COLOR, OF YELLOW BUTTER COMMONLY SOLD UPON THE MARKETS IN WISCONSIN.

The article in question was sold by the defendants on December 20, 1906, and was introduced in evidence and marked Exhibit A. It was purchased by H. C. Larson in the performance of his duty as one of the dairy and food inspectors of the state, acting under the Commissioner, Mr. Emery. On November 9, 1906, Mr. Larson also purchased from the defendants a roll of the light colored oleomargarine, manufactured and sold by Swift & Company in compliance with the statute. This was also introduced in evidence and marked Exhibit B. The same price, namely, eighteen cents per pound, was paid for each article. At the time of the purchase of Exhibit A, there occurred the following conversation between Mr. Larson and Mr. Meyer, one of the defendants:

"I asked if he was still of the opinion that he was going to continue to sell oleomargarine that was yellow in imitation of butter, and he said yes, that the matter had been talked over and Swift & Company were going to back them and defend them in the matter and they were going to sell it."

That the article sold, Exhibit A, was, as to its color, in imitation of the yellow

low butter commonly sold upon the markets of Wisconsin, is the undisputed testimony in the case. Mr. Larson, who purchased the article, testified:

"Exhibit A was the color of yellow butter."

"For most of the markets we have what we call a light straw shade which would be about the color of this sample (Exhibit A) shown me. * * * I would call this Exhibit A a light straw color."

W. D. Hoard testified:

"I would call it (Exhibit A) butter of a light shade of yellow. * * * It is a little lighter than the usual shade of butter for the Chicago market, but no lighter than some of the butter which is called for by some of the customers of the Hoard Creameries."

J. G. Moore, who had had large experience at the University, at county fairs, and other places, in scoring contests in which the color of butter was to be passed upon, testified:

"I would say Exhibit A is about a light straw color. There is a tendency among creamery men in this state to keep the yellow as deep at least as that."

U. S. Baer, a cheese-maker and buttermaker and teacher at the Dairy School of the University, and at the time of giving his testimony assistant dairy and food commissioner, a person, as he testified, familiar with butter that had been manufactured in different parts of Wisconsin and in the different shades of yellow for the markets of Chicago, Elgin and New York, for the past ten or twelve years, testified:

"That Exhibit A resembles very closely in color the yellow butter manufactured and sold here in Wisconsin."

F. E. Carswell, another inspector for the Dairy and Food Commission, and a person familiar with butter and the different shades of yellow manufactured for the different markets in Wisconsin, testified:

"That exhibit looked to him like yellow butter. * * * In order to tell whether it was not some other article, I would have to make a test of it."

William McAdam, another inspector of the Dairy and Food Department, and a person of large practical experience in the manufacture of butter for the last ten years in Wisconsin, in which work, as he testified, he was called to observe the different shades of yellow butter that are commonly manufactured and sold in this state, and that he was familiar with such shades of yellow butter, on being shown Exhibit A, testified without objection:

"Judging of the color only I would consider that butter. I say that from its color and appearance. If that was set out as an article of food upon the table, not knowing anything about it, I should consider it butter. In order to determine it to be anything else I should have to make a test of it."

Dr. Richard Fischer, chemist to the Dairy and Food Commission, a part of whose duty for a number of years has been to analyze butter and oleomargarine to determine their constituent elements, testified:

"In order to determine whether the article, Exhibit A, is butter I would have to submit it to a physical and chemical examination. If I were a consumer and it was set before me in a hotel where I was paying a good price for a meal, I should probably pass it as butter; if it came to me in the laboratory I might suspect that it was oleomargarine because that would be my business as a chemist."

But the strongest testimony as to the color of this article being calculated to deceive the purchaser into the belief that it was butter, came from Mr. F. W. Weyman, manager of the butterine department of Swift & Company. Of course, he testified, as was to be expected, that Exhibit A was, as to its color oleomargarine and not butter.

To test the fairness of this witness, the State, as a part of its cross examination, prepared five so-called "patties," and placed them upon as many small dishes. Each dish had placed upon its bottom some number or letter to identify it. These five "patties" were marked by the reporter as exhibits, and the exhibit number and marks upon the bottom of the dish and the contents of the article in each case, are as follows.

Exhibit 13, marked on bottom of dish "No. 2-d" and being a sample of uncolored January, 1907, butter manufactured at Dodgeville.

Exhibit 14, marked on bottom of dish "No. 6," and being a part of Exhibit A.

Exhibit 15 marked on bottom of dish "No. 1," and being a sample of Armour & Company's yellow oleomargarine.

Exhibit 16 marked on bottom of dish "3" and being a sample of uncolored butter made at the creameries at Ft. Atkinson on the Saturday before the trial.

Exhibit 17, marked "4" on bottom of dish, being a sample of recently manufactured butter at the Ft. Atkinson creameries, with coloring matter therein.

Exhibit 18, being numbered "5" on bottom of dish and being a sample of uncolored oleomargarine manufactured by Braun & Fitz, of Chicago.

