SECRETARY'S REPORT

JANUARY 1, 1940, TO JANUARY 1, 1941

The Wisconsin Dairymen's Association has been pledged to continue every effort available to make the Wisconsin dairy herds more profitable. The Board of Directors drew up a program designed to cooperate with existing agencies, including the College of Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, Vocational Agriculture Departments, County Agricultural Agents, Breed Associations and The Wisconsin State Fair, to increase Dairy Farm Income. To promote and encourage Bull Associations, Production Record Keeping among Vocational Agricultural Departments, Production Shows and Breeding Schools and to work in every way possible with the Junior Dairymen. To work for more record keeping and greater use of records, the Association has endeavored to cooperate fully with the above named groups. A brief summary of activities is included in this report.

Annual Meeting and Convention

Continuing the established practice, a two-day convention was held as part of the year's activities of the Association, in which the best talent available informed Wisconsin dairymen of new ideas and new approaches to the problems confronting the Wisconsin dairymen.

Menomonie was chosen for the 68th annual convention and particular emphasis was placed on feeding and breeding of dairy cattle with additional emphasis on herd health.

This program was made possible by the cooperation of the Menomonie Chamber of Commerce, Stout Institution, the City of Menomonie, State and County Breed associations and many individuals cooperated in making the program one worthy of the tradition of fine meetings established over the period of years, during which the two-day convention has become the dairymen's homecoming as well as an educational two-day program.

The following men brought information to the General Program: Ralph Ammon, Director, Dept. of Agriculture; Dr. W. E. Peterson, Minnesota University; Dr. C. F. Huffman, Michigan State College; J. C. Nisbet, Ohio Dairy Products Association, Inc.; Dr. E. E. Heizer, Head, Dept. of Dairy Husbandry, University of Wisconsin; Dr. F. E. Walsh, Head of Veterinary Obstetrics, Iowa State College; Dr. M. H. Fohrman, Bureau of Dairy Industry, Washington, D. C.; Howard Clapp, Herdsman, Pabst Farms, Oconomowoc.

The Junior Program was again continued as a part of the annual convention. Future farmer and 4-H Club recognition were given and much emphasis was placed on attempting to bring a real approach to the Junior dairymen and his problems which are of genuine interest to all the adult dairymen of Wisconsin. The following appeared on the Junior program: Ivan Kinschi, President National F. F. A.; Maynard Matthys, State 4-H Dairy Champion 1939; R. W. Stumbo, Extension Fieldman, Wisconsin Dairymen's Association; Frank Astroth, South St. Paul, Minnesota; Professor G. C. Humphrey, Dairy Husbandry Dept., University of Wisconsin.

Many thanks are due Miss Agnes Freidl and Mrs. Max Hill for their untiring efforts in arranging for and pre-

senting the Women's Program. The program was completed entirely as a result of the committee working under the direction of Miss Freidl and Mrs. Hill. It was, without doubt, the most successful Women's Program in the history of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association conventions.

Recognition was given to the owner of those cows that had produced more total pounds of butterfat in each of the five breeds. One award was made to each breed. The following cows were honored: Ayrshire, Joyce of Dairy Center, owned by Henry Krenke, Fremont; Brown Swiss, grade cow, owned by Yahnke Bros. of Burlington; Guernsey, grade cow, Sunshine, owned by Fred Burhop, Grafton; Jersey, Electioneer's Noble Belle, owned by P. N. Steffanus, Delavan; Holstein, Correction Excetter Beatrice, owned by the Milwaukee County House of Correction.

National and statewide publicity featured not only the educational program but the cows that were honored and much valuable publicity to the State of Wisconsin resulted in the honoring of these cows and their owners.

The D. H. I. A. fieldmen made possible the selection, as it was through their efforts the information was made available.

Program of Work

Following is the program of work adopted by the Association's Board of Directors and every effort has been made to increase and expand the activities of the Association insofar as is consistent with efficient work:

Cooperation between various state agencies has been sought in every possible means. Bull Associations have continued to be a major project of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association and much time and energy was spent in organizing and supervising cooperative associations so that more good bulls would be alive when proved and greater use would be made of the great sires when found.

In this issue of the Yearbook is found a list of associations and the bulls used in these associations.

Better Sire Campaigns

Several counties put on intensive better sire campaigns in which every effort was made to get the dairymen interested in using better sires. Cooperatives were set up through which bulls could be purchased. Junior bull projects were encouraged and bull bazaars were held. County-wide publicity was carried on extensively in an effort to help eradicate the menace of the scrub bull.

This program was successfully carried out with the aid of the extension service, vocational agriculture departments, and breed associations. More of this type of campaign will be held.

Exhibits

A panel exhibit calling attention to the need for better sires and the means of securing such sires was used at many dairy days, county fairs, at the State Fair, and on occasions when such exhibits were possible. In addition, a State Fair exhibit, consisting of twenty Stars of the Milky Way was sponsored by the Association in which one cow of each breed from four separate regions within the State were taken to the State Fair for an educational display which lasted the duration of the Fair.

These cows were selected on a basis of type, production and reproduction.

Completing the exhibit was a proved sire and ten of his daughters, all show-ring winners, all proving their ability as milk producers. Incorporated in the Dairy Day at the State Fair was a parade of these exhibits.

Richardson, Spring Green; and Jake Voegeli, Monticello; District No. 4, W. R. Evans, Waukesha; J. A. Dalton, Oconomowoc; H. & H. Lurvey, Dousman; Wisconsin Industrial School for Boys, Waukesha; and P. N. Stefanus, Delavan.

The proved sire and his daughters belonged to Chas. J. Mitchell, Waukesha, Wisconsin.

Supplies

Herdbook covers for D. H. I. A. permanent herdbooks have been supplied free to members of the Dairymen's Association and at cost to all other D. H. I. A. members. Over 50,000 printed record sheets have been made available to vocational agriculture departments. A correlation between the Jr. D. H. I. A. and the regular organized D. H. I. A. has been attempted wherever possible and much progress has been made in making a statewide program available to all dairymen.

The Wisconsin Dairymen's Association, its officers and directors, truly appreciate the cooperation afforded by all in making the past year's work possible.