These different exhibits were presented to Mr. Weyman, an expert in judging of the color of butter as well as oleomargarine. As to the first exhibit, No. 13, being the Dodgeville uncolored January butter, he first testified that "it would pass for butter as far as the color goes," but then added: "It would not with

me. I don't know what it is, but it does not look like yellow butter, because it isn't yellow enough. I don't know whether it is oleomargarine or butter."

There was next presented to him Exhibit 15 which was a sample of yellow oleomargarine manufactured by Armour & Company for markets other than Wisconsin, Iowa and Pennsylvania. As to this exhibit the witness testified:

"What looks similar to the other one. I don't know whether it is butter or oleomargarine."

There was next shown the witness Exhibit 16, and the witness testified:

"I can't tell whether that is butter or oleomargarine and couldn't from the looks of it if it were set before me at the hotel or restaurant."

This, it will be remembered, was a sample of uncolored butter manufactured just before the trial at the Ft. Atkinson creameries.

There was then presented to the witness Exhibit 14, which was a part of the article sold, namely Exhibit A. As to this exhibit the witness, evidently feeling sure of his ground, testified:

"That looks like very light colored butter."

That is, the expert witness of Swift and Company, the manager of its but-terine department for the past five years, on being shown a sample of the article, under circumstances which did not disclose to him anything more than the color of the article, declared unhesitatingly the article to look "like very light colored butter."

(b) DIFFERENT SHADES OF YELLOW BUTTER.

The fact was drawn out on the cross examination of the state's witnesses, particularly, that there are sold in the different butter markets different shades of yellow butter. This is common knowledge, and was well known to the legis-lature when it enacted this statute.

It was also shown that different markets may call for different shades of yellow butter.

J. G. Moore, who perhaps had had more experience than any other witness in the case, in passing upon the different well recognized shades of yellow butter manufactured and sold in Wisconsin for the different leading butter markets, testified:

"Speaking of the different markets, Elgin, New York, Milwaukee and Chicago, there are so called official inspectors for the different markets to pass upon the different qualities of the butter, including the color. * * * In passing upon the color of a tub of butter, the main object is to see that the color is straight, uniform, that there are no streaks of yellow in it, the shade of the color is not objected to. According to the demand of the particular market or person wish-ing the butter the color is judged, and this (referring to Exhibit A) would no doubt pass in my mind as perfect in color for some markets."

Q. "There is a growing demand on the part of certain markets, and principally New York, for a lighter color than this? A. Yes sir. And in Chicago and Elgin the general demand has been a light straw color. I would say Exhibit A is about a light straw color."

This witness further testified:

"Creamery men want to keep the distinction of color deep enough so that dis-tinction will be entirely apparent between butter and oleomargarine. This is recognized among the manufacturers of butter and articles have appeared in the press along those lines."

Speaking of the shades of yellow demanded by the different leading markets, and giving the reason why it was to the advantage of the butter buyer to have the different markets come nearer together as to the different shades demanded, as a business proposition, the witness adds:

"There is a tendency to lighten the color (of butter manufactured for the St. Louis market) to be more in uniformity with the other markets so as to sell it there, but the requests have been during this last year decrying this tendency of lowering the distinction between oleomargarine and butter."

To the same effect see testimony of F. E. Carswell, who, after stating that the tendency in the manufacture of butter had been toward a lighter shade of yellow for the leading markets, adds:

"The manufacturers have not complied with the demand for a lighter color to the full extent, because there has been desire on their part to keep the color of their butter so as to distinguish it from oleomargarine."

The witness further testified that Exhibit 14, as to color, was an article that would meet this tendency in the different markets toward a lighter color of yellow for butter.

(c) THE INGREDIENTS THAT ENTERED INTO THE MANUFACTURE OF EXHIBIT A.

An analysis of Exhibit A by Mr. Kundert, a chemist employed by the Dairy and Food Commissioner, disclosed that it contained about ten per cent. of cotton seed oil and two per cent. of butter fat. An analysis by Dr. Fischer disclosed the same facts. Dr. Fischer further testified that "the presence of that amount of butter (two per cent), would have no appreciable effect on the color." Case

16-17. The analysis failed to disclose the presence in the article of any artificial coloring matter.

Dr. Fischer concluded from his analysis that there was in all probability in Exhibit A neutral lard and oleo oil, but that he knew of no way to determine the percentage of each of those fats in the article. He further testified that knowing that there was only two per cent of butter fat in the article, and no extraneous coloring matter, that the pronounced yellow color of the article must be due to the presence of "a very high percentage of highly colored oleo oil."

(d) EXPERIMENTS TO DETERMINE WHAT PRODUCED THE PRONOUNCED YELLOW COLOR OF EXHIBIT A.

The chemical analysis having shown that there was practically no butter fat in Exhibit A and that no artificial coloring matter had been used in its manufacture, there were left but two possible sources from which the yellow color of the article could come, either (1) from the cotton seed oil, or (2) from the oleo oil or from a combination of the two. The only other element entering into its manufacture was neutral lard, and this is always white.

For the purpose of determining from what ingredients used in the manufacture of Exhibit A the pronounced yellow came, Dr. Fischer made a number of experiments. He produced, and there was introduced in evidence, four samples of cotton seed oil, marked Exhibits 1, 2, 3 and 4.

Exhibit 1 is a University specimen purchased from a wholesale drug company, and was the ordinary commercial cotton seed oil known as winter yellow oil. The other exhibits, numbers 2, 3 and 4, came from the University Museum and were supposed to be representative samples of cotton seed oil obtained by the American Cotton Seed Oil Company. Exhibit number 2 was known commercially as summer white cotton seed oil, and Exhibit number 3 as summer yellow cotton seed oil.

Exhibit No. 5 is a small portion of Exhibit No. 1.

Exhibit C is the oleo oil—after it was melted and churned, extracted from the fat of a grass fed animal, the same having been purchased by Mr. Moore from a butcher at Edgerton in the fall of 1906. Exhibit 6 is a sample of this fat, the same as Exhibit C, except that it was not churned.

There was manufactured under the supervision of Dr. Fischer two samples of oleomargarine made up of ingredients as follows:

Exhibit D. This contains 60 per cent. of oleo oil (Ex. 6), 19 per cent. of neutral lard, and 20 per cent. of the commercial cotton seed oil, being No. 1, and being the highest colored of the four samples, and 1 per cent. of uncolored butter fat.

Exhibit E. This contained 40 per cent. of oleo oil (Ex. 6), 44 per cent. of neutral lard, 15 per cent. of cotton seed oil, Exhibit 1, and 1 per cent. of uncolored butter fat.

In manufacturing these exhibits Dr. Fischer testified that he used a larger percentage of cotton seed oil than was found in Exhibit A, "to see how much color could be produced from using that cotton seed oil."

About one week before the trial, Dr. Fischer made a trip to Chicago for the express purpose of examining the plant of Armour & Company and of securing samples of the materials used by that company in the manufacture of its different grades of oleomargarine. He saw at the time of this examination "oleo-entrants" into its manufacture. He requested from the company "representative samples of their different grades." He "made out a list and left it with Dr. Mann (the chemist for Armour & Company with whom Dr. Fischer was well acquainted) for various lards, cotton seed oil, etc., and extracts." Dr. Fischer produced upon the trial four samples which were introduced in evidence as Exhibits 7, 8, 9 and 10, and were identified by Dr. Fischer as the samples received from Armour & Company. These samples came to Dr. Fischer "in a package purporting to come from Armour & Company" by express and were addressed "to Dr. Fischer, University of Wisconsin, Madison, Wis." About the time he received the samples, he received a letter "from Dr. Mann stating that they had been sent," and Dr. Fischer testified "that the samples corresponded in appearance with the samples that I saw in Armour & Company's plant. I saw these samples of neutral lard and oleo oil in the butterine factory of Armour & Company and I tasted them and examined them as closely as I could." He further testified as to one of the exhibits, No. 9: "It was labeled that way when I got it, and I requested from them (Armour & Company) representative samples of their different grades. The color of this article, as near as I can say, is the color of the sample that I saw while at their plant."

Dr. Fischer explained exhibits 7, 8, 9 and 10, as follows:
Exhibit No. 7 is a sample of cotton seed oil known commercially as butter oil and used by Armour & Company in the manufacture of certain kinds of their oleomargarine. It is decidedly more yellow than Exhibit No. 1 and would tend to produce a yellow color in oleomargarine.

Exhibit No. 8 is a sample of light colored oleo oil used in the manufacture of oleomargarine.

Exhibit No. 9 is a sample of highly colored yellow oleo oil.

Exhibit No. 10 is a sample of neutral lard used in the manufacture of oleomargarine.

Dr. Fischer testified that he was familiar with the regulations of the United States Internal Revenue Department and with the formulas there given for the manufacture of oleomargarine. These formulas were published in 1902 and taken from the report of the United States Census of 1900, and were furnished to the United States Government by the firm of Armour & Company. These regulations contain the formulas as thus furnished of high grade, medium and low grade oleomargarine.

Exhibit F is a sample of oleomargarine manufactured by Dr. Fischer, using the proportions of oleo oil and neutral lard prescribed in the formulas for a high grade oleomargarine, that is 38 per cent. of yellow oleo oil No. 9, the highest colored oil obtained from Armour & Company, 49½ per cent. of neutral lard No. 10, and 12½ per cent. of cotton seed oil No. 7. He desired to simulate in the manufacture of this exhibit as nearly as possible the conditions in Exhibit A, and still use these formulas.

Exhibit G was manufactured using formula No. 2 found in the regulations of the U. S. Internal Revenue Department, that is, 34 per cent. of oleo oil No. 9 and 53½ per cent. of neutral lard No. 10 and 12½ per cent. cotton seed oil No. 1.

The 12½ per cent. of cotton seed oil would produce a higher color than that per cent. of butter fat.

It must not be understood that cotton seed oil was used in the manufacture of oleomargarine of the better grades prior to 1902. It is a very cheap ingredient as compared with either oleo oil or neutral lard.

As a result of the analysis by Dr. Fischer and the various tests and experiments made by him he testified that, while he could not state positively what caused the color of Exhibit A, "he thought it might be caused by and would be caused by the use of a very large percentage of highly colored oleo oil procured by a very careful selection of the highest colored fats."

The testimony on the part of the defendants substantiated in every particular the conclusions of Dr. Fischer as to the cause of the pronounced yellow color in Exhibit A. Mr. Weyman testified that Exhibit A was composed of 65 per cent. of highly colored oleo oil, 25 per cent. of neutral lard and 10 per cent. of yellow cotton seed oil. He produced a sample of oleo oil that was used in the manufacture of Exhibit A, and the same was received in evidence and marked Exhibit A-1. On cross examination he testified:

"In comparing Exhibit A-1 with Exhibit 9 I should say there is very little difference, if any, in color. If anything No. 9 is higher colored.

He also produced a sample of cotton seed oil which he stated was from the same factory and substantially the same as that used in the manufacture of Exhibit A. This sample was received in evidence and marked Exhibit A-2. A comparison of this exhibit with exhibit No. 7 will show that they are identical in color.

- (c) EXHIBIT A IS AN INFERIOR ARTICLE, BUT WAS SOLD AT THE SAME PRICE AS A SUPERIOR ARTICLE, BY REASON OF ITS PRONOUNCED YELLOW COLOR, AND THIS COLOR WAS SECURED BY THE CAREFUL SELECTION OF CERTAIN INGREDIENTS MADE FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMITATING YELLOW BUTTER.

Mr. Weyman testified that Swift & Company made three grades of oleo oil; that No. 1, the light colored oil, was the "choicest," and commanded the highest price; that as to color there was practically no difference between the two other grades, number 2 and 3.

It was the testimony of the State that neutral lard was a better article as to quality than oleo oil. But, Mr. Weyman, while admitting that "neutral lard is a fine oil," thought it was "not a finer oil than oleo oil." He admitted, however, that according to the formulas for high grade oleomargarine as manufactured prior to 1902, there was used "a higher percentage of neutral lard than oleo oil."

Now there was no dispute in the testimony as to the quality of cotton seed oil. As conceded by Weyman, "cotton seed oil is recognized as a cheap product." See also Dr. Fischer's testimony. It was not used in the manufacture of high grade oleomargarine prior to 1902.

It is to be remembered that Exhibit A contained practically no butter fat, and that a certain percentage of butter is now used in the high grades of oleomargarine.

Hence we have, under the testimony, in Exhibit A a very high percentage of a highly colored and inferior oleo oil, combined with 10 per cent. of yellow cotton seed oil, a cheap product, these two making up 75 per cent. of the article, the other 25 per cent. being neutral lard. Such a product as this is very aptly characterized by Dr. Fischer in his testimony as follows:

"I would say that a product containing a large percentage of oleo oil and a small percentage of neutral lard with practically no butter and 10 to 12 per cent. of cotton seed oil is a low grade article. The more cotton seed oil you set into it the lower the grade and the less butter in it the lower the grade; and the greater the excess of oleo oil over neutral lard the lower the grade."

Mr. Weyman, on cross examination, testified:

"If the article (Exhibit A) is made up of 34 per cent. oleo, 53½ per cent. neutral lard, 12½ per cent. cotton seed oil, I think we should get a much lighter

article than we get by using the percentages of 65 per cent. oleo oil, 25 per cent. neutral lard and 10 per cent. cotton seed oil."

And again:

"I could have made an article of a better quality by using a part of the lighter colored oleo oil. I would have got a better article if I had used half of the higher grade and half of the lower grade of oleo in the manufacture of this product. I would probably have gotten a lighter article."

And again:

"I recognize Exhibit C (should be Exhibit B) as a product of our manufacture. It is somewhat of another color and is a better article. We have sold it for a higher price. We did sell that article and the yellow article at the same time for the same price. Whether we did so to these defendants I don't know."

Q. That is, you sold an inferior article, didn't you, in quality, at the same price as a superior article in quality by reason of the fact that the inferior article was colored like butter, while the superior article was of a lighter color?

A. If these two grades were sold to this customer at the same price, I don't dispute it. I don't know whether they were or not; we would do it. Can't state that I sold these articles, to these customers for the same price, but I will say that I would do it to them or anybody else."

And again:

"Q. You are able to do that, to sell an inferior article because it is colored to look like butter at the same price that a superior article goes for because it is of a lighter color? A. Yes sir."

DECISION OF JUDGE GRIMM

on the motion of Mr. Quar'es of counsel for defendants to direct a verdict of not guilty.

Ever since I set this case for trial last week I have given the subject of the construction of this statute the best thought of which I am capable, and I feel grateful to you, gentlemen, for having so fully presented the law to me yesterday in your arguments. It has enabled me to come to a firmer conviction as to my duties. The court has nothing to do with the wisdom or policy of the law, the court does not concern itself with the fact as to whether such a law works good for the community or not. That is a matter entirely within the province of the legislature. If the law is not plain in its terms, the court must construe what it means. And if the law is otherwise not in violation of the constitution it must stand. The leading rule of construction to be applied to this case in my mind is this: To take the main terms of the language used in the law, and see if they are capable of misunderstanding. If not, follow them, and apply them and use them according to their ordinary meaning.

I am convinced that the interpretation put upon this statute by the state is the correct one in substantially every particular. The law in so many words, plain and simple, says that oleomargarine or any substance made of oil, fat or oleaginous substance not derived from pure milk or cream from the same, which shall be in imitation of yellow butter is forbidden to be made or sold in this state. Yellow butter, as has been shown here by the uncontradicted testimony, differs in shade from a light straw-color in the winter to a bright orange-color in the summer, with varying intermediate grades throughout the year. That is natural, uncolored butter. Colored butter shows a little brighter shade of yellow in the winter as one extreme, and a little deeper than the richer shade of yellow or natural butter in the summer. All these shades of yellow come within the protection of the law. Oleomargarine must not be in imitation of that product; and to be in imitation of yellow butter would be to resemble it in color and appearance possibly to such an extent, or probably to such an extent that it would be likely to deceive a consumer who did not know its true character. Oleomargarine may be sold in this state, if it contains no ingredient and no coloring matter to make it look like yellow butter. Ingredients in this connection cannot refer to anything else except the substances that go into the making up of the compound. And it is equally forbidden, as I construe this law, to color this compound with artificial coloring matter, as it is also to build it up of such oils and fats as will make it yellow. There can be no distinction. The aim of that statute is absolutely plain to my mind—to prevent the sale of oleomargarine that is colored, or made up to resemble in color yellow butter—to resemble it to the degree that I have stated, and not to prohibit its sale as butter, because that part is fully covered by the next section.

The motion to direct a verdict for the defendants is denied. You may go to the jury.

CHARGE TO THE JURY BY HON. GEORGE GRIMM, CIRCUIT JUDGE.

GENTLEMEN OF THE JURY:

The state has requested me to give you certain instructions as to the law of this case, and, so far as I deem them correct, I will now give them to you.

This is a prosecution under Section 4607c as amended by Chapter 151 of the Laws of 1901. The section is a part of Chapter 30 of the Laws of 1895, entitled "An act for the protection of public health, and to prevent adulteration,

deception or fraud in the manufacture and sale of dairy products." Said Section 4606c makes it unlawful for any person, either by himself or his agent, to manufacture, sell, ship, consign, offer for sale, expose for sale, or have in his possession with intent to sell, any article, product or compound made wholly or partly out of any fat, oil or oleaginous substance, or compound thereof, not produced from unadulterated milk or cream from the same, and without the admixture or addition of any fat foreign to said milk or cream, which was in imitation of yellow butter produced from pure, unadulterated milk or cream from the same, with or without coloring matter; provided, however, that nothing in the section shall be construed to prohibit the manufacture or sale of oleomargarine in a separate and distinct form and in such manner as will advise the consumer of its real character, and free from coloration or ingredient that causes it to look like butter.

The information in this case charges that the defendants unlawfully did offer and expose for sale, and did sell a certain article, product and compound which was made partly out of fat, oil and oleaginous substance, and partly out of a compound thereof, and neither the said article, product or compound nor the said fat, oil and oleaginous substance, nor the said compound thereof, was produced from unadulterated milk, or from cream and unadulterated milk, and that said article, product and compound contained the admixture and addition of fat foreign to unadulterated milk and foreign to unadulterated cream, and that said product and compound was then and there in imitation of yellow butter, with or without coloring matter, produced from unadulterated milk or cream from the same, and that said article, product and compound was so in imitation of yellow butter, with or without coloring matter, when and at the time the same was so in the possession of the defendants and by them sold to Mr. Larson, an agent of the state.

It is the claim of the state that the article so sold was in imitation of such yellow butter by reason of its having the color of yellow butter, but it is conceded that such color was produced solely by the ingredients contained in such compound; it being further claimed that said ingredients were so selected and used in the manufacture of the oleomargarine sold in such manner and in such quantities and proportion as to produce the oleomargarine so sold, which was then and there in imitation of yellow butter produced from unadulterated milk or cream from the same, and that such sale of such article was contrary to the statute.

Any person who sells any such article of the color of yellow butter produced from unadulterated milk or cream with or without coloring matter is guilty of the violation of said section of the statute; and you are instructed that it is wholly immaterial whether the defendants, or either of them, at the time they made the sale in question, knew of the existence of the law above stated, or knew that they were doing an unlawful act.

You are instructed by the court that butter which contains coloring matter is not, under the provisions of the statute in question, adulterated, since the statute expressly permits butter to be colored. You are further instructed that it is wholly immaterial in this case that coloring matter is used in the manufacture of butter.

I will say right here that the color of yellow has long been recognized as the color of butter, which is a natural product. And the legislature, in the exercise of the police power of the state to protect the public health or morals, have the right to enact laws to forbid the use or imitation of that color which belongs to natural butter, in any artificial product made up by the combination of other elements. They also have the right to protect the use of yellow color to accentuate or increase the color of natural butter.

The question of criminal intent is not in this case. It is wholly immaterial whether the defendants intended to violate this law or not. The selling of the prohibited article is made an offense, even though such sale should be made in good faith, and with no intent to violate the law.

The article, the selling of which the statute forbids, is an article "in imitation of yellow butter." The imitation referred to and prohibited in the statute is confined by the statute to the color of the article. The statute expressly permits the manufacture and sale of oleomargarine in a separate and distinct form, and in such manner as will advise the consumer of its real character, free from coloration or ingredient that causes it to look like butter. In determining whether the article in question which Mr. Larson purchased from the defendants was "in imitation of yellow butter" it is not necessary for you to find that the article was calculated to deceive Mr. Larson, or that it did deceive Mr. Larson, who chanced to have bought it in this instance; all that it is necessary for you to find on this branch of the case is that the article which Mr. Larson purchased was in imitation of yellow butter, likely, by reason of its color, to deceive any person who might buy it, or who might be the consumer of it.

The statutes of this state impose upon the Dairy and Food Commissioner and his assistants, among whom was Mr. Larson, the duty of enforcing this law, and you are instructed that you are not at liberty to draw any inferences unfavorable to the state in this case, by reason of the fact that the article in question was purchased by Mr. Larson, even though it was not purchased by him for consumption, but for the purpose of ascertaining whether the defendants were violating the law. It was not only the privilege of Mr. Larson, but

his duty, as a dairy and food inspector, to ascertain whether the defendants were violating this law, and to that end it was proper for him to procure the article in question by purchase thereof.

It is proven by the testimony in this case that, at the time of the sale by the defendants of the oleomargarine in question there was being sold upon the market, and was in the market for sale generally, different shades of yellow butter. You are instructed that if the oleomargarine in question was in imitation as to its color of any one of said shades of yellow butter, whether said yellow butter had coloring matter in it or not, so being sold on the market, then the defendants are guilty of an offense under this section of the statute.

To these instructions requested I need add but little more. You and I, gentlemen of the jury, have nothing to do with the wisdom of the governmental policy which prompts the enactment of such a law. That is a matter entirely in the judgment of the legislature, and is an exercise of its inherent right to legislate for the protection of the public health and morals. Your duty and mine is to take the law as we find it, and determine whether the defendants are guilty of any violation of it. If you find from the testimony, beyond reasonable doubt, that the compound sold by the defendants was in imitation of yellow butter, you must then find them guilty; otherwise you must find them not guilty.

Butter, that is, natural butter, as is shown by the undisputed testimony in this case, and as is a matter of common knowledge, varies in the degree of yellow, from light straw-color in the winter to a rich light orange yellow in the summer. Colored butter varies from a shade of yellow somewhat more pronounced than the natural color of winter butter to shades higher than the highest natural color of summer butter; and all these shades of yellow in butter come within the protection of this law, and it is equally forbidden to sell oleomargarine in imitation of the lightest shade of yellow butter, colored or uncolored as it is of the most pronounced or intermediate shades. And it is equally forbidden whether this be accomplished by artificial coloring matter, or by the selection of, or by the proportion of, the ingredients used in making it.

You are to carefully consider all the evidence in the case, and the exhibits introduced are a part of it; the compound sold by the defendants, and various other samples of oleomargarine are before you, as are also samples of various shades of color and uncolored real butter. You have, therefore, in addition to the oral testimony, the evidence of your own eyes to aid you in determining whether or not, under these instructions, the compound sold by the defendants was in imitation of yellow butter,—which also determines whether or not the defendants are guilty or not guilty.

In this, as in every other criminal case, the burden of proof is upon the prosecution to prove beyond reasonable doubt every material fact necessary to establish the guilt of the defendants.

The defendants enter upon the trial with the presumption of innocence in their favor. This presumption attends them throughout the trial, and must prevail unless their guilt is established by all the evidence in the case, fairly and impartially considered, beyond reasonable doubt. The proof is deemed to be beyond reasonable doubt if the evidence produces a conviction upon your mind: upon which you would not hesitate to act in your own most important affairs and concerns of life.

I have prepared two forms of verdict for you, one of guilty and the other of not guilty, and you may adopt the one which will accord with your findings.

The testimony shows that the two defendants were partners in business, and that the product was sold by one of them, that would make no difference. If one of them sold it, and being in partnership in business it would make the other equally guilty under the law, if you find either of them guilty.

VERDICT OF THE JURY.

"Guilty in manner and form as charged in the information."
An appeal was taken to the supreme court.

UNIFORMITY IN STANDARDS AND LABELS.

At a meeting called at the Ryan Hotel in the city of St. Paul, Minnesota, on the seventh day of September 1907, by Dr. E. F. Ladd, President of the National Association of State Dairy and Food Departments, for the purpose of securing harmony of action as to rulings, standards and principles, and to promote the uniform enforcement of the food laws and co-operation among food officials of the states of the middle west, the following states were represented:

Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin. Commissioners present.—E. F. Ladd, North Dakota; J. Q. Emery, Wisconsin; E. K. Slater, Minnesota; A. H. Wheaton, South Dakota; A. H. Jones, Illinois; H. R. Wright, Iowa.

Assistant commissioners present.—H. E. Schuknecht, Illinois; John McCabe, Minnesota.

Chemists present.—R. Fischer, Wisconsin; J. H. Shepard, South Dakota; Julius Hortvet, Minnesota; T. J. Bryan Illinois; A. S. Mitchell, (U. S. Dept.) St. Paul; A. L. Winton (U. S. Dept.) Chicago.

Dr. H. F. Ladd was elected chairman H. R. Wright, secretary. The following resolutions were unanimously adopted.

Resolved, That no artificial color should be permitted in Vanilla Extract.
Resolved, That a Vanilla Extract, complying with the standards of the U. S. Circular 19, and containing not less than 40 per cent. of alcohol by volume, may be sold if the face label on both carton and bottle contains the following information:

- First, net weight or measure;
- Second, brand or trade-mark (optional);
- Third, "Vanilla Extract;"
- Fourth, percentage of alcohol by volume;
- Fifth, the true name and business address of the manufacturer.

SEPTEMBER 17TH, 1907. 2:00 P. M.

Resolved, That the terms extract, flavor, flavoring, spirits, essence and tincture, as applied to solutions used for flavoring food products are held to be synonymous, but the use of any term in lieu of the word "extract" is deprecated, as applied to flavoring solutions made from an aromatic plant or parts of the plant.

Resolved, That any other flavoring extract recognized in U. S. Circular No. 19 and complying with the standards laid down in that circular and free from artificial color, may be sold if the face label on both bottle and carton contains the following information:

- First, net weight or measure;
- Second, brand or trade-mark (optional);
- Third, name of extract as recognized in Circular 19;
- Fourth, percentage of alcohol by volume;
- Fifth, true name and business address of manufacturer.

Resolved, That the use of alum or any other aluminum compound in prepared fruits, vegetables and condiments is injurious to health and unnecessary and should be prohibited.

Resolved, That compound jellies, jams and preserves containing glucose, cane sugar and fruit may be sold if labeled:

- First, net weight or measure;
- Second, brand or trade-mark (optional);
- Third, the word "compound" followed by the names and percentages of the ingredients and then with the word "Jelly," "Jam" or "Preserve" as the case may be, thus,—

COMPOUND.

- 30% Glucose
- 20% Cane Syrup
- 30% Currants
- 20% Apple
- Jelly

Fourth, true name and business address of manufacturer.
Resolved, That in compound jellies, jams and preserves, before mentioned, no starch, gelatin, gum, added acid, artificial coloring matter, artificial sweetener, or preservative will be permitted.

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 1907.

Resolved, That catsups, conforming to the standards laid down in U. S. Circular 19, including freedom from artificial coloring matter and fillers, may be lawfully sold. (After December 1, 1908, the sale of catsup containing any preservatives except those mentioned in the standards will be contested).

Resolved, That edible oils and fats, complying with the standards of U. S. Circular 19 may be sold under the names there given. The name "salad oil" is not recognized as a descriptive or distinctive name for a simple oil and its use as such is not approved. Mixtures of edible oils intended for salad purposes may be sold as "Salad Oil (a compound)" provided the names and proportionate amounts of the ingredients are plainly stated on the main label in the order of their predominance. *Example*:

First, net weight or measure:

Second, brand or trade-mark (optional):

Third, name, e. g. "Salad Oil (a compound)"

composed of
 60% Cottonseed oil
 20% Peanut Oil
 20% Sesame Oil.

Fourth, the true name and business address of manufacturer.

Resolved, That the sale of soda fountain syrups and crushed fruits, containing any preservative other than sugar will be contested after December 1, 1908.

Resolved, That the addition of color to any vinegar constitutes an adulteration whether declared on the label or not.

Resolved, That solutions of artificial substances used for flavoring and made to resemble the flavor of pineapple, strawberry, raspberry, banana, blackberry, etc., may be sold as "artificial pineapple flavor," "artificial strawberry flavor," etc., if free from artificial coloring and if the label contains no statement or design whereby the purchaser may be misled into believing them prepared from the natural fruits and if the true extract cannot be made from the plant or part of the plant.

Resolved, That such terms as "extra quality," "first quality," etc., as applied to food products, be deemed a misbranding unless the quality of the goods corresponds to the terms used.

Resolved, That the terms "double," "triple," etc., as applied to flavoring extracts, be held to mean, respectively, two or three times the minimum strength required by the standards as given in U. S. Circular No. 19.

Resolved, Further, that the term "concentrated," as applied to flavoring extracts, is false and misleading.

Resolved, That solutions of coumarin and vanillin will be passed in the States here represented as properly labeled as to the name of the product, if they contain no artificial color and if labeled with the name, or names, of the flavoring principle or principles, together with the word "flavor"; as "Vanillin Flavor," or "Coumarin and Vanillin Flavor," etc., as the case may be.

Resolved, That a copy of the minutes of this meeting be submitted to the Food Commissioner of each state not here represented, with the request that he subscribe thereto in case goods so labeled would pass as properly branded in his state.

SANITARY MAXIMS.

ISSUED BY THE FOOD COMMITTEE OF THE NATIONAL CONSUMER'S LEAGUE, 135 E. 22d STREET, NEW YORK.

"My plea is, in order to secure pure food in the household, that this and other similar organizations unite to compel the manufacturers and dealers in food stuffs, to stop all adulterations, to stop all misbranding, to stop all coloring, and deception, and furnish the pure, unadulterated and palatable article."

—Dr. Wiley.

DIRT, DANGER, DISEASE.

"Clean water, clean food, clean streets, clean houses, keep us healthy."

AT THE STORE.

Buy food at the cleanest stores only.

Buy only clean, fresh food.

Refuse to take food handled by dirty hands. Insist upon its being well wrapped. Paper bags are best.

Buy only the purest candies. Is the candy pure and clean that your children buy from the push cart? Do not buy decayed food because it is cheap.

Do not buy bread and cake at dirty bakeries. Look into the baking rooms, if possible. Are they clean?

Examine the packages of cereals for worms before cooking. Packages of long standing often become infested with worms and are sometimes found at the best stores.

Does your grocer keep his butter and milk in clean, cold places, and are they covered? Does he keep his candies, figs, dates, berries, lettuce, bread, etc., exposed to flies and dust from the street, in shop or show window? Flies carry dirt and disease to food and man.

Are your grocer and butcher and baker cleanly in person? Are their clerks cleanly?

Urge them to keep their goods off the sidewalk. There is danger of disease in street dirt. Ask the delicatessen storekeeper and the pushcart man to keep their tables covered.

Refuse to buy food sold in open buckets which stand uncovered in the store day after day.

FISH, FLESH AND FOWL.

Select a reliable tradesman as you would select a reliable physician. The best and purest food is cheapest in the end.

Fish. Buy only fresh fish. It should have red gills, and be firm, with moist and bright scales, clear eyes, and be rigid when handled. Stale fish is flabby, has scales dull, eyes sunken covered with film and a bad odor about the gills.

LOBSTERS and Crabs should be purchased alive.

Do not eat oysters in May, June, July or August. They are best in months with the "R." Clams may be eaten throughout the year. All shell fish should smell fresh, and the shells should close firmly when put in water or touched with the finger.

Flesh. Buy only fresh meat. Beef should be a rosy, red color, yellowish white fat, firm, elastic and scarcely moist when touched with the finger. Cook it well. Do not buy wet, flabby beef that is pink or purple. Good lamb and mutton is firm, close grained and light red with fat white and hard.

Fresh Veal is pale red with firm white fat. Bad Veal is soft, mushy and bluish tinge.

Good Pork is solid, pure white fat, pink flesh. Cook it thoroughly. Reject yellow, soft pork.

Make your own sausages if possible. Much of the sausage meat we buy is preserved by chemicals because fresh meat so readily spoils.

Do not eat raw meats of any kind. Cooking kills germs if they are present.

Cook thoroughly all meats, especially Hamburg-steak and pork.

Do not let cats and dogs come near meat. Canned meats must be free from molds and a greenish hue when opened. If the top of the can is raised in the center, it has begun to spoil and should not be eaten.

Poult. Buy on y poultry that is firm to the touch, has pink or ye low color, with fresh odor and strong, unbroken skin.

Stale pou try is flabby, b uish green on the crop and abdomen, has bad odor and skin is easily pulled apart.

The odor of decomposition can be detected in any food.

IN THE KITCHEN.

Keep all food covered in ice-box or cup-board. A paper bag is easily slipped over a pitcher or a platter of food to protect it.

Save your clean paper bags.

Keep your ice box c'ean and filled with ice, if possib'le.

Don't leave food standing around in kitchen or living room. Don't stand it in a sink or washtub. Keep your garbage pail clean and covered, and don't stand it near the ice-box or where you keep food.

Protect all food from flies.

Wash thoroughly all meat, fish, vegetables and fruit before using.

Boil or filter the drinking water, if it is not clear.

Don't let drinking water stand uncovered. The air of living rooms is full of dirt from human breath and human bodies; therefore air your rooms daily.

Keep your cooking utensils clean and off the floor.

Verm'in and mice carry infection, they never stay in clean places.

Don't serve food on a dirty table, nor from dirty utensils. Keep the dish-pan c'ean, and everything else that has to do with food. The cook's hands must be clean. Typhoid fever has been contracted from dirty hands.

Keep flies out of your house, especially the kitchen.

MILK RULES.

Tuberculosis kills 5,000,000 people annually. It may be carried through infected milk.

Select a milk man who has clean hands, clean clothes, clean wagon, clean cans, clean bottles.

Do not select a milk man, because he sells cheap milk.

Refuse milk that shows a deposit of dirt in the bottom of the bottle.

Do not forget that dirt in milk is a menace to health.

Do not forget that dirty milk may kill the baby.

Always keep Pasteurized Milk Cool. Use at once. Do not forget that germs multiply more rapidly in pasteurized milk than in any other.

Do not leave milk uncovered anywhere.

Do not leave milk in a warm room, or unchilled ice box. Protect it from flies. Do not leave it out-of-doors in the sun or exposed to cats or dogs.

Do not use the milk bottles for anything but milk.

Wash and scald milk bottles as soon as emptied. Return clean bottles to the milk man. Buy only bottled milk, if possible.

LABELS.

The law requires all food manufacturers to label their products truthfully.

Do read the labels carefully.

They are your protection from fraud.

Study them and learn what is an honest label.

The labels must tell what is inside the can or box or bottle. If it is a compound it must be so stated.

Read the small print, as it is often more important than the large.

Does the label tell the truth about the weight of the package? Don't buy foods artificially colored. Don't buy foods containing chemical preservatives.
